

SCANNING THE CAREER activities of Lowell Thomas, you'd probably get the idea that the phrase "family man" would have no connection with this man who campaigned with T. E. Lawrence in the Holy Lands, broke the Allied blockade of Europe in 1918 to witness the German revolution, explored the interiors of Afghanistan, Alaska, Australia, India and Burma, took a 17,000 mile flying trip to Central and South America, made a 25,000 mile' flight through twenty-one countries in Europe, Asia and North Africa, headed two expeditions to the sub-Arctic, topped his own lecture record by delivering one address on "Lawrence of Arabia" 4000 times to more than three million listeners, is currently writing book number forty-three, and has been a radio commentator for 14 years without interruption. No, you'd naturally think such a busy man has had little time for

"home life"—but you're wrong to think that about Mutual-Don Lee Commentator Lowell Thomas. And these pictures prove it.

As a matter of fact, Thomas has two homes—his own farm, "Clover Brook" in Pawling, New York, and his apartment in one of New York's most beautiful buildings near Central Park. But since the apartment is maintained merely as a convenience to him and his family during working hours in the city, it's the Pawling estate that Mr. and Mrs. Thomas call home. Third occupant at "Clover Brook," is Lowell Thomas, Jr., now training to be a pilot with the AAF in Florida. . . . Lowell, Jr., is a true son of his father, for both are expert baseball players, skiers, and both share the same love of adventure that has taken them together to unknown sections of the country. With Mr. and Mrs. Thomas always, of course, are the pets of the Pawling place—their six riding horses, including Lady Clair, the radio man's favorite, Micky and Boaz II, their

dogs, and a flock of sheep that provides the family with wool and part of their meat supply.

"Home" For 14 Years

But, now more about the home itself. Located two and one half hour's drive from Manhattan, "Clover Brook" has been the commentator's home for the past 14 years, ever since he became a radio commentator. The thirty-room Colonial-style house was built more than 200 years ago by a Quaker bachelor, and though it has been remodelled many times in the past two centuries, it still retains the original structural plan of its builder, and the wood paneling first installed.

There is a quaint story about the builder of the house at "Clover Brook." Records have been found by Thomas which tell the amusing tale of the advice given the Quaker bachelor by his relatives. They said if he'd build more and more rooms, undoubtedly he'd some day find a wife to be mistress of his home. The rooms were added one by one, but unfortunately no wife ever came to live in them.

Has Deed

Incidentally, Thomas has in his possession the original deed to the

The Church That Radio Built

FLOYD B. JOHNSON, dynamic evangelist and former Sunkist district manager, likes to sell religion as if he were disposing of a carload of oranges. Strictly a business man with a business man's direct approach, he remarked to Radio Life the other day: "Most religious organizations add radio programs to their schedules. Our development began the opposite. We started with radio and out of it we have produced a big, downtown church."

Today, Floyd B. Johnson heads the King's Ambassadors Association, a non-profit religious group organized under California law, which owns and operates the Los Angeles Evangelistic Center at the northwest corner of Eleventh and Hope streets with a paid staff of fourteen. Furthermore, he and members of his staff are heard in nine weekly broadcasts: Sunday, Wednesday, and Fridays at 8:05-9 p.m. from the church over KMTR, Mondays at the same time from the studio, and mornings from Monday to Friday over the same station at 10:30-10:45 a.m. This year the association's radio budget will hit around \$75,000.


"A Miracle"

"We bought the building four years ago for \$75,000," stated Johnson. "We have never had a membership, never had a pledge. But in four years, we have reduced the indebtedness \$47,350. To me, it's a miracle!"

Yet in speaking of his childhood and the preparation which he was unconsciously accumulating for his work today, Johnson assumes a matter-of-fact attitude.

"I was born in Huntington, Indiana. My mother was a Salvation Army officer and assisted General William Booth. My father was a clergyman in the United Brethern Church. Father died and I was raised by my mother—just a poor widow's kid. Got as far as business college in school.

"When I was twenty-three years old I was converted under Paul Rader. Yes, I had had my fling!

ALTHOUGH THE CENTER has never been organized with a membership, the church is filled every Sunday and for thirteen related meetings a week. It stresses youth activities, publishes a monthly eight-page tabloid paper with a circulation of 15,000. Above picture was taken at opening service, June 1940, attended by 1200.

"I went into the ministry as a business man. When I was working as assistant district manager for Sunkist in Chicago," Johnson chuckled, "Charles Fuller was working here at the same time for the same company. I started in radio in 1920 at KYW in Chicago with a male quartet. I was first tenor and manager and was billed as the 'Original Sunshine Man.' Out of this I became program director for religious broadcasts of WJBT in the Wrigley Building, Chicago.

"As a business-man evangelist for eight years I filled speaking engagements Sundays and evenings. That's how I received my interdenominational aspect—speaking at every kind of church. For five years I was associated with Rader and managed all his religious broadcasts (fourteen continuous hours every Sunday). After that, I took a trio and traveled the nation, broadcasting from key cities. In the winter of 1936, we visited Los Angeles, and at the invitation of some of the churches here, I returned the next year and through Van C. Newkirk, started

broadcasting on KMTR."

Gathered a Following

On the air six and a half hours a week, Johnson soon gathered a devoted following. People began to appeal to him for some meeting place, so once a week he rented the Biltmore Theater. "We began to pack it," Johnson recalls, "so at the end of a year, when the church property on Hope Street became available, we purchased it. The combined seating capacity is 1200. We filled the regular auditorium all the time."

The church is interdenominational in its creed. "We carry on a constant evangelistic campaign," stated Johnson. "We have a great youth organization. Right now, we've added another flourishing department, The American League of Praying Mothers, a group which meets to supplicate for their sons in service. Altogether, we have thirteen meetings a week at the church. In addition, we publish a monthly, eight-page tabloid paper, which has a circulation of 15,000."

A Grandfather

Johnson, a substantial-looking,

middle-aged man who wears glasses, is married and lives in Glendale. His wife assists him as private secretary. They have two children, Floyd Jr., and Ruth, who is Mrs. Robert Pierce. Pierce is associate pastor and youth director of the association. The Pierces have a small daughter, Sharon Ruth.

The Johnsons relax very little from their religious duties, but he gives some attention to a victory garden. Asked if he reads much, he replied: "I'm diggin' all the time, mostly in my Bible. I'm strictly a Bible preacher. I feel people need the word of God."

In addition to his Bible, Johnson also peruses Readers Digest, the Times and Herald-Express, and "many books."

"I don't want to appear like a clergyman," he said. "I don't want the demeanor of one," he continued looking at his plain business suit. "I want to sit down and talk religion to people the same as if I were selling them oranges.

"Oh, sure. Every morning I have to have my orange juice. Yes. It's always Sunkist!"

Georgia Gibbs Is The Tomboy Type But G.I. Joe Likes Her That Way

I LIKE BASEBALL," laughed Georgia Gibbs as we lunched with her one recent afternoon. "It may be unglamorous, but I love it," she continued. "I guess I'm the tomboy type!"

"Her Nibbs," Miss Gibbs, is the small, dark-eyed, golden-haired songbird of CBS' Jimmy Durante-Garry Moore show. A "musician's singer," she renders sweet, swing, blues and torch songs with a style all her own, but always, she maintains, the way that the composer wrote it. "No frills to clutter up the melody" is Georgia's policy.

She has the same idea concerning her clothes. "It was quite an innovation," she related, "when I started singing at supper clubs in tailored suits." She wears them for almost

all of her appearances, forsaking the customary evening gowns, maintaining that a singer should be able to sell herself with her voice alone.

On the afternoon of our chat with Georgia, she was wearing an attractive tailored suit with a pair of gold bird ornaments decorating its lapel. Once in New York, she told us, a flyer who liked her singing of "Shoo, Shoo Baby" presented her with a pair of silver wings for the lapel of her suit. Later, after being sent abroad, the pilot had occasion to see a magazine photo of her, and noticed immediately that she was wearing the wings he'd given her. He sent her a V-Mail from England, telling her how much he wished he could hear her sing "Shoo, Shoo Baby" again.

So Georgia obliged the soldier by including his number and a personal hello for him in one of the albums

of records which she sends regularly to the troops overseas.

Personal Touch

Knowing how lonely the boys become, the thoughtful, warm-hearted Georgia does her best to inject "something personal" into all her contacts with the boys in uniform. When she sends out autographed photos in answer to their requests, she encloses a friendly personally-written note in each envelope. She carries on an extensive correspondence with servicemen here and abroad, devoting a full day's time to the enjoyable task each week.

Grateful for her friendliness, soldiers everywhere write to the songstress regularly, lengthy, intimate letters that reveal how much they're thinking of home. Some ask that she relay messages to their home-folks, which Georgia immediately does. A few of the fellows have sent her souvenirs, mostly Japanese coins.

At every opportunity, Georgia Gibbs gives shows for the boys at camps and hospitals. "The men are so wonderful," she smiled. "A lump comes into your throat when you try to sing for them."

To Hot Desert

Sometimes, when journeying to the desert outposts, she has found herself to be the first girl the soldiers have seen in months. Under the blazing desert sun, she appears before them hot and disheveled, her hair limp and straggly, her face wet and shiny with perspiration, but the boys like her that way.

"The temperature's 135 degrees and up, out there on the desert," emphasized Georgia. "They hand out sandwiches to us, and the bread curls up in the heat."

The songbird's most ardent wish is to go overseas. "Jimmy Durante hopes to go before very long," she told us, adding emphatically, "If Jimmy goes, I go."

Hollywood's movie moguls have been bidding for the mellow voice and sultry blonde beauty of songbird Georgia, and it is likely that, in the future, moviegoers as well as radiodials will be seeing and hearing a lot more of her.

Right now, however, she is looking forward to being back in New York when the Moore-Durante show finishes its Hollywood airings. She isn't as happy in California, since her home is in the east. The youngest of four children and the only one still unmarried, she lives with her mother in a New York suburb.

Out here, she's staying in a hotel room. "And I'm lucky to have that," she declared quickly.

Parsons Subs

The other day, Radio Life went out to call on Louella Parsons, who will help fill in Walter Winchell's time on the Blue, Sunday nights, while Winchell takes a month-long August vacation. We found the columnist very deferential and obliging, albeit she was just getting over a bad cold, and was worried about her voice being ready to go on the air.

She likes radio, she said, as she recalled her long career at the mike. Also, she didn't hesitate to brand her first air series as "simply awful" and again as "a terrible show."

For her stint on the Winchell program, she plans to use material that will appear in print in her Monday newspaper column, "I try to keep things light," she observed. "People like to hear light things with this war going on. It's terrible. Doctor (her husband, Dr. Harry Martin) was

overseas for almost a year and some of the things he tells just turn your stomach."



On His Way Up!

Meet Young Doug Gourlay,
Protege of Harry Owens
And Personable Addition
To NBC's Announcing Staff



DOUG GOURLAY (middle name Crosby) is now heard frequently on NBC's air. He came here from San Francisco the first of this year, has blue eyes, brown hair, weighs 160 pounds and stands five feet eleven and a half.

WHenever I get the urge to work, I lie down until the feeling leaves me."

The speaker was collegiate-looking Doug Gourlay, who stacks up as one of NBC's most personable young announcers. He was just kidding, of course, because deep-voiced Doug takes his work as staff mikeman and his special chores as announcer for *A Date for Judy*, *Bob Burns*, the *Rancho News on Saturday Night*, and "A Song Is Born" in very serious vein.

Here in Southern California we're really being exposed to Doug's voice for the first consequential time. He came to Hollywood from San Francisco's NBC on last January 1, after three years announcing in the bay city. Before that, he worked at KLO, Ogden and for five years at KDYL in Salt Lake City. He's a native of Vancouver, Canada and got his first job on CJOR, immediately after completing high school and business college. He, Alan Young, Don Forbes, and Sid Chatton all started in radio together.

"Adopted"

One of the luckiest things ever happening to young Gourlay was meeting Harry Owens, famed conductor-composer of Hawaiian music. For several years he announced Owens' dance music in San Francisco and became more or less an adopted son of the noted musician.

"He helped us get a house when we moved down here," Doug waxed appreciative. "Us" means Doug's young wife, Audrey, and the couple's seven-months-old son, Douglas Henry.

Needless to say, the announcer's favorite brand of melody is Hawai-

ian. His pet sports are badminton and swimming. "Basking in the sun is okay, too," smiled Doug, "and we love to take week-end trips."

His favorite radio shows are *Bob Burns*, *Fred Allen*, and *Bing Crosby*, his favorite comedienne is *Cass Daley*, his chosen movie stars *Hope* and *Crosby*. Although he is no relation to *THE Crosby*, Gourlay's middle name is the same as *Bing's* surname.

Doug likes to read history and good books, reads *Time*, *Atlantic Monthly* and *Readers Digest* from cover to cover. "I glance through *Life*," he added. When asked what he liked to collect, he said, "Money. Yes, I'm very practical. Next to war bonds, my extravagances are food and clothes. I like Irish poplin ties. My favorite color is navy blue.

What He Likes

"What do I like on women? Sports clothes," he stated. "And I don't like to see women wear black. None but a terrific blond can wear a black dress. The others look like undertakers. I hate those doggone snoods, too," Doug said, gaining momentum. "Yes, and slacks!", with a mite more vehemence.

Asked about his culinary likes, Doug admitted, "I love candy, ice cream, and chocolate pudding. Oh, yeah. My mother used to make a

wonderful split pea soup. I guess my favorite meal would be tenderloin steak, mushrooms, mashed potatoes, and green peas. The only thing I can make is a wonderful dressing for shrimp."

About his musical accomplishments, Doug said, "I play the piano. Just 'Claire de Lune.' I used to work on the *Mary Marlin* show and there was a cut-in, so everybody who worked the show learned the 'Claire de Lune' theme so we could sub at a minute's notice if we had to."

Fried Eggs On Walk

When Gourlay, now only 29, was at KDYL in Salt Lake, he also served as special events director. "One hot day I remember we fried eggs on the sidewalk," he remarked. "Then, one year we waited two hours for the ground hog to come out and predict what kind of a spring we'd have. Finally, we discovered that the holes we had the mike set up in front of were gopher holes and that there hadn't been a ground hog in that neck of the woods for a hundred years."

Because he worked for so many seasons announcing from San Francisco's night spots, Gourlay is a late sleeper and it's hard for him to pull himself down to Radio City before noon. "I always feel miserable until three in the afternoon," he summed up pathetically.



RECIPE FOR BARBECUED BEANS

Drain 1 No. 2 can whole kernel corn. Drain 1 large (pound) can kidney beans. Add 1 large can Boston

style baked beans. One 11 oz. can plain chili con carne (without beans). Strain ½ cup chili sauce.

1 tsp. Worchester sauce. Pour in casserole and bake 1 hour in moderate oven (350°). **SERVES SIX.**

Thomas E. Dewey's Neighbor: Is Even Busier

estate granted by King George III. The parchment is inscribed on both sides, with the Royal Seal imposed in all its historic legality. Because the document is of so much interest to his friends (and to collectors, by the way) Thomas has never had it framed, but keeps it in a folder so those interested can read its closely written lines describing the estate and specifying the grant.

Of similar interest is another old deed Thomas has in his possession. This is to famous Quaker Lake which was granted by Queen Anne and remained in the same family for more than 200 years.

These two deeds are typical of the many treasures Thomas has on display in the beautiful Colonial house at "Clover Brook." Some of the "treasures" are not exactly suitable to living room decoration, so Thomas has a study on the top floor of the house filled with swords, spears, flintlocks, ancient trunks and other similar reminders of his visits to the remote corners of the world.

Suspended from the ceiling of this "trophy room" is a ship's huge wheel, rescued by Thomas from Coral Island. It is held in place by heavy ship's chains. Reclining peaceably against a long Quaker-built dining table in the room are bamboo poison sticks which Thomas received from pygmy tribes he once visited. The walls of the study are lined with books, as are the walls of the libraries on the first and second floors of the Thomas' home. He has more than 3,000 books in his collection. From the standpoint of value, one of the most remarkable of Thomas' trophies is a teakwood chest given him by the abbot of a Buddhist monastery. The chest is covered with 30 layers of thin gold. But all the treasures didn't come from foreign lands—for among the most prized trophies Thomas has are the three balls used in the 1942 World Series, when for the first time the Yankees were beaten. Each ball is autographed by the players and managers of each team.

Distinguished Neighbors

Now, more about the estate. Thomas has some distinguished neighbors. On the adjoining estate former ambassador to Great Britain Hugh Gibson has his home, Governor Thomas Dewey lives a mile away, Robert Montgomery of the screen has a family home nearby, and James Young, newsman famous for his book "Behind the Rising Sun," lives within walking distance.

These families, with the other intimates of the Thomas household, are regular visitors at "Clover Brook," for the Thomas' home is the scene of many and varied neighborhood activities: baseball games, for example, swimming meets, riding parties, square dances to which the

whole countryside, including many war veterans undergoing convalescence in a hospital nearby, is invited. Many of the good times enjoyed at "Clover Brook" take place in "the barn," a structure which houses a miniature broadcasting studio, sun porch, a huge dance floor, and an enormous lounging room built around a gigantic stone fireplace of stone slabs representative of the civilizations thousands of years old. "The barn," Thomas says, really belongs to the community of Pawling, and Thomas only "borrows" it when he needs the studio for broadcast from his home.

Then adjacent to "the barn" are the Thomas' own ski run, a tennis court, a swimming pool, a baseball diamond and a soft ball court.

So you see, despite the fact that Lowell Thomas is well known as the world's greatest traveller, that adventure and exploration are synonymous with his name, he's very much a "homebody," with as much time for his friends and family as for the career that has dazzled the world. Who could be busier than he?

VIRTUOUS VIRTUOSA


