

Linkletter, the big, blond, clean-cut fellow who handles the microphone for the Blue Network's "What's Doing, Ladies?" and NBC's "People Are Funny" programs, has learned a lot about people in the past ten years that he has emceed audience participation airshows.

He also has learned all the ins and outs of the ticklish art of ad-libbing. He has made ad-lib shows his specialty, and now Hollywood and San Francisco share him as emcee of their leading audience participation programs. He commutes between the two points weekly, and has a standing reservation on the "Lark" to do so.

"People are wonderful!" Linkletter beamed when we cornered him long enough for a chat about his unusual place of prominence in the radio spotlight. "Whenever I'm feeling low," he went on, "stepping out in front of an audience is like a shot in the arm. You can feel the presence of all those people. There's nothing like it."

When he gets ready to work with an audience, Art scans the sea of faces, searching for signs that show which ones will be the most fun. During a session of "What's Doing, Ladies," we watched him single out a woman in the third row whose face had been wreathed in smiles from the very start of the show. He knew she would supply good-natured answers to his breezy, friendly inquiries.

Hilarious Customer

When he asked her where her husband was, she replied with a giggle, "He's home, washing windows. Yes," she went on, "my husband is always helpful around the house. Yes, he does the dishes, too," she laughingly admitted in answer to Linkletter's playful banter.

"What day does he do the family wash?" grinned Art.

"I haven't gotten him that well-trained—yet," responded the lady, now thoroughly convulsed in giggles.

"Well, what do you do around the house?" laughed Linkletter.

By this time, his "victim" was too engulfed in mirth to make any reply and Art moved swiftly to another section of the studio, where he had spotted somebody else he knew would be fun.

Sometimes he attempts to guess facts about the individual he is interviewing, and a surprising number of times, he turns out to be right. We watched him as he walked up to one lady, said hello, and told her that she had been married for forty-two years. He missed it by just two counts. The lady had been married for forty-four years. Then he asked for her purse, and proceeded to ex-

amine its contents, naming the items into the microphone.

Reids Purses

He told us later that he had never found any article in a woman's purse that he couldn't mention over the air. A few things he has considered it good taste not to mention, however—among them, a can of stay-fast powder for false teeth. One of the funniest items was a tattered brown hair rat, with a comb dangling on the end of it.

Linkletter points out that people don't mind being ridiculed, as long as it's done with genuine good nature. "You can say most anything," explains Art, "as long as you say it with a smile."

Children and old people, he continues, are the most satisfactory people to interview. They have no inhibitions, and usually voice the truth quite candidly. Linkletter puts people at ease, simply by being so completely at ease himself.

He thoroughly enjoys every show he does. "In fact," he told us, "I do a lot more programs than I have any need of doing, just because I love doing them." He keeps physically fit,

doesn't smoke, drinks very little, gets plenty of sleep and exercise, and hasn't missed a show because of illness in eleven years.

Born in Massachusetts some thirty-two years ago, Art came west early in his youth and attended school in San Diego, acquiring an A.B. to teach English and dramatics. As an undergraduate in 1932, he received his first radio bid as a result of writing a



Soundmen Ad Lib, Too!

ACTORS aren't the only ones who find it necessary to ad lib once in a while, according to NBC sound effects headman Ed Ludas. The right thing to do, even more than the right thing to say at times when the sound effects DON'T go off when the show goes on, is the problem that confronts radio's acoustics experts.

"Like the time on Jack Benny's show when the telephone was supposed to ring and didn't," Ludas recalls from his experience. "The suspense was awful—the thing just wouldn't work—so finally one of the boys leaned over and said ting-a-ling-aling into the mike. It got a big laugh."

These little slips that pass do not always add up to a laugh, however, he pointed out. Especially when the

background setting is recorded and can't be duplicated in the studio. One big slip of this type occurred one time on the "First Nighter" program, which opens with a recording of the sounds of the crowded night as a taxi makes its way through midtown Manhattan to the "Little Theater Off Times Square." As a rule, that is. But on the night in question the record of the cross-town trip was placed on the turntable, the arm dropped upon it, and—nothing happened.

Kick Did It.

"I remember that particularly well because it was my first night on the show," Ludas relates. "I was frantic, sound refused to come out, so finally in desperation I kicked the machine." That, apparently, was all that was needed, for then the noise came on with a loud blast—luckily in the part where first nighters are already inside the theater and a hush has

begun to fall over the audience. Engineers quickly toned it down and fortunately lost only that first bit of the show.

NBC's sound effects dispensary head claims his most embarrassing moment in the line of duty was one time on the Sealtest show. It was the large end of a comedy buildup that went on for weeks in which Joan Davis made an ice cream soda. With each broadcast a few more sound effects were added to the ones on the preceding program until finally the soda-making project consisted of thirty solid seconds of

Goodbye Greasepaint

AND NOW, Larry Keating . . .

Listeners to Fleetwood Lawton's nightly program of news commentation have become familiar with that introduction and with the pleasing voice of the genial mikeman who answers to that name. What some of you might not know, however, is that Larry Keating came to radio with a background of distinctive achievement in the world of the theater. Before radio, his ability as a dramatic actor had gained him, many times over, the distinction of having his name in lights on Broadway.

Now he has forsaken the field of acting to become one of the airplane's favorite announcer-emcees on such popular programs as the Blue Network's "Scramby-Amby," "Hollywood Star Time" and "Club Good Cheer." So much the suave sophisticate in appearance, we wondered if there was ever a time when the affable Mr. Keating had found himself at a loss on the air.

When we put the question to him, he replied with a loud emphatic "Yes!"

"I was once asked to broadcast a description of a military service parade," he related, recalling his panic with a frantic query in our direction.

"Have you ever seen a multitude of men in khaki filing by? They're all alike! After the first fifteen minutes, I didn't have anything more to talk about!"

Up In the Air!

Then there was the time, in 1938 (when such a thing was quite unheard of), that Larry boarded a plane, with the well-known Dr. Lovelace of the Mayo Clinic, to zoom some six miles up into the stratosphere for a special broadcast.

Once up there, Keating, a novice in the business of "flying through the air with the greatest of ease," had no sooner settled back into his oxygen mask than he suddenly noted dark spots forming upon the glass windows of the plane. No one else seemed alarmed, however, so he attempted to accept it as a natural occurrence.

But soon the windows were completely opaque, and our suave announcer was fast losing his serene composure when the pilot burst through the door of his compartment and, looking straight at Larry, exclaimed excitedly, "The right motor's clogged! What'll I do?"

"What'll you do?" repeated our dazed mikeman in a weak voice, adding with a gulp, "You're asking me?"

All was well, however, when the

pilot made it known that he wasn't asking for technical advice on how to manipulate an airplane in an emergency, but rather, simply wanted to make it known to the radio man that the ship couldn't be kept in its stratospheric position for the completion of the special broadcast.

Nevertheless, Keating completed his mission to broadcast from the stratosphere, even attempting to do so minus his mask for the few seconds that his body could stand it.

Wouldn't Trade

In spite of such assignments that have made him sweat blood, Larry made it known that he wouldn't trade radio for any other medium of the theater. "Radio's the thing!" he declared with genuine enthusiasm.

"I've spent practically all my life in the theater," he continued. His first stage job was with Walter Gilbert, father of the late John Gilbert. Since then, he has appeared in some six hundred plays, including "White Cargo," "The Vagabond King," "Death Takes a Holiday" and "Reunion in Vienna," all on Broadway. He talks fondly of the old days when there was an opera house in every small town of America. He toured the country with road shows, and appeared in stock in twenty-six different cities.

He was playing a small-town theater when a talking picture called "The Jazz Singer" first made its appearance, and after viewing it one afternoon, he returned to his dressing room and commented to his fellow troupers, "Well, that's the end of this."

Keating made his final bows on the boards in the plays, "Queer People" with Gladys George and the late Hal Skelly, and in "Men in White," then left the cast of the latter for a vacation with his parents in Portland, Oregon. He became interested in radio there and joined the

There are prizes given away during the show, too, and tickets for the broadcast may be easily obtained by sending your request and a self-addressed stamped envelope to CBS, Columbia Square, Hollywood, 28.

Dem Bums!

It seems a radio controversy has been stirred up by that sequence on the August 6th Mutual variety quiz, "Quick As A Flash," during which two people, one named Paul, the other Greta, both speaking with a slight German accent, were heard bitterly discussing the attack by the Yanks on October 6, 1941, against the new order. It turned out that the two were discussing that World Series game in which Owen dropped a third strike, paving the way for the Yankees to win it.

The network and the program's producers have been flooded with telephone calls, letters and telegrams either lavishly praising the sequence or furiously attacking its authenticity.

Dick Lewis, one of the "Quick As A Flash" producers has a simple explanation for Paul and Greta. They were German refugees who had been transplanted to Brooklyn and had become faithful followers of those inimicable Dodgers.

History on Wax

CBS has contributed to the National Archives of the United States in Washington, D. C., sixty-seven 16-inch recordings which are a dramatic testimonial of history in the making. The discs are transcriptions of nearly sixteen hours of news programs broadcast by the Columbia network on D-Day, including eye-witness reports from landing craft, from bombers and the beaches, and the voices of General Eisenhower, King Haakon of Norway and the Prime Ministers of Belgium and The Netherlands.

It is CBS' second gift to the National Archives, whose collection dates back to 1789. The network's first contribution consisted of recordings of news of the first twenty-four hours of World War II.

In a letter accompanying the D-Day discs, Paul W. Kesten, CBS Executive Vice-President, wrote: "In finding room for this second presentation, we hope you will be able to reserve space for a third so that happier Americans may in better days hear how peace returned to the world."

Receives Award

Organized shortly after Pearl Harbor when the need for spiritual inspiration was so great, the daily "Minute of Prayer" feature heard on the KHJ-Mutual-Don Lee network, was presented with an Award for Distinguished Merit by the National Conference of Christians and Jews at a Yale Club luncheon in observance of Brotherhood Week.



musical comedy for school production, and through his junior and senior years he announced for a local station.

In 1935, he was made program director for KGB, San Diego, and handled the radio exploitation for the San Diego Fair. In 1936, the Texas Centennial made him program director and official master of ceremonies. The following year he was assigned as radio director for the San Francisco World's Fair, for which he wrote two theme spectacles, "The Cavalcade of the Golden West" and "America! Cavalcade of a Nation." In 1939, he resigned his post with the Fair to devote his entire time to free-lancing as an emcee, writer and radio producer.

San Francisco Stunts

Before his trek to Hollywood and his acquisition of the emceeing spot on the transcontinental "People Are Funny" program, Linkletter had become well-known to radio audiences in San Francisco for his adept handling of his other audience shows including "Who's Dancing Tonight?" and "What Do You Think?" The former originates from the Sir Francis Drake hotel where he interviews the couples who come to dance; the latter program is now discontinued due to the war. He presented both sides of current controversial topics, then asked members of his audience their opinions on the subjects, allowing them to say anything they pleased.

"An ad lib show," smiles Art, "is like a grab bag. It's full of surprises."

He told us he wouldn't want to do a gag show. "There's too much tension," he went on. "You have to be hitting for a home run every minute." On the other hand, he pointed out, an ad lib show comes easily and naturally.

His most difficult program is "People Are Funny," because it is just partially ad-libbed. "We have to work in and out of the script."

He considers the program's "warm-up" of equal importance to the show itself, for it is then that he must get his audience to feel friendly and relaxed.

Likes Large Audiences

He prefers working with large audiences—the larger, the better, and he always lets his audience choose the contestants. "They're never wrong," he explains. "They'll dispense with the smart-alecks every time. We merely want nice people who are willing to try."

He finds famed personalities eager to appear on the "People Are Funny" show, and they willingly fake part in the show's stunts. When Joan Davis appeared, for instance, she was hidden behind a screen while a sailor was being questioned.

Linkletter asked the Navy boy, "How would you like being shipwrecked somewhere on a romantic desert island with a beautiful movie star—like Joan Davis?"

"Joan Davis!" repeated the sailor in dismay. "Are you kidding?" Whereupon an "insulted" Miss Davis burst forth from behind the screen and the sailor's face turned a slight shade of scarlet.

Linkletter points out that people love to see someone embarrassed, when it's all in fun, of course.

"Almost all people are interesting in one way or another," declared Art. "There are three separate sources of conversational matter—who they are, what they've done, and where they've been." But when he does encounter a person who seems to have nothing to offer of interest or amusement about himself, Linkletter solves the situation by asking him or her for an opinion on a subject of interest.

If, by some chance, even that avenue should prove unsuccessful, he finds himself with the most ticklish problem of all—terminating an interview abruptly. An emcee must employ the most delicate tact to get the microphone away from persons who are either too talkative or too reticent.

Likes Children

Art's fondest dream is to work on the air with children, and he hopes to do so soon. He works with youngsters in YMCA activities and gets along with them exceptionally well. "I love kids!" he enthused, "and they like me, too. I've worked with 'em, played with 'em, and had 'em." He has a son, six, and a daughter, four. His wife is a non-professional.

Art has often included a joke about her during his shows. He tells his audiences, "I wish my wife were here, but she has to stay at home. We're expecting a bundle. The laundry!"

Now, come October, the Linkletters are expecting a bundle—and it won't be the laundry. Says Art with a happy twinkle. "I would insist on telling that old joke over and over again. Now, it's backfired!"

crash-bang noise.

"The concoction started out fairly logically with the sound of seltzer water fizzing, then came whistles, splintering wood, anvils clanking, chains rattling, shattering glass, cowbells jangling, thuds, clunks, and last of all, a large wooden crossbar pulled from a "crash tub" to simulate the sound of a splashing body," he relates.

Stole the Show

Our soundman really outdid himself working single-handedly up to this terrific buildup, then, at the climax, slipped in a little misplaced seltzer water and landed flat on his back, to steal the show from the

star. No ill effects. Just onlookers' convulsions.

Occasionally, in the case of recorded sound effects, either the cues or the records get mixed up and the right thing comes out at the wrong time. Once on the "Red Ryder" program in a spot where gunshot was supposed to come in loud, the order of discs had not been reversed since rehearsal and twittering of birds was all there was to accompany the actors' bloodcurdling screams, dying yells and melodramatic histrionics.

Ingenuity is required not only after things go wrong, but also when a script demands bizarre or unusual accompaniment. Ostrich footsteps called for in a recent Oboler show, "Ostrich in Bed"—so soundmen devised shoe-sized kapok-filled canvas pads with rubber spots and metal bolts fixed to the bottoms. Strapped to the feet and worn as sandals, the invention really produced the padded, scratching sound of the huge-footed bird.

The tinny muffled echoes that characterize voices in a submarine were hard to achieve for one of the "Latitude Zero" programs, but the sound effects crew managed to do it. They fixed together sheet metal arches the height of a man, sealed off one end with a booth in which they put an iron barrel, and radio actors spoke their lines inside this contraption. The desired subterranean effect was achieved.

Listeners Frozen

Another program on the same series called for the cry of "Griffon," a weird imaginary monster. So they took a recording of a panther's cry, speeded it up terrifically (automatically raising the pitch), then suddenly slowed it down (and deepened the pitch) so that a shriek-to-growl noise came out to freeze listeners to their chairs.

Things do not always sound like what they are, otherwise the sound effects department's job would be greatly simplified. It is particularly hard to reproduce the sound of a heavy castle door slamming in a small studio. Complex machines and motor-driven vehicles, such as sewing machines, cars, trains, lawn mowers and a host of other mechanical devices must be simulated in the studio by other means on the spot or via recordings. So many minor sounds made by these mechanisms are picked up and amplified by the microphone that the real thing would be unrecognizable over the air. Then there are planes in flight, the cranking of a mineshaft, and street cars on a bridge, all of which must be duplicated because of obvious studio limitations.

Though they do not contribute to the drama in so many words, radio's soundmen are just as much troupers as the actors. They have their scripts and cues and work out their own interpretations of their parts, interpretations which are always ingenious and occasionally impromptu—for soundmen sometimes have to ad lib, too!

Which Niles?

BIZARRE Hollywood unfurled a fresh oddity the other day: an extremely successful radio announcer who wishes to high heaven that he were someone else!

The gentleman in distress is Wendell Niles, whose brother, Ken, is likewise an extremely successful radio announcer. What makes Wen wish he were someone else is the persistent confusion between Wen and Ken—a confusion that's everything their names imply. To spice the situation is the fact that Wen Niles really has priority on his name, for he was born two and a half years sooner than his brother. But he broke into Hollywood radio after Ken was an established Hollywood name. So here professionally, Ken had priority over Wen, or do you follow us?

The time for him to turn into someone else, Wendell now admits,

was when he first began looking for announcing jobs in Hollywood circa 1935. Practically every producer to whom he applied for work crisply commented: "We know Ken, but we don't know Wen. Are you trying to cash in on his reputation?"

For a short while, as a counter-attack to such remarks, Wendell used two noms de mike: John Dennison (his mother's surname) and Ronald Drake (a name bestowed on him by George Burns when Wen started doing his first coast-to-coast show with him and Gracie). But it wasn't long before Wendell reverted to his own moniker. And led straight into the confusion worse confounded.

Fine Background

If Wendell weren't such an affable chap he would have been slightly irked at his Hollywood reception. For while brother Ken was still in college, Wen was already busy emblazoning his name across the musical marquee as an orchestra leader of marked ability.

"I've really been in radio longer than Ken," he laughed. "I started entertaining in 1923 when I organ-

ized an orchestra and emceed at Missoula, Montana, where I was attending university. Then, my elder brother, Russell, who is now a professor of law at N.Y.U. helped me line up a tour which took the band to the Orient. We were in Yokohama right after the quake.

Wendell followed the boom into Florida and built his musical organization up to fourteen members. He, himself, became proficient with guitar, banjo, drums, and singing baritone.

After the Florida bubble broke, Niles and his Montanans were hired for one of their most important engagements: the swank Lake Placid Club in New York state. "One contract I remember was for \$100,000," Wendell recalls. "I cleared about \$1500 a week. We played at Lake Placid for five seasons. Between seasons, we followed Whiteman as ship's orchestra on the Leviathan, played at London's Kit Kat Club and Picadilly Club. Our last trip was in 1927." Subsequent contracts with the Statler Hotel chain fell through in

Perpetual Motion

Billie Burke makes one wonder if the secret of perpetual youth lies in perpetual motion. She is enthusiastic about all things domestic and artistic, was personally overseeing the mixture of paints destined for the walls of her home. She does as much of her own housework as time permits and delights in trying out new recipes from her cookbook collection. She also is an avid Victory gardener—claims she "raises flowers for morale"—and finds time for Red Cross work. Billie Burke does all of this in addition to her weekly radio program and frequent appearances as guest star on other airline shows.

In addition to entertaining millions with her portrayals of flighty females who use the wrong word at the right time—but with dignity—Miss Burke has had a rich and colorful life. Her library, in addition to



Brains Behind the Baton

Phi Beta Kappa Discards His Advertising Ideas to Become Top Notch Bandleader-Arranger



BANDLEADER PAUL WESTON followed Horace Greeley's advice, "came West" to Hollywood to become ace arranger and man-behind-the-baton on NBC's "Chesterfield Music Shop."

IT wasn't his Phi Beta Kappa key that opened the door to musical fame and fortune for Bandleader-Arranger Paul Weston. The brains behind his baton have to do with more than just books.

The very talented young man who is responsible for the way the music comes out on NBC's "Chesterfield Music Shop" is a Phi Beta Kappa from Dartmouth who originally planned on an advertising career. When he was in college Weston bought an \$8 clarinet, and learned to play it just well enough to be in the band so he could go to all the football games free. Then, though it didn't appear to be the first step toward the musical bigtime at the time, he organized a campus dance orchestra and began writing arrangements.

Paul Weston is responsible for the best-known arrangements of the Johnny Mercer specialties "Do-Ration Blues" and "G. I. Joe," the smooth Jo Stafford recording of "It Could Happen to You," as well as all the song arrangements from "Holiday Inn"—"White Christmas," "Be Careful, It's My Heart," "Abraham."

He got his start doing arrangements for Joe Haymes' band in New York. Rudy Vallee heard his work, liked it, called him, and the next thing he knew he was signed to do the musical adaptations for the Fleischman show. Phil Harris was another recipient of his earliest efforts.

Extensive Experience

From 1935 to 1940 Paul did all the arrangements for Tommy Dorsey's band. After that he worked with Bob Crosby for awhile, came to Hollywood with the band, and once here free lanced and did arrangements for Glen Gray, singer Joan Merrill, and Lee Wiley's record albums. Then he arranged and conducted the orchestra for a number of Dinah Shore's recordings. He later worked with Ginny Sims, did the music for the Fibber McGee and Molly show, and other radio work, climaxed by his present alliance with Johnny Mercer, whom he met when both of them were working on the Paramount picture "Star Spangled Rhythm." In ad-

dition to all the arrangements for "Holiday Inn," he has done other film work, and records for Capitol.

Weston is quiet-mannered, has a friendly gleam in his eye and is easy to talk to. He is 32, of medium height, and has brown wavy hair and hazel eyes.

An Eastern boy who came West, he claims he is a conservative by inclination as well as heritage. He referred to spectacular Hollywood tastes when it comes to clothes, said "At first I felt as if I didn't belong, but now that I've had time to get accustomed to the Hollywood way of dressing I like it." Weston wears tweeds and sport clothes, not dull but conservative.

"What's His Racket?"

When he first began arranging, he claims his father was always being asked by old friends and neighbors back in Springfield, Massachusetts, "Just what is it that Paul DOES?" in a what's-his-racket tone of voice. "It was a little difficult to explain at first—they knew I didn't write the words or the music, and at that time I didn't lead the band, either. Dad finally worked out his own explanation of me in self-defense, I guess," he told us.

Arranging is adapting a piece of music to voice or instruments other than those for which it was originally written—specifically, in Paul's case, adapting simple vocal tunes or piano compositions for a large orchestra or for several voices (the Pied Pipers) or both.

As to his method of going about his work, Paul explained that he pays close attention to the lyrics, but particularly tries to follow the mood closely. "I got into the habit of doing that when I was working with Dinah," he said. He gets his best results working at the piano, "even

if it isn't the most approved method." He sometimes gets out of bed in the middle of the night to jot down ideas—notes, that is—that come to him. He demands complete solitude when he writes music, is unmarried and lives alone in an apartment.

"What type of tunes do you like best to arrange?" we asked him. "All kinds, as long as they're good and musically solid," he answered. Songwriters Harry Warren, Harold Arlen and Jimmie Van Husen rank tops with him on that score. For the last three years he has been specializing in vocal arrangements.

Disagrees With Trotter

Popular music alone is not the limit to his musical tastes, although he admits a liking for just about everything from ballads to boogie-woogie in the popular field. As to classical preferences, he has an aversion to much of the dissonant modern music, is particularly fond of the music of Richard Strauss, Brahms, and Rachmaninoff. "John Scott Trotter and I disagree violently on Rachmaninoff," he commented. "Trotter thinks he's too sweet."

As a hangover from his kid days when he wanted to be a professional ball player and did anything to get out of practicing his piano lessons, Paul proves he's still an ardent baseball fan, goes to the local pro games whenever he has a chance. He plays golf, but hasn't had much time for that since the Chesterfield show began. "Ten shows a week keep me rather busy," he remarked.

He hates to get up in the morning, but admits the new-found routine which his present work necessitates is probably a good thing. "It's the first time in my life I've had any order in my life, and I like it for a change," he says. He tells us he has

1929 with Wall Street's debacle. Niles tried to hold his band together, but those were not dancing times and eventually he had to give up his group.

Studied Aeronautics

Enrolling at N.Y.U., he completed a specialized course to prepare him as a ground school instructor. Spurred on by his love of flying, he made top grades and finished third in his class. "Sort of subsalutatorian," he chuckles. "It was the first time in my life I was ever good in school."

In Seattle he opened a flying school, the largest north of San Francisco, boasting of forty-five students and four planes. This flourishing venture abruptly collapsed just when Wendell had high hopes for an experimental plane in which he had sunk \$12,000. The creditors clamped down on the eve of the ship's debut. "I had nothing left but my scrapbook," he remarks of this disappointing period.

"I decided to get back into show business and took up leading the Olympic Hotel's orchestra and working as an announcer at KOL."

Coming to Hollywood, Niles worked at Warner Brother's station, then succeeded in snagging the Burns and Allen announcing stint after taking a blind audition under the name of John Dennison. "Starting then," he observed, "I've never been without a network show." Wen's voice pitched just a little lower than Ken's, has been heard on such programs as Chase and Sarnborn, Joe Penner, Bob Hope, Al Pearce, and currently on Johnny Mercer, Charlotte Greenwood, and Billie Burke's shows.

"Sometimes when I'm seeing a movie that Ken or I have done the narrating for, I can't tell at first whether I'm hearing my voice or Ken's," Wen stated. Everyone says mine is lower and that Ken laughs more than I do."

All In Family

Objects of confusion to themselves and their fans, the brothers Niles carry on in true family fashion when it comes to hunting and fish-together and filling in at the mike when the other one is ill or needs a vacation. Wendell also likes to swim and play badminton and to read good historic novels. "I let my wife take care of the mystery stories," he grimaced.

Flying is still a passion with him. Before the war he owned and flew a plane together with Russ Johnstone, Bob Garred, and Bill Goodwin. At present he exercises his interest in flying by helping his two sons, Wendell Jr., 13, and Denny, 10, build minutely precise models.

Stocky, five-foot nine Wen, whom five foot nine and a half lean Ken does not resemble in any special way, thinks he inherited his father's features. Wen Jr. resembles Wen Sr.,

but Denny looks like his small, pertly blonde mother, Joan, who became Mrs. Niles sixteen years ago. Ken is thirty-seven and a half, his brother will be forty next December 29.

Wendell and his family live in Hidden Village in a delightful white, Colonial, two-storied house which they bought about a year and a half ago. The Niles also have a 450-acre ranch in the San Joaquin Valley on which they raise cattle and alfalfa.

Mikeman Wen is generally seen around the studios wearing smart sports jackets and slacks, but he affects more subdued combinations than Ken.

"Comfortable shoes are my pet indulgence," he confided. "I own forty pairs, mostly brown." Always sure to be noticed in the Wendell Niles ensemble is his handsome wrist watch. "Muntz gave it to me after we travelled together to Arizona to do a broadcast," he grinned.

Travelled With Hope

During his association on the Bob Hope show, Niles has experienced many pleasurable and exciting incidents, especially on the camp trips which the comedian has taken. "With Hope I've travelled the equivalent of around the world several times," the announcer said. "We covered 20,000 miles in March alone." Frequently he has served as Hope's golfing partner.

Speaking of his air work, Wendell commented: "Some folks say you're through when you stop being nervous over a show. I never get nervous, perhaps because I used to fight and for two years was light-weight champion of Montana. If you're through when you stop being nervous, then I was through when I started!"

Recently in a concerted effort to end the confusion between him and brother Ken, Wen has asked his business associates to call him "Wendell."

But the Wen-Ken scramble persists, even to the point of one being paid for the other's work.

The other day when Wen was signed for the Billie Burke show, Ken cracked: "I see you're going to do 'Fashions in Rations.' I hope they send me the check!"

He has spent considerable time in every state of the union, but wouldn't trade California for any of them.

Keating is forty-five years old, just under six feet tall, has dark gray hair, and wears a mustache. He is married, has two children, and lives in Hollywood.
