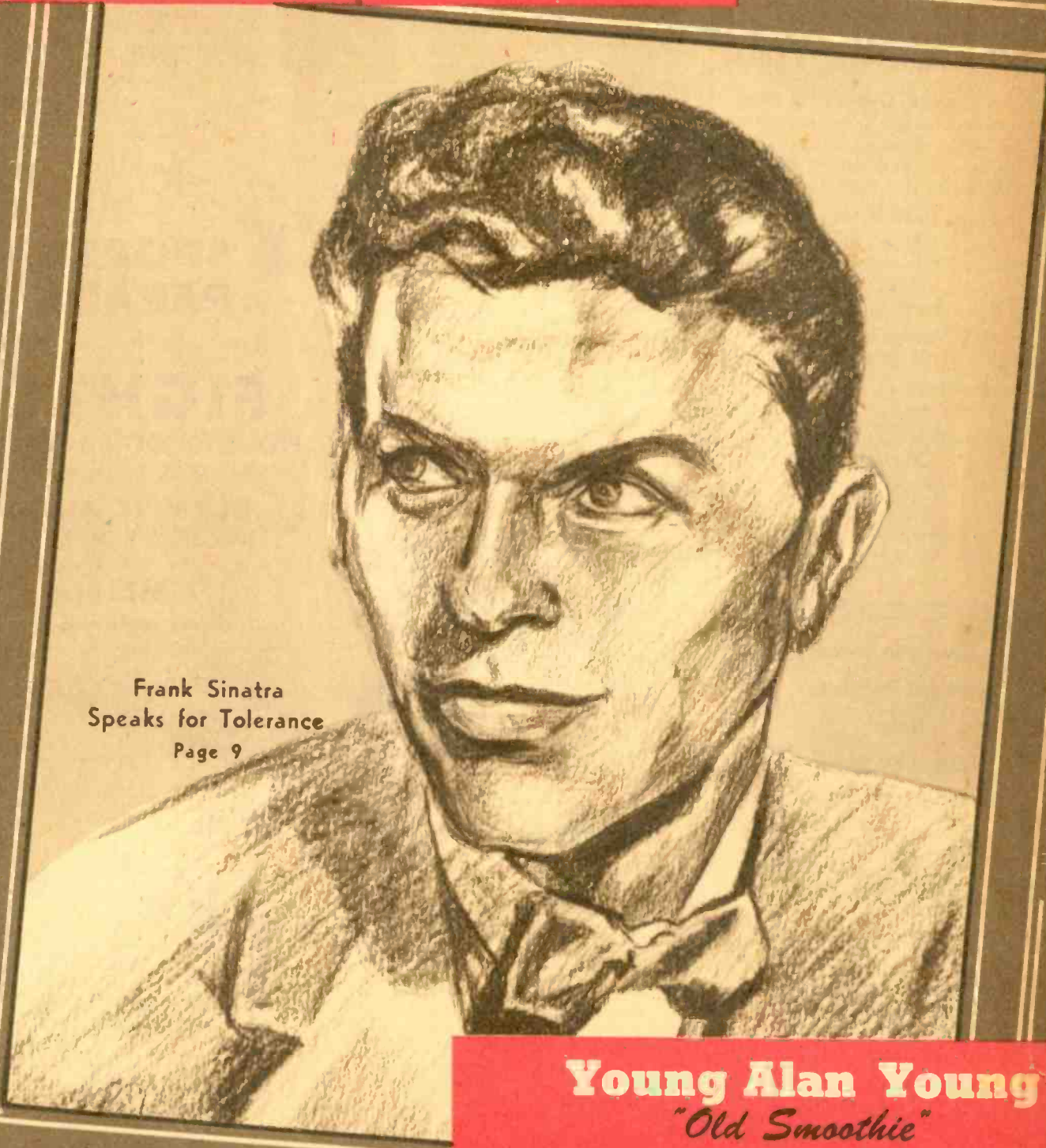

WAY BACK in 1939, it was a common belief in ether circles that the nightly "Richfield Reporter" put radio to bed. "Huh uh," said the air-minded heads of Thrifty Drug Stores, "we don't believe it. And we'll prove it."

through Friday) is rounding out its sixth year (and doing nicely on Hooperatings); "Hollywood Spotlight," featuring George Fisher (KECA, 2:45 p.m. Monday through Friday) is filling its sixth cycle; "The Green Hornet" (KECA, 9:30 p.m. Saturday), a thrilling mystery series, still shares honors with the gory "Haunting Hour" (KFI, 9:30 p.m. Friday); "Baukhage Talking" (KECA, 11 a.m. Monday through Friday), from Washington, is one of Thrifty's most popular shows; and for the younger fry, Don Otis presents "America's Top Tunes" (KMPC, 5:45 p.m. Monday through Friday.) Cal Tinney's comments are a new Thrifty air-feature (10 p.m., KECA, Monday through Friday.)

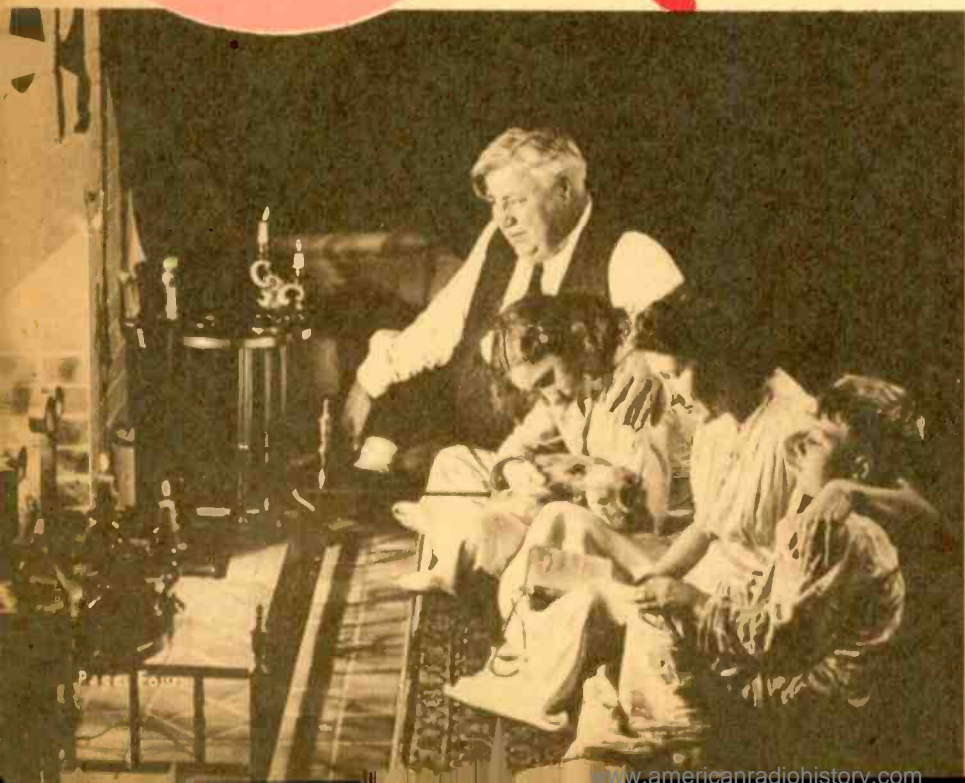
Jane—are his severest critics. "We really have a big conference when I come back home for breakfast after the show," he related, "and they tell me just what they think—good and bad."

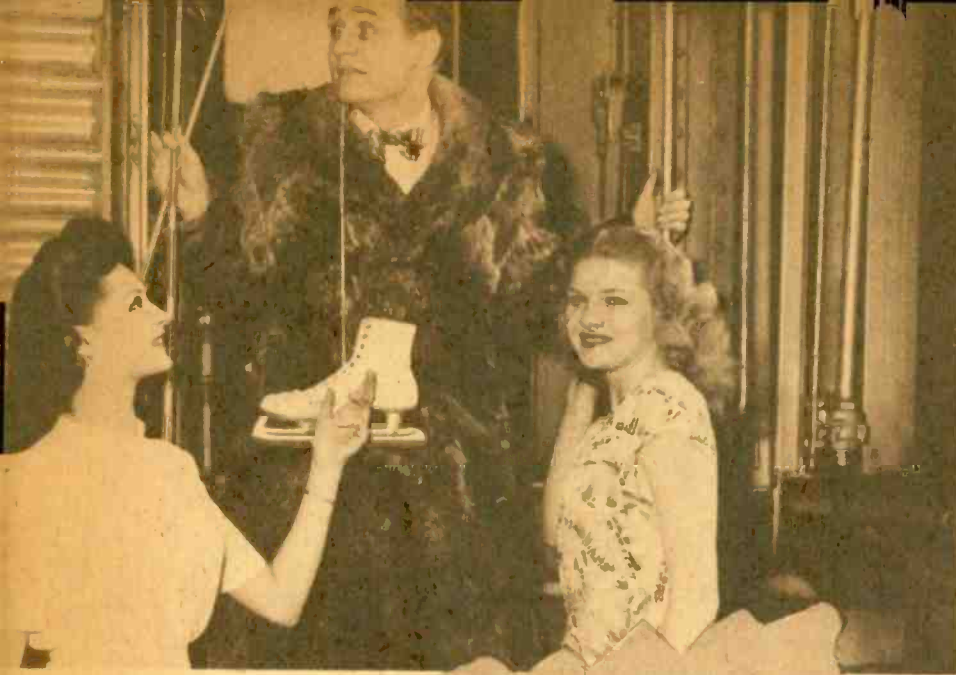

THE LOS ANGELES Chamber of Commerce is going to love Alan Young! Wait until it gets an earful of the kind words he's sending sunny (at this writing) California's way. Let's face it. For a New York resident—that's a concession.

But that's the way Alan is. He's one of the nicest young men you'd ever want to meet. He's enthusiastic about all of good old Cal's fatal charms; he likes her people, he likes her climate, and he likes her Radio Row. Needless to say, those are the requisites for a smash hit.

Upon meeting ABC's rising young ether comic, one is greeted by a slightly-built young man of twenty-six, with silver blond hair and clear

blue eyes. He's a quiet family man who presents a picture of a serious college student.

But place him before his Friday night audience and he becomes one of the liveliest comics on the air-planes. We were intrigued by this young Mr. Young and sought an opportunity to lunch with him shortly

after his arrival. We found an Alan who is a devoted husband and father, who neither smokes nor drinks, and an Alan who possesses a keen sense of showmanship with a theatrical background to match. The combination is amazing.

His rise wasn't meteoric. He was born in England and moved to Can-

ada at the age of four. He made his first radio appearance while in high school and received his training at a small station. He wrote a network show which was good enough to warrant him a spot on the air. The "Alan Young Show," as it is today, was a summer replacement which

"You dirty Wop!"

Those three short, ugly words are responsible for a drive that is being felt in every part of the nation—everywhere that the voice is carried by radio. One of the spearheads of the drive is Citizen Frank Sinatra and it is his voice, stilled of its crooning, but earnest in its sincerity, which is pleading with the nation, most particularly the nation's youth for tolerance and tolerance's more active sister, understanding.

As an underprivileged son of foreign-born parents, New Jersey-born Sinatra early learned the sting of the address derogative, and he decided that when, and if, the opportunity came he would do his utmost to keep other children from suffering those stings. The opportunity came and Sinatra remembered his pledge.

By the radio—over his Wednesday night CBS show—through the motion picture, "The House I Live In," through personal appearances and addresses to the youth of the country in high schools in various sections of the land, Sinatra has carried his cry for racial and religious tolerance and understanding.

Although he started his campaign with no thought of any personal return, awards and medals have been heaped on him, and now is coming the best award of all: Sinatra, who thus far has been carrying on the campaign almost single-handed, is going to have help. His friends in the entertainment world are rallying to the cause and now, instead of Sinatra alone, groups of them are initiating meetings with the idea of forming a nation-wide organization to combat intolerance and bigotry. This organization, however, is still in the earliest formative stages, but as soon as possible, Radio Life will let you know which of and how your favorites are participating.

Thus it is, in recognition of Sinatra's campaign, we place his picture on this week's cover of the Magazine. The cover sketch, itself, has interest. It was drawn by talented, sixteen-year-old Rene Lee Bergstrom, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Lee Bergstrom of Hollywood. Native daughter Rene Lee has been sketching ever since her play-pen days, is now entering USC to major in art. She is also an ac-

complished pianist and an ice skater, has appeared in pictures with Sonja Henie. Her sister, Carmela, is married to Jim Jordan Jr., son of "Fibber McGee and Molly".

Cantor's Side

There was no one more surprised by the Canadian Network's banning of Eddie Cantor's NBC airshow than the comedian himself. The Network's explanation read "The Eddie Cantor show was refused by the CBC for a number of reasons, but mainly because it did not meet CBC standards of program acceptance."

Variety is quoted as saying, "There is no secret, however, that there's been not a little eyebrow-raising in many homes and by certain groups over Cantor's frequent reference to his large output of daughters."

Mr. Cantor remarked to his associates that he saw no wrong in his frequent references to his five daughters. Every comedian was characterized by a trademark of his own, such as Crosby's horses, Sinatra's undernourishment, Benny's stinginess, etc. And to Cantor, the constant joke about his daughters was a running gag—all part of the game.

House-Cleaning

It has been announced that the new owners of Station KMTR intend putting into effect a new policy for their programs. Notifications of cancellation for all existing sponsored programs have been sent out, and commencing March 11th, the station will start accepting only carefully scrutinized shows.

Included in the house-cleaning campaign, is the enlargement of the station's studios and offices. There will be five studios, complete with a one-hundred-and-fifty seat auditorium. No personnel changes are contemplated.

Not So Jivey

The song-popularity contest just concluded on Dick Haymes' CBS show, has revealed rather interesting facts regarding choice of music by fans. It's the old songs like "I'm Always Chasing Rainbows" and "Stardust" that seem to hold first place in the affections of Joe Public & Family—in fact, the only new song up in the top fifteen bracket is "Symphony."

Letters accompanying listeners' choice of songs are also proving of interest. One woman mentioned "Dick Haymes, Helen Forrest, Gordon Jenkins, and Four Hits in the Mist." Another woman wrote: "Rhapsody in Blue" WAS a great song—a masterpiece of wrong tense, we'd say.

Academy Award Theater

A new airshow being readied for a March 30th debut on CBS is the "Academy Award Theater." The program will present dramatic adaptations of pictures that have either won Academy Awards or have been nominated for them. In some instances, the show will be built around individuals who have been either "Oscar" winners or nominees—including technicians, writers, directors and composers as well as actors.

*From One Sports Fan to Another—
Bill Stern Tells Radio Listeners the
Thrills of Major Sportscasting*

THERE'S ONLY one thing wrong with talking to Bill Stern. It just can't last long enough!

Bill comes to California once a year to broadcast the Rose Bowl game and already we're starting to look forward to next year! All he ever sees of our favorite state is football season—then back to New York until Rose Bowl time rolls around again. This has been going on for nine years.

How did this year's game stack up? Well, according to expert Stern, it was a better than average football game, but not among the best of the Bowl classics.

Though Bill is a phenomenal advertiser, the preparations for the Pasadena event are far from spur of the

moment. The minute the teams have been determined, he contacts the graduate managers of both sides and gets complete name lists and biographical material on the first, second and third teams, and color stories on the coaches and colleges. He charts the teams and memorizes all his material.

"It takes me about eight hours to memorize it all," Bill explained. "For instance, this year S.C. brought forty-eight players and Alabama brought thirty-four. Alabama used every man it brought, so you can see that I have to keep up on every player. The last time Notre Dame played the Bowl it brought a hundred and six players!" Stern does have slips typed with several lines of information about the players pinned on a board above him, but he doesn't get much chance to refer

to them. "Things happen too fast," he smiled. "If there's something happening and the crowd starts to roar, the radio audience can hear them and it wants to know what's going on that instant. I can't often take time out to refer to my notes."

ON THE THIRD floor of CBS' bustling Hollywood Station there's a room packed full of enough post-war "can't gets" to make Mrs. Housewife happy for life. There are irons, mixmasters, vacuum cleaners, sheer nylons, blankets, shirts, furs, solid silver serv-

ices, and G. E. mangles. Many more mysterious things tucked away in boxes of all sizes are revealed, on occasion, to pique the peeper's curiosity.

Guardian (Santa Claus would be a more appropriate title) of the aforementioned "goodies," is a handsome young man named Fred Kroemer. He is assistant to producer Gordon Hughes, who, in turn, is re-

sponsible for the Sunday airer, "Hope Chest." And all of those wonderful items comprise the hope chest.

It all began with an idea from writer, ex-radio man Roy Maypole. Maypole, you will recall, deals largely with veteran rehabilitation. Said Roy, "We all know that love stories have been the best sellers

throughout the ages. Well, I wanted to combine an audience participation quiz show with sweet and laughable anecdotes. And so the idea for the show evolved from the dreams and plans of couples who are soon to be married."

Several weeks ago, "Hope Chest," with Jimmy Wallington billed as "everybody's best man," made its ether debut. The audiences thought it was grand fun. This was experienced Wallington's first participation show and he wasted no time in starting the ball rolling.

Full Chest

Four couples are interviewed each week by Wallington. Five Chancellors of Cupid's Court (picked from the audience beforehand) decide upon the most appealing couple (determined entirely by their story) and elect them Cupid's Couple. This lucky twosome walks away with the afternoon's Hope Chest, which is packed with approximately \$1,000 worth of gifts.

A generous angle of the show is the fact that no couple goes unrewarded. After each interview, the boy and girl are amply gifted, with nobody going home empty-handed.

Kroemer, Hughes, Wallington, and Maypole work from broadcast to broadcast, and at this writing, some fifty letters are weekly pouring in requesting interviews. The only requisite asked of the couples is that they are prospective bride and groom.

At the pair's convenience they are interviewed by the four above-named gentlemen. Decision of the judges rests upon the pathos or comedy sit-

uation of the couples' stories. No impertinent questions are asked, only those pertaining to generalities of how the couple met, when he proposed, etc.

Gifts Are Special

After each broadcast's contestants are chosen, Kroemer proceeds to buy the gifts. Gifts are never chosen at random, but are picked specifically for a certain couple.

The Chancellors of Cupid's Court

are picked weekly from the participating audience. Wallington seeks out the oldest married couple, the youngest married couple, any spinsters "who'll own up to it," and bachelors. It's good clean fun for all, points out Maypole, with the old reliable institution of marriage taking a ribbing. And, concludes Maypole, at this writing, only two of the many male contestants have not been ex-servicemen.

IT WAS THE NIGHT before "Hope Chest"—and Fred Kroemer is still on the phone. Though there's not much room left on his desk—the chances are it will be covered even more before air-time.

"Win, Place or Show" Is Air Version of Fast Horse Race

Saturday, 8:30 p.m., KECA

IT'S RADIO'S newest, thrill-packed, race track game . . . "Win, Place or Show!" Here's how it's played. Each contestant (jockey) picks the horse he likes from the name and odds posted on the tote-board. The name of the horse indicates the nature of the questions. The odds give an inkling as to how tough the questions are to answer. The bigger the odds, the harder the questions. So, after picking your horse it's up to you to decide whether to go for win, place or show. You must answer all three questions right for "win" money, two for "place" money, or one for "show" money. After choosing your position you must bring your horse home in that position or better. In any case, you are only paid for the position you choose. If you lose, the posted odds on that horse go to the person who sent in

the questions, and you return to the barn to bite your nails and await your chance to win the fifty dollar American Handicap at the end of the show.

When Dwight Hauser, originator-producer, presented the show, he visualized a radio program that would bring listeners all the color, thrills and excitement of a day at the races. But it took two and one-half years of constant plugging to arouse any interest. (Incidentally, during that time Dwight won, with his series, "Destination Tomorrow," the 1945 award for writing and producing the program contributing most to interracial harmony and understanding in America.)

Can't Lose

Radio executives were afraid only race track habitues would listen to the program—but J. Donald Wilson,

young, far-sighted ABC program director for the West Coast, saw the possibilities of a colorful game that would capture the atmosphere and actual feeling of a big time race track. Only this track would pay out lots of that long green stuff instead of enticing you to spend it.

To keep everything strictly horsey, a man who could play the character of a race track tout was wanted—a guy who had all the information, knew all the answers, and got his dope straight from the horse's mouth. So ABC bought a ticket to win on Eddie Marr.

Eddie ("Tell you what I'm gonna do") Marr, born, bred and buttered in show business, took to the job like a bookie to telephones. He even dresses the part in a straw hat, oversized, loud bow tie, sport coat with white buttons and a glad-hand smile. But instead of giving his ap-

proval to gambling, Eddie hands the wisecracks a backhand with his opening line, "Hello, Suckers—wanta lay some lettuce on the nose of a nag?"

From then on Eddie makes with the entertainment, hot tips, and quiz questions—and continues to keep it plain that the only way to bet on the bang-tails and not lose your shorts is on "Win, Place or Show."

As in all horse races Lady Luck has more to do with winning than actual knowledge. One jockey, a lawyer by trade, answered five different questions in a row and was ready to step over the finish line. A young Marine answered one question, leaving the other four horses still at the post. On his sixth try the lawyer answered wrong, and was sent

back to the barn. Just then the bell rang, ending the handicap, and the young Marine after answering only one simple question found himself decorated with a flower-covered horseshoe as large as himself. He was richer, too, by \$122.

As on all quiz shows many moments arrive when the emcee wishes

he has never grown tired of it. He sounds enthusiastic because he really is. He doesn't root for any particular player or team—he roots for the score. The closer the better. "I just pull for a good game. I know that if the score gets too far apart, I'll start losing listeners so I pull for the underdog."

Bill's choice as the most thrilling moment he's witnessed in sports, however, is in the realm of boxing. "It was the Joe Louis-Tony Galento fight," he related. "Louis was, of course, the favorite. Tony was old, out of training, fat and flabby—without a chance in the world of beating Louis. They came out into the ring, and then the impossible happened. Galento hung one on Louis' jaw that had three hundred pounds of fat and beer belly and a fighting heart behind it. I could see Louis' eyes glaze over and he sagged. The fight was nearly over right there and then. It took Louis four rounds to recover from that one blow, meanwhile he back-pedaled, kept out of Tony's way, gaining strength. He finished Tony off. But that one moment of seeing the guy who hadn't a chance do the impossible is the most thrilling thing I've seen in sports."

When a contest is too uneven, Bill's enthusiasm mounts as he tries to keep his air audience interested. His favorite cartoon is one of Max Baer leaning over the ropes of a boxing arena and saying to an enthusiastic Stern, "Take it easy, Bill, you're wearing me out!"

Bill says that his natural gift of gab and his great love of sports led him to the field of sports reporting. "Besides," he laughed, "when people heard me play the saxophone, they insisted I'd make a wonderful sports reporter." (We don't know about that—if you missed Bill playing "Somebody Stole My Gal" on his saxophone on a recent Kay Kyser show, we'd say you missed THE musical event of the season.) Once in a great while his ad lib fails him. "I don't become silent," he said ruefully, "I just get a mouthful of marbles and try to say three different things at the same time. I once ad libbed for two hours one afternoon when the bleachers collapsed while I was waiting for the football game to begin."

Bill couldn't tell the radio audience what had happened because the confusion of people who thought they might have relatives and friends in the stand would have caused a riot. "The radio audience could hear the confusion and the ambulance sirens in the background, but I just kept on talking."

Suffered Nightmare

It was during the reception of the

fleet in New York harbor several years ago that the nightmare of all announcers came true for Bill. He was on the U.S.S. Washington, Ben Grauer and Jimmy Wallington were on two other ships and a three way commentary was arranged to describe the reception. Only it turned out to be strictly a one-way commentary—they couldn't get the mike off Bill's ship!

What do you do in a case like that? "Well," said Bill, "you just talk all afternoon. You interview the captain and tell about his wife and little kiddies waiting for him at home, you talk about the first mate and the second mate. They fired off the guns for me, and I described that. Then we went down into the engine room and I described the machinery. I gave what is, without a doubt, the worst explanation of how and why a boat runs. I'd say something like, 'Well, folks, there's a big piece of machinery in front of us and it's going round and round.' After all, there's nothing duller than a man describing a boat moving through the ocean."

Silence Trying

Besides his radio show, you hear the voice of Bill Stern in the two newsreels a week he does for MGM and the twelve movie shorts a year that he makes for Columbia. He has also done several television broadcasts. "The hardest thing for me, and for all other sports reporters, to learn about television is to keep our mouths shut. I keep forgetting that the audience is seeing just about the same thing I am. We try to make it exactly the way you see a game in the newsreels." According to Stern, the improved television camera can now televise football games in the foggiest weather, and even take close-ups. Cameras are set up at the goal lines and at the fifty-yard line, so a good deal of the time there are no explanations necessary on the part of the reporter.

Stern is married and lives in New York. He has a little boy, Peter, five, and a little girl, Mary May, two. Peter listens to his father on the radio and has been known to shout into the speaker, "Daddy, you're talking too fast!" Peter is also under the impression that when he hears Stern announcing a football game that it is his father who is playing. When it's over he turns to his mother and asks, "Did Daddy win?"

Peter, you've got a smart Pop. The way he plays the game, he's the only guy who always wins!
