From Strings to Screams

*Gorgeous Virginia Gregg Mixed Murder
With Music, Got Harmonious Air Career*

FOR a gal who has been killed in every way conceivable to the mind of a radio writer, Virginia Gregg is surprisingly chipper about it. "I like horror shows," she explains, "and besides I developed a terrific scream."

"Ah, ha," we coyly thought, "we'll label this tall, svelte blonde, 'The Scream'."

"Fine," she agreed, "but I'm not screaming so much these days. I've been graduated to dramatic and comedy roles."

This is what Virginia prefers. Like every good air thespian she longs for a show of her own, but until that day she wants to work on as many programs as possible. She lists as her favorites, "Rogue's Gallery," "This Is My Best," "Mayor of the Town," and the former Bullocks show.

"No," pondered Virginia, "I take it back. I don't think I really have favorites. They're all wonderful to work."

Believe it or not, Miss G. works seven days a week, because she likes it. But it isn't a case of all work and no play with Ginny. She's an excellent hostess and frequently entertains her guests with small informal parties. She boasts about her cooking, but looks the other way when sewing is mentioned. And then there is music.

Music a Gateway

Ginny's music is a story within itself. She began her professional life as a bass viol player, but she insists her heart was never in it. She wanted to act.

Upon completion of a course at Pasadena Junior College, she at-

tended the Pasadena Playhouse. The road to becoming an actress was a tough one and so she joined the Singing Strings group and found herself on the air.

From the Singing Strings Ginny drifted into screams. "The day I received a chance to act instead of wield a bow, I sold the bass viol," she recalled, "and I haven't been near one since."

That didn't put an end to her love of music, though. She'll listen to anything that has rhythm and has a large collection of records, which she enjoys playing for her friends.

In 1941, she built a home in the Los Feliz district and furnished it in modern Chinese. "I'd rather spend a quiet evening there than brave crowded night clubs," she confessed.

Not a bachelor girl, Ginny shares her home with a cousin and a fourteen-pound black Persian cat, Abdul. "It's Abdul who's lord and master

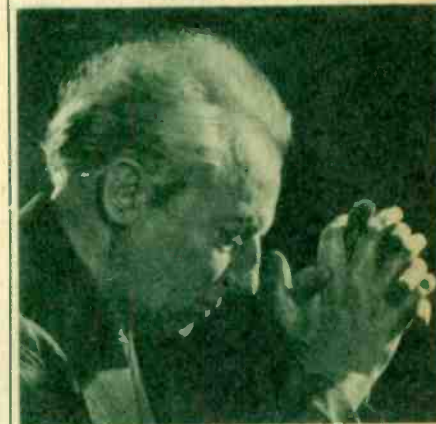

THE SECOND WEEK found popular Ralph Edwards handling emcee's chores. Mr. Edwards is only kidding.



"Take It Or Leave It" Names L. A. As One of Two Brightest Cities

Sunday, 6 p.m.

ANGELENOS will be glad to know that their city rates as one of the brightest in the nation — in answering the sixty-four dollar question, that is.

"You're wonderful," smiled youthful producer Bruce Dodge. "We're always sure you can Take It."

Dodge was referring to the results of the recent coast broadcasts made by CBS' granddaddy quiz, "Take It Or Leave It."

Upon checking we learned that LA has not always presented a perfect showing. In 1942 the audience hung its head in shame because nobody came up with a perfect answer.

"But that's rare," continued Dodge. "When we broadcast from here, we expect a good show. And, we certainly weren't disappointed on our

last visit. You were on your toes."

Two Out of 52

Local audiences get a peek at the perennial favorite on the average of once a year, when it makes one of its infrequent West Coast appearances. The other fifty weeks find the show emanating from New York with Phil Baker as emcee.

While Baker was vacationing, Dodge, armed with dollars worth of questions, headed for the Coast to present "TIOLI" with Kay Kyser and Ralph Edwards as emcees.

"The format of the show hasn't changed since its beginning in 1940," explained the producer, "but it has held the public's interest for six years. We're still rated as one of the top fifteen shows on the air."


Even if you've visited, watched or participated in a "Take It Or Leave It" broadcast, you'll always find it good fun. Every member of the audience receives a fair chance to try for the lucky seven questions as his numbered ticket stub is dropped into the famous fishbowl when he enters the studio. And there's no chance of becoming a contestant *unless* your number has been picked from the bowl.

From five men, five women, and two servicemen, the emcee chooses approximately half of that number to answer seven questions from eighteen categories on the blackboard decorating the stage. The emcee is equipped with a set of questions pertaining to each category.

KYSER LOVES TO KID THE FOLKS, who, in turn, love to kid Kay. Note the fish bowls marked "women" and "servicemen" on the table to the left of Kyser.

And it's then that the fun begins.

Adult Quiz Kid

Absent on this trip was "brain woman" Edith Oliver, whose job it is to compile the categories and questions. For the past six years she has had to dream up hundreds of questions which she must be able to answer herself before passing them on to the contestants.

"Without her we'd be lost," averred Dodge.


In answer to queries about whether the studio audience is a help or hindrance, Dodge definitely assured us that they were most cooperative. "And our contestants are generally cooperative, too," he continued. "In this business you soon learn to size people up and know who will answer the sixty-four dollar question and who won't."

Only one gentleman, it seems, ever gave up after the one dollar question. About fifty per cent of the contestants correctly answer the top quizzer.


"We don't worry about Los Angeles," Dodge confided, "because we know you'll give us a good show. In fact, we may come back in the fall and stay several months. We're just looking for a good excuse."

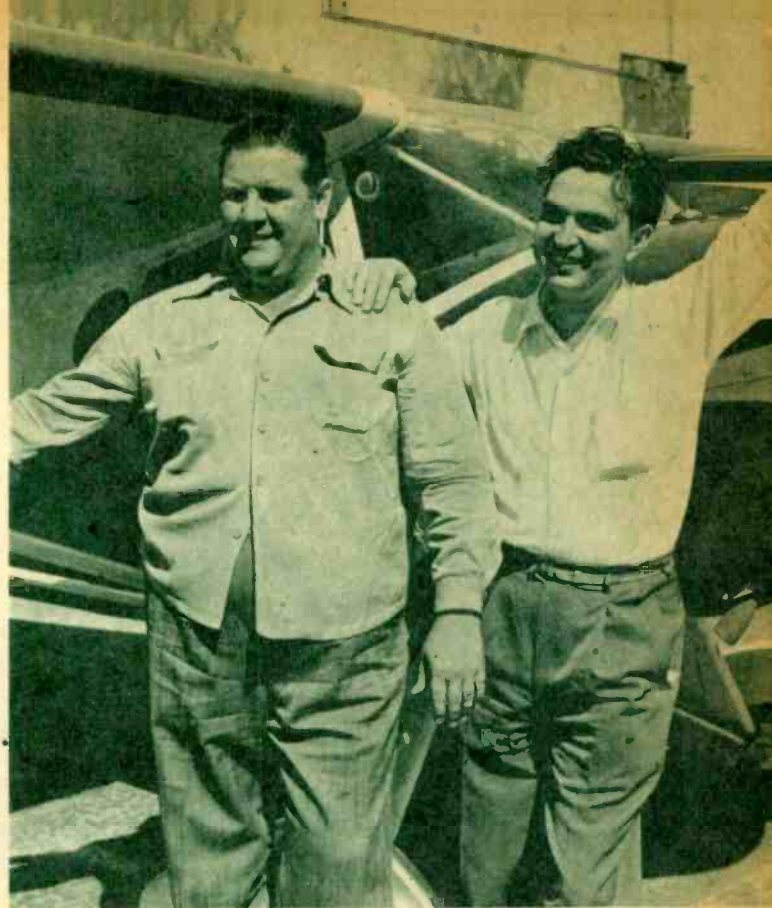
However their interest was fostered, the fact remains that when many of your top dial performers aren't on the air, they're in it.

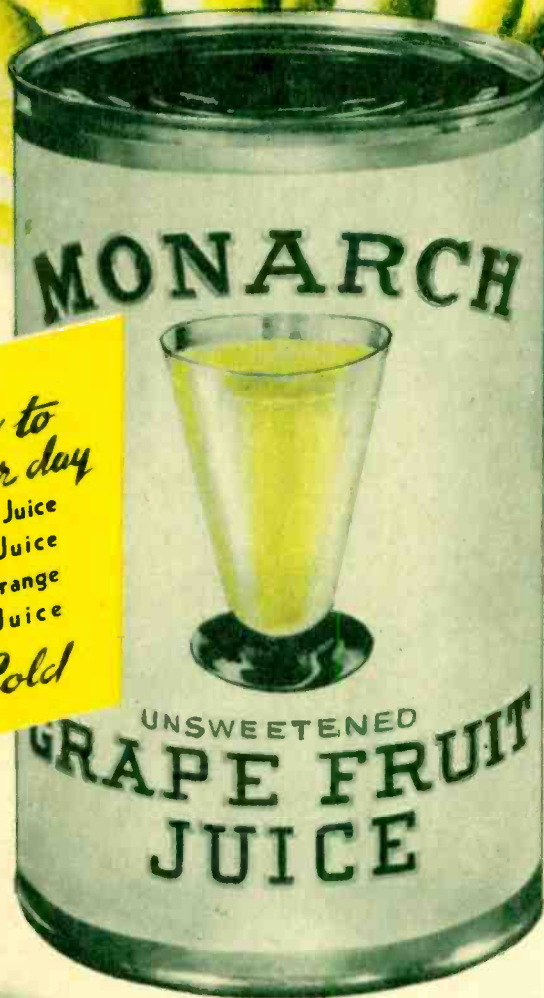

or speaker goes on the air. Anyone who wants to broadcast goes to the station that day and is put on the air. If no one shows up, the station announcer plays a few records then suggests listeners tune in again on the next broadcast day and signs off."

However, the limited broadcasting from the station does not limit the listening in Tahiti, Adarm pointed out. Reception in Tahiti is exceptional at any hour. American programs are very popular and are heard direct via San Francisco or Los Angeles stations.

The favorite type of program in Tahiti is music. Their favorite type of music is modern jazz or cowboy and hillbilly tunes. And Tommy Dorsey is a favorite bandleader.

Adarm related how the natives constantly played Dorsey's recording of "Boogie Woogie." "It is a wonderful record," he emphasized, "but I think I go mad—mad altogether—because it play from morning to night. You get up in the morning—it play. You go to sleep at night—it still play. So I take the record, . . . break it up and throw it in the fire. But no use, the next morning the native he come in with another one. The same record. It start all over again—I go crazy."

As this has been Adarm's first trip to the United States since 1933, he has been seeking a great deal of new equipment for a hotel which he is rebuilding. But he feels the most prized acquisition which he is taking back with him is a picture of Tommy Dorsey and himself. "I tell the natives I meet Tommy Dorsey, they no believe me," he said. "But the picture . . . it is proof!"

you, I'm very much interested in 'show business'."

Asked if he thought the American Veterans Committee would be a force in American politics, Roosevelt answered thoughtfully, "Yes, I think so. After all, it is the only liberal veterans' organization in the country." He bemoans the lack of liberal press and radio commentators at present. "There is much less of either of them than there formerly was. The people get less of both sides of the picture than they should." A recent personal case in point was the newspaper story of his resignation from HICCASP (the Hollywood Independent Citizens Committee of Arts, Sciences and Professions to which many radio-ites belong.) All local papers except one announced that upon accepting the Democratic Party position, James Roosevelt resigned from HICCASP with a denunciation of their policies. "I still believe in the things they stand for," he told us. "The real reason I resigned is that I won't have enough time to devote myself to both jobs, and that as head of my Party here, I can't be connected with an organization that might back a Republican if they so desired."

Asked if he thought the amazing parallel of American history in both post-war eras would continue to the same tragic result or whether he thought people had learned from the twenties and were waking up, he replied fervently, "I hope so! But we haven't shown any signs of learning as yet. The forces of red-baiting, for instance, are ten times as well organized and spectacular as those behind the Big Red Scare of the early twenties."

We asked Mr. Roosevelt if there was anything he would particularly like us to say for him. "Yes, there is. I would like very much to have you say that a commentator is like other performers—he enjoys hearing from his audience just as much as Bob Hope or any of those fellows. It's very enlightening."

Air time was drawing near, and as we shook hands prior to departure, he laughed, "Something I'd really like to do is have a weekly debate with Fulton Lewis, Jr. You know, he'd be on one week, and then I would answer the following week. I doubt that that will ever happen, though," he added regretfully.

Saturday nights the Yexas dine at home, but seldom alone or quietly. Usually there are two or three jazz celebrities present, and after dinner they adjourn to the solarium. Then comes Ted's own private little jam session.

Proud of Collection

Ted's houseboy doubles in brass as errand boy, record recorder operator, valet, shopper, and general factotum. The recording machine is a wonderfully complicated piece of mechanism with a panel like that of a Flying Fortress. This is Ted's baby—his erstwhile hobby, but now ready to pay dividends from his new record company. He plays his vast collection of home-recordings at the least sign of interest from the stream of visitors and guests who have turned his home-office into a Grand Central Station. He is most proud of those impromptu recordings of the great jazz artists of the air who just happened to be on hand as guests at his home on any evening when Ted felt in the mood to record his own private show. His guests invariably fall right into the mood with him, and before the evening is over (evenings end at about 4 a.m. at the Yerxa residence), several more prize recordings find themselves a part of Ted's extensive music library.

Through his jam sessions, Yerxa is given a great deal of credit on the Coast for the prevention of juvenile delinquency. The thought is also expressed by informed persons that his program featuring every known race, color and creed has done a great deal to break down racial prejudices.

you of the stories of political enemies of the late President Roosevelt, who on meeting him, found themselves chatting like warm friends, and much to their own surprise, charmed before they knew it. James Roosevelt seems to have that same gift.

It comes as a surprise also to those who hear him as a commentator for the first time, what an excellent radio delivery he has. "Many years ago in Boston I did do a program once a week, but this five-day-a-week series is my first real radio experience," he smiled. "I guess being raised in the public eye has made it easy for me."

99 Per Cent Complimentary

"You should ask someone else about that," he said, nodding to his secretary, when we wondered as to the results of his audience reaction and letters. "It seems immodest coming from me, but the reaction has been excellent. We've had between three and four thousand letters already, and ninety-nine per cent of them have been most complimentary. It worries me that I'm not getting enough opposition and makes me wonder if I ought to be reaching a larger audience." (This, after but three weeks of broadcasting.)

What about the rabid anti-liberals, the folks to whom the name Roosevelt anywhere or on anything is anathema? Roosevelt laughed quietly at our question. We got the impression of a man who has been near center in a target of name-calling and mud-slinging for a long time and has emerged without losing his good humor. "Yes," he added, "we've gotten eight or ten letters in the bunch that have said in one way or another that if we'd all go bury our heads, they'd consider themselves well satisfied. Of course there have been individual points of argument that we've had letters about, and I answer them by mail."

"Do you read and answer your mail personally?" We were frankly surprised and said so. Radio mail has a way of stacking up into formidable piles.

"It's a whale of a job, and takes a lot of time," he agreed, "but the letters are so intelligent and well written that I enjoy it."

Forthright commentator Sam Balter had entered the studio during this part of the discussion and readily agreed that letters from listeners were most intelligent. "Whoever said that radio listeners were a bunch of morons was very much mistaken. In fact sometimes they're so brilliant

they worry me and make me wonder if I'm on the right side of the mike!" exclaimed Balter.

Being a political innocent, we inquired what the first step, on being made head of the Democratic Party, would be.

This brought another smile. "Finding a good treasurer," he assured us. "Someone who knows how to raise money."

We said that we assumed that he planned to live permanently in Southern California.

No Newcomer

"It's a funny thing," he replied. "I am a resident of California, and have been for eight years, but nobody seems to know it. Everyone thinks of me as a New Yorker, but I've been here since 1938 when I came to the coast to work for Sam Goldwyn."

"Are you still interested in show business?" we asked, horrified at how flippant we suddenly sounded. Roosevelt shot us a quizzical look. "Do you call this show business?" he asked, pointing to the microphone before him on the table.

"Maybe we don't," we faltered, "but we bet Variety does."

He laughed aloud. "Then I assure

WHEN MIKE WORE SHORT PANTS

Meredith Willson, Rounding Out 20 Years in Radio, Recalls Anecdotes

JUST twenty years ago this month a tall, gangling youth whose hair kept falling in front of his eyes, got a side job playing flute on the Atwater Kent Radio Hour. Despite his tender years he was already a flutist of some renown, having several seasons with John Philip Sousa and the New York Philharmonic behind him. But radio was a strange new field.

It wasn't regarded too highly then by musicians and Meredith Willson didn't dream he was fated to spend most of his working hours during the next two decades facing the piece of metal they called a microphone.

During those twenty years Willson, now a noted conductor-composer and

a comedian and emcee of growing prominence, has seen radio expand from an awkward stepchild of the entertainment field into the world's most powerful medium of information and amusement.

Though he got his radio start in New York, most of his career has been spent on the West Coast, and his memories of the early days of radio 'are bound up with the old "Blue Monday Jamboree," the "Signal Carnival," "House of Melody," "America Sings," "Maxwell House Showboat" and other programs of the late 20's and early 30's.

"Few shows have ever surpassed those two-hour broadcasts of the 'Blue Monday Jamboree,'" Meredith recalled this week. "That was before the days of listening polls, but I sincerely believe you couldn't have phoned a radio-equipped home along the entire West Coast on a Monday night that wasn't tuned to the Jamboree. Half the present air performers and directors in Hollywood today had something to do with it at one time or another. A lot of funny things happened, because radio then wasn't



the highly-rehearsed, polished, split-second job it is today.

"The funniest thing I remember—and it was so good I had to tell it on my summer program recently—was the time we decided to interview a train engineer and find out what the different whistles meant. So we had him dismantle and bring down a whistle off a Southern Pacific engine, and we set it up on the stage, all 175 pounds of it, hooked it to a tank of compressed air, and got ready for the show.

"That was in 1929 and we never rehearsed the program beforehand—just went on and hoped everything would come out okay. Sometimes one of the cast wouldn't get a chance to do his act, but nobody minded; he simply came back the next week and waited around.

"Well . . . !"

"So this night Harrison Holloway, the emcee, asked the engineer his favorite whistle and the man said it was three long and a short to let his wife know he was only fifty miles down the road and she could start breakfast. Then Harrison asked him to demonstrate it. Well . . . !

"You'd have thought somebody would have figured we couldn't take a whistle you could hear fifty miles and blow it in a radio studio, but nobody did. When the engineer pulled the cord, the plaster fell from the ceiling, the broadcasting machinery was wrecked, the station went off the air, and several members of the audience threatened suit because they couldn't hear for weeks."

Though Willson dates his radio career from his first Atwater Kent program, he unwittingly had a hand in developing radio three years before that, while a flutist with the Sousa band. He met Dr. Lee De Forest, "father of radio," at a party and the good doctor, learning he played the flute, induced him to come to the doctor's laboratory and play scales while De Forest tested sound recording devices. Willson kept this up weekly for almost a year.

stack up until even Ted can't read them. Then, in a spirit of efficiency and order, he will say to his secretary, "Let's throw these all out—they're stale anyway—and start off with some new typewritten ones." So he dictates a full page of things to be done almost immediately. They are beautifully typed on a clean and virgin sheet, and five minutes later Ted has embellished them and added to them until you can't tell the new ones from the old ones.

Ted is a very mechanically-minded person and has absolutely no sales resistance for new electrical contrivances. And after he gets them he likes to know just how they work. Witness his new Dictaphone machine. For a few days it was a positive essential. Then something happened

Ted Yerxa— Purveyor of Jazz!

TED YERXA, known to thousands of radio fans as "The Lamplighter," is a national figure. He is the key-hole peeker of "after dark" life on the Pacific Coast.

His colorful column has been a feature of the Los Angeles Daily News for over four years. His stories on radio personalities and musical celebrities are eagerly awaited by an admiring reader audience. Radio fans know him best for his air programs covering news, interviews and musical interludes Monday through Friday of each week.

Hundreds of "big name" jazz men have appeared on another of his air shows emceed personally by Ted every Sunday afternoon 2:00 to 2:30 p.m. over KXLA. To the writer, this is one of the most remarkable programs aired on the Coast.

Almost every well known musician sooner or later seems to land on the jam session program. A few of them are Gene Krupa, Buddy Rich, "King" Cole, Duke Ellington, Stan Kenton and Art Tatum. If the individual is a musical sensation, Ted will get him.

The program is produced at a Hollywood Boulevard night spot, and

the air show features unrehearsed jazz music by the nation's leading jazzists. After the half hour broadcasts, a jam session continues to 6:00 p.m.

Surrounded by every time-saving device and electrical gadget yet invented, Yerxa sits in his Castle Malibu overlooking the Pacific and yearns for greater problems to lick.

Unique System

There are telephone extensions all over Yerxa's house, and by each extension one can find a small pile of notes—illegible to everyone but Ted—of things to be done today or things which should have been done yesterday. These notes continue to

to it, and Ted decided to fix it himself. He unscrewed a few things and removed a few others, and Clatter! Clash! Bang! Parts flew all over the room. An expert on Dictaphones put it back together. In radio's early days there wasn't the demand for studio tickets that there is today and some of the lesser programs had considerable difficulty filling their studios.

Meredith recalls one show—which he declines to name!—that sent lackeys into the street and paid loiterers two dollars apiece to come in and listen and applaud. They could only afford a few, so they grouped them right under the one mike, and then turned the volume to the top.

"It may have lacked spontaneity, but it was loud," says Willson.

He remembers the first broadcast of a Toscanini concert, when the over-awed engineers put a microphone in front of every instrument. "You could hear the oboe player breathe between notes," Willson chuckles. "but it didn't sound at all like Toscanini music. After that, they just stuck one mike in front of the whole orchestra."

Meredith recalls a humorous incident on KFRC in San Francisco in the early 30's which illustrates the casual way radio once went on the air. Earlier in the day Willson had turned down as "too young" an applicant for the program. That evening, as he swung into a South American number the girl arose from a front-row seat and began dancing and clicking castanets to the music.

"She wanted to show me how good she was—and she did," said Meredith. "But nobody got apoplexy over the interruption. No ushers came down the aisle to give her the bum's rush. We got no letters next day asking 'what is radio coming to?' I finished the number, she sat down triumphantly, and the show went on. The girl went on, too, to quite a career in the movies as Margo."

Another funny episode happened to Willson a dozen years ago when he was guesting on a Sunday program. First rehearsal was Saturday night, and that afternoon Meredith went to a football game, where he yelled himself blue in the face. In the evening when he tried to read his lines his voice cracked like Andy Devine's.

"Say, that's funny," commented the program writer. "Do that tomorrow."

The next day Meredith, his voice still in a splint, came down and everything went along fine until, a few minutes before the broadcast, his voice suddenly snapped to normal.

The producer was horrified. A whole situation had been built around Meredith's fractured larynx. He called a hasty huddle.

Some seconds later the studio policeman rushed to the men's room, where he thought a murder was being perpetrated. He found Willson there screaming at the top of his voice, trying to crack it again.

He did, too, like in the stories—just as they went on the air.
