## Annie---She's No Lady!



But She's Nevertheless an Attractive And Efficient Adjunct to CBS' Research Department and Its Program Analysts pairs of hands holding (and pushing) buttons connected to "Big Annie." HE IS streamlined . . . attractive . . . polished . . . efficient . . . the darling of the Program Analysis Division of CBS' Research Department, Mr. Tore Hallonquist, and his assistant, Dr. Martin Kaplon. They call her "Big Annie," but imagine a lady sitting silently while a roomful of listeners indicate their likes and dislikes of a radio program!

"Big Annie" is no lady. She's a gray, slickly competent machine which squats ponderously before an audience of program testers, but spryly and accurately coordinates and records responses from ninety-five pairs of hand buttons.

Suppose yours is one pair of hands participating in the test.


You are seated in a large room at the head of the stairs at CBS' Vine Street Theater, where "Big Annie" has been holding open house of late. Dr. Kaplon explains that during the next thirty minutes a transcription of a "Whistler" show is to be played and you are to indicate whether or not you like what you hear.


"If you hear something you like, press the green button in your right hand," he instructs. "If you dislike something, press the red button in your left hand. Press and keep the buttons down as long as you wish. If what you hear is neither good nor poor, don't press at all. Please hold the buttons in your laps so your neighbors won't see what you're doing. Relax now, and listen."

As the buttons are pressed, electric impulses created are collected by "Big Annie" and a second-by-second total of the audience's reaction is automatically calculated and recorded. This is accomplished by two slowly moving rolls of graph paper inserted at the top, on either back side of the machine. This paper unwinds under the points of two vertically fixed pens, the one on the right carrying green ink to correspond with the green button and the one on the left holding red. When the buttons are not pressed, the pens trace a straight line down the sides of the paper rolls. But when one green or red button is pressed there is an imperceptible move of the pen to the right, and when fifty buttons

register, the resulting pen move is fifty times farther to the right.

#### **Test Local Shows**

Resultant is a profile chart, like those shown on the accompanying pages. Having profiled more than 225 programs in New York during the past eight years, CBS' Program Analysis Division recently moved "Big Annie" to Hollywood to test several locally created airers such as "My Friend Irma," "The Couple Next Door," "Hope Chest," and Fred Beck. Each program profile being broken into definite segments, such as singing commercials, spoken commercials, musical bridges, comedy spots, or narration, it is possible to put a finger on the score for any moment in the broadcast (the score for any

segment is a composite of "likes," "don't likes," and neutrals). An average of the entire scale above and below the line comprises the total rating, theoretically 100. An excellent program, however, actually rates about fifty and a very poor program once tested to the sad tune of a minus five.


The definiteness of "Big Annie" is obviously advantageous. Suppose two girls engaged in dialogue on a show register a high rating of "like" responses until a male character steps in. A drop in listener approval tells the program's head that there's something wrong with this man: maybe his voice is harsh or too similar to others on the show, or perhaps the character needs to be made more sympathetic. In any event, the program is tested as such, with no out-

side factors to intrude. Shows not yet premiered can use "Big Annie" to discover potential strength or weakness before taking to the air.


In testing, the Program Analysis Division attempts to secure an audience similar to the one which might be listening to the program on the air. Fred Beck's morning stint, for example, was tested early on a Saturday morning when a mixed group could participate. Soap operas are usually "Big Annied" with an audience of housewives.

One thing most profiles show is that listeners don't like commercials, except, perhaps, the highly humorous, integrated variety. "Big Annie" must surely bolster herself for a bad time whenever she feels a prolonged plug coming on!

A JUMPY CHART GENERALLY INDICATES overproduction. According to the researchers, Hollywood often tries to be too clever and has a tendency to overproduce. Although this does not happen to be a Hollywood show, the program here employed an annoying theme which ran through the entire broadcast. Sound effects of a sharp whistle and the sawing of a tree occasioned listener disfavor and too many characters incurred further disapproval.





AND LIKE THE FLOWERS, Fred Allen brings promise of merry sunshine when he gets on the kilocycles with lines like these, aired with Bing Crosby as auest.

(Those of you who laughed last May when Fred did his wonderful show using "The Mikado" as a springboard, probably remember some of the lines, but in case you'd like to refresh your memory (or if you missed this swell broadcast) here are a few excerpts from Allen's script, adjudged by Radio Life to be best comedy script of 1947. # You Gotta Be a Doubting Thomas

If You Want to Join the Shrewd Crew Which Organizes ABC's "Don't You Believe It!"

OM, I GO to school to learn all about George Washington crossing the Delaware and Robert Fulton inventing steamboats. Then along comes this radio show and says it's all the bunk. How about it, huh? How about it?"

To this frequent peevishness from the younger listening set, radio's ten-year-old "Don't You Believe It" program has an answer: "The Truth," say its creator and writers, "is usually as interesting as The Falsehood, if not more so. Why not tell it?"

On the premise of "Why not, indeed?", this unusually popular series (heartily recommended by the P.T.A. itself in 1945) has given the razzberry to enough accepted beliefs to rewrite history books straight up the line.

Don't You Believe It?

To prove this point, program-or-

ganizers can snatch the breeze and find a "tain't so-ism" from almost any period in history you might suggest. Examples?

Sir Isaac Newton conceived the law of gravity while watching an apple fall from a tree. Nope. ERSATILE Viking Leif Erickson, handsome sixfoot-four blond who plays the part of Richard Rhinelander III on "My Friend Irma," lives in Venice on the brink of the briny. Further living up to a reporter's fondest expectations, he owns a dory and loves to fish. When the family pediatrician told Mrs. Erickson that baby Bill should have white-meated fish included in his diet, Leif's wife had no more than to report the doctor's words and Leif marched seaward. In five minutes he came back with a fish. "What is it?" he asked an interested spectator. "White sea bass," came the satisfactory reply. Leif proudly carried his catch homeward with an attitude unmistakably indicating that all Mrs. L. had to do was name it and he could produce it.

He was being facetious, of course, but there is no denying, after Leif has sketched his young life story to date, that he has turned a successful hand to many undertakings. His relish at recounting them adds to their essential excitement. As he describes himself, "fresh out of Beverly Hills High School and a year at U.C.L.A., "working as doorman at the Downtown RKO, one can easily visualize his blue suit with shiny brass buttons "In summer, I wore white pants," Leif adds. At nineteen, when he had moved over to Loew's State, he felt a vocal urge and promptly let go singing while taking tickets. The following New Year's Eve at a Sunset Strip bistro where Ted Fio Rito's orchestra was playing, Leif's vocal urge needed only a boost of one champagne cocktail to assert itself. He boldly strode toward the bandstand and said he'd like to sing. Fio Rito liked Leif's voice, and the next morning Erickson was an ex-tickettaker preparing to open at San Francisco's St. Francis. He stayed with the band a year and a half. His biggest moment was the day he returned to Loew's and met some of the people with whom he'd worked. They considered him a big shot.

Leif did, too. "I thought I was a most important guy," he recalls himself in 1930. "I owned a tux and got thirty-five dollars a week. So one day I walked out. It was two years before I got work again."

#### Lean Times

There's a hungry edge to Leif's voice when he speaks of the lean days living on \$4.50 a week, meals included, in a cubicle on Virgil Avenue. He whiled away the time practicing the piano until the sister of the boarding house proprietress helped him snag a part in Rine-(Please Turn to Page 15)

#### Vocals Versus Music

Nominated as the only disappointed guy over the reneging of the Petrillo ban is one Chuck Mitchell, maestro of the most unique musical aggregation in Hollywood, the Vocalaires. Mitchell's group is a carefully auditioned vocal orchestra of ten voices, each selected for its proximity to the qualities of a musical instrument. Six men and four girls are assembled into the musical grouping. Former "Sportsman" Thurl Ravenscroft and Jerry Phillips, first woman arranger in America to belong to ASCAP, are both members of the group.

Vigorous rehearsing of the "vochestra" had the Mitchell group ready to step into any musical spotlight deprived of the benefits of instrumental music because of the Petrillo ban. Ban or no ban, the possibilities of this sort of thing seem endless and "The Vocalaires" should find themselves in demand as a top novelty group. Only instrument to defy impersonation by the human voice, according to Mitchell, is the piano . . . so don't look for his "vochestra" to attempt "Kitten on the Keys" or anything like that.

#### The Henry Morgan Show?

If Henry Morgan's present writers don't get off the well-known dime, or Henry himself doesn't ease the strain out of his voice and get back with the old ad-lib proficiency, the billing on his airer could easily be changed to "The Arnold Stang Show."

We like Arnold Stang in the "Gerard" role as well as the next fellow, and seeing a new character get ahead is always a good deal . . . but we like Morgan, too. Arnold is capitalizing on the one thing that formerly marked Morgan as the ABC wit... under-playing his lines. So much so that Henry's readings and ad-libbings, by comparison, seem to have lost a lot of their former punch, and "Gerard" garners the laughs.

When Mr. Morgan allows himself the joy of unrestrained irony, or deals in those classics of understatement that have so long marked him, he is nonetheless enjoyable for all the di-viding of his spotlight. Few of us remember that by the end of this season Morgan will be observing his tenth anniversary on the air. Listeners are still prone to regard Henry Morgan as a "new comedian."

Yet it was in 1939 that Henry start. ed insulting sponsors, from the mike of WOR, flagship of the MBS network in New York. Later he was spon-sored by the Adler Shoe Company, and poked continuous fun at Adler Elevator Shoes. Then he started to pick on the network executives, and once auctioned off a whole group of them for the stupendous sum of \$83! Yet we're still apt to regard him as a "new comedian." Familiarity in this case has bred no contempt.

Someone should suggest to Henry that he lay off stepping back in favor of "Gerard." "Gerard" will do all right. Why doesn't Morgan remember the old days when his unorthodox methods put his sponsor's name on every tongue? No sponsor today would complain of that! And Henry, you can be a nice guy off mike and still light into the boss on mike. Think of the possibilities in the name of today's sponsor . . . Rayve Sham-

Sportscaster Bob Kelley, heard Monday through Saturday nights at 6:15 over KMPC, could be called a Walter Winchell of the sports world. Bob adopts the same authoritative "I-toldyou-so" attitude and the rapid-fire prognostication. Like Winchell, too, he's usually correct.

An authority since his last year in high school on everything performed on turf, sod, greens, fields, floors or rings, Bob Kelley can afford to be pretty positive. Listeners, however, have to be of the sports-page-fan class if they are to keep completely calm during a Kelley broadcast. Bob doesn't always allow for the fact that some of his listeners find their newspaper entertainment in the comic section, and haven't developed complete backgrounds on players, contracts and coaches. He jumps in where other columnists fear to tread, and has his say-so.

If your dinner hour is held up till 6:30 so that you won't have missed a single pearl of Kelley's sports wisdom, you won't understand a reference to the righteousness in this really nice young man's voice. Your interest will have lent a background of sports knowledge that negates any offensiveness of his being so blasted right all the time. If you class as an occasional listener, remember — Bob isn't trying to sell anything. He's a sports authority, and after all, who would be listening if they didn't want facts? A lot of politely worded "I guess maybe's" would sound pretty silly, wouldn't they?

#### Perennial Story-Teller

"Tales for the Ageless," the first of a series of childhood classics edited by Jean Hersholt, CBS's kindly "Dr. Christian," will be released this summer under the auspices of the Limited Editions Club, published by George Macy.

The book will contain three stories that rank as all-time favorites. "Aladdin and His Wonderful Lamp" will be illustrated by Fritz Kredel; "Dick Whittington and His Cat" by Robert Lawson; and "The Three Bears" (written by Robert Southey) by William Movers.

Hersholt is titling his entire collection "Evergreen Tales." The second volume will contain the Bible story of "Joseph and His Brethren"; the tale of "St. George and the Dragon"; and Hans Christian Andersen's "The Ugly Duckling."

In addition to editing and, in many cases, translating the original stories from archaic, obsolete or poorly print-

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ed texts, Hersholt has written introductions on each author and told the histories of each tale. Before he began the work, he queried two dozen editors of children's magazines and librarians in charge of children's reading-rooms. He submitted 100 titles to these authorities and asked them to list the thirty they considered to be stories every child should know. Their choices make up the titles to be included in the anthology.

Hersholt's preceding volume of thirty Hans Christian Andersen fairytales is considered one of the finest translations of the Danish story-teller's works. A great many of the Andersen stories will also be retold in this new selection.



The scarcer than hens teeth supply of channels boils down to a ridiculous-sounding statement — not enough air to go round, now. And ya gotta have channels to get sponsors. They're the boys who pay for continuous big-time talent. Time will clear this.

W6XAO came within a hair's breadth of losing its channel during the last (and first) big rainstorm of the season. Engineers were forced to troop around with cans of sterno, keeping the transmitter at its normal temperature. It seems that if one of these precious crystal sets cools, the frequency is lost!

KTLA fared little better. Lightning hit its antenna atop Mt. Wilson, not once, but six times, on February 5, temporarily paralyzing the video outlet and pointing up the hazards which all video sets atop the peaks may anticipate. KTLA canceled all remote programming and stuck to studioproduced events, using an auxiliary diesel on the mountain for heat and

One of Leif's duties was to sit in a box and wait for the boys to announce: "We've found a newsboy standing down on one of your local corners. This chap has a terrific voice and we'd like to have him stand up and sing a song," whereupon Leif would rise and warble. He also assisted in throwing popcorn, breaking balloons, and raising general pandemonium, which he lovingly summarizes as "having a wonderful time." This lasted a year until he came back to Hollywood, by mistake.

It seems that a producer of Westerns, thumbing through some casting pictures, saw a face that caught his eye and asked whose it was. "Leif Erickson," an uninformed assistant replied. "I wanna see him here tomorrow," the producer stated.

"Can't," answered the assistant.

"Why not?" demanded the producer.  $\ensuremath{\mbox{\sc d}}$ 

"He's not here," patiently explained his colleague. "He's with Olsen and Johnson in Peoria, Illinois."

The assistant wired Erickson in Peoria, but Leif thought the wire was just another Olsen and Johnson prank. Another telegram arrived, then several more, but Leif tore them up. Finally the assistant threw up his hands in attempting to contact Leif and turned the assignment over to a woman agent, who immediately telephoned Erickson. Still convinced this routine was all a gag, Leif turned a stuffed ear to her pleadings. But when she persisted, he settled the matter by saying, "If you're on the level, send me \$200 cash and I'll be there on the next train." Two hours later the money arrived.

When, as a slightly puzzled stooge, Leif confronted Olsen and Johnson with evidence of a bona fide offer, he gasped, "It's on the level."

"Of course," the zany duo answered. "That's what we've been trying to tell you."

By the time Leif was Hollywoodbound, he felt certain that there was a mistake somewhere. He was sure of it when he finally walked into the studio and told them his name.

"Yeah?" they answered. "Well, whaddya want?"

Things didn't turn out badly, however, for the agent, also thinking there had been a mistake along the line, had already secured Leif a contract at \$100 a week. He played a corpse being nudged by a horse in his first picture, which got underway a week later.

Leif was with Paramount until 1940, then he put in two years on the New York stage. Subsequent movies in which he participated included "Nothing But the Truth," "Are Hus-

bands Necessary?" and "The Fleet's In." As a free-lance actor, he played in "H. M. Pulham, Esq." before signing with Universal and then his Uncle Sam. His most recent cinema parts are in "The Snake Pit" with Olivia de Havilland and "Joan of Lorraine" with Ingrid Bergman.

#### Radio Satisfying

Leif likes radio. "It satisfies me," he states simply. "It satisfies eighty-five per cent more than pictures. It keeps one facile, for the characters are different." Then he adds practically, "But in movies, you make more money."

It was while he was in New York between 1937 and 1940 that Leif did his first radio program. Followed dramatic parts on "Manhattan at Midnight," "One of the Finest," and "Grand Central Station." He found his way back to the microphone through Cy Howard's seeing him play the part of Leone in "Volpone" at the Las Palmas Theater. Next day, producer-writer Cy called Leif and asked him if he would join the cast of "My Friend Irma." He's been on the show ever since and has also made appearances on such broadcasts as "Hollywood Star Preview." On "My Friend Irma," Leif plays the "threat man" — Jane's aristocratic boss whose importance to the plot is evidenced at each airing. "It must be a hard part to write," says Leif. "After all, Richard Rhinelander III can't be too ridiculous."

Leif, as might be expected, went into the service as an enlisted man in the navy. He came out a chief photographer's mate and also a man in love, for at Pensacola he met Ann Diamond, a civilian employee of the navy. When Leif was sent overseas, she quit her job and joined the WAC, becoming a master sergeant. He was discharged early in December, 1945... they were married December 24, 1945, and Ann was discharged the next day.

Leif was instrumental in photographing most of the South Pacific spots and film-recorded the surrender on the Missouri. Later he was sent to Tokyo, where he clicked off reel after reel for the navy. Leif luckily survived two narrow escapes (he was hurled from the deck of the Nevada into the Pacific when a Jap kamikaze plane attacked and was in a photo reconnaissance plane shot down over the Pacific).

His one big accident as a navy man was when he caught his finger in the innards of a movie camera.





#### Behind the Typewriters

What sort of dispositions have the fellows who hooey all this hokum? Skeptical, naturally. And determined. Originator of the series, Cran Chamberlin (now assistant director of program writing at CBS), first based his material on a musty book called "Popular Fallacies" which he'd found while browsing through a library. This source for stories was rapidly outdistanced, and it's now estimated that approximately 1311/2 working hours are required to put each ten-and-a-half-minute show on the air! (Additional four and a half minutes devoted to commercials, bridges and themes.)

A breakdown of that schedule is this: eighteen hours of reading, thinking, checking possible ideas; six hours in meeting to pick twelve best possibilities; forty-eight hours in the library checking all aspects of these twelve possibilities and narrowing them down to four; nine hours of arranging stories in logical order; sixteen hours in dramatizing chosen material; three hours in repeat conference and in rewriting script; two hours in re-examining and rewriting script a second time; two hours of editing; one hour of censoring; four hours in copying and duplicating; twenty-two and a half hours in rehearsal and final broadcast. Total again, 1311/2.

Writer Richard Sharpe, who also authors the "Loaves and Fishes" column in Script magazine, has been at this schedule for four years; and his new co-researcher, Sam Lynch, has been knocking it out for three months.

Each program is built on four types of fallacies. First is usually an oddity, like Corrigan making the longest wrong way trip in history. Second is a briefie, like Nero tossing the Christians to the lions. Third is a major historical falsity, like Betsy Ross sewing the first Old Glory. And the last expose is of a timely nature, like Doris Duke being the richest woman in the world.

From these basic beginnings, the crew usually branches out in almost any direction. "Let's do a story about dogs," suggests one of them. "Okay . . . how about dachshunds?" counters another. "Check dachshunds" is chalked on the schedule.

#### At the Microphone

"Don't You Believe It's" staging cast includes some loyal talent. Pat McGeehan, who is story-setter-upper, and GeGe Pearson, who enacts the feminine roles, have been on the program for five years.

The thundering "Don't You Believe It" voice is Tobe Reed's. Original reader of these lines was KHJ's present "Rise and Shine" man, Bob Bence. Successors to the part have

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included jingle-writer Alan Kent, announcers Don Wilson, Herb Allen, Jim Ameche and Ken Niles. Tobe Reed has been with the program since 1943. Del Castillo is at the organ, and Herb Allen now reads the commercials.

#### With Malice Toward None

In every way, program originators wish to make clear that their sub-stitutions of fact for fancy are without malicious intent. Where it becomes necessary to clarify impressions about respected figures of history, "Don't You Believe It" always qualifies . . . e.g., "Teddy Roosevelt and his Rough Riders were a fine group of fighting men, but another group of equally brave men has been overlooked," et cetera.

How so many fantastic deviations from truth have arisen, the program is at a loss to explain. It's like getting stories from a crowd which has witnessed an accident . . . none of them match and the most colorful becomes popular. Relators of history seem susceptible to this same fail-ing. "Don't You Believe It" confesses that its biggest quarrel is with the writings of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, whose crroneous poems about the ride of Paul Revere and the courtship of Miles Standish are glaring examples.

The program frankly adds that there is a very good reason for its long-duration success where other shows of its type have failed: "Our material," say its collaborators, "has never been easy to get.'

Specialist in Laughter and Tears, Danny Thomas Calls Himself Honest and Corny

E'S AN ARTIST,"
they'll tell you over at
MGM, where Danny
Thomas has been
launched on a highly
successful movie career. "He's got it here,"
they say as, with sentimental fists,
they strike their chests in the
general direction of their hearts.

This is a rather unusual sight when the spokesman is an old-line publicity man or a hard-boiled assistant director. The subject, sad-eyed, dark-visaged Danny Thomas, said it differently when we talked to him in his madhouse of a portable dressing room on the set of "The Big City."

"Artist?" he moaned. "I wish I felt like one. My belief in comedy is that it all must be believable. I don't like the fantastic comedy. I try to base my humor upon the common man's mishaps—to portray them in a humorous manner without being morbid." He gave the word "morbid" a ringing chest tone, popped his eyes at us and waved his cigar.

"The groom gets lost on his way to the wedding—a man gets a flat tire, on a dark road at midnight, no jack—that's my type of humor. 'I don't say the cockroaches around here are big, but three streetcars are missing'—that's not my type. Primarily I'm a 'complainer.' I complain about conditions in general and headlines in particular, and people laugh. It may be darned serious—but people laugh. Or I hope they will."

#### Calls Himself Corny

"My character is just a rewrite of 'Pagliacci'—honest and corny. I want the people to go out of the theater laughing and then stop and say to themselves, 'Say, this bum said something!'"

Danny acknowledges that the tag "comedian" is a loose term to apply to his characterizations. "Producers are befuddled with me. They see me do a funny routine and they start looking for a comedy role for me. Next time they see me being serious

and they decide I should have a dramatic role," he smiled.

Danny's first two picture parts, in "The Unfinished Dance" and "The Big City," have leaned toward the serious side. Upcoming for him is an out-and-out musical which fans can expect to be loaded with Thomas routines. Danny's dream role is the part of the immigrant in the best seller, "Anything Can Happen."

#### Show Business Start

"I didn't decide to become a comedian when I was a kid—I just decided to eat," he exclaimed when we wondered at what age the desire to become a professional funyman hits. "My English teacher had predicted that I would become an orator. My education stopped after high school. Who knows, if I'd gone to college I might today be an after-dinner speaker at the Lion's Club!" Musical revues in school led to a job as candy salesman in a burlesque theater in his home town of Toledo, Ohio. "Real burlesque it was in those days-not the girlesque they have now," he moaned. It was the comedians who played these houses that gave Danny his ambition. The eleven-year-old candy salesman acted as baby sitter for the fouryear-old son of one comedian he particularly admired, Joe Yule, better known nowadays as Mickey Rooney's father!

#### Changed Name

His very first professional appearance was on the stage of the Capitol Theater in Detroit, Michigan, where he received two dollars for singing a comedy parody on "Yes Sir, That's My Baby." Later, as a night club comedian, he dropped his real name, Amos Jacobs, so "the folks back in Toledo" wouldn't know he was playing in a particularly run-down joint. He took his oldest brother's name, Thomas, and his youngest brother's name, Danny, as a temporary measure. Three years later both Danny and the "run-down joint" were big time. In New York Danny made news at swanky La Martinique, Life selected him as one of the ten best contemporary comedians, Marlene DietDANNY THOMAS made his screen debut in "The Unfinished Dance."

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Nancy Chose the Simplest Way to Get on the Air. Any Girl Can Do It—If She Has a Voice Like Hers

HEN a dark-eyed little girl attending Los Angeles Roosevelt High School decided, five years ago, that she wanted to sing on the radio, she took the simplest course. Most singers approach an agent, prove their worth, and let the agent toil his way through the competitive ranks to book them.

Little Nancy merely approached the officer at the desk in NBC's big lobby.

"May I have an audition blank to take with me?" The obliging officer handed out his steen-hundredth blank for the day. Soon it was back at the station, neatly filled out by Nancy Norman. Because of the influx of requests from other aspirants, it took three months for Nancy's audition request to be answered by NBC. She was informed by telephone one bright day that she must have two songs ready and be on hand two days later.

At the studio, a young man at a piano accompanied Nancy through the two songs requested, and three

additional songs the astonished auditioners insisted on. The accompanist was Skitch Henderson.

Because it was a staff audition, a job as staff singer was the opening offered for winner Nancy. This didn't prove tempting enough to lure her from schoolbooks and high school fun, so Nancy forgot that dream.

#### Joins Kaye

Skitch Henderson didn't forget the warblings of this four-foot-ten-and-a-half-inch youngster. When bandleader Sammy Kaye was on the hunt for a vocalist, Skitch arranged for him to hear Nancy, then called her.

"Kaye wants to hear you," announced the enthusiastic Skitch.

Without the benefit of even a piano accompaniment, little Nancy sang for Kaye and got the job. She was just two days past seventeen when she packed her bags and headed east with the band for her first trip away from her native city. Los Angeles.

#### Early Audition

Daughter of a cantor, Nancy had been song-minded practically since her first infant shriek on April 23, 1925. Her theatrical career, however, started out in another direction. When she was just past the crawling stage, Nancy was sent to dancing school, so that by the time the tot was barely five, she was heel-and-toeing before private clubs and lodges in and around Los Angeles. Vocal talents nevertheless refused to be quieted and gradually took prominence over dancing interest. Nancy began to sing at community affairs, but like any thirteen-year-old she didn't consider a possible professional career until an amateur radio program gave her the idea.

The petite miss convinced herself she could do "just as well as those other kids on the program," and went down to an open audition for "Uncle John" at KFWB. That was her first experience with auditions. Like the later success, this audition was so outstanding that Miss Norman was guest on eight successive programs.

Amateur reviews, singing groups and local shows were Nancy's background for the next couple of years. Then came that NBC audition.

During the four years following, with Kaye's band, Nancy became the delight of the G.I.'s with her songs "I'm a Big Girl Now" and "I Wanna Get Married."

When Nancy and singer Dick Brown met, the words became an actuality, and Nancy left the band to be married.

Back on the Coast now, Nancy says "If I can help it, I hope to stay right here in California, where Jay can soak up all the sunshine possible."

"Jay" is Nancy's joy, chief topic of conversation, and fifteen monthsold baby boy. The wise little mother speaks of her baby as though he were a contemporary rather than an infant.

"I don't dare baby Jay. I'll have to leave him alone so much later on, when I'm working in pictures, that his training now is doubly important."

At the present time Nancy is singing ballads and jump tunes on CBS' Saturday night "It's a Great Life," coast-to-coast network show featuring Steve Allen. Nancy laughs at the mere mention of Steve and says "He's a wonderful comedian!"

#### Single Hobby

"I guess I'm not very good copy. I've always been too busy to have any hobbies, except once, in high school. Then I wrote poetry— and what poetry! I found some one day in an old trunk. I don't remember who the boy was, probably the football captain I didn't even know, but I wrote him fifty-five poems."

Busy with her son and the problem of doing all her own housework, Nancy takes time out only for a weekly outing. Each Sunday afternoon the tiny singer and her "gang" go to the little park in Coldwater Canyon. Sides are chosen, and the weekly game begins. They play football.

## Bruce Anson

From Station Parking Lot to Announce Booth Was The Expected Pattern Followed by This Typical Young Announcer From One of the Big Networks

HEN Radio Life visited the NBC announce booth one day to get a few facts from one of the network's announcers, Bruce Anson, that young man quite seriously exclaimed, "I can't see why anyone would be interested in me—I'm not a big name."

True, the ex-footballer isn't a big name. It may be years before he arrives at the enviable state of billing equaling the star's. But he is completely representative of a group of radio workers who staff stations the country over. His beginning was the parking lot of the National Broadcasting Company. He now does cut-in announcing on two transcontinental shows, is taking a refresher course in acting, and grinningly admits that he, too, would be happy to leave announcing for acting.

#### Local Schooling

Bruce Anson attended Hollywood High School, then followed the footsteps of the rest of his family to UCLA, where he played football and gave a lot of thought to his pre-med studies. The result of the thought was that he dropped the entire course in favor of business administration.

"There's no point in training to be a doctor if you know you'll never be a good one—I would never have been. Like about half the fellows I was going to school with, I didn't know what I wanted to do."

Before he'd finished school, the radio bug bit, and upon graduation Bruce was able to get work at NBC's parking lot. His genial manner and nice kooks soon enabled Bruce to move inside, where he donned a uni-

form to guide tours around the studio and take charge of ticket distribution. During his leisure time, Bruce trained at the school announcer course Ken Carpenter was running for hopeful actors and announcers. Early in 1941, when things didn't seem to move along fast enough to suit him, Bruce decided to join the army and get his year of military training out of the way.


#### Military Life

About six months later, at Fort Lewis, Bruce and a buddy named Howard Duff were engaged in a friendly Sunday morning card game with some of the fellows in camp. The two had met during the presentation of a camp skit called "Tonight at Fort Lewis," a Duff-emceed production for the purpose of bondselling and the entertainment of the rest of the forces around Fort Lewis.

On this Sunday morning, the radio was blaring through the good-natured squabbling that accompanied the camp card games. Suddenly came the announcement of an attack on Pearl Harbor.

"None of us could believe it. We thought it was another 'Man from Mars' stunt."

The all-too-real announcement ended a quiet camp session for Bruce. He was put into the 542nd Special Engineers Brigade and for the next four and a half years was engaged in running landing barges for General Douglas MacArthur. The Special Brigade started at the bottom of New Guinea and worked its hard way by hops up to the Philippines. The three-man LCB landing barges had no docks to pull up to.



There weren't many supplies aboard these thirty-six-foot boats, either. Many times the outfit had to use captured Japanese boats, or sit on jungle shores for days, as they awaited reinforcements, with nothing to eat but the detested bully beef.

The group, for reasons of secrecy, remained unsung during the entire war, and Bruce emerged as a PFC. from four and a half gruelling years during which some part of his outfit was in every landing made by General MacArthur. Yet Anson's one regret about his service stint is that it occurred just in time to prevent him from seeing the UCLA-Georgia game in 1941. His talk of the service sounds like a read-aloud chapter from any one of the many colorful books on World War II seafare or guerilla warfare. It's a little difficult to get this normally quiet young man started on his reminiscing, but once he's launched on his recountings Bruce loves it and will ramble by the hour.

#### Rejoined NBC

Once out of the service, Bruce immediately rejoined NBC, married Penr.y Berry, and started to plan his post-war home. Today Anson talks happily about the new house he has in Baldwin Hills, about the extra work that planting and painting create, and about how unusually beautiful the four-months-old Wendy Anson is.

Announcer Anson is an inveterate reader of anything autobiographical, a rabid football fan, and must continually watch himself to keep from marching out and buying the saddlehorse he wants.



That Audience Participation Show for Kids, "Let's Have a Swell Time," Hands Out Gifts To the Juniors While They and Emcees Hal Gerard and GeGe Pearson Have a Swell Time!

EOPLE MAY BE FUNNY but kids are cute!" laughed Hal Gerard, speaking of his and wife GeGe Pearson's latest venture, "Let's Have a Swell Time," an audience participation show for kids. Both members of this husband-and-wife radio team have been familiar to dialers for many years on such shows as "Don't You Believe It," the Eddie Cantor, Red Skelton, Phil Harris shows and many, many others. This however, is their first audience participation program. Three and a half years of reading the funny papers over the air have helped them considerably in dealing with the small fry, though they both admit that in the first few broadcasts they learned a good deal from their youthful participants.

The age group that makes up the "Swell Time" audience and contest-

ants is the seven- to fourteen-yearold. The KMPC studio is packed at show time with more than 250 members, some of whom have been waiting since early morning to get in on the fun and prizes. The smallest children are brought to the program by their parents, but the older ones make it under their own power. Producer Lou Holtzer (who also is the originator of the show) picks the youngsters for the broadcast. In order that the younger children will not be called upon to compete with their older schoolmates, quizzes are fitted to the different age groups. Children from seven to eight vie in the funnypaper and nursery rhyme quiz, the nine-to-tenners take part in a participation stunt, those from eleven to twelve play the music bee game and the thirteen- and fourteenyear-olds try the "Swell Time" quiz.

Hal and GeGe have had invaluable aid and encouragement from the Parent-Teachers' Association and the Board of Education in handling the school children. Another source of counsel has been their own young daughter, Luana. "She's our barometer of the likes and dislikes of children," laughed GeGe. "Our best friend and severest critic," added Hal.

In recent weeks the program has been playing host to fifty young orphans a week, "and what wonderful children they are," enthused both the Gerards. Latest plans are to take the program touring to children's hospitals and shelters.

At last count there were seven mikes handling the entertainment out of the "Swell Time" studio hand mikes for GeGe and Hal, dialogue mikes for the participants, audience mikes and those for the announcer and the program organist. Another production problem up to producer Holtzer is that of the selection of the twelve participants. Hal and GeGe, we've discovered, are far too tender-hearted to be entrusted with the task. They'd pick all the kids and give everybody prizes if it were left up to them. As it is, they admit that they bend over backward in an effort to give hints to contestants. Prizes or no prizes, each child is given two "Swell Time" ice cream bars during the program. Each contestant is given the chance to guess the number of ice cream bags in the giant jackpot bowl (a fourpound jar). The prizes that go with this are a child's dream. Incidentally, children of any age may compete in this part of the program by writing in their guesses to the program.
