**L**OS ANGELES talent, both amateur and professional, has been responding enthusiastically to a chance to break into television, radio and frequency modulation by means of a gigantic live audition series on KFI. The three media simultaneously presented hillbillies, piano singles, teams, singers, tap dancers and comics beginning Saturday night, October 30.

The Long Beach section was featured at that time, followed by a show November 6 for Hollywood-to-Westwood aspirants; and one No-

vember 13 for Glendale-and-Pasadena to Monrovia.

In each area, an extensive search for talent was carried on for four weeks previous to the televising and broadcasting of top talent from that particular area. Here's how it worked. During the weeks before the shows, widespread advertising and publicity led the talented to their Packard-Bell dealers, who made available entry blanks. There was no qualification as to amateur status for those wishing to enter the talent test, since the only objective of the series is to find individuals whose talents can do much to advance the television arts and sciences.

Winners of the tryouts have been

assured full-scale professional production facilities for the most advantageous presentation to the public, when and if they reach the finals held at KFI.

Master of ceremonies on the radio-television-FM show is Cliff Arquette, familiar emcee and character actor (formerly with "Glamour Manor," as "Mrs. Wilson" of the Dick Haymes show, and "Ben Willett" of "Point Sublime") for more than eighteen years. Winners of the last stand Saturday night audience shows were offered some type of help to further launch their careers. Other grand prizes included large Packard-Bell television-radio (FM and AM)-phonograph combinations.

# Pantomime Whizzes

Sunday, 8:00 p.m.

**F**RIDAY the Thirteenth won't soon be forgotten by Mike Stokey, a former City College boy who has good reason to regard the usually fatal day as a good omen. It was on November 13, 1947, that young Mr. Stokey received a telephone call that plunked him soundly into West Coast television, and re-united him with a school buddy who harbors similar ideas about the right way to make a living.

"Pantomime Quiz" is just another name for the old game of indications. The dramatics classes at Los Angeles City College used to pass the time between classes by this game, and ever since that day Mike clung to the thought that a similar routine might make a heck of a presentation for the new medium. A few years later, when video got rolling, Mike tried to peddle his idea. He was graciously received by program man-

agers at the two stations then in operation, and just as graciously ushered out of their offices, with "Pantomime Quiz" still in idea form. Then Paramount's KTLA called Mike, and announced that if in two days he could line up teams for his "game," it would go on as a replacement. By Sunday, November 15, Mike had a team of players from the University of Southern California (U.S.C.) ready to meet a team from the University of Southern California at Los Angeles (U.C.L.A.). He had Roddy McDowall and Fortunio

Bonanova as guest stars. During his frenzied telephone calling of old friends and drama students, Mike had run into Bernie Ebert, and their friendship was re-cemented with worry over this one chance, with practically no notice, to make good. But they did make good. The young idea men today operate as "Stokey-Ebert Enterprises" and package three entertaining shows.

The question now is never "Whom can we get for the show Sunday?" The problem lies in choosing from the ranks who call to ask if their

team may be on the show. Offers of meeting the current champions flood the "Enterprises" office.

**Indications**

The game itself consists of members of a team, one at a time, picking a slip from the fishbowl. On that slip is written the name of a song, a movie title, a famous saying or a play title. The drawer must convey to his own team, through his actions, in the shortest time possible, and using no spoken words, the wording on his slip. Members of the teams, which usually number four to a side, alternate. The time limit on each charade is two minutes. The side wins which tallies the *least* number of minutes used up in acting out the messages.

Artists who have guested on the show include Bill Bendix, Jack Oakie, Howard Duff, with just about every other known air detective; a team of well-known boxers vs. well-known wrestlers; real doctors vs. radio doctors; the columnists vs. the people of the entertainment world about whom the columnists write. Les Brown's team of Eileen Wilson, Ray Kellogg and Sonny Burke established the all-time low for all four of them successfully to act out their hidden title or slogan. One minute and twelve seconds.

**Just Carried Away**

Mike explains that a tremendous competitive spirit has grown up between visiting teams, and judging from the incoming mail the spectators enjoy the matches and return matches as much as do the players.

"Things are rolling along wonder-

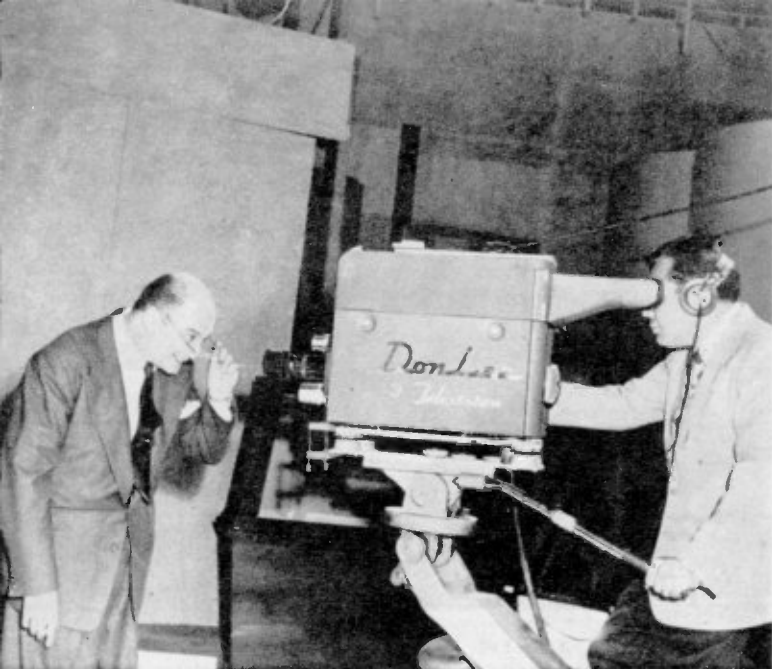

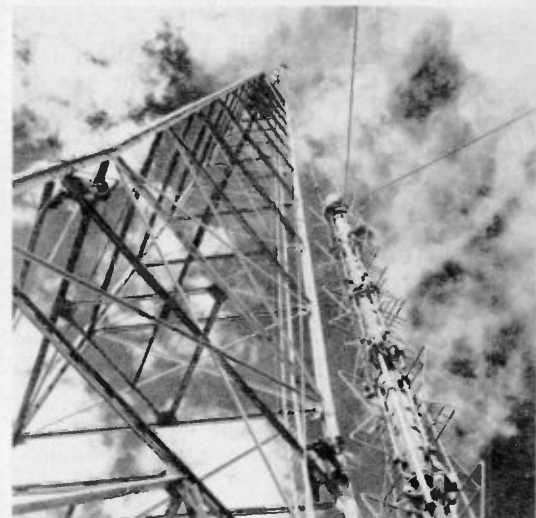

Your good Sunday listening starts early on ABC. . . . There are morning favorites like the hymn session, "Church in the Wildwood" which opens KECA at 7, that nationally famous quartet, "The Southernaires," at 8:30 . . . the inspirational programs, "Message of Israel" and "Hour of Faith," and many others. For example, there's the entertaining and informative "Romance of the Highways," heard at 10:15 every Sunday morning. Headed by world traveler, Commander A. W. Scott, the show has been a favorite of western radio fans for almost thirteen years. . . . From their own armchairs, they travel in fancy to interesting and scenic spots in Western America, and hear his always entertaining accounts of their past and present. Commander Scott has thirteen globe-circling trips to his credit, as well as an estimated 1,400,000 miles of travel in the United States.

Speaking of western lore, there's "California Caravan," another Sunday airer on ABC-KECA (4 p.m.) which dramatizes exciting tales of pioneer days in the Golden State, and brings to life little-known incidents which have helped to build the West into the great industrial and cultural center that it is today. . . . And there's a new and later Sunday afternoon time for the commentary, "This Changing World" with Harrison Wood, which now airs at 5:30, instead of 1 p.m.

In the drama department, Michael Shayne, private-eye, is now heard on KECA Thursday nights at 9:30. . . . With Jeff Chandler, who is as ruggedly handsome as the character he portrays, in the title role, Shayne gives his fans a thrill a minute because he uses not the "sit back and deduce" method, but a more physical approach to crime solution . . . a method which frequently ends in near disaster for the hero. . . . Listen some Thursday night. . . . You'll see what we mean. . . . On the subject of crime dramas, it's small wonder that the "This Is Your FBI" shows are so realistic. . . . Jerry Devine, who originated the series, took time off to attend the regular training course given to all prospective G-men. . . . This is the thirty-minute broadcast put on by the American National Theater and Academy, an organization that includes practically every worthwhile talent in the theater, and sponsored by the U. S. Army and Air Force Recruiting Service.

The opening show boasted an array of troupers that could not be matched by any star-studded Hollywood effort. Just look at this: Mary Martin, Alec Templeton, Alfred Drake, the legendary Willie Howard, Donald Cook and Tallulah Bankhead. The packed thirty minutes kaleidoscoped a Broadway tour of hit performances. Miss Bankhead and Cook offered a segment from their current version of "Private Lives." Willie Howard did his famous "French Lesson." Mary Martin teamed with Templeton in one of his witty satires and Alfred Drake emceed the proceedings. Vinton Freedley, producer of Broadway hits, spoke a few words about ANTA and gave the show a welcome to the airways that must have been echoed by listeners from coast to coast.

#### "Marriage for Millions"

With the frightening increase of broken homes and families, many worthy endeavors are being inaugurated to salvage and give rebirth to the Great American Institution.

Among the very notables is the Community Chest's new radio series, "Marriage for the Millions," heard on Tuesdays over KECA at 6:30 p.m. That it should be recommended to those on the very edge of separation is only halfway praise; it should also be serious listening for those just beginning life together.

Prominent personalities (Jinx Falkenburg, Rosalind Russell, John Kiernan, Fannie Hurst, Bert Lytel, etc.) are featured, in these important little fifteen-minute dramas based on case studies of actual marital problems and how they have been solved.

During the quarter-hour, listeners might easily identify themselves with quarrelsome wife or unreasonable husband, and be "reached" by the far-from-trite arguments of giving and forgiving suggested by the marriage welfare consultant. Neither spouse



ever appears to be scot-free of blame, and the ideas for making "a new start" of a shambles are inspiring.

"Marriage for the Millions" is sponsored by family service agencies of Los Angeles, Pasadena and Long Beach, and by the Jewish Family Service of Los Angeles. In keeping with its excellent message and purpose, the series (a transcribed one) is beautifully written, produced and enacted.

### "Lynn Looks at Hollywood"

"Lynn Looks at Hollywood," KHJ, 1:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, is another of the Hollywood chatter programs for which the public appetite seems insatiable. Lynn Castile, the lady with the lore, brings a nice, wide-eyed interest to the local scene and communicates this same feeling to her listeners. Happily, she seems to do no editorializing unless you could put in that category a wistful statement that silent stars were a more glamorous group than the later crop. (Well, weren't they?) The fifteen minutes of Hollywoodiana is broken once during the show for a recorded song pertaining to one of the items. Guest-star interviews are conducted with a minimum of gushing and tend to be a little more straightforward than the usual variety. In fact, on the few broadcasts we've heard of this pleasant little program, it seems to us that Miss Castile has accented the more legitimate movie news and left the fanciful rumors of who-is-breaking-up - what - home-and-will-lose-what-contract to those who deal mainly in that whimsy-poo. And we haven't yet heard her say, "Remember, you heard it here first!"

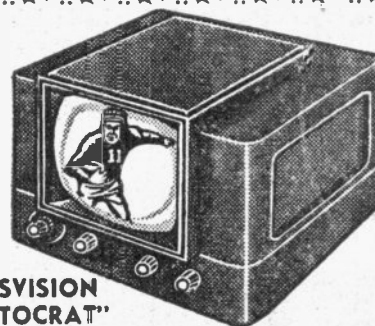

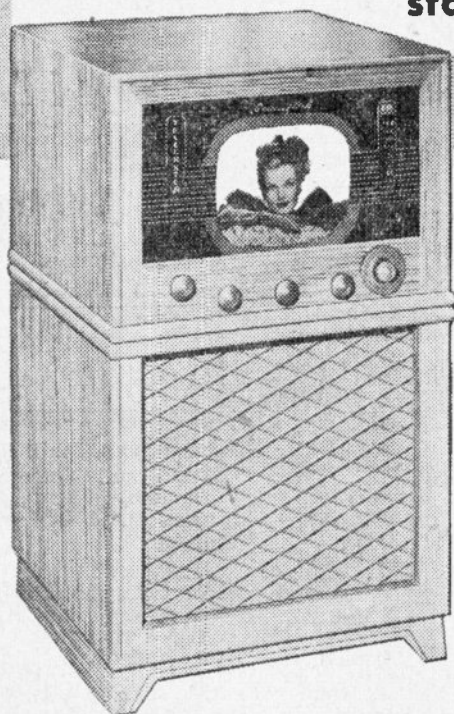

# DIALAGNOSIS

Program Views and Reviews from the Tenth District P.-T.A.

By JUNE D. PRAY

During the first-quarter-hour on KHJ, 3:30 Monday through Friday, "Adventure Parade" is broadcast. It is a dramatization of children's books—one each week in five episodes. This program has long been on our "recommended" list and last year it won our

annual award as the outstanding children's program. It provides action, mystery, and adventure, yet serves well its purpose of stimulating interest in literature, and we are deeply grateful to KHJ for bringing it to us.

Then at 3:45 "Superman" is broad-

cast. It embodies all the features we protest most strongly. It is based on crime and violence—crimes are solved and criminals brought to justice by an individual operating independently of the functions of law and order—it uses all the cliff-hanger and suspense techniques so harmful to young listeners—and even when viewed purely as a dramatic production, is a very poor program indeed. To be specific, a recent series entitled "Murder Scores a Touchdown" contained the following beneficial and cultural elements: murder, attempted murder, burglary, poison, gambling, phony chemistry, and bad grammar—all mixed up in an involved plot centering around the outcome of a football game.

"Superman" has won recognition for its campaign against racial and religious prejudice and we commend its intent in that respect. However, the effectiveness of its message is open to question, tacked on as it is to such questionable program content, and we strongly condemn this "sugar-coating" technique. It is apparent, too, that the broadcasters of "Superman" do not attach much importance to its tolerance pleas, since they are frequently supplanted by more materialistic messages—i.e., three one-minute plugs per broadcast offering a quiz game in return for 10 cents mailed to "Superman." And of course commercial announcements replace the loftier messages when the program is sponsored.

"Adventure Parade" and "Superman" are cooperative shows—that is, they are available for sponsorship locally or regionally in lieu of national sponsorship. At present neither is sponsored in this area. We'd like to suggest to prospective sponsors that "Adventure Parade" is the type of program which we favor for our children's listening.

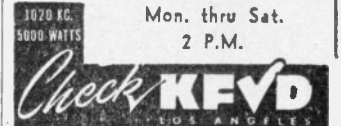

**ALBUM OF THE WEEK:** Lovers of Viennese music will welcome the six twelve-inch sides comprising the London album "Franz Lehar Conducts." . . . Here in overture form are selections from "The Merry Widow," "Gypsy Love" and "Women of Vienna" and, as conducted by the composer, with the Zurich Tonhalle Orchestra, they're as fresh and invigorating as the gay Vienna of yesterday. . . . Lehar has conducted his Last Performance, but here is music that will always command a gorgeous Chord in G! . . . **RECORD OF THE WEEK:** Discovery has another unusual waxing in Phil Moore's "Fugue for Barroom Piano"—a musical portrait of a frustrated honky-tonk pianist who, while playing a fragment of better music from his early days, imagines himself in concert with full orchestra backing only to awake to reality again at the bistro . . . it's unusual . . . it's daring . . . it's easily a three-noter. . . . **RE-ISSUE OF THE WEEK:** "Elmer's Tune" and "Juke Box Saturday Night" by Glenn Miller are back on the RCA-Victor label and none are more welcome than this top-flighter of yesterday—it's like meeting someone from the old home town . . . especially "Juke Box" with its Beneke, Hutton & Modenaire vocals and its Harry James and Ink Spots impressions that made it a three-note item. . . . **JAZZ:** The Benny Goodman Sextet rides as of yore on Capitol's "Varsity Drag" with some top solo work by BG, Norvo and Powell. . . . There are no dull moments in this fast arrangement with a strong beat. . . . What a pity the reverse "Maids of Cadiz" had to hold back this brisk disc to the two-note division! . . . **GIRL VOCAL:** Doris Day spins out the soft wordage of "Pretty Baby" and the appealing "Just Imagine" in intimate style and easy relaxed tempos with pleasing backing by George Siravo's musicians. . . . A little of the Day whispered huskiness would have boosted this otherwise Columbia double-noter. . . . **MALE VOCAL:** Displaying more ease than usual and avoiding the customary Laine-isms, Frankie has a pair of top-pers in the lullaby "Tara Talara Tala" and the seasonal "You're All I Want for Christmas," which might turn into a standard Holly-timer from Laine's Mercury platter. . . . Here is Frankie at his best, and easily rating the three-note division. . . . **NOVELTY:** Baileys in again (Pearl, that is) and in her best tired style sings "I'm Lazy, That's All" and "Say It Simple" . . . and the more tired she sounds, the better we like our Pearl and the reason we say with a yawn . . . "Ho-hummmmm . . . three-notes."

# S. D. and J. S. Love TV

*And Does TV Love Them!*

**J**UDY SPLINTERS just loves television. "I've got television eyes," she explains piping. "Hocus-pocus-focus. I can see where all the birthday gifts are hidden."

Judy's pal, Shirley Dinsdale, just loves television too. Naturally, she likes radio, but "television is the medium for Judy," she adds generously.

In December, 1942, just three months after Shirley moved to Hollywood from San Francisco, Radio Life "did a story" on the wistful little ventriloquist and her pert dummy. The angle, as we remember, was that Shirley's life had been punctuated by "eye-openings." First, of course, was her birth on Halloween (twenty-one years ago this past October 31). Next happened in a San Francisco hospital room, where little Shirley Faye was not expected to live after being severely burned by hot oil which tipped over on the kitchen stove and trickled down over her fair hair and delicate skin. It was on Christmas Eve, after a serious skin-grafting operation, that tiny Shirley opened her eyes to see a tree, heaped about with presents all put there by nurses who had grown to love her in no time at all.

### Judy "Born"

The third eye-opener was almost as important as the other two: it came on the day old-time ventriloquist Lawrence Johnson informed the Dinsdales that their daughter was a "natural ventriloquist" and that there was nothing more he could teach her. A few days later, Shirley's father (a toy designer and commercial artist) made a dummy for Shirley. "Judy Splinters," she was

christened. Shirley herself sewed on strands of black yarn for hair and made Judy a dress. That night they entertained for the people attending a church party.

Then Shirley and Judy came to Hollywood and opened their eyes to more and more radio (they had already made 65,000 people chuckle in San Francisco). Eddie Cantor featured the ventriloquist-dummy team on his show and so did Nelson Eddy. Between microphone jobs, Shirley and Judy entertained the servicemen and finally, in 1946, the USO sent them on a tour of the country which kept them on the road for nine months. Judy estimates that she and Shirley have given shows for more than a million of the boys.

Since a year ago last September, Misses Dinsdale and Splinters have been opening a few thousand pairs of eyes focused on KTLA. Most of the eyes that pop at Shirley and Judy nightly (except Sunday) at 6:30 are the wide-eyed ones of children, but you'd be surprised to see the mail that S. and J. get from the wheel-chair brigade. Recently, when it was suggested that the program be pushed up to 6:00 p.m., the team also discovered fans among papas and mamas. Wrote one woman, "Please don't move the program up half an hour. Daddy just can't make it home in time." We have it straight from Judy's saucy lips that it's not uncommon procedure for mothers to call their youngsters in from play by calling "Judy time! Judy time!" And straight to the house of the neighbor with a television set streak anywhere from one to twenty children, anxious to hear and see the show that specializes in presenting "a cross section of Little America growing up." Youngsters

watch raptly while Shirley and Judy chatter, sing, read stories, and present children as guests. In choosing youngsters for appearances on the program, the *child* is considered first, not his accomplishments. Ordinary children are sometimes tongue-tied on the program, but not often in Judy's presence, and Judy would almost rather interview an awed little boy or girl trying to express his "growing pains" than exchange repartee with some sophisticated little boy or girl with "professional" rating.

During last summer's vacation, youngsters had more time to write letters to the program and they sent in an average of 100 daily. The mail now runs about seventy-five a day. Of course, all this detail keeps Shirley, Judy, and Shirley's mother extremely busy. There's a weekly voice lesson for Shirley . . . she plays tennis once in a while . . . but most important is her sponsorship of a group of twenty-five junior high school girls connected with Hollywood's First Presbyterian Church. Judy enters right into any activity like this, too. She has a kelley green jacket just like other members of the club.

### Clothes-Conscious

She and Shirley always dress alike for their program. They have twenty "twin" outfits, including pajamas. Their latest is a new sports model in plaid. "I look better in plaids and stripes when being televised," Judy pointed out. "And I like any color except black." Shirley's and Judy's winter suits are Sierra green with swing skirts and swing jackets, and their new party dresses are plaid taffeta. "The girls"

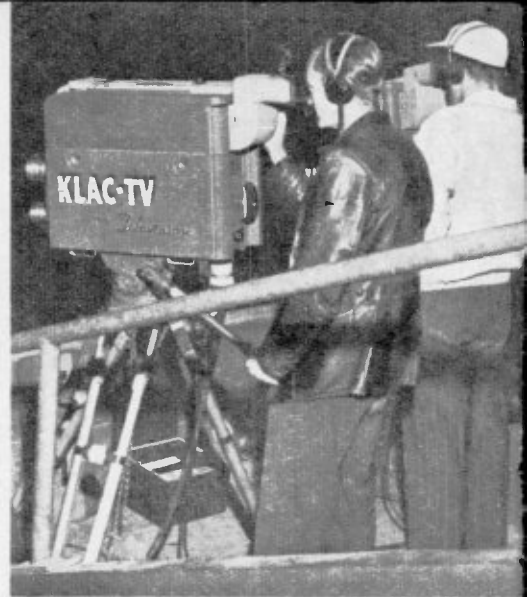

# KLAC-TV Kickoff

**D**ON FEDDERSON, KLAC and KLAC-TV's general manager, recently challenged all those "It can't be done's" and put up a television station in ninety days. He was the man behind the scenes who, forty-eight hours before the station was to debut, stayed with the engineers and workmen atop Mount Wilson, inspiring them to drive like a football team. On September 17, KLAC-TV sent out its first "test pattern" at 5:00 a.m. After twenty-four continuous hours, workmen were able to sleep for a little while prior to the telecasting of the opening University of Southern California football game that night.

About a month later KLAC stepped up daily video programming, still concentrating on weekend varsity football, but making Wednesday and Thursday nights variety shows.

Two of the clever programs from that period of development were

## *Seconds Counted in Getting New Station on Video Screen In Time for Gridiron Fray*

"Hollywood Merry-Go-Round" and "Hollywood Stepladder." The former show, emceed by Irwin Allen (long a commentator on affairs within the cinema capital) features a board of four movie guests who are quizzed on happenings in Hollywood. The panel has to try identifying old eight-by-ten stills from silent pictures; guess from what early talking picture portions of old sound track came; and last, to identify a well-known actor merely from his shadow. This show exemplifies the manner in which a quiz can be lent the visual treatment for video.

"Hollywood Stepladder," true to its name, comprises a group of youthful students from the Ben Bard School, finding an opportunity in television to parade their talents.

Both these presentations come from the station on Cahuenga Boulevard. With a football game it works a little differently. As the football season nears its end, many people owning TV sets have wondered just how KLAC-TV televises a football game.

### Method

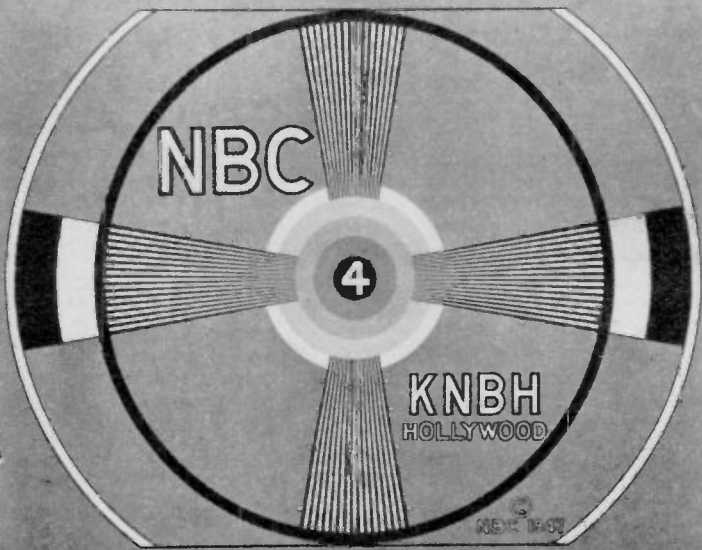

**E**XPERIENCE is the best teacher.

KNBH, NBC's television station on Channel 4, is currently telecasting a test pattern on a regular basis, and when it begins commercial operation the first part of the year it will reap the benefits of nearly twenty years of television experiment, research and actual broadcasting by NBC in New York.

Programs will be telecast five days a week, approximately three hours per day, when KNBH begins its commercial operations, and the telefare which will be offered by the NBC Hollywood station will be the best.

Already several NBC New York programs are being presented on Los Angeles television stations; these will all move to KNBH, Channel 4, the first of the year. Among the NBC programs being telecast here are the "Philco Television Playhouse" by KFI-TV, the "NBC Newsreel" by KTLA and the Dunninger-Paul Winchell program by KTSL.

#### Set-up

Confusion may exist in the minds of many Southern Californians as to NBC's television operations. NBC's AM radio programs are heard, and will continue to be heard, on affiliate KFI. But when NBC's television station begins programming on Channel 4, it will be under the ownership and management of the National Broadcasting Company and will be competitive to stations mentioned in the preceding paragraph as well as to KTTV, KECA-TV and KLAC-TV.

A few of the programs not now seen here, but seen in the East and Midwest on NBC television network stations which will be viewed in Southern California via Channel 4 are "Musical Miniatures," "Stop Me If You've Heard This One," "America Song," "Television Screen Magazine" and "Howdy Doody," the marionette who has become the friend of every little girl and boy within range of an operating NBC television station.

ANYONE old enough to remember the dear dim days when twenty cents bought a theater ticket that covered a Rin-Tin-Tin show and a half hour of gaudy vaudeville need sigh no longer over the demise of live acts. Daily they are being reborn. Suddenly, last spring, some of them took a tentative step that landed them squarely on their feet in a broadcasting studio.

Late in May of this past year, Carlton Winckler, director-producer of Mutual Don Lee's television operation, decided that for all that boxing, wrestling and audience-partici-

pation shows were proving to be good entertainment, a slice of vaudeville would keep many another viewer glued to his set-side. Mr. Winckler had been imported from several successful seasons of stage direction in New York City, and knew the value of pretty dancing girls and madcap comics as entertainment spicers.

The result was permanent scheduling of the popular feature, "Music Hall," whose mail pull proved that the sports enthusiasts, too, welcomed music, dancing, magic and comedy.

The ten-piece orchestra and various artists who make up the entertainment each Tuesday night at 8:30 recently moved down off Mt. Lee, and perform in Mutual's swanky and more accessible Vine Street studios. The half-hour is an audience

show, to which visitors who have procured tickets from the station are welcome.

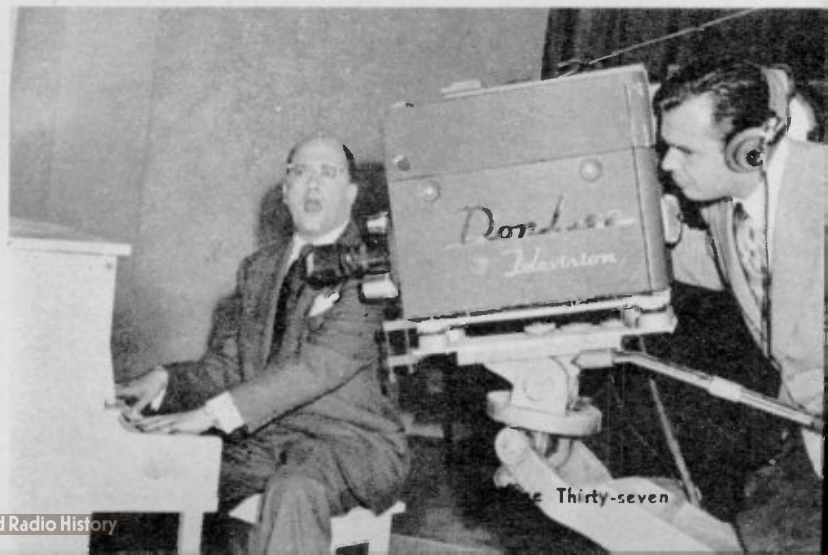
Each Tuesday night brings both to studio visitors and to at-home viewers a brand-new bill of fare. The big agency which books the acts for this spot can draw on the best and the least, the biggest and smallest, in the way of talent, city-wide, and send stars and unknowns alike to the stage of "Music Hall." Many times the unknowns have drawn demanding mail that brought them back to the camera.

You don't have to think back fondly to the days of bird calls, paper tearers, acrobatic dancers and marvelous magicians who made vaudeville the jolly point in any week. Vaudeville's not dead any longer. Television took care of that.

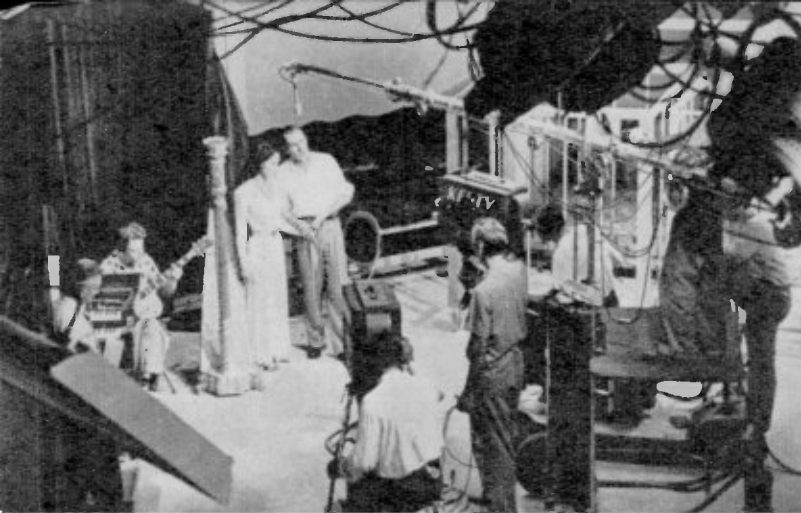

Shirley and Judy also use the car in the interests of their newest project—visiting sick children. Their calls are usually made on Sunday—the only day they have free. Some of the children are not seriously ill; some of them have but a short time to live. In the interests of these kiddies, Shirley and Judy have organized the Sandy Arthur Memorial with an objective of raising money to buy television sets for shut-in children. It is intended that each set be loaned a sick youngster until he has completed convalescence. Then he passes it along for someone else. The Memorial is named after Sandy Arthur, a little eight-year-old whom Shirley and Judy visited the week before he died. Just before he passed away, he whispered, "I'm going to miss Judy tonight, but I'm too weak to look." Then he became delirious, but kept calling Judy's name.

Most of the children Shirley and Judy visit will be well again. All that most of them want is just to lie quietly, hold Judy and look into her "hocus-pocus-focus" eyes.

A few of them are eager to touch her hands. They give a person a peculiar sensation, for Judy has springs in her wooden fingers.

fully for us," Mike grins, "but come Sunday, no matter who's playing, we still have one big worry. Television provides entertainment within the home, remember, and we must respect that.

"So no matter how experienced the player, or how fast he works, we have to keep our eye out for anybody to follow that most natural of tendencies to get some word across with an indelicate gesture, or by pointing to some part of his anatomy. The player, in earnest excitement, would be completely unconscious of anything offensive, but spectators might be shocked.

"One night recently, in a big play-off, one of the team members agonizedly wondered out loud 'What in h--- could it be?' He had no knowledge of having spoken until a fellow player told him . . . then the poor guy blanched with embarrassment! But it's great work, even though there's a lot more to it than just getting people to play games."

weighing approximately 100 pounds, and costing \$18,000 each. These cameras relay the picture to a master control truck stationed next to the athletic building, where Fred Henry supervises the picture screened in the home. One camera usually works at a time. However, both cameras continually follow the action. The pattern of each camera is shown on an individual receiver in the control truck. Inside the truck Henry chooses the camera which is to be used on the air by directing calls, such as "take one," "take two," "take one," etc., for approximately two and a half hours. From the control truck the picture is sent to the KLAC-TV transmitter high atop Mount Wilson, and from there to the thousands of television receivers from San Diego to Ventura.

Located in the press box is KLAC-TV's director of sports, Sam Balter, who sends out his audio description with the picture. The technique used in describing a televised game is naturally quite different from that used on an ordinary AM broadcast. As the viewers are witnessing the action, it is up to Balter to keep them advised as to types of plays used, players' names and other necessary information. There is a receiver set located next to Balter, so that he may view the televised game and the actual game at the same time.

It takes the use of ten men to televise a game, at an approximate cost of \$1,000.
