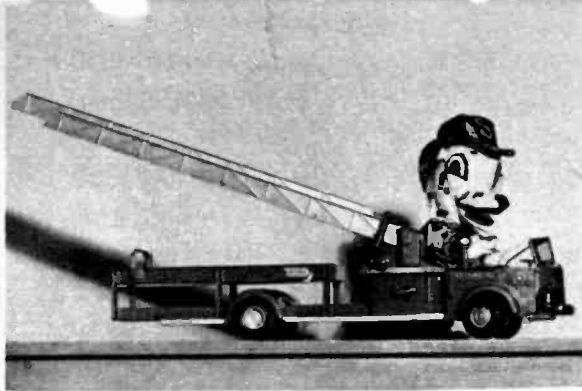

Once upon a time
a fellow wanted his own
TV show, so
look out, folks

Here Comes Hoagy!

IT WAS hard to tell whether Hoagy Carmichael was happy—or sick.

He was talking about his new job of taking over the "Show of Shows" time on Saturday evenings over NBC-TV for the summer. His hour-and-a-half-long program is "Saturday Night Revue" and he's the emcee. But the more he talked about it the more it seemed he was trying to get out of the whole deal.

"Don't tell anybody," Hoagy commented in his droll manner, "but I'll never know how I got into this. Me taking over an hour-and-a-half show! Why, something's gone wrong somewhere. Somebody gave me this job just to see if I had any talent. I can't sing. I can't dance, I can't play the piano, and I can't remember lines—so what am I doing?"

Hoagy was probably pulling a few legs, but NBC-TV is quite contented with the set-up. Perhaps because they don't know that Hoagy just doesn't know a thing about show business. After all, the guy has only written dozens of hit songs, among them the famous "Stardust," he's been in a good many pictures, he has done several TV shows with notable success. It looks as though the network has been fooled into

hiring a rank amateur with no experience at all.

So how did all this come about?

How He Got the Show

"I've got a good salesman in Eddie Sherman," Hoagy grinned. "He and I had been talking to NBC for about a year and a half trying to get together some kind of show. We wanted something different, but after a lot of talk we all kinda agreed there weren't any new ideas left.

"Then one day my business manager called me and said he had a TV spot for me. I got cold chills and told him not to tell me what it was for a few days. I wanted to get used to the idea. When he told me I was to do my own show—and an hour-and-a-half one at that—I was so surprised I could only close my eyes and say, 'Well, at least I don't have to work for two or three months.' I've been playing golf harder than ever since that fateful moment.

"Not that I don't like to work. I'm an unhappy guy when I have too much time on my hands. But I certainly have myself a challenge in this deal.

"On the show I'm trying to avoid the straight emcee kind of thing. None of this formula stuff like 'How are you's' to the talent, the endless

shaking of the hands. And I certainly won't do the whole show myself. We're having a name band each week and we also have a spot devoted to the showing of films made in Europe with comedy, singing, and dancing acts. They are at least different from the run of the mill."

Not So Relaxed

Naturally, Hoagy looks relaxed on this program. He always acted as though he's about to fall to pieces from absolute ease. But don't let that fool you. He's a real nervous guy—as nervous as any performer who is worth anything.

"It's very hard to be relaxed and give a good performance," Hoagy explained. "At least it is for me. It's easy to get up there and yell a lot, but that's not my style. The one thing that does worry me is my piano playing. It's a little uncertain. I've become a weak piano player because I haven't had the chance to work at it the way I'd like. Besides, I play by ear, I never even had any lessons—so maybe you can understand why I haven't regarded myself as a Horowitz."

Yeah, but can Horowitz play "Stardust" the way Hoagy can?

This Is Hoagy

For a few facts and figures about Mr. Hoagy, he once thought of becoming a lawyer. . . . "Stardust" changed his career abruptly. . . . "Rockin' Chair" and "Lazybones" followed this hit number and Hoagy was in. . . . He's married and has

"And this isn't sour grapes," says "Big Payoff" contestant Walter Miles, who had a fine time in New York but missed the final question which was worth mink, trips and a car

IF YOU were asked the name of the man (raised in the Hawaiian Islands, adopted by Americans who brought him to this country) who co-introduced basketball to the U.S.A. and who is called The Father of Basketball . . . if you were asked the name of this man, who also founded the Camp Fire Girls . . . would you know?

TV-Radio Life's Walter Miles recently smacked against this poser and when he failed to come up with the correct answer in the allotted

time, there slipped through his fingers a vast array of fancy prizes on CBS-TV's "The Big Payoff." Among loot were a mink coat, round-trip tickets for two to Paris, and a new Kaiser automobile. Value of these and other prize items was estimated at \$7000, so it's reasonable to expect that Walter would be keenly disappointed by his failure.

Instead, he and his family flew back from New York to Hollywood in pleasant frame of mind. Pressed for the reason of this unusual behavior, Walter finally broke down and ad-

mitted that he was truly relieved he hadn't won and added this startling attitude was not to be taken as sour grapes.

"Actually," he explained, "we got the wonderful trip to New York" (he won the drawing at a press party at Hollywood's Television City) "plus a week's vacation and feel exceedingly happy with these treats. In addition, for my answering correctly the three questions preceding the jackpot question, I won for Barbara, my wife, quite a few things: a bag, a white silk dress, a large white hat, some

rhinestone jewelry, a house coat, a large flacon of perfume, a pair of shoes, a sweater, and a watch.

"My pride, I guess, made me want to win the jackpot more than my desire for the prizes. As you know, time ran out the first day Barbara and I went on the program. So I had to wait until next day for a crack at The Big Payoff. I really wanted to win at that stage of the game, so I stayed up that night until 2 o'clock studying the World Almanac. When we went back to the show the following day, my mind was loaded with information about Presidents. I could have told you all about state flowers. I knew the name of Mohammed's father. But I didn't know the name of the man who was raised in Hawaii, was adopted by Americans, etc.

"That cost us The Big Payoff. At first Barbara and I felt rather forlorn. But that night, after the excitement tapered off, we sat down with pencil and paper and by the time we'd done some figuring, it dawned on us we hadn't been so unlucky.

"Here's why. The mink coat was estimated at \$2500, but before we

could start thinking about taking it (it has to be made special to each winner's requirements) we would have had to pay the Federal tax, \$500. This we didn't have. The Kaiser car was valued at \$1600, but to take delivery from the local dealer we would have had to pay about \$135 for California sales tax and license. The trip tickets were not negotiable, so I doubt very much that we would have taken them if I had gotten the right answer, because the time for the trip was limited to the period between October and March, and we couldn't have gone to Europe then. Since I couldn't have sold them, it would have been silly to have taken the tickets and not used them, because we'd have been stuck for income taxes. As for income taxes, I've no really accurate figure, only a rough estimate on what they would have amounted to had I won The Big Payoff. But a very conservative figure would be \$1500. This, together with the \$500 for the coat tax and \$135 for the car tax and license, would have amounted to something like \$2300—the sort of money the Mileses just don't have.

"Now I see what the people run-

ning The Big Payoff mean when they say that this show is not a giveaway for those who are in need. I guess it's actually the higher-income bracket's 'Strike It Rich,' and people who are chosen as contestants should be able to afford the luxury items given as prizes."

Now that Walter, Barbara, Kenny and Patty are back home, the fashion prizes have been arriving steadily and have been completely satisfying. It was interesting to Walter, as he again resumed his rounds of TV and radio, to find that nobody he talked to, including sports enthusiasts, Camp Fire Girls or their Guardians, has known the correct answer for the jackpot query he missed. It was also interesting to learn that the "Big Payoff" show has an average of only two winners a month.

Still more interesting, to Walter at least, was the discovery that had he stayed up just one more hour the night he crammed so hard on World Almanac, he might have known the right answer. When he quit to tumble into bed, he was only ten pages from the information which would have told him the name of the man was Luther Gulick. (Or did you know?)

TELEVISION has hurt radio. No one can deny that. But television has helped the people who still perform on radio. How? Briefly, it has taught the radio personality to appreciate his own medium.

Almost every day around Hollywood—or any TV or radio studio throughout the nation—you hear the comments:

"Radio is a snap compared to TV."

"Radio people never realized how soft they had it, until TV came along." And how true this is!

Hospital lists and doctors' bills—or just a visit backstage—are ample and dramatic proof of these statements.

A half-hour or full-hour show on TV has made physical and nervous wrecks of many of our topnotch and most experienced performers. TV, with its great demand for precision and exactness, is undoubtedly a tremendous strain on the entertainers.

Bill's Background

A more concrete and specific ex-

ample of how easy radio is in comparison to TV is Mr. Bill Stewart of KMPC.

Bill is an "iron man of the mike" at the 50,000-watt outlet. During an average week he is actually on the air over forty hours. This does not include the time he spends digging up records to spin on his programs.

The soft-spoken, pleasant deejay spins platters from his own library. He's been collecting records ever since 1932. That was the same year when, as a child, he won a talent contest at Vancouver, B. C., to appear on the Canadian Broadcasting Company network. He's had the "radio bug" ever since.

His first professional job as a disc jockey was with station CKMO in Vancouver when he was still in school. In 1941 he joined the Canadian Air Force.

Hollywood Hitch

In 1945, after a short stint at KTFI in Twin Falls, Idaho, Bill entered the U. S. military service and was as-

signed to Armed Forces Radio Service in Hollywood.

Following his discharge from the service, Bill worked for KLAC and KWKW. Finally, in November, 1952, he became a member of the KMPC staff family.

With the exception of doing a few TV commercials, the pudgy-faced, good-looking announcer is completely happy in radio. And especially so with KMPC. He believes wholeheartedly in the station's integrity, both in regard to suitable, reliable sponsors and listenable, pleasant music.

In private life Bill and his wife, Rusty, have two sons, Dick, ten, and Jim, nine. They live in Burbank.

His most embarrassing moment on mike: One night, on a coast-to-coast hookup in Canada, he had to read a commercial which concluded: "Remember, it's irradiated!"

Instead, he slipped and said: "Remember, it's irritated!"

Let's spin a record on that one, Mr. Stewart.

Second Glances (Critical Comment)

"Revlon Mirror Theater"

Tuesday, 8:00 p.m.
NBC-TV (KNBL)

A study in human emotions was vividly portrayed by **Eddie Albert** in the opening stanza of the "Revlon Mirror Theater" teleseries. As the young traveling salesman in "The Little Wife" it's Albert's show from beginning to end.

He receives a telegram that his wife is dying but he refuses to believe it. While on the train en route home he works hard at accentuating the positive despite the message in the tele-

gram. He pathetically tries to convince himself that the doctor isn't always right. He informs a fellow passenger that his wife Bessie is all right and that the baby is a boy. His make-believe is touching and there are moments when his despair breaks through. Flashbacks recall his happy marriage. The scene depicting his return home after three years of war was exceptionally well played. At first the young couple were strange, uneasy and unsure of each other, but eventually their restraint gave way to their happy expressions of love.

Albert continues the pretense of believing until he reaches home to face the reality. He kept his wife alive as long as he possibly could.

Georgiana Johnson was convincing as the little wife, "Bessie." The supporting cast also performed credibly.

It is difficult to judge a drama series when the initial ailer is a character study, but if Albert's performance is any indication of the calibre for the ensuing dramas we believe "Revlon Mirror Theater" will find wide appeal. The one discordant note, however, was the commercial. The young lady who delivered it spoke in a high squeaky voice and squinted her eyes "ecstatically" while she speiled about non-smear lipstick. Frankly, it was irritating. When will sponsors learn to give us adult commercials?—M.R.

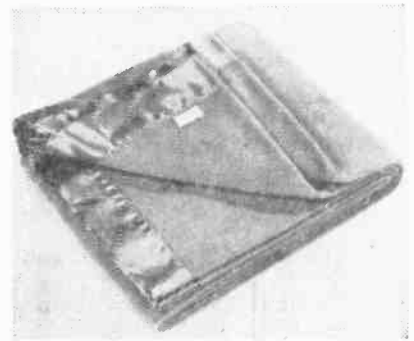

THERE SEEMS TO BE A RASH OF look-alike shows breaking out on TV. HOLLAND'S TUNNEL

Seeing Lucy and Desi at MGM recently where they're making "The Long, Long Trailer" reminded me of an incident that took place a few years ago. They were both very excited then that their show, "I Love Lucy," had climbed to seventh place in ratings. Everyone knows on what comfortable position that show is now resting. They said at the time they weren't too anxious for a top spot because of the pressure involved in staying on top. Now, of course, Lucy and Desi are a national habit, a favorite pastime of millions. They've been number one for a year—a remarkable record in this day of fast-changing public moods and interests. So how do they feel now? There must be great strain for any performers to know they have hit the high-water mark and that somehow they must stay there. There isn't much chance to relax in a situation like this. So much has been written about the public's tiring of TV stars so fast and yet Lucy and Desi continue to romp merrily along at a fast pace. They will probably remain favorites for a long time to come—and they are one of the few who will remain in popular favor—but it must mean terrific pressure. How can you keep topping yourself? Maybe the answer is simple: "Let's do the best we know how, give the best entertainment possible, and then pray." Regardless of any pat philosophy, the only shows that will remain tops will be those which refuse to sacrifice quality for quantity. This Lucy and Desi have not done—nor are they likely to.

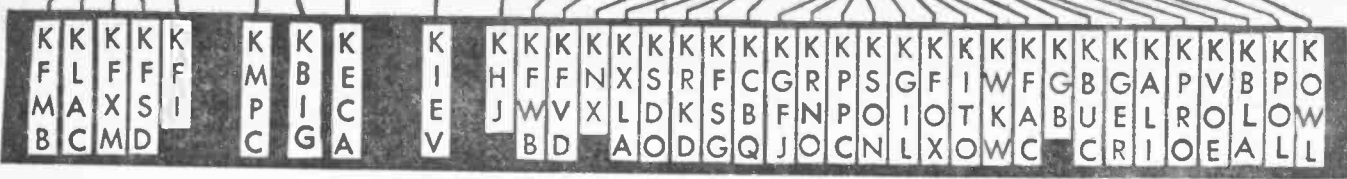

IT'S NOT very often that people in television can lead normal lives. Because of night shows, week-end engagements, guest appearances, and unusual rehearsal hours, the average performer on TV works very un-average hours.

Not so with the "Lucky U" gang at KHJ-TV. They usually are lucky. They know it. And they like it.

They rise with the sun. They are at the Don Lee studios by at least noon. Rehearse the songs and script until show time. Go on the air at 3:30 p.m. Through by 4 p.m. Relax and have a cup of coffee. Read over the script for tomorrow's show with writer-director Ed Haldeman and production assistant Donna Compton until about 6 o'clock. Then they go home, as all ordinary working people should.

This routine goes on five days a week, Monday through Friday. Their week ends are free.

Totals: a working week of approximately forty hours.

Results: a happy, energetic group who put on an entertaining half-hour show—without worry about ulcers or a nervous breakdown.

Quantity Plus Quality

"Lucky U" is not the best variety show in town. However, in considering the budget limitations, and by incorporating elements which have proven successful on other programs,

it does strike a wide enough range to please thousands of viewers. One, if not all, of the following departments is bound to satisfy some part of the audience:

Music. Naturally, this is the main feature of the program. Ken Curtis, formerly with the Sons of the Pioneers and a Western star for Columbia pictures, and lovely Betty Taylor are the featured vocalists. Blonde Betty adds poise and pulchritude to the all-male-except-her cast. She's single and once-upon-a-time sang with Les Brown.

Providing the musical background are Frankie Messina, the accordionist, and "The Top Hands," including Rex Dennis, guitar (formerly with Freddy Martin), Chuck Hurta, fiddle, and Buddy Dooley, bass.

Comedy. Shug Fisher, the Oklahoma Kidder, is always on hand to make the audience feel at home and the entertainers as uncomfortable and foolish as possible.

Audience Participation. A solid gold and silver "Lucky U" ring is presented each day to a member of the audience who submits the best reason for wanting his wish to come true. Oddly enough, many of these wishes, some quite dramatic, become reality within a very short time.

Contests. Besides a "tongue-twisters" contest, the best letter from the viewers at home is selected from

"The Wishing Well." As long as the request is not too elaborate (such as a Cadillac or a new home), the "Lucky U" gang always supplies what is asked for.

Western Approach. Whether the highbrows will admit it or not, the Western style of music and comedy has a tremendous appeal to the people in Southern California. Ken pointed out, however, that the majority of numbers are in the "pop" field.

"But we do dress in Western costumes. It may seem ironical, but if we don't dress Western fashion, people think we are being 'corny.' It also adds more informal atmosphere to the program."

"Lucky" Is Right

The original "Lucky U Ranch" show, starring the Sons of the Pioneers and Betty Taylor, was heard on KECA radio. In October, 1952, the gang switched to Mutual-Don Lee on both radio and TV. It is also listened to by ninety million people overseas on the Armed Forces Radio Service.

In February of this year, the "Sons" took to the road. Ken (who was recently married to Barbara Ford, the daughter of movie director John Ford), Shug, and Betty decided to stick with the "Lucky U" show. They had had enough of living out of a suitcase.

They haven't regretted their move. Today, they look at each other and say: "You Lucky U—and I do mean you!"

HOW TO GET TV-RADIO

HAPPY VACATIONISTS are pouring into Hollywood's radio and TV center by the thousands, all optimistically besieging the networks for tickets to their favorite shows. Their enthusiasm is bound to be dampened unless they possess a little forehand knowledge about tickets and summer shows.

Getting tickets is simple if you plan ahead.

Two Weeks' Notice

Requests for tickets should be sent in at least two weeks in advance. All such requests should be accompanied by self-addressed stamped envelopes with a California return address whenever possible. This will avoid tickets reaching the homes of out-of-town visitors after they are vacation-bound.

Of course there are many programs visitors may attend by picking up extra tickets at the reception desks of the various radio and video stations. But for the more popular shows it's wiser to make advance inquiries.

Here is one faithful radio-video fan who believes in writing for tickets. Following are excerpts from a letter received by CBS's ticket division from Abquaiq, Arabia:

Dear Sirs:

While I am away working in Arabia, my family is staying in Reseda, California. . . . It would please me very much and I would be ever grateful if you could furnish my wife with tickets for some of your top TV and radio shows. I will be in Arabia quite a while so if you could send her tickets for shows up to six months or more in the future I know she would appreciate them greatly.

P.S. I bought a twenty-inch TV set just before I came to Arabia and I can tell you I really miss it.

Good dramatic summer fare has been assured by at least one regular standby. . . . "Lux Radio Theatre" became "Lux Summer Theatre" last June. The summer stanza presents top motion-picture stars in adaptations of famous novels and plays as well as original stories by top Hollywood radio writers.

ABC provides a tour of its ABC-TV Center facilities for out-of-towners. Scheduled buses leave for the radio center at 1539 North Vine Street every hour on the hour. When people write to ABC for tickets the net issues "guest cards" which give visitors carte blanche to attend any ABC program.

Mutual-Don Lee's perennial favorite "Queen for a Day" requires from six to eight weeks advance reservations for tickets during the summer months. It would appear that almost every woman in America wants to be queen.

No matter what your video or radio pleasure might be, the guest-relations departments of the various stations and networks can serve you best if you remember to write for tickets in advance.

a song called "Quit Sittin' in the Pretzel Barrel, Leroy, or People Will Think You're on a Bender Again."

HAYNES: A Pretzel: that's a cracker with the cramps.

(AFTER DOG BARK) **HAYNES:** Alisandro, I see your dog is always chasing his tail but he never seems to catch it.

ALISANDRO: Si Senor. It's awful hard for heem to make both ends meeet, Ameeeego.

HAYNES: Did you hear about the butcher who went on a vacation? (He took a meat loaf.)

HAYNES: The famous wrestler, Lord Blears, came back from merry old England with some new grapple grips. He now ties all his opponents in Windsor knots. (Whether he wins or knot.)

BENNY: Uncle Richard, did you hear my new "intruder" song? They wouldn't let me intruder door, so I came intruder window. AH AH AH AH AH AH AH AH?

HAYNES: Presenting Sir Chester Drawers and his poem for today:

From Westerns to Crime

Rod Cameron, popular Western hero, invades the TV field as a detective in the new "City Detective" series

IT WAS inevitable that popular Rod Cameron, rugged and handsome hero of many an outdoor action film, should be asked to play Westerns for TV. But Rod nixed all such offers and turned to crime instead.

Rather, he decided to play a detective in the new TV crime series, "City Detective."

"I couldn't see any sense in doing Westerns for TV," Rod commented with a grin. "I'd be competing with myself. After all, I'm still doing the action stuff for the movies, you know. Besides, my TV show may give me a chance to break away from the strictly Western kind of part."

How Show Was Born

"Before I began making 'City Detective' for Revue Productions I had a lot of people asking me to do TV. Thousands of guys seem to be running around with scripts under their arms.

"The first two films I made for 'City Detective' were actually done for the Chevron Theatre." The product looked so good that Rod was nabbed for a regular series. "So here I am working my head off on television. And very happy about it, I might add.

Naturally, everyone wants to know if our series will be any different from other TV crime films. Well, all I can say is that 'crime is crime' and we think we have a good show. Some of our stories are based on actual police records but not all. One time an actor in one sequence read the script and said, 'Oh, this story happened in my home town.' We don't believe in advertising when an episode deals with an actual case.

"TV is quite a medium—and it's certainly a lot more concentrated than movies. I have to learn so much dialogue it's coming out of my ears. About twenty pages a day, is my average. Fortunately, I'm a fast

study. When I was ten, in fact, I learned 2000 verses of Scripture for Sunday school.

"TV is not, however, without its disadvantages. For one thing, my wife, Angela, feels like a TV widow because we seldom have any time together any more. We used to take off for vacations between pictures but now I'm doing TV when I'm not in a movie. And when I am home I'm usually studying.

"TV has also cut into my fishing and hunting—my two favorite hobbies."

Hunting

A couple of years ago Rod went elk hunting in Idaho. While there he met a couple of fellows who were his guides. They were impressed with the fact that a movie star could also be a very rugged he-man. Recently, they came to Hollywood for the Sportsman's Show and presented Rod with a gift—a seven-foot mountain lion they had killed!

"And this is the time when you're supposed to say, 'Oh, this is what I've always wanted,'" Rod said. "The lion had been so recently killed that there was still blood on it. It cost me \$185 to get it stuffed. But I'm not complaining. Regardless, it was a terrific gift.

"There's a rather funny sideline to this story. One of the men had never been in the city before. He took one look at the traffic on the freeway and refused to leave his motel for three days."

Rod and his wife just moved into a spacious new ranch-type home in Tarzana. And the moving was quite a job! It took fifteen carloads plus the big van to transport their many possessions to the new house. Most of the pieces were things Rod had bought while in Europe and China.

Many Interests

Rod is a man of many interests. . . . He is an expert at wood carving,



specializing in ships. . . . He is a fine pianist. . . . He's had over thirty jobs in his life. . . . He likes to watch hockey and boxing. . . . He collects records. . . . He is disinterested in eating and considers a Welsh rarebit as good a meal as any. . . . He dislikes people who honk their horns before the green light shows, who shove or grab, and those who talk with their faces too close to you. . . . His splurges are on hunting gear and automobiles. . . . He pilots his own plane.

Rod is fortunate in that he can view the demands of TV philosophically. He can even find something funny in doing commercials.

"A beer company sponsors my show," Rod said, "and I spent one entire day making commercials. I never drank so much beer in my life. This has got to go! Do you know of a good prop man with a formula for pale dry ice tea with a head on it?"
