Most Listenable Music

BILL WINTERSOLE. Bill grew up across the river from Cincinnati in Newport, Kentucky. An intellectual, he attended the university on a scholarship, graduated with honors. His tour of military duty took him to Korea. During the war he worked with Armed Forces Radio. Long range ambition is to be a writer; claims he would rather be a good one than a successful one... but hopes to be both. A recent addition to the staff of KPOL, Bill joined the station to become its after-midnight man, is heard regularly throughout the wee small hours on "The Big Show." Unmarried.

MORE than one Los Angeles radio station specializes in music. Of the group beaming melodies, KPOL may be singled out as middle-of-the course. No Presley. No rock 'n' roll. No really long-hair stuff. Chief requisite of KPOL programming is "listenability."

Instrumental records predominate over those with lyrics. Lex Baxter, Hugo Winterhalter, Andre Kostelanetz, Frank Chacksfield are typical maestros playing show tunes and semi-classical numbers now, or at one time, popular. Violins rather than trumpets, singing rather than crooning and persuasive, quiet "sell" on commercials rather than pitching are ingredients of KPOL's pleasant programming day and night.

WALT HOFFMAN. Born in Buffalo, Walt Hoffman at age 8 moved to Rochester, his home until recently. Was chosen for an opening at KPOL above some 50 announcers.

After a tour of duty with the Air Force as navigator of a B-17 over Germany (and a brief period as a prisoner-of-war in Brunswick), resumed his education at the University of Wisconsin. Graduated with honors, then earned his masters degree.

GEORGE CROFFORD. Southern California native. Acting and announcing careers have taken him to Santa Maria, Ontario, Pomona, Bakersfield, finally back "home." JANE POWELL, the delectable and diminutive star of the screen, was finally launching herself full force into TV — via the Producers' Showcase production of "Ruggles of Red Gap," a musical version of the stalwart hit. Along with Janie were Imogene Coca, Peter Lawford, and Michael Redgrave.

This was Janie's first real TV plunge — and for a very good reason.

TV Debut

"I had wanted to go into television but I preferred doing my first job in a spectacular," Janie said. It is significant to note that Janie was making her TV dent in a live show and not in a film production. It is equally interesting that she is one of the few motion picture stars who has not wholeheartedly embraced television before.

"The idea of doing 'Ruggles of Red Gap' intrigued me," Janie said, "even though at first I wasn't too anxious to give an unqualified 'Yes' to the offer. For one thing, I had seen no script, I didn't know what part I was playing, and I was leery. For all I knew Imogene Coca and I would run off together at the end of the story and David Wayne and Peter Lawford would pair off. But my agent argued with me, I listened, and I figured that if the idea were good enough for the rest of the stars it should be okay with me. I also liked the songs written by Julie Styne and Leo Robin for the show — so I took the plunge."

Janie had just finished making "The Girl Most Likely" for RKO and was happy about this since it offered her a better

type of role — a more adult, sophisticated light comedy kind of part. She was also excited about the new boat she and her husband, Pat Nerney, had bought recently. It's a 40-foot ketch called the Etoile.

"I was on location in Newport for 'Girl Most Likely' when Pat and I saw the boat," Janie bubbled. "So since he had always loved the sea and I rather enjoyed it too, we bought it. We've been going down every week-end since and have had a ball.

Husband

"Pat is branching out in another field now. You know he has a Ford agency. Well, now he has turned author. He has written a book called 'Sugar 'n Spice' or 'How Little Girls Are Made,' which is a sort of manual for bachelors. I know this sounds quite daring, but, really, you can read it to children it's that nice. He and Paul Clemens wrote it together and it has been accepted for publication. Paul and he started it when they were both bachelors and were on a European trip. Then Paul got married and Pat and I were married and the book was forgotten. However, they kept talking about it so they finally decided to finish it."

Janie has been a busy girl with her career and her home. She has three children, the latest being daughter Lindsey Averille, who is one year old. She has another daughter, Cissy, four, and a son, Gary, five and a half.

"It seems that TV isn't the only new venture for me," Janie concluded. "I've also been making records for Verve, and I'm particularly elated at how well my album, 'Can't We Be Friends' has been going and at the success of my single, 'True Love.' I'm certainly not in any rut these days — thank heavens!"

Janie was taking off for New York to begin rehearsals for the TV spectacular — as was Imogene Coca whom I talked to just before her departure. She was in a bit of quandary since her dog was quite ill and would have to be left behind in a hospital. Imogene had hoped to be able to stay with her pet but rehearsal schedules made this impossible.

Imogene was as confused about what she was doing in "Ruggles of Red Gap" as was Janie.

"I saw the movie and read the book," Imogene said

lightly, "and was mightily impressed with both, so the idea of doing a musical version was of more than passing interest to me. But after saying I'd do it, I began to wonder about what part there was for me. I couldn't remember any women in the story — at least none of any importance. I was then told that the script wasn't done because the producers wanted to know first who would play the various roles and then the writers would do the script around them. I had no idea if I were to be Jane Powell's uncle or Peter Lawford's maid. I just had faith in the people doing it so went ahead.

"I frankly enjoy doing specs like this rather than a TV series. Not that I wouldn't like a regular series but it would have to be the right one now. I certainly prefer doing what I am now to doing a show of my own that I didn't like.

"My biggest ambition is to do a show on Broadway. And I'd be happy if it were a dramatic one. Most comedienne want to do drama, but, after all, comedy and drama aren't so far removed."

Imogene had rented a home in Bel Air with three bedrooms and two fireplaces. A friend was staying with her — but she in no way thought the place was too big for just two people.

"I love it here," she said. "I like to see a lot of stuff growing, so perhaps that's why I wanted to be in Bel-Air. All that greenery, you know. And, besides, I like room. In New York I live in an apartment near enough to the East River to be frustrated because I can't see the river." She laughed, "But I get a lovely view of smoke stacks and warehouses."

Imogene then discussed the problem she had of deciding how to return to New York. She finally settled on the train, although she doesn't like trains. And she won't fly unless someone she knows is with her. When she is settled in one place, she won't drive a car because she can't drive. As she put it, "I have too much consideration for the pedestrians to risk their lives."

With a deep sigh she added, "Maybe walking is the only way for me."

Producers' Showcase has two delightful stars in Imogene and Janie Powell. With their names on the roster and with Peter Lawford, David Wayne, and Michael Redgrave also starring, "Ruggles of Red Gap" should be a TV highlight.

Janie and Imogene certainly hope so anyway!

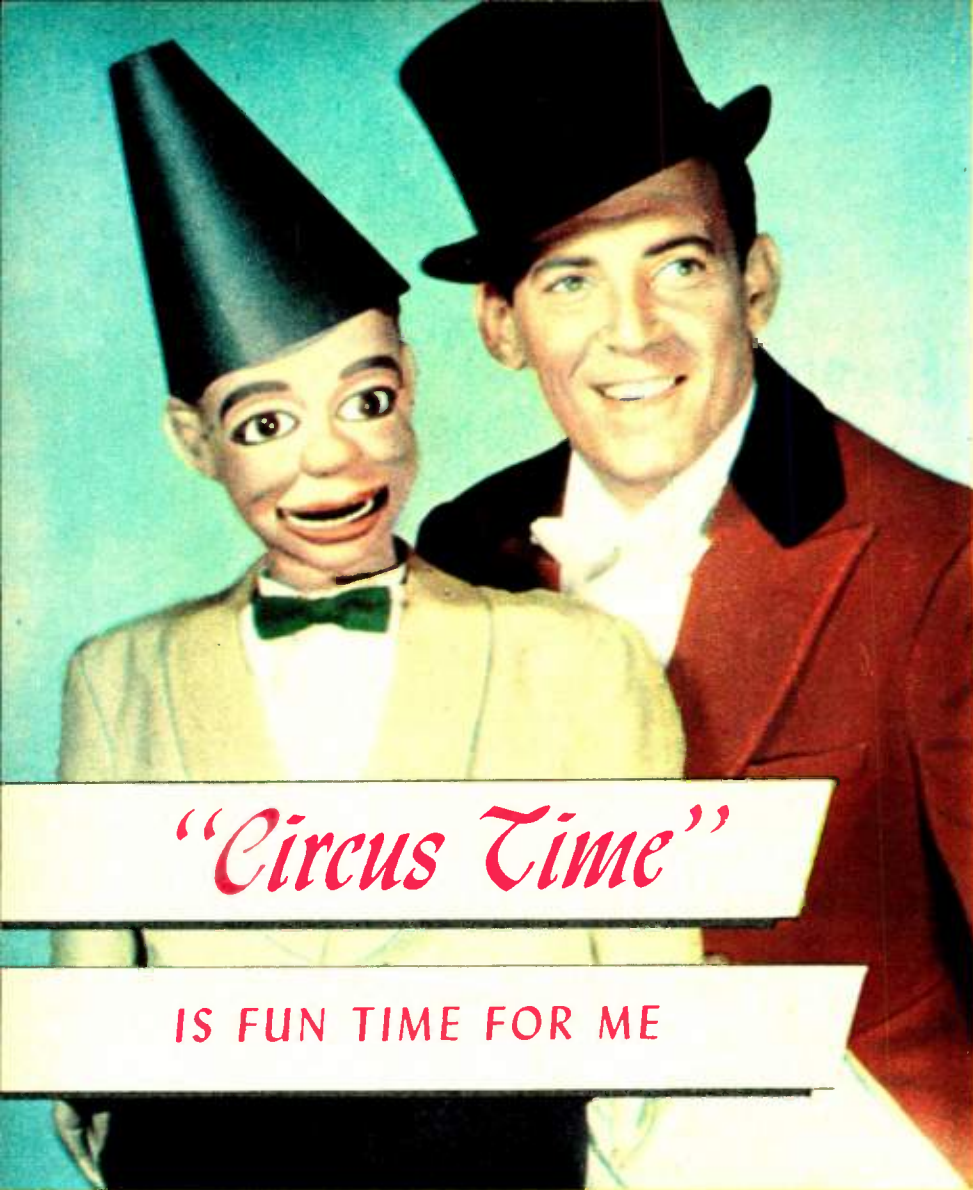

"Circus Time"

IS FUN TIME FOR ME

PAUL WINCHELL and friend Jerry Mahoney are adding fun to ABC-TV's *Circus Time*. Paul's artistry as a ventriloquist has given him a large following.

RECENTLY, when my managers, Chubby Goldfarb and Mike Vallon, phoned me to ask if I would like to star on a new Thursday night ABC-TV series called "Circus Time" I said yes, even before they told me any of the further details of the show. What a thrill it was for me to hear that producer Martin Stone wanted me to host a circus program that was based on a new idea and concept!!! In my twenty years in show business, after having started as a Major Bowes winner at the age of thirteen, I had worked in every show business medium but the circus — my first love!!!

I have worked in theaters, supper clubs, night clubs, have made recordings, worked on radio, performed club dates and have been in TV for the past nine consecutive years. During this time I have worked with Jerry Mahoney and Knucklehead Smiff as a ventrilo-

quist; I've sung; danced; played musical instruments; and I did a whole TV dramatic series working with such great stars as Thomas Mitchell, Sir Cedric Hardwicke, Hedy Lamarr, Peter Lorre and Brian Aherne. I am proud that I was honored two years in a row by *LOOK Magazine* as "TV's Most Versatile Performer."

Even in ideology ventriloquism and the circus are very similar, just as ventriloquism and magic are close runners. Ventriloquism hasn't always been as it is known today. Ventriloquists were not always applauded performers in the theater. Take a hop, skip and a sleeper jump back into history and you'll find that ventriloquists were stoned as witches and burned at the stake.

Of course, that's going back a long way. But, then, the art of ventriloquism, itself, goes back to the ancients, long before recorded time. Thus, we

only know fragments of its long and colorful history. There is plenty of proof that ventriloquism existed in ancient times. It is found in the Egyptian and Hebrew archeology as well as in later writings of the Greeks and the Romans. But ventriloquism was not used in those days to amuse or entertain people. Various priests would make a rock, a statue, or a tree talk and then claim that they had performed a great miracle, whereas, it was nothing but ventriloquism. Those who could do the same thing, and didn't have the priestly robes, were said to be witches possessed of demons.

The Bible speaks of the "Witch of Endor." King Saul had questions he desired answered concerning a forthcoming battle. The Witch of Endor called up the Prophet, Samuel, from the dead, to give him the answers. Little did they know that it was only ventriloquism. The modern counterpart of this deceit is the phony medium who claims you are hearing the voice of dear, departed Aunt Emma, when it's nothing more than the medium using a ventriloquial voice.

Since my teens I have been a rabid circus fan. In fact, as an ardent weightlifter, I have long been interested in the acts using muscle and coordination to perform their feats. Year after year, after seeing all the circus shows possible, I've envied many of the European stars in the variety field who have had an opportunity to work with circuses in their countries. It is a little known fact that many of the European greats such as Edith Piaf and others oftentimes travel with the largest circus shows in Europe, appearing in the center ring, singing and performing as the stars of the circus presentation.

In recent years American circuses have included more theatrical productions than ever before. We at ABC-TV's "Circus Time" hope that we may be leading the way to a new circus concept, that is, the presentation of circus acts and variety acts side by side. Who knows, maybe on one program soon, I may sit Jerry in the audience and try a handle-bar or wire act performance myself!!!

Playhouse 90's *The Ninth Day* has received the most glowing praise of any show since the memorable *Requiem for a Heavyweight*. Stars **Piper Laurie**, **John Kerr**, **Victor Jory**, **Elizabeth Patterson**, and others really got the accolades as did the unusually good script. There is a good chance that this will be repeated and the Tunnel hopes that everyone who missed it before will give it a look the second time around. It is significant to note that it took TV to take **Piper Laurie** out of the "just another ingenue" class into the spot where she is recognized as an actress. This **Playhouse 90** offering clinched the deserved recognition for her.

TV has also had much to do with the spectacular career **Harry Belafonte** is enjoying. I can remember a few years ago when he made his first appearance on Ed Sullivan's show. He was practically an unknown at the time. Since then he has skyrocketed to one of the all-time great singers. His next appearance here, for only two weeks, will be at the **Cocoanut Grove** where he opens on **January 30**. That the **Grove** will be sold out during his entire stay is a foregone conclusion. **Lisa Kirk** is just closing at the club after a very successful engagement — due to a socko act. TV has helped her career too. Somehow, the medium has brought night club entertainers out of just a career in smoke-filled rooms into a kind of success that previously would never have been possible for them.

Ray Anthony, whose show on **ABC-TV** is gaining in popularity, is appearing each week-end at the **Palladium** in Hollywood. His opening night was jam-packed with **Ray** and his company at one point putting on a miniature version of his TV show. This **Mr. Anthony** has plenty of class, his music is without parallel (as you can judge by his hot-selling **Capitol Records**.) **Ray** has big hopes for his **ABC** show, with plans to introduce new features. He's riding high these days!

The Last Word is receiving some good notices and it is the kind of program that can educate as well as entertain, but isn't it possible to have it on at a better time than its present

11:30 a.m. on **Sunday** slot? There are a good many people who are attending church at that time and as a result never get a chance to see the program. Couldn't this hold an audience at a better time? The answer to that one is — **YES**.

The Mail Bag: **Marchia Trueblood** wrote a very interesting letter asking for the return of the **Eleanor Hempel** show. As she said: "Recently I have had occasion to wonder, along with many others, about the methods employed in rating TV shows. I refer to the recent demise of 'Little Schoolhouse.' Since I have never been contacted (and neither have about 75-100 young mothers of my acquaintance) our TV preferences have never been tabulated by a commercial group . . . the very secret of an accurate rating is to contact people in every listener category. This automatically becomes unfair in the case of **Mrs. Hempel** because her show appeals to only one segment of viewers. Her program is directed at a neglected segment of viewers who are most unlikely to express their feelings in the normal course of events . . . Please help bring her back." . . . **Mrs. Lucy Haro** writes that one of her favorite shows of 1956 was **Kay Starr's** spec. **Kay** certainly made a terrific impression with this one — of that there is no doubt. **Mrs. John D. Verrill** wrote a very irate letter about the treatment of the dog who was supposed to walk tight wires on **You Asked For It**. Must go along with her views. This kind of inhumane business has no place on TV or anywhere else.

I REMEMBER Los Angeles City College back there in 1946 or so and I think we all knew that someday **Arbogast** would really go places. "Boy, what a crazy guy," we used to say. I remember **Arbogast** and I had a class together . . . "Advanced Drinking," I think it was . . . and during the third bout, he asked me, "Do you think I should spell my name with a small 't'?" "Sure, Bob," I said (We had to call him **Bot**, then, the crazy guy) and that's how the cult of botulism was born. Anyway, I think he's a funny guy with a special brand of obvious subtlety and I think the critics who have panned him deserve the snappy repartee type senses of humor they have. So, be **Arbo's** gast on **KABC**. (Unpaid adv. Haven't seen him in ten years.)

"**The Male Animal**." (5) Feb. 3, 7:30. 1941. Adapted from the play by **James Thurber** and **Elliott Nugent**, this vastly entertaining movie sticks closely to the original and presents a bitingly satirical view of the college campus and its sophomoric inhabitants. **Henry Fonda** is a professor upon whom pressure is brought to drop his plan to read the **Sacco-Vanzetti** letters to his class. This still current problem is spiced with a triangle involving the prof, his wife, **Olivia De Havilland**, and a returning football hero, **Jack Carson**.

"**Bad Man of Brimstone**." (11) Feb. 7, 10:15. 1938. Of all the stars appearing on this series, I think the one who has

best withstood the test of present standards is **Wallace Beery**, who again plays his usual bad man with the heart of gold. He taxes his fellow outlaws to finance his son's education and when the son returns as a federal marshal, I think anyone can write the rest of the story.

"**I, The Jury**." (2) Feb. 4, 4:30. 1953. Remember **Mickey Spillane**? He was a bad writer of murder mysteries and this is the one about a private eye who kills his best friend's murderer as she is preparing to make love to him (the private eye, of course).

"**Portrait of Jenny**." (9) Beginning Feb. 5, 9:00. This film is considered by most as a little too precious, but I hesitate to say anything after reading **Channel 9's** release: "Note to editor: We are not issuing a synopsis on 'Portrait of Jenny,' because this picture's unique format demands that it be presented in its entirety." By all means, let's not have half a format. "**Jennifer Jones** and **Joseph Cotten** are co-starred in one of the most unforgettable love stories ever." Ever what? Ever presented in its entirety?

"**Kangaroo Kid**." (13) Feb. 5, 8:30. 1950. **Jock O'Mahoney** is a California detective who goes to Australia to find out who has been robbing the stage of its gold shipments. This picture of Australia is B.O. . . . before Olympics, of course.

Odyssey

THE Odyssey of mythology, I seem to remember, was the epic story of the errant wanderings of Odysseus (alias Ulysses), the king of Ithaca, who took ten years to beat his way home to his patiently waiting Penelope after cleaning up on the Trojans.

The Odyssey of CBS is something else again. There is a good bit of wandering in the CBS version, although carefully chaperoned by host-narrator Charles Collingwood. Officially noted as a CBS Public Relations Program, television's Odyssey offers substantially more than an effort to win friends for CBS.

Odyssey's first effort dealt with the early mining of silver in Nevada; the second, jazz; the third, the exploration of a sunken Spanish treasure ship off the Florida coast. Others, Salem's witchcraft trials in 1692; Sherlock Holmes and "The Baker Street Irregulars." Thus, in subject matter, the significance of the title becomes apparent.

There is much to applaud in the experimental approach of this show, both in subject matter and treatment. Free from the necessity of catering to demands of audience ratings, Odyssey presents a challenging and stimulating effort.

As the subject matter indicates, Odyssey is documentary in treatment of subject matter. Although at times sharper editing is called for to eliminate the static effect of a camera over-telling the story, there is adequate compensation for the critical in the imaginative handling of effects.

This was particularly noteworthy in the Spanish treasure ship when such historical personages as Columbus, Queen Isabella, and Spanish conquistadores were shown in silhouette against early maps of the New World.

Odyssey also offers more than television experimentation, for its entertainment value lies in the exploration of the little known and unique, a three-dimensional camera reporting of the significance behind the facts of subject matter.

If you are searching for something more than the customary sponsor-ridden television fare Odyssey is well worth your time.

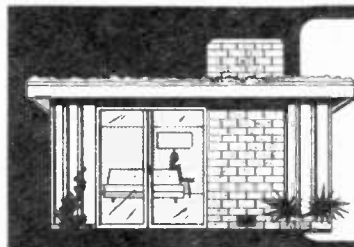

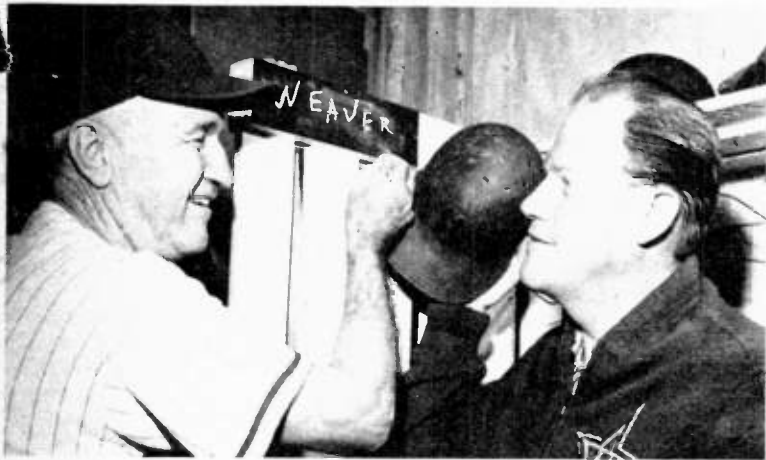

Climax

HAS DONE!

FEW SHOWS on TV are as off-beat as is CBS-TV's *Climax*. Its very premise is unusual in that it presents only stories of suspense, those with strong melodramatic twists. No comedies get a showing here.

It is always presenting the unusual and its efforts in this direction embrace several factors.

Casting

No other TV show has gone in for such unorthodox casting as has *Climax*. It has taken big name stars and presented them in roles unlike anything they had ever done before. As such, this has been an actor's dream—and the artists can thank the confidence and daring of producer Edgar Peterson and casting director, Millie Gusse for this.

It has been the general consensus of opinion, for one thing, that Terry Moore is not the world's most brilliant actress. In fact, most people have thought that her ability lay in wearing a white fur bikini. Edgar Peterson thought differently and cast her as an unglamorous, simple, straightforward girl of the streets in "No Right to Kill," a modernization of the book, "Crime and Punishment."

"I am confident Terry proved she was an actress on this show," Edgar started. "I had known she was really studying to improve her craft, that she wanted to act. And the performance she gave in that show bore out the fact that she is a much underrated star. She had no glamorous clothes to wear, no trappings, so all that could come forth in this highly emotional role was the actress. This was no glib part—it was a highly demanding one.

"Anna Maria Alberghetti was another example of an actress who had been considered as very competent but primarily as a singer. Millie Gusse and I chose her for the role of a gun moll, a tough little girl. She had to play a warm, simple, unsullied girl of 18 or 19 in looks but one who could pull out a gun and kill if the occasion demanded it. I believe, along with others, that Anna Maria is going to be one of our finest actresses—and very soon.

"Then there was Boris Karloff. We cast him as an English vicar. Even when the show was on people thought he'd wind up as the killer, but instead he was the personification of a male Salvation Nell. Boris, as I knew, is actually one of the most gentle and well-read persons in this country. His recent appearance on the \$64,000 Question with a category of children's nursery rhymes is only another facet of his personality.

"Marie Windsor had been concentrating on sultry and sexy sirens—or rather she had been cast in these kinds of

roles. We presented her as a wife with delicacy and charm and with no sirenish overtones.

"Ricardo Montalban is another example. He was always the romantic leading man who danced and sang, so we had him play in 'Island in the City' a Puerto Rican cop. I knew Ricardo had been studying constantly and that he was anxious for a change of pace. He found, as have other actors, that he could give a far more vital performance when he was given a chance to do more than be just a personality.

"We will continue to go against all publicity build-up and previous type-casting in our shows—at least until we have given an actor or an actress a chance at a different part first. After a performer has appeared on our show in an off-beat role we may present him later in a part that is more typical of what he has done. We are, in short, not selling the personality as much as we are selling the part."

Stories

In types of stories presented, most of which are originals, the same rule of doing the unusual holds true. All types of melodramas are done. "The Chinese Game," for instance, was a fantasy with a melodramatic emphasis.

"We can't do comedy because the very title of our show negates it," Peterson added. "Frankly, this is a welcome restriction. It gives us more of a chance to attempt the different.

"We do have some interest in stories that deal with important personalities and we like those with topical value, but we have to be careful about what is topical. For instance, we didn't want to do a show based on the Hungarian situation because we didn't think it was entertainment, so we took the same interest, the same basic topic, and the same interest elements of this situation and gave them all a different locale and setting.

"Getting stories of the type we prefer is difficult, but anything worth doing is often not easy. The very problem our needs in stories presents helps to give our show even more vitality and freshness since part of the vitality comes from the fact that audiences never know what to expect from us."

Climax fans have come to expect only one thing—good production. In this they are not disappointed. Edgar Peterson and his staff are not in the business of letting viewers down.

Yvonne de Carlo and Henry Wilcoxon talked about their trip to Egypt to make "The Ten Commandments." Dean Martin and Anna Maria Alberghetti told of their experiences in Rome making "10,000 Bedrooms."

Shirley, along with her brother John and sister Margaret, produce the show. The stars have also been glad to appear on the program since they finally have a chance to discuss things other than where they were born, where they were married, and what they eat for breakfast. The subject matter of the show was so appealing that Shirley even scored a coup when Cecil B. DeMille agreed to appear on the program.

Challenge

"This is a far more challenging show than any gossip type of thing I have done," said the personable Shirley. "And I hope to accomplish something worthwhile from it. What I want goes far beyond the show, beyond radio and TV. Through it I hope to aid a tiny bit of understanding among peoples of the world. I want to be a reporter and yet have a chance to travel, to get to know people in other countries, to get to the meat of things." And here Shirley paused. Very seriously she added, "When I have progressed to the point where I have more knowledge I hope to go into things of an international nature — perhaps a job with the United Nations or something along this line, wherever I'd fit in best. Maybe a job with an embassy with the State Department. I feel it's a crying shame for me to go through life taking out as much as I am and not give anything back.

"I feel that what Danny Kaye has done with UNICEF is a classic example of what I want to accomplish. I'm certainly not going to stay put in the Hollywood scene but I always want to main-

tain an association with it."

That is the bee in Shirley's bonnet — and she's just the girl to accomplish this goal.

She plans to go to Europe and the Middle East in March to film shows there with the stars who will be making pictures abroad. Her itinerary so far includes stops in Istanbul, Teheran, Frankfurt, Dusseldorf, Hamburg, and Paris. She will take her sister and probably her mother with her. John, who was just married, can't go. Margaret will handle the camera since she is quite an artist herself.

"I've had in my mind a sort of Hollywood travelogue for some time," Shirley went on. "But I never quite hit on the right peg until I went to Africa and Europe last year on the cerebral palsy junket. When I came back I knew I had to get a travel series on the air, so I wrote a three page outline of a projected show and sent it to three different program managers. Much to my surprise and delight, all three wanted it. I chose KTTV because of the wonderful feeling there.

"My show has been exciting because I have had to delve into areas of the world about which I knew nothing. Obviously I couldn't conduct an intelligent interview unless I had some knowledge of the topic, so I have been doing a tremendous amount of research. I read about six volumes of Mayan civilization when Vincent Price appeared and I really had a job getting boned up for my Christmas show, which dealt with the way Christmas is celebrated in seven different countries.

"I recently returned from New York too where final details were ironed out for syndication of the show in other markets. My sponsors asked, after the first show, to have every program filmed, even though it is done live here, so I have a backlog already."

Shirley, a delectable charmer, is also a bachelor girl and apparently plans to stay that way. When you ask her about romance she says, "If I had time for that I'd put on another show." But she vows she is no career girl, that she hopes to have her own home when the time is right.

Shirley's own trouble will be in finding a man who can match her tremendous drive and enthusiasm. This Thomas lady really has a lot to offer any man — as well as an industry called TV.

No Stranger to Danger

WHEN Jet Productions and Medallion got their heads together to produce an adventure series called High Road to Danger, they couldn't have picked a better or more experienced narrator than Steve Brodie.

The premise of the program was simple to state but not so simple to photograph:

"Adventure is here for all who seek it. The thrill of landing a giant marlin, shooting blue shark and sail fish with bow and arrow, hunting jaguar, wild boar and Kodiak bear, windjamming across the Pacific or racing an unlimited hydroplane. All this and more is in store for the viewers of High Road to Danger."

Unlike other travel-adventure programs, the "different approach" on the popular KHJ-TV series is that the audience "relives" the experience right along with the original cameraman who covers the experience.

That's where actor Steve Brodie enters the picture — or at least his voice does.

WHILE NARRATING the High Road to Danger, Steve wears a neat shirt and tie. But not when he's "on the job" acting in various TV shows and movies. He'd just as soon "avoid danger—I'm not the brave type"—but so far he's had his share of narrow escapes.

"So far, I haven't been able to go on any of the adventures myself," Steve related during a TV-Radio Life interview. "I may in the future. However, my primary purpose on this particular program is to act as the host or narrator."

Experienced Actor

And for this — particularly in the light of his past experiences — Steve is more than qualified.

Most TV and movie fans are familiar with his innumerable acting credits: "Home of the Brave," "The Caine Mutiny," "The Charge at Feather River," Lux Video Theater, Damon Runyon Theater and Studio One. Altogether he has appeared in more than 70 full length motion pictures.

"Originally I came from the New York stage to Hollywood back in 1941 as a comedy actor. The first time a Hollywood producer heard my whiskey-sounding voice and took a look at my broken nose, he said that my comedy and I had had it. They put me in 'heavy roles' and I've been doing them ever since."

Steve's broken nose isn't merely a twist of fate. It has been broken. Not once — but four times.

"I was a professional boxer once," Steve recalls, "and had my schnoz broken on three different occasions in the ring. The other time it happened while I was working as a 'swamper' in the Texas oil fields."

A "swamper," as Steve explained it, is the flunky of the oil fields — the jack-of-all-trades master-of-none — the guy who is asked to do everything and anything from digging a ditch to drilling a well.

Close Calls

This father of three children (Devi, 16, Jo Ann, 14, and Kevin Patrick, 5), has had more than his share of "close calls" during his long acting career.

There was the time when impulsive Robert Ryan got carried away with a fight scene in "Crossfire." He started to slap Steve a few times, and ended up slugging Brodie, but good. The result (for Steve): broken blood vessels around the jaw; 8 stitches, and a clean K.O.

In a racing picture with Mickey Rooney several years ago in Tucson,

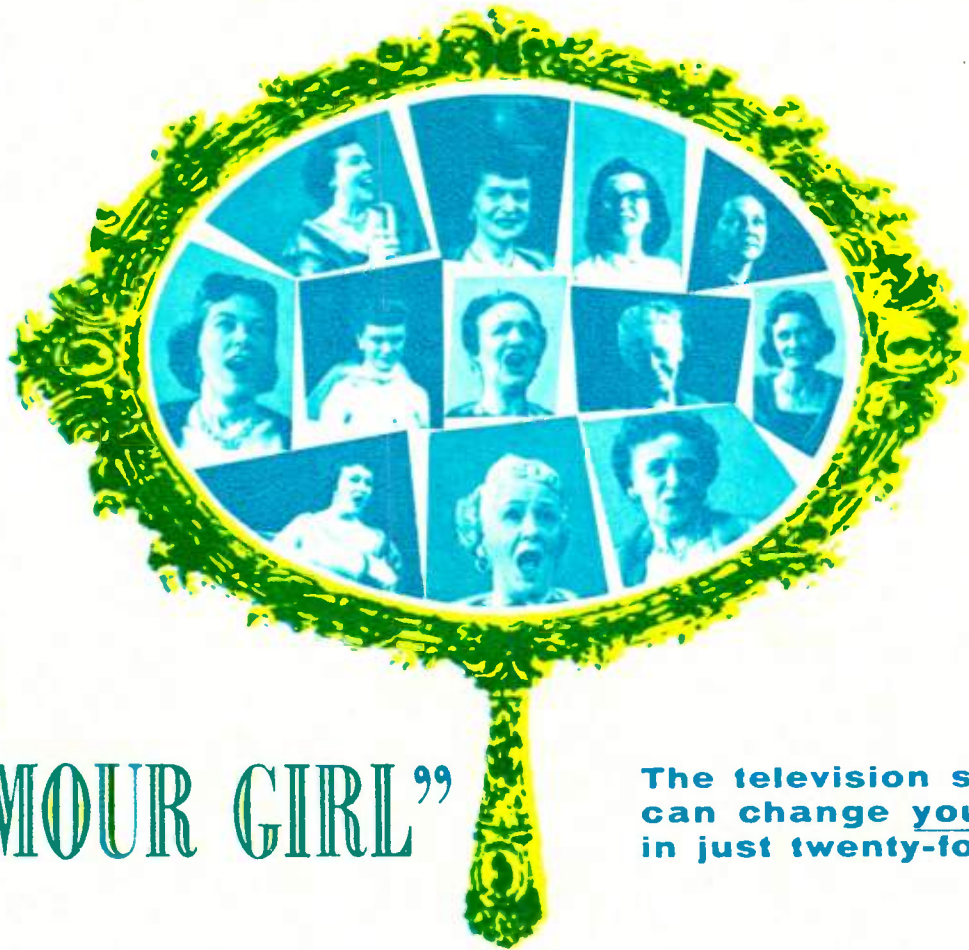
Arizona, Steve took a turn at the wheel and at 65 miles an hour "knocked down 115 feet of fence, just like it was a row of toothpicks."

There were dozens of other "near misses" for the popular actor too numerous to detail: the rupturing of an acute appendix during the filming of "Steel Helmet" when a doctor warned him: "If you have torn it on the inside, you'd better start counting the minutes now;" or when a black stallion fell on him breaking a leg; or when he tumbled off a pier during another fight scene, ploughed through a pile of garbage cans 18 feet below, and landed in the icy water of the Pacific suffering miraculously "only a few cracked ribs."

Anyway — you get the idea. Steve Brodie is more than just the smooth talking host of the Channel 9 adventure series. He knows what the "High Road to Danger" is all about because he's traveled it himself on more than one occasion.
