DICK WHITTINGHILL trades bon mots and witty sayings with viewers on KTTV and listeners on KMPC. But once this genial gentleman hits home shores he becomes merely the country squire, the head man of the manse.

When I finally caught up with him—and getting him for a few minutes between his many KTTV adventure serial shows, his record spinning on KMPC, and his golf games is no easy job—he was extolling the virtues of a commercial product at KTTV. When the movie started running, though, he came off the set.

TV Fan

"You know, I'm a sucker for these old movies," he grinned. "And I don't care how old they are. I spend most of my time at home watching them. Of course. I'm a TV addict anyway. I watch it most of the time—especially the movies, the fights and the football games.

"I don't play any records at home, though—and for a good reason. Why should I listen to the records all day and then go home and play them at night?"

Home Look

Dick prefers to spend what time he has at home with his two daughters, Willy, 3, and Nora, 1, and his wife, Wilamat.

"That Wilamat," Dick grinned. "That's sure a name. I asked my wife where her parents got it and she just shrugged her shoulders and said, 'I don't know—they must have just made it up.'"

"But she's a great person—my wife. She would have to, to be able to stand me. I'm the nervous type, you see, and she has a wonderful way of calming me down, of keeping me on an even keel."

Dick is up at 4:30 a.m. every day except Sunday. He does his radio shows, naps between 11 and 12, goes back to work again, gets home after his late

afternoon KTTV show, and is in bed as a rule by 9:30.

"On Sundays I stay home," Dick explained. "That's my day for cooking. I fix the family's breakfast and I usually stir up a barbecue. However, my daughters and my wife are beginning to complain since I always fix the same things for them every Sunday. And each wants something different to eat. It's like a short order house.

"Cooking is the only thing I can successfully do around the house. I have absolutely no talent at all in gardening, carpentering, anything that you have to use your hands with. I can't even fix a light plug. Whenever I have tried I've blown a fuse. When I was a kid I was the last one to learn how to tie shoe laces even. I am fairly good, though, at teaching my daughters how to swim."

Issues

Dick finds it quite difficult to leave his work at the station. He usually lugs it home with him. And he has even been known to find problems away from the station that he can take right to work with him. Dick has a passion for issues.

For instance, there was no traffic signal at a certain street in the Valley near his home. He had to travel it every day and each morning he'd get madder and madder as he tried to get on to the highway in the face of a steady stream of traffic. One day on his radio show he began talking about this certain intersection, loudly voicing his annoyance over the lack of a signal there.

Not too long ago, Dick was present when the signal was installed. The Whittinghill campaign had paid off. He is equally vociferous about other matters that concern him.

"Sure I bring problems home with me—and also take them to work with me," Dick remarked flatly. "How can you keep them apart? If something bothers you it bothers you—and you can't close doors on it. At least I can't."



Dick has no special preference about his two jobs. Both radio and TV intrigue him. He does get a kick out of TV, though, because, as he says, "I'm hammy and television gives me a chance to be hammy. People stop me now on the street since I've been on TV, whereas when I was on radio I was just a voice. I used to send pictures to people who wrote me at the radio station and asked for them, but no one ever seemed to recognize me until I hit the TV circuit. Being hammy, I kind of enjoy people stopping me in stores or on the street."

Dick has certainly been a success with both jobs. Yet, he lives no luxurious life. He has a modest two bedroom and den home in the Valley, but there is a chance of his having to move since it is no longer big enough for a family of four. When he and his wife bought it, there were just the two of them.

He does have extravagances, though—mainly clothes and telephone calls.

"I have several suits but I'm always wearing sports clothes," Dick said. "As for the telephone bit, when I was a kid my father worked for a telephone company. He'd bring pencils home for the six of us in the family—and on each was written the motto: 'Don't write—phone.' I've taken that literally ever since. I call all over the world and for no particular reason. I just like to call up people."

Well, as we said in the beginning, Dick is definitely the chatty type.

The Best

IS YET TO COME

THIS FALL at least 30 new TV shows will be beaming on our local TV screens. At least 20 per cent of these will be Westerns and an equal number will be musical-variety headed by stars like Sinatra and Pat Boone. In addition, the schedule of special programs (see Pages 48-9) promises to inject new interest in TV fare. We outline the activities at the various outlets.

CBS is preparing at least six new shows for debut in September. The range from adult westerns to 90-minute spectaculars.



In the spectacular vein, is the Twentieth Century, a series set to premiere on Sunday, October 20, with a special one-hour program devoted to Sir Winston Churchill. Produced by CBS Public Affairs, The Twentieth Century will present a broad pictorial canvas of our times. The entire series will consist of a minimum of twenty-six programs. Five of these will be of one-hour duration, the remaining will be half-hour shows.

'Seven' for Sunday Afternoon

Another show with a hint of the spectacular is the new hour-long Sunday series, The Seven Lively Arts. John Crosby, television and radio columnist, will host the series which will utilize the award-winning talents of seven young (average age: 33) directors.

Executive Producer John Houseman has announced that Franklin Schaffer, George Roy Hill, Sidney Lumet, Charles Dubin, Mel Ferber, Jack Smight and Robert Sharpe have been signed. Each of these men will be assigned to individual programs in the series; programs including drama, dance, music, biographies, documentary and virtually every phase of entertainment as it relates to modern living.

More Adult Westerns

The Wild West comes in for some more pictorializing, this time under the banner, Have Gun - Will Travel, story of a former West Pointer, Paladin, who moves to the West when he finds his aptitude for gun fighting is salable. New Saturday night series will star Richard Boone.

Slated for Friday night is another western, Trackdown starring Robert Culp as a Texas Ranger.

The format of I Love Lucy will be considerably changed (to an hour-long monthly show) and loosened to allow guest appearances of such stars as Ann Sothern, Cesar Romero, Hedda Hopper and Rudy Vallee. The show, however, will retain the same well known characters.

Raymond Burr will play Perry Mason in a new hour-long CBS-TV dramatic; mystery series. Barbara Hale has been cast as Perry Mason's girl Friday. The show is based on Erle Stanley Gardner's works.

Seven new shows will be entered in the rating sweepstakes this fall by NBC. Two of them are Westerns; three are mystery-dramas and the remaining two musical and comedy.

Among the Westerns is Wagon Train, a one-hour series set in the period im-

Other developments for the fall at CBS include It Gives Me Great Pleasure, starring Eve Arden. In this series Miss Arden makes a natural progression from the classroom of Our

mediately following the Civil War. The story is a visual diary of the westward trek of a band of pioneers.

Leader of the wagon train is played by Ward Bond. Robert Horton is cast as the scout. In addition to these regulars, a guest star will appear in each episode. Cast in title roles of three episodes already filmed are Ernest Borgnine, Michael Rennie and Shelley Winters.

Restless Gun

Motion picture star John Payne will play the role of Vint Bonner in a new western series, *Restless Gun*. Story is set in the late 1860's.

The Alcoa-Goodyear series, as yet untitled, will star David Niven, Bob Ryan, Jack Lemmon, Charles Boyer and Jane Powell. Programs will be as varied as the featured performers.

Erle Stanley Gardner's famed *Court of Last Resort* will be based on actual cases already investigated by the famous board of crime detection experts which was founded nine years ago by

Gardner and magazine publisher Harry Steeger. Royalties from the TV series will go to further the work of the court.

'Hitch' Ends Lineup

Winding up the NBC line-up of mystery-dramas is the master himself, Alfred Hitchcock. Hitchcock will act as senior producer-director for 20 hour films and 22 live hour presentations of a series called *Suspicion*.



The live dramas will originate from New York. Stories already set are "Split Second" by Daphne de Maurier, starring Bette Davis; "The South American Story" by Frank Rosenberg, and "The Other Side of the Curtain" by Helen McCloy.

NBC's final entry for the fall is the George Gobel-Eddie Fisher combination.



Although formats for neither have yet been set, NBC has announced that each star will guest on the other's show.

Frank Sinatra is the big name heading up ABC's offensive this fall. There will be 36 half-hour films. Series will kick off with an hour-long live show from Hollywood on October 18 and with the exception of one other hour-long live presentation in February, remainder of the schedule will be films. Sinatra will personally star in 13 musicals and 13 dramas and host the remaining 10 dramatic segments.

Cheyenne will share its Saturday slot on alternate weeks with *Sugarfoot*, a new hour-length-Western starring Will Hutchins.

Another contender enters the Ed Sullivan-Steve Allen Sunday evening rating battle in September when ABC's *Maverick* checks in at 7:30. An hour-long Western dramatic series, *Maverick* stars James Garner.

The Walter Winchell File finds W.W. hosting, story telling acting, playing a role he has lived for more than 30 years: a newspaper man whose name is synonymous with excitement and entertainment.

ABC has announced no firm format for the Pat Boone show.

New Disney Production

Premiere date for the Disney production of *Zorro* series has been tentatively set for October 10. Guy Williams will star. The Real McCoys, starring Walter Brennan, is another ABC entrant.

Guy Mitchell, who recently signed a long term contract with ABC, will make his debut as the star of a weekly music and variety series. Emphasis will be on good music, with a guest star each week as well as appearances of fresh young talent with "star" potential.

Munsel Makes Debut

A live half-hour musical-variety series showcasing the Metropolitan Opera star Patrice Munsel rounds off the ABC offerings for the fall.

Miss Munsel is the first Met star to have her own regular TV series. The program, however, will go light on classical music and concentrate on Broadway shows and popular songs, with emphasis on comedy and dancing. Miss Munsel will be supported by guests from all fields of show business.

Oliver Treyz, ABC vice-president in charge of television, has stated that with this schedule of programs, "ABC-TV will have the strongest program lineup in its history."

The "Maggie" of Today

CHATTING with Margaret O'Brien is like having a dream. For in our dreams, we transcend Time: the past, the present, and sometimes even the future become linked as a single entity.

Have we not all had a new experience in life—but somehow, because of our dreams, felt that we had been through it before?

That's what it's like to meet and talk with this world-famous actress.

It all begins when a small newspaper item reports that Miss Margaret O'Brien

has appeared in court and has had a contract approved for several thousand dollars a week for starring in a new TV series called "Maggie."

Now Miss O'Brien has been appearing quite often on TV lately, but mainly in the old KTTV-MGM movies. The announcement she was ready to star in her own series was something entirely different. A definite angle for a TV magazine such as ours.

Surprisingly enough, one of Margaret's agents, after being contacted, was reluctant at first to do any kind of a story.

"Yes," he acknowledged. "She has completed a pilot for a new TV series. ABC-TV has picked up the option on it, but it has not been sold yet. So I don't think you should write anything about it."

I didn't agree. So I made arrangements to meet with Miss O'Brien, anyhow.

On the way to her house, I got lost—as usual. I called her to check my directions and inform her I'd be a few minutes late.

"Yes. This is Margaret," she said on the phone. That's when the dream first came into focus. For on the phone, she sounds almost exactly as she did as a child actress.

Oddly enough however, when you finally meet her in her own living room, all traces—in all ways—of that talented precocious child disappear.

Margaret O'Brien has grown up to be a very beautiful young lady. She bears a great resemblance to her namesake, Erin O'Brien (no relation). She wears no jeans, but a pretty blue dress. In the spotless living room with the expensive white carpet, and with Margaret sitting opposite you with very correct posture, you have the feeling, a nice feeling, that you're living in the Victorian Age of the 20th Century.

For Margaret is perfectly poised. Maybe a little too much so, but that's to be expected upon a first meeting.

"Acting is my life," she explains in her boarding-room accent. "Some people may think that my mother or other people have urged me on. But I'm afraid I've always been the ham. Ever since I can remember, I've always wanted to act."

In recent years, Margaret elaborates, she has appeared in various TV productions, such as Climax, and has been primarily interested in her first-love, the theater. Her latest effort, favorably reviewed, was Romeo and Juliet, in which she co-starred with John Barrymore, Jr.

Because she does a great deal of traveling with her mother, making personal appearances, she prefers to live in her Beverly Hills apartment. But if plans materialize for her present TV series, produced by McCadden Productions at the General Service Studios, she'll be able to spend far more time at home.

As for the "Maggie" series itself, which co-features Leon Ames and Fay Baker as her parents, Miss O'Brien says it will be partially comedy (as the pilot was), but will also include dramatic stories.

"I enjoy comedy, but I prefer to do the serious roles," she declares.

Sad, satirical, slapstick, or serious—if the series stars Margaret O'Brien, TV fans will be sure to tune in. If nothing else, TV fans will be curious to see how "the two Margaret O'Briens"—the old and the new—compare. From what we've seen so far, they won't be disappointed.

EACH day on the *Liberte* there is a movie, one day a French picture and the next day an American film. And at night in the salon after dinner there is dancing. During most of the voyage games like bingo or *Courses de Chevaux*, or horse races, are played to add to the fun. Dancing, of course, gets more and more festive as the days go on, but the *Soiree de Gala*, the dance on the *Captain's Night*, was sheer, wonderful bedlam. At these evening affairs I met such nice people as *Dorothy Mesrop* and *Esther Cook*, from Los Angeles, on their way to Europe for four months, a girl named *Paula Deitz* who had won a year's schooling in Geneva, and who could dance like the living end; a professor named *Fran Parker* who was on her way to Moscow for a month to study the people there, and *Madeleine Zak*.

To keep yourself further occupied, there is, of course, the gym and the swimming pool to use. And it's most advisable to use them unless you want to get off looking like something that *Slenderella* would love to get hold of. The pool isn't large but it's very nice. It is indoors which was good since a large part of the trip was spent in rather cloudy weather with a strong wind.

One of the real thrills of the trip was a visit to the bridge. It is indeed an experience to be able to see the "brains" of the ship. One of the French officers explained how a course is charted, how depth in the ocean is figured, how the radar works, how weather is checked, and, of course, how it is kept on course. The *Liberte* probably went off course for a few moments while my son and *Marian Terry* took turns at the wheel. From the bridge you get a beautiful view of the

forward part of the liner. Plus a feeling that you're high on top of your own special and very exclusive world.

One of the officers explained the steps taken if someone accidentally falls overboard. This, fortunately, has only happened a very few times. On one instance, an officer of the *French Air Force* fell overboard. The ship was stopped immediately, returned to find him, and could locate no trace.

Had another interesting experience. The Purser, *Guyon Le Bouffy*, invited me to a cocktail party one evening where I met some delightful people. All were more than interested in talking to you, in wanting to know the kind of work you do, where you were going, and when I would say I was from Hollywood, you'd get all kinds of eager questions thrown at you: "Is it phony? Is it all glitter? What stars do you know?" It's a shame so many people have the idea that Hollywood is nothing but glittery tinsel with no substance. I did what I could to assure people that Hollywood had its very real side and that its natives weren't dashing around in gold-plated Cadillacs reading just their own press notices.

On the deck itself every afternoon, there is genuine festivity and hilarity. In the crowd were *Jay Protzk* and *Bob Wheaton*, two earnest young men who were on their way for two years in Frankfurt. They enlivened most of the proceedings and were great company. But everyone on board was shedding inhibitions and throwing himself into the foray with utter abandon. My son found plenty to keep him busy at the ping pong tables and at shuffle board.

There is so much to say about this trip and about the *Liberte*. As we near *LeHavre* and the last day, there is a let-down, a feeling of regret that the trip is about over. There is only one thing — let's hope our fumbling French improves in Paris. It was rather sickly and anemic here. But all of us, I'm sure, have one thought in mind: if Europe is half as much fun and half as exciting as the *Liberte*, vive l'Europe!

CONFIDENTIALLY, it didn't cost me a thousand to have my subpoena quashed . . . I was a little flat, already, and I got out for a dollar and a quarter. Besides, all I know about the Grauman's Chinese is that Gable's feet are bigger than mine and you can't write your name in solid cement.

"*I Wake Up Screaming*." (2) Sept. 8, 11:15. 1941. Originally titled, "Hot Spot," this *Steve Fisher* whodunit was an offbeat "sleeper" hit in its day and should stand up just as well in this showing. Showgirl *Carole Landis* is murdered and promoter *Victor Mature* is the prime suspect in the mind of detective *Laird Cregar*, who thereupon embarks on a systematized persecution in an effort to break down *Mature*. *Betty Grable* is the dead girl's sister and the climax and solution are as exciting and surprising as any mystery buff could wish.

"*The Paradine Case*." (9) Beginning Sept. 9, 9:00. 1947. A completely different kind of mystery, but just as satisfying in its way, this *Selznick-Hitchcock* offering puts *Valli* on trial for the poisoning of her blind husband, with *Gregory Peck* as the lawyer for the defense and *Charles Laughton*, as the judge. The latter and more important half of the picture takes place in London's Old Bailey courtroom and the suspenseful twists and surprises of the plot involve such acting stalwarts as *Louis Jourdan*, *Ann Todd*, *Leo G. Carroll* and *Ethel Barrymore*.

"*It Happened In Brooklyn*." (11) Sept. 13, 8:00. 1946. This piece of unabashed sentimentality about Brooklyn has *Frank Sinatra* as a shy veteran whose ability to make others assert themselves creates happiness for a music teacher,

Kathryn Grayson and a titled British songsmith, *Peter Lawford*, and it's all harmless enough.

"*Escape Me Never*." (5) Sept. 8, 7:30. 1947. *Ida Lupino* is a waif with child who is cared for by indigent musician *Errol Flynn*, whose brother, *Gig Young*, is about to marry heiress *Eleanor Parker*, who is spirited away by her parents, but *Errol*, *Ida* and *Gig* follow on a donkey and singing for their suppers, and when they find *Eleanor*, she falls for *Errol*, who leaves for London to protect his brother, who arranges a performance of *Errol's* music, and the baby gets sick, and *Eleanor* is discovered to be a shallow creature, and *Errol* and *Ida* are reunited. Whoee!

"*We Are Not Alone*." (2) Sept. 12, 11:30. Second showing of an excellent movie starring three estimable actors, *Paul Muni*, *Jane Bryan* and *Flora Robson*. It is the *James Hilton* story of a British doctor married to a nagging hypochondriac whose treatment of their son prompts him to bring to his house as governess a young dancer he had treated after a suicide attempt. The wife is found poisoned and the trial becomes an infuriating formality as the couple is sentenced to die. The last moving scenes show *Muni's* acceptance of an idea that those who die senselessly . . . he, the governess and those then dying in World War I . . . are not alone. I think this is a beautiful picture.

"*The Cat and The Fiddle*." (11) Sept. 12, 10:30. A picture with guts.

WHETHER or not you like bullfighting, you should dial the seasonal premiere (Sept. 12) of CBS-TV's Playhouse 90 to see Jack Palance star in "The Death of Manolete." I say this because I understand from Director John Frankenheimer that the drama is to be more the story of a man than of this era's greatest matador. Frankenheimer thinks the TV script is one of the best he's ever seen. It is an adaptation of Barnaby Conrad's soon-to-be-published book; will be produced for TV by Martin Manulis and has had the talented typewriter of Paul Monash for video treatment of Conrad's script.

CONRAD, SO I LEARNED ON a special air trek to San Francisco where the author has El Matador cafe, is a former diplomat turned bullfighter. His films, taken in Spain and showing the great Manolete, have been used as source material for the TV show. He has other footage of not-so-famous matadors which he screened as he explained bullfighting, which he feels is "almost as cruel as fox or deer hunting or duck shooting or trapping a fur-bearing animal." He described its lure as "unjustifiable but irresistible," its art that "of risking your life in the most graceful manner possible." To the uninitiated, the film and talk were enlightening but still did not sell this reporter on bullfighting, for whose love, since the "sport" began, 47 out of 127 top matadors have been killed.

Producer Manulis feels that Playhouse 90 is adult fare in an adult time and as such should cover a variety of themes. He told me that the new interest in the ring prompted decision to do Manolete's story (Aug. 28 was 10th anniversary of the famous matador's death). Playhouse 90 will try to show you why Manolete wanted to die, despite his fame, his youth (30), and wealth (\$4,000,000).

JACK PALANCE (and please pronounce it to rhyme with balance), has been taking bullfight lessons in preparation

for his role. First thing he had to learn was not to hold the cape like a regular fighter with fists clenched.

ALL SOUTHERN CALIFORNIANS should be proud of our JOHN BAIRD, first West Coast contestant on NBC-TV's Twenty-One. This appearance came about because of his good showing on a Groucho Marx show almost two years ago.

IN PREPARATION FOR TWENTY-ONE, John took a four-hour test here. When New York summoned him as a contender, he took along 20 pounds of books to brush up (his heavy lecture schedule had put him behind in his reading).

"THEY WANTED ME IN NEW YORK on Saturday so I could relax," John explained, "and get my shoes shined and clothes pressed by Monday. We had 'dress rehearsal' at 6 p.m. which means we were shown how to get in and out of booths. Then I was sent back to my dressing room to remain in splendid isolation—couldn't even go to the men's room without permission and was told I was one of the most active contestants they'd ever had my first Monday when I had to ask permission four times!"

JOHN ASSURED ME THAT THE program goes all out to make contestants comfortable. He said questions are from 105 different categories, that absolutely no clues are given and that the show is 200 per cent on the level.

JACK WRATHER AND HIS ACTRESS-WIFE Bonita Granville threw a Lassie Party at the Beverly Hills Hotel to introduce Jon Provost, seven-year-old addition to the show's cast. Jon

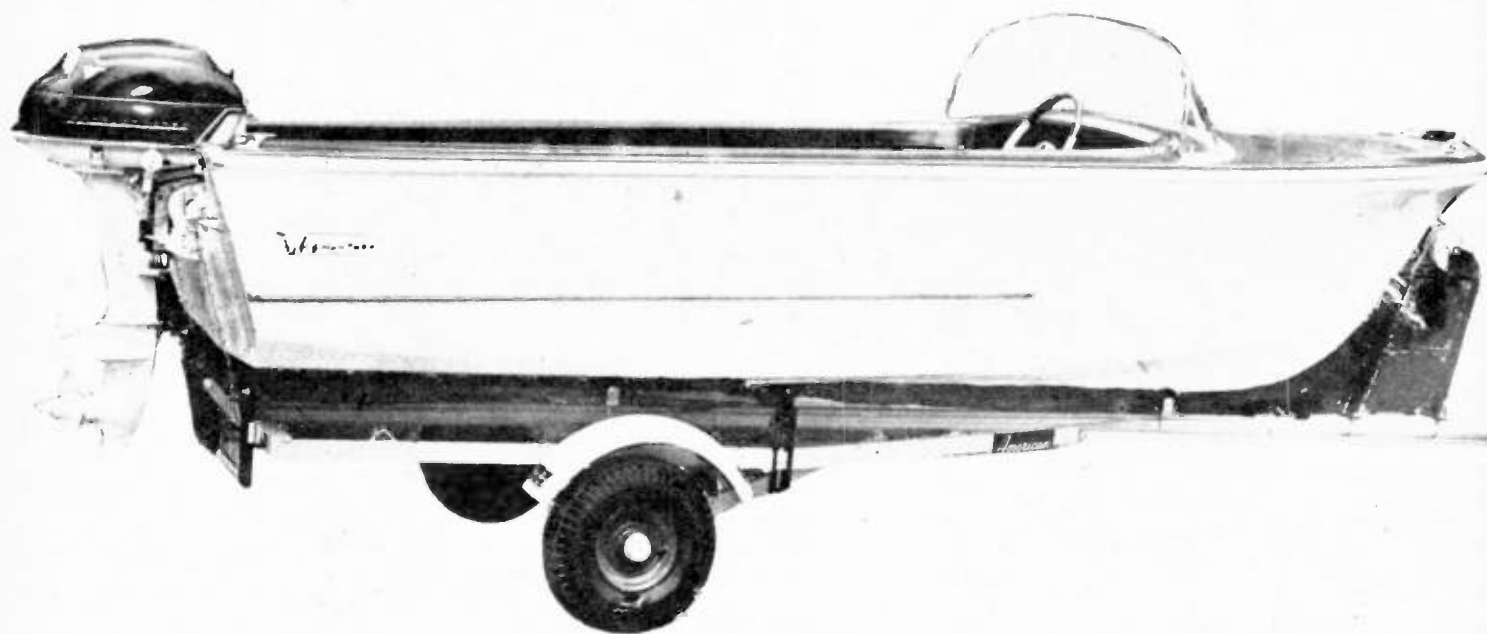

TV WEEK

In observance of National Television Week, September 8 to 14, and saluting fall, 1957, as TV's biggest season, local TV stations, in conjunction with the Electric League of Los Angeles, Sunday (8) will start a "puzzle picture" contest for viewers. Top prize will be an expense-paid trip to London or Paris for two, over the Polar route via TWA Jetstream.

The two-week contest, running through September 21, will consist of each participating station showing pictures of top personalities, with their features arranged differently. Competition for the European trip and 13 other prizes of television sets will depend upon the viewer correctly identifying the personality and telling in 10 words or less why he watches the star. Winners will be determined by aptness of phrasing, sincerity, and originality of expression used in telling about the TV personality, provided identification is correct.

Contest entries must be on official blanks obtainable at TV dealers, where viewers will have a chance to see 1958 television sets, complete with advanced engineering developments and newly styled cabinets. The contest is open to anyone over 21 years of age and persons may enter as many times as they wish.

Stations participating in the contest are KRCA, KNXT, KHJ-TV, KTLA, KTTV, and KCOP.

First week of the "puzzle-picture" contest will coincide with Television Week, being celebrated throughout the nation and in Los Angeles by Proclamation of Mavor Norris E. Poulson. Glen L. Logan, managing director of the Electric League, is Los Angeles area chairman of National TV Week.

Presiding over many festivities marking TV Week and the coming new season will be Donna Chadwell, "Miss New TV."

Second week of the contest (ending September 21) will serve to usher in the new fall TV season—biggest to date according to figures reported to the Electric League by local TV stations.

A total of \$2,100,000 weekly will be poured into production costs alone by the 7 stations on new shows. This does not include production costs on first-run movies scheduled for fall showing which would, of course, make the figure even higher.

Viewers will see 93 all-new shows a week, and with hour and half-hour segments, these represent 88 weekly hours of telecasting.

Added to the imposing new line-up will be the regular favorites—all in all making fall, 1957, truly TV's biggest season.

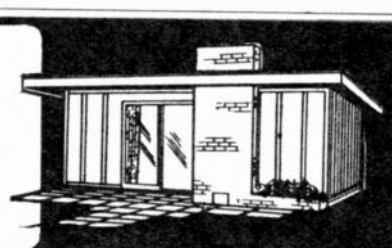

Summer vacation is just about over and I hope it has been a very special one for you. Did you take a trip . . . go to Summer Camp . . . visit relatives or travel to some far off spot? No matter whether your excursion was short or lengthy I have an idea that will make it more valuable to you in the years and months ahead. WHAT'S SPECTACULAR

About the New Season?

By Jack Holland

WHEN YOU take a look at the new spectaculars being lined up for the current season, a couple of impressions stand out.

Two-Hour Shows

For one, there is a move towards more two-hour spectaculars. For a long time, 90-minute shows were considered very special and often very long. Now, the move is towards even longer efforts. Perhaps the most notable example of this is the upcoming NBC presentation of "Die Meistersinger," which will be run in two parts, each two hours long. It will be very interesting to see what audience reaction is to this.

Another opera on NBC-TV-KRCA will hit the two-hour mark—"Rigoletto," which is to be seen in the new season.

However, the two-hour shows aren't limited just to operas. Mary Martin's super-special production of "Annie Get Your Gun" on NBC-TV will be two hours and this one will probably be as popular as was her "Peter Pan," although there are some who feel that since "Annie" has been seen so often there won't be quite so many breathlessly waiting to catch it as there were for "Peter Pan." However, Mary Martin's own popularity can probably make a hit out of any show she does.

There is another two-hour show coming up which is simply titled "Dialogue of the Carmelites." NBC-TV is doing this one too, but there is little information about it at this writing.

90 Minutes

Ninety-minute shows are now nothing unusual at all. TV apparently feels that with movies hitting the two-hour stretch most of the time, audiences will sit still for that long. The only thing is that on TV the show had really better be something special to hold an audience for two hours because once

boredom sets in, it's an easy matter to switch to another station.

Of the 90-minute specs, a few stand out.

Van Johnson will star in NBC-KRCA's "The Pied Piper of Hamelin." It will be filmed in Hollywood and has a tentative air date of November 12. Getting Van for the spot was quite a coup since he has been avoiding any big TV splurge like the plague.

The DuPont Show of the Month CBS-KNXT spectacular has several things lined up, beginning with Paul Gregory's "Crescendo," Starring Rex Harrison and Ethel Merman. This will go on September 29 and will be an extravaganza built around seven musical idioms developed in America—folk music, jazz, blues, western music, religious music, Latin-American and musical comedy.

In October the DuPont show will present "The Prince and the Pauper," adapted from the Mark Twain story for TV. The date is October 28.

Hallmark Hall of Fame has four productions lined up for NBC-TV, but the actual names of stars and shows haven't been announced as yet.

The Standard Oil Company is going into the 90-minute spectacular field too with a show.

One Hour

Of course, not all of the spectaculars are going to be "longies." A few will stick to the old one-hour treatment.

For NBC-TV, Bob Hope, Jerry Lewis, and Dean Martin (Martin and Lewis still soloing) will do special one-hour shows for the network. Most audiences know what to expect from these comics by now.

On October 13, Mickey Rooney, Walter Slezak, Fran Allison, Stubby Kaye, Jerry Colonna, Martyn Green, and Mata and Hari are scheduled for a special telecast of the classic, "Pinoc-

chio." Music will be by Alec Wilder with Lyrics by William Engvik and choreography by Hanya Holm. This undoubtedly will be a prime favorite with both young and old and it will be aired at a time, praise be!, when children will still be up to see it.

NBC-TV is also scheduling an hour-special of *March of Medicine*, which will be more in the documentary style and should be of general interest.

KABC-TV has, of course, its very special Frank Sinatra shows on tap and Disneyland has a Christmas spectacular lined up.

As for CBS-KNXT, Lucy and Desi will probably create the most excitement with the six one-hour shows they plan to do this coming season. Their regular half-hour Monday programs are no longer around except for re-runs. For their first shows Ann Sothern, Cesar Romero, Rudy Vallee, Rodolfo Hoyos,

is important enough to preempt the Ed Sullivan program, one of the very few times this has happened.

The spectaculars show a slight trend towards efforts to appeal to the so-called intelligentsia of the audience, at least with its documentary shows and its operas. But the emphasis is still on the type of offering that is fairly sure of garnering a mass audience. At least, the spectacular fare is more varied than the trend in new weekly shows. Here westerns of one kind or another predominate. It is quite possible that the spectaculars, which so far haven't really paid off as well as expected, may be a welcome relief from watching heroes dive over bars and ride out into the sunset.

At any rate, this season will be worth watching. Out of the long list of high-sounding and promising shows, a few memorable TV productions may emerge.

and Vivian Vance and Bill Frawley will join the popular Lucy and Desi.

Art Linkletter also has six projected specials called "People and Places." And Lowell Thomas is working on 10 shows to be called "High Adventure."

There is one spectacular, which is in the two-hour class, that can be the highlight of the season. Some may remember the great Ford 50th Anniversary show of several years ago. It was one of the best — if not the best — things ever done on TV. This season *General Motors* will present on November 17 its big spectacular — on NBC-TV. With the memories of what Ford did to TV, it is not too much to assume that GM will go all-out on this one.

A late entry is CBS-TV's one hour Edsel-sponsored benefit for Gonzaga University which will air October 13 and will star Bing Crosby and Frank Sinatra. This will be the first time Bing has headlined a live TV show and appeared as emcee — and it will be the first time Crosby and Sinatra appear together on a live telecast. The show

JOHN CONTE is that handsome, personable man who handles the host chores on Matinee Theater on KRCA-NBC-TV so efficiently. He is also the personality who has the damndest way of absolutely shattering his female audience.

Mail

There was one lady, for instance, who wrote John a couple of passionate love letters. His wife, Ruth, read the epistles — as she does all of his mail. She replied, saying in general terms that John and she appreciated her admiration. A few days after this, John went into the hospital for an appendectomy and his devoted fan wrote Ruth to ask if she could visit him. However, the hospital didn't want him to have any visitors.

"Then Ruth went on Matinee to fill in for me," John said, "and this lady wrote her that she was beginning to feel the same deep affection for Ruth, to which my wife replied saying how kind it was of this lady to be so complimentary. By the time I returned to Matinee the woman was a friend of both Ruth's and mine — and I think this shows what a completely wonderful wife I have. She can read all of the mail I get with the most astounding objectivity."

Ruth explains her reaction very simply, "I think the mail is wonderful and I can understand how the women feel about John since I am so much in love with him myself."

The woman who had written the passionate letters later apologized for her glowing notes but added that she was still in love with John.

Some of Conte's mail is most amusing. One lady penned a long letter at the end of which was this notation: "I have to stop now to go take my bath so I'll be nice and clean for you when you come on Matinee." Another said, "Although it gripes me that my husband is such a sloppy mess I know I can at least watch someone as spic and span as you."

Oddly enough, when John goes out in public he is not mobbed. He is recog-



nized, yes, but the ladies act quite respectful. Once he and Ruth were at the Farmer's Market and they noticed a few teen-agers and their mothers staring at them. They obviously were afraid to make any moves to John so he went up to them. One of them was eating an ice cream cone.

"Where did you get that ice cream?" he said. "It looks so good."

When the girl was able to recover from shock she directed John to the stand.

"It helped break the reserve," John explained, "and I honestly enjoyed talking to the girls later."

Besides letters, John and Ruth receive a lot of gifts from fans. He gets china, cakes, brownies, cookies, everything from a package of mangoes to cash.

"I opened a letter one day and found \$70 in cash inside," John said. "The letter itself was a little rambling so I wrote this person and asked her what she wanted me to do with the money — give it to a charity or did she want me to return it to her. The woman asked me to send it back, which I did. Ruth, however, gets as many gifts as I do—aprons, earrings, handkerchiefs, books, family heirlooms."

Ruth answers between 600 and 1000 letters a week but when he was in the

hospital the mail hit the 3000 mark.

"I don't think I realized what a strong bond there was between me and my audience until I was in the hospital," John said. "They wrote me as though I were a member of their family who was ill. I guess they feel that way because I'm in their living room five days a week."

Unusual Personality

John Conte is quite amazing in some ways. For one, he is on TV five days a week and he does little but act as host and pitch commercials. Most people would get heartily sick of such a deal after a while. But John's fans often turn in just to hear the commercials. And you can be sure they don't walk out for a cup of coffee or a sandwich when he does his stint.

"I honestly enjoy my work on Matinee," John said. "It never becomes tiresome to me. Certainly I have other ambitions — I'd like to do a nighttime TV show, for instance, where I could be more of an entertainer, where I could sing. I also hope to do some movies. My contract makes this possible since I have the right to take one month off every six months. But so far Matinee is keeping me pleasantly engrossed."

"It is also keeping my house a shambles. There is mail in every room — to which I say a hearty 'thank you all.'"

What is a Failure?

DEE PARKER wants to understand people and the "why" of their daily inter-relationships. Her daily show on KABC-TV, *Woman's Diary*, has sparked her natural curiosity about people into becoming something close to full time research.

"I try," she says, "to find a parallel that will make our filmed story a commentary on life and not just another flight of fancy.

"As a wife and mother, I have faced the same problems as our viewers. Although I am by no means an expert, I do try to draw a conclusion from the story in my comments that might help me, and at the same time, help others.

"To bolster my own experience, I've become loaded with books on everything from philosophy to psychology. I've found that almost everyone has a problem of some sort and that generally it can be overcome if you have the courage to face it. You know, it's not enough to make excuses for yourself, you have to find out the cause. Once you do that, your problems are on the way to being solved. Woops! There I go making like an amateur analyst again. I guess that comes from reading so much, but I can't help it—I love to read about people."

Much of the time Dee's comments are drawn from personal experience

and her long-time association with people from all walks of life.

For five years, prior to her current KABC program, Dee conducted Detroit's famous "Auntie Dee" show, a six-day-a-week amateur program for children over WXYZ-TV.

"I still get calls from ex-Detroiters here in Hollywood," Dee reports, "who just want to say hello. And this summer when I substituted for Chucko a few days, a lot of letters poured in asking if I was 'Auntie Dee.' It seems that Southern California is just flooded with ex-Detroiters."

Dee also sang with the Vaughn Monroe orchestra for a year in 1946 and

followed that with a two-year spot with the Jimmy Dorsey orchestra.

Dee, who is Mrs. Phil Brestoff off camera, is the mother of two boys, Nicky, 8, and Ricky, 6. Her day is divided between home and the KABC studios with her family getting most of her time.

In order to be at home as much as possible, Dee previews the following day's film right after the show and discusses it with the director. They decide on the approach that she will take in her commentary and then off she runs for home and the boys' lunch. She sandwiches in her appointments with hairdressers and dressmakers in the afternoons. Then at night, after she has put the children to bed, she begins the research that ultimately results in the script for the next day's show.

Singing one night stands, hosting a television show and making a home for her family has resulted in a rounded background indeed. Dee has met a lot of people and, like Will Rogers, "She's never met anyone she didn't like."

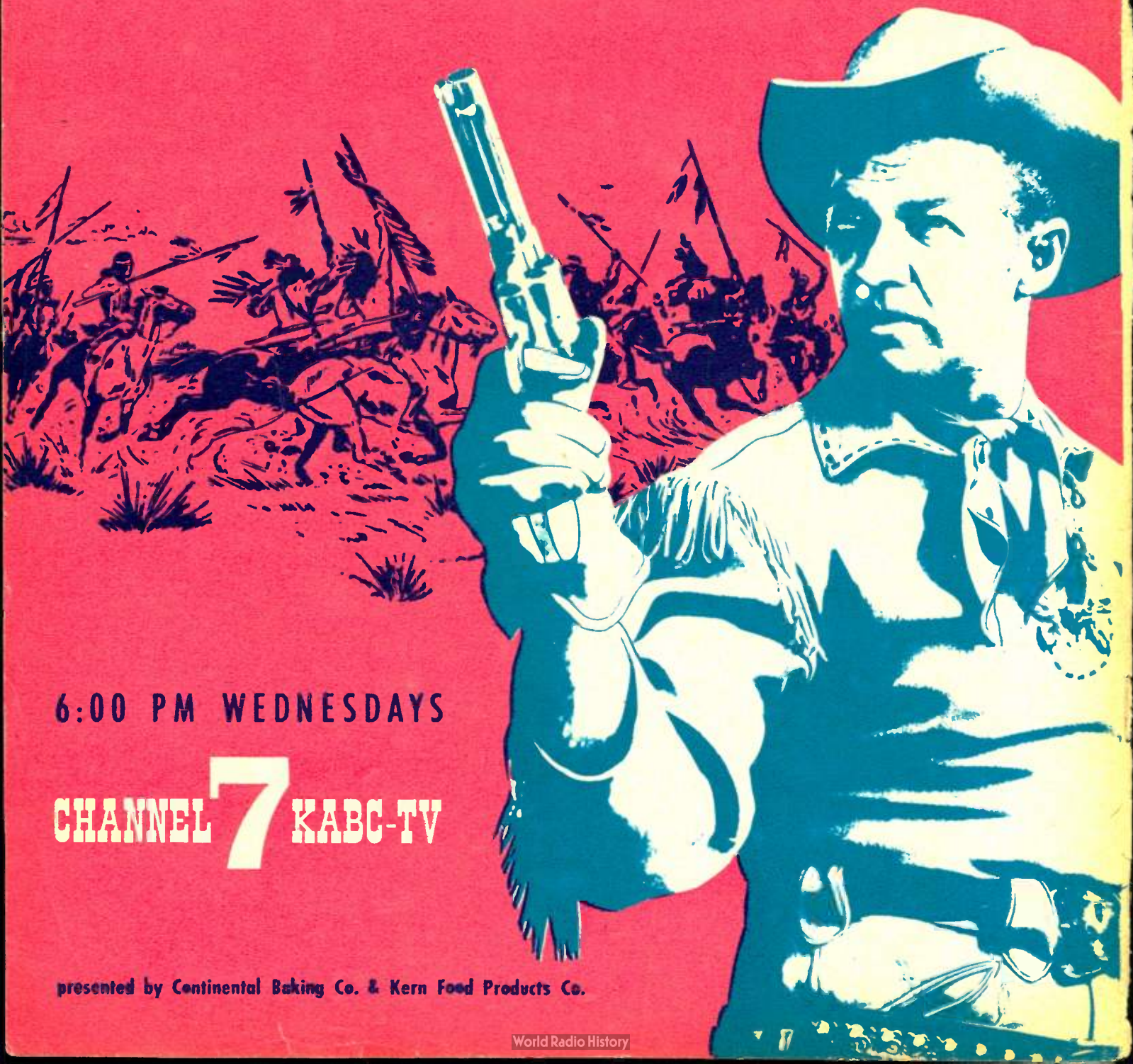
Perhaps her philosophy—and the feeling that she tries to convey on her program—can be put into a phrase: "Failure is not in falling down—it's staying down."
