Listen Before You Leap

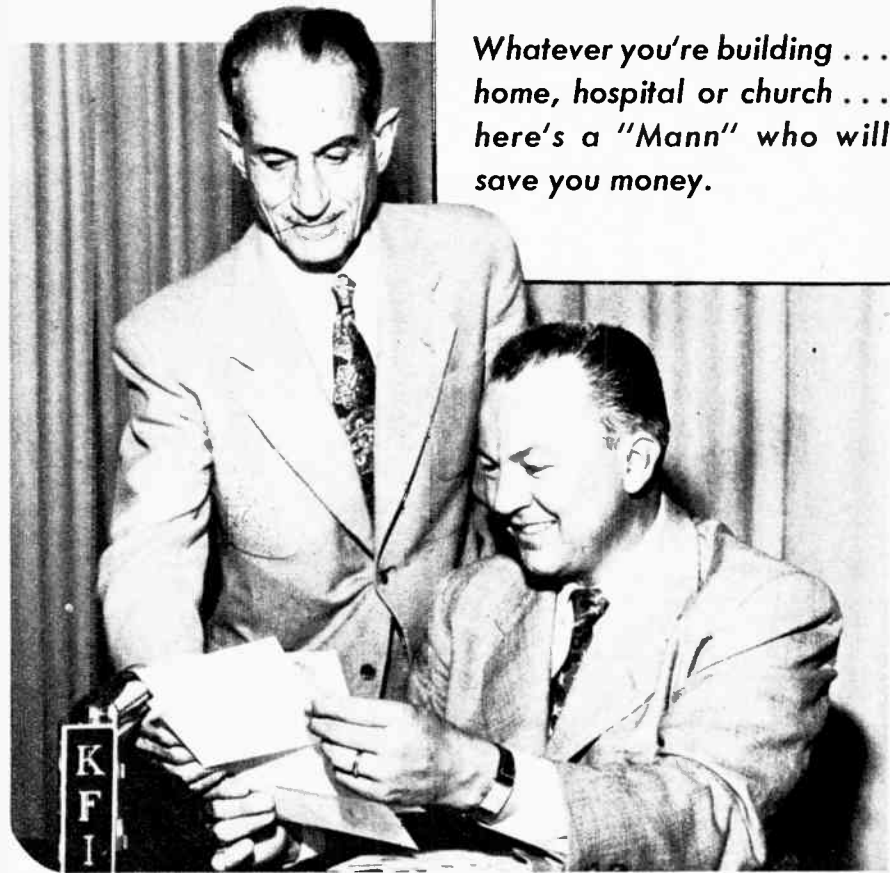
BEWARE of the high pressure salesman who wants to sell you insulating material or some other building product and doesn't give you time to think it over," advised Herbert J. Mann, nationally recognized building consultant. "Don't sign any contract until you think it over for a few days. Check prices with reputable firms in your community."

This is the kind of advice that Mr. Mann gives on his KFI Sunday morning program. Sponsored by a utility company which isn't selling anything but adequately wired homes, the program is commercial more by indication than insistence. Mann's aim is to acquaint listeners with fundamentals of obtaining maximum value in building, remodeling and repairs, and to warn them against "rackets."

"As an example of what can happen when one of these high pressure salesmen moves in I'm thinking of a case on which I was consulted recently," continued Mr. Mann. "At eight in the evening a salesman had called on a young couple, and at ten he left with a contract in which they agreed to pay him \$500 for insulating the ceiling of their home. After he left they worried about it, for they couldn't afford \$500. They called the insulating company the next morning to cancel the job, but were told that it was too late—the truck had already left with the material. They checked around to find out how much the job should cost, and found that reputable, established companies would have done it for \$80.00."

Mr. Mann has returned to KFI with his program after an absence of two years. From 1948 through 1956 he gained a reputation as a "racket-buster," working with the District Attorney, U. S. District Attorney and the Better Business Bureau. His advice to prospective homebuilders enabled them to avoid the mistakes which often turn "dream houses" into "nightmares."

President of Herbert J. Mann and Associates, Inc., consulting architects and building cost engineers, Mr. Mann personally devotes his time to organized research in the field of cost reduction of buildings. As a public service he

addresses civic organizations, service clubs, churches, school boards and other groups interested in this subject. He is particularly concerned at this time with outmoded procedures in school building programs. Because of these old-fashioned business procedures, Mr. Mann contends, there is as much as one dollar in four of the taxpayer's money being wasted in some communities.

Through methods suggested by Mann from 10 to 40 percent can be saved on all types of construction. An outstanding example is the experience of the Church of Religious Science, Alhambra.

The Board of Trustees had accepted bids for a new church. Lowest bid on plans prepared was \$162,470, plus architect's fee of \$12,889.60, making a total cost of \$175,359.60. This was beyond the means of the church. Mr. Mann was consulted, the services of the architect terminated at a loss to the church of \$8,500 which had been paid him on account. A new architect, recommended by Mr. Mann, was employed. This architect worked with the builder and the church was completed in 1955 at a total cost of \$98,614, including architect's fee and contractor's bond. Reports the church, "We saved \$76,755, or 43%, and the church is actually larger, and we believe, more beautiful, and with greater utility value than the original building."

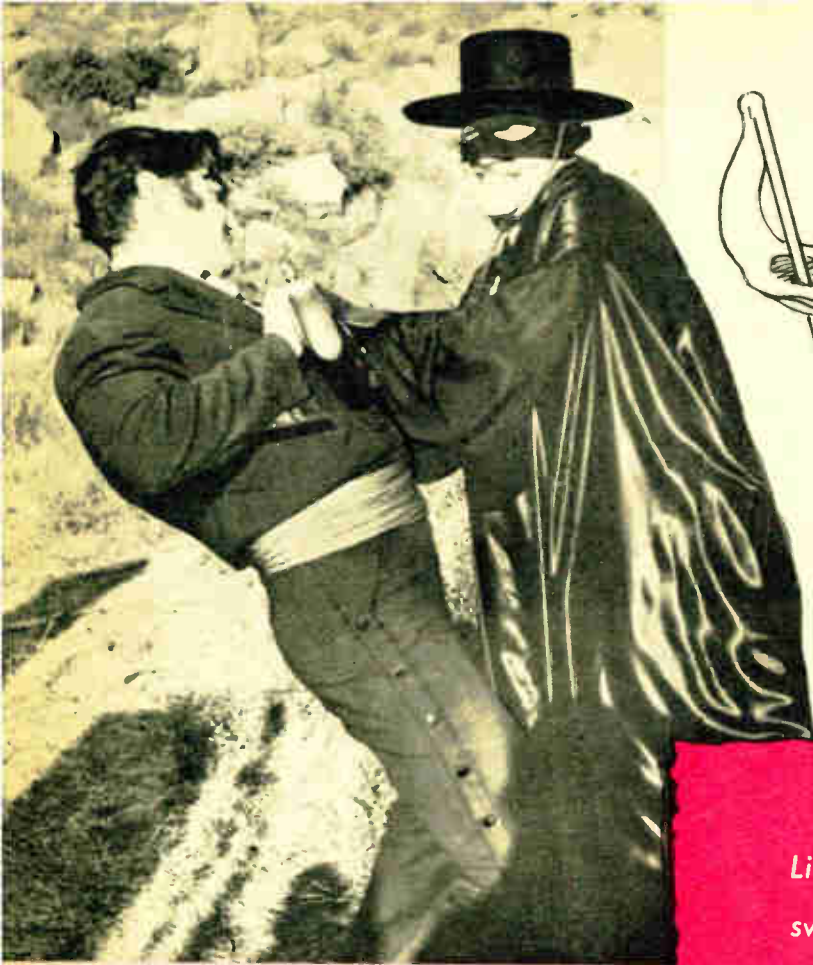
Mann, the son and grandson of Wisconsin lumbermen, never had any doubt

as to what he wanted to do in life. He started his technical training at an early age in Chicago, then went for four years to the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Returning to Chicago he served his apprenticeship and advanced to construction superintendent on some of that city's first tall buildings.

In 1910 Mann started his journey westward when he was sent out to build a bank in Globe, in what was then Arizona Territory. He stayed to build bridges, irrigation projects and buildings. In 1923, recognizing the growing importance of California he moved the Mann Building Company to Los Angeles. From a builder's experience of over half a century, Mr. Mann's advice to the layman is reassuring.

"In building, the main thing is to select an honest contractor and building designer or architect," stated Mann. "I've been in business 50 years and I know that most of them are honest. I would estimate that only about 3% are dishonest, and these are the 'promoters.' To make sure that you are getting an honest contractor all you have to do is ask for a list of his clients. Question them. If you find they are satisfied you can go ahead without fear. Put your complete trust in him, and don't try to chisel after you've engaged him by asking for little extras here and there. You don't want him to outsmart you—don't try to outsmart him. You can't."

FOULED UP
GUY WILLIAMS?

*Life isn't the same for the star of Disney's
swashbuckler now, but who wants it to be?*

GUY WILLIAMS AS ZORRO battles an armed villain in a scene from ABC-TV's successful Zorro series.

THINGS are quite different these days for Guy Williams — thanks to Zorro.

Guy had just returned from a visit to New York, his home town, his first since being cast as the star of Disney's successful Zorro series on ABC-TV. It was a trip he'd been looking forward to, but it didn't turn out entirely as he expected.

"I had so looked forward to walking through Central Park as I used to," Guy said quietly. "But I soon discovered this wasn't so easy any more. I was okay if I kept walking, but once I stopped it seemed kids came charging from all over, asking for autographs.

"The same was true of the Bronx Zoo, another New York spot I love to visit. Here, again, if I didn't stop, it was fine, but I happened to hesitate at the elephant house there and I was through.

"Sure I miss the privacy I used to have, but when I had that privacy I also had little or no money and lots of frustrations. I'd be crazy if I objected

to the attention these fans give me. Without them, where would I be?"

Most of Guy's friends in New York, many of them actors, reacted to his success in an expected manner — they were glad he got the big break, and from a personal angle, they enjoyed his good fortune. None of them was envious — and yet most of them were still waiting for that one big chance. Those friends who weren't in show business had all kinds of questions about the show to ask him.

"The majority of them wanted to know how I put the Z in the shirt, what the sword itself is really like, is Henry Calvin as fat as he seems or is he padded (he's not padded), is Gene Sheldon a deaf mute (he's not), and things like that. There is a great deal of curiosity about Zorro — which is certainly good."

Impression

Few series have made such an impression as has this one from Disney's. And most emphatically it has made the young set sit up and take notice. Recently, the kids at the Rio Vista Grade

School in North Hollywood all signed a Z at the bottom of their arithmetic test papers instead of their real names. They apparently pre-arranged this but it pointed up the popularity of Zorro.

Even Guy's son, Stevie, has finally been won over.

At first he wasn't too interested in the show, but things have changed. At his school he noticed how enthusiastically the other kids talked about Zorro — and how suddenly popular he was. However, when kids began giving him candy, he assumed it was because they liked him — which was partly right. At any rate, he began to ask his pals over to the house and promised them Guy's autograph.

Guy has taken his success in his stride. He and Dennis Weaver, who are close friends, hit the jackpot at about the same time and they compare notes. They arrived at the same conclusion.

"This was no overnight thing for me — or Dennis," Guy said seriously. "Six long years of disappointment, hard work, and frustration came first. All the

misery you went through before you hit is overlooked. People say, "How lucky can he get? Recognition of his work is so important to an actor — it's tough when it takes so long in arriving. And yet, the time spent in working and hoping often pays off — if you apply yourself right. For two of those six years I took lessons in fencing, primarily for more ease in bodily movement. It was certainly a good thing I did — considering all the fencing I now do on Zorro."

"I must say, though, that in my wildest dreams I never expected to get a break as a Latin. I had gone on many interviews before where a Latin type was needed. The casting directors took

we got the show. During production we'd rehearse our dueling scenes between set-ups — and since these are grueling chores it was even more important that we had had all that fencing before. Britt and I really got to know each other — blade-wise.

"As for Gene and Henry, they have a great sense of humor. In the long stretches when there's not much happening on the set, Gene keeps the whole set in good spirits by his jokes and general comments. Henry is the same — in his rotund, good humor. George Lewis, too, is another who makes our Zorro set a happy one, and in a series like this if there's not a good feeling on the set between the regulars, it's a rough deal."

No woman has been featured as a performer on Zorro, but this is to change in upcoming segments. So far, no definite girl has been selected but by the time you read this it is possible that the choice will have been made. The girl should create further interest on the Zorro set.

"Frankly, taking everything in consideration, I can't think of a better way to make a living," Guy commented with a smile. "Getting paid for having fun is one of the best occupations I know of."

one look at me and just laughed; said I was too American and all that. Consequently, when I got the call to go to Disney's to be interviewed for Zorro, I had little hope. I was especially sure I'd not be considered because I had just finished some Annapolis TV shows and had my hair in a crew cut. But, much to my surprise, Lee Traver, who is in casting at the studio, said to me, 'I think you could look Latin all right.' I just about flipped. He passed me — and so did the others. And now I'm the super-Latin type."

Co-Workers

Guy has found the series a very

pleasant chore, principally because he has been able to work with such people as Britt Lomond (who hasn't appeared in recent episodes but was in the first 13), Gene Sheldon, Henry Calvin, George Lewis.

"I've been surrounded by a good cast and crew," Guy said sincerely. "Britt and I, for instance, used to fence together before we ever heard of Zorro. We did sabre work then. We both learned about casting for Zorro at the same time and we agreed it would be a great idea to work together. 'We could get paid then to fence,' we remarked. It was indeed a break that

SUMMER SPOTLIGHT on . . .

Rowan and Martin

Two of the brightest new TV comics discuss "What's ahead for Comedy on TV?" They're now subbing for Dinah Shore on the Chevy Show.

DAN ROWAN and Dick Martin are two enterprising young men who have regaled sophisticated audiences with their mad-cap antics. On their TV appearances they have registered strongly as one of the leading comedy teams in the country. Now they are being seen on the Chevy Show this summer.

They are so optimistic about their TV stints that they aren't even concerned about the old bugaboo of too much exposure murdering comics.

"We'd like a weekly show if we could get the right format," said Dan. "That's how worried we are about being seen too much. Right now seems the perfect time for a new comedy show since laughs are coming back into vogue again — and may even possibly give the six gun a run for its money."

Comedy Back Again?

"Why, look at what happens to the ratings when Jack Benny, Jerry Lewis, or Bob Hope go on," Dick added. "They soar. Yet, we're not aware of the liabilities to comedy on TV. It's true TV can eat you up and that people get too used to comics too fast. Singers are lucky. They have the greatest writers — men like Rodgers and Hammerstein, for instance. But there is a place for comedy if it has a sound basis."

"When we did the Perry Como show recently, we talked to Perry about his own program. He said he had 17 minutes of song in his show — and that the toughest thing for him to do is to rehearse a skit."

"He's a great guy to work with," Dan commented. "We had a routine rolling in rehearsal that was getting laughs. However, it ran long and the producer wanted us to cut it. 'No, let it stay the way it is,' Perry said. 'I'll cut one of my songs instead.' And, by golly, he did."

During rehearsal, Rowan and Martin just toss out their lines in a kind of mumbling way. But when they get on camera, things start happening and the ad libs come out with sheer abandon. They have ad libbed on every show they have done with the exception of Jerry Lewis's.

"We were pressed for time and could not take the chance," Dick said. "Jerry works very differently from the way we do anyway. And if you're not careful you start working as he does — detailed, conscientious, serious. Actually, Jerry's rehearsals are a riot — they should film some of them. No one has his tremendous energy. This guy is happy only when he's working."

When it comes to the new look in comedy on TV, both Rowan and Martin think that there is a new trend — an accent on literacy. They point to Wayne and Schuster as two good examples of this new approach to humor. And yet these men have been a team for 25 years.

Rowan and Martin have teamed up only the last four and a half years. Both were once writers. In fact, it was while Dick was writing special material for Tommy Noonan and performing the routines that Tommy suggested that he work with another writer — Dan Rowan. That was the beginning.

Of all the comics the boys admire, the two who stand out most vividly as the greatest, in their estimation, are Laurel and Hardy.

"We believe in the essence of the team," Dan said. "And Laurel and Hardy were a team who believed in each other. There are, of course, great comedians like Benny, who is primarily a reactor. Sid Caesar is a genius. And Jackie Gleason is one of our greatest sketch comics. We think Sid Caesar has had a hard time establishing himself because he couldn't register as a personality. He was only at ease when he was playing a sketch. When he had to be himself he was at a loss. Benny, on the other hand, is a real personality and so is Dean Martin — now."

"Comedy on TV, at its best, is more confining than night clubs or stage. Material has to be so different — and it takes longer to get the audience reaction, what with the camera set-ups and the like. We can't see the audience — only the faces of the crew — and this is disturbing. We like to do warm-ups before a show so we can see our audience — it helps us when we're on camera."

Rowan and Martin are unique among comics for several reasons, one being that they write their own material. That relieves them of one responsibility — if they goof up a routine, the only persons they can fire are themselves.

It used to be a weekly highlight when Paul Coates and Zsa Zsa matched words and wits on *Bachelor's Haven*. "She always wants to top me," Coates once lamented. In the same breath he labeled her "intriguing, excruciatingly feminine, charmingly catty—the most exciting woman to come along since Mae Murrey." Then one night Zsa Zsa got so mad at Paul that she broke a record over his head. (She cut her hand in the process.) Paul was too stunned to say or do anything in retaliation. This feuding show was springboard for Coates. Apparently Zsa Zsa is too busy with other matters to TV.

ANOTHER PERSONALITY WHO used to appear on our local screens and who well might be welcome again is Eddie Albert, whose current television guestings are to promote his new Dot album, "High Upon A Mountain." An inspirational number, "Let There Be Peace on Earth," is one of his songs attracting most attention. (As you may know, Eddie was trained at Juilliard School of Music.) En route home from Africa, where he recently went for filming of a movie, Eddie stopped off in Madrid to check an orphanage regarding adoption of a little girl. Here he found and succumbed to the charms of a four-year-old, Marcia del Carmen, who returned Eddie's affection. The Spanish government was most co-operative and because wheels had been set in motion in ample time, speeded routine so that Maria is now part of the family. Eddie's wife, Margo, told me last week that by the second day she was here it seemed as if she'd been with them all her life. The Alberts' seven-year-old Edward is learning Spanish from Maria, while the little girl is picking English up quickly. Small Eddie wants Maria to also have the name of Heidi, so it will be added to please him. Margo hopes to get back into television come fall.

IF you spend a couple of days on the **Perry Mason** set, you suddenly become aware of one thing — that no TV star in any series has a job as demanding as that of **Raymond Burr**. Not only does he have more dialogue to learn than any other star in the TV business, but he is in almost every scene. Fortunately for **Ray**, there is such a genuinely happy feeling on this set that he is able to meet the fantastic demands placed on him. Co-stars **Barbara Hale**, **Bill Talman**, **Ray Collins**, and **Bill Hopper** and director **Bill Russell** are all so congenial and so lacking in phony temperament that they make work a pleasure. **Ray**, of course, does manage to get away from the pressure on week-ends when he goes to his ranch home by the sea, far past **Malibu**. Here is another world — a peaceful setting, a real refuge from the cares of TV. And here is another side of **Ray Burr**. The man who lives here is an expert cook, has a fantastic green thumb (even grows spider orchids), is a furniture-maker, does cement work, tends to his stock consisting of **Zsa Zsa** (his donkey), his ducks, bantam chickens, rabbits, and his four dogs. During the week **Ray** lives in his dressing room at the studio so this place really is important to him. It is here where he manages to refuel to tackle the next week's work on the successful **CBS-TV** series. But still those who know only shake their heads when they take note of the job **Ray** does and say, "Don't see how he does it — week after week. All that dialogue to learn!" He just takes it in his stride — and keeps his fingers crossed.

O. L. Jagers, the "renowned" gentleman of the air waves, is really getting in trouble these days. In his hey-day on TV

when he harangued away and added to his exchequer certain facts were presented about him here. None of the recent developments should be in the least surprising in view of the data unearthed about him by this magazine. Mayby now people will wake up about him!

Where has all the good music gone on radio and on TV? This is a question more and more people are asking. Several of the finer programs like **Voice of Firestone** have gone off the channels and nothing has taken their place. The only answer is just that as long as TV is hamstrung by a thing called ratings and as long as those so-called ratings say good music has no audience, sponsors will not buy such shows. Even those stalwart few who presented better programs regardless of their "standing" have begun to weaken. Your TV fare is at the mercy of advertisers — it's more and more a medium for **Madison Ave.** than for any general public.

Patricia Cutts, TV actress of note, went on a special 900 calorie a day diet which included some health foods. She insists that with this diet she is never hungry and that it worked for her. I'd like to say now that "Mighty Joe Young" obviously picked up that phone and called Vic Tiny's, does a nice job of aping its betters, and won an Oscar for special effects. Come to think of it, Channel 9, itself, also just won an Oscar.

"Dead Reckoning." (5) July 13, 7:30. 1947. Paratrooper captain **Humphrey Bogart** and a buddy are on their way to Washington for medals when the buddy disappears. Bogart goes to the kid's home town in the south to look for him and discovers that the fellow is wanted for murder. It's just a plot jump from there to finding the kid murdered and trying to clear his name. With **Lizabeth Scott**, as the femme fatale, and it's an entertaining picture of the genre, mainly because of Bogart.

"The Dark Corner." (2) July 12, 10:00. 1945. **Clifton Webb** plays once again his usual character, an effete snob whose wit and supposedly superior breeding humble anyone so foolhardy as to cross conversational rapiers with him. He is an art dealer and his great passion is his beautiful wife, who spends most of her time stretching canvas (for pictures, of course) with a blackmailer, **Kurt Krueger**. There is a murder and pvt. eye **Mark Stevens** and his secty, **Lucille Ball** (zany, natch) arrive on the case. Webb tries to frame Stevens . . . you must remember he deals in pictures . . . and it all adds up to a fairly good crime story with a neat twist here and there . . . Now, you must agree that Miss Ball is a neat twist.

"Tender Comrade." (9) Beginning July 14, 9:00. 1943. Directed by **Edward Dmytryk** from a story by **Dalton Trumbo**, this teary romance tells the stories of **Ginger Rogers**, **Kim Hunter**, **Ruth Hussey**, **Mady Christians** and **Patricia Collinge**, whose husbands are away at war. They group together in one house, work at war plants, and in general fight the battle of the home front. There is near infidelity, a husband missing in action and the usual stiff upper lip sort of thing prevalent in this kind of picture. **Robert Ryan** appears as Miss Rogers' husband.

"Bittersweet." **"Indian Love Call."** **"I Married An Angel."** **"Naughty Marietta."** **"Sweethearts."** (11) All week at 10:40 or thereabouts. Here is KTTV's fulsome tribute to **Jeanette MacDonald** and **Nelson Eddy** and their fans . . . and I mean fulsome. What can one say about this pair? They were magnificent successes and there must have been a reason. Here are five of them.

"Yesterday and Today." 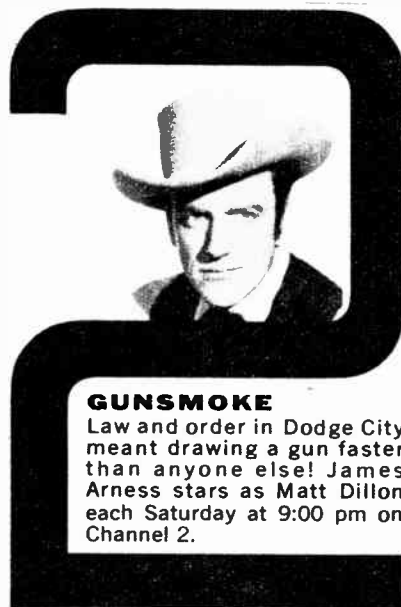

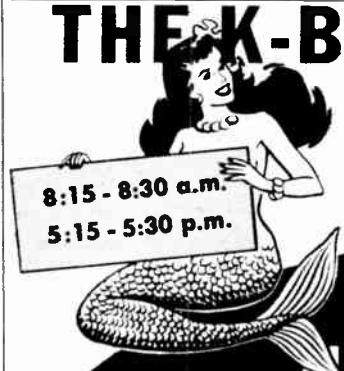

SKIPPER FRANK'S SCAM-O-GRAM

Marky Derwin of Pomona has written me to request more tricks that can be performed with playing cards. So here goes with the card trick called the "Whispering Queen."

This is a very effective effect. A spectator is asked to shuffle the pack. You take the deck and ask, "Which is your favorite queen?" Suppose the queen of spades is named. You run through the face up pack and remove the queen of spades. Next, you lay the pack face down on the table and divide it into three piles. Ask the spectator to select one of the piles and to secretly lay the top card of that pile face down on the table without looking at it.

You now tell the spectator that the queen of spades is very wise. You hold the queen to your ear and pretend to converse with it. Then touch the queen to the selected card on the table and again hold the queen to your ear. "Ah!" you announce, "the queen tells me that you have selected the four of clubs." The card is turned up and it is the four of clubs!

SECRET: In looking through the deck for the queen of spades you calmly glimpse the top card and remember it. When you cut the pack, you lift off about two-thirds, leaving a small heap; then you move to the right and drop another third; finally drop the top group in the center. Thus you know the top card of the center heap. When you ask a spectator to select a pile he will almost invariably take the center heap, which fits into your plan. Since you know the top card the rest of the trick is mere window dressing.

Don't worry if the spectator chooses one of the end heaps. Turn to another person and say "You take one also," at the same time point to the other end heap with a wave of your hand. If the spectator takes the other end say "Now we have one heap left we will use it." If the second spectator takes the center, ignore the first person and finish the trick with second spectator.

But perhaps the biggest trouble with Haggis Baggis is that it is riding in on the last gasp of the quiz show. Or is this evaluation only wishful thinking on the part of this reviewer? But it does seem that the hey-day of this type of show is on the wane.

One might wonder whether the pattern of television programming following the rise and fall of such definite trends indicates the ever-tightening bonds of conformity in American life. It would appear that entertainment material is no longer judged on its own merit, but only in relation to the current vogue that seems to be paying off rating-wise whether it be straight drama, westerns, quiz shows, comic shows or whatever the case may be.

This is unfortunate, for the world of theater and entertainment has found its greatest reason for being in the strength of its creative originality. It was a world of daring spirits, of soaring imagination. Conformity was *not* the order of the day. And it is disheartening to see this last stronghold of rugged creative individualism succumb to the tightening strictures governing so many other phases of American culture.

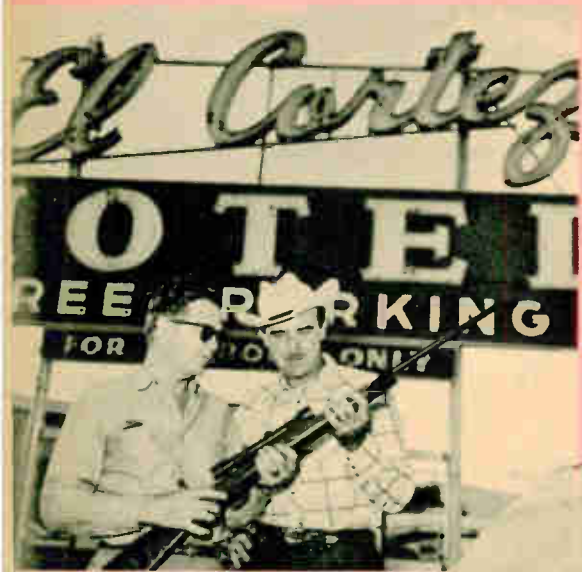

HOW TOD ANDREWS *Lost His Fear*

It was a long fight to overcome his big problem, but the star of Gray Ghost won out and found success.

IT'S HARD to imagine anyone with the background, experience and command of Tod Andrews ever being so afraid of walking on stage that he'd start to stutter. And yet this is the battle the young star of KTTV's *Gray Ghost* won.

When he was about five or six he used to go to movies a lot. Afterwards, he'd come home, put on some black lines for moustaches, get a coat to use as a cape, make a sword out of a piece of wood, and go out in the back yard and play a scene of derring-do with a friend. Tod isn't quite sure what the movies were that he saw but from the props he used he said, "They must have been Douglas Fairbanks movies!"

But when he went into high school suddenly Tod developed a terrible shyness, a fear.

The Fear

"I'd have to get up and recite in school and I'd be so scared I couldn't open my mouth," he explained, "so I'd just say quickly, 'I don't know' and then sit down. My grades got worse and worse. The teacher called my parents in to discuss my work and my father finally asked her to give me a written test — to prove I wasn't just plain stupid. I took the test and got a high grade. It was then that my mother and father — and the teacher — decided I should take a class in drama.

"Here again the fear came — and with it the stuttering. Since the students were called on in alphabetical order I was the first to be asked to recite. We

had a pantomime exercise one day and I got up and waved my arms back and forth. No one knew what I was illustrating. I had to tell everybody at last that I was pretending to catch butterflies. I remember how everyone laughed.

"It wasn't until I noticed that others in the class weren't so good that I began to get a little confidence.

"And yet, even when I went to Pasadena Community Playhouse and did some plays and then to Broadway I'd still have that fear, that nervousness. I can recall on Broadway going to the theatre at six instead of 7:30 or 8. I'd sit there and try to work myself out of my nerves. I'd be okay after I was on stage for awhile. Then I would be able to forget myself — and that was the big thing. To forget self.

"There was a poem I used to recite to myself before I went on stage that was a big help in curing me of my fear and my stuttering. It said, simply that God had apparently wanted me to be an actor, that He expected me to be a good actor, that people out front were going to like me. This helped build up confidence. Later, when I did 'Mr. Roberts' under Joshua Logan's direction, he used to call the cast on stage and tell them: 'Think to yourself that you're the best actor there is, that you know your part, and that everyone is going to like you. Remember that and you'll be alright.' This was of immeasurable help to all of us."

Tod was doing a production of Tennessee Williams' "Summer and Smoke"

when Josh Logan first saw him. In the play, Tod was playing a dissolute Southerner. After the show, Logan came back and asked him what part of the South he came from. Tod replied that he wasn't a Southerner — he was a Yankee from Buffalo. Then, as Logan was leaving, Tod said, "I'd sure love to work with you some day."

Later, Tod was cast as Mr. Roberts to replace Henry Fonda and he couldn't help wondering why Logan, after seeing him as a Southerner, cast him as Mr. Roberts. Logan explained, "It was the sincere way in which you said you'd like to work with me that convinced me. I figured that anybody with that kind of sincerity could play Roberts."

Tod got the part in *Gray Ghost* in a peculiar way. He had been with a company doing "The Best of Steinbeck" but the show wasn't drawing. He told his agent he had to work and to find him something, so one day the agent brought him a script of *Gray Ghost*. Tod liked it and after an interview with producer Lindsley Parsons he got the role.

"My agent—and I—never mentioned I couldn't ride a horse," Tod said, "and so after I got the part I managed to take four lessons before I made the pilot film. It was then that Mr. Parsons knew I couldn't ride too well. I finally confessed I had only had four lessons, and that I was also afraid of the horse. But I began to take daily lessons and now I'm really sold on horses and riding. So acting helped me over another fear.

"The stuttering and the nervousness I had before stemmed from lack of confidence, shyness, and from improper breath control. My son from a former marriage gets excited at times and the words don't come out, so I help him by teaching him how to breathe properly. It's all a big battle but winning it is worth any effort."

Marriage

Tod got married again about a year and a half ago and he and his wife, Alice, have a new baby boy named John. His wife is a Southerner, born in Nashville, Tennessee. In fact, he and Alice were married in Nashville 100 years to the day that John Mosby, whom Tod portrays in the *Gray Ghost*, was married there.

"I'll never forget the day Alice asked me to meet her family," Tod laughed. "Here I was a Yankee to begin with. Then I walked in to meet her two brothers who towered over me at six feet six and six feet four. I don't know how I ever got by that test."

Tod is now comfortably wrapped up in the security of a successful TV series and a happy marriage. The days when he stuttered and lived in fear are only hazy memories — memories he recalls as his greatest lessons.

Need a Mother? Call Barbara

Barbara Billingsley not only is a mother in real life but also in her reel life. She doesn't, however, confuse her two roles.

BARBARA BILLINGSLEY is beginning to wonder if she isn't being type-cast. She is currently essaying the motherly role in *Leave It to Beaver* for CBS-KNXT. She has also played a similar role in her other TV series now past, *Professional Father*. She is fully expecting to be asked to lend her maternal affections in some other series once *Beaver* has run its course.

Not that the job is hard for her. She is a mother in real life — of two boys, Glenn, better known as Brud, and Drew. Glenn is 13 but stands a mere six feet while Drew is the "shorty" at five nine and a half.

"Sometimes, after what goes on at home, I wonder if I'm really acting at all on the set," Barbara laughed.

"So many of the things that happen in *Beaver* have happened either to me in the days past or to our writers, Joe Connelly and Bob Mosher. In my day, when my boys were younger, I had to do the talking to the teacher bit. Then there was the time when the boys went to military school and decided to play hookey one day. They were court-martialed! They have simmered down slightly now — with their interests turning to such plebian things as girls and cars."

Barbara is the widow of the late TV director, Roy Kellino. She has been, tritely but nevertheless honestly speaking, both mother and father to her two boys — and the camaraderie here is something to see. There is no possessive mother routine here. Barbara allows her boys the right to be individuals.

"The girl friend business is perhaps the most acute," smiled Barbara — motherly. "I've heard about the boys' attempts to get seats in the movies closest to the best looking girls they see. And I am most heartily aware of a thing called the phone. The boys were getting so many phone calls from girls — and



doing so much calling themselves — that I finally gave in and got them their own phone.

"Actually, Brud and Drew are great pals. Brud is accepted by all of Drew's pals because he is so tall. He constantly refuses to have a birthday party because he doesn't want any of his pals to know he's only 13.

"Brud and Drew have the same interests too — girls. Drew, however, has gone more into the car business, mainly because cars are important in taking a girl on a date. I gave him our '54 model which he decided had to be re-painted, so he asked me to give him \$50 for Christmas towards the paint job. He assured me it would cost \$80. I gave him the \$50 and he turned right around and got the whole thing done for \$27, smugly pocketing the balance. The same thing happened when I gave him money for seat covers. He promptly got a solution to clean the seats with instead. The extra money he thus saves he spends on gadgets for the car."

There is never any question about the boys being able to have their friends over to the house — except that Barbara prefers that they have parties on the week-ends only. Their gatherings, how-

Barbara was put into *Leave It to Beaver* in a rather odd manner. She was to do another show with Joe Connelly and Bob Mosher but it was canceled out and she was cast into *Beaver* instead.

Her career has been a succession of rather healthy breaks, mainly on TV. Most of her big opportunities came on Schlitz Playhouse and Four Star.

"With all the work I've done on TV, my sons remain completely non-committal," Barbara concluded. "They don't let me know whether I'm good, bad, or indifferent. All that matters to them is that I come home from work and still play the role of their mother."

"I find this my most delightful assignment."



Out-Relaxes Como

MYRON FLOREN picks up and puts down his accordion about 150 times every evening when he is on the bandstand. Whenever he lifts the 27-pound instrument to his shoulders and starts to play, fans are certain to hear some of the country's most brilliant accordion music.

Myron smiles rather shyly as his nimble fingers whisk over the keys and buttons. It all looks so easy. Mostly it is. "I enjoy my work," Myron admitted. "Or is it work? Maybe that's why I enjoy it! I enjoy it so much sometimes I say I'm almost ashamed to take the money!"

What he doesn't confess quickly is that his accomplishments represent roughly 15,000 hours of hard rehearsal and practice. They symbolize accordion lessons from the time Myron was only 7, public appearances beginning at age 8; working his way through Augustana College by teaching accordion; and professional appearances starting with radio when he was 19.

But there is much more to Myron's career than his accordion playing on ABC-TV and radio, his appearances with Lawrence Welk at the Aragon Ballroom and his other band work like recordings. Whenever the Welkmen go on the road, it is Myron who takes care

of the group. He heads their mutual savings and investment organization. And for some time now he has been averaging a concert appearance weekly. During the mid-week when the Welk activities are usually at slow flow, Myron planes out to points north and east where his special delight is entertaining young people.

With a schedule like this, not to mention his home activities with Berdyne and four girls, Myron could easily be one of Hollywood's most harrassed gentlemen.

That he is not is due entirely to his personally acquired philosophy. He can out-relax Perry Como. "Everything always works out" is almost a motto with Myron. Planes may be late, take-offs risky, landings hazardous, and all sorts of misfortunes pressing, but Myron Floren refuses to get into a dither.

He believes that his ability to slow down was developed during childhood when he suffered rheumatic fever on three occasions. Once he dropped to a mere 90 pounds, but within a season was back carrying his load of labor on the farm. Because he has had to work so hard all his life he likes to stress the rewards of honest effort in his talks to high school and music students. A speech Myron heard when he was still a boy impressed him deeply. It was delivered by the only man of his home

state, South Dakota, who was in Who's Who at that time. The particular sentence striking Myron was, "Success is in rendering service to the world."

People Count

He interpreted this to mean that the individual owed certain things to himself as well as society. "We're in an age of push buttons," Myron may impress upon a youthful group, "but it is not all done that easily. Work is involved. So if you are supposed to practice an hour, make it an hour and a half." Theme of his talk is "Hard work pays off." And who should know better than Myron?

Right now he is concentrating on writing a book on accordion method. This is an arduous yet creative task involving origination of illustrative themes. Myron stays cool and collected in traffic waits by using the time to think about his themes. It is his feeling that most persons fail to devote sufficient time to thinking of any sort and of course if one has some project in tow, this requires additional pondering.

His associates label Floren as one of the most even-tempered men in the Welk organization. Just because he fails to become flustered does not mean he is lax regarding responsibilities. For one thing, he is very punctual, preferring to be about 15 minutes ahead of time than to squeeze in at the last minute. Yet contradictorily, if some spare five moments appear and he is short on sleep, Myron is able to doze off quickly and nap for a "fast five" any time of day or night.

He is not so constituted that he worries about himself. He values his three accordions highly, his best one worth about \$3500 because it has an extra special set of reeds. Once a month the instrument undergoes a cleaning—a complicated task because there are 328 reeds on the right side alone. Such frequent refurbishing is necessary because of the dampness at the beach ballroom. But insofar as Myron's priceless hands are concerned, he carries no insurance. Until he became so busy with appearances he used to work more in the garden, hands grubbing in the soil. The knuckle on his ring finger is slightly enlarged from one experience. Perhaps one reason Myron is so unconcerned about his hands is that he is extremely versatile, and an impairment or end to his playing, tragic though it might be, would not spell finis to his musical career.

"I always want to work," he claimed in discussing the years to come. "No retirement for me." His idea of real relaxation is to go back to Green Lake, Minnesota, lie in the sun, gaze up at the sky, and think.

Why Kids Scare Bill Stulla

There are moments when Engineer Bill just holds his breath and keeps his fingers crossed. But, of course, such moments only make his work more interesting.

BILL STULLA, better known to the well-informed as KHJ-TV's Engineer Bill, has been in TV for ten years. He has spent about three and a half years out of those ten doing shows with and for children.

You'd think nothing could bother him. But — oh! you'd be wrong.

"The youngsters, God love 'em," Bill began, "are forever pulling things that are completely unexpected, although I should be ready for almost anything now. One day, I had a bright little girl on the show. While I was talking about one of my sponsor's products, she kept interrupting me. I wasn't sure whether I should stop my spiel and let her talk or not. I was afraid she might say that her mother never uses the particular product I was praising. This happened to me once. I was plugging something called Magic Milk Shake Mix. A girl on the show topped it all with, 'My mother uses Nestle's instead.' Well, I did finish my commercial and I then asked the girl what she wanted to say. Seems she had nothing in mind — she was just feeling chatty. But it's this kind of thing that keeps me wondering what is coming next.

Big Fear

"I have a particular fear of the inevitable. I refer specifically to parents who don't take their children to the bathroom before bringing them on the show. Or maybe they do and the nerves start acting up, and — well, you know the rest. More than once in the middle of the show I've had a little boy or girl tug me on the sleeve and say, 'I got to go to the potty.' So I get a cartoon on as fast as I can and escort the child off stage.

"One girl called out to me on the program once, 'Engineer Bill! Engineer Bill!' I was talking so I said, 'Just a min-

ute, dear. I finally got over to her and asked, 'What is it honey?' Very bluntly she answered, 'I had to go to the bathroom but I don't now'."

Of course, not all of his dealings with children involve incidents like this. There are heartwarming moments too. Recently, a seven-year-old boy was a special guest on Bill's show. The child had been deaf and dumb since birth and was considered a hopeless case. Then the Hear Foundation, which works on deaf and dumb children with special hearing aids, worked with the boy and his hearing and his voice were restored. His one favorite TV show had always been Engineer Bill. Even though he couldn't hear or understand what was going on, he'd be glued to the set. So his greatest moment was going on Bill's program and hearing him talk for the first time.

Bill is very fond of children — that is obvious in the way he handles them, but he does have some dislikes. For one thing, he does not at all appreciate it when little girls walk into the studio wearing lipstick and make-up. He thinks this is being much too precocious. But here, of course, he blames the parents.

"I never get tired of my show, though," Bill remarked. "The crew is just great and Lyle Bond and I, who do a lot of kidding, have fun trying to make each other goof.

"There is always something happening that gives me real satisfaction. For instance, in my 'Red-Light, Green

Light' game I try to get the kids to drink their milk — although I've never had a milk company for a sponsor. I got so many letters from parents thanking me for getting their children to drink milk. One mother wrote, 'Now, can you do it with meat and potatoes?'

Ambition

With all the shows Bill has done — and with his previous years spent on radio — he still has to attain his ambition, which is to be an actor. To get an acting part would be a real thrill for him.

"I am basically a very shy person," Bill admitted. "Yet, I have no inhibitions as Engineer Bill, probably because I wear a uniform and I don't feel like myself. It was my wife, as a matter of fact, who insisted I go on TV in the first place. I thought it was a silly idea. I pointed out that I was short, hadn't too much hair, so what would I do on TV? Her answer was, 'Just get in there while nobody knows what he's doing anyway.' It worked. My first TV job was as an announcer on a musical show. My wife's only comment was, 'You looked like a frozen cigar store Indian.'

"But I still want to act."
