Bell, whose previous experience also includes programming KMEL/San Francisco and WIZF/ Cincinnati, said, "This is a rare opportunity, because the whole staff from the bookkeeper up has done radio and understands it. Everybody who's here has done an airshift, and they all understand what we need. This station has everything."

Noted WRKA GM Mike Kirtner, "It's always a pleasure to hire someone who's programmed the number one AC in the country, as Mike has done." Kirtner's reference was to Kay's accomplishment in fall 1985, when Kay programmed WCRZ/Flint.



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

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WASHINGTON REPORT

Broadcasters Urge Tougher Standards For CP Applicants

Broadcasters, industry groups, and communications attorneys are voicing strong support for an FCC proposal that would require applicants for construction permits to include more financial, ownership, and management integration information in their initial filings.

Comments filed in recent weeks with the FCC, in response to its proposal to modify the construction permit application (Form 301), were nearly universal in their support for demanding more information from applicants. Proponents of the changes believe they will speed the comparative licensing process and reduce the number of "sham" applications filed by unqualified parties. This proposed overhaul of Form 301 was initiated by the Federal Communications Bar Association.

Most of the groups that filed comments were concerned with revising Form 301 in order to fight abuse of the comparative renewal process. Competing applicants for the license of an existing station are required to file a Form 301.

In its notice of proposed rulemaking on revision of Form 301, the FCC sought comment on proposals to require the following: identification of all equity owners, including limited partners and non-voting shareholders; disclosure of current or future ownership rights agreements; disclosure of financial information, such as a listing of the applicant's estimated costs of building and operating the station for the first three months: and identification of all sources of funding. Another proposal calls for increasing the standard for evaluating the availability of money for construction and start-up from "reasonable assurance" to a "firm financial commitment."

The FCC is also considering a rule that would require corporate and partnership applicants to provide the date and location of their incorporation or formation.

The proposed revision of the Integration section of Form 301 would require applicants to outline the hours and duties of each owner who is expected to be involved in management of the station.

NAB, CBS Urge Action

NAB urged the Commission to modify Form 301 "expeditiously," adding, "Such action we believe is needed now before a flood of 'sham' competing applications is filed against radio renewal applicants. In addition, modifications to the FCC Form 301 might actually reduce the number of applications by eliminating many persons who file solely to be 'bought off' in a settlement agreement."

CBS echoed that position, but said changing Form 301 will be of limited use in curbing abuse of the comparative renewal process. "Only a fundamental overhaul of the comparative renewal system will eliminate current abuses," said the broadcast giant.

CBS also called on the FCC to require CP applicants to disclose the media holdings of their limited partners and non-voting stockholders.

Most of those who filed comments were opposed to requiring new station applicants to meet the tougher "firm financial commitment" standard for availability of funds. Such a requirement is unrealistic. the broadcasters said, as a comparative licensing procedure can last for several months or years longer than any funding source can be expected to remain "firm" in its commitment to an applicant. NAB, however, did urge that applicants filing against an existing station's renewal application should be required to meet the "firm financial commitment" standard.

Attorney Skidelsky Begs To Differ

Notable for his opposition to most of the proposed Form 301 changes was New York communications attorney Barry Skldelsky. According to Skidelsky, the proposed financial disclosure rules would result in nothing more than an added burden for entrepreneurs who already face huge obstacles when attempting to build a radio station from scratch.

Skidelsky also urged the Commission to allow attorneys to provide their services to applicants in exchange for an ownership without requiring the attorney to become integrated into the station's management.

vestigation of KUKQ & KUPD/Tempe (Phoenix). "I almost feel like I've been con-

victed of a crime I didn't commit. I had no reason to protect anybody there, and I didn't," said Jeffrey Colson, (a/k/a Jay Stone), now an announcer with KLSQ/Las Vegas. He added that the judge's opinion has already cost him a possible job, and is ruining his reputation.

Similar sentiments were expressed by two others singled out by the judge, air personalities John Edward Jennings III (a/k/a Bobby Christian) and Thomas Mueller (a/k/a Todd Wallace).

"Bottom-line, I think I've really been victimized in this case, as have Bobby Christian and Jay Stone for that matter," said Mueller.

Judge Criticized Testimony In Complex Case

The air personalities recently came under fire when FCC Administrative Law Judge Edward Kuhlman refused to renew the licenses of Tri-State Broadcasting Inc. for KUKQ & KUPD and awarded the stations to a competing applicant. The action climaxed five years of litigation over Tri-State's business ethics and truthfulness in dealing with the FCC.

Kuhlman ruled that Tri-State lost its licenses because corporate officials for several years had lied to the FCC about the true ownership and management of the combo, specifically the involvement of Robert Melton. The judge said Melton, who had come under FCC fire for his management of the stations in the '70s, continued to manage the stations and was a secret co-owner despite Tri-State's representations to the contrary before the FCC.

Kuhlman specifically criticized the testimony of the stations' former air personalities, and said they "gave material evidence that was false and/or withheld facts they knew to be important." Kuhlman ruled the personalities did not level with him when they testified that Melton was not involved in the stations' management, and he accused Stone in particular of being "disruptive to the orderly taking of evidence" because of frequent revisions in his testimony.

Stone, who admits he changed his testimony several times, insists he did not lie to the FCC. "I took an oath to tell the truth, and I told the truth," he said. "If the judge feels I colored or withheld the truth, then I'm very saddened and very disappointed."

Mueller denied charges by Judge Kuhlman that he was paid to round up witnesses and coach them to back up Melton's story. He said he testified truthfully — even if the judge didn't like his statements that Melton did not manage the station.

"Obviously what concerns me is that just because our experience didn't agree with the judge's ultimate decision, he has apparently taken this to mean that we must have been, in essence, lying," Mueller said. "Not only is this not true, it's not fair. It is particularly where they have no way of responding or proving their total innocence." Jennings told **R&R** he never received "any marching orders" from Melton, and can't understand

unfair to make a casual judgment

about someone like that, in a forum

from Melton, and can't understand why the judge would accuse him of lying. He denied the judge's finding that his testimony was coached by anyone.

Payola Reference Called A Smear

The air personalities also said they were upset about one other matter — the judge's revelation that the combo was being investigated for drugola and payola in the early '70s. They deny any involvement in such activities, and point out the allegations were made prior to their employment at the stations. While the judge's opinion did not specifically accuse them of such activities, the air talents say being named elsewhere in the same ruling has smeared their reputations.

"I have never been questioned by anybody, be it government employee, reporter, or anyone else about anything to do with payola, plugola, or drugola," said Jennings. "I've never been asked about my own activities or my knowledge of anyone else's activities. I'm not telling you that I'm a saint, but I certainly have never had any involvement in that, and I would be happy to take a polygraph test to that effect if necessary."

Barry Leverant, a Phoenix attorney and spokesman for Tri-State, was unavailable for comment on the matter but the firm's Washington counsel told R&R an appeal of the ruling is likely.

Texas Station's Frequency Fight Continues

KBEC/Waxahachle, TX owners Richard and Faye Tuck filed an application to shift their AM daytime station from 1390 kHz to 770 kHz In 1981. After a five-year, \$100,000 battle with three other applicants, KBEC was awarded the frequency on the basis of its proposal to become Waxahachie's first fulltime broadcast facility; the other applicants proposed to serve the communities of Garland and Plano. All three communities lie outside Dallas, and Plano and Garland are closer than Waxahachie to the city.

On appeal an FCC Review Board ruled that none of the three applicants was entitled to a preference because Waxahachie, Plano, and Garland are part of the greater Dallas area, which is served by numerous broadcast stations. However, the board ruled that even without the preference KBEC was the best-qualified applicant for the 770 kHz frequency.

The competing applicants appealed that decision to the Commission. While the appeal was pending, KBEC took advantage of a new FCC rule that allows certain daytimers to broadcast at night at 65 watts. As a result of that move the FCC is now considering whether KBEC should retain the preference it won for planning to provide the first fulltime service to Waxahachie. At 1390 kHz with 65 watts. KBEC covers a population of about 24,000 at night. If it were to move to 770 kHz and increase its power to 1 kw as planned, KBEC would reach over close to 500,000 people.

The administrative law judge will be considering which, if any, of the applicants should receive a preference in the licensing procedure. The judge will also examine KBEC's nighttime service to determine exactly what area is served by the station at 65 watts. Participants in the proceeding say there is no way of knowing how long it might be before the 770 kHz frequency has a permanent occupant. But Richard Tuck says he will pursue the matter to the end.

NEW/S BRIEFS

Jackson Set For NABOB Conference

The Rev. Jesse Jackson will deliver the keynote address at next week's National Association of Black-Owned Broadcasters management conference in Washington, DC. The civil rights leader and former Presidential candidate will speak to the group on Wednesday (9/14), the first day of the three-day event. Black broadcaster Bertram Lee, who owns Boston-based Albimar Communications, served as Co-National Finance Chairman in Jackson's campaign for the Democratic Presidential nomination.

NABOB officials expect between 50-100 station owners and managers to attend the conference, which focuses on management and business Issues. The NABOB gathering will overlap the first two days of the National Association of Broadcasters' "Radio '88" convention, which is also being held in Washington.

'Ultimate Radio' Born Boasts Host Of Technical Features

prototype radio of the future developed under the

guidance of the NAB is set to debut at Radio '88. The "Ultimate Radio," as NAB has dubbed the receiver, includes a host of technical features the group would like to see included in new radios.

"Ultimate Radio was born out of concern that receiver makers weren't creating high quality receivers, especially for AM," said NAB Executive VP John Abel. "There was also a concern that listeners and broadcasters didn't believe AM could sound as good as FM."

According to NAB officials, the Ultimate Radio is the first receiver designed to incorporate the NRSC (National Radio Systems Committee) standard, a set of transmitter and receiver guidelines devised by NAB and EIA (Electronic Industries Assoc.) with the goal of

improving sound quality and reducing interference on the AM band. The radio also features an antenna capable of tuning out interference from such sources as fluorescent lights, a tuner capable of reception in the soon-to-beopened 1605 kHz to 1705 kHz stretch of the AM band and, of course, AM stereo.

SESSIONS SUMMARY

Radio '88: Old Faves And New Material

t the heart of the Radio '88 program are the 75 working sessions covering the full range of radio topics – from programming to finance to legislative and technical matters. Some of the sessions are updated repeats of programs that proved popular at past conventions, while others are brand new presentations developed to address pressing new issues and questions confronting the radio industry.

NAB officials are particularly excited about the following sessions. Because schedules are subject to change, refer to your convention program or NAB's daily convention newsletter to determine the time and place for sessions and events.

• Guerrilla Warfare: Tricks of the Trade — Does your competition have a spy on your staff? Is someone picking through your trash looking for station secrets? Maybe. This session will tell you how to uncover such "dirty tricks" and put a stop to them.

Your guides into this shadowy world of industrial espionage will be programmers who know how such games are played and have agreed to talk only on the condition that their identities be concealed. They will address the audience from behind opaque screens, their voices modified electronically.

• The Power Of Sound — This presentation by Andrew Goodman of the American Comedy Network serves as a reminder of the emotional and persuasive powers of that basic radio ingredient sound. Goodman has presented this program across the country to rave reviews. Those who have seen it say it should not to be missed.

• Entrepreneurship: The Good, The Bad, The Ugly — So you think you want to own a station, eh? Well, here's your chance to find out what ownership is really like from people who have experienced radio entrepreneurship firsthand. Participants include Emmis Broad-



casting's Jeff Smulyan, Barnstable Broadcasting's Al Kaneb, and KNIC/Lamar, CO owner Clara Oxley.

• Jokes, Trick Phone Calls, And Libel — Does your pulse quicken every time one of your jocks starts to dial a number on the studio phone? Maybe it should. Radio stations are more and more frequently being sued as the result of telephone-related comedy bits. NAB Asst. General Counsel Steve Bookshester will lead a panel of legal experts in a discussion of the legal limits of telephone jokes and pranks.

• Making The Most Of A Group Operation — Top executives from the nation's largest and hottest radio groups discuss how to maximize a multistation operation. Here's your chance to hear the distilled wisdom of Emmis Broadcasting founder Jeff Smulyan, Noble Broadcast Group's Norm Feuer, Genesis Broadcasting's Marty Greenberg, and Mel Karmazin of Infinity Broadcasting.

• Formula For Buying And Selling Stations – Broker Gary Stevens will moderate this panel discussion of how to bring about the successful purchase or sale of a radio station. Panelists include Bishop Cheen of Paul Kagan Media Appraisals, Tom Buono of Broadcast Investment Analysts, and Susan Ness of American Security Bank.

• Background Vs. Foreground Radio – A point/counterpoint discussion of the merits and drawbacks of two distinctly different types of radio. Which works best? Steve Goldstein of Saga Communications moderates the debate between Evergreen Media's Buzz Bennett and Great Empire Research Co.'s Barry Gaston.

• What America Thinks About AM Radio – Does AM radio still have a place in the hearts and lives of the American people? Find out when Bill Moyes of the Research Group presents the results of a new NAB survey of public attitudes toward AM radio.

In order to protect NAB's neutrality in the battle over a single AM stereo standard, three Ultimate Radio prototypes were built. All three radios are identical, except that one is equipped with Motorola's C-Quam system, another works with Kahn, and the third is compatible with either system.

On the FM side, the Ultimate Radio prototype is designed to include FMX, a technology that allows FM stations to regain much of the coverage area they lose by broadcasting in stereo. A station broadcasting an FMX signal to FMXequipped receivers can increase its stereo coverage area by as much 2.4 times. FMX also reduces multipath interference, which occurs when a station's signal bounces off objects such as mountains and buildings before reaching a listener's receiver. Because of difficulties in obtaining necessary parts, the prototype on display at Radio '88 may not actually be equipped with FMX circuitry.

The Ultimate Radio also features such bells and whistles as digital tuning, memory, and continuous band tuning, which allows the listener to tune directly from the top of the AM band (1705 kHz) to the bottom of the FM band (88 MHz). NAB believes a similar receiver could be mass-produced at a cost to the manufacturer of about \$50 each.

Comparative Renewal, Fairness Doctrine Top Pending Issues

B roadcasters visiting Washington have a lot to talk to their lawmakers about. Several key issues affecting the radio industry are bubbling on Capitol Hill. A few conversational icebreakers include:

• Comparative renewal: Amidst allegations that license challengers use FCC procedures to "shake down" broadcasters for cash settlements, the FCC has committed itself to reforming the entire licensing process. Many broadcasters are calling for radio-only legislation that would further simplify the process and erect new barriers to challengers. But public interest groups and liberal Democrats have opposed such measures.

• Fairness Doctrine: With the FCC's repeal of the Doctrine still a sore point with key Democratic lawmakers, expect this issue to become the main rallying point for industry opponents in the next Congress — especially if Michael Dukakis is elected President. Some broadcasters are hinting the Doctrine should be used as a bargaining chip for license renewal reform, but others insist no compromise is possible because First Amendment protections are at stake.

• indecency: Sen. Jesse Helms (R-NC) has successfully sponsored an amendment to an appropriations bill that requires the FCC to enforce its indecency policy around the clock. While his measure suffered a setback recently when a federal appeals court ordered the FCC to reconsider its "safe harbor" time periods, the House will consider the proposal when it attempts to reconcile differences in the appropriations bill.

• Antitrafficking: Despite an initial defeat, Senate Commerce Committee Chairman Ernest Holl-Ings (D-SC) continues with his plans to slap a four percent tax on stations that change hands within three years to help bankroll public broadcasting. While no action is expected this year, it may become a top-burner legislative item in the next Congress.

• Advertising restrictions: Discussion continues in Congress about eliminating tax deductions for advertising expenses, and the talk may get more serious in the next session because of the huge federal budget deficits. Another issue is the NAB's fight to remove restrictions on lottery advertising.

Top radio engineers tell what's wrong with Century 21 GOLDDISCS.

Recent published remarks by top radio engineers illustrate a major problem with Century 21 compact discs. It's the old 'garbage in, garbage out' theory from the computer industry. That is, if you take the same old oldies from vinyl (with compression, dynamic noise filtering, and electronic 'depopping') and just transfer them over to digital, they still sound the same: muddy and compressed with the absence of real dynamic range. Consider these quotes:*

> "We have some Century 21 discs and when I listened at home, I thought my processing had gone out the window. I took the CD into the studio and found the piano was distorted on the disc... It's the same old problem. It's a matter of who's mastering — it doesn't make any difference what the medium is." — Dave McKenzie.

CHR

Washington sports two CHR stations, Emmis's WAVA at 105.1 and Cap Cities/ABC's WRQX (107.3). WAVA is home to morning zookeepers Don Geronimo and Mike O'Meara, who square off each morning against Q107's Marc Ross and his zoo-like Q Crew.

Urban

The nation's capital has four spirited and aggressive Urban stations. NBC's WKYS (93.9) and Howard University-owned WHUR (96.3) are longtime powerhouses in the market, but relative newcomers WDJY (100.1), a United Broadcasting property, and Cook Inlet's CHR/Urban hybrid WPGC-AM & FM (1580/95.5) have both succeeded in carving out very significant audiences for themselves.

Country

Country combo WMZQ-AM & FM (1390/98.7) took the Arbitron ratings crown this spring with a combined 7.3 share of the 12+ audience. One big reason for the station's success is the morning team of Jim London and Mary Ball. Mary is a finalist in this year's CMA Personality of the Year competition. Jim won that honor in 1983.

AOR

WWDC-FM (101.1) is the place for rock in Washington. Mornings start with a jolt at DC101 courtesy of creative and controversial shock jock Doug "The Greaseman" Tracht. The station is owned by Capital Broadcasting.

AC

Looking for light rock, less talk? Try CBS-owned WLTT (94.7) or Outlet's WASH-FM (97.1)

Full-Service AC WMAL (630) offers a folksy, comfortable blend of news, information, and music served up by long-established personalities. Morning men Frank Harden and Jackson Weaver have dominated the morning ratings for 27 years. WMAL is a Cap Cities/ABC station.

For years broadcasters have said Washington needs an FM station "just like WMAL." Well, that's what former WMAL talent Tom Gauger is attempting to build in his new job as PD of Almic Broadcasting's WMMJ (102.3)

NAC

One year ago, WBMW (106.7) set Washington abuzz by adopting an NAC format under the guidance of then-PD John Sebastian. The station has struggled, but Infinity Broadcasting President Mel Karmazin said recently that he's not ready to give up on the format

Classic Rock

Legacy Broadcasting's WCXR (105.9) has market exclusivity in this format. Is it going to rain today? Listen to Harris in the Morning for the definitive word from Cindy the Weather Dog. Laugh if you want, but she's only been wrong 13 times in the past ten months!

Gold

Ragan Henry's WXTR (104.1) pumps out the hits of yesteryear. Radio veteran Bill Bailey hosts the morning show

News/Talk

Outlet's WTOP (1500) is Washington's all-News source. If it's talk you crave, tune in Greater Media's WWRC (980). The station features local talk during the day and NBC's "Talknet" at night.

Classical

WGMS-AM & FM (570/103.5) pioneered the notion of showcasing personalities in Classical radio. Morning man Dennis Owens and afternoon host Renee Chaney ease their listeners to and from work with light classics and soothing tidbits of highbrow wit and wisdom. RKO recently received approval to sell WGMS to a Washington group called Classical Acquisition Partners.

LOBBYING TIPS

Take A Congressman To Lunch

he location of NAB's Radio '88 convention gives broadcasters a splendid opportunity to lobby their elected representatives on issues of concern to the industry. Capitol Hill lawmakers grow tired of hearing lobbying pitches from well-oiled trade organizations, but tend to greet visiting constituents with open arms – even if they're carrying the same message. Politicians tend to pay more attention to grassroots pressure from the voters back home than they ever do to professional lobbying campaigns.

In the real world of Washington politics, visits from hometown broadcasters are especially welcome because of their prominence in the community - and the opportunities they provide for favorable media exposure.

Some quick tips for effective amateur lobbying:

· Call ahead, don't just drop by. The Capitol switchboard can connect you with any members of Congress or their staffs. Dial (202) 224-3121. If the legislator is not available for a meeting, a senior staffer almost always is - and the staffers often have tremendous influence. Make sure you're expected and connected before walking through the door.

• After initial pleasantries, get to the point quickly. While many broadcasters may question what their elected representatives do to justify their salaries, the truth is that most lawmakers put in long days and are deluged with requests for their time. Brevity is a key to success for citizen lobbyists. By the way, don't remind lawmakers about your campaign contributions (or lack thereof) - they already know the score.

· Provide facts, not political opinions. Washington is an ideological fantasyland that feeds on itself, with competing interests constantly grinding their political axes. Legislators crave hard, straightforward information about how federal policies really affect the folks back home. Visiting constituents can help lawmakers gain perspective on the real-world impact of their actions, especially by providing concrete examples in their hometowns.

• Don't violate FCC ex parte rules. Those rules forbid participants in Commission proceedings to have contact with officials who could influence the outcome of the proceeding - and that includes congressmen. FCC General Counsel Diane Killory says it's all right to lobby on pending legislation or broad policy issues such as the Fairness Doctrine, but don't ask a lawmaker to lean on the Commission about a personal matter such as a CP application or rulemaking action.

While a congressman can ask the FCC for a "status check" of those proceedings, he can't grease the wheels for you. The penalty for violations of the rules can be severe. The FCC recently yanked a new FM application after a licensee lobbied lawmakers on behalf of AM daytimers - and mentioned its pending FM application, too.

During the past five years, the number of traditional temps those assigned by employment agencies to work for client firms has risen from 400,000 to more than

Why Some **Managers Fail**

hen analyzing executive failure, it's tempting to use 20/20 hindsight. However, according to a recent survey conducted by the Center for Creative Leadership, there are five major reasons for executive failure:

• Incompatibility with coworkers. The lack of good interpersonal relationships - especially with subordinates - was one of the most frequently cited factors.

· Inability to adapt. Too many managers operate under strategies that were successful in the past, but have become non-productive in a different time or environment.

• Inaction. The fear of failure prevents some executives from making any moves at all.


• Inability to face failure. Some managers - especially those who've experienced early successes - tend to hide their failure rather than rebound from it.

In addition, the government uses more than 300,000 temps annually, mostly in postal positions.

If current trends continue, the number of temporary workers will increase by more than 80% before the year 2000, as opposed to the 19% growth rate for the overall labor force.

Two reasons for the growing popularity of temps: they generally receive less compensation than permanent employees, and get little or no company benefits. They are also hired for limited amounts of time. All this can add up to huge cost savings for the employer which, of course, is a negative for the temporary employee.

On the positive side, however, temp work gives people a chance to get a foot in the door and become familiar with a corporation (many companies give hiring preference to temps already working there.) Also, some businesses have started to extend benefits and work incentives to temps, thereby increasing morale and productivity.

E-Mail Links Corporations Worldwide

s big business becomes bigger, so too grows the need for a cost-efficient and speedy system of communication. Keeping in line with a move that has saved major corporations such as IBM an estimated \$150 million a year, more and more companies are turning to electronic mail ("e-mail") as a link to the rest of the business world.

Although the system grew slowly during the past decade, e-mail which transmits paperless messages and documents faster than mail and less expensively than long-distance phone calls jumped from five million to six million users in the past year alone, according to a recent article published in the Washington-based Trend Letter.

At least one billion electronic messages were transmitted in the US last year - and industry analysts predict there may be as many as 30 million users by the mid-1990s, with a whopping 60 billion messages sent by the turn of this century

Transmitted over subscriber networks, e-mail allows the user to send memos, letters, graphics, and even complete spreadsheets from personal computer to personal computer anywhere in the world with the push of a key. For instance, a typed document of 2500 characters can be relayed halfway around the world in 20 minutes or less. Naturally, this isn't good news

for overnight courier businesses, at least 25% of which could eventually be replaced by the e-mail system.

There are at least 80 public networks currently vying for a piece of the \$415 million e-mail market, a figure that is predicted to reach \$1.2 billion by 1992. This incredible growth is encouraging a host of companies to market new e-mail products and related services, with compatibility - that is, allowing communication between companies with different e-mail networks the newest trend in the market.



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SELLING STYLES FOR THE '90s, PART II

Closing & Attack Platforms: What To Look For In The Next Decade

ast week we looked at the dramatic evolution of selling styles. This week we'll cover the changes – and outline future trends – in two other areas of the selling cycle: closing and the attack platform.

Closing: The '60s-'80s

Closing in the 1960s was marked by the "alternative choice" approach. The salesperson would always give prospects two viable choices – such as between 30- or 60-second commercials, whether a male or female should cut the spot, and whether it should run the entire week or just Wednesday through Saturday. This method left the decision-making process wide open (maybe too wide open).

The 'Balance Sheet' Approach

The "balance sheet" approach was popular during the '70s. An AE would approach a prospect, having already drawn up a list of the positives (and negatives) of purchasing the salesperson's product. The AE could then sit back and let the account stumble through the conversation, trying to ascertain the negatives.

Closing in the '80s has, for the most part, been reduced to pure and simple math. There are two reasons for this trend: the ever-expanding use of computers (which can quickly calculate and analyze a myriad of numbers against varying quotients), and increasing media and advertising choices.

Unfortunately, many salespeople rely too heavily on numbers and statistics, and haven't developed other important closing skills. While understanding concepts is top of the mind, too many AEs cannot effectively *express* those concepts.

The 1990s: The Prospectus Generation

The "Prospectus Generation" is already here. And although efficiencies will always play an important role in sales, the '90s will see more emphasis placed on the potential results rather than pure math. A successful close in the next decade will be based on giving potential advertisers either estimated results, or actual performance.

For example, there are already a number of national and international agencies that have "performance" written into their contracts. Many of these contracts look like report cards, with evaluations based on actual increases in sales, not efficiencies.

The Evolution Of Attack Platforms

The predominant attack platform of the 1960s can be summed up in one word: print. Salespeople were taught effective methods of increasing new business by attacking the print advertiser ("cut an inch off here and there, and invest the difference on my station"). When this tactic did not work as well as anticipated, a new approach was needed.

That new approach was co-op. In the '70s, the discovery of co-op — and its money-making potential was virtually a religious experience for salespeople. GSMs redirected and reeducated their staffs to tap the co-op goldmine.

The Vendor Decade

In the beginning of this decade, sales trends indicated vendor would be even bigger than co-op, and the "millions" of untapped coop dollars would become "billions" of untapped vendor dollars. While it has proven to be the most successful of all attack platforms, many stations that initiated vendor programs have abolished the day-today efforts of cultivating manufacturers' dollars.

ness appear to be the most likely candidates.

The second approach is to employ alternate platforms on each call; sales staffs adopting this philosophy should become the success stories of the '90s. The alternate platform theory can be used on every call - retail, agency, distributor, manufacturer, or corporate. If more platforms are used, the closing ratio will be higher. This method will ultimately generate more new business for the salesperson.

A good business maxim to keep in mind is this: while technologies change, basic sales premises don't, and therein lies the reason for much of the trendiness – and lack of success – stations encounter when cultivating new business.





"Carmate," manufactured by the Fremont, CA-based Bondwell Industrial Co. Inc., is a two-piece telephone-like unit that mounts on the console of any automobile. It combines three products in one: a digital clock, electronic thermometer, and movement detection displays.



Computer Cleans Up Sloppy Handwriting

Unit Recognizes Individual's Writing Style

ave you ever tried to read a physician's handwriting? Most doctors scribble and scrawl a prescription so that it ends up looking like a foreign language. But a new computer could help pharmacists (or anyone, for that matter) decipher sloppy penmanship.

The "Write Top" – a nine-pound portable computer developed by the Reston, VA-based Linus Technologies, Inc. – can be "trained" to recognize an individual's handwriting. A person writes each letter of the alphabet onto the Write Top's glass-plate screen, using a special electronic pen. Once the sample is stored, the machine will recognize and understand what's written by that person.

The \$3600, IBM-compatible unit interprets handwriting samples by converting them into ASCII code, a standard system used by all small computers. The information can then be stored, printed, or transferred to other computers.

210 ORIGINAL THEMES Production Music CD Library Available

he Toronto-based Sound Ideas firm recently unveiled a 25-volume, compact disc version of the company's production music library. Each of the 210 original themes is accompanied by a 30-second and a 60-second bed as well as an alternate mix or rhythm track (when appropriate), making for 716 music tracks in all. The firm plans to update the library annually as well.

Orban Intros Latest Programmable Microphone Processor

esigned for either microphone or line-level uses where the ability to store and recall processing can increase efficiency, the San Francisco-based Orban Associates Inc. has unveiled the model "787A" programmable microphone processor.

Especially useful in on-air production, the 787A enables announcers to get more out of their microphones through its three-band "constant Q" parametric equalizer and compressor with adjustable release time. Also available from Orban is the "787A/SL" model, an optional sec-

Software That Speaks In Tongues

omputer software has taken a step closer to its creator with the advent of "Monologue," a program designed to read aloud converted text in an effort to exorcise the misspellings that bedevil proofreaders.

The Seal Beach, CA-based CSSL Inc. firm developed Monologue to verbally point out inputted errors when checked against original reports, thereby keeping a modified playlist's "Debbies" from becoming "Doobies." The mouthy program won't correct misspellings, however, depending instead on its human partner to do some work.

Retail priced at \$189, the IBM PC-compatible program features a synthesized voice that can be tuned according to the user's speed, pitch, tone, and volume.

Super VHS Makes American Debut

The problem with taping TV shows on a VCR home unit is the tape never turns out looking as good as the original program. This is because current VCR machines toss out as much as 30% of the information contained in a broadcast signal.

But now there's good news for home tapers: the arrival of Super VHS. Introduced in Japan last year, the recording system is finally becoming widely available on our shores.

Until now, a conventional VCR could handle approximately three megahertz (three million cycles per second), even though each television channel is assigned a frequency bandwidth of six megahertz — of which 4.2 are used to transmit the actual signal. With Super VHS, however, the machine has an internal bandwidth of 5.5 megahertz, nearly twice that of the conventional VCR and more than enough to handle an entire broadcast signal.

This process could have been achieved sooner, but existing videocassettes couldn't accommodate the extra megahertz. Instead of phasing out standard tapes, the VCR industry tried to develop a magnetic tape that could pack more bandwidth onto the same space. Finally, a chemist at 3M came up with a new type of ferric oxide containing smaller particles, allowing more information to be stored on a tape.

Unfortunately, many Americans' TV sets cannot adequately reproduce the clarity and high quality of Super VHS recordings. To fully appreciate the new system's scope, it's necessary to view it on a TV that keeps the brightness and hue components of the signal separate. Still, even with your old set, you'll get a much better picture from Super VHS tape than an ordinary VHS or Beta cassette – and the Super VHS machine can still play your old tape collection.





You can create your own news by seeking listener input, as USA Today does by regularly putting questions to its readers. Passing along the results of these polls is news, and compels the audience to listen for the outcome.

Combining the promotional tools provided by **Reebok** with trade-out merchandise and services from long-standing promotional relationships has enabled several stations in medium-sized markets to create exceptional **Human Rights Now!** Tour promotions.

In Orlando, WDIZ has focused its efforts on the Paris, France concert date. Not only will the station send four of its listeners on an all-expense-paid trip to the "City of Lights," but it's taking its full morning crew as well to produce a live remote from the French capital.

According to WDIZ program director Rad Messick, the Human Rights Now! Tour couldn't have been better timed. "Throughout 1988 we've been sponsoring the ' 'DIZ World Tour' -



sending listeners on all-expense-paid trips to concerts around the world," he said. "We've positioned the Paris as part of our World Tour not only because of the quality concert entertainment experience it offers, but because of the importance of the whole human rights issue attached to the Tour."

During the past month, the station has run special bits of french sounds ranging from the national anthem to the voice of cartoon character Pepe Le Pew six times each day.

Upon hearing the spots, listeners would call in to qualify for the trips to Paris, Tour merchandise and Reebok shoes.

n what turned out to be a world premiere, Z100/NY leaked the new Bon Jovi single, "Bad Medicine," at 3pm on Labor Day (9/5). What's unusual is that the leak was promoted in advance as "another major artist from the station that world-premiered Michael Jackson's 'I Just Can't Stop Loving You,' and Bruce Springsteen's 'Brilliant Disguise.' " Z100 got a cease-and-desist order the next day, but the record leaked elsewhere as well and wound up getting rush-released by Mercury.

Lee Michaels is no longer PD at WBMX/Chicago. Meanwhile, GM Kernie Anderson has exited 'BMX for GM duties at WIZF/Cincinnati.

With **Buckley** buying NY institution **WOR**, industry speculation centers on the fate of the **John Gambling** father-and-son morning dynasty.

Big D Rumor Roundup

KZEW/Dallas PD **John Roberts** has tendered his resignation from the AOR that just turned Classic Rock (see Page 3), and ST's ear-to-the-saddle-sores has Roberts either going up the block to join crosstown CHR **Y95** as part of its programming department or taking the **WYSP/Philly** PD post.

If Roberts joins Y95, that would allow PD Buzz Bennett to put more energy into his national programming duties for Evergreen Media (which also owns WLUP-AM & FM/ Chicago and WAPE-AM & FM/Jacksonville).

In any event, look for Evergreen owner Scott Ginsburg to announce some new properties shortly. He's currently working on seven deals, all in Top 20 markets. Although this is the last of Wagontrain's stations, the company still owns **Drake-Chenault Enterprises.**

After nearly ten years of programming AC **WMGK/Philadelphia**, PD **Bob Craig** is leaving. GM **Larry Wexler** seeks T&Rs, but Craig will remain on the J-O-B until a replacement is found.







"He's an extremely intelligent guy, his market knowledge is real valuable, and he has a positive, winning attitude. I wanted to find someone coming off a positive experience who can translate those good feelings and energies into a winning situation in Los Angeles."

Asked about a much-rumored change in the station's direction, Seraphin said, "We've commissioned a major research project which will be presented to us at the NAB conference. I want to reserve some specifics in terms of what we're going to do until we've taken a look at what the latest market research shows. We want to be a rock 'n' roll station that can appeal to adults, and I think there's a hole in this market for that type of approach right now. To a certain extent we've accomplished some of that already."

Kelly was Asst. PD at KLOS/ Los Angeles before joining Transtar a year ago. He remarked, "I really feel very confident in what we're going to put together here. CBS was looking for somebody with multi-format experience. I think there are maybe five different positions or avenues we can pursue in this market, and obviously we're going to take the best one available to us and run with it."

Kelly declined to be more specific about the station's direction, adding, "Everybody in our industry, myself included, always looks for a way to pigeonhole a format so we can all understand it. Well, the reality is maybe it's not going to be a traditional format. I'm not sure a traditional format is going to work in this market."



KMLE Goes Country

Regarding Freeman's appointment at KMLE, which Clark earlier said will go Country around October 1, Clark commented, "J.D. has a solid background in programming and sales and a thorough knowledge of this very competitive market. But above all he was hired for the leadership qualities he brings to this situation. He's a bright, articulate, incisive guy who understands the nuances of this market and can put together a strong team and a good radio station."

Freeman, a 14-year veteran of the Phoenix market, said his first priority was to "hire the best PD I can find." Commenting on the impending battle with market leader and longtime Country powerhouse KNIX, Freeman said, "Having programmed three different formats in this market, I understand the evolution of this market. I've seen the rise of KNIX and watched how they met the opportunities presented them. "It's not our intention to go headto-head with KNIX," he continued. "Phoenix is big enough to support two Country stations. This is one of the best Country markets in America. I think we'll see the (Country) share grow here."

Freeman has been GSM at Beautiful Music KMEO for the last two years. He spent 1982-86 with Edens Broadcasting in Phoenix in a variety of capacities. Originally joining as OM of Eden's Easy Listening KQYT, he later became OM of Full Service AC sister KOY. He rejoined KQYT as GSM two years later.

Ironically, Freeman's first job in Phoenix radio was at KNIX, where he was hired 14 years ago to do afternoon drive by PD (now KNIX General Program Manager) Larry Daniels.

Prior to joining WFOX four years ago, Esserman spent six years as GSM at crosstown AOR WKLS.

WFOX ranked 11th 12+ in the spring Arbitron (4.8) and placed fifth 18-49. Birch figures for the corresponding period (3.3 12+) positioned the station 12th.

market," he explained. "KQRS positions itself as 'the home of rock 'n' roll,' and we're about to serve an eviction notice. That station is extremely vulnerable. This is the first time in this market that (KQRS PD) Dave Hamilton has ever had a direct challenge, and I think he ought to take notice, because it's here now." Rohm was GSM at KQRS before crossing the street last year.

Rohm described Davis as "a formatic technician who comes to us with a game plan. The guy had terrific success in Dubuque and has 'winner' stamped all over him. I've never seen a successful major market PD who hasn't slugged his way through the woods on the way up. This is Wes's opportunity, and he's poised and ready for it."

Although Davis has spent the last three years programming AC, he has prior AOR experience, including two years as APD of then-AOR WYFE/Rockford. He told R&R, "KJJO has had a very heavy teen orientation. We're going to try to solidify the 18-24s and begin looking toward that 25-34 demo. Right now what we're hearing from a lot of folks - other than our obvious core - is that we're too heavy for them. We're trying to make it a little more palatable for them so that, when they do cume in, maybe they'll stay around a little bit longer."

Felix labelled KJJO's new sound as "straight-ahead, more mainstream rock 'n' roll. We're still rocking pretty darn hard, but we've cleaned it up a little bit. It's not quite as unfamiliar as it was. We're trying to get a few more listeners over the age of 21."

Both KJJO and KQRS simulcast with sister AMs. The KJJO combo had a 5.3 in the spring **Arbitron**, 8.5 in **Birch**. The KQRS combo scored 11.6 in both surveys.

Show Listeners The Real You

Creating Positioning Lines That Truly Fit Station Image

It's amazing how many radio stations sound good on the air but fail to give listeners a concrete idea of what the stations are really all about. In the struggle to come up with creative positioning lines, stations drown in a sea of verbiage that may sound great to other broadcasters but flies over the heads of most average listeners.

An example is the billboard that reads "Adult Contemporary Radio For Adult Contemporary (town)." This column will examine strategies for communicating effectively about your station — not to the radio literati of your area, but to that most basic of common denominators: the average listener.

1. Say What You Mean

It's amazing how many stations discover a key audience word in their market research, then attempt to skirt around it as they create a positioning line.

The story comes to mind of a large station that adopted an Oldies format but found only average numbers and average success. Interestingly, though, it resisted calling itself "oldies" and danced around the term with every broadcast euphemism you could imagine. Finally, after 18 months of frustration, it bit the bullet and actually began using that dreaded word on the air. Lo and behold, its cume immediately shot up and stayed at that advanced level.

Does that mean thousands of new listeners instantly discovered this station because it began using the word "oldies?" Not at all. What it means is that oldies was a word the listeners could identify with and relate to. It was something around which they could describe listening to that par-

ticular radio station. And it gave the facility a handle. Anytime a station can do that for its listeners, the likelihood of greater reported listening increases significantly.

So the next time you're thinking about using cliche broadcaster terms like "monster" or "gold," remember the best way to position your station is by using a word listeners can relate to.

Postscript: the station in this example has now added "classic" to its slogan, implying that it not only has an oldies heritage, but also plays the very best.

2. Use Listener Words

The radio graveyard is littered with stations that attempted to position themselves based on the idea that they knew more than the listeners. Terms such as Album Rock, Contemporary Hit Radio, Adult Contemporary, and Beautiful Music come from broad-

casters' vocabulary. Words like rock, rock 'n' roll, Top 40, Easy Listening, mellow, variety, and mix all come from listeners.

Wise is the radio station that listens to its own research and translates its self-vision into something that correlates with words listeners are using. While this may come as a shock to some, there's absolutely nothing wrong with labeling your station as Top 40 - ifthat's what the majority of listeners think of it as. Also, contrary to what some misguided souls have said, Hot Hits is not burned out. It's still a viable slogan that works because listeners understand it and can relate to it.

3. Why We Make Mistakes

Given the growing caliber of talent available in American radio, how can such gross miscommunication mistakes be made? The answer is simple. Although many broadcasters

claim to know their audiences, they really don't; they see listeners as an extension of themselves. Once you've been a broadcaster for a month, a week, or even an hour, the odds are you never will listen to radio like John Q. Public does. You'll listen for the length of the stopset, the promo, and the crossplug coming out of the break. In short,

- Don't rely on opinions from your own social circle
- Stick with slogan themes for at least a year

you'll listen for all sorts of things the typical listener never pays any attention to.

Therefore, don't pin your hopes on how you think your station sounds. Owner/operators, GMs, and PDs are particularly susceptible to the delusion that they still have the "common touch."

Also, realize the people you hang out with all become second-line critics to a certain extent because they know what business you're in. These people include spouses, social friends and, worst of all, business acquaintances.

This is illustrated in the tale of a GM who attended a social function where a dozen people told him what a great new slogan he had developed for his station. He was beaming ear-to-ear. believing he was hearing the reactions of regular, everyday people. In reality, however, they were regular, everyday people who happened to be acquaintances of a radio station GM. This makes them considerably different from the vast majority of people who don't know a station GM and would never take the time to seek him out.

4. Evaluate Your Slogans

Your on-air slogans should revolve around several discrete criteria:

• Does the slogan clearly communicate a station/listener benefit?

• Is it specific?

• Does it give your station a handle?


• Does it accurately depict the station's sound and can the station back up its claims?

For example, "The Only Station That Plays Ten In A Row" is correct in design but will backfire if your program staff doesn't religiously adhere to it. The same is true for "Number One For Music And Fun." Some stations using that slogan quite frankly have no business doing so because they're not that much fun. Unaware as he may be, the average listener won't take long to figure out you're not what you say you are. Ultimately, that's the kiss of death.

The key to all station slogans: once you've made the choice, stay with it. Don't continue to bombard the listener with one slogan after another. Develop two or three basic themes and stick with them for at least a year. Remember, about the time your station staff is absolutely sick to death of hearing a slogan, somebody out there in the listening world might just be beginning to have the vaguest idea of what you're talking about.

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ON THE RECORDS

Secret Pasts Of The Stars

Enough time has elapsed, and enough new hits, comebacks, and new artists have emerged, that it's time to bring back an old On The Records topic favorite. Longburied past musical artifacts from current stars are exhumed and exposed to public scrutiny.

When I say "favorite," I mean a favorite of mine, because I get to use "big art" (a technical publishing term meaning "sizable pictorial displays") and write less (a technical publishing term meaning "write less"). It's also fun to dig up these examples of early efforts and see them in print.

Feat In The Factory

The return of Little Feat, to the top of the AOR chart no less, allows me to dredge up a couple of obscurities. The late Lowell George, founder member and guiding spirit of the group, participated earlier (around 1967) in the Factory, whose first single (also the fifth release for the fledgling Uni label) is pictured. An odd country-flavored march (or so my notes describe it), it never really got off the assembly line.


The Turquoise single shown next to the Factory, I was informed some years back by some doubtless unimpeachable source I can't recall, features Little Feat keyboardist Bill Payne. This fuzztoned psychedelic relic was part of a briefly burgeoning Oxnard/Santa Barbara, CA '60s scene that included artists as disparate as the Strawberry Alarm Clock and the legendary Hot Poop (more desperate than disparate), whose mixedgender members exchanged genitalia for the cover shot of their one rather-difficult-to-find LP

The Roots Of Jazz Before Johnny Hates Jazz, there were solo singles by the trio's lead singer, Clark Datchler, on longtime UK label presence RAK Records. INXS Baggage

I don't have any pre-INXS recordings by any of the band's members, although there may be some strewn in the more INXSible nooks and crannies of Melbourne. I do, however, have a rather amusing early photo from one of their first Australian singles.

For comparison purposes, since the group's lineup has remained constant from the beginning, I've showcased a shot from a 12-inch this year. Success has done wonders for them.

Covers Keep Coming

It never fails that any time I survey the contemporary state of cover versions, as I did August 12, a whole new raft of them emerge just after we go to press. Phil Collins's Mindbenders cover revives one of the songs deemed most likely never to be reanimated, on the sound linguistic grounds that no one in the '80s could take a song constructed around the term "groovy" with any degree of seriousness. I have a feeling Mr. Collins will be proving the linguists wrong.

Kylie Minogue is trying for the third hit on "The Loco-Motion" (her spelling; Little Eva and Grand Funk made one word out of it). Shriekback brings back KC & The Sunshine Band's first hit "Get Down Tonight." Sammy Johns is back with a new version of his biggest hit, "Chevy Van." And, in one of the more unusual self-covers, Darlene Love, who sang lead on the Crystals' 1963 hit "He's Sure The Boy I Love," is back on Columbia (which also put a Ronnie Spector record out last year and is apparently going for a monopoly on former Phil Spector vocalists) with a grown-up version renamed "He's Sure The Man I Love."

Girls Named Sam Dept: This may not be the most culturally significant trend uncovered this year, but it's odd to have three female vocalists by name of Sam on the scene. Sam(antha) Fox started the craze, followed just now by Sam Phillips (who was formerly Contemporary Christian star Leslie Phillips) and any day now by British singer Sam Brown, whose A&M LP is just out. Not since the never-to-be-forgotten era of Sammi Smith and Sami Jo has this phenomenon been quite so inescapable. We lack just one more to complete a Grand S(l)am.

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

"And What Does A Newsman Do?"

We who are frontline troopers in the Radio Wars (not merely Radio National Guard members) are sometimes asked by civilians, "Does a newsman do anything besides talking on mike?" We newspeople give straight, polite answers — but I often wonder what civilians *speculate* newsmen do.

Sometimes the Devil tries to make me tell a civilian that, well, there I was, driving to meet the governor for another exclusive interview, when one of the fax machines in the mobile news unit suddenly signalled an incoming message and hardcopied me an AP bulletin. I pulled into a no parking zone and radioed the control room to put me on the air.

The deejay had stepped out of the room and was unavailable to throw a switch, so I hit "Emergency Override," suppressed the studio output, and broadcast direct to our transmitter via microwave, putting the bulletin on the air live.

At the governor's mansion, I parked in one of our reserved slots and set the cellular telephone to Automatic Call Forwarding, so calls would ring on my handheld. The fax also forwards to my beltclip microfax, just in case of anything BIG.

The Chief Executive had little to contribute. He wanted more hints on running the state. I made a couple of suggestions, then left as he got on the phone to relay instructions to his secret contact in the Eastern Establishment. As I walked out through the lobby, I encountered a secretary (voluptuous; are there any other kind in stories?) who kept saying how macho my voice is.

Another call came through as I walked out toward the car. The network again, entreating me to come to the Big Apple to supervise the expansion of the news division.

My attention wandered during the net president's pitch, because an interesting satellite picture was coming across the wrist TV. Action! It appeared that I would have to have one of our choppers come pick me up from the capitol grounds and ferry me to one of our news planes.



Weekend programming used to be so easy. Twofers, threefers, fourplays, block parties, all-requests, A-to-Zs, no-repeats — just rotate evenly and serve. Sunday nights belonged to the syndicators. Sprinkle in a locally-produced jazz, oldies, or specialty show — run a couple of promos —

and watch the ratings soar.

Okay, perhaps it's never really been that simple. But the fact remains that multi-hour umbrella features have been AOR staples for well over a decade. The crucial question is whether the old warhorses of weekend programming still work. Does the audience still get off on "back-to-back blocks from all your favorites?" The PDs I spoke with provided an intriguing contrast of opinions.

Former WPYX/Albany OM Ed Levine, who was just about to take the KLOL/Houston PD job when contacted, believes the standard features 'PYX ran for years are no longer effective. After experiencing "disastrous" weekend numbers last fall in an otherwise excellent book, Levine decided to trash the umbrella features the station had been using virtually every weekend.

Adults Prefer Regular Programming

"We felt that if our programming was strong enough during the week to give us the kind of meganumbers we had, it should be strong enough on the weekends," Levine explains. "Almost 60% of our audience is over 25, and we position ourselves as an adult radio station. When you look at some of the great adult stations in America, very few do anything special on the weekends. So I think that for this particular station it's better to do the occasional weekend special, but nothing more than that."

A perceptual study backed up Levine's belief that 'FYX's 25+ audience prefers the station's regular programming. More important, the station's weekend numbers were up almost two points in the last book.

WTUE/Dayton PD Tom Carroll started cutting back on weekend features at the beginning of the year. "We used to do a special every weekend, and it really wasn't helping us that much," he explains. "It got to the point where we were forced to come up with something new every week, like an 'all-Canadian rock weekend.""

Like Levine, Carroll has changed his thinking on weekend programming. "You get a lot of core listeners during the weekend who might not necessarily get to hear you during the week. I thought, 'Why should we spend all this time "If our programming is strong enough during the week to give us the kind of mega-numbers we have, it should be strong enough on the weekends."

getting our weekly programming up to snuff only to screw off on the weekends playing the last cut on side two of every **Bob Dylan** record?' "

Since weekend specials were deemphasized, ratings are up. Carroll isn't certain there's a direct correlation, but reasons, "When you do a Pink Floyd weekend, you blow off everybody who doesn't like Pink Floyd. You can find yourself segmenting your audience. I would much rather have a great event on the weekend than contrived programming."

Save for a monthly no-repeat weekend to highlight variety, KRNA/Cedar Rapids sounds essentially the same on Saturday and Sunday as it does during the work week. PD Mark Vos says it's been that way for years.

"We haven't run a block party since 1983," Vos says. "I thought they were pretty tired then. I think the weekend is the perfect time to display what you do best, especially to those 25-pluses who are working and don't necessarily catch you all the time during the week. We're proud of our format."

Listening to Levine, Carrol, and Vos, you might get the idea that weekend specials are becoming a thing of the past. However, there are still plenty of successful AORs relying on familiar features to help boost weekend numbers.

All Specials, All The Time One of those is WLLZ/Detroit, which has been doing block parties virtually every weekend for over two years. As a matter of fact, PD Doug Podell reports the demand became so great he moved the start time of the blocks up twice; the "party" now kicks off Friday at 1pm.

"Our plan was to rest them a bit in the summer, so we went to every other weekend," Podell says. "However, we went down a couple of tenths. I know that could have been due to anything, really – but I'm not going to take any chances." Blocks will once again become an every-week deal at WLLZ.

WDIZ/Orlando's Rad Messick is another PD who runs specials every weekend. He still does a lot of the basics: A-to-Z Sundays, album sides, and classic cuts. Block par-

Jock Takes Cops For A Ride

The Portage, Pennsylvania police force was down in the dumps — literally — until a sympathetic morning jock came to the rescue.

When the only patrol car in the depressed mining town of 3500 broke down, police were forced to cruise the streets in a dump truck. The 1984 Diplomat they had been using was on its last legs, and there was no money available to cop a replacement. Local car dealerships refused to lease a car to the force for insurance reasons.

The town, halfway between Pittsburgh and Harrisburg, soon became the brunt of jokes. One caller to the police station reportedly said, "We've had a break-in. Could you come over and investigate and, on your way, can you bring a load of topsoil?" Ironically, help came from across the border. Upon hearing of the Portage police plight, CHTZ-FM/St. Catherine, Ontario morning man Scruff Connors sprung to action. He took to the airwaves and streets in an effort to raise \$15,000 for a new cruiser. Picnics, barbecues, and car washes were organized. Listeners dropped by the station with donations.

Two weeks after launching the fundraising campaign, Connors drove to Portage and personally presented the police with a new car. The monumental event was, of course, broadcast live on CHTZ-FM.

ties and "Psychedelic Psundays" are each scheduled once a month.

In addition, Messick tries to "come up with thematic weekends that actually hold a concept, rather than just doing blocks. We try to showcase one individual item so it continues to carry through." For example, when the new Van Halen album arrived, every hour 'DIZ played a track and gave away a copy.

Tying in promotions and prizes with the music continues to be an extremely popular weekend tactic, even among those stations avoiding umbrella-type features. Featuring an artist who's coming to town while blowing out concert tickets and CDs remains a favorite technique.

KRQR/San Francisco does a special just about every other weekend, according to PD Chris Miller. The ubiquitous block party is called a "menage a trois," and is rotated with no-repeats, artist features, and the like.

"Those are our staples, and we really don't vary a lot from them," Continued on Page 64

Miller says. "The same things continue to work. A lot of it has to do with how the station packages it. Just because you say it's special doesn't mean people are going to flock to it. It's got to be programmed well and executed well.

Miller's point - which was echoed by the other FDs - is well taken. It's easy to fall into the trap of merely announcing, "Hey, it's another fabulous block party weekend" and cranking up the computer to spit out blocks.

All-Request Yields Success

Faced with soft weekend numbers, KOME/San Jose PD Ron Nenni resolved to go after the active 18-24 audience last spring by determining its favorite special and doing it every week.

"Because there's so much AOR competition in the Bay Area - a lot of the same special programming you have to strive to be different," Nenni says. "You have to find out what specials the audience responds to best."

Nenni decided to try continuous all-request weekends, and the results were impressive: the 12+rose almost 30%.

"On the weekends the 25-44s are listening to their CDs, doing things with their young families, and taking part in the events the area offers," Nenni reasons. "And that's great, because we promote all that stuff on the radio. I believe in tak-

ing advantage of the most active listener, especially when there aren't that many people listening on the weekend.

Unlike stations that say "allrequest" but feature few if any actual requests other than those that happen to be prescheduled, KOME leaves four open slots an hour for jocks to plug in listener suggestions. Nenni says if you're going to allow jocks to play real requests, it's helpful to have a master list of secondary cuts from which they can choose

"You have to make sure your jocks are using good judgment in playing those requests," Nenni says. "And when creating clocks, you certainly want to surround the open cuts with hit material." Nenni says the use of the actual requests helps spruce up the song list while luring the actives he's seeking.

KOME's request weekends will continue through at least the fall because, Nenni says, "The buzz is there." But he feels it will eventually burn. To keep it as fresh as possible, the station is expanding the request concept by narrowing a particular weekend's musical focus. For example, KOME tied into a blues festival by asking for and featuring requested blues rock. The same can be done with "best of the '70s," British rock, etc.

Another way KOME is enhancing the request special involves taking the faxed request idea one step further. "Work-force blocks" were solicited Monday through Sunday.

Specials' Worth Depends On Competition

Significantly, the three stations that don't use frequent features (WPYX, WTUE, KRNA) have

more in common than weekend policies. They represent the three smallest markets of the seven stations analyzed here, are double-figure dominant, and have no significant in-market AOR competition. In contrast, WDIZ, KRQR, WLLZ, and KOME each have at least one in-format rival.

Conclusion: If your main music competitors are CHRs, it could make more sense to take advantage of your market exclusivity seven days a week, rather than fool around with specials that may narrow your station's appeal. On the other hand, if you're not so lucky as to have things to yourself, such specials may still be effective in solidifying your actives and distinguishing your station from other AORs in the market.

Regardless of how often they use weekend specials, all the PDs interviewed here rely in varying degrees on both syndicated and locally-produced specialty shows. Vos is the least likely to air them - only two oldies shows are on KRNA's current schedule. The others reserve a good portion of Sunday night for any one of a number of classic-oriented shows, new music shows, countdowns, concerts, and the like. Sunday morning jazz shows are also popular.

Levine specifically promotes the Sunday 6pm-midnight lineup as the "Sunday Night Specials." He made a good point about the effective use of your own air time to let the audience know about weekend specials. "I think one of the big mistakes stations - including my own have made is not prepromoting these things enough. If you watch a sports show on TV, they're already promoting on Saturday what's coming up next weekend. Starting your promotion on Wednesday is simply not enough time."

Some other interesting observations/ideas that came up in conversation: Carroll, while eschewing regular weekend specials, does believe in allowing his jocks more freedom than they have during the week. Messick has seen his weekend numbers consistently dip in the winter, a fact he attributes to particularly high football usage leading up to the Super Bowl. And Podell, who says he's far more selective of the syndicated shows he runs than he used to be, thinks there may be room for some "AOR rock 'n' roll talk, such as open phone lines, politics, sports something in that vein."

WUSL: 'Bastion Of Consistency'

One of the major spring '88 Arbitron UC success stories is WUSL (Power 99)/Philadelphia, which ranked number one with an 8.2 12+ (up from 7.1). WUSL President/GM Bruce Holberg and PD Dave Allan shared their ideas on the how they got to the top and what they're doing to stay there.

"Five-and-a-half years of programming and marketing consistency is one of the reasons we did so well this book," Holberg said. "We don't change our story from month to month. In a market that's seen three format changes since November '87, we've been a bastion of consistency. Over time, that pays off."

Philadelphia radio has always been known for its listener loyalty - provided the audience decides a station is worthy. Holberg said, "The high standards of our airstaff have become a tradition at Power 99; people have come to expect excellence. (Morning team) Carter & Sanborn are following in the tradition of people like Tony Gray, Fred Buggs, and Jeff Wyatt, who all did good jobs when they were here. I'd also like to add that PD Dave Allan is terrific; he's a hardworking and perceptive programmer."

Success Right On Schedule WUSL adopted the UC format in October 1982, pioneering the "Power" tag. Allan assumed the programming chores in September 1987, three days before the fall '87 ARB sweep began.

"At that time Bruce, consultant Don Kelly, and I laid out some goals for the station," Allan recall-

ed. "The main thing we talked about was pulling above an eight share and being the number one station in the spring '88 book. These things don't always work out as planned, but this one came through for us.

"One of the other goals we had was to change what was then a young adult/teen station into one the whole family could listen to. We've now evolved into just that, and the current book is the best ever for the station. In the major demos, we were not only number one 12+ but also number two 18-34 and number three 25-54.

"Every shift was up in the ratings. Jo-Jo Davis, who does 6-10pm, was number one again with the highest numbers of any shift in the market. We've had to replace people in every shift except Jo-Jo's. Brian Carter from B104/ Baltimore and Dave Sanborn from K94/Norfolk are our new morning team. Lisa Fairfax, who does middays, came from WEGX, the Top 40 here. John 'Big John' Monds (2-6pm) came from WQHT (Hot-103)/New York. Frank Cerami does the 'Saturday Night Dance Party,' which is also number one in the ratings. On Sunday nights we have the 'Quiet Storm,' which is also number one. This book is a major accomplishment for our entire team."


Power Max Pays Off

During the spring '88 sweep, Power 99 ran the "Power Max" promotion originated by Wyatt and Kelly that first aired on KPWR (Power 106)/Los Angeles. Triggered by a key song, the "Power Play Of The Day," listeners call in and choose whether to keep \$99 cash or go up against Power Max, a Max Headroom-type character. Power Max can give them bigger cash amounts or prizes — or zap them with a tunafish sandwich or dirty socks.

"The contest was created for people who don't play contests," Allan said. "It gets the passive listener to listen and react. We gave away \$40,000, spread among a lot of listeners, and a Mercedes.

The two biggest cash prizes were for \$10,000 and \$5000, and there were about 20 \$1000 prizes. The rest of the winners took the \$99. During the last couple of weeks, when people were aware that the Mercedes hadn't been awarded yet, the phones were ringing off the hook, It really got kind of crazy around here, but it all worked well for the audience and for us."

A Community Mainstay

Discussing WUSL's image further, Holberg said, "A major area of expansion this year was the business we hadn't been getting from the black advertising agencies. There was a misconception about the station and its dedication to the community. People now see that we have a strong commitment and view us as a viable way of reaching the black community. They may not have seen this before, even though our numbers have been terrific for a long time."

As for community service, Holberg said, "We're now running a 'Crack Hotline.' In four days we've received 300 phone calls from listeners giving details on the locations and operations of crack houses in Philadelphia. We relay that info and follow up on the air to report when the houses get shut down.

"We're also doing a fund drive in cooperation with the *Philadelphia Daily News* for a six-year-old who was shot and paralyzed in a drugrelated incident. Just this week the total is \$13,000.

"We've been much more active than in the past. This has helped us for all the right reasons when it comes to our community image, our advertisers, and our fellow citizens."

Facts And Figures

Sparked by morning legends J.P. McCarthy, Bob Steele, and Wayne Perkey, Full-Service powerhouses WJR/Detroit, WTIC-AM/Hartford, and WHAS/Louisville continue to post staggering numbers.

Among 35-64 adults, McCarthy posts a near-20 share 35-64 - more than two and a half times that of his nearest challenger. Steele's stats are as strong as his name - more than three times that of his runner-up. Perkey is in the same neighborhood as Steele, hovering around a 30 share - a full 10 shares ahead

of the second place finisher. Thirty-four signals penetrate and register ratings in Detroit; 20 in Hartford; and 17 in Louisville.

Here's a quick review of how the three stations performed for the total week 6am-midnight, according to the spring, '88 Arbitron surveys. A station's Time Spent Listening (TSL) is listed in minutes per day.

When Bruce arrived WHAS was nailing down 15 shares (12+), but not long ago the station had an extremely upper-end demo appeal.

For example, our traffic plane has to be covering all parts of greater Hartford. If I don't pay attention to that, someone else may beef up their traffic coverage. Also, our music has to be on target."



Determining it was a scheduling problem, Marks has turned it into a major station promotion.

The first thing he did was talk an auto dealer into donating a white 1977 Ford LTD – "a real boat," according to Marks – to the cause.

Dubbed the "Bama Beater," the car is a "rolling petition" to which thousands of fans have affixed their signatures. Said Marks, "The petition is designed to let Alabama know in a positive way that even though they've played here every year the last few years people still want Utah to be included as a concert stop."

But the fun doesn't stop there. KKAT morning man Jay Byrd will soon slide behind the wheel of the "Bama Beater" and take off for L.A., arriving in time to present the "petition" to the group prior to its September 23 concert.

MCA's 'Mystery' Marketing Plan

On the heels of its successful "Swing For A Million" spring marketing campaign, MCA/Nashville has embarked on a new fall promotion: "The Clue Is In The Music." Involving both radio and retail, the contest revolves around a murder-mystery theme, with the national grand prize winner copping a role in a "Murder She Wrote" episode with Angela Lansbury.

MCA will support the campaign with national and local print and TV ads, as well as a video and accompanying literature outlining the plan. The label is also offering product discounts, extended dating, and a retail display contest as incentives. MCA/Nashville Executive VP/GM Bruce Hinton remarked, "This campaign not only has a lot of sizzle, but it's also designed to drive consumers straight to the country music bins to look at our artists' newest releases. This translates to increased sales for our artists and a big fall for MCA/Nashville."

Artists featured in the promotion are Patty Loveless, Waylon Jennings, the Oak Ridge Boys, the Desert Rose Band, the Bellamy Brothers, John Anderson, Lee Greenwood, Conway Twitty & Loretta Lynn, Glen Campbell, and Ethel & the Shameless Hussies. Also included: the "Country & Eastern" compilation LP (R&R, 9/2) plus eight new "Budget" compilations.

Jennings's radio spots will give clues to the listeners, who can hear the answers in MCA artists' songs played on participating stations. Each station will host a "Murder Mystery Party" for 50 to 100 winning listeners; that's when a grand prize "weekend" winner will be selected.

Meanwhile, retail will be conducting scavenger hunts for clues in record stores during October. Consumers solving mysteries can win prizes in local drawings. Twenty-one grand prize winners (one from retail, 20 from radio) will receive weekend trips for two to a Murder Mystery Party with Waylon Jennings at Los Angeles's Universal Studios. At that time the national grand prize winner will be announced.

Also as part of the campaign, American Express will offer a \$5000 reward for the finder of a oneof-a-kind album cover – which holds all the "evidence."

Earle, Griffith Exit Nashville

Steve Earle and Nanci Griffith are moving their future recording projects to other cities. Earle will go to Uni (a division of MCA) in New York while Griffith will go to MCA/Los Angeles. Though both artists' records have sold well and won critical acclaim, they both cite the lack of Country radio airplay as the reason for the changes.

The Nashville Banner quoted Griffith as saying, "I really feel like (MCA/Nashville) did the best they could with me. But I really need to be in a different genre. Country radio just does not like Nanci Griffith."

Nashville Notes

• Lane Brody and Thom Bresh will headline a Nashville Network special, "Miss USA/USO Show," with current Miss USA Courtney Gibbs (9/16, 10pm ET/9pm CT). Viewers will travel along with Brody and Bresh as they visit American military bases in Ger-

many, Turkey, Italy, and Greece. During the recent Travis Pickin' Festival in Mountain View, AR, Bresh announced he was the illegitimate son of the late Merle Travis. Bresh stated, "There were two men in my life: my dad, Bud Bresh, and my father, Merle Travis," adding that he had waited until after the elder Bresh's death in '87 to reveal his real father. It was Travis's desire that Bresh continue to perform at the Pickin' Festival following the former's

own death.

• This is going to sound like deja vu but like fellow CBS group Shenandoah (R&R, 9/2), the Charlie Daniels Band narrowly escaped harm from fire in its rented Winnebago. Passing motorists spotted smoke billowing from the vehicle and flagged down the band near Ventura, CA. Daniels and the band exited just as the motor home exploded. Uninjured, the group was rescued by the CDB crew bus and whisked on to the next concert.

•615 artist Bobbi Lace was injured in a one-car accident August 27 near Knoxville, TN in which a member of her band was killed. Lace was moved to a hospital in Florida near her family.

• Singer/songwriter Nat Stuckey died August 25 of lung cancer in Nashville. Stuckey not only wrote hit songs for himself, but for Buck Owens, Ray Price, Jim Ed Brown, and Loretta Lynn. Originally from Texas, Stuckey's latest success was as the jingle singer of Budweiser's Spuds McKenzie/"Buzzard Gulch" TV ad.

• Keith Whitley's hometown of Sandy Hook, KY named a street in his honor. Whitley kicked off his current tour with a concert for the folks at home.

• Gumbo Records has been formed in Shreveport by Maggie Warwick. The first single is by her, called "Warm Your Heart" and written by Atlantic President Ahmet Ertegun. There are also new releases by Guy Coleman and Aunt Sally.

how your outlet can become one.)

Label publicists and regional promotion reps can certainly set up phone interviews and in-station visits. But due to their heavy workload, they often would rather refer stations to us. Since a reliable publicist is on top of his client's every move, we're excellent contacts for stations that want telephone interviews, recorded liners, guest DJ spots, artist-involved contests, bios, autographed pictures, and Tshirts. When you know a particular artist is coming to your town, it's generally easy to find the publicist involved by calling the promoter and asking him to look it up in the contract rider. Many publicists list their companies in the rider as easy reference for promoters and press representatives. You can also call the CMA for information. (You may also clip the country artist directory on Page 70 — Ed.)

National Press

Publicists are also the people who arrange for artists to appear on national syndicated and network radio programs. Labels do this as well. However, since the indie press agent is often the "clearinghouse" for all media commitments, I've found that record label PR heads are often glad we're here to work with the national shows.

Publicists *publicize* what already exists in the artist's career. But we also create situations that will direct the spotlight on our client. If an act happens to sit in with a radio personality, we try to arrange a photo of them together in the studio for the trades.

Here's another example of creating press coverage: I asked Kenny Rogers to throw a birthday cake in Larry Gatlin's face after he surprised Larry backstage with the cake and a birthday song. Kenny accomplished this with much aplomb, and I had an Associated Press photographer stashed among the onlookers. As a result, a three-picture sequence featuring that horseplay soon went out on the AP international wire.

The publicist's job is all this – and more. As publicists for country entertainers, we're keenly aware of radio's importance. We come up with special promotions, often working with the label, because we know that AP news photos, appearances on "David Letterman," and coverage in *People* magazine are a direct result of radio airplay. Please call on us. We're here to make your job easier.



PHIL COLLINS's 19-3 leap with a remake of the Mindbender's '66 smash was the big news on the British chart, as top seeds YAZZ & THE PLASTIC POPULATION and BROTHER BEYOND remained rooted in the one and two positions, respectively. WOMACK & WO-MACK made a respectable jump to fourth place, BOMB THE BASS's double A-side single hit fifth, and YELLO raced into 6.

The HOLLIES' '69 hit "He Ain't Heavy" - reissued to celebrate the band's 25th anniversary and the

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song's use in a commercial debuted at 9, while BILL MEDLEY's "Rambo" version of the same tune topped the Moving Up list. Although things were pretty solid at the top of the Australian chart, second-place finisher 1927 made

big gains on longtime front-runner JOHN FARNHAM. JIMMY BARNES improved to fifth, the CHANTOOZIES advanced to sixth, and the HIPPOS kept steady at 7. BIG PIG wallowed back to 8 in front of new appearances from CROWD-ED HOUSE's second charting track and a new one from DARYL BRAITHWAITE. Most Added honors went to the GO-BETWEENS.

FROZEN GHOST pushed into fourth place on the Canadian listing. as its top three acts also remained unchanged. CANDI held on to fifth, COLIN JAMES moved into 7, and ROMAN GREY stayed at 8. BLVD. (at 9) and LIBERTY SILVER (at 10) notched charting debuts. MYLES GOODWYN led a handful of Top Adds that included IAN THOMAS and COREY HART's follow-up to his six-week chart-topping "In Your Soul.
