Entercom Tops Off In Seattle; Enters KC In \$190 Mil. Swap

Bonneville gets KLDE/Houston + \$5 million

n a deal valued at about \$190 million, Entercom will get seven stations - three in Seattle and four in Kansas City for its KLDE-FM/Houston in a trade with Bonneville International. Entercom will also pay Bonneville \$5 million. Bonneville will give up KNWX-AM & KIRO-AM & FM/ Seattle and KMBZ-AM, KCMO-AM & FM & KLTH-FM/ Kansas City. Subject to approval by the Department of Justice and the FCC, the transaction will put Entercom - which already owns KBSG-AM & FM, KISW-FM, KMTT-FM & KNDD-FM/Seattle - at its ownership limit in that market, with eight outlets total and five on the FM band.

Although it sounds like Bonneville is giving up a lot for one station, the company says it's the right move for the future.

Heftel's Hefty Sum: \$112 Mil. For KSCA

The first big deal of 1997 was born this week when Heftel Broadcasting Corp. acquired an option to buy KSCA-FM/Los Angeles. The option, which cost Heftel \$10 million, allows it to buy the stat on from Golden West Broadcasters for an additional \$102.5 million.

Heftel has said it will flip KSCA from Adult Alternative to Span-- a move many industry ish onlookers say is smart, giver

that L.A.'s population is about 37% Hispanic. The groups will enter into an LMA after they receive Hart-Scott-Rodino approval from the Federal Trade Commission.

"We are excited to strengthen our commitment to the Spanish-speaking residents of Los Angeles," said Heftel President/ CEO Lowry Mays. "This, combined with the anticipated merger with Tichenor Media System

R&R EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW The ABCs Of Tom Joyner

Tom .lovner is truly an air talent: No radio personality has logged so many frequent-flyer miles by simply commuting to work every day.

But the "Fly Jock"'s now-legendary KKDA-FM/Dallas to WGCI-FM/Chicago daily jaunts are a thing of the past.

Joyner now radiates his upbeat humor on the "Tom Joyner Morning Show" via the ABC Radio Networks, beaming into such locales as Miami, Atlanta, and Washington, DC - where he recently defeated longtime local rival Donnie Simpson and rocketed WHUR-FM to top Urban status.

Celebrating his show's third anniversary this month, Joyner is an air veteran who's also logged time on WLOK-AM/Memphis, KWK-AM/St. Louis, and WBMX-FM/Chicago. In this exclusive interview, the "Hardest Working Man in Radio" - along



with ABC colleague/Urban Format Manager Steve Harris --- shares his thoughts about the show's successful "fun factor," what a typical workday entails, and staking out his next challenge as the Nassau Shuttle Jock.

R&R: When you first started in radio, did you have any idea you'd end up being a nationally known morning show host?

Tom Joyner: I'd like to say I've got a psychic gift ... then I could go on TV, get one of those hotline numbers, and start making some real money. But no ... to be honest, no.

R&R: What is it like doing a nationally syndicated show?

TJ: It's not really difficult because the audience is basically the same all over the country. The African-American audience, which we focus on, is the same from Philadelphia to Miami, from

It's A Done Deal: Westinghouse/CBS **Closes On Infinity**

It's official: Westinghouse Electric Corp. and Infinity Broadcasting are one. Broadcasting's new big bear ended 1996 with a bang on New Year's Eve, settling on its \$4.9 billion merger that symbolizes the new, golden age of radio.

The combination of CBS and Infinity properties gives the new company 79 stations in 17 markets. "With total revenues of approximately \$1 billion." Westinghouse reported, it's "the largest radio group in the world.'

The closing in Pittsburgh came a brisk five days after the deal. received final and unanimous


Toppled Tower Darkens Oldies' Lang Syne



S purred by across-the-board, double-digit increases in national billings, radio industry revenues in November '96 were 12% higher than the previous November, according to the RAB. The year-to-date numbers have radio ahead of 1995 by 7% overall (+7% local/+8% national).

RAB President/CEO Gary Fries called the figures "a clear indication of sponsors' growing confidence in radio and the success the medium is having in attracting advertising dollars away from other media.

Broadcasters Receive Break On EAS Installation

While the FCC declined to give broadcasters a 90-day grace period to complete installation of new Emergency Alert System (EAS) equipment, the **National Association of Broadcasters** (NAB) is happy with the Commission's response to lobbying groups' request to give broadcasters a break.

"They understand there will be a break-in process," NAB Deputy General Counsel **Barry Umansky** told **R&R** Tuesday (1/7). He said replacing the Emergency Broadcast System (EBS) with the new technology will "take an effort of working together."

The Commission said it will consider equipment shipping delays and "other extenuating circumstances" in situations where broadcasters failed to have the new Emergency Alert System (EAS) by the original January 1, 1997 deadline. Umansky characterized this as "a positive response" to NAB's December 18 written request for a 90-day suspension of the January 1 deadline for stations to have EAS installed, or get additional installation information, or for an insight into possible inspection and enforcement plans.

'Technical Violation'

In a Dec. 19 response to the NAB, the FCC said "broadcasters who do not have EAS equipment" by the deadline "will technically be in violation." But there could be exceptions to that, according to FCC Compliance & Information Bureau Deputy Chief Arlan Van Doorn.

If, in the event of a station inspection, a station has not yet installed EAS gear but has ordered EAS equipment (and has supportive records) with the expectation of a January 1 delivery, then the station may not be in violation. Van Doorn notes, "It is extremely unlikely that we would devote scarce prosecutorial resources to enforcement actions against broadcasters who appear to be making a good faith effort to comply."

But Van Doorn warned the NAB that broadcasters couldn't pull the wool over the Commission's eyes when it comes to using shipping delays as an excuse for not complying with the law.

"Waiting until December 31, 1996 to order equipment to meet a January 1, 1997 [deadline], doesn't look like good faith," Van Doorn added.

Umansky told **R&R** that a number of broadcasters had delayed ordering equipment because they were waiting for their states to finalize statewide emergency broadcast plans.

"The industry as a whole is trying hard to comply with the program and does a lion's share of emergency alerting." He noted that EBS to EAS will be discussed in several sessions at the NAB's annual convention April 5-10 in Las Vegas.

Dingell Questions Commission Jurisdiction On Alcohol Advertising

It was only a matter of time before Rep. John Dingell (D-MI) dipped his fingers into this pot. The ranking Commerce Committee member late last week asked FCC Chairman Reed Hundt why he thinks the Commission has the right to regulate alcohol advertising.

Dingell believes the FCC does not have authority in this issue and indicated he is irked by Hundt's recent threats against broadcasters who air liquor advertising. In his January 2 letter, Dingell stressed that the only reason the FCC has power is because Congress gave it that power.

He added, "Congress has never given the Commission the ability to censor specific programming or advertising; to prohibit or limit broadcasters' ability to air commercial advertising; or to prohibit or limit particular advertising of products or services legally sold in interstate commerce. It is unclear that Congress could give the Commission the ability to do any of those things in a manner consistent with the First Amendment."

Questions Posed

Dingell made it clear that if any agency has jurisdiction in this issue, it is the **Federal Trade Commission**. And he reminded Hundt that he does not have the unanimous support of his fellow commissioners in his battle.

All four FCC commissioners were asked to respond to Dingell's letter by January 31. Among Dingell's questions for the quartet:

 "Where in the Communications Act has the Commission been given the ability to censor specific programming or advertising?

• "What legal authority does the Commission have to assert it can render expert judgment on the effects of advertised products on segments of society, to be the evaluator of claims of the harmfulness of lawfully sold products, or to ban or limit advertising of those products?

• "Do you believe it is appropriate, consistent with the First Amendment, for the Commission or any commissioner to suggest, intimate, or threaten that a broadcast license may be denied, conditioned, limited, or not renewed on the basis of the content or otherwise lawful advertising aired or not aired by a licensee or applicant?"

Meanwhile, an aide to Rep. Joe Kennedy (D-MA) said it is likely a rejuvenated version of a bill he brought to the floor last year would be introduced. The bill, "Children's Protection from Alcohol Advertising Act of 1996," would forbid any alcohol advertising on radio from 7am to 10pm.

Cox Wins DOJ Clearance In Florida

Cox Radio Inc. (Nasdaq: CXR) has received the Department of Justice's blessing on its acquisition of seven Orlando stations.

Cox is acquiring WDBO-AM, WZKD-AM, WCFB-FM & WWKA-FM/ Orlando from NewCity Communications, which it agreed to purchase in May 1996 for \$250 million. Cox is also getting WHOO-AM, WHTQ-FM & WMMO-FM/Orlando from Infinity Broadcasting in exchange for its WCKG-FM & WYSY-FM/Chicago.

The FCC recently agreed to permit Infinity to transfer its Orlando stations to a trust to allow the CBS/Westinghouse merger to be completed without violating ownership rules. The deals are expected to close in the first half of this year.

Financial Update: Jacor, ARS Raise Cash

J acor Communications Inc. (Nasdaq: JCOR) has filed with the SEC to raise up to \$250 million by selling "debt securities, convertible debt or equity securities, common stock, and/or preferred stock."

The company said the proceeds will be used for general corporate purposes and noted it may use underwriters to sell the securities.

American Radio Systems Corp. (Nasdaq: AMRD) said it hopes to raise about \$150 million through an institutional private placement of its exchangeable preferred stock. Completion of the offering is expected later this month. The company said the proceeds will be used to repay debt and to acquire more properties.

In other financial news, **Prudential Securities** has dropped its coverage of **Children's Broadcasting Corp.** (Nasdaq: AAHS).

Chancellor's \$200 Million Stock Offer

n two private offerings of \$100 million each, Chancellor Broadcasting Corp. (Nasdaq: CBCA) said it plans to raise funds to consummate its previously announced purchases of eight stations from OmniAmerica Group and 12 outlets from Colfax Communications.

Chancellor will offer \$100 million in a new class of convertible preferred stock, which will be convertible into shares of Chancellor's Class A common stock at a price to be determined.

The company is also offering \$100 million in a new class of its exchangeable preferred stock due 2009.

A new \$475 million line of credit will also help in the purchase of the new stations and the refinancing of old debt.

Evergreen Completes Stock Redemption

Evergreen Media Corp. (Nasdaq: EVGM) has completed redemption of its outstanding \$3.00 convertible exchangeable preferred stock. The **Bank of New York** said 1,608,297 of the shares were converted into 5,025,916 shares of Evergreen's Class A common stock at a rate of 3.125 common shares per share of preferred stock owned. Another 1703 shares of preferred stock were redeemed at \$57.20 per share. The group said there are 39,038,848 shares of Class A common stock outstanding.

SFX Closes On Delsener/Slater, WYSR

SFX Broadcasting Inc. (Nasdaq: SFXBA) has completed its \$24 million purchase of privately held concert promoter **Delsener/Slater En**terprises Inc.

Under the terms of the agreement, SFX paid \$20 million in cash and will pay an additional \$4 million in future payments. SFX said the cash was raised through existing company reserves and by borrowing on its \$225 million credit line.

SFX has also closed its \$1 million purchase of WYSR-FM/Albany from Jarad Broadcasting Company of New York Inc. The deal gives SFX its fifth property in Albany, coupling it with WTRY-AM, WGNA-AM & FM & WPYX-FM. The station will adopt its former calls, WTRY-FM, bring back its Oldies format, and simulcast with its AM sister. WYSR-FM currently broadcasts Classic Rock.

Metro Wraps Up TWI, Airborne Buys

Metro Networks (Nasdaq: MTNT) has completed its \$3.7 million acquisition of TWI Networks Inc. and its \$1.5 million purchase of Airborne Traffic Network Inc.

TWI provides traffic and news to 77 radio stations and four television stations in Cincinnati, Dayton, Memphis, Miami, Nashville, and Columbus, OH. Airborne provides traffic services to 16 radio stations in Kansas City and Omaha.


Oregon Outlet Incurs Transfer Fine

KSWB-AM/Seaside, OR has been ordered by the FCC to pay \$10,000 for "willfully and repeatedly" violating the Commission's authorized transfer of control rule. The station, which was licensed to Monte Corp., was being operated under an LMA by Seaside Broadcasting. The transfer to Seaside was eventually granted on October 5, 1995. But the FCC says that date was six months after Seaside had actually assumed full control of the station.

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

Hays said WAZU will remain jockless for the time being, with an "inyour-face" attitude aimed at competitor WBZX-FM. When asked how Active Rock will fare on a signal that covers the market's rural southeastern areas, Hays responded, "All those farm kids will have to learn to like Slayer and Green Day 'cause that's what they're going to get. If we could get a share off of [WBZX], that would be a great start.



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

Overcoming The 15 Biggest Mistakes That Managers Make

ne of the easiest ways to manage without making mistakes is to do nothing. Then, one could gather, nothing would go wrong. The other side of the argument then could be nothing went right because nothing happened.

It's certainly clear that in this era of "consolidation," those who will survive the cut will be the doers. They'll be the ones who take chanc-- and maybe make some mistakes - but, of course, they'll have more successes than mistakes.

To reduce your potential errors, here's a list of the 15 most common mistakes that managers make - and how to correct them - which will give you a leg up on the competition:

Mistake No. 1

Failure to hold people accountable for their actions. Of paramount importance is the manager's recognition that the end result is the sum of all the parts. If each team player is held personally responsible for his or her projected contribution to the overall team, you establish the foundation for a successful profit center.

Mistake No. 2

Inability to make sound and timely decisions. Although many managers get paralyzed into inactivity by the fear of making a mistake, one needs to remember that the number of mistakes has some direct correlation to the total number of decisions made. The only way to be flawless is to not make any decisions.

Mistake No. 3

Being unwilling to delegate. Managers aren't judged for the work they do, but for the results achieved under their supervision. In order to achieve great results, work and autonomy need to be delegated. For the manager to do the job himself or herself - because that way it'll be done the right way - is simply inefficient in the long run.

Mistake No. 4

Expecting subordinates to be as committed to excellence as the manager was when he or she was in those positions. You're a manager now because of how well you did when you were in your last position. If everyone was as committed as you were, the competition for your present position would be much more fierce.

Mistake No. 5

Failure to continually raise the bar. It's human nature for employees to take the path of least resistance — to do just enough to get by. If the manager fails to continually increase expectations, performance levels will never increase.

Mistake No. 6

Thinking that all people are motivated the same way (and by the same things). Just as personalities are different, so are motivations. The manager needs to determine what each person's hot button is, then keep on hitting it.

Mistake No. 7

Inability to keep morale and energy at high levels. When coming to work becomes something people look forward to doing, worker output increases. You have to set the stage for making it fun.

Mistake No. 8

Insisting that the team be "good radio people" instead of "good business people." In a world of consolidation, doing radio right is no longer enough. We can't be in radio (which just happens to be a business), it's got to be a business (which just happens to be radio).

Mistake No. 9

Willingness to settle for average performance. The best ways to keep this cancer out of your station are:

• Set a high standard of performance for your station.

• Never accept the present system or method as the best or only way.

· Encourage the team to better your system.

• Help people to set goals for themselves.

Mistake No. 10

Trying to be liked rather than respected. Although it's human nature to want to be liked - and managers are no exception — it's a waste of time when it comes to getting the job done. When you put an emphasis on friendship, you have to demand respect. If you place

Mistake No. 11 Failure to treat employees as individuals. When we treat business managers, salespeople - even air talent - as machines instead of people, we lose. Let's face it. No one wants to be treated as if he or she were a number. They want to retain their own unique, individual identity.

more emphasis on being respected,

it's easier to command respect.

Mistake No. 12

Not communicating in a specific, measurable, and time-bound fashion. Lack of communication, vague instructions, misinterpretation, etc. slows down an organization. Mistakes happen. Confusion and contradictions cause fingerpointing. When specific instructions are given - and the receiver repeats what he or she understands these instructions to be - everyone understands the expectations.

When it's measurable, the "black and white" interpretation eliminates using any shades of gray or "opinions" for evaluation.

Finally, when there's a date or time for when a project needs to be completed, everyone understands what's expected.

Mistake No. 13

Failure to keep good records. You're in a powerful position when you have notes from a meeting or a phone call, copies of memos, or historical information — it's documentable proof regarding an event that happened. Most important: The person who appears to be more organized tends to be looked upon most favorably.

Mistake No. 14

Forgetting that the management job requires getting things done through people. Most people would agree that if you catch someone a fish, you feed them a meal, but if you teach them to fish, you feed them for a lifetime. The habits and skills that you help people create as part of their culture build the long-term equity in their abilities. It's those abilities that pay off in the long run.

Mistake No. 15

Forgetting to train your replacement. At promotion time, the

most-qualified doesn't always get the job. If leaving would create a gap in your current station's management structure, no company would want the "exposure" of a radio station or department that doesn't have a leader at the helm. Therefore, you may not get the job! Most important: People at your station should always be in school for the next level above them. This creates an ongoing learning environment.

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
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

THE AGENCY POINT OF VIEW

The 'Other' Side Of Radio Sales

his interview with Kimber Sterling of Winkler Mc-Manus is another in a series designed to enlighten radio sales professionals about the "other side" of the radio selling process. It was conducted by Bryan Farrish, Publisher of the e-mail newsletter RADIO-MEDIA.

Bryan Farrish: Give us a general description of your agency.

Kimber Sterling: Winkler Mc-Manus is a full-service ad agency located in San Francisco. Our mission is to help in the branding of technology products. We number 60 people, who work on the following accounts: Sony ITA (PC by Sony, displays, peripherals), HP Supplies, Ascend (inter-networking hardware), Cybermedia (software), EI-DOs Interactive (gaming software), and others

BF: How involved are you with radio?

KS: We've done very little radio recently. We do, however, expect to do more in the next year. We've placed quite a bit of other consumer media this year (spot/network TV, outdoor, consumer print) for a number of products.

BF: Do some of your brands fit well with radio?

KS: Here's my thinking on the

radio "fit" issue. Products "fit" that: 1) Target a demographic readily reached via one or more radio formats. Example: Upscale professionals are pretty well reached via news formats during typical "drive" periods

2) Don't require visual identification/demonstration. If the product does require visuals, then radio is used as a "reminder," after the TV, print, or outdoor occurs.

3) Can be identified with unusually high product sales or opportunities within radio — which is the same as any other spot medium.

Many of our products meet these criteria to varying degrees. The Sony PC, Cybermedia, and HP could all be radio accounts. Probably not EIDOs, though, because the visuals of the game are too critical.

BF: Should radio concern it-

self with selling against other media, or against itself?

KS: Both. Most of the day-to-day dollar fights are going to be with other radio stations. Radio has little say in changing a media planner's or client's mind about broad media selections. (That is, by the time the sales rep finds out about the buy, or sees the TV ad.) But there is room for a high level radio educational effort, touting the benefits and successes of the medium (e.g., the Magazine Publishers Association's [MPA] support of magazine advertising.)

BF: What are your feelings on radio's consolidation?

KS: I'm not too concerned about it. If radio becomes too monopolistic, and if it significantly increases its rate structure, then advertisers will move to other media. The rates will then come back down. I don't think radio can price itself unreasonably high, since it would lose much of the advertising that isn't part of its core retail business.

BF: Tell us about any experiences you've had with reps.

KS: Very little, I'm almost never solicited directly by radio reps. Even when I was at Hal Riney (where I was buying a ton of radio), I was not solicited much.

BF: What is your prediction for Internet radio? Do you have any interest in learning about station web sites, banner ads, or Internet radio capabilities?

KS: Internet radio seems a long way off to me. As a consumer, I have a hard time thinking of what radio content there is out there that I want. but that I don't have access to with local stations.

And as an advertiser, I have a hard time figuring out how Internet radio will ever make sense, compared to the much lower CPMs that are available via traditional broadcast. I guess 10 or more years from now, Internet radio could compete with broadcast, if a central server were running our entire homes (our TVs, CD players, radios, etc.) But even then, what would we listen to in our cars?

Regarding web sites, I see these as being useful only if a given station has succeeded in developing a relationship with its listeners via these new channels. (I don't think that many have, however. Maybe ESPN or CNN on the TV side have.)

If it's just something the station is doing to be cool, and if it's not used much by listeners, then it's not very interesting for advertisers.

BF: Finally, what must individual stations do to increase a station's share of agency-derived sales inside of a given market?

KS: This comes down to making sure that the buyers understand the station's format, listenership, ratings, etc. Very few media planners will have much influence over a media buyer's decision to buy Station A over Station B, within a given market.

AD EXECS' ANSWERS

Why Doesn't National Radio **Get The Respect It Deserves?**

Bryan Farrish recently asked ad execs, "What is it about radio that makes it so unattractive as a national medium?" Here are selected responses:

"I wouldn't say radio is 'so unattractive' to national advertisers. There's really no question, though, that TV and print are more sexy. How often do you see an agency or creative person showing a radio 'creative reel' in a new business pitch or in their portfolios? My experience is NEVER. Radio creative is hard to do well and easy to do poorly. That does make it harder for agencies and clients to get excited about it. And it makes it a little harder for the media department to recommend it."

"National radio's problem is two-fold. From a creative standpoint, it is our only non-visual medium. We know people learn - or take in informa-- much more readily by sight than by sound. 'A picture is worth a thousand words,' as the saying goes.

"From a communications perspective, radio's fragmented audiences limit the short-term audience accumulation potential - unless big sacrifices are made in the frequency that one can achieve. Radio compares to cable in this regard, but again, without the visual. Perhaps radio owners should focus on how radio can be made to 'look' good in a copywriter's reel or portfolio.

"Anyone who thinks radio is non-visual should listen to Stan Freberg's 'Maraschino Cherry' routine. In addition to being a very clever and funny bit, it also points out how visual radio really can be."

"I would hardly call radio an 'unattractive' medium. They say a picture says a thousand words, but all it takes is a flick of the remote control, or a quick turn of the page, to miss an advertiser's message entirely. How many people honestly channel-surf while listening to the radio? And with relatively low CPPs, you can achieve much greater frequency than you ever could with TV or print.

"Also, I think it's a mistake to talk about radio in 'national' terms, when one of the key advantages of radio has always been its ability to reflect particular traits of a market."

"Radio is fragmented and fraught with unquantifiable differences. Although 10 stations may call themselves 'Urban Contemporary,' and although all of them may pull satisfactory cumes in the target demo, a spot in morning drive on each station is still running in 10 different editorial environments! Television, on the other hand, has less regional personality and less unpredictable quirkiness. 'Seinfeld' is 'Seinfeld,' whether it's in Little Rock or in Butte

"Buying radio is more challenging because it is a wild tangle of formats, ratings, rate cards, and discount structures. Radio salesmen are also more likely to cave in on their rate cards, so a buyer is always suspicious that if he'd just waited a day or two longer, he could have cut his buy's CPP by another 10% or so.

"Add it up: Confusion, contradictory format jargon, soft rate cards, etc., and it's a wonder anyone buys any radio at all. Despite all this, however, it's still more cost-efficient than television.

BF: Secondly, what must individual stations do to increase radio's total share beyond 7%?

KS: This is not a goal of advertisers. Advertisers worry about selling products and about crafting a brand image. Radio, like everything else, needs to be more accountable. Proving that radio advertising works for a broad range of advertisers, using a broad range of objectives (DR, awareness, etc.) would surely help.

Again, it's a matter of educating the buying/advertising public on the virtues of radio, a la the MPA.





Inc., will augment the company's ability to serve the Spanish-speaking population of the United States.'

Heftel already owns KTNQ-AM & KLVE-FM/Los Angeles. Radio analyst Jim Duncan told R&R the hefty price Heftel would pay for the property is not as radical as it might seem. Duncan pointed out that individual stations within mega-deals such as Westinghouse/Infinity were priced much higher. Take, for instance, the case of KRTH-FM/Los Angeles: Infinity originally paid \$116 million for the property, but Duncan estimates it went for nearly \$300 million in the recent merger.

"I don't think this particular deal is really extreme at all," Duncan said. "It's actually a very wise, strategic move. It helps them protect their cash cow, KLVE. KSCA sold for about 20 times gross revenue. To pay [\$112.5 million] for the station based on that would be irrational, but Heftel is buying the station as a protector. It's worth that much to Heftel."

Nevertheless, other industry sources are shaking their heads at the price. As one source quipped, "Well, it ain't wholesale.'

Leonard says we'll have to wait and see whether Heftel is paying too

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

PDs See Greater Variety At Most Formats

□ Programmers predict bullish future for radio as music crosses multiple formats

Ivev foresees positive results for

"Call the music whatever you want,

Greater variety at Pop and Rock and an increasingly sophisticated sound at Crossover and Urban --- that's what the tea leaves are telling some of radio's top programmers when it comes to what lies ahead. In the conclusion of this two-part series, a foursome of programming pros look back on '96 and predict how current trends might play out in the year ahead.

Musical Freshness For CHR/Pop WXKS (Kiss 108)/ Boston PD John Ivey, '96 was a year

in which alternative-slanted music from artists such as Alanis Morissette. Natalie Merchant, and **Blues Traveler** "came into prominence and helped change the face of CHR. A majority of stations had a great year because of the fresh-

ness of the music. I also liked the fact that several of these albums were deep enough to pull more than one single. It really let us differentiate Kiss from our sister station [CHR/

Rhythmic WJMN (Jam'n)]."

The net result, says lvey, is that Kiss became much more balanced musically, a trait which will carry over well into '97. "We started making adjustments at the end of '95 and it kind of evolved from there."

Pop dance records, which Ivey says "traditionally have done well" for the station, also will remain a key part of the playlist this year. As for some of the more Urban-leaning records gaining more appeal, he's letting WJMN step out on those before taking the plunge. "We put the En Vogue single on late last year, but mostly we're going to wait on those types of records. They currently don't fit on the station or meet the expectations of what our listeners expect to hear.'

As to a particular style of music that might get hot at CHR this year,

but the Wallflowers and the Counting Crows are putting out some very country-sounding records that are working well for us. And this is a market in which country traditionally has not done very well. To me it harks back to the day when CHR played Barry Manilow and Marshall Tucker. Again, it's all part of the increased variety of music at CHR today.'

One thing label promo execs will like to hear is that Ivey plans to continue staying on records longer. "Some of the most played records the biggest hits - were getting 1300-1500 plays at certain stations. It shows how long we really can stay on records. Alanis is still a top-selling artist.

That's how slow some listeners are. They don't view radio the way we do and we always have to keep that in mind. Whenever a record shows up in callout with 30-40% burn, that's still not a majority. People pulling records with 10% burn are making a huge mistake since those songs are just beginning to reach the active listener.

More Optimism

Hot AC WYXR/Philadelphia OM/PD Dave Allan agrees that '97 "should be a very good year for contemporary radio stations. Last year it was interesting to watch alternative move into the mainstream, which always bodes well for contemporary hit stations that want to play all the hits.

"It also was interesting to see what happened to dance. It really didn't lose flavor as much as it lost support. Record companies stopped putting out product when it didn't take off as well as most people thought. Dance more than anything else has a tendency to sound the same, whereas alternative never seemed to do that with our audience.

Nevertheless, Allan won't be gunshy about playing dance hits. "Like any mass-appeal station, we're still looking for the other people to start it and bring it on home before we're going to go on it."

Allan also doesn't believe the headlines proclaiming the death of Alternative, "I don't believe — like a lot of people do - that it's a waning format. It just became saturated and some of the stations will have to go away. It's a

natural progres-[CHR/ sion. Rhythmic] WQHT/New York started out as a Rap station. Now it's progressed to something much more than that when it comes to the music. The same thing could hap-

pen with Alterna-

tive. "I'm more optimistic than ever about contemporary radio. Urban's doing great and bringing along some artists that have more than one hit and have some teeth. As for Alternative, the best stations and artists will stay around while the others who aren't committed to it will go away.

As to what may break out in '97, Allan wonders if slickly produced rhythmic records might make the break. "That genre's very natural now. The music's very real. It could cut through because it would sound so different.'

Between Rock & Hard Edge

In the Rock world, Active Rock WRIF/Detroit PD Doug Podell says his crystal ball tells him this year could see more breakthroughs for alterna-metal. "The big decision we face in '97 is how hard-edged can we go. What is alternative rock in Detroit? Well, it looks to be a little harder-edged this year. Bands like Metallica, Tool, Type O Negative, and Pantera were all successful last year. And none of them - except for Metallica - had ever been before.

"

"We recently did our Nightmare Before Christmas festival with Danzig, Corrosion Of Conformity. Helmet, and Deep Purple. It was the best festival in two years. It's where the kids are gravitating to these days; it's what the 21-27-year-old guy is buying and sinking his teeth into. The 'alternative' sound has been around for years and still will. It's just that a lot of stations jumped on the bandwagon at the end. [Hard-edged alterna-rock] seems to be the next level of excitement."

Podell says the increased popularity of the sub-genre is a natural progression of alternative rock. He also notes that "for a lot of people there was a lot of hype surrounding alternative music, especially the softer stuff. With the harderedged alterna-rock [the labels] kind of laid it out there and didn't make a huge deal of it."

One thing that tops Podell's '97 wish list is the need for better artist development. He says things have become more song-oriented than artist-oriented, which could spell trouble in the future. "The labels are killing themselves with one-hit wonders. While people may listen to them and request the songs - and we'll still play them - the audience isn't going out and buying the albums in droves. And they probably won't buy the second one either.

Podell cites the Hunger and the Hazies as two bands that broke through in that regard. "Those groups had outstanding songs, their albums sold well in our market, they performed well in concert and could sell a lot of tickets, and they delivered when it came to interviews on the station. Listeners still have as high a passion for the music than ever, but they want the artists to have that passion as well."

Urban Gets Complex

In the Crossover and Urban world, CHR/Rhythmic KMEL/San Francisco PD Michelle Santosuosso says the resurgence of old school will continue in '97. "A couple of years ago music from artists like D'Angelo and Maxwell would have been considered too esoteric and may not have received the mainstream success they earned last year. Those two opened a lot of doors. I expect the same success for Tony Toni Tone, Universal's Erykah Badu, and Columbia's Alicia Keys. They have some new music coming our way that's wonderful."

Santosuosso thinks urban music "is about to get very sophisticated in its sound and the people are getting it. Listeners are very open to hearing real soul music in a way they traditionally haven't.'

The acid jazz-tinged music from Roots and Badu and Keys's upcoming album is what really excites Santosuosso, "Commercial, mainstream urban will still be strong. But this is a completely different form coming from the street and it's hit music. Urban has been clearly influenced by the acid jazz movement, which was been going on for years. But I think hip hop is going to be even more influenced by acid jazz this year."

"

Why now as opposed to when the movement first grabbed headlines a couple of years ago? "The audience has to be nurtured. It wouldn't have been possible for us to play Keys or Badu if we hadn't stepped out on D'Angelo and Maxwell. You have to educate your audience first. A station has that responsibility. If you don't, you're shutting yourself off from a lot of music, because you can only be aggressive if you've trained your audience to be that way.

Santosuosso also believes it's a 'natural progression of the scene. Mainstream contemporary urban is becoming pop music. It's similar to

what's happening with alternative. The edgier alternative music that first got on the air was considered new and fresh. Then it eventually became mainstream.

"

What alternative hasn't done and urban is doing is re-inventing itself. Real street urban music is doing what it naturally should do, which is go in a different direction. And that direction happens to be acid jazz in San Francisco.

Santosuosso's crystal ball also tells her that "if I were a betting person I would say that gangsta rap is going to completely fade out. The fact that Dr. Dre's been talking about the more positive messages in his new record and that Snoop Doggy Dogg's album is pretty low-key in terms of posturing tells me a lot. The whole movement seems to be ending."





Some background: The Blackout All-Stars are a one-off (for now) supergroup comprised of such jazz greats as Ray Barretto, Tito Nieves, Tito Puente, Dare Valentin. Paquito D'Rivera, and Grover Washington Jr. Taken from the compilation album "Global Basics Dance Music For The Millennium," their song was a club hit around three years ago.

Commenting on how well the track has been working at WHTZ, MD Paul "Cubby" Bryant calls it "massive in all areas. It's been constantly at the top of our research, pulling down Top 10 phones - especially among adults. And the sales are great. You put those together and you can't deny how much of a smash it is for our audience. And the Burger King commercial reinforces its familiarity. It's the dance record of the moment."

Bryant says the station, which added the song on November 27, has played it over 250 times. "We're going to be on this for quite a while. It shows little burn." One of the reasons Bryant foresees a long shelf life is that "Latin-flavored dance is especially popular. People seem to still want more of it."

Going forward, Columbia's promo strategy is pretty straightforward since it's unlikely that group is going to hit the road promoting the album. The main focus: to capitalize on research and sales in New York and other

markets Notes VP/Pop Promotion Charlie Walk, "We knew this was a mass-appeal pop record because of what we saw at 'KTU, where it not only researched well with its core tions that we did. We understood it was a tough time of the year and that we were even going against some of our own new artists, but the quality of the stations is very promising. People know these are programmers who react to the music and not other things.'

Some Words From The Wise

□ Advice from two pioneers in Talk and News


While going through my vast archives the other day, I uncovered two manuals I've been saving for many years. One is "The Talk Radio Handbook," written by **Willis Duff** in 1969. The other is a style guide authored by one-time **KFWB/Los Angeles ND Don Schrack**.

The latter was written sometime in the late '70s when Schrack and I were at the all-News station, and concerns itself with the fine art of writing for the ear.

As everybody tries to figure out what the heck they're going to do differently in 1997, I thought it would be helpful to excerpt some thoughts from two of the best manuals I've seen on *any* subject, let alone Talk and News. Their ideas and guidance are as contemporary and relevant as anything you're ever likely to see.

The Fledgling Format

Willis Duff put his thoughts on paper after launching, in the mid-'60s, the nation's first 24-hour telephone-talk radio station. It was, surprise perhaps, **Metromedia**'s **KLAC/Los Angeles**. Parts of



Duff's manual were taken from actual memos written to the staff of the fledgling, still experimental Talk station.

Duff points out in his introduction, "Most of the recipients of these memos, though all accomplished broadcasters, had never spoken a word into a microphone when there was a shadow of a chance that it would speak back. So there are some fundamentals propounded that may be unnecessary to those with any talk experience."

Of course, when Duff & Co. were cranking up KLAC, *no one* had any Talk radio experience because the format then was brand new and, even today, is only about 30 years old. Duff's KLAC and, later, **Ben Hoberman**'s **KABC/ L.A.**, broke dramatic ground in the baby format, hiring the likes of **Joe Pyne, Bob Grant, Ken Minyard, Marv Gray**, and **Ray Briem**.

In fact, Duff writes, "Several chunks of concept and operational method in this book were taken directly from observation of and (abrasive, occasionally close) association with Joe Pyne." For those who don't remember, Pyne was an ex-Marine with a wooden leg who kept a German Shepherd by his side at all times.

By comparison, Pyne could make the dog look like a nervous little poodle. His trademark line was "Go gargle with razor blades." He refused to let anyone touch him (Pyne, not the dog). He also had one of the first syndicated TV talk shows and died, entirely too young, in the early 1970s.

On to excerpts from some of Duff's memos, including this comment about who makes a good Talk show host: "The kind of person who can be a giant in this field is the kind of person who can inspire people to confide. To do this, he must stimulate the listener to action (call). He must give the caller confidence. He must meet the caller as an absolute equal at the start. After that, the relationship can go in any direction.

"Two-way radio is personality radio in its highest form. Personality implies, along with anything else, *conviction*. The most winning fellow, or the most obnoxious, is an incomplete personality unless he is capable of conviction ... Your opinions are your sacred domain, to be challenged and defended, teased and acknowledged ... Therefore, you must be resolutely honest.

"As professional broadcasters, you will be able to develop technique, style, and approach very quickly. But remember, technique must never dominate personality. The audience must have some *one* to listen and talk to, never some *thing*." Amen, Mr. Duff.

Don't Disappoint The Audience

In another memo, Duff stresses the importance of *knowledge*. "Your effectiveness will be direct-

KGO's Bernie Ward Says 'I'm Sorry'

KGO/San Francisco talk host Bernie Ward, who just got over a feud with the mayor over an unbleeped racial slur, is in hot water with the Bay Area's entire Jewish community.

The San Francisco Examiner says Ward spent 12 minutes on his nighttime show explaining why he was sorry for calling Judaism a morally inferior religion "stuck in the backwaters of history."

The *Examiner* quotes the ex-priest-turned-Talker as saying his commentary was "totally and completely a screw up. The choice of words was wrong. The direction of the conversation was wrong. It denigrated a great religion."

The newspaper says Ward, KGO GM **Mickey Luckoff**, and five Jewish leaders met to discuss Ward's comments, which happened in the middle of Hanukkah. A caller told Ward it would be hard for Holocaust survivors to forgive **Hitler**. Ward replied, "Well, that's one of the real bad parts of Judaism, isn't it? That's a part of your tradition that I think you suffer from."

Ward continued at length, saying Judaism "never caught on" because forgiveness was not the cornerstone of the religion, adding, "The Christian tradition is morally superior to the Jewish one ... because the system is built around the concept that everybody is redeemable."

Anti-Defamation League spokeswoman Barbara Bergen 'was incensed because Ward implied that she wanted him taken off the air, which she vehemently denied," according to the *Examiner*.

After the meeting at KGO, Rabbi **Douglas Kahn** of the **Jewish Com**munity Relations Council said, "There's been closure, and we've been satisfied with the result."

ly proportionate to your background on any given subject. The discussion and opinion format will very quickly point out your weak spots if you are not on the watch for your areas of ignorance. The audience will notice, so *you* damn well better ... "Your ability to turn yourself into an omnivorous reader will largely affect your success. The public expects great knowledgeability from discussion show personalities. The cardinal sin in any kind of entertainment is to disappoint the audience."

On the matter of Taking a stand and how to do it. Duff writes in another memo: "When the audience knows how you stand on an issue, another great incentive to call is at work. Also, it is vital to professional consistency and credibility that your own opinions be concrete in your mind. Decide, according to your own feelings, how you stand on each issue ... Read articles that disagree with your stand ... The longer any given issue remains a frequent topic of conversation on the air, the more real and in-depth research you must do on that issue.'

Duff warns, "It is possible to fix an opinion on a subject ... because it is frequently discussed, become

bored with the topic, and stop seeking new knowledge about it. This leads to a rigid and repetitious position that is exasperating and boring ...

"No topic that sustains long interest is fixed and immutable. The facts are always shifting. New factors come into play. Old theories tumble. The *big* topics demand constant research and an open mind." Right on again, Mr. Duff!

Agree To Disagree

One of the more annoying comments to come out of the 1990s is "I guess we'll have to agree to disagree." Duff saw this coming 30 years ago: "The air personality must have — and be allowed to air — his own opinions. The 'moderator' is cast in an insipid role; the eternal devil's advocate comes across as ridiculously inconsistent, and nobody really likes a peacemaker."

I hesitate to quote Duff on the matter of "conflict" because too many Talk show hosts these days will say anything to get a cheap rise out of the audience. Nonetheless, even Hollywood says every movie must have "conflict," so here's another memo: "In Two-Way radio, every call must have conflict. Conflict between the caller and the communicaster, or conflict between both persons and a third force; the conflict of challenge, or the conflict of probing discovery; conflict on a cerebral level, or conflict on an emotional plane; wherever it happens, there must be the tensions of actual and impending conflict.'

Kindly take special note of the terms "probing discovery" and "ce-rebral level." Thank you.

Here are some thoughts on what Duff calls *The Matador Syndrome*: "The audience — any audience is always hungry for the kill. The aficionados appreciate the cape work; the rest of the people come for the sword. The Two-Way radio audience is accustomed to a blistering pace; it has learned to expect a quick end to boring calls. They share management's frequent impulse, expressed as 'shut him off,' 'wrap it up,' and 'what a drag.'

"The listener rightfully expects hopscotching from interesting topic to interesting topic ... Keep your sword sharp. The audience came for the spectacle, the popcorn and the artistry, but mainly they came for the kill."

Duff provides plenty of nuts and bolts tips on how to keep a Talk show moving. A few examples: "Do not enter into a discussion with every caller. If a particular caller's subject is a repeat of a subject much hashed over, let him have his say and sign off.

"Don't try to convert ... Endless palaver will result from trying to 'win' in conversation ... Overlong argument becomes harangue. Harangue is the death of interesting conversation. Avoid harangue like all plagues combined. "Avoid technical discussions. Parts-per-million, ohms, cubic centimeters, brillings and slithey toves are far too *in* for most, and they extend calls dangerously close to harangue." And you already know what you can do with your harangue.

From another memo: "Be mysterious and unpredictable. One of the traits that makes a person dull is total predictability. All of us have interesting contradictions in our tastes, beliefs, and ideas ... If you are easy to label, you are too predictable.

"Your credibility depends on your 'objectivity quotient,' a measure of how rarely the audience says, 'Oh, he *would* say that, he's a Conservative.' Or a Liberal, or whatever. If your Credibility Quotient is high, the audience will be kept on its toes, wondering what you will do next."

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Duff adds some encouraging words for the sales department: "A high 'C.Q.' should eliminate any possible commercial prejudice against you from sponsors unwilling to be associated with particular political or philosophical slants; and, you will be less culpable in the eyes of die-hards at either end of the thought spectrum. So, cultivate your contradictions." But don't make them up. Thank you.

'Contest The Opinion'

On disagreements with other Talk hosts: "In the event that an opinion of your fellow workers conflicts with yours, have at him. But it is vital that we contest the *opinion*, not the *person*. Mutual respect must be a way of life."

On the length of calls: "Pacing a discussion/opinion show is very similar to pacing a music show ... Although the length of specific calls is never predictable, don't fall into any kind of rut ... Stagger the calls, take several quickies when the chance arises. Pace the show like a good boxer times his body blows — never get into a predictable thythm."

On boring callers: "The dull caller is our mortal enemy. The pace and vitality of this format breeds impatience in our highly attentive audience. The dull caller should receive the same hostility on Two-Way radio that dead air receives on a rocker.

"Make an instantaneous judgment about whether the call is good or bad ... Try very quickly to upgrade the call. Demand that the caller get to the meat of the subject. Hurry him. Contradict him. Challenge him. As a last resort, bounce a new topic simulator off him.

"If the call cannot be improved, *adios*. Do it as though your career depended on it. It does ... A good call is entertaining, informative, provocative, humorous, or sad; or ideally, a beautiful combination of several of these things ... You must be ruthless. If the caller is insipid or senile or stupid or repetitive, and you cannot save the call by your personal power of entertainment, *drop the call.*"

On teaching the audience good manners: "An occasional, petulant show of impatience with the caller who will not get to his point, or who wants to argue over how many topics he can cover or how many minutes he can speak, will have the beneficent effect of educating the audience that getting to the point is a good practice on your show ... It is your ultimate responsibility never to allow a dull phone call."

OK, students, that's enough Willis Duff for now. There's more, of course, but his additional words of wisdom may appear in future columns. Take a break, have some coffee, a smoke if you dare, and we'll get down to the nuts and bolts of newswriting for radio. Quiet down please, class. We're about to contemplate excerpts from the 1970sera "KFWB Style Guide" by then-ND Don Schrack.

Write For The Ear

Here's Schrack's basic philosophy: "The essential idea to remember in writing radio copy [news *and* commercials] is that it is written for the ear. The copy must flow; it must be understandable; it must be orderly; it must sound pleasing; it must *communicate*."

On rewriting newspapers or news wires for radio: "The source material must be fully read and understood. At that point, it is best to set the source material aside then, write the story in your own words. Of course, you may occasionally refer again to the source material for specific information.

"As you prepare your copy, *first* tell the listener what you're about to tell him; *then*, tell him." I can't resist adding that someone else (I don't remember who) once advised, "Then tell them what you told them." Let's face it. Radio copy goes in one ear and often out the other. A listener can't re-read a story or rely on the little graphics that TV news provides.

On the art of copy writing: "The first sentence of the copy is the most important. It must attract the listener's attention. It should *make* him want to hear all the additional details. It should be short — one line, if possible, and no more than 2 1/2.

"The most 'flavorful' parts of the story should be emphasized. New leads to ongoing stories should not be 'buried' in the middle of your copy (despite the fact that this is frequently the case with wire copy).



Try to avoid clichés. Also guard against convoluted lead sentences which may be cute, but which may confound the listener, not to mention the announcer."

On the Sixth W: "We've all heard about the celebrated 'five Ws' of journalism: who, what, where, when, and why. Unfortunately, the most important 'W' is never mentioned in journalism school. That 'W' is who cares? If that question is asked of every sentence in a particular story and if the answer is always, 'most of the audience,' then KFWB is broadcasting an excellent story."

Tense moments: "Whenever practicable, KFWB uses the present tense of the verb ... Special care should be taken to avoid the use of 'print journalism' with regard to verbs. A newspaper may say: 'Governor **Brown** said he would sign the controversial bill.' KFWB says: 'Governor Brown says he will sign the controversial bill.'

"Avoid using the past tense, which is 'dead' for most radio purposes. Because it can be used to straddle the past *and* the present, the *present perfect tense* is usually an excellent substitute for the past tense in describing events that have already taken place. 'Police *have charged Charles Manson today* with the murders of ...' is preferred

Voice Cuts A Must

On using actualities, or tape of newsmakers: "Stories containing voice cuts make use of a major advantage all-News radio has over the print and television media. Voice cuts aired by KFWB today will appear in quotation form in the morning paper tomorrow. Sound heard on KFWB within minutes after a news event may not be played on television or other radio stations for a matter of hours ...

"The first sentence is the key. It should arouse the listener's inter-

est and make him curious to hear more details. The sentence preceding the cuing of the voice cut should both identify the newsmaker and put the actuality in proper perspective ... Avoid duplication of facts contained in the voice cut when writing the surrounding copy.

"As a general rule, for all voice cuts longer than 15 seconds, the newsmaker should be *re-identified* in the copy *following* the voice cut. It is not necessary to identify all newsmakers by name [such as an eyewitness or a spokesman]."

On phonetic spelling: "... required anytime there is a substantial likelihood a word may be misread or mispronounced by the announcer. Use capital letters to indicate which syllables receive the accent. For example, "... in the icefree port of Valdez (val-DEEZ)."

Ah, those Alaskan oil spill days of yore. What times we had!

On streamlining copy for the ear: "Middle names and initials are seldom heard on KFWB ... No newsmaker merits the title of mister, Mrs., or Ms." [The *New York Times* doesn't follow Schrack on this; i.e., when reporting on the recent trial of **Snoop Doggy Dogg**, the Times stylebook would require the rapper to be referred to as "Mr. Dogg."]

"The leader of the group, committee, panel, or the like, is either a *chairman* or *chairwoman*. He or she is never a *chairperson*. Accordingly, we never use terminology such as weatherperson, spokesperson, businessperson or salesperson." Don't forget, this was in the 1970s when he or she didn't have to worry so much about how he or she referred to him or her.

On the numbers game: "Unless a specific number is an essential part of the story, it may and should be dropped. For instance, the number of firemen [!] at the scene of a fire is unnecessary unless that number is unusually large or unusually small. When using necessary numbers, we modify the numbers to make them easy to understand. For example, 3-thousand-849 becomes 'nearly 4-thousand.' 'Thirty-fivepoint-8-percent' becomes 'nearly 36-percent.'''

Since my computer tells me that this column is already nearly 2700 words, I'd better stop now. The last I heard, Willis Duff was a partner in an audience research firm in Dallas. Don Schrack was running a couple of stations and doing a lot of fishing somewhere in Oregon. If you have an update on either...

N o Doubt's "Don't Speak" (Trauma/Interscope) is far and away the top tester among the first 400 Callout America respondents of 1997. It ranks No. 1 across all demos while maintaining a comfortable burn score. No Doubt's "Tragic Kingdom" CD is now five times platinum (it placed fourth in total album sales for 1996), and the band has just been nominated for a Best New Artist Grammy.

"Lovefool" by Cardigans (Mercury) enters the survey with a 3.94 average score. It ranks No. 2 overall and tests No. 1 in the 18-24 cell and in the Midwest region. WKRQ/Cincinnati reports 57 plays, WPRO/Providence 56 plays, and WAPE/Jacksonville 48 plays.

"Nobody" by Keith Sweat (Elektra/EEG) debuts with a 3.84 average favorability estimate. It racks up an impressive 3.93 among 18-24 women and is especially strong in the East region with a 3.90. KHOM/New Orleans reports 60 plays. WNVZ/Norfolk 48 plays, and WNKS/Charlotte adds with 20 plays.

"A Long December" by **Counting Crows (DGC/Geffen)** continues to build in average score and familiarity. It registers a 3.66 overall and a 3.68 among women 25-34. WWZZ/Washington reports 44 plays. WDCG/Raleigh 35 plays, and WSTR/Atlanta 28 plays.

Learning The ABCs Of Tom Joyner

Former 'Fly-Jock' pilots way to syndicated success; eyes next challenge

Washington, DC to Phoenix, from Dallas to Chicago. I found that out when I did the Dallas-Chicago run. People were asking the same question then: How do you stay topical in Dallas and in Chicago being in two separate markets? It's not like one city is a foreign country to another city. People are people. It's a very small community.

R&R: Do you see yourself going beyond the Urban audience? TJ: No. If I try to do that, my

Urban audience will quit me. Our people are funny like that. Our audience thinks this show is theirs. R&R: Describe a typical work-

day.

TJ: Well, let's see. We have a pretty big team of people - I would say, fulltime working on the show, probably up to about 14 or 15 people. We've got 10 fulltime staffers in Dallas, and then you've got the "soap opera" people. My day starts at 3am central time; that hasn't changed. I wish it would. Everybody talks about the success and

how great it is. But it doesn't feel too successful when you have to get up and get started at three in the morning. The show goes on the air at 5am and we go 'til 9am. Then I do a ton of drops for stations on the network to keep the show localized and sounding fresh every dav ... I do about a phone book of drops. Steve Harris: And

that's one of the most

important elements of the show on the local level. Those drops really make a difference in how the show sounds in each city. And Tom does a great job with it. He tapes a lot.

TJ: And then we meet for about 30 minutes to an hour, one big meeting planning future shows. Then the rest of the day - until about 6 o'clock - is spent getting it together: phone calls, interviews, affiliate relations, whatever. So it's a pretty busy day. I'm still the hardest working man in radio. I just don't fly every day.


R&R: Do you miss the flying? TJ: Oh yeah, you know I miss it. There's nothing like eating your meal off a tray, with your knife and fork in plastic and little salt and pepper shakers. I really miss that. For awhile, I wouldn't eat. I had to go to therapy to get over that.

R&R: Do you do a lot of reading to prepare for your show?

TJ: We all prep. USA Today is the main source because it's the national paper. So we rely a lot on that. We get feedback from the affiliates with their local newspapers. They fax and mail material to keep us abreast of what's going on in the local markets. But USA Today and other national publications like People, Time, and Newsweek keep us aware as to what's generally going on around the country.

R&R: Although you're not flying every day now, you're still on the road quite a bit. How many remotes do you average?

TJ: Well, we're supposed to average two a month. But it seems like I haven't had a weekend where we weren't going somewhere in an awfully long time. If we're not doing a remote, then I'm doing appearances that's why it seems like all the weekends are running together. Our voter registration remotes were probably the most successful. We started with the first of those at the Democratic Convention in Chicago. And I think from then up until the voter registration cutoff, which was mid-October, we did five remotes in about a month and a half, including Philadel-

phia, Atlanta, St. Louis, Dallas, and Washington, DC. We don't know how many people we were responsible for registering because there's no way of telling. But we know we inspired a lot of people to go out and vote judging by the response at these

One of the things we do know is, when we advertised the Rock The Vote 800 number, we blew their phones up. People were told to call that number; they could feed their names and other information to the RTV computer. Then RTV would mail them a package, which they'd sign and send back via overnight mail. Well, we decided that was a cool idea and that we'd advertise it. We didn't get in touch with Rock The Vote or anything; I guess we should have. But we had no idea of the response this would get. RTV told us something like 125,000 people called. But RTV thinks there are another 50,000 people who never got their packages because RTV just



didn't have the manpower to get them out in time. So that was one indication.

Then we asked people to help us register other people to vote. We simply said, "Find five people who aren't registered, take it upon yourself to register those voters, and then be responsible for those people to go to the polls and let us know what you've done." People wrote, called, and faxed; we were just flooded with calls. And then there were other organizations around the country that conducted local voter registration campaigns as a result of our efforts.

R&R: Do you work in tandem with the affiliates on remote events. or do you do them on your own?

T.J: The stations call, and we work in tandem. We have more requests than we can fill. But we eventually hope to get to all the affiliates

with one of our live audience shows. They're the most fun; I love 'em. I wish we could do one every day.

R&R: What do you like most, the spontaneity?

TJ: Yeah, and the touching, the feeling. We get such a huge response. We recently did one in Atlanta at a black comedy club in Buckhead [County], which isn't exactly the neighborhood. Located in a

nice little shopping center, this club holds about 300 people. But when we drove up to the place at 5:30 in the morning, more than 600 people were standing in line in the cold. The first person in line said he had gotten there at 1:50am. Most of them were women; they were dressed with makeup and hair done. It was amazing. We opened the door at 5:45am and closed it at 5:50. We took all we could. And we gave T-shirts to those we couldn't let in. Meanwhile, hundreds of other people continued to come as the show aired. They had to be turned away.

The same thing happened in Philadelphia. We had been on the air only three months when we did our first remote. And we had a line that stretched down the block and around the corner with people who could not get in.

R&R: For someone who hasn't heard your show, how would you describe it?

TJ: The fun factor's way up, the

music is basically "old school," and there's good information. Our results show that people like our show and listen to it all the time. They get hooked.

SH: ... From the soap opera segment to celebrity interviews. Tom's had everybody on the show that you would want to listen to - from Johnnie Cochran to Luther Vandross. When you know something's happening and you can turn on your favorite radio station and hear Tom Joyner talking to whoever's hot, that makes a difference. You know Tom's connected and hooked up.

R&R: What do you think about today's R&B music?

TJ: I'm so glad that old-school music has made a comeback. I love it. It's the best thing that could have happened - old school and music coming out that's influenced by old school. It's gone back to music. I was getting real burned out on samples. And that's a weird concept. They call it "sampling," but it's really stealing, dammit! I wish I could go into a store, take a suit off the rack, and say, "I'm just sampling this, I'm not really stealing.'

R&R: How do you determine the balance of music and other elements in your show?

TJ: We don't like to talk about that too much because you know how program directors get: "What? You're only playing how many songs an hour? That doesn't make any sense." It's about half and half, old and new music. We feel that when we're not playing music, everything we do can take the place of a hit record at any time. Whether we play a four-minute song or do a four-minute bit, we can hold the au-

SH: In terms of music, our stations do the audience testing. We're using a very safe playlist of strong hits and old school that will work in any segment of the country - along with all the entertainment elements on Tom's show.

R&R: How many affiliates do you have now?

- SH: We're at 77 now.
- TJ: Thank you, Lord.

R&R: How many major markets does that represent?

SH: Miami, Chicago, Dallas, Atlanta, Philadelphia, Detroit, and Washington, DC. And we're still working on growing.

R&R: What's your timetable?

SH: I don't want to put a number out there. We're just very aggressive about getting out and selling the show. Really, at this point, the show is selling itself. Different programmers and different general managers around the country are looking at Tom's success in a number of markets and saying, "You know, I want some of that.

In the beginning, there were a lot of people who said it wouldn't work. that it couldn't be done, especially in Black radio. People said Tom wouldn't work in DC, that he couldn't beat Donnie Simpson; that he wouldn't work in Atlanta because he wouldn't be able to compete with WVEE's Mike Roberts. But the plain and simple fact is it's working, and not only for the stations and their morning show ratings. The show helps lift the ratings for the rest of their day as well because Tom is a strong lead-in. Now we look at our DC numbers and know we're leading the pack by a wide margin. And we want to keep that.

R&R: Speaking of DC, you shot to the top there very fast. Was there a special strategy?

TJ: That credit is due to the affiliate. Where we are successful - and we're successful just about everywhere - you'll find there's a very equally aggressive affiliate that packages and markets the show: packages the show when it's on the air with drops, co-hosts, and contesting; markets the show with commercials, billboards, buses, and things like that. If it's packaged and marketed right, if they are just as aggressive as we are from a programming standpoint, it's an unstoppable combination.

SH: WHUR GM Jim Watkins and PD Hector Hannibal just believed in the show completely. They put their full force behind the show and rallied the station behind it. The success was doing the show the right way and, as Tom said, marketing. The word got out that Tom was on 'HUR, and the audience just grew and grew. Tom's time spent listening is up to about five hours a week in Washington, DC. That's an incredible achievement

R&R: What's your take on deregulation — is it an advantage or disadvantage for minorities in the industry?

TJ: It's a disadvantage. And they've done away with the affirmative action tax credit, another disadvantage for minority ownership.

R&R: Do you have plans down the road to try your hand at sta-tion ownership?


T.J: No, no. Then I'd have to deal with talent. I wouldn't be able to deal with me.

R&R: Then what's your next challenge?

TJ: This job isn't done. I've got a long way to go to finish this job. We've been on a good roll, but we're a ways from saying, "Okay, we've done it. We're there. There's still a lot more. The success we've had is great: It's been three years, and we're way ahead of projections. But we can't rest yet.

R&R: Where would you like to see yourself a year from now?

TJ: Doing a remote from the moon. Yeah ... a space jock, the "Nassau Shuttle Jock."

Charity, Cards & Caring: A Country Christmas

Stations spread the season's spirit to listeners

Once again Country station staffers put their personal holiday preparations on hold to make the holidays a bit brighter for the less fortunate.

Those who've never worked in radio don't realize how busy things are around a station during that time of the year. I doubt there's a time the jocks work harder — both on and off the air. Here are the details on a few of the charitable events and heartwarming activities aired by Country stations toward the end of last year.

Arizona's Police Toy Drive

KNIX/Phoenix middayer W. Steven Martin spearheaded the 22nd annual Arizona Police Toy Drive, which saw more than 700 officers distribute over 120,000 tovs both record numbers. Indeed, it's the distribution system which makes this effort unique Martin says, "Members

of the police and sheriff's departments have a hard time gaining the confidence of children, especially in high-crime neighborhoods. The kids associate them with negative experiences. I thought if cops brought the toys, it might help turn that around."

Each officer wanting to participate is permitted two families for adoption. Often these are homes and kids with whom they've had personal contact. The officer gets a wish list from the kids in the house and, on specified days just prior to Christmas, they head to the warehouse where they can go through and pick out the gifts themselves to fulfill the lists.

The drive has been expanded the last couple of years to Tucson, Prescott, Flagstaff, and Yuma as well. Toys could be dropped off at any Arizona Exxon station.

A number of area companies also participated. They ask employees to bring toys for the drive

to the company's holiday party. Martin personally attended more than 50 parties to pick up gifts and thank people.

But the big news is that W. will soon be heading to Washington to help establish ground rules for a national foundation for similar one-to-one

gift-giving programs for atrisk children.

Elmo: Country King Of 1997

Building a successful promotion around a phenomenon like Elmo requires some creative thinking. If every other adult station is auctioning off the irascible critter, it's important to put your own twist on the deal to make it special. Sometimes it's your own invention, sometimes it's the donors themselves who make it special. Here are some of the things Country stations did in weeks past:

• Imagine soliciting bids for an Elmo and picking up the request line only to find Garth Brooks on the other end! That happened to KUPL-FM/Portland, OR afternoon driver Rick Taylor just before Christmas. Garth was high at \$5000, but said anyone who matched the offer could have the doll. Later, the CEO of ABC Technologies did just that — and he too gave the doll back to the station. Elmo and the \$10,000 went to a local children's hospital. KUPL's first Elmo went for \$4200.

• WPCV-FM/Lakeland, FL let listeners request songs to the tune of \$5 a pop — but that also entered their name in a drawing for the ubiquitous one.

The station collected over \$1650, more than 600 food items, and over 300 toys through various efforts, including a showcase at a local club that featured a number for local bands. It all went to Toys For Tots.

• WMIL/Milwaukee's 30hour Toys For Tots campaign included 1996's seemingly obligatory "Elmo Auction." However, it took the "Tickle Me Elmo" phenomenon a step further by having a pair of Elmos for auction autographed by Green Bay Packers linebacker George Koonce. The two netted \$4200 in cash and \$2500 in toys.

• KIZN-FM/Boise, ID raised nearly \$17,000 for three local children's charities when it put up

five Elmos for auction. Helping the cause were celebrity auctioneers, including the state's governor and lieutenant governor and Boise's mayor. Plus, the winning bids were all matched by Idaho Power and Walmart.

• WCMS-FM/Norfolk had a couple of Elmos up for bid: one of which was purchased by the Chairman of Smithfield Foods, who pledged \$5000 in celebration of a new grandchild born the day of the station auction. The total take for American Cancer Society's Relay For Life was over \$7000.

• **KXDD/Yakima**, WA took in \$1025 for its Elmo, with proceeds going to the Union Gospel Mission.

Other Promotions

In the non-Elmo world of holiday promotions:

• W K X K - F M/Chicago teamed with Chicago Bears defensive tackle Chris Zorich and his foundation. The airstaff made appearances around Chicagoland every day of December, and listeners were invited to bring toys or gifts to the remotes. As part of the promotion, the station's van was re-christened as the "KICKS Country Christmas Cruiser."


On New Year's Eve, 'KXK cosponsored the "First Night" celebration at Navy Pier. Music, dance, cultural, and interactive activities took place between 5pm-midnight, followed by a huge fireworks display.

• KSSN/Little Rock participated in a "Buddy Bear" program with local police. Operating on the premise that children who come into contact with police under stressful situations can benefit from having a stuffed animal to cling to, the station collects teddy bears which officers carry in their patrol cars.

• KIIM/Tucson collected over 1.6 million pennies at its mall broadcast site during its First Annual "Penny Pitch," benefitting the Arizona Children's Home of Tucson.

NASHVILLE THIS WEEK

CMA Points To Country's Success

□ Growth levels off, but statistics show Nashville's international strength

Despite reaching a plateau of growth, the country industry has been given a clean bill of health by the "doctors" at the Country Music Association. Although record sales are down slightly from 1995, a recent CMA study indicates country has remained strong since the beginnings of the unprecedented boom that began in 1990.

CMA Exec. Director Ed Benson explained, "Anyone who looks at the industry realistically could not have expected growth to continue at the rate we've seen over the past six years. This is a leveling-off period that was anticipated, not a death drop. Country radio is still the No. 1 domestic radio format, corporate America is getting involved with country more than ever before, and the international market is growing tremendously."

Sales Stats

As evidence of country's continued popularity, the CMA points to the following:

· According to the RIAA, revenues from sales of country recordings have quadrupled since 1989.

• In Pollstar magazine's estimates for 1996, seven country artists are in the year's list of Top 25 tours. Five artists made the 1995 list.

• Pollstar figures also reflect that the Top 10 country tours of 1996 showed an increase of approximately 16% from 1995. Business was up by \$22.3 million from the \$136.1 million in total gross ticket sales generated by last year's Top 10 country tours.

• In addition to the success of the CMA's first-ever "Marketing With Country Music" seminar, country artists forged alliances with major corporate sponsors including Fruit Of The Loom, Folger's Coffee, MCI's 1-800-COLLECT. Frito Lay, Kellogg's, Coca-Cola, Discover Card, Chevrolet, Kraft, Wal-Mart, Martha White Foods, and Crown Royal.

Awards Appeal

The 30th annual CMA Awards broadcast again gave CBS-TV the top-rated program of the night. Overseas, the BBC-2 telecast of an edited version of the show scored the highest ratings in its five-year UK television history. It also marked the first time BBC-2 provided a live radio simulcast of the awards show.

• In conjunction with Nashville labels, the CMA's London office coordinated the first UK retail campaign to promote the awards show and record sales.

• Elsewhere, the CMA Awards show was televised in Canada, Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Denmark, and Australia, and will be shown in other countries on CMT.

Worldwide Interest

Country is regularly featured on more than 400 radio stations outside North America, reaching more than 34 million listeners in 19 countries. Among the CMA's



other observations of country's international popularity:

Hearts" - Larry Gatlin

• Foreign television networks are showcasing country more than ever. Artists including Mindy Mc-Cready, Emmylou Harris, and BR5-49 traveled to Germany to tape a special for **ZDF-TV**.

• John Berry's solo acoustic performance marked the first time a country act performed at Germany's Rock AM Ring festival, one of Europe's biggest music events.

• Also in Germany, Warner Music launched an unprecedented marketing campaign to promote Faith Hill. BMG teamed with Marlboro Music on advertising campaigns and other promotions to introduce listeners to country artists.

• In Australia, LeAnn Rimes's "Blue" album went double platinum, while Alan Jackson's "Greatest Hits Collection" was certified gold. Several artists, including Trisha Yearwood and Dwight Yoakam. performed there in '96.

• Last year's "Rock 'N' Country" tour - featuring Travis Tritt, Confederate Railroad, Charlie Daniels, Victoria Shaw, and Highway 101 — sold out its London show. Others enjoying sold-out houses during their '96 tours included the Mavericks and Steve Earle.

Garth Brooks, who sold more than 2 million concert tickets in '95, has added a third show to his upcoming performances in Dublin, Ireland. More than 80,000 tickets to his first two shows at Croke Park Stadium sold out immediately.

Concert promoter Jim Aiken of Aiken Promotions said, "This is

unprecedented. We've sold twice as many tickets for Garth Brooks as we've ever sold in one day before. There is obviously no decline in the affection the Irish people feel for Garth, and their anticipation of his upcoming concerts is overwhelming. People were literally in tears as they left with tickets in their hands.

The concerts take place May 16-18. No word on whether Brooks's overseas concerts will be included in his upcoming live album. Brooks had tape running at each show of his '96 U.S. tour.

Brooks's success hasn't gone unnoticed by another famous act. At last month's Bruce Springsteen concert at Nashville's Ryman Auditorium, "The Boss" offered up a bawdy holiday tune. As the - with a cheap plassong ended tic replica of Santa and his reindeer emerging from above the stage - Springsteen joked, "Special effects? I'll show you special effects, Mr. Garth Brooks.

Background

The odds are slim that both halves of a duo could have the same first name, but that's just the first coincidence surrounding Regina Regina. Texas-born Regina Nicks and North Carolina native Regina Leigh also share close connections to Reba McEntire.

Brunette Nicks worked several years at Starstruck Entertainment as a personal assistant to McEntire and the superstar's manager/husband Narvel Blackstock. Leigh, the blonde, spent nearly three years on the road as one of McEntire's background vocalists

Both proudly admit to being longtime McEntire fans, each having performed her songs at clubs throughout their home states. Nicks says, "I know you're not supposed to have idols, but she was my idol. When she'd play concerts in Texas, I'd wait in long lines behind the coliseum while she'd stand out beside her bus to sign autographs."

Musical History

Leigh was just 13 when she started making records for independent labels. She later spent five years in Dave & Sugar before beginning a two-year stint on the road with McEntire in 1993. While awaiting the release of Regina Regina's first single, she worked as a background vocalist on TNN's "Prime Time Country."

During Nicks's tenure at Starstruck, very few of her co-workers were aware that she had sung professionally in Texas. Her first marriage failed, and her time was consumed with her work and raising her son, Wesley.

Their friendship evolved during random phone conversations while working for McEntire. Their career as a duo was sparked by a chance meeting at Sony Tree Publishing. Leigh said, "I knew her, but I had no idea she sang. I would talk to her on the phone all the time at Reba's office. We lived in the same apartment complex. She would keep my little dog for me when I was on the road. It was just really strange."

Producer Wally Wilson, then an executive at Sony Tree, asked them, "Do you know each other?" After impromptu harmonizing on "Amazing Grace," Nicks and Leigh knew they wanted to sing together.

The Music

The Reginas soon came to the attention of Giant President James Stroud, who co-produced the album with Wilson. Nicks said, "I had never sung with another person. I had never even sung harmony backgrounds, but it all seemed very natural that we could do this. Everybody else was so totally amazed that our voices blended so well. It was just meant to be."

When it came time to produce the self-titled debut album, they learned that McEntire had expressed interest in recording "Ticket Out Of Kansas." a song they had on hold. Leigh said. "When she found out about our plans, she said 'You girls take it. I know you'll do a great job on it."

The first single, "More Than I Wanted To Know," was written by Bob Regan and Mike Noble. Leigh explained, "That was one of my favorites from the very beginning. The demo tape we got had three songs on it. This wasn't the one they were pitching to us, but I just loved it."

Promotion

With the debut single going for adds in December, Giant executives realized the timing wasn't right for a series of showcases aimed at Country radio. Instead, the label has distributed Regina Regina's "Showcase In A Box." Packaged in a cardboard box resembling a road case, the innovative promotional tool includes a brief video tape of the duo's recent performance in Nashville. The package also includes other items you might receive at a showcase, including a T-shirt, backstage pass, and a bag of pretzels.

Managed by industry veteran Bobby Roberts, Regina Regina will be solidifying radio contacts in the weeks to come. Tour plans will be determined after the album's release later this month.

Star Programmer Up For The Challenge

Nearly three years ago (4/22/94), R&R debuted its Hot AC chart with a 38-station panel. Since then, the reporting base has doubled to 76 — including 16 mainstays from the original group. On that inaugural chart, Richard Marx, Phil Collins, and Bonnie Raitt were 1-2-3, while two Michael Bolton cuts made the list. How far has the format come? This week, a trio of programmers looks at Hot AC's current evolution.

For a variety of reasons, including stellar ratings, KFMB-FM/San Di-



ego is emerging as one of Hot AC's shining "Stars" under Director/ Programming & Operations Tracy Johnson. In its women 18-34 target demo, Star finished second to CHR XHTZ in Arbitron's winter sweep. In the sub-

sequent spring and summer books, the

two outlets tied for first in the demo. "Some people call us 'Modern

AC' or 'Alternative AC,' but I think we're just AC," Johnson comments. There probably aren't as many Modern ACs as the industry would want to find, and it's a dangerous format to try to copy. Stations can't just throw on the Cure and Depeche Mode and see what happens. Defining the boundaries of the format is the biggest thing that confronts stations like ours right now. We have to know where the format is going and what will be accepted."

Johnson challenges the notion of the "Alternative lean" that many industry people ascribe to stations like his. "I went through R&R's Top 96 of '96 in Alternative, Hot AC, and CHR (R&R 12/13/96) and looked at how many of those songs we played. It was very interesting in determining who and what we are.

'During the entire year, we played only 30% of the Alternative songs and about 54% of both Hot AC and CHR songs. We're very much a cross between Hot AC and CHR."

Eighties music has played a major role in helping define KFMB-FM. But Johnson cautions, "I'm afraid that we're very close to burning up our fairly small '80s library. We play fun, uptempo stuff by Bananarama, Bangles, and Missing Persons. How many times can you play 'Hungry Like The Wolf' and have it mean something? Once you get past that and get up to the late '80s, there aren't many records left that fit soundwise."

Where Do We Go

When preparing his transition to the new year, Johnson evaluated whether it was time to rethink some of Star's earlier musical decisions. "I'm looking at things like Real McCoy's 'Another Night' which, to this point, hasn't been at all compatible. But songs like that are starting

to test better in our research with people who like the clusters that we represent.'

Songs by No Mercy ("Where Do You Go") and La Bouche ("Be My Lover" and "Sweet Dreams") are also being considered. "La Bouche tests 'playable' for us, and No Mercy tests 'very playable,' but we haven't felt the need to play them yet. We're trying to be conservative and discerning in making tactical moves that impact our strategy. When I look at other stations. I look at what they're doing and the kind of success they seem to be having with these songs.'

Staying Connected

Among the programmers with whom Johnson regularly networks are CHR KRBE/Houston's John Peake, who recently programmed Hot AC-turned CHR/Pop KWMX/ Denver. "His station has become more mass-appeal, although their demos are quite a bit younger than ours. But he made the sound change with great success.

"I also look at [Hot AC] KALC/ Denver, which seems to have backed off from what they'd been doing. They're probably searching for the same things we are. Where do you go? What do you do?"

He also tracks Hot AC KZZP/ Phoenix, and while some common titles are shared from station to station, Johnson comments, "I don't know if there's anyone who is that close to us. The Buzz [WDBZ/New York] and the Loop [WLUP/Chicago] are starting to become similar to what we do.'

Close geographical proximity, shared use of the "Star" handle, and music overlap easily explain why some perceive KFMB-FM and KYSR/Los Angeles as twins. But Johnson explains, "There are many differences between us. We're brighter and more mainstream they're harder and heavier. I don't

nlike Hot AC WBMX/Boston, which kept its calls and "Mix 98" handle as it modified its format (see separate story), WMXV/New York jettisoned its calls

and "Mix 105" slogan late last year in favor of WDBZ and "The Buzz."

"The essence, marketing, name, music, and stationality make this an entirely new station," remarks PD Steve Weed. "It's a realignment of the product to the target audience.

"Mix 105 was a prototypical Hot AC that struggled with the rapidly diminishing passion for those who'd been Hot AC's core artists. People like Mariah Carey, Phil Collins, Gloria Estefan, Whitney Houston, Elton John, and Rod Stewart, who drove the format for several years, seemed to have lost their relevance to the audience."

The Name Game

Several different terms were tested before the Buzz emerged victorious. "It has such common useage today," notes Weed. "People understand what it means and what we're implying. It's something new and exciting that's on everybody's lips."

While stating that the Buzz is now probably considered Modern AC, Weed admits it's difficult to define. "We're essentially an AC station targeted to 25-54s, leaning toward females, with a musical bent to Pop/Alternative. I don't know if it's a unique separate format or a fringe Hot AC offshoot.

"Core artists in our base library include David Bowie, Elvis Costello, Talking Heads, and U2. For the sake of charting and tracking, we're still Hot AC. We're more aggressive with modern music."

think they look at us and we certainly don't look at them.

Their trends are going down and it might be that the uniqueness is wearing off. I'm not concerned, but am curious about what everybody sees as this format's next development and I'm certainly rethinking it. The format's valid, but I want to know what to do with it.'

Cool To Be Uncool

Playlists aside, Johnson focuses on two other "p"s - presentation and packaging --- to help differentiate his station. "Star has an adult style, and we don't get too involved with hype. Our air talents are real people with very bright and uptempo personalities. We make a big effort in trying not to be too cool for the room.

The key for stations like ours is to develop morning shows. You can't just throw music on and expect people will be locked into it forever. Our morning show really fits the station's sound, feel, and lifestyle. The music is really the easiest part of the station."

"[But], we must be very careful to keep our eyes open to the next emerging trend. We might need to look at more techno-pop records, or Madonna may have an uptempo song that. fits. The key is keeping a finger on the audience's pulse and letting them dictate where we're going."

American Radio Systems Hot AC WBMX/Boston continues to be a trailblazer. A rhythmic flair first helped it stand out from the pack. Recent changes, though, find Mix 98.5 which once spotlighted Boyz II Men, Mariah Carey, Jaki Graham, and Luther Vandross -- now playing a steady diet of Hootie & The Blowfish, Melissa Etheridge, Dishwalla, and Alanis Morissette.

"We always update the product to maximize TSL and opportunity," observes VP/Program-Greg

ming Strassell. "If you took a snapshot of us two years ago, this would be a radical

change. But those who've been in the market have seen us evolve. This type of music is so compelling that we have to stake out our position. We found that some of the pop stuff was becoming less effective for us, so this wasn't a very difficult decision. The

exciting music is adult, but it isn't the adult Phil Collins and Rod Stewart of the last few years."

Numbers Game

In Arbitron's Summer 1995 book, WBMX was Boston's leading station among women 25-54, enjoying more than a one-share advantage over crosstown AC WMJX. A year later, though, WMJX propelled itself from fourth to first, while 'BMX slipped to third.

Female demos are still being courted by Boston's Mix. "In the six years I've been here, we've never put a male in one of our music tests. We still target women, but this format attracts men by default because it has more of a rock feel and isn't as sappy.'

This type of music is so compelling that we have to stake out our position. The exciting music is adult, but it isn't the adult Phil Collins and Rod Stewart of the last few years.

Noting that WBMX's current direction is "exciting radio," Strassell remarks, "It's Hot AC for 1997. In order to survive, stations have to focus on certain sounds and own the image for those sounds. Some mainstream Hot ACs around the country are starting to fall apart."

All In The Family

Co-owned ARS Hot ACs WTIC-FM/Hartford and KMXB/Las Vegas, Strassell says, are similar in sound to WBMX. "We're not as far into the format as KYSR/Los Angeles and don't play as much 'flashback' as them or KFMB-FM/San Diego. We're more of an East Coast Modern AC or Hot AC. Once WDBZ/New York gets up and running and starts getting numbers, I'll start looking at their playlists.'

Since Modern AC often means different things to different people, I asked Strassell for his interpretation. "To become more distinctive, these stations avoid traditional AC artists and will not play Celine Dion or songs like 'I Finally Found Someone' by Barbra Streisand & Bryan Adams. We'll probably see a lot more of these stations by the spring book.'

Programmers Pick 'The Lost Hits Of 1996'

CAROL ARCHER

Despite some PDs' and MDs' love and support, these are the tracks that got away

It happens every year in every format ... and always has. Programmers and MDs embrace tracks that their instincts say are hits, that are perfect for their stations. But sometimes even great records don't make it.

Perhaps the releases didn't get the recommendation of Broadcast Architecture, such as Marc Antoine's "Latin Quarter," Phil Upchurch's "Bee's Blues," and Zappacosta's "Orlanda." Or perhaps they were endorsed by BA, such as Tina Turner's "Something Beautiful Remains," but didn't develop sufficient momentum. Maybe they were serviced to the format but never promoted, like Toni Braxton's last two singles (and as great an artist as she is, the failure of these tracks in NAC proves the old axiom, "A terrible thing happens when you don't promote: nothing") or Chaka Khan's achingly beautiful "Love Me Still."

Here are what some of our reporters believe are last year's lost hits. Many of the following tracks have researched very strongly for the stations that picked them, so you may want to reconsider them for your library.





NAC NOTES By Carol Archer

W ith each release, Unity Entertainment increases both its commercial capital and its impact on the NAC format. This week, **Keiko Matsui**'s extraordinary "Dream Walk" CD (Countdown/Unity) and its first emphasis track, "Bridge Over The Stars," each have attained No. 1/bullet status. Congratulations to Ms. Matsui and all involved in the promotion effort on this noteworthy project.

Starting off the new year in an impressive fashion is **Zachary Breaux**'s "Never Can Say Goodbye" (**Zebra**), which powered 11-6* with an increase of +126 plays. Breaux's CD "Uptown Groove" jumped 14-9*. In a re-

cent conversation with **KTWV/L.A.** Asst. PD/MD **Ralph Stewart**, we touched on the now-outdated notion that covers reinforce the image of NAC as an "elevator music" format. "Hey," he noted emphatically, "if Zachary Breaux's rendition of 'Never Can Say Goodbye' is playing on an elevator, take me to the top so I don't miss a single soul-soaked note!"

Whitney Houston's passionate cover of the Four Tops' "I Believe In You And Me" (Arista) is MostAdded with eight new station reports, including WQCD/NY (adding with 17 plays), WNUA/Chicago (with eight), and WJJJ/Pittsburgh. In its third week of airplay, the track is up to 13 plays at WJZF/Atlanta and 12 at both WJCD/Norfolk and KCIY/Kansas City.

Last November, I recommended that programmers give **Curtis Mayfield's** "New World Order" CD (Warner Bros.) a listen. WJZF PD Mark Edwards — a man, in my opinion, blessed with prodigious ears — did just that and added the track "It's Love That We Needed."

When you receive the two-track pro from Gota (Instinct), bolt to your CD player immediately to review "European Comfort." This exceptional selection should be an instant add for discerning programmers formatwide. Great stuff!





"And I get to play music that I like. Glenn Goldstein, my agent, gets calls for me to do other things, but I'm doing what I like to do right now. Of course, if someone waved \$6 million in front of my face, I'd wear a flaming tampon up my ass and say it was the greatest thing in the world.'

Bru-Bites

One of Brutus's creative outlets is writing poems, such as parodies of Dr. Seuss that he used to do at WHJY/Providence. "It was 'Dr. Seuss: The Lost Manuscripts.' They were extremely rude, but very close to the originals. The story lines were almost the same; the syllabic metering was all the same. The result was the comedic juxtaposition that sounded exactly like Dr. Seuss except they were really disgusting.

"I wrote a lot of turkey poems for Thanksgiving and we played 'Tom Turkey Trivia.' For example, the big slab of skin under a turkey's beak reminds most Americans of a) Thanksgiving dinner or b) former president Ronald Reagan. Or the statement, 'I'd like more breast meat please,' is a term commonly overheard from a) the kiddie table or b) PamelaAnderson Lee's plastic surgeon.

"The important factor to bits like these is to have the music, sound effects, and everything else linked thematically. When you present a tightly knit, well-produced bit like that, it gives a much better flow to the show."

Lou describes two of his game creations: "Flatulence Of The Stars was where differ-

'Carte Blanche'

Station ownership — Evergreen Media — extends a broad measure of creative freedom. Brutus acknowledges it's one of the reasons for the station's

overall success. "I have carte blanche on whatever I want to say, topic-wise. Nobody tells me not to do anything. Certainly, [PD] Dave [Richards] and I will talk sometimes after the show, and he'll let me know if there was something that made him a little uncomfortable. But I trust him and his judgment completely — I'd follow him to hell and back."

The feeling is mutual, as Richards attests: "We have the best airstaff in America. The reason they're here is to entertain, not to read liner cards which I could do myself. Lou knows what he's doing and is so dedicated to entertaining his audience that when he gets in the studio at 2pm, he's already put six hours of work into preparing for a fourhour show.

In addition to his gig at WRCX, Brutus also hosts SW Networks' HardDrive. For both assignments, music is still the primary ingredient, so delivering his bits in the rightsized capsules is vital. He says, "I've been preparing things to work in short, measured doses for years. It's like anything else, once you get used to it you just tend to think that way.

You edit the bits that are too long, take out the parts you're unsure of. If you think something isn't that good, then drop it because

chances are everybody else is going to think it sucks. You have to be very critical.

Some people say that I do a morning show in the afternoon, but that's not right. This is not morning show bits done in the afternoon. The bits are tailored for the attention span of the audience in the afternoon. You don't have the luxury of time that people in the morning have, so you just keep that in mind when you're preparing your show."

Brutus starts each day by reading all the newspapers and wire services, like AP and UPI, which he gets via computer at home. The writing process begins with his tally of the day's topics, followed by specific bits on each subject. He uses a mixture of written elements and off-thecuff jokes.

"You also have to figure in what's happening on the phones," he adds. "Some days you have really good phones and everything else goes out the window. Sometimes I'll bounce a joke off [APD/MD middays] Jo [Robinson] or somebody out in the hallway just to get a read on what kind of reaction it'll get. Sometimes it won't sound right and will need more work."

Interview King

At last September's Rockstock (WRCX and WLZR/Milwaukee's joint, listener-appreciation concert), Brutus interviewed dozens of artists for both 'RCX and HardDrive. In preparation for the chore, Lou researched each band and found nonmusic items to talk about. "Bands tend to get asked a lot of the same questions all the time and after a while it becomes boring. I think that's why you find so many artists who don't want to do interviews, they've done too many bad ones.

"However, if an artist comes away having done a memorable interview with you, you're always going to get them for repeat visits. It makes them look good and they have fun. Too many people don't do any research or they over-research and then sit there and talk the whole time and won't let the guy get a word in edgewise."

The length of Brutus's interviews depends on each artist and to what degree the station has a vested interest in them. "The brand new bands with a song you've only played a few weeks will run the shortest, unless they're dramatically entertaining — but that's just common sense.

"If it's somebody your station has a stake in, and they have something to say, let them talk. When we had Slash in the station it was supposed to be 10 or 15 minutes, but he was telling stories about growing up around Chicago, spending his holidays here, where the good topless bars are, and that's the kind of thing you look for.

"Rockstock was a pretty weird animal because there were so many interviews all day. When you're not in the studio you have different factors to take into consideration, like the ambiance of the room and whether it'll be listenable or will there be noise bleeding in. Are the guys paying attention? Do you have to modify the questions to keep their attention? The dynamics change with each interview. But it comes down to whether the artists have something to say and whether they feel like talking.

"If a guy doesn't want to talk or has nothing to say, I won't bang my head against the wall. But some peo-

ple take longer to get going, and that's a different animal. Eddie Van Halen doesn't like doing interviews, not because he's an unfriendly guy, but he just feels uncomfortable doing them. He's not chatty or talkative by nature. But once you get somebody's trust and they're comfortable and they don't feel like they're doing an interview, then they tend to open up.

"

"Some people just hate doing interviews, and you're never going to get a good one out of them. Or if you do get it, it'll be with great difficulty. But on the rare occasions I've actually hit a wall with somebody, there's nothing you can do except get them the fuck off the air."

Of course, Brutus remembers a certain credo when all else fails. "Well, Robin Williams always said 'Kid, when you're not sure of what you're doing, always go for the dick jokes.' One of the laws of comedy I guess."



The New Year ... Re: Solutions

"Nothing a rating point won't fix," was how one of my early radio mentors described his attitude toward his station's "troubles." As we embark into 1997, that philosophy could apply to the Alternative format as a whole. Boy, wouldn't going up a point in the winter book be just swell?

A lot of programmers entered the fourth quarter in 1996 with the same kind of optimism. When many of that quarter's superstar releases failed to generate a level of success that was desperately hoped for, the format suffered. Conversations with PDs revealed a sense of disappointment as those programmers, admittedly, were banking on platinum home runs.

Will the first quarter of 1997 field a bumper crop of happening hits? Or will it yield a barren field of withered stiffs? We asked some major label execs to gives us their prognosis on the format's biggest upcoming releases.

Make Or Break Time

There is a collective sense at both

radio and at record labels that there is a lot at stake with the forthcoming spate of releases from U2, Live, Silverchair. Nine Inch Nails, and others. Columbia **Records** National Director/Alternative Promotion Jon Cohen recog-

nizes this issue. "It is in our collective best interests, by that I mean radio and records, to see that this first-quarter batch of big releases succeeds. It goes beyond any individual self-interest. It extends to the issues of the viability of the format overall. There is an opportunity to show everyone the format is going to be a player for the long-haul."



Cohen and Columbia have a stake

to claim of their own, that of the new

as to how a major label - some would use an intended derogatory term 'corporation' - handles this incredible indie success story. We are taking a record from one of the great independent, "street" successes ever and have the burden of ensuring that the band avoids any cynical tags of having 'sold out.'

Cohen is quick to rankle at that very same cynicism as he feels it is all too pervasive at the format. He charges, "As hard as we try to let the record speak for itself, there is no chance in hell that the format judges this record on its own merit. There is a skepticism that seems to pervade a number of opinion leaders at this format regarding any successful follow-up.

You can't shape and nurture follow-up records the way you can new releases. You can take months to develop a Primitive Radio Gods first

record. When it comes to platinum artists, radio is taking a similar approach to the way movies are allowed to develop. If it doesn't happen in the first weekend, it's over. But songs aren't like movies. One impression doesn't fulfill the listener's appreciation of a song. What we are seeing is the divergence of agendas between radio, with the pressure of four-week trends in ratings, and labels, who want to demonstrate conviction in their sense of artist development. I believe the two agendas have never been further apart."

Does Cohen recognize the major labels' part in creating this heightened scenario? "I will definitely concede that labels are at least partially guilty in creating an accelerated system that churns out records to radio. Labels need to be more selective about how many records they release. There is a flood of mediocre releases that dilute the importance of a major release. They also need to convey more passion to radio about the records they truly believe in.

"We are determined to set our own mandate for the Offspring record. We are thinking long-term in our strategies. We won't veer from our commitment. We want radio to know that. We won't compromise the vision of a selfsufficient band like Offspring.

Cream Rises To The Top

How does a label handle delivering a record when the benefit of being the "underdog" is gone, replaced by, in many cases, unrealistic expectations? Lisa Cristiano, National Director/Alternative at MCA, was involved in the development of Live with her work at MCA's associated label, Radioactive.

She recalls, "Live really was one of the band's that broke through in the new era by doing good, old-fashioned hard work. Their first record was good. and they toured relentlessly, building a great live reputation. The crux of their success last time wasn't a result of any accident. They delivered a brilliant record that exceeded the expectations of everyone. They had built a following of core fans and were ready to live up to the demands of their second record."

The question now becomes, at what point are we all guilty of expecting new releases from superstars to fulfill our exact expectations? Radio is notorious for wanting an artist to deliver their breakthrough hit, part II. Comparisons are always made, sometimes favorably, sometimes not. One vital element is almost always overlooked - the thrill of discovery. Alternative prides itself, rightfully, on finding and breaking new bands.

Balancing that quest for discovery with a fair appreciation of acts with brand names will be key to Alternative's survival. One brilliant young programmer recently posed an honest, sincere question to me when he asked. "Does every band Alternative plays need to become big?

No, but some do, thus allowing for greater mass acceptance of the format. No matter what we in the industry feel. many listeners are only so aware and informed.

In the case of a band like Live, Cristiano believes the commitment is warranted. "The most dependable way to overcome expectations is to satisfy them. The cream does rise to the top. We are genuinely floored by the music Live has given us. They took a longer time to make this record, and the results are apparent. It sounds like a cliche, but we're willing to let the music represent itself."

The Ultimate Arbiter

Epic VP/Alternative Stu Bergen feels confident that his release, Silverchair, is just beginning to garner an audience. Thus, he doesn't fear a letdown. "This a young band whose audience can grow up with them. We are doing everything we can to make the public aware of the return of Silverchair. This record is a huge priority for Sony Distribution. The feedback we've gotten from retail has been very encouraging. We want to do everything we can to make this record real for radio.'

Bergen knows the vital role Alternative radio played in Silverchair's success. Unlike some situations, where labels (or artists) release a so-called "image-enhancing" track to radio first, Bergen believes Epic went for the jugular with a radio-friendly release. "Radio sold a lot of records for Silverchair. That's why we didn't play any games



why not give it to them?"

Bergen believes Silverchair is even more prepared to succeed than last time. "This band loves to come to America to tour. They love coming to cities just to see other American bands that they've heard about. That youthful earnestness is infectious."

Full Circle

One record that has prognosticators debating furiously is the forthcoming release from Depeche Mode. As the new electronica movement gains favor, can we expect a nod of respect toward the founding forefathers, or will Alternative deal D'Mode its typical "that was yesterday" cynicism instead? Reprise National Director/Alternative Promotion Bob Divney hopes the time is right for the band's re-emergence. He allows, "Initially, we were apprehensive regarding how Alternative would view Depeche Mode's return. One basic issue is the amount of time they were away. Some of the new programmers have no first-hand sense of commitment, no real feel for the legacv of the act.'

Divney is eager to impart Depeche Mode's historical importance to the newer stations while acknowledging



to a contemporary audience. He says, 'There are some people who I can't expect to have a grasp of how huge this band is. How many new programmers witnessed them sell out the Rose

Bowl? How many really know the millions of records this band sold and how they did it by representing a true alternative to what was the mainstream in the late '80s and early '90s?

"Mainstream radio didn't play Depeche Mode for years. They became an Alternative icon in that sense. They represented what was Alternative. Now, with the hard-edged sound of "Barrel Of A Gun" [the first single], this band is totally relevant to what is happening at the format."

Lesson From The Masters

No band in history has ever done a better job at re-inventing themselves than U2. While many of their musical incarnations have challenged those wanting them to maintain (albeit great) status quo. U2 has demonstrated over the years a desire to remain in touch with what is contemporary. Can they do it again? Can they remain vital and relevant vet another time, in light of Alternative's tendency to cut short the warranty on most act's lifespans?

Howie Miura, Director/National Alternative Promotion at Island Records believes they can. He enthuses, "One reason for U2's continued acceptance has been their willingness to change. The band members are rabid fans of music and are aware of trends. They recognize their own power as leaders and aren't afraid to challenge the status quo. That fact has always been recognized by Alternative radio."

Nonetheless, the format has been putting its core artists to the test (of time) recently, so how confident is Miura that U2 can retain its hold while others relinquish it? He counters, "When you listen to "Discotheque" you hear a song that incorporates great, progressive dance elements into U2's sonic terrain. A long time ago, U2 opted to not stand still, and those creative decisions are paying dividends."

Will the format reap dividends from the first-quarter's musical offerings? Mark your calendars for the answer.
