

KOEL <u>News & Farm Programming</u>

One of the main reasons thousands of Northeast Iowa residents tune into KOEL - AM is for unmatched local news coverage. The man most responsible for getting the KOEL news department to where it is today is Dick Petrik. Dick came to KOEL in April of 1952, and retired from KOEL only a couple of years ago.

The KOEL news team works to bring hometown news to those who don't want to wait for the hometown newspapers. They make over 100 phone calls to police, fire, and sheriff's departments throughout Northeast lowa every day to gather the news.

Pam Ohrt took over as news director when Dick went into semi-retirement in the early 90's. Pam started at KOEL in 1976. Pam left the station in 1998. Roger King is the current News Director. Roger has been a part of the KOEL news team for over 10 years. The KOEL news department has had many reporters sit behind the microphone in the past 50 years, many of whom have moved on to larger markets for both radio and TV stations. KOEL started broadcasting farm news and markets in the late 1960s. Dave Sylvester was the station's first full-time Farm Director. Von Ketelsen filled Dave's shoes in the 90's until 1999 when Jerry Passer came aboard.

KOEL is one of the nation's leading farm news stations. KOEL - AM was one of the first radio stations to broadcast AgriTalk, a nationally broadcast talk show discussing farm related topics. The program which is hosted by Ken Root has been aired on KOEL - AM since the mid 1990's.



The 1960's were a decade of continued arowth and change for KOEL - AM. In 1961, Northeast Iowa Radio Corporation (the original investor group of Oelwein businesses), sold the radio station to Stuart Enterprises of Lincoln, Nebraska. General Managers at KOEL in the 60's included Dale Wood and Paul Ruse. In 1962 the transmitter power for the station was increased to the present 5000 watts. KOFI also began reporting farm news in the 60's. On May 15, 1968 a devastating tornado ripped through Oelwein and Maynard. KOEL was only off the air for 55 minutes, and played a key role in the recovery efforts. The radio station lost most of the roof of the downtown studios and one of the transmitting towers in the tornado.







The KOEL <u>Agri Expo</u>

One of the most popular events for the KOEL stations is the annual Agri-Expo. The event has been held every year since 1972. The first event was actually called "Farming For Profit". In 1972 the expo had 8 exhibitors in 1999 it includ-90 ed over ag related exhibitors. The event has been held in several different locations as the crowds continued to grow each year. The first two were held in the Coliseum in Oelwein. Then in 1974 and 1975 it was moved to the high school in Oelwein. Upper Iowa University in Fayette was home to the event from 1976 to 1987. Then in 1988 it was moved to its present home at Northeast Iowa Community College in Calmar. The KOEL Agri-Expo is the largest one day farm show in the state of lowa. In addition to the exhibits, those attending are treated to a free noon meal, and a featured speaker with ties to the farm community gives an address in the afternoon. Admission to the event is free.

The 20's

The 1970's saw many new opportunities for KOEL and a birth in the family. It was in December 1971 that KOEL - FM was born. KOEL - FM signed on the air with 100,000 watts of power playing country music, as it still does today. In 1976 the KOEL stations made the move to their "Radio Park" studios located next to City Park on the south edge of Oelwein. This was the first home for the stations that was built specifically for operating a radio station. The 1970's also brought about some familiar promotion events for the stations such as "The Ice Thing", "Key To Wheels", "The Great Bike Race", and the first KOEL AGRI - EXPO was held in 1972. KOEL -AM also joined the ABC Radio Networks in the early 70's, which brought a new voice to the airwaves in Northeast Iowa... Paul Harvey.





The 1980's were a decade of more changes for the KOEL stations. KOEL - AM started broadcasting 24 hours a day during this decade. Ownership of the stations changed twice between 1980 and 1990. Stuart enterprises stations sold the to DKM Broadcasting of Atlanta, Georgia in 1985. Then in 1987 a newly formed group Independence called Broadcasting Corporation from the East coast purchased the stations. A new sales office was opened in Cedar Falls in 1987 as the FM station began broadcasting on a new 1,000 foot tower. The first edition of the "KOEL Almanac" was published in 1985, and named in honor of News was Director. Dick Petrik.







Ownership again changed in 1996 as Independence Broadcasting sold the stations to another new organization Connoisseur Communications. based out of Connecticut. New changes in the laws governing radio stations now allow one company to own several radio stations in one market. Connoisseur Communications in turn grouped KOEL AM and FM with two other stations in the Waterloo market, where the KOEL FM studios are now located. In November 1999, Cumulus Broadcasting, which is the 2nd largest radio corporation in the country, entered into an agreement to purchase of the Connoisseur all Communications properties. The KOEL studios were upgraded to new digital technology in the mid 1990's. Most recorded programming you now hear on KOEL is played from a computer hard drive. KOEL - AM was honored with two prestigious awards from the National Association Of Broadcasters in the 90's ... The Marconi and The Crystal

Awards. Programming on KOEL - AM started the decade with an adult contemporary format, and is now programming all news and talk, which has become a very popular format across the country as the "baby boomers" are wanting more information and interesting conversation.


