Well, if it wasn't the WE FIVE it should have been as this young A&M recording group is causing much conversation in the music world.

It started approximately three years ago when Mike Stewart whose brother John is one-third of the famed Kingston Trio formed *The Ridge Runners*, a largely folk oriented group. Their first effort in a folk saturated field fell on deaf ears. John, who had great faith in his brother's ability, repeatedly brought his brother's group to the attention of Frank Werber, manager of the Kingston Trio. Months of hard work, endless hours of rehearsal, and countless revisions and refinements, resulted finally in the nucleus of an excitingly individual music concept. By this time, Werber had formed TRIDENT PRODUCTIONS, INC., a Kingston Trio owned independent production company and succeeded in obtaining the services of Don Graham as National Promotion Chief, and it was agreed to sign the group to a recording contract.

On April 20th, 1965, Werber brought WE FIVE into the Columbus Recording Studios in the basement of the Columbus Tower in San Francisco. Here, in the same area once occupied by the original Hungry i, in Trident's new ultra modern studio, the initial recording steps began.

After six long hours spent in total dedication to the final product, the record was as ready as human effort could make it. This was WE FIVE in *Thought and Soul*. This was *You Were on My Mind*."

With the new record completed, it now became the job of Trident Productions to arrange for distribution through a national record company. After close scrutiny of all companies in business today, A&M Records became "most likely to succeed." This enthusiastic young company, owned and operated by Jerry Moss and Herb Alpert, who had experienced a phenomenal two and a half year growth with Tijuana Brass, agreed that the sound of WE FIVE generated such

BEETHOVEN OUTSELLS BEATLES!

Beethoven was never like this. Youngsters and adults alike crowded and jam-packed Central Park in New York City for what was billed as just an ordinary outdoor concert by the New York Philharmonic. They stood for hundreds and thousands of feet back and craned their necks toward

the podium especially set up for the occasion for this great outdoor concert. Beethoven's Ninth Symphony rolled off before 70,000 bending pairs of ears and the audience appreciatively yelled for more. The bravos took over as the symphony orchestra began the first of a series of weekly planned concerts in several different New York City boroughs. The same concert with the Beethoven itinerary was repeated on Staten Island, the Bronx and in Brooklyn's Prospect Park.

"Who said the classics were dead?" Those were the words of one British sailor who stopped in to get an earful of the Central Park proceedings.

"Man, I dig this the most!" said one Village beatnik making his way to the front in a milling throng.

One lady said she never had been so storm-tossed at a concert before but she seemed to enjoy every minute. From every part of the New York area, they thronged and they wanted more and more.

Following the lead of the classic turn of late in Great Britain, American classic expression has certainly found a real outlet with these free park concerts.

We talked with Don Graham, National Promotion Chief, just before going to press, and Don tells us to watch for WE FIVE soon to be seen on night time national television very soon.

WE FIVE consists of Mike Stewart, leader and arranger, Bob Jones the baritone-tenor of the group, Pete Fullerton a fine tenor, Jerry Burgan the other tenor of the group and of course Beverly Bivens lead singer

with a vocal range of low tenor to high soprano, and we might add, Beverly Bivens is one of the best lead voices to come along in a long time. While she sings lead singer, she is always mindful of the rest of the group and does not "drown" them out as many lead singers do. And this is what makes WE FIVE we think, such a "BOSS" sound around the Bay Area.

Peter, Paul and Mary, and Tony Bennett have accepted invitations to appear in the Royal Variety Show in London next month, cables Lance Fielding.


They join the cast, picked from the world's finest entertainers, which will be seen by the Queen at the London Palladium on November 8.

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seeing about your eyes

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1 Smooth white shadow on the entire lid, dab powder over it. 2 With brown powdered shadow make an arc just above the fold in the lid. Use grey or black if you prefer. 3 Apply a light-coloured eye-shadow or liquid make-up to the area below the line and above the lid. 4 If you use false lashes, apply them now. Put them as near to your own lashes as possible then trim to suit your own lashes. 5 With a liquid or cake liner and a thin brush draw a fine line directly above the lashes—don't extend this any further than the corner of your eye. 6 Apply mascara (most model girls get a good effect with the block type). Two thin coats is better than one thick one. 7 The final touch—a little colour on the eyebrows (if needed). Don't make hard lines. Use the pencil in fine strokes to give a feathery effect.



Singer GLEN YARBROUGH, who was seen in concert Saturday evening October 16 at U.C.'s Harmon Gym, is no newcomer to the music world.

After many years in the singing world beginning at Grace Church in New York to the month of May in 1959 when a chance meeting in "Cosmo Alley" a Los Angeles night club, brought Glen the friendship of a man named Lou Gottlieb, himself a well known name in the music world, along with Alex Hassilev and the rest is history.

Organized as the LIMELITERS, these three men in the next four years became one of the most popular folk-singing groups in the nation. The

outstanding solo voice in the group, Glen was the featured performer on all ballads and it was his voice that gave the Limelitters' sound its unmis-

takable soaring quality.

In spite of the group's success, by the summer of 1963 Glen had decided that it was time to move on. He explains that the excitement of performing with a group was beginning to wane. He was bored with folk music, tired of traveling and itching to see if he could make it as a single. And make it he has, with all albums currently selling well and a full schedule of concert, television and

nightclub appearances in the months ahead.

One thing is certain, however, no matter where Glen goes he will continue to be his own man — determined to be casual, determined to be free. And no matter what the future brings, Glen will continue to sing for he has to open his mouth to let the music pour out of his heart, as you can hear by his latest RCA Victor album *It's Gonna Be Fine*.

The colleges are Utah States University, Logan, Utah (1); University of Nevada, Reno (5); University of Pacific, Stockton, Calif. (6); Bakers-



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
