Actors who appear regularly are listed in the premiere cast, then subsequently referred to as "regulars". Live shows are listed in caps in the left column; filmed shows are in upper and lower case letters, underlined.

Only first runs of a film series are listed. Running character series (not anthology), usually staff-written shows, and other programs which use regulars, are listed only when the names of extra actors are available.
