The list includes: Sam Cooke, The Eberly Brothers, The Rays, Bobby Helms, the Crickets, Della Reese, Joe Bennett and the Sparkletones, The Platters, Jo Stafford, Tony Bennett, Teresa Brewer, Spike Jones, Louis Jordan and his Tympany Five, Frankie Lymon, Georgia Gibbs, Gene Vincent, the Four Aces and Lu Ann Simms. Any other acts that start to move up the best seller record lists will also be signed as soon as their popularity is evident. If many of the names in the list seem familiar, it's because lots of them have been moving around on other musicvariety shows, filling the spot that is hailed as, "and here he is, singing his latest hit record." The stars of the music shows are the ones who sing the standards. Meanwhile, no word from Steve Allen.

The Dec 20 Du Font Show of the Month, Fridays, 7:30-9pm NYT, will co-star Joan Bennett, Bob Cummings, Paul Ford and Carol Lynley in "Junior Miss" from Hollywood. Ralph Nelson will direct......The second Lucille Ball-Desi Arnaz Show, this one at the planned one-hour length, will be seen on the CBS net on Dec 3, Tuesday, 9-10pm NYT.....Rosemary Clooney has joined the parade in announcing her starring acts up to the first of the year. (Some Hollywood agents have released their stars' TV itineraries for several months ahead to invite bids from some of the less lucky shows for the free dates that might show up in the schedule). The Clooney guest list will include her sisters Gail and Betty and brother Nick on her Thanksgiving family show on Nov 28, Merie Wilson on December 5, Charles Laughton on December 12 and youngsters Patty McCormack and Tim Hovey on December 19 for a special Christmas show. Spring Byington will close the Clooney year as a special pre-New Year's guest on December 26.

NBC's Tonight has not only gotten back into some of the cities that cancelled the pre-Jack Paar version (even Boston returns to the fold next week), but the pre-Christmas selling season starts to fill its advertiser bank next week, with several of the orders running into next season. (Paar won't be able to mention headaches on the air any more without taking an immediate cure -- Bufferin will be one of the new advertisers). The impressive list of new sponsors represents a total of four million dollars in new billings, split among seven firms. Block Drug Co., Inc, thru Sullivan, Stauffer, Colwell & Bayles, Inc(NY) is buying 234 participations over 52 weeks starting Dec 30. Bristol-Myers Co thru Young & Rubicam, Inc(NY) ordered 208 participations over 52 weeks for Bufferin and 28 participations for Ipana during the last quarter of the year, with both schedules starting Monday (11). Phillips Co thru C. J. Ia Roche & Co., Inc(NY) for the Norelco Electric Shaver, has ordered 115 participations for the Spring and Fall of 1958. Harrison Laboratories, Inc thru Product Services, Inc(NY) ordered 42 participations between Nov 15 and Dec 31 for its Ten Day Press On Nail Color and Tuck Cellophane Tape. The Polaroid Corp., long a Tonight advertiser, has ordered an additional 40 participations thru Doyle Dane Bernbach, Inc(NY), beginning Jan 6, 1958. Bymart-Tintair, Inc thru Product Services, Inc(NY) has ordered 26 participations, beginning immediately and Webcor, Inc., thru John W. Shaw Advertising, Inc(Chi) has ordered 21 participations for pre-Christmas promotion starting Nov 12.

That ticklish switch in the storyline of the <u>Lassie</u> series had an actual unwanted assist when George Cleveland, who played "Gramps" in the current series, died. The new members of the cast, joining Lassie's new master, Jon Provost, in the Dec lepisode, as Jan Clayton, Tommy Rettig and the late Mr. Cleveland bow out. The storyline explains it: Due to the untimely death of Gramps (George Cleveland) the Miller family is forced to give up the farm and move to the city so Jeff (Tommy Rettig) can attend high school. Little Timmy (Jon Provost) runs away when he hears that the welfare agency will not permit him to remain with Ellen (Jan Clayton). The next day, Paul (Jon Shepodd) and Ruth Martin (Cloris Leachman), the young couple taking over the Miller farm arrive and help search for Timmy. A water rescue and some debate and the new storyline is resolved when it is decided that Timmy and Lassie will remain at the farm with the Martins. Of course, no matter how many times it might be explained, most of the steady viewers of the series won't believe that George Cleveland actually died, and the producers will probably be berated for "killing off" Gramps.

There's another Bowl game on the television schedule for this season. NBC will present the first telecast of the Senior Bowl game, the ninth annual, on Saturday, Jan 11, 3pm NYT. The game features squads from the North and South (and a few players from East and West schools) playing at Mobile, Ala., with professional coaches for the squads. The fifty participating players actually make their professional debuts, with the winners each receiving \$500 and the losers \$400. Since they're all seniors who have finished their college football careers, and as the game follows all the "amateur" bowl games, star players from most of the other bowl contests participate in this one and get an above-the-table pay check.

No one can say that Hollywood isn't operating on a reciprocal trade basis. The Roller Derby, which has been on the West Coast for the past three years, returns to local New York TV over WABC-TV(NY) on Dec 29, Sunday, 3-4:30pm, and will be seen for 26 weeks. Three years of campaigning haven't changed the leading performers, since the "New York" Chiefs will be led by Gerry Murray and Billy Bogash and the "Brooklyn" Red Devils will be led by Toughie Brasuhn and Ken Monte. While NBC was officially announcing the appointment in Los Angeles last week of Jess Oppenheimer as head of a newly established creative programming unit within the NBC television network, reporting to Manie Sacks, it was also reported that Alan Livingston, v.p. in charge of NBC programming in Los Angeles, was preparing up to 11 new projects for the network for next season. According to one report, one of the projected tasks is the "development of a comedian for live TV."
