Global TV has been given the OK to distribute its signal in encoded form via satellite to its transmitters, to cable systems throughout Ontario, and to other stations holding rights to Global shows. Cancom, Baton and CTV opposed, seeing the move as a strategy to extend Global nationally; the CRTC said it does not intend to authorize any extension beyond Ontario... Fabmar Investments Ltd. has purchased 90% of the voting shares of CHMG St. Albert (AB). The sale by Western World was a divestment as a result of WW's purchase of CJCA/CIRK-FM Edmonton... CFEK Fernie and CJEK Sparwood have become full-time rebroadcasters of CKEK Cranbrook, BC, having ceased local programming... CIDC-FM Orangeville, ON, has increased hits from 50% to 66% in an attempt to win some of the 70% of locals who tune other stations. CIDC has recorded losses for five years...

Elvis Lives: CKIS-FM Montreal gave away \$1,000 a day, beginning March 1st. (Promotion director Walter Levitt didn't say how long this largesse would last.) The giveaway was designed to keep listeners tuned for Elvis songs... 'Oldies 990' also reports that it raised over \$30,000 in the 2nd annual Valentine's request-o-thon. Proceeds go to the Starlight Foundation, which assists critically ill children... And here's a great promotion by CICS Stratford: Elvis expert Steve Christopher was brought in to do a 4-hour show, Elvis on the Air from the Stratford Home & Garden Show. Steve offered to buy a new car for any listener who requested a legitimate Elvis release that he did not have in his collection. That evening, he followed up as D) of an all-Elvis dance party at a local restaurant & bar...

After 21 years, Jan Van Bruchem signed off his *Dutch Treat* show on **CJVB Vancouver** on March 26. In 1972, Jan mortgaged everything he owned to raise \$125,000 to start CJVB. As you've read in BT, he's now sold the multilingual station for \$5.1 million to a partnership largely made up of Chinese investors. In recent years, Chinese programming has

increased to 12 hours a day on 1470...

CITI-FM Winnipeg notes it became the first Winnipeg station to win honors as "Canada's Rock Station of the Year". CITI's Ross Winters was named Rock PD of the Year in the music industry awards... And, as you must know by now, the gang at CIZZ-FM Red Deer was mighty happy to get #1 station in the small market (under 300,000) category for the second year in a row, along with Rob Robson taking PD of the year...

The growth of aboriginal broadcasting in Canada is a largely untold story (BT hopes to change that in the near future). A vast northern wilderness is now served by hundreds of TV and radio transmitters owned by native organizations. Usually of low power, they both originate local programming and carry aboriginal network productions. Among FMs currently being added: 6 for Native Communication Inc., Manitoba; 18 for Aboriginal Multi-Media Society of Alberta; and 11 for Northern Native Broadcasting in BC...

CKVR-TV Barrie and Breakthrough Films, with the support of the Senior's Secretariat of Health & Welfare Canada, recently produced Coming of Age. The 85-minute movie stars Jan Rubes and Marion Gilsenan as seniors who fall in love. It's hoped there will be a network airing... Kudos also go to CKVR for producing two 30-minute shows featuring local winners in the Kiwanis Music Festival... Another great musical event, staged by CHOK Sarnia, won recognition recently from CAB. The annual Camlachie Jamboree presented 12 bands and 12 hours of non-stop country and oldies music. More than \$6,000 was raised for Optimist youth work. CHOK staffers Dave Curtis, Paul Godfrey, Rick Burrows and Gary Connors were in the lead band...

Cooperative Radio Restigouche Ltee of Campbellton, NB, has applied for FM at Balmoral, 7,295 watts on 103.9 MHz (channel 280)... Alberta's new premier, one-time TV reporter Ralph Klein, has been appearing weekly on CITV Edmonton and CKKX-TV Calgary. His Ask Ralph is a three-minute answer to a single queston selected from viewer mail. The opposition parties say it gives Klein an unfair advantage, but News VP Mark Jan Vrem of CITV says it's a form of direct democracy... BT

It didn't and she went to the switchboard at CKLW Windsor. From there it is a long story to how she became music programmer and a kingmaker, but she did, and ruled through the Big 8's great days. Rosalie's induction into the Broadcast Hall of Fame was one of the most emotional ever... Peter Steinmetz, former president of CARAS, was inducted to the Music Industry Hall of Fame... CIZZ-FM Red Deer won yet again as a small-market station of the year... There was a boost at the conference for Kim Zayak, former (fired) promotion director for Sony. The Sony promotions department won the award for the Major Record Company Promotion Team of the year and en masse walked over and presented the award to Kim.

Tom Tompkins loves a challenge. Having helped put CISS-FM Toronto on air, now he's part of a group putting together an application for a TV country channel, sort of a Nashville Network North with Cancon. Also in the project are Thompson MacDonald, whom many will remember as news VP at CFCN Calgary, and Spence Bozek. If the group gets a licence, Tom will be VP programming. Otherwise, he says, he'll be just another bum looking for a job...

Changes at Rawlco: **Keith James** moved from GM of CISS-FM Toronto to executive director of communications, where, says president **Gordon Rawlinson**, he will be ambassador to the outside world and liaise with the industry. **Sandy Davis** transferred from his PD position at CJMJ-FM Ottawa to become GM at CISS. **Kent Newson** replaced Sandy; he comes from CFMC Saskatoon, where **Jamie Wall** will take over as PD. CFGO-AM Ottawa also got a new PD in **Kim Somers**, who was assistant PD at Majic FM.

Yellowhead Broadcasting and the YR group celebrated their 25th year as "the voice of West Central Alberta" on April 3. I've promised to go to the 50th anniversary -- if I'm invited and if GM Mel Lazarenko serves real Champagne, not the stuff made in Grande Prairie... I've mentioned Vic Dubois is now GM of Western World's Saskatchewan division. At the same time, Dean Sinclair moved from AM106 Calgary to become ops manager at CKCK/CKIT-FM Regina, and Bob Fisher from CJOB Winnipeg became GSM for all Saskatchewan.

Peter Krabinsky, a 21-year-old Saskatoon high-school student, found himself abruptly becoming a TV talent-show host. STV picked him for *The Undiscovered*, a 13-part series featuring talented high-school rock bands and vocalists in Regina and Saskatoon. Gord and his wife had a new baby not long ago, to join his almost grown-up family, and morning shifts don't always go well with new babies... Jungle Jay Hamilton moved from afternoon drive to mornings... Popular CP/BN Edmonton bureau chief Heather Boyd moves to Ottawa as deputy bureau chief this summer; Gerry Arnold will move in from Ottawa.

Troy Reeb is now ND at CFOK Westlock, from CHSN-FM Saskatoon... Ray Stout, former ND at CHUB Nanaimo, has left... CHFM Calgary PD Gerry Seimens says he was happily surprised by reaction to CHFM's Southern Alberta Songwriting Competition. After just two weeks, he estimated 60-75 entries, many of good quality. The winner(s) should be announced by early May; Gerry expects finished product by the end of August. He wants fees private broadcasters are demanding from cable operators also directed to the public broadcaster, along with longer-term government financing. But CCTA President **Ken Stein** said, "The CBC now gets nearly a billion dollars in 'fees' from Canadians already. That ought to be enough"...

Toronto Women in Film and Television wants a specialty TV channel designed for women, as a right and because it's good business. **Barbara Barde** said: "We have the right to watch our own stories, hear our issues discussed and have opportunities to author our images. The current state of broadcasting is a far cry from that goal." She said the women's channel should be carried on basic cable. The organization, which represents female producers, directors, distributors, crews and entertainment lawyers, has no plans to apply for a licence. But the group recommended the commission order cable firms to contribute \$100 million a year to a Canadian programming fund, part of which would be set aside for programs created by women...

Earlier, the CAB told the commission cable firms should pay broadcasters up to \$200 million a year for the right to pick up their signals and retransmit programs to cable subs...

TV pioneer John Walson Sr. succumbed to liver cancer at the age of 78 in Allentown, Pa. The former appliance store owner is widely regarded as the founder of cable television in the 1940s... Coming up this August, 64-year-old Joe Franklin, TV's longest-running talk show host, retires. He hasn't missed a day in 43 years of his New York-based show...

CHSC St. Catharines jock **Tim Lock** hoaxed media newsrooms across Ontario with a faxed story of a new federal political party seeking to represent young Canadians. The 'leader of the New Canada Party' claimed his parents were wealthy Beatles fans who had their name legally changed to that of drummer Ringo Starr. PD **Ted Yates** said an "innocent prank" got "a little out of hand"...

MEMEX TO SUPPLY DIRECTV

Memex Software Inc. of Vancouver will supply the traffic and scheduling system for DirecTv Inc., slated to launch its 150-channel DBS service early in 1994. VP Larry Driscoll credits Memex with "impressive capabilities to handle multiple channels in an integrated system." Long-time broadcaster Don M.E. Hamilton is chairman of Memex, established in 1987.

SOVCAN JOINT VENTURE

Four Canadian firms are involved in a joint venture with government agencies of the Commonwealth of Independent States and a Russian manufacturing association, NPO PM. NPO PM builds and operates satellites; the Canadian firms are ComDev, a supplier of satellite equipment, CanCom, Spar Aerospace, and General Discovery Canada, which promotes Soviet-Canadian business projects. The consortium has named a U.S. firm, Vista Satellite Communications of Florida, to market three transponders available in mid-1993 for coverage of the Pacific Ocean region.

ABL Canada Inc. of Montreal is supplying video coders and decoders for Britain's new Channel 4 network, described as "the world's most advanced digital TV network." Channel 4 is also building all-digital studio facilities, to be ready in 1995... Archive Films has closed its Toronto office.
