CBC BUDGET GETS REPRIEVE: With the appointment of Tony Manera as president, the CBC appears to have been given assurances of stable funding by the new federal government. Cuts of \$100 million in the CBC's annual budget of \$1.1 billion a year will now be spread over a 5-year period; but Manera will still have to cope with the effects of inflation and a shortfall of least \$90 million for the 1995-96 fiscal year.

TELEMEDIA TO BUY CJEZ-FM TORONTO: Confirming years of speculation, Telemedia Inc. is moving to buy CJEZ-FM from Redmond Broadcasting. CEO James McCoubrey says the FM is "an excellent strategic fit" with Telemedia's AM 1430 "The Fan". Bob Redmond - who also owns FM stations in Calgary and St. Catharines, and an AM in Simcoe - says the new owners will help 'EZ "achieve its full potential." 'EZ won CRTC approval for a power increase from 4 to 28.9 kw last fall, along with a reduction in its Canadian talent commitment from \$130,000 a year to \$28,000. Telemedia owns 26 radio stations in Ontario and Québec... Meanwhile, Z97.3 has hired Charlie O'Brien from CKLW Windsor to take over the afternoon shift; he joins the line-up of morning man Tom Rivers and new midday host Shelley Wright. Promotion director Walter Levitt also tells BT that Z97.3 is being heard in all Cineplex Odeon theatres in Toronto.

CKCK-TV Regina 40th Anniversary: Western Canada's first privately-owned TV station, CKCK-TV went on the air July 27/54. All staff alumni are invited to a reunion on May 21 contact Dorothy Dunne at (306) 569-2000 for information... Big Ratings for Winter Olympics: Nearly six million Canadians tuned in to CTV for the opening ceremonies of the Winter Olympics, with an average of 1.9 million. Average daytime audience for the first two days was 1.6 million... Speaking of ratings: CISL Vancouver showed a 55% increase in morning ratings last fall, after Red Robinson took over the show. Its sister station, CKZZ showed a 43% increase in number of listeners to 287,300. The top 5 FMs (12+) were: Z95.3 9.4; CKKS 7.7; CHQM 7.0; CFMI 6.6; CFOX 5.8... An interesting twist to the Access Network story: one of the applicants for a national pay-TV channel, Canadian Learning TV Network is offering to maintain some Access programming if it gets a licence. CLTV, a partnership of Ron Keast of Vision TV and CHUM Ltd., says it could use the Alberta facilities... Another proposal is that Alberta's private broadcasters would make time available for Access programming... CRTC Activity: Radiomutuel Inc. has applied for a change in daytime coverage for CJMS Montreal to improve service to the south shore area; also for a power increase at CJMM-FM-1 La Sarre, Québec, from 46.8 to 2476 watts... Regina FMs CHMX (Harvard) and CKIT (Western World) have both filed their bids for changing formats from pop-rock-dance to country. CKIT is asking that \$91,600 expenditures on Canadian talent development be deferred to the next licence term; CHMX is committing to an increase from \$6,000 a year to \$25,600... Recent decisions: FM approved for CHLO St. Thomas (from 1570 to 103.1 with 16.7 kw ERP); among those opposing was the Christian Institute of Broadcasting which requested a delay to allow consideration of an application for a Christian station... CFVD Dégelis, Québec, will move from AM to FM, but was required to change the proposed contours to exclude parts of New Brunswick; broadcasters

in that area said the expanded coverage would be harmful to their operations... Other approvals: Transfer of control of CKDM Dauphin to Jos. & Marguerite Maillard... A new FM for Native Communications at Thompson, MB, 86w on 96.3; it will produce 72 hrs/week of local programming. Also, Northern Native Broadcasting of Terrace will add 13 10-watt FMs in BC. Native FMs have also been approved at Igaluit, NWT, Meander River, AB, and Wiarton, ON... Recent CRTC denials include applications for a new FM at Whitehorse, YT, and a rebroadcaster at Gascons, PQ, for CIEU-FM Carlton; the latter would have extended coverage into the area served by CHNC New Carlisle... Over \$25,000 was raised by CHIN Toronto in its 2-day Variety Children's Radiothon; Johnny Lombardi was host of the multicultural segment of the Variety Telethon which raised \$4 million. In an earlier Radiothon, CHIN raised over \$30,000 for the Caritas Project, a drug rehabilitation program... The first Indian station in the Maritimes, CICU-FM Eskasoni, NS, is on the air in Cape Breton. It broadcasts 65% in Micmac from the basement of manager Greg Johnson's home... The CBC has dropped local newscasts at five Newfoundland stations. Instead, news originating in St. John's will be augmented by reports from the stations, without cuts in staff... Stateside: WBZ-TV Boston is getting more audience for its 11 pm newscast through a deal with WSBK-TV, which airs WBZ-TV news at 10 pm. Similar partnerships have been formed in other U.S. cities: the network stations gain audience and revenue, while the independents avoid the high cost of news shows. BT



A week before Christmas, staff delivered more than 200 teddy bears to the children's wards of four hospitals. CFRN asked listeners to mail in a Christmas wish and did its best to grant as many as possible. It was the second year of the campaign and 21 wishes were granted, including paying \$5,000 in postage so an Edmonton woman could send boxes of collected toys to the Ukraine for Christmas, reuniting a mother and daughter for Christmas by flying the mother to England, and supplying blankets and toys for all the animals in the SPCA over Christmas. CFRN is also involved in Coats for Kids, in which people drop off old coats at Page the Cleaner stores where they are cleaned and given to local charities.

- CISN-FM/CHQT EDMONTON gave a coffee mug to listeners who dropped off clothing for the Salvation Army, and raised well over a ton of winter boots, mitts, hats and coats. CISN also raised \$34,000 for the Christmas bureau through the sale of celebrity items, mostly autographed, during its 3rd annual celebrity auction televised on the community cable channel. CHQT raised another \$37,000 in its 20th annual Brightest Light campaign in conjunction with Edmonton firehalls.
- CHIN TORONTO raised more than \$30,000 during its 3rd annual radiothon for Caritas, concluding with a concert of classical music. The Caritas project helps drug addicts particularly from the Italo-Canadian community.
- CHAM HAMILTON has for 14 years supported and promoted Operation Santa Claus, in which Hamilton character Jimmy Lomax takes six weeks vacation from his Stelco job to coordinate and distribute toys, clothing and care packages to the needy. Last year, with the support of the community, CHAM helped provide toys, household items, clothing and food for 53,000 people through 29 agencies. CHAM and a grocery chain, The Barn, raised another 1,100 kg of food for local foodbanks, although promotions co-ordinator Brenda Hazell says foodbank support is a year-round program that all Hamilton stations support.
- CKGL/CHYM-FM KITCHENER: CHYM worked with the McDonald's Gift of Christmas toy drive and created its own drive through an At Work Network. About 7,000 toys were collected through 75 member offices and distributed by the Salvation Army. Sister station CKGL focussed on a Secret Santa Drive for children served by family and children's services, resulting in 500 toys being collected over two weeks at six Canadian Tire locations. In the Country 570/United Way Operation Cover-Up, 12,000 coats were collected; 10,000 were distributed through a store-front mall location and 2,000 by service organizations.
- CFMI-FM VANCOUVER auctioned strange gifts during its 12 Hours of Christmas Fundraiser for the Vancouver Food Bank. Included were Montreal Canadien Patrick Roy's autographed goalie stick, a Roland Music Keyboard signed by Billy Joel, a Harley Davidson leather jacket autographed by Bon Jovi, a road hockey game against Geoff Courtnall and three other Vancouver Canucks and a cow print apron signed by Aerosmith.
- CJOH-TV and CJMJ-FM OTTAWA: combined in the 2nd year of a *Toy Mountain* campaign that brought 142,000 toys to 11 participating shopping centres; the toys were distributed by the Salvation Army Christmas toy program. It was recognized as one of the top 60 promotions around the world by Promax International in Image Magazine. It ran from Nov. 15 to Dec. 17 and was promoted with a full-length music video produced

and aired by CJOH-TV and used to acknowledge 26 corporate sponsors, and with a locally produced Toy Mountain song. The campaign was extended into the business community through a Canada Post At Work Santa Program that encouraged workers to collect toys. A new element was introduced in 1993 - a free 'Friends of Toy Mountain' Benefit Concert sponsored by Canadian Tire at the Ottawa Congress Centre. The artists performed free. Ticket sales and the sale of Toy Mountain song cassettes and sweatshirts raised \$3,000; the sweatshirts were also sold by direct mail raising another \$450. Supplementary materials included custom stationary, order forms and envelopes produced in-house by CJOH-TV. Posters designed by CJOH-TV were printed free to use as P.O.P. materials in shopping centres and At Work Santa Kits. A Courier company donated its services as the official Toy Mountain Express to pick up toy donations. Many have already offered help for the next campagin and there's interest in taking the idea to other centres this year.

 CHCH-TV Hamilton joined forces for the sixth year with the Hamilton-Wentworth regional police and the Greater Hamilton Food Share in a Christmas food drive that brought in 5,000 kg. of food. The campaign ended with a public singa-long at police headquarters on Christmas Eve.

CHCH-TV revamped its evening news: the 7-8 pm national show, Canada Tonight, moved to 6:30-7 pm, preceded by First Edition at 5:30 (local and regional) and The Evening News at 6 (focussing on Ontario). The half-hour Canada Tonight, hosted by Tony Parsons, has done well on WIC's Alberta stations.

'QM Now CHMB: After 24 years, CHQM Vancouver went off the air at 9 pm February 9th and multilingual CHMB went full-time (previously, the new owners had leased the night hours). Much of the old CHQM 'Quality Music' format is now on Q104-AM, the old 'Coast 1040'... CHUM Ltd. retains CHQM-FM, along with CFUN-AM... Among those now off the air with 'QM-AM is Andy Walsh, one of the nicest people and most mellifluous voices in radio. Andy started his radio news career in Cornwall in 1951 at CKSF (now CJSS), moved to Sault Ste. Marie, then to CFRA Ottawa (when Fred Davis moved to Toronto), and via CJAD Montreal to Vancouver.

Murray Brookshaw is now PD for three of CHUM's four Windsor stations, replacing Charlie O'Brien and Michelle Denomme at CKKW, CKLW-FM and CIMX-FM. Wayne McLean is PD of CKLW... When I wrote, Gerry Forbes was likely on his way to become morning host at Edmonton's The Bear, managed by Gerry's brother Marty Forbes, Gerry has worked for Standard before and decided he's more comfortable with a music

especially hit French-language stations such as CFMT-TV (TVA Network) and Radio-Québec (Educational TV)...



A tip of the hat to Saint John bureau chief John Miller, and to Vaughn Sullivan, the first announcer hired by CBA when it moved to Moncton back in 1968.


