YOU WOULD never guess it from the photograph, but this young Toronto radio actress, SANDRA SCOTT, says she seldom sees a microphone without feeling a pang of fear. Her ambition is clear and straightforward—"to become a better actress" and judging from the demand for her talent, which has been steady ever since her debut in the spring of 1945, she is well on the way. Drama series directed by Andrew Allan, CBC supervisor of drama; music by Lucio Agostini. From Toronto. A radio adaptation by Drew Crossan of Henrik Ibsen's play, A Doll's House. Cast: Nora—Sandra Scott; Helmer—John Drainie; Christine Linde—Ruth Springford; Nils Krogstad—Alan King; Dr. Rank—Budd Knapp. Drew Crossan, author of this adaptation, is a CBC producer. He began his work on Ibsen's play while studying at the Toronto Academy of Radio Arts. Joining the CBC, getting married, welcoming his first-born, and finding a home delayed the work for more than a year. Settled at last at Lake Wilcox, Ontario, Crossan finished the script and took a copy to Andrew Allan. Allan was out. Crossan left the script in his desk. The same night Crossan's Lake Wilcox home was burned to the ground and everything lost, including the notes and master script of the radio version of A Doll's House. Allan, however, read the surviving copy and accepted it for Stage 49. He describes it as "an honest and perceptive adaptation by a man who realizes that Ibsen is a great dramatist and that nothing should be allowed to stand between him and the listener."

The Prairie Gardener

Summary Of Broadcast Of May 1, 1949.

Some May Gardening Activities:

1. *Thorough preparation of the soil* before seeding is the most important job for the gardener in early May. In easily worked, sandy loam soils shallow cultivation is sufficient but in heavy soils spading to a depth of nine or ten inches is necessary. But in either case the soil must be made firm after working to reduce moisture losses through excessive aeration. If manure is added in the spring it should be finely divided, well rotted, and evenly incorporated in the soil.

2. *Weed control* during May and early June is much more effective and less labour-consuming than later in the season. Sowing seeds should be delayed if soil is full of weed seeds until the first crop of weed seeds has germinated and the seedlings killed by shallow surface cultivation. Then sowing should be done with the least possible disturbance of the soil. Deep cultivation to kill weeds brings fresh seeds nearer the surface where they will germinate a second crop of weeds.

3. *Sowing seeds* is not to be done carelessly or without consideration of the size of seed, the right depth to sow and the most suitable rate. Small seeds must be sown close to the surface, a half inch being suggested as the greatest depth, that will likely yield satisfactory results. Avoid deep seeding but leave the soil firm after seeding to keep moisture rising in the soil around the seeds.

4. *Early May sowings* likely to involve some frost on the seedlings should be limited to frost-hardy things, i.e.—vegetables: radish, parsley, cress, spinach, etc.; flowers: alyssum, candy tuft, clarkia, larkspurs, poppies, sweet-peas, sweet sultans, etc. Frost-tender crops such as beans and cucumbers should not be sown until the latter part of May or even early June. But where successive sowings or plantings are to be made (corn, potatoes, gladioli) some gambling with frost is permissible, provided main plantings are made after danger of heavy frost damage is past.

5. *Do not be in a rush* to set out tomato plants during the first warm spell. Hold tender plants under cover until the soil warms up and danger of frost is well past.

6. *If early started plants indoors* are becoming too tall transplant them into boxes or pots with more space between plants.

7. *Watch out for cutworms.* Spread poison bait thinly along garden rows. Use one teaspoonful of Paris Green to one quart of bran. Moisten slightly after mixing.

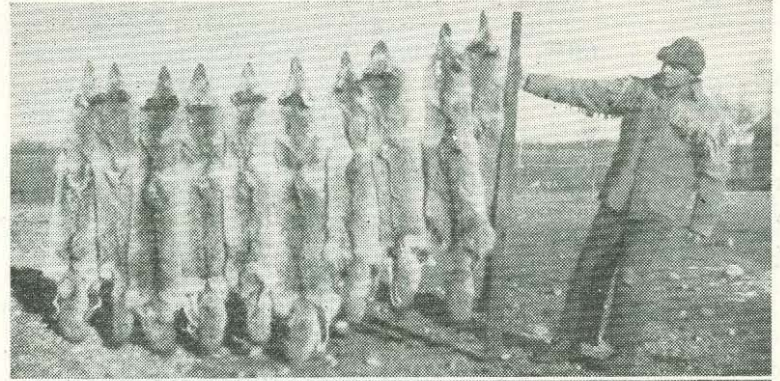
obtain an airline and telephone service. Their current objective is a community centre. From Vancouver.

Ouimet Named CBC TV Co-ordinator

Dr. Frigon Announces New Appointment

Ottawa, April 26—Dr. Augustin Frigon, General Manager of the CBC, today announced that Alphonse Ouimet will act as a Co-ordinator of Television for the Corporation during the necessary preliminary stages preceding actual television operations in Canada. Mr. Ouimet is the assistant chief engineer for the CBC, and has been actively engaged in television work and research since 1932.

A native of Montreal and a graduate of McGill University in electrical engineering, his first position was as research engineer with Canadian Television Limited, which established and operated an experimental television transmitter in Montreal between 1932 and 1934. He joined the Canadian Radio Broadcasting Commission, forerunner of the CBC, in 1934, and from 1937 to 1941 was Operations Engineer and General Supervising Engineer with the CBC. His duties during this period included technical administration of the Royal Tour broadcasts, one of the most complicated series of radio broadcasts ever undertaken. In 1941 he was appointed Assistant Chief Engineer for the Corporation.

A good portion of his time has been spent in the television field in line with CBC's general policy of keeping abreast of all developments in TV, and today Mr. Ouimet is generally recognized as the greatest authority in

Galgay To Head CBC Nfld. Region

Former General Manager of Island Corporation Named CBC Representative
Ottawa, April 26—William F. Galgay, formerly general manager of the Broadcasting Corporation of Newfoundland, has been appointed CBC Regional Representative in the new province. The appointment was announced in Ottawa by Dr. Augustin Frigon, CBC General Manager.

Under the terms of union with Canada, the Broadcasting Corporation of Newfoundland was taken over by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, forming the Newfoundland or sixth region of the national system.

William Galgay's radio experience dates from 1925 when he became program director and announcer of radio station VOXM in St. John's, while teaching school there. In 1930 he joined RCA Distributors in St. John's, and later worked with the sound-picture division of the Northern Electric Company both in Montreal and St. John's.

In the latter period, from 1932 to 1939, he was also manager of the Dominion Broadcasting Company in St. John's, which in 1935 absorbed the Newfoundland Broadcasting Company. In 1939 he was named general manager of the newly-created Broadcasting Corporation of Newfoundland, which was given a constitution quite similar to that of the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation. The BCN operated stations at St. John's, Gander, and Corner Brook. Plans are underway for the establishment of another station at Grand Falls.

Mr. Galgay is vice-chairman of the Newfoundland Press Club, a member of the Newfoundland Public Libraries Board and the advisory board on Visual and Adult Education.

Dr. Willan has written more than 300 compositions, including two symphonies, a piano concerto, chamber music, choral music, and instrumental pieces; Brebeuf and His Brethern, an historical pageant; and an opera, Dierdre of the Sorrows, commissioned by the CBC and first performed on the air during the Easter season of 1946. Dr. Willan has been the musical director at the Church of St. Mary Magdalene in Toronto since 1921. His many anthems, carols, motets, etc. are used widely in churches in England and the United States. He is a lecturer at the University of California, and will go there this month to attend the premiere performance of his latest work, called The Royce Hall Suite.

The trial came to occupy an important place in British legal history. Penn, a Quaker, went to London to comfort his dying father, and found that the Quaker meeting place in Gracechurch Street had been closed by soldiers. In protest, he began preaching in the street, and was arrested for unlawful assembly. He denounced the charge as illegal. Against the court's direction, the jury refused to find him guilty of unlawful assembly, and the twelve jurors were fined. The Court of Common Pleas later vindicated the jury, and declared the fines illegal. The trial established the right of juries to find on facts even against the court's direction.

Healey Willan Is Veteran of Music Distinguished Composer Began Career At Eleven

Dr. Healey Willan, three of whose best-known musical compositions will be performed on CBC Wednesday Night this week (May 11), was born in London in 1880, and educated at St. Saviour's Choir School in Eastbourne, where he played and conducted services at the age of 11. At 16 he was an associate of the Royal College of Organists, and at 18 a Fellow.

He continued his musical studies under William Stevenson Hoyte in London, and was for ten years—1903-1913—organist of St. John Baptist Church in Kensington. He was closely associated with the London Gregorian Association at this time, and was recognized as an authority on plain chant.

Dr. Willan came to Canada in 1913 to head the department of theory at Toronto Conservatory. In 1922 he was elected head of Toronto's Arts and Letters Club, first musician so honoured. He set the club's constitution to music in the same year. He left the Conservatory in 1936 and became a professor in the faculty of music at Toronto University.

Dr. Willan is the founder of the Tudor Singers musical group and has served as adjudicator at many musical festivals. Geoffrey Waddington, Reginald Godden, Ernest White, Godfrey Ridout, and Robert Fleming are some Canadian musicians who have studied with him.

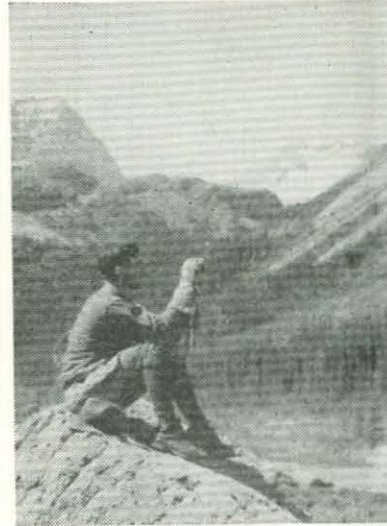
