The Jacksons

The theory behind the brief dramatic sketches heard daily on CBC Farm Broadcasts is basically that there is no better way to learn the lore of farming than by hearing day-to-day accounts of the routine life of a farm family, simply and entertainingly told. That the theory succeeds in practice is demonstrated by the very evident reality and vitality which "the Jacksons and their neighbours" have come to possess in the minds of large numbers of rural listeners in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta.

Dollar Dick Jackson, who loves auction sales, his daughter Colleen (now Mrs. William Davis), his son Buddy, and his neighbours, are very real people indeed to those who hear their daily adventures on the Farm Broadcast. The author of the Jackson sketch, Mary Rogers Pattison, has made the characters genuine and recognizable. But the day-to-



day story of the Jacksons has also another purpose—that of imparting useful information about the latest farming methods in an informal and easily-digested way. Dollar Dick and his neighbours are no laggards when it comes to agriculture, and they let drop a hint now and then which may solve many a difficulty for the prairie farmer.

This daily sketch has been going for four years, and is now approaching its 900th episode.

Manual Notes Radio's Limits In Teaching

Appeal More Emotional Than Intellectual, CBC Supervisor Suggests

Radio, in the view of R. S. Lambert, CBC supervisor of school broadcasts, is an emotional rather than an intellectual medium. Hearing is the most primitive and deep-seated of human faculties. A new-born baby will respond to stimuli of sound much earlier than he responds to stimuli of light, shape and colour.

These factors have to be weighed when broadcasters are considering the place of radio in teaching, and they have learned, Mr. Lambert says in a manual for teachers and parents recently published by the School Aids and Text Book Company, of Regina and Toronto (*Radio in Canadian Schools*), that by associating emotional experience with intellectual experience, listeners' receptivity can be greatly heightened.

A rule-of-thumb suggested by Mr. Lambert for the guidance of those concerned with school broadcasting is, "Never try to do through the ear what can be better done through the eye." Radio is no substitute for the blackboard. Nor can it take the place of the film, the film-strip or the ordinary still picture; these remain superior to radio for conveying descriptions of places and things.

But radio broadcasting is simpler, cheaper and speedier than motion picture production, and this helps to make up for its limitations. Radio excels in the "actuality"—live or recorded broadcasts about the news and current events, presented for their topicality, and the movie is no match for radio in this important field.

Mr. Lambert says that probably not more than a third of all Canadian schools are equipped to listen to school broadcasts and he looks to the day when a good radio receiver will be standard equipment in every classroom.

The manual contains a wealth of information of interest to teachers and parents. It describes the range of school broadcasts at present available in Canada, tells where to get up-to-date information about them, explains how to obtain and install suitable equipment and suggests how teachers may obtain the greatest help from educational broadcasts.

Under The Sea To Skye

"Speed, bonnie boat, like a bird on the wing, over the sea to Skye," runs the old Scots' song, telling of Bonnie Prince Charlie's flight to that most romantic island of the Inner Hebrides. Now another tune has been composed, and heard on a recent BBC broadcast, with the title "Under the sea to Skye."

And what is it that is going under the sea to Skye? A submarine cable which at last brings electricity to the shepherds of the glens, the crofters by the shore, and all the people of this remote and lovely island. The cable is part of the new Scottish hydro-electric scheme.—BBC London Letter.

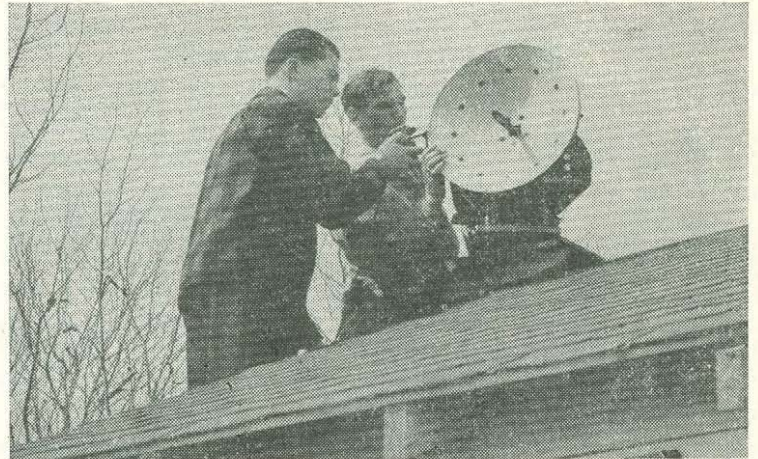

Migrating Birds React To Radar

CBC Unit Visits Delta Research Station For Experiments

In aerial navigation, according to Tom Benson of CBC's International Service, ducks and geese are away ahead of us.

With a CBC unit which included Tom Taylor, CBC producer, and Johnny Gibson, CBC operator, Benson visited the Waterfowl Research Station at Delta, Manitoba, last week to see a test experiment made with radar beams directed at migrating waterfowl.

"Ornithologists," he reported, "have been trying for years to establish (Continued on page 6)

Puffery

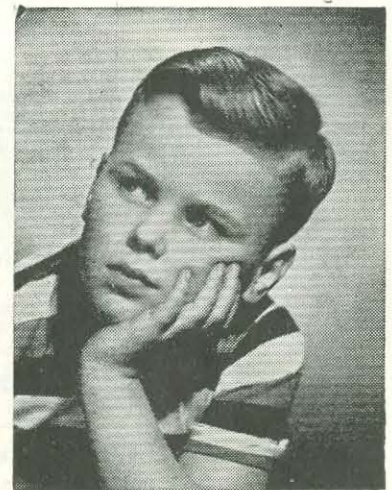
"They even interrupted a play," said recently one indignant visiting dramatic critic, "to say something about soap!"

"The hatter in the Strand of London, instead of making better felt hats

than another, mounts this lath-and-plaster hat upon wheels and sends a man to drive it through the streets. . . . Laugh not at him, O reader, or do not laugh only. He has ceased to be comic; he is fast becoming tragic. To me this all-deafening blast of Puffery, sounds too surely like doom's blast!"—A. M. Pratt, in Manitoba School Journal.

CBC Wednesday Night FOR THE TIME IS AT HAND

Drama on the life of Henry Wentworth Monk (1827-1896), of March, Ontario, an early Canadian exponent of Zionism, by R. S. Lambert of Tor-

onto, based on Mr. Lambert's book of the same title. From Toronto. In a historical note on Monk, Lambert says he was first attracted to him by seeing his portrait by Holman Hunt, English pre-Raphaelite, in the National Gallery at Ottawa. He says that in seeking material for his book, he explored "family papers in an old farmhouse, a ruined ancestral mansion at March on the banks of the Ottawa River, a solicitor's strongroom in Ottawa, uncatalogued material in Toronto Public Library, and rare pamphlets in the U.S. archives." He describes Monk as a friend of the Jews and a pioneer of world peace, who

crossed the Atlantic ten times, became a member of a pioneer Jewish colony in Palestine, was the sole survivor of a shipwreck, interviewed Abraham Lincoln during the Civil War in the United States, and was one of the first advocates of a world state with a court of international justice. He was a personal friend of John Ruskin, English author and critic, and of Holman Hunt. He forecast a cycle of world wars in the 20th century, and said they would compel humanity to choose between world peace or self-destruction. Monk's proposals for the Jews preceded the first Zionist Congress.

Jean-Charles Chapais, CBC French announcer and member of the CBC panel of "Northern Messengers" who broadcast to the Far North during the fall and winter seasons, received an interesting package last week.

It came from Cape Dorset, on the south shore of Baffin Land, about 1,500 miles north of Winnipeg, and it contained a miniature pair of Eskimo top-boots, made of sealskin, and a miniature pair of Eskimo mitts of the same material. They were beautifully made, by Eskimos at Cape Dorset, and Jean-Charles is treasuring them as a delightful memento of his work on CBC's "Northern Messenger."

The donor was Father Rene Belair of Cape Dorset, a missionary and a regular listener to the broadcasts, for which he expressed great appreciation.

Mike Fright Seldom Troubles Juveniles

CBC Drama Supervisor Finds Excellent Poise In Child Actors

Watching juvenile radio actors in action has proved a lesson in humility for many a grown-up actor. Their intelligent, composed performances often surprise their more experienced colleagues and others who have a chance to watch the production of radio shows in which children are taking part.

With the split-hair timing and careful attention to cues which are necessary for smooth radio drama, producers might be expected to think twice before casting a youngster in a role that might make or break the play. Yet Andrew Allan, for example, says he has the utmost confidence in child actors.

Most of the youngsters he has worked with have remarkable poise and timing, Mr. Allan says, and on the whole they have been very responsive to his direction. Many adults who are old hands at radio acting will admit that they still get "mike fright" when waiting for their cues. To the younger actors—at least, to many of them—it's just a glorious game.

In age, juveniles heard frequently on CBC networks range from eight to early teens.

He has published more than 400 short stories. His book, The Happy Time, was a best seller in 1945.

exactly how waterfowl find their way from the northern nesting grounds to the southern parts of the continent where they winter. Now another clue has been added. Radar experiments have established that the birds have some mysterious reaction to the radar beam."

Tom described how the beam was directed at flying birds about 200 yards away. It was positively proved that the birds were allergic to radar. They all reacted the same way, flaring up and changing direction when the beam was directed at them. One flight was caught three times, and finally became so confused they scattered in all directions.

"The surprising thing about the whole business," Tom said, "is that the radar has no effect on birds that are more or less local inhabitants. At

least, no reaction has been obtained from them. They have to be birds that are migrating and in flight."

What it meant, he said, was still a question mark, but it did give the ornithologists something new to work on in the mysterious thing called migration.

Second Triumph For Manitoba Soprano

Louise Roy, of St. Boniface, Wins CBC French Network Award

Montreal, May 1—Louise Roy, of St. Boniface, Manitoba, and Jean-Pierre Comeau, of Granby, Quebec, each received a prize of \$500 from Dr. Augustin Frigon, general manager of the CBC, when named tonight as winners of the CBC French network contest, *Nos Futures Etoiles* (Our Future Stars), which has been in progress since last October.

Miss Roy, soprano, and Mr. Comeau, bass, were two of 12 semi-finalists chosen from 44 contestants heard in the series, who in turn were chosen from 626 candidates representing six provinces. There were 564 entries from Quebec; 49 from Ontario; four from Nova Scotia; one each from New Brunswick, Manitoba, and British Columbia; and six from the United States.

Miss Roy's victory follows a similar triumph on the English network, where in the contest "Singing Stars of Tomorrow," she also carried off the first prize. She is a daughter of Mr. Justice and Mrs. L. P. Roy of St. Boniface, and is 24 years of age. She is now studying at the Toronto Conservatory.

Mr. Comeau is 22, and is an announcer at a Granby radio station.

In addition to their \$500 prizes, these young artists receive a 26-weeks' CBC engagement. The ten other semi-finalists will also have guest appearances with CBC orchestras during the summer.
