

# Alan Mills' First Play On "Drama in Sound" June 21

MONTREAL ACTOR - FOLK-SINGER Alan Mills has now added playwriting to his long list of accomplishments and interests in the field of "Canadiana." His first play, *Ti-Jean and the Devil*, will be presented on the CBC Montreal drama series, Drama in Sound, Wednesday, June 21.

Mills prefers to call the work an "illustrated narrative" rather than a play in the conventional sense, for he unfolds his story of Ti-Jean, a French-Canadian fiddler who makes a bargain with Satan, in the manner of the traditional raconteur. Short dramatized scenes illustrate and highlight the narrative.

The plot of the story is based on a fragment of an old folk legend told him by a fellow Montrealer, Jean Carignan, a fiddler, or "violoneux," who often accompanies Mills in concert appearances.

"Some time ago," Mills explains, "Johnny (Carignan) and I were preparing a new LP album of Canadian folk songs and fiddle tunes for Folkways Records, and I was asked to include a folk legend, or story in the folk tale idiom, just to add something that would be a little different from the other records I've made.

"I thought it would be best to do a story that would involve Johnny's fiddling, but I couldn't find anything suitable in my own collection of folk tales, so I asked Jean if he knew any old stories about fiddlers.

"It turned out that he did remember an old French-Canadian legend about a fiddler making a bargain with the devil (a common theme in the folklore of many countries) but he couldn't recall many of the details. So I just made up a story from the little he did remember, and that's all there was to it."

It was while preparing the tale for his recording, Mills said, that the idea occurred that it might make a good play, so he decided to dramatize it, "just for the fun of it."

"I expected to have difficulty stretching the thing to the usual half hour," he said, "but you know, once I started, it almost began writing itself. All kinds of colorful characters I've known or heard about over the years began pushing themselves into the story, and the problem soon became to confine it to the limited time!"

Montreal drama producer Rupert Caplan accepted the finished script on first reading.

Although *Ti-Jean and the Devil* is Alan Mills' first play, writing is not new to him. He was a newspaper reporter and feature writer for years before he decided, in the early 1940's, to make a full-time career out of his hobbies—acting and singing.

Since then, he has become widely recognized as one of the leading interpreters of both the English and French folk songs of Canada, recorded hundreds of them on more than a score of LP's, authored or co-authored four song books, sung in over 1,000 radio and television broadcasts, and given many lecture recitals in Canada, the United States and England on what he calls "tuneful Canadiana."

This summer the burly baritone will travel some 10,000 miles to appear in concerts and lecture recitals at folk festivals and universities in California, Ontario, and the Maritimes.

In the CBC production of *Ti-Jean and the Devil* on June 21, Mills will be featured as the old *raconteur*, Telescope Coté. Part of the recent Folkways recording Mills made with Jean Carignan will be used to illustrate the tale.

# IN REPLY

Excerpts from the CBC Radio program In Reply of May 21, in which J. Frank Willis dealt with press criticism of CBC costs.

WILLIS: . . . I read you an editorial some weeks ago about the so-called "CBC millstone around the neck of the suffering public." A Vancouver In Reply listener has commented on just this type of editorial, and he has some interesting suggestions.

"Out here on the west coast the CBC seems to me to be the object of a never-ceasing vicious campaign with only one end in view, the closing of CBC as a 'money losing' 'terrible burden' on the taxpayer and its substitution by privately owned TV and radio, which are supposed to 'cost the viewer nothing' and 'do the job better' while making handsome profits for all concerned. With a good many others I dissent heartily from this viewpoint, but there is very little way of getting any other viewpoint solidly in front of the public. I think the tempo and intensity of the 'abolish CBC' campaign is increasing all the time and the overall costs of the CBC are certainly increasing. At the same time-the CBC seems to me to be compromising its position a little more every day. In order to do something about the costs, it has had, and is having increasingly, to depend on sponsors for advertising revenue, thereby making itself for a good part of the time almost indistinguishable from privately-owned broadcasting.

"TV is of course the villain of the piece, and colour TV will be even more expensive. And no matter which way CBC plays it will be wrong. If it comes in early it will be confronted at every opportunity with statistics and editorials showing what a frightful waste of money CBC is. If it comes in late, it will be damned for failing to give to viewers what the sponsors of private TV, out of the goodness

IN THE CBC'S library lie scripts and recordings of millions of words spoken during broadcasts of talks and interviews over the years. Many have historical significance; many have mellowed and become even more interesting with the passing of time.

Novelist Ron Hambleton recently has dug through the CBC's files of the past 20 years, and has put together a series of broadcasts entitled Worth Repeating, that began June 15 on the Trans-Canada network, and will continue to be heard each Thursday.

His selections include: an interview recorded 10 years ago in which singer Paul Robeson discusses education in the Soviet Union; several talks by the late Dr. Marion Hilliard on the problems of women; and Rex Lambert's description of a court case which took place in Canada in the 1840's, when the United States tried to extradite a runaway slave.

Material is drawn from not only all periods of CBC broadcasting, but from all phases of operation—local, regional and national. If the original discs or tapes exist they will be used. Otherwise, the script will be read by the announcer who read it originally. Scripts will not be "doctored;" they will be heard exactly as they were when first broadcast.

A "BROTHER-AND-SISTER" act is together for the first time in four years in Power by Proxy, a drama to be seen Sunday, June 25, on General Motors Presents. Vita Linder (in a walk-on part) joins her brother, Cec (playing a leading role), who has just réturned from Britain where he has developed a successful career on television, stage and screen. They last acted together on CBC-TV four years ago, playing brother and sister roles. Vita Linder is heard every Thursday night on the Dominion Network program Shadows, reading poetry.

IN CONCLUDING an account of the history and development of radio in Canada, the CBC in a booklet just issued, *Broadcasting in Canada*, restates some of the principles underlying CBC programming policy.

"The general aim in making up CBC domestic program schedules is to arrive at a satisfactory balance of entertainment on one hand, and information and education on the other. Wherever possible, these factors are combined, and presented at suitable hours. All listeners do not like the same things, and there are minority groups whose tastes must be taken into account. But whether a listener likes jazz or classical music, light opera or chamber music, discussion programs, daytime serials or book reviews, CBC feels he should have programs to meet his particular taste somewhere in its schedules.

"The views of specially constituted Advisory Councils are sought in planning programs in connection with Religious Broadcasts and School Broadcasts. Many other organizations act in an advisory capacity for a number of CBC series."

# A Day in the Life of the Scholar Wu

THIS WEEK Q for Quest offers one of the most unusual in its series of off-beat features: A Day in the Life of the Great Scholar Wu, by the brilliant and controversial German playwright, Bertolt Brecht. It was translated and adapted by Rose Kastner of Toronto. "Brecht," says supervising producer Ross McLean, "permits a delightful glimpse of the sad lot of scholars in ancient feudal China, and it proves not too unlike the fate of the contemporary egghead. For all hands, this television version is a reunion. All combined to present Wu on stage in Toronto last year. It was warmly praised."

In A Day in the Life of the Great Scholar Wu (Tuesday night on CBC-TV) Brecht blends a play from Honan Province with selections from the Chinese Book of Comedies and scenes from several Chinese operas, all written by men whose names have been lost in the shuffle of the centuries. But the points they had to make are timeless in their wisdom and bite, and highly entertaining.

Wu is a scholarly gentleman who thinks he can avoid work and earn his daily bread simply by dropping a few crumbs of knowledge in the paths of more ignorant mortals. "O Knowledge," he breathes gratefully, "thou comforter of the few!"

He brags to the unlettered that he is invited to sup at the best homes, tells them that the first step on the road to culture is learning "how to stretch your legs under the banquet tables of the rich." After that comes practice in the subtleties of flattery and parasitism. Sprinkle a little wisdom (or what passes for it) here and there, he says, and you're off to a plush life and an easy one. In theory,

As the play proceeds we look in on Wu as he tries to treat himself to a free breakfast, as he finds himself done out of a lunch, and as he arrives too late for the dinner he is dying for. It seems that poor Wu is just not wanted in anyone's dining-room. With tummy rumbling unmercifully, Wu suffers a further indignity. He loses his shoes. And he asks himself sorrowfully: "What is knowledge good for if you have no shoes?" As he slips further and

# COURTROOM DRAMA RETURNS

A CASE for the Court, rated one of the most popular programs on CBC-TV last summer, will return for a second season on Monday, June 26.

The 12-week series is produced by the CBC in co-operation with the Canadian Bar Association and features actual judges, magistrates and lawyers. Gil Christy will return as host.


A Case for the Court has an ambitious format for a 30-minute show. Each case opens with Christy talking to witnesses (actors); the scene then shifts to a courtroom, where two lawyers argue the case before a judge or magistrate. Four panelists—representing the public—then discuss the arguments, give their decisions and question the judge. Finally, the judge hands down his own decision.

"The chief aim of the program," according to producer George Dick, "is to get people thinking about the law." The success of this is indicated by the fact that last year many viewers wrote that they discussed cases long after the programs ended.

"This country is full of livingroom lawyers," wrote a Toronto critic, "and A Case for the Court is their meat."

An insurance claims adjuster, a probation officer and a minister were among the viewers who requested transcripts or further information on last year's series. They felt they could use details of the cases in their respective work.

Variety said this of last year's series: ". . . for sheer excitement and suspense, A Case for the Court is a sleeper that should prove an




MR. JUSTICE McLENNAN

outstanding summer replacement for the CBC."

This season, innovations have been made in an effort to make the program even more successful. The program will feature a larger roster of names, faces and factual situations. One case will be argued as in Quebec courts, to show the difference between French and English Canadian law in some civil aspects. Lawyers from Quebec will present the case, with Justice Roger Ouimet, for the Superior Court of Quebec presiding. There also will be a 90-minute special, which will cover a bank robbery from the hold-up scene to the final verdict.

Justice C. D. Stewart of the Supreme Court of Ontario, who appeared on last summer's series, will preside over four of the new cases.

The first episode, to be seen June 26, is subtitled, My Son's Good Name. It concerns a high school principal who publicly accused a student of theft. With the accusation proved false, the question arises as to what extent the principal is responsible for damage to the boy's reputation. Lawyers Barry Pepper, Q.C., and John Howard – both of Toronto—will argue the case before Justice J. McLennan of the Supreme Court of Ontario.

of their hearts give the taxpayer for nothing.

"I commend to your attention a recent article by a Vancouver Province columnist. In it he makes a suggestion with which I am very heartily in agreement, since it represents my own views from a good while back. He suggests cutting down the number of hours a day devoted to TV, and improving quality rather than trying to give more quantity. This seems to me to make complete sense. If TV broadcasting did not start before six p.m. each day would it not be possible to

(a) Improve TV quality.

(b) Have a TV system completely free from commercials and therefore completely and delightfully different.

(c) Cut down the overall cost and thereby forestall some of the totally unfair criticism to which the CBC is subjected almost daily.

"I would not have bothered to write this letter if I did not feel that the current is setting in fairly strongly against the CBC, and that its downfall, which would be gloated over by the newspapers, would be a first class diaster for Canada."


WILLIS: I think this letter itself indicates where the CBC's best defence would lie if a strong and final defence were needed: and that is with the listeners. But I don't think we have to talk in terms of last stands. Most responsible people and most sections of the press know perfectly well that the CBC gives value for money. People don't always remember that when they're reckoning the value they should include the programs and services that don't happen to affect them personally: the French networks, for instance, or the Northern Service, or the line facilities to relay transmitters. And they like to grumble about what's happening to their taxes. But if there were a serious move to abolish the CBC I think you'd hear from them pretty

Now I don't mean to discount this Vancouver listener's concern.

There is a good deal of specious criticism of the CBC, and it shouldn't go unanswered.

One answer, of course, is for the CBC to make more noise about what it does: to say a little more often and a little more loudly that it operates five networks and broadcasts in two languages; that it produces thousands of program hours at a lower average cost than any comparable broadcasting system in the world, whether public or private; that most people who've had a chance to compare program quality have far more praise than blame for CBC productions-and we have the international awards to prove it. We could point out that the taxpayer and the consumer are the same man, and that this man pays for broadcasting whether it's public or private. We could produce our own facts and figures to show that neither system could survive alone in this country and give national coverage. For instance, while you're thinking about what the CBC costs, you might picture our 1959-60 season if we had had only that 38 million dollars in commercial revenue to finance our operations-radio and television, remember, French and English, over 4,000 miles. Remove the 50 million or so that came from public funds, and imagine if you can what programs and services you'd

further into poverty, rejected and miserable, he plumbs the depths of his soul as he asks: "What is the good of knowledge at all, in times like these?" At the end, this perplexed scholar is unkempt, unwanted, unhopeful. And the lesson he teaches is handled with razorsharp satire within the terms of Oriental drama.

Author Bertolt Brecht, who died in 1956, is the author of *The Three-penny Opera*, a musical play on which he collaborated with composer Kurt Weill, when he (Brecht) was a little-known playwright in Germany. After its premiere in 1928 he became a celebrity. (Not long ago, after a five-year run in New York the same show topped the record *Oklahomal* peak of 2,248 performances, and one of the show's songs, *Mack the Knife*, made the hit parade).

But by 1933 Brecht was no longer the fair-haired boy in Germany. The Nazis exiled him and he spent the next 15 years writing (which he does standing up at a lecturn) and living quietly in Denmark, Sweden, Finland, France and Hollywood. In 1947, after a scuffle with the Un-American Activities Committee, he went back to Germany, where he founded the famous state-owned stage company, the Berliner Ensemble.

Probably Brecht's greatest work was his Mother Courage, which a Berlin reviewer said "throbbed with the heartbeat of all mankind." Through various locales and moods his theme is always man selling his fellow man. His dramas are like the medieval miracle and morality plays, rude or crude in a folksy way as they teach a lesson as plain as their language.

Annie Farge, star of CBC-TV's "Angel" series, plays much the same role in real life as on TV. A product of the Comedie Francaise, Annie gave up her acting career in Paris to follow her husband Dick Sanders, a dancer-choreographer to the United States. She was discovered by the brilliant producer-director Josh Logan.

# We Investigate the Investigators

The history of Royal Commissions in Canada is probed Sunday by CBC Radio's Venture

ROYAL COMMISSIONS are sober inquiries into economic, social and cultural problems of our time which the cabinet feels can best be investigated that way. The inquiries are made by earnest, well-informed citizens for whom sifting and assessing a staggering amount of evidence and giving an unbiased opinion is an onerous, challenging job.

There have been royal commissions in Canada ever since 1870. And for years people have been complaining that they are only a delaying tactic in helping the government evade responsibility, that they are a confession that the government has lost touch with the people, and that nothing ever happens after their reports are tabled.

Probably not too many people have a clear idea of how royal com-

missions are appointed, how they operate, and what good they really do. The whole thing will be explained Sunday afternoon on CBC Radio's *Venture*, from the first commission 91 years ago through the now-famous Massey, Gordon and Borden reports to the current MacPherson and O'Leary Commissions on Transportation and Publications.

Prepared by Peter Stursberg, edited by Dita Scholtz and produced by Hugh Webster, the program will have the Right Honourable Louis St. Laurent as special speaker. Other speakers include Walter Gordon, who discusses the commission he headed on Canada's Economic Prospects; M. A. MacPherson, who talks about work involved in the Transport Commis-

# **FOUR TEACHERS**

How does our education system compare with that of other countries? This special Monday on TV will try to find out

"TOMORROW'S CITIZEN of the world — today's child: volatile, eager, pulsing with life; avid for experience, for excitement, for pleasure; avid for knowledge—who and what am I, how does it work, what does it mean?—a thousand questions and needs, demanded of those who so largely shape the minds of children—their teachers."

Thus begins an hour-long film entitled Four Teachers to be seen this Monday on CBC-TV. It is one of the National Film Board's Comparisons programs and consists of vignettes of education in Japan, Puerto Rico, Poland and Canada.

Actually, the program includes six teachers. Besides the ones seen in the four countries, two of the three commentators are educators: Professor John R. Seeley of Toronto's York University; a social scientist and educator whose research, lectures and writing are internationally known and respected; and Glenna Reid of Montreal, whose teaching career is temporarily suspended while she completes a degree course in education at McGill University.

The other commentator is Gordon Burwash who discusses with Professor Seeley and Miss Reid the various aspects of teaching as shown in the four countries.

Comparisons are made of school environments; differences, if any, in teacher-student relationship; the courses of study and interests in extra-curricular activities.

Film of a typical school day in Japan, Poland and Puerto Rico was produced for the NFB by film

# Music of the Sun King

Works of three composers of the court of Louis XIV are featured this week on CBC Wednesday Night

DURING HIS REIGN of 73 years, the longest in European history, Louis XIV, the Sun King, had a highly civilizing effect on France and the rest of Europe, despot though he was. He built a setting for himself at Versailles that was like a miniature Louvre and Tivoli Gardens rolled into one, with a touch of fairyland and Hollywood. Every bit of botanical beauty and rarety, every exotic sample of European art that money or guile could buy, were there, and it had literally taken a cast of thousands to produce this splendid monument to the glory of France. As many as 30,000 soldiers worked on it at a time (when they could be spared from one war or another) at a cost that would make even Hollywood gasp: \$112 millions.

Night after night the court at Versailles glittered elegantly in the winking light from dozens of candle-lit chandeliers strung through its elaborately decorated salons and corridors. The swell of violins putting some new work through its première for the pleasure of the Sun King, the skip of dancing feet or laughter at the sally of a comic actor would often drift through the windows and over the spreading tapis vert, to the famous Orangery, the Swiss Lake, the magnificent fountains and groves. For Louis, besides bescented. lace-and-satindecked Commander of the Faithful, was an artist of some merit, and, from his early teens, a staunch supporter of the arts. He loved music, and under his wing several

important composers developed and prospered.

On CBC Wednesday Night CBC Radio presents Music of the Sun King, 90 minutes of music written for the court of Louis XIV. A CBC Montreal orchestra is conducted by Jean Beaudet, a chorus is directed by George Little, and soloists are soprano Rene Maheux, contralto Fernande Chiocchio, tenor Jean-Louis Pellerien, and bass Napoleon Bisson. Three selections will be heard: the suite from L'Europe Galante by Andrew Campra, Concert dans le Gout Theatrical by François Couperin, and Te Deum by I. B. Lully.

Of the three, Lully had the most colourful career, was close to the

King for a longer period, and enjoyed the most remarkable strokes of luck that swept him from obscure poverty to great wealth. He was the first of a number of distinguished foreign composers who settled in Paris and had considerable influence on French music.

Giovanni Battista Lulli (h e changed the spelling of his name later) was the son of a humble Florentine. A Franciscan friar taught the boy to read and to play the guitar, and then Lully taught himself to play the violin. He used to join the strolling players at carnival time, dancing, singing, playing his violin and cutting up. When he was about 10 or 11 his

makers in the countries concerned. The sequence showing the Canadian teacher at work was photographed in the Montreal suburb of Ste. Anne de Bellevue. CBC interests in the production are maintained by Eric Koch, supervising producer of CBC-TV's public affairs department.

Professor Seeley, like so many education authorities in this country, believes there is room for considerable improvement in calibre of Canadian teachers as a whole. While he feels that a higher salary scale would help improve the general standards of teaching, Professor Seeley thinks a greater factor is "interest and intensity in the teaching profession-a greater urge to know more, to accomplish more."

"So many conditions are required to bring this about," he says. "More concentrated study, possibly longer courses, possibly many more bursaries and scholarships; so on and so on. One key factor, I feel,

have been left with. Work out any sort of system you like, and you'll find that either the service isn't the one you have now, or it's simply being paid for with money from another pocket.

This is one kind of answer, as I said. And I think myself that there's more point in showing people what they're getting for their money than in cutting back established services just to forestall unfair criticism in certain sections of the press. But in the end it's our programs and services that speak best for us to the listener, and very often it's the listener himself who answers the extravagant criticisms in some (only some) sections of the press. I think I have just time to read you part of a letter that was published some weeks ago in Saskatoon. I think it will show our Vancouver listener that he is not alone in his feelings: Here is one listener's answer:

"Many of those who continually rail against the existence of the CBC should familiarize themselves with the meaning of the word 'intolerance.' One rarely finds CBC fans, much less the CBC, campaigning for the abolition of private broadcasting; why, then, can't CBC opponents be content to allow us to have the kind of program we enjoy? It is no argument that those who never listen to the CBC are still compelled to support it as taxpayers, because it is equally true that those who never partake of commercial radio and television are still compelled to support it as consumers. In any case the CBC does not confine itself to Rawhide. Bertrand Russell and the National Ballet; it also features Front Page Challenge, NHL hockey, and Don Messer. If these critics can find nothing in this whole spectrum to suit their tastes, one can be pardoned for wondering what it is, indeed, that they do want."

from the peak period between 1911 and 1920 when we had an average of seven a year. Britain's peak was the 1850's, when she averaged eight a year, and Joshua Toulmin Smith, in his book Government by Commission, Evil and Pernicious, declared that "they would, in fact, put the whole earth in commission and deliver over the whole human race saved from the flood." Now Britain's average is down to two. In both countries this peak period coincided with the sort of conditions royal commissions appear to thrive on: crises, growth and development, and adjustment-social and economic-after growth. Some people claim that Canada has commissionitis." There have been well over 1,200 federal inquiries since Confederation, and anywhere from 10 to 25 per cent of them are described as roval commissions.

Many of these commissions have been investigations of questions of great historical importance, and the variety of their subject matter is flabbergasting. Just about the only thing royal commissions haven't looked into is themselves.

Roughly there are three kinds of commissions. One examines disasters such as fire, flood or accident. or looks into scandals or supposed scandals. Examples are the Quebec Bridge inquiry of 1908, the loss of the Empress of Ireland in 1914, the Parliament Buildings fire of 1916, the Bren machine-gun contract of 1939, the Canadian forces at Hong Kong in 1942, and the Halifax riots on VE Day. Another kind of commission, which usually contributes something of lasting value to the community, looks into social and cultural aspects of our way of life, such as the cost of living, industrial relations, broadcasting, the penal system, and the development of our arts, letters and sciences.

The third important group deals with aspects of Canadian economics, an outstanding example being the Rowell-Sirois commission on Dominion - provincial relations, in 1940. Nearly all our basic industries and occupations have been investigated at some time or another, some of them several times.

#### Festival National De Musique

The National Festival of Music, a yearly event taking place on a nation-wide scope over the French radio and television networks, will be seen on Channel 6, Sunday June 25th, from 8:00 to 9:00 p.m. It will feature winners from all across the country.

#### Expeditions

The series Expeditions, presented on the French network on Tuesday evenings at 9:30, can be considered among TV's most fascinating tools of learning, and stands out as one of the more popular and interesting documentaries, with adults as well as with students.

The series, which originated in the United States, was designed primarily for some 175,000 professors and 9,000,000 students who could follow the program with the help of text books. Only one month after the origination however, some 96,000 more professors and students had written for more details and the accompanying manuals and teaching guides.

Expéditions is more than a documentary; it is the real-life adventure story of prominent\* researchers and explorers. Although some find it easy to discredit documentaries generally as dull and hardly informative, they generally agree that the series Expéditions is an exception. It has done much to discourage prejudices and intolerance among students and other persons who see it, as well as to encourage scientific research, the love of art and the knowledge of geography.

Here are the titles of some of the forthcoming programs in this series: June 27: "The Last Nomads of the Arctic," a documentary by Per Host, Norwegian photographer and explorer; July 4: "The War Tribes of the Amazon," comments by James Marshall; July 11: "The Ovibos," a report on a musk-ox hunt by doctors Lange Kech and Christian Vibe; July 18: "The Lost World of the Kalaharis," first of a two-part program on a caravan conducted by Colonel Laurens Van der Post in Africa; July 25: "The Last Inhabitant of the Bush-Country," a continuation of the previous documentary.

antics caught the attention of the Chevalier de Guise, who was passing through Florence on his way to Paris from Malta. To please his niece, cousin of the French King, who wanted to learn Italian, the Chevalier took Lully home with him to France.

Once there, however, Lully found himself relegated to the kitchens as a scullion. In his free time he learned the songs of the day and played them on his violin with an engaging charm. A visiting Count chanced to hear him one day, and before long Lully had been given a place in the Princess' Band at the Palace d'Orleans. There he quickly outdistanced the other musicians, but his mischievous habit of writing sarcastic poems and setting them to music got him into trouble with the Princess. He wrote a song poking fun at her, she got wind of it, and dismissed him in disgrace. Fortunately, King Louis XIV, who was the same age as Lully, around 14, had taken a fancy to him. On one occasion Lully's comical behaviour on stage in a court comedy had been so exaggerated that he fell into the orchestra pit and shattered the harpsichord. The King had never laughed harder, and when he heard that the boy was "at liberty" after the incident with the Princess, he made him a member of his private orchestra, the King's Twenty-Four Violins, as well as ballet dancer and composer of music for the elaborate entertainment Louis favoured.

Soon Lully persuaded the King to let him form his own orchestra, Les Petits-Violons du Roi, which became known as one of the seven wonders of artistic Europe. All this was before either Lully or his patron were out of their teens.

In the centre of court lavishness and intrigue, in Paris and later at Versailles, Lully was in his element. Being a cunning, energetic, resourceful young man he soon realized that he needed more study to make the most of his opportuni-

ties, and he began to perfect himself as a solo player and conductor. took harpsichord and organ lessons from the best masters, and was well on his way to becoming an outstanding composer by his early twenties. He let nothing and nobody stand in his way. He could be quite ruthless, didn't give a hoot for morals, and lost no opportunity for ingratiating himself with those in authority. If other people's heads or jobs fell by the wayside, that mattered little to him. Above all, he studied how to amuse and please the King, the Queen, and later the royal mistresses, who were the chief influences at court.

No festival or court celebration was complete without Lully's music. He and the King often danced side by side in the numerous court ballets he composed. There were over 30 of them between 1658 and 1671. These soon became more like operas with ballet interludes. as Lully grew intrigued with the opera form, and when he began collaborating with the great comic writer Molière in 1664, Lully raced ahead in style and royal favour. By 1671 he had persuaded the King to grant him the exclusive right to organize operatic performances in Paris. Thirteen years later this prerogative was extended to the whole French kingdom.

After Molière's death, Lully began a profitable 14-year collaboration with the poet Quinault. They wrote 20 operas and firmly established French opera tradition for many years. Even Lully's church music was operatic in style.

Lully's death, at the height of his fame and power, in his midfifties, was the result of an accident that sounds as if it came straight from one of his own comicballets. Conducting a festive *Te Deum* one night to celebrate the King's recovery from a severe illness, Lully accidentally struck his foot with his baton. An abscess formed, Lully consulted a quack who only aggravated the sore, it went septic, and he died in one of the four elegant homes he owned in Paris.

# Sam Pollock Pays a Visit

AFTER BROADCASTING from Britain to Canadians for 10 years on *Postmark U.K.* (Sunday mornings on CBC radio), Sam Pollock finally has come over to say hello. His popular weekly newsletter about life in Britain brought him so much mail from listeners describing life in Canada that he decided to come and see the country for himself.

Although he has travelled on business and pleasure all over the world - Germany, China, France, Spain - he had never set foot in North America until the end of May, in spite of his 10-year liaison with thousands of listeners across Canada, "Many of them would look me up in London, even if only for a cup of coffee," he said, "and describe the beauties of Canada so eloquently that I just had to come and see for myself. I've been trying to arrange a trip for quite a while, and decided that Postmark U.K.'s 10th anniversary, June 4, would be as good a time as anv. I'm going to look up some of the friends I've made through the program, as well as a brother in Hamilton, other relatives in Calgary, and I must see Montreal before the end of my five-week visit."

Pollock is just the way he sounds — informal and friendly. When we met him, a couple of days after he landed in Toronto, he said he was busy seeing the city—on foot, a fact which completely astonishes nearly everyone he asked for directions. "They could tell me how to get there by bus or subway, but walking? Unheard of!"

In 1943 Pollock wrote and broadcast a Cradio talk called Where are you going to, my pretty maid?, in which he urged British women to stand up and fight for their rights. That was the start of his long career in broadcasting. He's a man of strong personal views, like most Irishmen, and he

doesn't hesitate to state them forcefully. The BBC has given him a completely free hand, ever since he joined the staff in 1945 as a producer of industrial programs offering career guidance to ex-servicemen and war workers. He produced BBC talks and public affairs programs until he began to freelance in 1950.

Shortly afterwards he started broadcasting his human and pithy reports on the British scene, particularly industrial and economic aspects, for the BBC's Overseas Service. The CBC first presented them the following year, with a companion piece by Arthur Bush, under the title of Postmark U.K. Bush offers recorded visits to places and people of interest around Britain, a feature that has become so popular that he now has a staff of four other broadcasters who roam the United Kingdom recording bits of nostalgia for Britons abroad.

Both of the overseas commentaries are prepared in London and flown to Canada a few days before each broadcast. We asked Pollock how he puts his show together. He began to laugh. "I use a devious method. I watch the news carefully through the week for something that will remind me of something else. . . . My BBC producer claims that she can never tell by the way I start my script what I intend to talk about. For instance, one script about umbrellas led off with a reference to the fact that I'd noticed that a new taxi service had opened in the streets of London."

CBC producer John Reeves, who has been involved with *Postmark U.K.* in Toronto since 1952, says "one of Pollock's favourite approaches to life is to puncture the balloon of pomposity. He treads on the odd corn or two, but

he does it with such charm, wit and good humour that it's obvious he has no wish to give offence."

Pollock receives quantities of fan mail, not only from Britons in Canada but from native - born Canadians who enjoy his spirited slant on things in the U.K. "Listener reaction is almost entirely favourable, thank goodness," he says. 'And when people do occasionally check me on something I've said, they are usually very generous about it. An Ottawa woman wrote to sav I'd been implying that Toronto was the capital of Canada and she felt she should set me straight. A funny thing — I've found that Canadians tend to be more English than the English. If I make a playful but kindly reference to British aristocracy, they write in indignantly to say 'long may our aristocraey live'.'

Pollock tells us that early in his Postmark U.K. davs he was almost inundated with food parcels from listeners in Canada. "They seemed to think we were living under almost siege conditions, and probably said 'we must ship off some vitamins to poor old Pollock to keep him from starving'. To offset this I began broadcasting such glowing accounts of life in Britain that an Englishman, Tom Sloan, who was BBC representative in Canada, packed up and went home! Now he's head of BBC-TV light entertainment."
