New Program**News Features
To Highlight
Afternoon TV**

A MINIATURE news magazine on film makes its debut on CBC-TV this Tuesday afternoon. Titled *Cross-Section*, this five-minute package will be seen Monday to Friday at the same hour throughout the winter, but will not be seen on New Year's Day.

Each program will consist of one or several items contributed by reporters in CBC newsrooms coast to coast. The co-ordinator is Tim Ralfe, editor in the CBC's national TV news department in Toronto, who will also be featured in Toronto-area contributions to the series.

"All the items on *Cross-Section* will be strictly Canadian," he says. "It's more of an information program than a news show, because we plan to spotlight off-beat subjects that are usually not considered immediate enough to be covered in regular news programs — or if they are covered, it's only briefly. But our five-minute period will allow us to explore these topics more deeply. We'll see what's going on in areas all over the country, hear both sides of arguments in various regions, anecdotes, personality sketches and interviews, see background material on current happenings and projects in the 10 provinces, provincial legislature news — there are endless featurish items to draw on. Some will be




SPORTS FANS who read about the Year-End Sports Review, compiled by Bob Moir, in this column last week should note that the program has been rescheduled to 5:15 p.m., Sunday, December 31—a day earlier than originally planned. Bob talks about the special program in the sports column on page 21 of this issue.

PRAIRIE PLAYHOUSE, half-hour radio drama from Winnipeg, moves to a new spot starting this week, replacing Vancouver Theatre at 8:30 p.m. on Tuesdays. A series of five programs featuring Marian Waldman's radio adaptation of *Tay-John*, a novel by Howard O'Hagan, kicks off the new year.

Tay-John is set in the Yellowhead Pass of the Rocky Mountains, between British Columbia and Alberta. Dave Robertson, in the title role, plays an Indian, member of a tribe of some 50 years ago. The story develops into what is commonly called an adult western, with a plot full of both action and warmth.

THOMAS ELLIOTT, a young native of Buffalo, New York, who has at 25 years of age made a name for himself in Winnipeg music circles, is featured Tuesday at 6:45 p.m. on *Recital in Miniature*. Now first bassoonist of the Winnipeg Symphony and the CBC Winnipeg Orchestra, he holds a graduate degree from the New England Conservatory of Music, Boston, Mass., where he studied under scholarships won while an undergraduate of Buffalo State Teachers College. In the summers of 1958 and 1960, he studied at Tanglewood, and among his teachers have been Sherman Walt, principal bassoonist of the Boston Symphony, and also the principal bassoonists of the Buffalo Philharmonic, the Pittsburgh Symphony and the Philadelphia Orchestra. He has performed solo work, chamber music, and jazz with ensembles and symphony orchestras of the Buffalo and Boston areas.

**THOMAS ELLIOTT**

THE WORKINGS of the provincial government, which might seem a dry-as-dust subject for the average schoolboy, becomes not only palatable but fascinating in a new 13-week series *Gateway to Government*, commencing Tuesday, January 2 on CBWT, 5:00 to 5:30 p.m.

Host for the series is Jim Mitchell, former host of *How About That*, *Let's Follow Jim* and *Swim Time*. Each week he will lead junior and senior high school students, and any others who care to look in, on a fascinating tour of some provincial government department. Government employees will appear to explain how they go about their jobs in the Department of Agriculture, the Highways Department, the Manitoba Telephone System, Manitoba Hydro, the law courts, Mines and Natural Resources department, Travel and Publicity, and other provincial departments.

A special feature each week will be a discussion by two high school students. Each program will end with a question-and-answer period, with students of various city and suburban schools taking part. Ron Bashford is producer.

humorous, some serious, controversial, perhaps even irritating, but all interesting, we hope."

"For instance," says Ralfe, "we're planning to have an item on the latest activities of the radical Sons of Freedom sect of the Doukhobors in British Columbia—interviews with sect members and opinions on their difficulties. From Toronto we'll offer a program on the arguments of an expressway versus a subway, and others on various problems of Metropolitan government. From Ottawa Tom Earle will give us background colour about people and events on Parliament Hill—not a run-down of the week in governmental affairs, but facts and opinions about Parliamentary developments and situations, and other news from the Ottawa area. We're planning a report from Newfoundland on how the island is recovering from the terrible fires that swept over it a few months ago. And there'll be human interest and colour contributions from many other parts of the country."

The Canadian Broadcasting Corporation won 21 prizes at the 1961 Ohio State University awards for educational radio and television programs. Eligible for a total of 62 prizes, the CBC won 15 for radio and six for television. Its closest competitor, the Columbia Broadcasting System, won a total of eight awards.

'The Nature of Things' Returns

CBC TELEVISION'S informative science series, *The Nature of Things*, returns for its second season this week at a new, prime viewing time: Thursday evenings. Changes have been made in content to suit the expected larger, and probably older, audience.

David Walker, program organizer, says *The Nature of Things* is intended to show parents some of the scientific subjects their children are being taught at school as well as augmenting adult viewers' scientific knowledge and helping science students in high schools.

"Our aims during the series are to show the inter-dependence of the sciences, to give young people and their parents an appreciation of science and scientists and to delineate the emerging roles of science and technology," says Walker. "We intend to emphasize the unity of science, showing how its various branches pool their resources to solve specific problems. For example, in the study of the function of body cells, physicists, chemists, mathematicians and biologists combine their findings."

Among those who will be seen during the series are: Drs. Donald Ivey and Patterson Hume of the University of Toronto; Donald Crowdis, curator of the Nova Scotia Science Museum; and Lister Sinclair, one of the writers of the series who will also appear as host of some of the programs. Other contributing writers are Alan King and Rita Greer Allen. Alan Maitland will introduce each program. Producer of the series is James R. Murray.

The first program of the new series will be seen this Thursday night. Entitled *Looking Ahead*, it devotes some time to the plasma research work being done at the RCA Victor laboratories in Montreal. The director of the laboratories, Dr. Morell Bachynski, in some ways represents those whom C. P. Snow has called "the new men," the new generation of scientists who are doing so much to mould the future of our civilization. There will also be interviews with a few of the prominent American and Canadian scientists to find out what the promising areas are in the science, what branch of science or scientific development we will be hearing about and what sort of person is doing important research. Sinclair will be host of the program, written by King.



Dr. Donald Ivey of the University of Toronto returns as host of some of the programs this season on *The Nature of Things*. With a new time slot, the format takes on a new look.

On January 11, the series switches to the motion-picture camera and the role this invention has played in scientific discovery since it was first used experimentally in the late 19th century. A Shell film unit production, *The Revealing Eye*, will be introduced by Donald Crowdis.

Drs. Ivey and Hume are the hosts of the January 18 program, *To Educate a Scientist*, which explains what can be learned from physics and one of the new ways it can be taught, using simple homemade apparatus. These methods have been worked out by the Physical Science Study Committee, initiated by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and the National Science Foundation of America.

The Situation is Fluid, the January 25 program, is about detergents—what they are and how they remove dirt. Another film, *Outline of Detergency*, produced by Unilever, will be introduced by Crowdis. The program also considers the nature of liquids in general.

Gallstones will be the subject of the February 1 program, in which part of a BBC production, *Your Life in Their Hands*, will be shown. The program, which originated at the Charing Cross Hospital in London, England, explains what gallstones are, how they are formed and how they are removed. Viewers will also learn of some interesting aspects of chemistry. (Please turn to page 7)

istry, limestone, doctors and surgical operations. Crowdis is also host for this program.

On February 8, host J. Tuzo Wilson, professor of geophysics at the University of Toronto discusses the Upper Mantle Project, a Canadian plan to survey that part of the earth lying immediately below its crust. Detailed knowledge of this layer, which is only a few miles beneath the surface of the planet, may lead to a clearer understanding of how the earth was formed and what determines weather and landscape phenomena.

Dr. Hume and Ivey return for the February 15 program, *The Language of Physics*, to present the story of how mathematics enables us to investigate

nature in the science of physics. Some of the physical phenomena of music are discussed by Lister Sinclair on the February 22 program, titled *The Physics of Music*. Among the points talked about by Sinclair are: What are the sounds out of which music is made and how are they combined in traditional and electronic musical instruments? How do you describe a note? And, if some instruments are more precise than others, is it desirable?

On March 1, Donald Crowdis discusses the relationship of a human being's social development, temperament and physique. Dr. William Sheldon describes, with the help of other scientists, how he gives numerical values to our constitutions and our minds. Some implications concern parents, who, some years from now, may be able to decide what careers their children should follow.



"Noel sur la place" was created for Canadian television last Sunday December 24 in Montreal, in much the same spirit, followed by the celebration of the Holy Mass from St. Laurent College Chapel. Featured in the play were Roland Chenail, Monique Leyrac, Georges Groulx, Lise Lasalle and Monique Normandin.

When Wooden Figurines Speak

TRAVELLER Without LUGGAGE

JEAN ANOUILH has long ranked as one of France's most brilliant dramatists. But when North American audiences were introduced to his work in the last decade, they were at first repelled and bewildered by his outlook. They called him a bitter, desolate writer, disgusted with life.

But later, after they had had a further taste of his stimulating, often blistering ideas, they began to see that he was basically an incorrigible romantic in a tender, malicious, savage way. While he's busy defaming love, romance, innocence, fidelity, marriage, honor and medical progress, he's admiring man's courage in clinging to ideals in the face of disappointment. He insists that his plays are not realistic but rather poetic and imaginative interpretations of reality. People, he says, are more important than dreams.

One of his most flashing mixtures of farce, irony, sentiment and stinging wit is *Traveller Without Luggage*. CBC-TV's *Festival* series presents a 90-minute adaptation of it on Monday night. Production is by Mario Prizek. Set in France in the 1930's, the play stars James Douglas as Gaston, a young man who has spent many years in a mental home, suffering from amnesia brought on by the First World War, and is now trying to establish his identity, in spite of his fear of finding out who he might be.

Other starring roles are played by Norma Renault, Mary Savidge, Jane Mallett, and Geoffrey Alexander, with Joseph Shaw, Anne Butler, Donald Ewer, Gillie Fenwick, Winifred Dennis, Leo Phillips, Rex Hagon and Charles Palmer.

Prizek has drawn on personal experience in producing the show. "I had a brief loss of memory a few years ago, after a car accident in London, England," he says. "I knew what it felt like to be detached completely from the past. Aside from moments of panic, it was a wonderfully light, happy feeling."

Prizek says he considered setting the play in the period after the Second World War, "but felt it would lose something in the transition. The comic touches throughout underline the bitterness and sharpness of the theme, and are somehow more in perspective set in the 30's."

Traveller Without Luggage begins when the Duchesse Dupont-Dufort (Jane Mallett) brings Gaston to the country estate of the widowed Mme. Renaud (Mary Savidge), who, with her eldest son Georges (Geoffrey Alexander) and his wife, Valentine (Norma Renault), try to prove to Gaston that he is really Mme. Renaud's lost son. Gaston confesses that he doesn't recognize any of them. In conversations with his mother, he realizes that she had never really loved him. And he discovers that he had had an affair with Valentine, who wants to carry on the relationship. Gradually Gaston begins to hate himself and his family. Then he finds a loophole through which he thinks he can escape from both his real family and the horrors of his past, but in trying to run away he reveals the cruelty and selfishness inherent in him.

Although the play has a happy ending on the surface, underneath lurks the usual bitter twist found

daughter of the Marquis of Calatrava. The Marquis is determined that his daughter shall marry a man of higher status, but Donna Leonora is deeply in love with Alvaro and plans to elope with him, aided by her confidante, Curra. On the point of departure with him, she suddenly desires to see her father for the last time. He unexpectedly enters and discovers Alvaro; he threatens Alvaro with death, and Alvaro offers to surrender himself to the Marquis. He flings down his pistol which fires and mortally wounds the Marquis, who dies cursing his daughter.

Act II. The Alcalde, several peasant muleteers, and Don Carlo of Vargas, the brother of Donna Leonora, are gathered in an inn in the village of Hornachuelos. Don Carlo is searching for Alvaro to avenge the death of his father and is disguised as a student of Salamanca, under the fictitious name of Pereda. Leonora, in male attire, arrives. During the supper a gypsy tells the young men's fortunes and exhorts them to enlist in the war for Italy's freedom. Don Carlo tells them of his father's death. Leonora overhears and barely escapes discovery.

Change of scene: a monastery. Leonora takes refuge in the monastery. She tells the abbot her true name and that she intends to spend the rest of her life in a hermitage.

Act III. Alvaro has joined the Spanish army under an assumed name. One night he saves the life of Carlo who is serving in the same army also under an assumed name. They become close friends and go into battle side by side. In one of these engagements Alvaro is seriously wounded and confides to Carlo's care a box containing a bundle of letters which he is to destroy as soon as Alvaro dies. He has sworn not to look at the contents of the letters but he becomes suspicious of his friend, opens the box and finds a picture of his sister. At that moment a surgeon brings word that Alvaro may recover.

Act IV. Alvaro has entered the monastery at Hornachuelos, near which is Leonora's cave. Carlo arrives and forces Alvaro, now in monk's garb, to fight. They choose the ground before the cave and Carlo is mortally wounded. Alvaro calls for help, and Leonora, recognizing his voice, rushes out. She stoops over her dying brother who stabs her to the heart. Alvaro flings himself to death from a cliff as the monks arrive singing a Miserere.





Explorations

Three "Firebrand" Politicians

IN THE HUNGRY, tragic decade between the stock market crash of 1929 and the beginning of the Second World War, three Canadian premiers rose to power in a whirlwind. They were dynamic, colourful men with new ideas: Mitchell Hepburn of Ontario, William Aberhart of Alberta, and Maurice Duplessis of Quebec. Each in his own way was an answer to his times.

What kind of men were they—in the spotlight and behind it? Why and how did they achieve fame and power? And how did they maintain their place in politics? CBC-TV's *Explorations* offers some of the answers in *Portraits of the Thirties*, a four-part series beginning Wednesday night.

Narrator and interviewer for the series will be Professor John Saywell of the history department at the University of Toronto. For several months he and a CBC drama crew travelled across Canada from Quebec City to Vancouver, filming interviews about the depression years with dozens of Canadians. He talked to relatives of Hepburn, Aberhart and Duplessis, as well as to other men and women who were associated with them in and out of politics.

This week's program is about Mitchell Hepburn—"husband, father, Ontario's biggest onion farmer, headline seeker, friend of the people and of big business, and premier of Ontario." Saywell talked to Hepburn's widow; friends Archie Coulter, an Elgin County farmer, and Colin Campbell; Senator David Croll, who was Hepburn's minister of labour at the time of the General Motors Strike in Oshawa in 1937; Malcolm Smith who was working at the GM

plant at that time; and Tom Keith, a former editor of the *St. Thomas Times-Journal*.

In 1926, at 30, Hepburn became the youngest member of the House of Commons, and before long was known for his wit, charm, quick decisions, and his fiery way of lashing out at millionaires, high tariffs, insurance companies, and banks. The people loved him. Four years later, in the depths of the Depression, Hepburn became the leader of the Ontario Liberal party.

Explorations follows his progress as he blasted his way to the premiership, as he tried to fulfil his promises to the people of Ontario (with such dramatic attractions as the auctioning-off of cabinet ministers' limousines), and as his power began to decline.

The turn of the tide in Hepburn's career dated from the General Motors strike in Oshawa in 1937, when an effort was made to organize a union in the plant, and Hepburn swore that "the CIO will come into Ontario only over my dead body." Labour felt he was its friend no longer, and gradually his supporters drifted away. Hepburn then turned to big business for support, but he was no longer the successful firebrand of his earlier years. His final legislation was the compulsory pasteurization of milk.

He spent the last years of his administration in a running feud with fellow Liberal Mackenzie King, whom he had once helped to elect. He was defeated in the 1945 election—even in his own constituency of Elgin County. He retired brokenhearted to his farm and died in his sleep on January 5, 1953, in the room where he was born.

The January 10 program is about the rise and fall of William Aberhart of Alberta, who combined politics with fundamentalist religious fervor in a (Please turn to page 31)

unique atmosphere that swept him through the dust and misery of the Depression to the premiership in 1935. Like Hepburn he was an Ontario farmer's son, born in 1878. He soon left the farm and faced a dilemma that bothered him all his life. Should he be a teacher or a preacher?

At first he chose the schoolroom. But after he headed west at 31 to win his way into one of Alberta's top educational jobs—principal of Calgary's Crescent Heights high school—the preacher in him rose to the surface, and he founded the Prophetic Bible Institute. Through religious broadcasts he gathered a large band of enthusiastic supporters. Soon after the Depression hit Alberta he began to preach a new doctrine of Social Credit—overnight he had been converted, after a friend lent him a book explaining the social credit theories formulated by a Scottish engineer, Major C. H. Douglas. Quickly Aberhart set out to convince other Albertans.

He sent out barrages of pamphlets and speaking teams through the province. In a razzle-dazzle grand sweep of the province, he rode to the premiership in 1935, as head of the first Social Credit government in the world. In only three years he had led a great grassroots movement from nothing but ideas in a book to province-wide power. He was re-elected to office in 1940, but his lustre had faded a little. He died in 1943 at 64.

The January 17 and 24 programs will look at the equally famous but longer career of Maurice Duplessis of Quebec. They are sub-titled *The Face of Hope* and *The Face of Disappointment*.

Duplessis' supporters, says Professor Saywell, called him "a loyal friend, a brilliant administrator, charitable, an ally of the common man, a democratic politician of outstanding ability and appeal, and above all, a French Canadian dedicated to his people and their rights." His enemies called him "a traitor who betrayed a great movement and a great cause, a 19th-century Tory reactionary, a corrupt politician, spiteful, an arrogant man in quest of one thing: power; . . . a dictator . . ."

Violent controversy about this man who ruled Quebec from 1936 to 1939, and from 1944 to 1959, continues even after his death. Many men might have broken up under the storm that surrounded him, but he seemed to thrive on the battlefield.

He was born into a political family in Three Rivers in 1890, the son of a judge who was a member of the Quebec Legislature for 14 years. Like his father, Maurice became a lawyer and was elected to the provincial legislature in 1927. For a while he merely watched politics from the sidelines, waiting for the perfect moment for his grand entrance to sweep Quebec out of its Depression doldrums.

In a 1933 election convention he convinced the delegates that he was their man, and was elected leader of the New Conservative Party of Quebec. He and his party weren't taken very seriously at first. But Duplessis really got into action in 1935 when he joined Paul Gouin and his Action Libérale Nationale party to form a coalition: Union Nationale.

Professor Saywell interviews a cross-section of Quebec citizens to try to find out what lay behind Duplessis' "strange paternal government that betrayed many of its own followers and dismayed the rest of Canada."

in Anouilh's plays. But, as drama critic Walter Kerr once pointed out in the New York *Herald Tribune*, Anouilh is the true artist who is able to touch life without smearing it. "He puts his finger on a pinpoint in time or on a delicate pressure-point of passion, and takes it away again while the tingle of contact is still in the air and before he has discolored the moment with his own blunt mark. He makes the world transparent without making it obvious. Everything hovers on the edge of definition, holding its breath. We stand at the top of a teetering ladder, slightly dizzy and not entirely secure, looking at the whole landscape in a single, triumphant glance."

Anouilh has a natural gift for whimsy, and he has mastered dialogue with dazzling sharpness. With

great delicacy he creates poetic moods as he jokes and jibes against disappointment, pointing up the struggle within us all of optimism and pessimism. Why are "great men" in politics often corrupt? he asks. Why does love so rarely last? Why does money so frequently take the place of beauty, truth, affection? Why are desire and love so embarrassingly confounded?

Grimly irritating as some of Anouilh's ideas are, his work is vastly entertaining, partly because he doesn't even attempt to rectify life's "errors" with a big stick. If his glance at life is pained, his assessment disillusioned, it is because he feels that the cancerous growth of self-seeking opportunism is so overwhelming that nothing can be done about it. But he can make the prospect of grinning and bearing it a stimulating theatrical experience.
