

THE ACADIANS

Hardy Residents of the Atlantic Seaboard

ALONG THE ATLANTIC seaboard, in the areas where the legendary Acadians live, there is a couplet which goes—"Contentez-vous avec peu. Vous serez toujours heureux." It means: "Be contented with little. You will always be happy." This is the way it has been for the Acadians, since the first 300 founders of this "race" arrived in the New World from France in 1632.

During the last century one aspect of the Acadians has been their dominant claim: the more than 30,000 Acadians in Nova Scotia are much closer to their more than 600,000 fellow Nova Scotians of British ancestry than to the French Canadian people of Quebec.

They like to say they are Acadians, not to distinguish themselves from Nova Scotians, but because they want to make it clear that they aren't French Canadians from Montreal. Some Acadians say that those in Quebec have maintained a state within a state and have clung to old ways too tightly for their own or the country's good. They resent what they consider a tendency of the well-to-do in Quebec to look down on the Acadians as poor relations. Nova Scotia is not a wealthy province, and the Acadians for the most part live very simply.

There has been relatively little migration of Acadians to Quebec. It is often remarked along the Acadian shore between Yarmouth and Grand Pre on the rim of the Bay of Fundy, "We can't even understand each other." The dialects used in Nova Scotia and in Montreal or Quebec often vary greatly.

On Wednesday, March 21, CBC television's *Explorations* will present the second of two programs from CBC Halifax about the Acadians. The first program was to be seen March 14.

The Mount Allison Institute on French Canada held in Sackville, New Brunswick, last summer considered, among other things, the effect of forces at work in French Canada today on the French-speaking groups outside the province of Quebec. The increasingly important contribution of the Acadians to the life of the Maritime Provinces, especially New Brunswick, was made evident during the discussions.

At that time, interviews were filmed with the general chairman of the Institute, A. Davidson Dunton, with Professor Mason Wade of the University of Rochester and others. These, with subsequent interviews held in the Acadian district of Claire in Nova Scotia, and in the Moncton area of New Brunswick, form the basis for the series.

The second program includes a panel discussion among Dr. Colin MacKay, president of the Univer-

sity of New Brunswick; Emery LeBlanc, editor of the French-language daily *L'Evangeline*; and the Rev. Clement Cormier, president of St. Joseph's University. Host for *The Acadian*, is Ken Homer. Sandy Lumsden is the producer.

The early years of the Acadians in North America were ones of constant turmoil and change as the area in which they lived continuously changed hands between the British and French. Isaac de Razilly brought the first 300 *hommes d'élite* to Port Royal in 1632 and then, between 1639 and 1649, D'Aulnay Charnisay brought more. Smaller groups arrived later and a sprinkling of French soldiers settled in the colony. The main settlements were made along the Port Royal Valley (Annapolis) and Minas Bay, but some located at Canso and Cape Sable. Generally, the early Acadians came from the west of France — Berry, Basse-Bretagne, Poitou, Saintoigne and Touraine.

The people for the most part were strong, healthy, virtuous, sincerely attached to their religion and their traditions. Content with the product of their labor

Sing a Song of Parkinson's Law

THREE BRITISH writers have pooled their talents in a 30-minute operetta which, in the best Gilbertian tradition, pokes fun at various institutions and the type of organization which produced the program, the BBC.

The writers are Nesta Pain, David Heneker and Monty Norman, and their collaboration resulted in *Parkinson's Law*, based on C. Northcote Parkinson's popular book about work practices in large organizations. The operetta will be heard on *CBC Radio International*, Friday, March 23 at 8:30 p.m.

One of the first jokes in the program is about the venerable British Broadcasting Company: An official sings the program credits to a typist and orders many copies to be sent to other executives, including A.C.P.T.P. (P)—the Assistant Comptroller of Programs, Third Program (Programs).

The first part of the operetta deals with Parkinson's First Law: that "work expands so as to fill the



time available for its completion." A tired executive decides he needs help—"not one assistant, young, eager and ruthless, and ready to trample me underfoot in his rush for power," but two—"Two who will be rivals to each other, but not to me." (Factor one of Parkinson's Law is that "subordinates must number two or more, each being kept in order by fear of the other's promotion.")

A year later the two assistants have demanded—and gotten—assistants: two each. Seven people are now doing the work that was being done by one before. And how is the original overworked official? He is swamped, looking after Four's special increment, Five's application for transfer, Six's compas-

sionate leave for twins, Three and Two who have quarrelled irrevocably, and Five, who is in love with a married woman in the typing pool.

Among the other topics dealt with are methods of selecting new employees, including the perfect advertisement (which brings in a single candidate who is "off his head and exactly what we want"), and retirement.

Music for *Parkinson's Law* is by Antony Hopkins, who is something of an old friend to many Canadian radio listeners. Last season CBC presented his lectures on *Understanding Music*, recorded while he was in Canada to teach at the Jeunesses Musicales Camp at Mount Orford, Quebec. 

THE ACADIANS

and having few wants, they lived in perfect equality and with extreme frugality.

In 1654 the Acadians came under British rule and for the next 13 years they managed to live a fairly peaceful life even though plagued from time to time by the shifting Anglo-French relationships among the colonists. Under the Treaty of Breda in 1667, Acadia was handed back to the French in exchange for St. Christopher, Antigua and Montserrat, and for the next quarter of a century England and France were at peace, the Acadians being active in the cultivation of the marshlands by the rivers and the sea, in building dikes to keep back the tides, in cutting timber for fuel and in hunting.

In 1710 the Acadians again came under British rule. No serious breach occurred in the life of the Acadians even though their refusal to take an oath of allegiance perplexed their administrators. Because their peaceful intentions seemed obvious, they were allowed to carry on without disturbance. It was not until France began to make Louisbourg a North American stronghold, and to strengthen Beausejour and the other Chignecto posts that the British began to take more interest in Nova Scotia. With the construction of Halifax and the founding of a British settlement there after 1749, the Acadians began to be looked upon as a local problem of some magnitude.

From time to time, on the appointment of a new governor or commandant, the Acadians were requested to take the oath, but it was never enforced because under various pretexts the inhabitants refused to take an unqualified oath of allegiance. In July, 1755, the Acadian emissaries were called to Halifax and, unaware of the appalling consequences intended for them, they adhered to their traditional attitude of refusing the oath unless they were exempted from military service. On July 28, the decision to move out the Acadians and disperse them among the British colonies was made public.

In most cases, they endured much suffering in the colonies and, after the peace of 1763, hundreds of them found their way back to Nova Scotia. By then their lands had been taken over by the British and they were forced to begin again the work of pioneer clearance. But Acadian settlements were soon established in various parts of Nova Scotia, mainly along the coasts.

The expulsion has been immortalized by Longfellow in his poem, *Evangeline*, which tells of the mass exodus and the hardships involved. Among the Acadians, there is the feeling that there might have been a hundred Evangelines during those hard years, hundreds who are now legendary figures among their descendants who number more than 1,000,000 in North America with the majority of them in the Maritime provinces.

Finding Out About Music

TO PROVIDE junior listeners between the ages of nine and fourteen with some awareness of the creative process involved in writing and making music, the *National School Broadcast* is presenting a series of five programs in which two young people, Gary and his sister Lynn, discover for themselves how to understand and respond to music.

Titled *Finding Out About Music*, the programs were to begin Friday, March 16. The dramatized scripts are by the late Dr. Leslie Bell, noted Canadian musicologist who died early this year.

In the opening program Gary and Lynn listen to records and talk with a school friend who works in a record shop, discovering that the sounds in the world around them—sounds of nature and man-made sounds of civilization—often provide inspiration or an idea for a composer. In the March 23 broadcast they learn how important rhythm is in music and how many different kinds of rhythm exist. And on March 30 they discover how primitive rhythms developed

into melody and then harmony, the steps being illustrated with many attractive musical excerpts.

The April 6 program about form in music will illustrate the way a march is built, rhythmically and melodically, and the musical and emotional intent of the march. A dance form, and the most common orchestral forms, the symphony and the sonata, will be similarly discussed and illustrated.

In the last program, on April 13, Gary and Lynn follow a composer through each of the steps he takes in writing a piece of music, from the initial idea to the first performance. The music will be *Four Epigrams for Symphony Orchestra*, an original work commissioned especially for the program from Rudi van Dijk, young Dutch-Canadian composer. The *Epigrams* incorporate the two main essentials in a work designed to appeal to young listeners: a powerful rhythm drive, and a wide range of orchestral tone colour. Rudi van Dijk also wrote the music for the *National School Broadcast* series *Voices of the Wild*, and he has written for other CBC radio programs, too. He teaches piano to young people and is one of the accompanists in the *Playroom* series, heard on CBC radio Monday to Saturday at 10:15 a.m.





Festival of Songs

Sunday, March 18 at 8:30 p.m., replacing *Music-Hall*, CBWFT presents its Festival of Songs, a yearly event during which are announced the winners of a country-wide song-writing contest organized by the CBC's French Radio and Television Networks.

Judges for this year's contest are three well-known Canadian musicians and performers: troubadour Félix Leclerc, composer - conductor Jean Deslauriers and disc-jockey Guy Mauffette. Their task: to choose among

some 600 compositions, the 12 best, and the three among these to be presented at the International Song Festival in Brussels.

The winning compositions and their authors remain unknown to all except producer, vocalists and author until the actual on-air audition, which might partially explain the popularity of this particular yearly event, and the enthusiastic audiences that throng to the St. Laurent College auditorium in Montreal to witness the contest finals.

Producer Marcel Henry has selected some of French Canada's best-known performers to create these 12 new songs. They are: Miss Music-Hall, Muriel Millard; singer-actor Michel Noel; organist Lucien Héту (a past *Please turn to page 31*)

D. H. LAWRENCE:

Controversial Man of Letters

SOME REMEMBER D. H. Lawrence as an angry, red-headed scarecrow, apparently tied to his mother's apron strings, who had a mind like a cesspool, thought about nothing but sex, and died at 44 of T.B. He was labelled a communist, a fascist, a sexual pervert, and much was made of his fierce, easily-roused temper and his restlessness.

Most critics consider him one of the important writers of the 20th century, a deeply serious man who wanted to know the whole world in all its manifestations, and who continuously urged his fellow men to creep out of their shells and live a freer, more intense life in the short span allotted to them. He tried to persuade them that sex is neither shameful nor slyly funny. Those close to him insisted that he was a puritan rather than an immoralist. And yet his most famous books: *Sons and Lovers*, *Lady Chatterley's Lover*, etc., have long drawn smirks from readers who see them only as spicy, under-the-counter fare.

Actually there were many Lawrences, depending on your point of view. In his wife's view, "The spring of his being was love for his fellow men, love for everything alive, and almost all creatures were more alive to him than they actually were . . . He embodied most of the English virtues. This sounds ridiculous but it is true. Complete honesty, mentally and materially, a sense of freedom, and drive, and above all, courage. It took courage to write what he wrote in the teeth of British convention . . . He died

unbroken; he never lost his own wonder of life. He never did a thing he did not want to do and nothing and nobody could make him. He never wrote a word he did not mean at the time he wrote it. He never compromised with the little powers that be; if ever there lived a free, proud man, Lawrence was that man . . . He had a full life, but the fullness was mostly in him."

The art and the life of this strange man, as misjudged genius, wandering prophet, dying poet and tempestuous seeker-after-life, will be discussed on CBC Wednesday Night, March 21, on CBC radio at 10:30, in the series *Architects of Modern Thought*. The speaker will be John Peter, who lectures in the English department at Victoria College, Victoria, B.C. Born and raised in South Africa, he graduated from Cambridge in 1946, and taught in the English department of the University of Manitoba from 1950 to 1952. He has published numerous articles and poems, and two books of literary criticism, the latest being *A Critique of Paradise Lost*.

Lawrence was the offspring of a Nottinghamshire miner and of a teacher of some cultivation. As a boy, he was rather sickly, but studious, with strong ideas about his own ability. "We wor a bit hard on him," recalled a school pal. "He wor a bit to blame, for he wor rayther stuck up. But he began hittin' back wi' his tongue and he could get at us where it hurt" — a knack he learned to perfect. His mother, whom

Drama Portrays the Eskimo

A 90-MINUTE drama about Eskimo life in the far north of Canada will be broadcast this Tuesday at 8 p.m. on the CBC Trans-Canada radio network. Written by Len Peterson and produced and directed by Esse Ljungh, *The Great Hunger* is about justice, religion and revenge among the Eskimos.

Starring in the drama will be John Scott as Kudlu, Beth Lockerbie as Nukinga, Frank Perry as Noona, Barry Morse as Pitsoolak and Jean Keller as Saodlu.

The Great Hunger was originally heard on CBC radio in February, 1959, in a two-hour production for *CBC Stage*. At that time it was titled *Tomorrow We Hunt*. This new version has been tightened and partially rewritten and was staged in Toronto at the Centre Stage theatre in November, 1960.

Peterson has been interested in the Eskimo since his 'teens, and was commissioned by the CBC to write the play. For the first time in Canadian history,

the co-operation between different branches of the federal government resulted in a play. The CBC's drama department was interested in Peterson's idea and financed his trip to the Arctic in 1958. The Department of Northern Affairs arranged travel and accommodation for Peterson in Baffin Land.

The Great Hunger, when performed two years ago on the stage, drew more than passing interest by Toronto theatre critics, and Farley Mowat, author of several books about Canada's Eskimos, wrote, after seeing the play:

"Of those writers who are contributing to the destruction of the old Eskimo myth, and who are concerned in the revelation of the real man behind the myth, no one has struck a more telling blow than Len Peterson in his new play, *The Great Hunger*.

Program Notes

METROPOLITAN OPERA

Un Ballo in Maschera (A Masked Ball). Opera in three acts by Verdi. Cast: Count Riccardo, Governor of Boston—tenor; Renato, his secretary—baritone; Amelia, wife of Renato—soprano; Ulrica, fortune teller—contralto; Oscar, page—soprano; Silvano, sailor—baritone; Samuel and Tom, conspirators—bass. Place, in and near Boston. Time, the end of the 17th century.

Act I. Officers and citizens in the house of Count Riccardo express their love for him, while the Negro conspirators, Samuel, Tom and their friends, declare their hatred. Ulrica, a Negress, is about to be banished as a witch. Riccardo loves Amelia, the wife of his secretary. Renato sees the list of the invited guests and warns the governor of treachery to come. He resolves to visit Ulrica in disguise. The conspirators learn of this and determine to take advantage of the opportunity to wreak their vengeance.

Change of scene: Ulrica's dwelling. Incantation scene. Amid a crowd of women and children Riccardo appears disguised as a fisherman and is recognized by Ulrica. Amelia arrives and the witch dismisses the crowd. Riccardo overhears that Amelia loves him and that she desires forgetfulness from the sorceress. Ulrica tells Amelia to pluck a certain plant at midnight in a lonely place, and she departs. Riccardo now has his fortune told and hears that death is near and that the first man to press his hand that day will be his murderer. Renato appears and extends his hand to Riccardo. Riccardo is recognized as the governor and is joyfully greeted by the people.

Act II. Midnight. A deserted spot. Amelia meets Riccardo and both declare their love. Renato unexpectedly arrives on the scene to save the governor from the conspirators. He does not recognize his disguised wife, and first having changed cloaks with Riccardo, promises to escort her to safety. The conspirators are foiled but in revenge tear the veil from Amelia's face, and Renato, thunderstruck, recognizes his wife. Renato's love for the governor turns to hate and he arranges with the conspirators to meet him the next day.

Act III. Renato's chamber. Renato plans to kill Riccardo. He promises aid to the conspirators and compels Amelia to take part in the drawing of lots. His name is found on the slip and Amelia suspects his designs. Oscar, the page, brings an invitation to the masked ball.

Change of scene: Masked ball at the palace of the governor. Riccardo resolves to allow Renato and Amelia to sail for England and thus be true to honour and duty. The conspirators seek the governor but he is warned by Amelia and bids her farewell, renouncing his love for her. He is stabbed by Renato who has followed him. Dying, he declares Amelia's innocence and forgives Renato. W-2:00 pm K-2:00 pm X-2:00 pm



he adored, encouraged him to become a certified teacher, which he did, and was an excellent one, too, by all accounts.

It was a buxom farm girl he met on holiday who encouraged him in his verse writing. (She figures as Miriam in *Sons and Lovers*). They were close friends for 10 years, and it was she who copied out five of his poems by hand and sent them to the *English Review*, which published several. This paved the way for the publication of Lawrence's novel, *The White Peacock*. The success of this was dimmed by the death of his mother, but the sight of himself in print, though it carried with it only 50 pounds in practical cash prompted Lawrence to give up his teaching job and try to live by writing.

Some months later, while calling on a professor to see whether he might find a job lecturing in a German university, Lawrence fell madly in love

with the professor's wife, a woman five years older than he, the mother of two children, and the daughter of a German baron. Such was Lawrence's magnetism that he persuaded her, within a month, to leave husband and children and follow him into an uncertain, impecunious future. In a couple of years she got a divorce, and they were married.

He had his first brush with police pruriency in 1915 when his novel *The Rainbow* was condemned as obscene and the whole edition was burned. Perhaps the most rounded illustration of Lawrence's ideas on life and love, *Women in Love*, was published by private subscription in New York, after having been rejected five years earlier in London. When the Lawrences were living near Florence he wrote *Lady Chatterley's Lover*, making at least three versions before he was satisfied. In 1928 it was published privately in Italy, and was banned in England and the United States, but thousands of copies were smuggled into both countries over the years. And the book is still the subject of hot controversy.



DRAMA PORTRAYS THE ESKIMO

"... I have some peripheral knowledge of Eskimos at first hand and, as a writer myself, more than peripheral knowledge of the motivations and emotions common to all men. The people of Peterson's play, while they are incidentally Eskimos, are pre-eminently men—men amongst men. And it is an odd thing to remember that their own name for themselves — *Inhuit* — means simply that, Pre-eminently Men. This is how Peterson has seen them, and it is in the light of this clear vision that he has portrayed them.

"This play is truth. It is as implacably true and as faithful to man's enduring nature as the Greek classics. It is authentic, with the unquestionable authenticity which can only arise from the mind and pen of a perceptive and greatly gifted writer. With *The Great Hunger*, Peterson has done the Eskimos an immeasurably important service. He has rendered an equally important service to the rest of us as well."

Nathan Cohen, *Toronto Daily Star* critic, observed *The Great Hunger* as being "copiously flecked with those qualities of feeling, and reflection on the wonder and mystery of the human condition which are essential for an entertainment to graduate into art. The setting is unfamiliar, but there is far more to *The Great Hunger* than mere novelty."

The drama itself is about an Eskimo boy, who on becoming a fully-fledged hunter, learns that he must kill the man who killed his father or bring on the worst of evils, the shortage of food. "But Kudlu has been a second father to Noona, the young hunter," says the boy's mother, Nukingka, "and a good husband to her." However, Saodlu, a sort of witch-woman, demands action, before the blame spreads to the rest of the tribe.

Peterson's interest in Eskimos began when his Norwegian-born father took him to see the Norwegian hero and explorer, Amundsen. Now the interest has grown. Explains Peterson, "I am a Canadian and an awful lot of Canada is in the far north."

To make his play authentic, Peterson spent two months in the Arctic during the winter of 1958, doing research near Frobisher Bay.

Before he left for Frobisher, Peterson met and joined up with Lee Manning, an Eskimo linguist with the Department of Northern Affairs who had spent 34 years with the Hudson's Bay Company. Manning's death of a heart attack a week after their arrival at Frobisher, cut short many of the plans they had originally made but Peterson found the one week of tutelage with the old Arctic hand invaluable when he set out on his own to document and study his subject. This association along with the actual day-by-day experience of living with the Eskimos helped Peterson to obtain the authenticity he sought when he decided he'd like to write a play about the Eskimos.

CHOCOLATE SLICE

- 1 1/4 cups sifted flour
- 3/4 teaspoon soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/4 cups chopped dates
- 3/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1 cup chocolate tid-bits
- 2 unbeatn eggs
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 cup orange juice
- 1 cup nut meats

Sift flour, soda and salt. Combine dates, sugar, water and butter in a large saucepan. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly until dates soften. Remove from stove, add chocolate, then blend in eggs. Mix well. Add dry ingredients alternately with orange juice and milk. Stir in nuts. Spread batter in well greased 15 x 10 x 1 jelly roll pan. Bake at 350°, 25 to 30 minutes. Cool and spread with glaze.

ORANGE GLAZE:

- 1 1/2 cups sifted icing sugar
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 or 2 teaspoons grated orange rind. Blend in 2 or 3 table-
spoons boiling water. Spread
over cake.

John Boyden:

One of the Most Gifted Singers I Have Ever Heard

... says soprano Elisabeth Schwarzkopf of this
young Canadian, featured this week
on CBC Wednesday Night

WHEN THE YOUNG Canadian singer John Boyden made his debut in the Mozart Hall of Vienna's famous Konzerthaus earlier this winter, critics compared him with another now-famous singer who had made his debut in the same hall exactly ten years earlier—Dietrich Fischer-Dieskau.

"At 25 he sings lieder with the kind of inspiration, nuance and intensity that one has attributed in recent years only to Fischer-Dieskau," said *The Express*. "The whole evening became a demonstration of a highly-cultivated, deeply-felt art." All of the Viennese papers were amazed at the young Canadian's mastery of the German language. *Der Kurier* described it as "staggering."

Mr. Boyden is soloist this week on a *CBC Wednesday Night* program from Montreal, conducted by Alexander Brott. He will sing Mahler's song-cycle *Kindertotenlieder*.

John Boyden was born in Woodstock, Ontario, and brought up in Stratford, where he studied both piano and voice. By the time he was 19 he had won dozens of trophies and prizes, and the Royal Conservatory of Music of Toronto awarded him a scholarship to study with the celebrated soprano Elisabeth Schwarzkopf, who describes him as "one of the most gifted singers I have ever heard." He then went to the Royal Academy of Music in London, and while in England was chosen to perform a solo role in Bach's Christmas Oratorio in the Royal Festival Hall and to represent the Academy at a recital at the Salzburg Mozarteum. In Montreal, where he now lives, his teacher has been Bernard Diamant, who also taught the contralto Maureen Forrester.

On *CBC Wednesday Night* this week Alexander Brott will conduct the orchestra in two works besides the Mahler songs—Richard Strauss' *Metamorphosen* and *Dance Suite After Couperin*. Earlier the same week, on the Sunday concert on television, Mr. Brott will conduct Bartok's opera *Bluebeard's Castle*. He is the subject of another *Portrait of a Canadian Composer* to be presented March 30 on *CBC Radio International*.
