# Reporting On Election Fever

INTENSIVE NEWS coverage of the campaign for the June 18 Federal Election is being carried out by the CBC. Television and radio news programs are carrying reports by top political reporters and camera crews are filming election rallies and speeches.

Two nationally-known CBC reporters, Norman DePoe from Ottawa and James M. Minifie from Washington, are criss-crossing the country during the campaign, reporting the political trends for CBC radio and television news programs.

The wealth of background information they gather will provide color and local detail on election night when DePoe will have a key position for the national television coverage, and Minifie for the national radio broadcast.

In addition, regional crews in five areas are reporting on election activities in their regions. During the election-night programs they will report regional returns.

DePoe, Minifie and the five regional reporters will contribute to the CBC radio and television National News as well as to the weekly television program, CBC Newsmagazine, throughout the campaign. In addition, they will provide reports for CBC News Roundup and direct reports on CBC radio every morning.



IN TELEVISION'S short 10-year history in Canada, the CBC has taken giant strides in bringing TV service to every area in which such service is economically feasible. Latest milepost is the building of transmitters at The Pas and Flin Flon, northern Manitoba mining communities. Finishing touches are just now being put on these transmitters, and it is expected that experimental signals will begin from Flin Flon June 8, with regular programming to commence June 25. At The Pas, June 22, is the prospective first date for the test signal, with the official opening scheduled for June 26.

Both stations will carry programming fed from CBWT Winnipeg and rebroadcast it for local reception, on channel 10 at Flin Flon and channel 7 at The Pas. The CBC Times will carry program listings and notes for these new stations.

IN CONNECTION with the extension of television coverage, the CBC will file applications for authority to establish rebroadcasting stations at Fort Francis, Atikokan and Red Lake in northwestern Ontario, it has just been announced. In the same region, stations have been authorized at Dryden and Sioux Lookout, presently under construction, and a station is operating at Kenora. A total of 50,000 people will be able to view TV in northwestern Ontario by the fall of 1963, it is hoped, if the new stations are approved. Ultimate plans call for the group of stations to be provided with program service from CBWT, Winnipeg.

INCORRECT INFORMATION was carried in this column two weeks ago regarding Saskatchewan Mirror's visit to Shaunavon. The visit will take place the week of July 9, not July 29 as was stated.

THE QUEEN MOTHER arrives in Canada June 7, close on the heels of her son-in-law H.R.H. Prince Philip, for a nine-day semi-official visit. She is to participate in the 100th anniversary of the Black Watch Royal Highland Regiment of Canada, of which she is Colonel-in-Chief.

The Queen Mother will spend three days in Montreal, then fly to Ottawa to be guest of the Governor-General, and will conclude her visit with a short stay in Toronto. CBC television and Trans-Canada radio networks will follow her on her itinerary, with the following programs: her arrival at Montreal on Thursday, June 7 (radio only); her attendance at a ceremonial parade of the Black Watch, Saturday, June 9 (radio and TV); a visit to Lansdowne Park, Ottawa, for a welcome by school children, Monday, June 11 (radio); her attendance at the running of the Queen's Plate at New Woodbine track near Toronto, Saturday, June 16 (radio and TV).

TAKING THE PLACE of the National School Telecasts on Tuesday afternoons is a program seen regularly on Sunday afternoons entitled Reflections. Music and songs are presented with a cast consisting of violinist Francis Chaplin, soprano Jean Marshall, baritone Clarence Fleiger, harpist Phyllis Ensher, pianist Carol Hughes and a string orchestra under the direction of Gordon MacPherson.

## The FACE of the FAIR

EIGHT YEARS AGO the city of Seattle, Wash., planned to provide itself with a modest new civic centre, costing about \$7,500,000. This year, the proposed centre has mushroomed into an \$80 million World's Fair, running from April 21 to October 21, with more than 35 countries taking part. The planning committee received so much financial co-operation from state and federal governments that they can now have their cake and eat it. When the Fair is over, the buildings will be used for the civic centre.

Seattle has also neatly scuttled New York's plans for a World's Fair in 1964. Under rules laid down by the Bureau of International Expositions, a country may have only one World's Fair per decade. New York will have an international exposition but cannot officially call it a World's Fair.

The emphasis at the Seattle fair-entitled Century 21-is on the progress of science, and life in the Space Age. The theme is epitomized in the Space Needle, a 600-foot tower topped by a revolving restaurant-observation deck resembling a flying saucer. Other wonders include the Spacearium, where visitors can take a simulated inter-planetary trip, the U.S. science pavilion, the Monorail, on which fair-goers are whisked in silent speed from downtown Seattle to the grounds, and thousands of other displays, ranging from space vehicles to thermo-nuclear refrigerators. Even the girlie shows on the midway feature are billed as "heavenly bodies!"

The Canadian exhibit is one of the biggest among the 59 official displays from foreign countries. Costing about \$350,000, it occupies nearly 12,000 square feet and is intended to show some notable Canadian developments in science and engineering, and how these are serving mankind. A few of them are: a device which automatically calls search planes to a crashed aircraft; an instrument for mending broken blood vessels; a camera which detects skin cancer; a radio beacon which operates as an unmanned lighthouse in remote coastal areas; and the Theratron Cobalt 60 unit-better known as the "cobalt

bomb"-used throughout the world in the treatment of cancer. Other displays show models of Canada's first atomic power station, a new system of pipeline operation and a new chemical processor known as the Fluohmic Furnace. In addition, there is a large diorama portraying an Arctic community of the future, with rocket and Hovercraft landing fields, a submarine transportation system and high-rise apartment blocks ringing a circular, dome-covered community centre.

On Sunday, June 3, CBC-TV's 20/20 will visit the Seattle World's Fair to bring viewers an over-all look at its wonders, with particular emphasis on Canada's contribution. Host Harry Mannis and interviewer Bill Herbert will tour many of the major exhibits and will discuss the displays with those in charge.

## Stage is Set For Summer Drama

SUMMER STAGE, the warm-weather edition of the Sunday night radio series, CBC Stage, begins June 3 with a play typical of the light drama fare offered annually in this popular summer show. It's Dr. Mac-Gregor and the Case of the Abominable Snowman, by Betty Lambert, to be produced in the CBC's Vancouver studios by Gerald Newman. While visiting friends at a mountain lodge, the doctor and an amateur detective join their hosts on a trip to the mountain top on a ski-lift. On the way up they pass an immobile, snow-covered man seated in the chair-lift heading in the other direction. Who killed him? How? Why? When? The doctor and the amateur sleuth leave no stone unturned until they find out, and for most listeners the resultant spine-chilling scenes should be a pleasant antidote for the first sultry days of the season.

As has been his custom for the last few years, CBC supervisor of drama Esse W. Ljungh is spreading the series' production duties around the five major CBC broadcast centres. After five plays from

# On Playdate and Festival

# Three Intriguing Dramas

PAUL ALMOND WILL PRODUCE three intriguing dramas this week on CBC-TV. The Collection and A Slight Ache, two short plays by Harold Pinter, one of the most promising and perceptive of the younger British playwrights, will be seen on Festival, Monday night. (Pinter's play The Caretaker was one of the past season's highlights off Broadway.) Hold My Hand, Soldier, by Clive Exton, a leading British TV writer, will be seen on Playdate Wednesday night.

While contrasting provocatively in setting and mood, *The Collection* and *A Slight Ache* both point out that there is no objective truth in any event that involves human beings. Each human sees it differently, or wants to see it differently, each is affected by it in a different way. And because of the differences in the speed at which people think, because of their false anticipation and inability to really listen to one another, they never really know each other.

"I feel," says Pinter. "that instead of any inability to communicate, there is a deliberate evasion of communication. Communication itself between people is so frightening that there is a continual talking about other things, rather than about what is at the root of their relationship. Communication is too alarming. To enter into someone else's life is too frightening. To disclose to others the poverty within us is too fearsome a possibility. I'm not suggesting that no character in a play can ever say what he in fact means. Not at all. I have found that there invariably does come a moment when this happens, where he says something, perhaps, which he has never said before. And when this happens, what he says can never be taken back."

Watching and listening for this subtle revelation keeps Pinter's audience on their toes, and gives them much to mull over afterwards, for part of Pinter's dramatic appeal is the material he offers for reflection. The Collection concerns four people in a search for the true facts about a recent event which

may or may not have involved two of them at a fashion showing for the trade (the "collection") in Leeds, England. It is not the event itself which is important, but the effect it has on the relationships of the four to each other, which, by the end of the play, are changed forever. The two who went to Leeds will be played by Neil McCallum and Toby Robins. Miss Robins is currently in

Stratford, Ontario, rehearsing for the Festival production of *The Taming of the Shrew* and *Cyrano de Bergerac*. Others in the cast for The *Collection* are William Hutt, Budd Knapp, and Donald Ewer. A *Slight Ache* concerns a married couple, played by Joseph Shaw and Mary Savidge (husband and wife in real life, too) whose quiet, rather dull country lives are disrupted by a strangely silent matchseller, played by Gillie Fenwick, who takes up his stand at their gate and acts as a catalyst for a projection of the others' deepest feelings. Written originally as a radio drama, the play was first produced on stage in London's West End 18 months ago, with Emlyn Williams in the leading role.

Pinter's masterly touch belies his age: 32. He writes with cruel accuracy of the horror and absurdity in the little episodes and tangled relationships in all our lives and of the misery and menace of the unexplained. He uses contemporary speech with brilliant simplicity, complete with non sequiturs and repetitions which, tumbling from the lips of characters "at the extreme edge of their living, where they are pretty much alone," reveals much more than they intend to say, "Speech is a constant stratagem to cover nakedness," Pinter says. "The speech we hear is an indication of that we don't hear. It is a necessary avoidance, a violent, sly, anguished or mocking smoke-screen which keeps the other in its place." Most critics feel he has given English stage dialogue a whole new dimension.

His plays all deal with a short and usually climactic period in his characters' lives. To get the most enjoyment from the plays, the viewer should not look for the traditional "Western" drama pattern of Ibsen or Shaw. If he does, he may feel cheated and not understand the play, for Pinter has created his own formula, and within its boundaries what he is trying to say is as clear as a traditional playwright's message is within his frame of reference. Pinter's writing is profound, requiring his audience to think out his ideas for themselves before they can savor the full and highly satisfying—if offbeat—flavour of his art.

He doesn't believe in supplying too much information about his characters' background and motivation. "There are no hard distinctions between what is real and what is unreal," he says, "nor between what is true and what is false. The thing is not necessarily either true or false; it can be both true and false. A character on the stage who can present no convincing argument or information as to his past experience, his present behaviour or his aspirations, nor give a comprehensive analysis of his motives, is as legitimate and as worthy of attention as one who,





Vancouver, the series will originate for five weeks from Montreal, where, on July 8, Rupert Caplan will produce *The Swamp Creatures*, by Australian writer Alan Seymour. Caplan describes it as "a highly imaginative and extremely well-written play in which the swamp symbolizes those who either refuse to grow mentally out of their dull environment, or who cannot make the effort." Its principal characters are

two strange old spinsters who live in a once-grand mansion.

Other plays from Montreal will include *The Big Deal* by M. Charles Cohen, which concerns two young men who dream impractically about a big deal. Their hope of ultimate financial success is a sort of childish game in their minds. "This isn't an involved play, as its theme might suggest," says Caplan. "It's just good summer listening."

Further plays in the series will originate in the CBC's Toronto, Winnipeg and Halifax studios.



alarmingly, can do all these things. The more accurate the experience the less articulate the expression."

Almond describes Pinter as "dynamic, sharp, full of drive." He considers The Collection the finest of the nine or ten plays Pinter has written. When he was in England last summer Almond worked with the playwright on a TV production of Pinter's The Dumb Waiter, presented on CBC-TV last year in a production by Mario Prizek. "During production of the two Festival plays," says Almond, "Pinter and I wrote back and forth a good deal, discussing various aspects of the work. Pinter uses the special techniques of television to build tremendous suspense, cutting swiftly from scene to scene for maximum effect.

A recurring theme in Pinter's work is the image of a room as the privacy of a person's own self, and his weaknesses as the doors by which a threat may enter the room. Pinter explains himself this way: "The curtain goes up on the stage and I see it as a very potent question: What is going to happen to these two people in the room? Is someone going to open

the door and come in? Obviously they are scared of what is outside the room. I'm sure it is frightening to you and me as well. A visitor entering the room will enter with intent. If two people inhabit the room the visitor will not be the same man for both. A man in a room who receives a visit is likely to be illuminated or horrified by it. The visitor himself might as easily be horrified or illuminated. But however much it is expected, the entrance, when it comes, is unexpected and almost always unwelcome."

Almond has tried to amplify this idea by setting the action of each play in a small area. In A Slight Ache the room has no visible doors or windows, just a reflection of a window and French doors cast on the walls by the sun. Only one camera is used throughout the play. The viewer may not be consciously aware of this unusual treatment, which subtly points up Pinter's theme of confinement. When the action moves briefly out of the room, only the characters' voices are heard until they move back into the room.

Hold My Hand, Stranger, Almond's Playdate production on June 6, although involving three soldiers, is not a war drama. He describes it as a morality play, its three characters representing Everyman, The Establishment, and Contemporary Man who is out for nobody but himself. Their aim is to get to a place of safety. When they finally arrive they find it's empty and not the answer at all. The final answer is in themselves. Almond says the play's author, Clive Exton, "has a wonderful ear for contemporary speech, and the ability to create characters as real as a handful of dirt." In Hold My Hand, Stranger, they are played by Jeremy Wilkin, George Luscombe and Ian Thorne, who is a well-known actor in Vancouver and now has moved to Toronto.



## In Defence of

# ELECTRONIC MUSIC

If you think electronic music is more mayhem than melody, don't miss "Music Without Performers," Friday afternoon on CBC Radio

BEWILDERED LISTENERS who run screaming from electronic music, mumbling that it's not music at all, sounds like a nail scraping across a blackboard, a jungle madhouse, or the centre of a battlefield in the Second World War, can probably rest assured that it will never replace orthodox music. But it looks as if it's developing into considerably more than just musical finger-painting, and cannot be completely ignored by the intelligent music lover.

If its prejudiced critics will explore it a little, they will find that some of it is ear-caressing, tender, lyrical, a far cry from the shattering noises usually associated with this avant-garde art; and after only one hearing of an electronic composition, it is often easy for the listener to remember its "tunes."

Traditionalists who sneer at the idea of a concerto devised from the recorded sounds of coughs, tugboat whistles, a baby's cry or a dripping faucet are reminded that in 1711 when Bartolommeo Cristofori was tinkering with an experiment in new sonorities later known as the pianoforte, the old guard said he was cracked.

The electronic composer doesn't write down notes. He records sounds, either real or manufactured, or both. Then, by manipulating the tape in a complicated technical process, he can change the characteristics of the sounds—pitch, timbre, duration, attack, decay. By varying the speed of the tape he can alter not only the tempo but the sound spectrum. Finally, he can synchronize or reverse a number of tapes, cut them, and juggle them.

The possibilities are almost endless for the composer willing to forsake the piano and studio for the tape-recorder and laboratory. At least one opera has been written for the new medium, it has been used effectively as background music in movies and TV, and several leading composers on both sides of the Atlantic have experimented with it successfully in concert selections—and they aren't just the younger crowd. A few middle-aged composers, bored with the "warmed-over sameness" of some contemporary musical works, have reached out eagerly for the refreshing inspiration of a whole new spectrum of sound colours and the lack of rules associated with them. Whether they will become bored with the new musical toy remains to be seen.

How electronic music began and what its future is likely to be will be discussed with sound illustrations in a program called *Music Without Performers*, to be heard on CBC radio Friday, June 8 in the afternoon period formerly filled by the National Schools Broadcast. The speaker is Murray Schafer, a young Canadian composer who studied at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto with John Weinzweig and the late Alberto Guerrero, and who returned a few months ago from Europe, where he studied on a Canada Council grant. He has written a book on contemporary English music which is to be published by the London firm of Secker and Warburg.

Schafer will explore some of the main criticisms levelled at electronic music: the charges that it is dehumanized; that because it employs machines it is therefore mathematical; that it is replacing the composer of the past with the cold scientist; and that the sounds it produces are disagreeable and meaningless.

Schafer points out that the first kind of music known to man was probably vocal music. No doubt primitive instruments shocked or amused the more conservative tribesmen when they were first developed. But the quest for fresh sounds went on, and finer instruments were developed. But the human voice wasn't replaced. "We still have vocal music," Schafer points out, "and there is no danger of the music of the past being replaced by electronic or any other kind of music. For the first time in history, the composer is allowed to work directly in sound. He actually hears his composition being performed as he creates it. He must bear the full responsibility of its success or failure himself. An electronic composer can never claim his ideas were distorted through a bad performance!"

Schafer goes on to say that for some listeners the elimination of the performer in music is not an agreeable thought. "But are we not witnessing dehumanization in every aspect of our existence? Technology implies dehumanization; if we deny that we are rejecting contemporary life. In the natural sciences today the object of research is no longer nature itself, but a nature deprived of its autonomous behaviour and obedient to the control of technology. Each age



gets the art it deserves. If we are presented with the phenomenon of electronic music, it is because it is the inevitable accompaniment to central heating, television and solar explorations."

Schafer has a word of consolation for those who say they are baffled by modern music because they don't understand it. "What do we need to understand?" he asks. "We don't refuse to enjoy nature because we don't understand why the branches of a tree grow a certain way, or why a pebble thrown into a stream causes a certain pattern of ripples. Why should we question art when we never bother questioning nature? I don't think interrogating art gets the listener anywhere. I don't feel that the listener who is able to identify all the sections of a

Beethoven symphonic movement is any further ahead than the listener who is completely ignorant of musical grammar and simply sits back and allows the music to overwhelm him."

Schafer feels that, "there is more noise content in a great many other kinds of music than in the best electronic music." He puts forward the theory that "we often allow some kinds of objectionable sounds to surround us every day of our lives and let them pass, but arbitrarily pick on something and call it noise because it is new and unfamiliar."

He concludes the program with a little experiment to help listeners decide the validity of his theory. *Music Without Performers* is the second of two illustrated talks by Schafer, organized by Digby Peters, who recently won an Ohio first award and two honourable mentions for 1961 shows he produced for CBC radio.

In the American League six teams have been tossing the ball back and forth, and the runaway pennant winners according to the prognosticators, the New York Yankees, have been hard-pressed to stay at the top.


Last year, the American League had Mantle and Maris. Without this awesome pair, it is freely estimated American League attendances would have been several hundred thousand less than it was.

This year the American League has a pennant race.

This week, on the CBC's Major league baseball telecast of the week, two of the American League contenders meet—the Chicago White Sox and Baltimore Orioles.

Both of these clubs have been close enough to the top in recent years to smell "pennant money." The White Sox, in fact, even won the pennant in 1959, only to be humiliated by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the World Series.

Belinsky is familiar to Winnipeg baseball fans, who watched him beat the local Goldeves in class "C" Northern League all-star game a few years back. Belinsky pitched with Aberdeen Pheasants, a Baltimore farm

## FEATHERWEIGHT DINNER ROLLS

2 cups scalded milk

1/2 cup shortening or margarine

1/4 cup sugar

1 teaspoon salt

2 eggs

I package dehydrated yeast

4 cups flour

Dissolve yeast according to directions on package and let it rise. Scald milk—add shortening, sugar and salt. Cool to lukewarm and add beaten eggs and risen yeast. Sift flour into large bowl and add liquid all at once. Mix we'll and beat about 50 strokes. Set aside in warm place to rise. When doubled, beat again about 100 strokes.

Fill greased muffin tins one-half full and set to rise again until doubled. Bake 375 degrees, for 15 to 20 minutes. Brush buns with sugar and milk when still hot. Makes 2½ dozen large rolls.

For variety: one may use grated cheese, santed onions or herbs between these rolls. Put half the quantity of dough into tins. Sprinkle cheese on this (or onions or herbs) and then put in the other half of dough, filling tins half full. Bake as above.

## They Keep Music in the Family

JOHNNY'S A DRUMMER, Joe plays the bass fiddle and Bert plays just about anything that turns wind into sound. They're the Niosi Brothers, three of the busiest musicians in Canadian television.

Every week during the winter season the three form a trio to provide background music for CBC-TV's network panel show, *Front Page Challenge*. This is one of the few occasions the three men play together professionally.

Mostly they perform separately on such shows as CBC-TV's Parade, The Tommy Ambrose Show, children's programs and CBC specials such as Wild Is Love, a Nat King Cole show.

Some of the other television series the brothers have worked on include Four For The Show, The Billy O'Connor Show, 'Cross-Canada Hit Parade, The Jack Kane Show, Music Makers, Showtime and While We're Young.

Johnny, the youngest at 46, looks like a concerned football coach, with furrowed brows. Joe, the oldest at 53, is an easy-going heavy-set man, who reminds one of a favourite uncle. Bert, 51, could be a Bond street haberdasher, with a natty moustache and immaculate clothes.

The Niosis were born in London, Ont., where their parents settled after emigrating from Sicily. The boys, Johnny, Joe, Bert and Eugene (a fourth brother) took music lessons from the same Italian music master who had taught Guy Lombardo and his brothers.

Although Eugene took an interest in music at the time, he later decided on a career as a real estate salesman in Florida.

Bert began playing professionally at the age of 12. By the age of 14, he was good enough to join the band of a fellow Londoner, Guy Lombardo.

In 1923, Lombardo and his brothers decided to leave Canada and play in the United States. After a successful six-week stand in Cleveland, Lombardo prepared to move on to Chicago. Bert phoned

home to tell his parents of the trip "but my mother – you know how mothers are—insisted I come home."

Back in London Bert played wherever he could, and in 1926 formed a band that included brothers Joe and Johnny. They played in and around London and later toured Loew's theatre circuit in the United States.

In 1932 the band moved to Toronto and the year after began an 18-year-stand at the Palais Royale, with summer trips to Port Stanley, Crystal Beach and the Brant Inn.

Joe remained with his brother's band until 1937 when he joined Trump Davidson's band at a Toronto nightspot. Later he went to England for a year with Ray Noble.

Johnny stayed with the band until 1942, when he joined the Royal Canadian Air Force band in Ottawa.

Soon after their return to Toronto Bert ventured into radio. He was a member of the Happy Gang, a CBC radio show that remained on the air for 21 years. During the war he also worked on an RCAF recruitment radio show with conductor Eric Wild.

When television was introduced in Canada, the Niosis found their talents and experience well suited to the medium. Today the brothers are in great demand for CBC television shows and according to Bert "we hardly have time now to get together for a jam session."
