## Eric Sykes Makes One-Night Stand Monday on CBC-TV

BRITISH FUNNYMAN Eric Sykes, chosen "Entertainer of 1961" by the British Guild of Television Producers, will be seen on CBC-TV on Election Night, June 18, in an episode from his popular BBC series, *The Eric Sykes Show*. It replaces the CBC-TV series *Don Messer's Jubilee*, which is unavailable this occasion due to election reports at Halifax, its point of origin.

When Sykes' adventure begins, he's in bed, and feeling "proper poorly." In fact he has already said farewell to his pal, Sebastopol Terrace, and is ready to depart this world. But he makes a miraculous recovery when his doctor prescribes a rest, plenty of fresh air, and offers Eric the use of his boat for a week.

A new, eager Sykes emerges from under the blankets, a true British son of the sea. Where is he bound? The Spice Islands? Hawaii? It makes no difference to intrepid sea-dog Sykes, whose eyes are set on far horizons as he licks salt spray from his lips.

With his plump First Mate, Hat-tie Jacques (seen in Canada in the *Carry On* films), busily swabbing decks, and a chart of the South China Sea before him, Sykes embarks on what promises to be a sizzling saga of the seas west of the Woolwich Free Ferry.

Called *Comedy Spot*, the series will feature a different comedy theme and new cast in each of its 11 programs. All but one of the programs, *Maggie*, starring Margaret O'Brien, were never telecast before. THE STRUGGLE over segregation in the U.S. has quietened in recent weeks—affording an opportunity to look at recent happenings in retrospect, and perhaps to forecast elements of the struggle yet to come.

*Face to Face* Sunday on CBC-TV telecasts an interview by John Freeman with the Rev. Martin Luther King, 32-year-old Negro minister, a leader in the anti-segregationist movement.

Mr. King will tell of his part in the 381-day boycott of public transportation which helped end segregation on public buses in Montgomery, Alabama. He will also pronounce his views on disarmament and the suspension of nuclear testing.

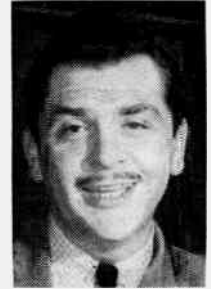
FOUR NOTED COMPOSERS are meeting this month in Toronto to take part in videotaping a concert sure to be of wide appeal, scheduled for next fall on CBC-TV. The concert will feature their compositions for the film industry, heard throughout the world.

The four composers: David Raskin (composer of background music for "Laura"); Aaron Copland ("The Red Pony," "The Heiress in Our Town"); Sir William Walton ("Henry V," "Hamlet" and "Richard III") and Canadian Louis Applebaum ("Tomorrow the World" and many scores for documentary films).

THE FAMOUS Wimbledon tennis tournament is among the forthcoming highlights on CBC-TV's World of Sport presentations. Another great sports classic that viewers will be able to follow from the comfort of their living rooms is the Canadian Open Golf Championship, soon to be seen. And, if you like plenty of action on the screen, there is a special program upcoming that visits some of the world's great sports car races. Also, of course, this Saturday (June 16), the Queen's Plate telecast provides something for everyone: the thrill of seeing Canada's best three-year-olds run, the pageantry of the continent's oldest continuously-run horse race, plus the added interest of the attendance of the Queen Mother, who will present the traditional 50 guineas to the winner.

GEOLOGY—the science basic to Canada's great mining industry—is the subject for CBC-TV's 13-week *Live and Learn* series starting Monday afternoon, July 2. Armchair students will learn the elements of this fascinating subject through illustrations, models and experiments, presented by Dr. David Baird of the University of Ottawa.

Purpose of the series, according to Doctor Baird, is to acquaint viewers with the history of land formations in order to help them better to appreciate their surroundings.

Thurber Satire on "Playdate":

# The Greatest Man in the World

AN HILARIOUS comedy about space travel, *The Greatest Man in the World*, adapted for television from a James Thurber satire, will be presented on CBC-TV's *Playdate*, Wednesday night.

Produced by David Gardner, it features Don Francks as Jack Smurch, an American nobody who shot himself into orbit in a home-made spaceship, managed to circle the globe, and turned Washington upside down with excitement and consternation. The trouble was that Smurch was as different from John Glenn and Scott Carpenter as a spaceship is from a kiddy-car. What his adoring public didn't know, but what his family and associates had been all too aware of from away back, was that Smurch was a "heel" of the first degree. The efforts of politicians and others to fit him into the American dream as a clean-cut, clean-living boy-next-door, resulted in some crazy situations which only Thurber could make real.

The action whips along in a whirlwind of chuckles. Behind them are some deceptively barbed pokes at the political scene in the United States and at phoney aspects of modern life. Thurber's solution to

the Smurch problem is as neat and offbeat as any of his famous cartoons.

Thurber's original play had "hero" Smurch circle the globe in an aircraft. Irving Neiman up-dated the situation by substituting space travel for what is now an every-day accomplishment.

Thurber, who died last fall, thought of himself as a rough, bruising satirist, and used to be annoyed when he was described as a real-life Walter Mitty—one of his most famous characters, a mild, mousy soul. Quiet and shy Thurber was, and self-effacing, but "one thing let's get straight," he used to say. "I'm not mild and gentle. I intend to beat up the next person who says that about me. Let the meek inherit the earth—they have it coming to them. I get up mad at something every morning, and think I should. Boris Karloff is mild, but I am not. Other mild guys are James Cagney and Peter Lorre unless backed into a corner. I'm in a corner without being backed there and often come out fighting.

# The QUEEN'S PLATE

*CBC Radio and Television take you to the scene of this great Canadian classic*



POMP AND PAGEANTRY combine with high excitement to make the Queen's Plate one of North America's most spectacular racing events. This year, interest in the turf classic will no doubt be intensified, even among those who aren't racing fans, by the fact that the Queen Mother will be in attendance to award the traditional royal prize of 50 guineas to the winning owner.

This will be Her Majesty's second official visit to a Queen's Plate running. In 1939 she accompanied her husband, King George VI, when he became the first reigning monarch ever to attend the Plate.

CBC radio and TV networks will bring the colour and drama of the 103rd renewal of the annual racing event to Canadians across the country on Saturday, June 16. Daryl Wells will describe the actual running of the race for both radio and television. Other commentators on the radio broadcast will be Bob Willson, Del Mott and Gord Pepper. Commentary for the hour-long TV program will be provided by René Lecavalier, Byng Whitteker and John Rae.

The Plate, a \$50,000-added event, and the oldest continuously-run stakes race in North America, will be run at New Woodbine track, near Toronto. It is expected to draw 14 or 15 of Canada's best three-year-olds, but the exact number won't be known until June 14, the closing date for entries.

The race was open to three-year-olds and over until 1939, when it became restricted exclusively to three-year-olds. The distance, too, has changed over the years. Originally run at the 'true' Derby distance of 1½ miles, it was changed to 1¼ miles in 1887. In 1924 the distance was cut to 1⅓ miles, but was restored to 1¼ miles in 1957. The same year, the present weight specification was inaugurated: colts carry 126 pounds, while fillies carry 121 pounds.

The gross purse this year is expected to exceed \$75,000, of which the winning owner receives more

than \$50,000 plus the Gold Cup, valued at \$5,000, and the Queen's gift of 50 guineas.

The tradition of giving silver plates as prizes began during the reign of Charles II (1649-1685), when plates of varying sizes were awarded according to the importance of the races. The substitution of money (guineas) for an actual plate was made about 1700. It was in 1859 that the Toronto Turf Club, through Sir Edmund Head, then Governor-General, petitioned Queen Victoria to grant a Plate for a race in Ontario. Royal assent was obtained, and the first Queen's Plate was held on June 27, 1860, at the Carleton track, which was situated in what is now the west end of Toronto.

In succeeding years, the annual continuity of the race was preserved, but its location changed almost yearly. As an event of great social and political prestige, it was coveted by various members of the legislative assembly, each of whom wanted the race to be held in his home constituency. As a result, between 1860 and 1883 the Plate was run in many different Southern Ontario towns.

Concurrently, Canadian racing had fallen on evil days and needed something to restore its former dignity and respectability. To provide this element, the Ontario Jockey Club was formed, under the leadership of T. C. Patteson, Toronto's postmaster, and Sir Casimir Gzowski, a distinguished engineer of Polish ancestry who was aide de camp to Queen Victoria. They were determined that horse racing should become established as a Canadian institution, not merely a sport, and to attain this end they asked that a representative of the Queen attend each running of the Plate. Her Majesty sanctioned the suggestion, on condition that the race would henceforth be run in Toronto. Thus, since 1883, the Plate has always been held at Woodbine race course and a

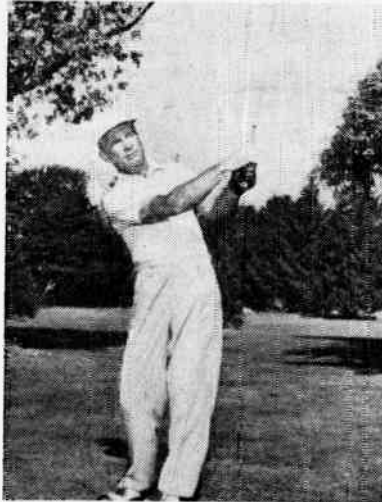

## The MONEY PIT

*Does a fortune of up to \$200 millions lie underground on Oak Island, off Halifax? CBC-TV's 20/20 visits the island Sunday, and meets men who are sure Captain Kidd's treasure is hidden there*

FROM THE DISTANCE Oak Island looks little different from the other 363 small wooded islands scattered around Mahone Bay, some 45 miles southwest of Halifax. But it's become one of the most mysterious and romantic spots on the continent since the late 18th century, and annually attracts swarms of the curious (including, in 1909, President F. D. Roosevelt) and treasure-seekers galore. Tradition says that that cruel British rascal, Captain Kidd, who was hanged for piracy in 1701, buried a huge treasure on the island.

The excitement began in 1795 when three young men from the western shore of Nova Scotia went rowing past Oak Island, were attracted by the giant oaks growing there, and decided to do a bit of hunting. Prowling around they came upon an enormous oak tree growing in a clearing with one of its main branches sawn off and lying on the ground. Hanging from another limb was a block-and-tackle (obviously from an old ship) which fell apart when they touched it. On the ground was a lead whistle, and a Spanish coin dated 1713.

At the foot of the tree was a depression in the ground about 30 feet across. The boys sped back to the mainland in great excitement and returned with shovels. After digging for 10 feet they came upon a layer of six-inch oak planks. The soil was easily moved, so they pressed on, and at 20 feet discovered a second plank floor, covered with charcoal. At 30 feet they found another floor. They tried to get financial help to buy equipment to continue digging,

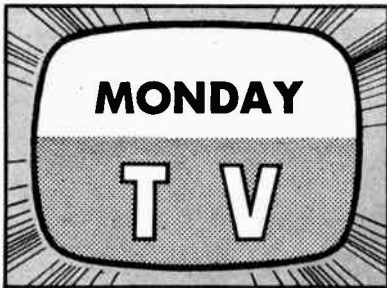

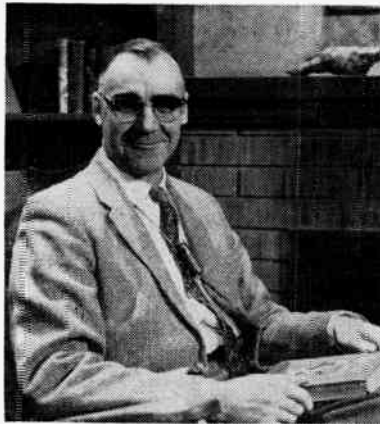

## THE GREATEST MAN IN THE WORLD

"I don't think anyone should write comedy nowadays that is pure nonsense; it must have meaning."

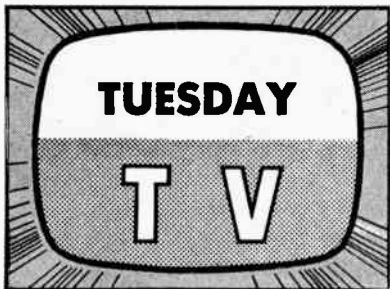
When he was six, Thurber lost the sight of his left eye when it was hit by an arrow shot by one of his brothers. Later the sight in the other eye deteriorated, and he was blind from 1941 until his death. But he was able to view the state of the world clearly long after his eyes were useless, and mourned the sad facts of his times with laughter the equal of which had not brightened the American scene since Mark Twain. The humourist, he wrote, "knows vaguely that the nation is not much good any more; he has read that the crust of the earth is shrinking alarmingly and that the universe is growing steadily colder, but he does not believe that any of the three is in half as bad shape as he is."

Thurber's genius for seeing the funny side of tragedy and frustration turned up in a variety of ways—in short stories, essays, reportage, plays, fairy tales, and his famous cartoons, with their pert, concise captions. Thurber wrote slowly and made almost a fetish of revision—he thought nothing of rewriting

a story 25 times. He said he would like to have written three sure-fire best-sellers: *How to Make Love and Money*, *How to Tell Your Blessings from Your Burdens*, and *How to Pass the Joneses at a Dogtrot*.

Targets for the sharpest of his satirical pot-shots at human foibles were often enormous, enraged wives, small, mousy men, stupid athletes and excitable relatives. His cartoons, the main vehicle for which was *The New Yorker*, often centred around huge, resigned, lop-eared dogs with bloodhound bodies and basset legs. "My drawings have been described as pre-intentionalist, meaning that they were finished before the ideas for them had occurred to me," he said once. "I shall not argue the point."

Thurber wrote in his head, anywhere, any time. "I can see the whole thing hanging up there in my mind," he said. His wife could always tell when he was writing at a party. "Stop writing, people want to talk to you," she'd say. Sometimes she'd wake up at four in the morning and know that Thurber was working on another satirical gem, so she'd tell him to stop it and get to sleep. Often he paid no attention and got on with the story, to the delight of thousands of readers to whom his unique wryness gave a sense of relief in a confusing world.

## THE QUEEN'S PLATE

representative of the Crown has always been in attendance. With the opening of the New Woodbine track in 1956, the race was moved to its present site.

While the prize money is quite substantial, competing in the Plate is not a money-making proposition. Trainers, board, feed, nomination fees for entering races and many other expenses cost vast amounts and only men of at least comfortable means can afford to take the gamble. Any stable in the world can enter; the only requirement for a Plate entry is that the horse must have been born in Canada.

There is a three-year elimination process involved in the nomination of entries, with successively higher entry fees at each step. As soon as a prospective Plate starter becomes a yearling, which happens automatically the first January 1st of its life, it must be registered as a nominee for the Plate of two years

later. Second step is to re-register the horse the following year. A further registration is required when the horse becomes a three-year-old, and final nomination (and opportunity to withdraw) takes place just prior to Plate day. The owner has to be pretty confident to go through to the final stage, because his investment in entry fees alone has reached \$675 by that time. All the entry fees—called 'stake money'—are added to the \$50,000 basic prize money to form the gross purse.

Eclipsing the prize money and, for some, the actual running of the race itself, is the colourful ceremonial of the Plate, highlighted by the arrival of the Queen's representative, in an open landau, complete with scarlet-coated footmen and a mounted escort of the Governor-General's Horse Guards. The plan devised by Patteson and Gzowski 100-odd years ago has been realized completely, for certainly no other sporting event in North America carries with it the tradition, dignity and prestige of the venerable Queen's Plate.

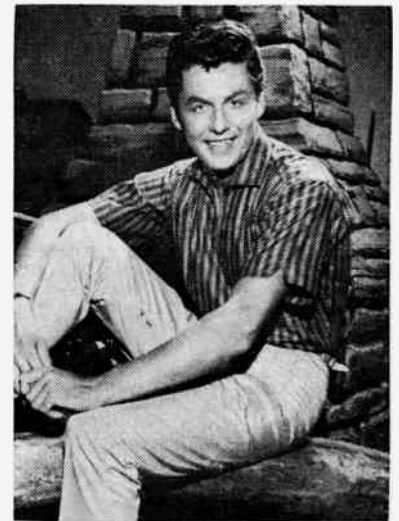

but it wasn't until six years later that they were able to get on with the job. An interested doctor in Truro, Nova Scotia, 60 miles from the Bay, organized a group of men who agreed to finance the dig.

Plank floorings were discovered down to 90 feet, the last having a layer of putty over it. At 96 feet, trouble, which has dogged every searcher since, arrived in the form of flooding with sea water. Obviously there was an underground channel beneath the pit, so borings were made and three oak chests were found at about 150 feet. Since then more than 100 different shafts and tunnels have been made on the island. The possibility of finding a lost fortune has attracted adventurers from many parts of the world. Now there are so many diggings that no one seems certain of the exact location of the original one. Over the years an estimated \$300,000 has been spent in moving tons of earth on the island. The fortune it's hiding is said to be worth between \$20,000,000 and \$200,000,000.

An old map supposed to indicate the burial-place of Kidd's treasure shows an island very much like Oak Island, which is a mile long and half-a-mile across. The more research there has been into the great mystery, the more foundation there seems to be for the one inescapable fact: that someone at some time long ago went to a great deal of trouble to perform what must have been an engineering feat of some magnitude for that era. Many in the Oak Island vicinity believe that it is Captain Kidd's treasure that lies below the island's soil, but this has been discounted by most researchers. A popular current theory holds that treasures of the Incas of South America are buried there. Some say the treasure is the diamond-studded crown of the Kings of France which was buried there after finding temporary refuge in the Louisburg fortress on Cape Breton Island. Others suggest that the treasure is the hoard acquired by British buccaneer Sir Henry Morgan when he captured Panama in the mid-1600's. There is also the theory that the men who dug the original

# Pills, Prices and Profits

*Why are drugs expensive in Canada?*

*"Soundings" looks into the question*

*Thursday on CBC Radio*

ONE CANADIAN WHOSE prescriptions cost him \$45 a week says, "I just break a hole in my pay packet and give it to the drug store." Drug prices in Canada are among the highest in the world. Are they higher than necessary? *Soundings* looks into the problem of *Pills, Prices and Profits* in a CBC radio documentary Thursday night, June 21.

Written and narrated by Toronto actor-writer Ivor Barry, it was organized by Catherine MacIver and produced by Weldon Hanbury. Barry talked to pharmacists, doctors, members of the food and drug directorate, officials in the pharmaceutical industry, and men and women who take prescription drugs, some of whom have had to do so for years.

Barry learned that although drug prices in Canada tend to reflect prices in the United States, they are 11 per cent higher here because of taxes. One manufacturer he spoke to insists that Canadians can afford to pay these prices, which he feels are in keeping with Canada's generally high cost of living.

Drug prices hit the middle class the hardest. Lower income groups can get free medicine through clinics, and the well-to-do don't have to worry when their doctor prescribes a daily dose of a high-cost drug. But the middle-income groups who want to pay their way and take pride in doing so, are put in an awkward position. Sometimes they have to mortgage their homes, after cutting down drastically in every other way, and frequently accrue debts which may hound them all their lives.

One druggist says he frequently gets customers who decide not to have their prescription filled when they learn what it will cost, but they always come back later and reluctantly spend the money.

Another drug store proprietor points out that 25 years ago when a patient had pneumonia, he and his family just prayed hard and hoped for the best. But today, because of "wonder drugs," the patient is on the mend in two or three days and sometimes back to work in a week. "Isn't his life worth the cost of the drugs?" druggists ask. One of them mentions that when Canadians buy a luxury item they never think of the manufacturer's or retailer's profit. But because they really don't want to have to buy drugs, because they resent their illness and the necessity for medication, they make a fuss about drug prices.

Druggists point out that their overhead is considerable. They must have a graduate pharmacist to

## CBC Wednesday Night:

### Opera, Drama, and Recital

THIS WEEK'S CBC Wednesday Night broadcasts on radio will originate in the CBC's Montreal studios. The evening begins with a performance (at 7:40) of Boris Blacher's short chamber opera, *The Tide*, with baritone Peter van Ginkel as The Fisher; soprano Claire Gagnier as The Young Woman; bass Gaston Gagnon as The Banker; and tenor Phil Stark as The Young Man. At 8:30 a 90-minute drama, *The Dialogue of the Carmelites*, by Georges Bernanos—one of the most distinguished of modern French novelists, who died in 1948—will be produced by Rupert Caplan. And at 10:30 there will be a recital of Beethoven songs by baritone Donald Bell, accompanied by pianist John Newmark. The recital was transcribed by the CBC International Service.

*The Dialogue of the Carmelites* was published in 1951 and has since been produced in many European countries. It was added to the repertoire of the Comédie Française in its 1960-61 season with tremendous success. The English translation is by Lucienne Hill, who also prepared the adaptation of *Becket* for Broadway last season. Howard Ryspan, a Montreal actor, has adapted the play for CBC Wednesday Night. Rupert Caplan describes it as "a fascinating dramatization of the true story of a group

of nuns of the Carmelite order at Compiègne, France, where Jean d'Arc was captured while defending the town. The action takes place during the French Revolution, from 1789 until the nuns' execution on July 17, 1794.

"The play reveals the disruption of their community life and their eventual martyrdom on the guillotine for their supposed sympathy with the nobility, despite their steadfast and quiet belief in truth and the basic rights. The central character is Blanche de la Force, a troubled young postulant of noble birth who finally makes a reconciliation with life—in death."

Playwright Georges Bernanos, born in Paris in 1888, served in the First World War, after which he was an insurance inspector for awhile. But he was dissatisfied with the atmosphere in France and kept hunting for places where he could find happiness and mental freedom. First he took his six children and his wife, a lineal descendant of Jean d'Arc, and having the same name, to Palma in the Balearic Islands.

Bernanos was one of the first French writers to join the de Gaullist movement. After the fall of France in 1940 he settled in Brazil, where he explored many remote regions and many new fields of thought, dominating a coterie of international thinkers in the area.

He was an impressive-looking figure, with a dark complexion, a big moustache, a grey pompadour,

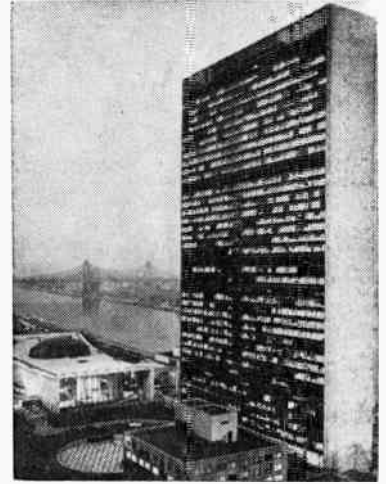

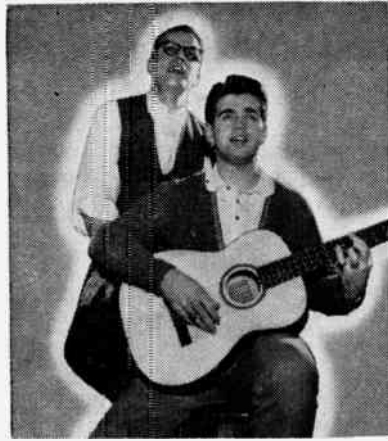

*contre des grand musiciens*, Sunday, June 17, at 11:30 p.m. Known as the Father of the Symphony, Franz Josef Haydn was born at Rohrau, Austria, in 1732, from parents who were poor in material things but gifted with a love for music—a rich endowment which they passed on to their son.

After leaving his Church Choir, he turned to the study of music in other forms. He was 27 years old when he finally achieved fame in Viennese musical circles. He became musical director for the Count Morzin, and married. But his orchestra was dismissed within two years. The most important liaison in Haydn's life was certainly his association with the Hungarian noble family of Esterhazy. It was Prince Miklos who made him first conductor of the orchestra maintained by the family, and later practically imprisoned him in the remote and beautiful family estate Esterhaz, where the composer was free to pour out his ideas in composition.

It was during his confinement at Esterhaz that Haydn first met J. P. Salomon of London, who had then made several interesting proposals—which Haydn felt forced to resist. At Prince Miklos' death, Haydn was set free and travelled to London where he accepted Salomon's offers.

His success was immediate. He played only to full houses, and was bestowed an honorary degree by Oxford University. All in all, he composed 12 symphonies for Salomon among which are his best: "Clock," "Surprise," "Oxford" and "London."

pit and inserted the plank floors were *looking* for something, not burying it.

Perhaps the key to the mystery is a strange triangle of round beach stones in the grass on the south shore of the island. Every couple of years an adventurous man or a small company will lease some of the island and dig like mad until lease or money runs out. Then someone else takes over. One company erected a coffer dam to wall out the sea water that obstructs all the pits but a bad storm destroyed it and they were forced to give up their plans. Other diggers found a 20-foot layer of cement at 153 feet and at 160 feet there were unmistakable signs of oak chests and soft metal relics.

One of the latest treasure-seekers is Robert Restall, a quiet, determined 56-year-old former steelworker and motorcycle stunt man who towed tons of equipment to the island about three years ago, settled his family there in a cabin, and set out to block the

existing tunnels against sea water. His theory is that the treasure was buried by privateers who hid the cream of their loot before taking the bulk of it, to their king. He thinks the treasure was buried in 1704, three years after Captain Kidd was hanged.

On Sunday afternoon, CBC-TV's 20/20 series presents *The Money Pit*, a half-hour documentary program attempting to sift out the facts about the island mystery and examine the theories that have been arrived at through the years. Introduced and narrated by Jack McAndrew, the program will show the Restall family at work on the island, and will also introduce M. R. Campbell, owner of the island, whose family has been associated with it since 1897, and who is convinced that treasure lies buried there.

Jack McAndrew will recall some of the tales told by Jack Adams, who has lived on the island for six years and has experienced what he claims are supernatural happenings around the diggings, and by Ervin Hamilton, retired professor of engineering at New York University, who has spent five unsuccessful summers trying to solve the Oak Island mystery.

dispense prescriptions, they have late operating hours, must offer free delivery, and must stock dozens of duplicate drugs—as many as 12 or 15 different brands of the same drug. Drugs can't be patented in Canada—only their manufacturing process; and between 90 and 95 per cent of patents in Canada are foreign-owned.

About 400 new drugs appear on the market each year, and, says one doctor, although many of them are invaluable and make a tremendous contribution to the public's well-being, we could get along without some of them very well. He and other Canadian doctors receive some 2,000 expensively-produced pamphlets and brochures from manufacturers each year, exploiting the latest drugs on the market, and he says one of his daily chores is to throw away the mail when he gets home at night. And he is frequently visited by what manufacturers call a "detail" man, who tries to persuade him to prescribe a certain product.

Is all this advertising necessary and what does it cost? Some firms estimate that their advertising and promotion account for 25 per cent of their sale price. It's necessary, they say — "we're in a competitive

enterprise, and no different from any other industry." A large British firm manufacturing in Canada estimates that five per cent of its sale price goes for research. Many pharmaceutical firms stress the cost of research. But a Toronto doctor thinks this research does not justify the high cost of drugs. He points out that most of the great medical discoveries have been made not by large drug firms but by dedicated researchers in obscure labs.

Drugs are known by three names: their chemical name, their trade or brand name, and their generic name, such as "penicillin." It is possible for a doctor to prescribe a generic drug, which may be manufactured anywhere in the world and which costs much less than a brand name. Some of these foreign drugs are quite satisfactory, but many physicians prefer to prescribe a brand name they know and have confidence in. Ivor Barry gets a variety of opinions on generics from doctors, druggists, and from a manufacturer (often involved in legal tangles for "piracy") who compounds generics in a modern plant in Canada and sells them at cut rates. And Barry concludes the program with suggestions from the general public, from doctors, druggists and pharmaceutical firms about what could be done to lower drug prices in Canada without sacrificing quality and a fair profit.

and the fixed gaze of the fanatic. When he spoke he was sometimes breathless and even incoherent with enthusiasm, often long-winded, but always impressive.

He returned to his homeland in 1945, but "could find no happiness" there, so moved his family to Tunisia.

His novels reflect a deep mysticism. They have a high-pitched eloquence and a strong melodramatic appeal that make them forceful reading. Bernanos was more than a novelist. He was a noted essayist, dramatist, publicist and an energetic pamphleteer, but has been described as "a moralist rather than a controversialist, furious and unappeasable." In 1936 he won the Grand Novel Prize of the French Academy for his *Diary of a Country Priest*.

Boris Blacher, whose chamber opera is the first offering on CBC Wednesday Night, is one of the few modern German composers of note who wasn't born in Germany. He was born in China in 1903 of Russian parents and spent part of his childhood in Siberia. He settled in Germany when he was 19, in-

tending to become an architect, and has been there ever since, mostly in Berlin, where he is now director of the High School of Music.

At first he earned his living pounding pianos in movie houses showing silent films, and studied on the side with Friedrich E. Koch, until Koch died, and then at the University of Berlin. He got his first "break" in 1926, when he was commissioned, with another composer, to write two hours of music for a silent film on the life of Bismarck. But he had a tough time financially, and survived only through the help of several musical men of importance, such as Karl Bohm, the Dresden conductor, who saw that he got teaching jobs from time to time.

During the Nazi regime his works were banned as "degenerate" music. He says he just lay low and hoped to survive—he was stateless at that point, but has since been given German citizenship. After the Second World War he began to come into his own as a composer, not only in Germany, but on the international scene, where his uncompromising originality, sometimes spiced with irony, is much admired. His work embraces all forms of music, including serial writing, but he says he's not committed to any one style.

THE MAJOR LEAGUE baseball season is now well past being one-third completed and in both leagues, no single team has, as yet, begun to dominate the scene.

In the National League, the Los Angeles Dodgers and San Francisco Giants have been racing along together for more than three weeks, with neither able to establish any sort of a lead.

The same situation exists in the American League, with the exception that almost since opening day, eight of the 10 teams have been very close to the top slot, which has been occupied by either the New York Yankees (even minus Mickey Mantle), and the rejuvenated Cleveland Indians.

This week's game will be brought to CBC television viewers from Tiger Stadium, in Detroit and will feature the Al Kaline-less Detroit Tigers and the Boston Red Sox.

Both the Tigers and Red Sox are in the throes of youth movements but the Tigers have had somewhat more success with theirs than have the Red Sox. As this is being written, the Tigers are in fourth place in the standings while the Boston are wallowing in 9th place . . . 9½ games out of first place, to only one for Detroit.

The difference, in the main, has been the play of Detroit's youngsters, who've been performing like veterans while the Red Sox newcomers and sophomores have been rather inept both in the field and at the plate.

In addition to that factor, the young pitchers on the Boston staff haven't lived up to their press notices. Last year's rookie of the year in the American League, Don Schwall, who managed 15 wins and only 7 losses, with a fine 3.22 era is well below his mark of the same time last year. Tracy Stallard, another promising young rookie last season, has

The Red Sox also lack power at the plate while the Tigers have a pretty solid long-ball hitting club, with the likes of Norm Cash, Rocky Colavito and Billy Bruton as well as catcher Dick Brown. Then, of course, there's Mr. Kaline, out with a broken collar bone, but who'll bring a potent bat into the Detroit lineup with his return.

To match their better-than-average power, the Tigers have greater pitching depth, with not having to rely on so many youngsters.

The historic Queen's Plate will also be on the "bill of fare" Saturday afternoon for those fans who like to watch the "oatburners" in action. This is the 103rd running of the "Plate" and the Queen Mother will present the Queen's guineas to the winning three-year-old. The gross purse at Toronto's New Woodbine this year, will be \$75,000 and the race is over a mile and a quarter.

In most areas, although not all, Stan Leonard's golf show follows with this week's show demonstrating how to blast and chip out of sand traps.

### VEAL LOAF

- 1½ lbs. ground veal
- ¾ lb. ground pork
- 1 tsp. salt
- ½ tsp. pepper
- ⅓ cup sautéed onion
- 1 clove garlic
- 2 tbs. chopped green pepper
- 2 egg yolks
- ½ cup coarse cracker crumbs
- ¼ cup cream
- 1 tsp. herbs (thyme, marjoram and parsley)

Sauté onions, garlic, green pepper in 2 tablespoons oil. Mix all other ingredients except meat and crackers in a bowl, add to sautéed vegetables. Mix meat and crackers in another bowl and add onion mixture. Mix well. Place in greased loaf pan. Sprinkle paprika over loaf and set in pan of water in 325 degrees oven for one hour and fifteen minutes.

### Mushroom Sauce for Veal Loaf

- 3 or 4 large mushrooms cooked in ½ cup chicken broth
- 2 tablespoons bacon dripping
- 4 tablespoons flour
- 1 cup chicken broth
- 1 cup salad cream
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice

Heat dripping, add flour and stir until golden. Add chicken broth gradually and cook until thick. Then add mushrooms in liquid and when ready to serve, stir in lemon and cream. Serve with veal loaf.

## Plan All-Out Effort For Election Coverage

THE GREATEST concentration of technical equipment and manpower for coverage of a federal election in the history of Canadian broadcasting, has been assembled by the CBC for the June 18 election.

On television, the full national network will be linked together reaching from St. John's to Victoria. On radio, the Trans-Canada network will broadcast the election coverage.

Both radio and television coverage will begin in each time zone at the close of the polls, 7:00 p.m. local standard time. The broadcast will continue until the overall result is known.

General pattern of both radio and television coverage will be 20 minutes of national network programming each half hour. Television stations will break away from the network to give local results for the remaining 10 minutes of each half hour. On radio, the remaining 10 minutes will consist of Prairie regional results, compiled at the CBC's Winnipeg newsroom. National network broadcasts on radio will be the sound portion of the network telecasts.

The CBC hopes to have remote units for both TV and radio with the party leaders in their homes or at party headquarters on June 18. Prime Minister Diefenbaker is expected to be in Prince Albert, Lester Pearson in Ottawa, Robert Thompson in Red Deer, and T.C. Douglas in Regina.

In addition to regular news coverage on election night and on news bulletins in the weeks prior to June 18, a number of Public Affairs programs on radio and TV are looking at the campaign. On radio this includes *Preview Commentary*, *Capital Report*, *By-line*; on TV, *Viewpoint* and *Newsmagazine*. Other programs will look back at the entire campaign after June 18.

On election night, a panel in Ottawa under the chairmanship of Arthur Blakely, parliamentary correspondent of the *Montreal Gazette*, will discuss the election. The panel will include Gratton O'Leary of the *Ottawa Journal*, John Irving of the University of Toronto, Scott Gordon of Carlton University, and Jean-Luc Pepin of the University of Ottawa.

Also on the night of the 18th, CBC reporters will talk with spokesmen for education, the Canadian Manufacturers' Association, the Canadian Labour Congress, agricultural and other representative organizations.

The results of the election along with an analysis will be transmitted throughout the world by the CBC International Service using a variety of facilities, including the trans-Atlantic telephone cable.

Electronic equipment, similar to that used by NBC in its 1960 Presidential election coverage, will be used in Toronto by the CBC Television Network to post party standings. IBM projections and analyses, which have indicated the outcome in previous CBC election coverages, will be used again this year.

In preparation for June 18, the IBM computer "memory" is already being stored with facts from previous elections so that when the new figures are fed in on election night comparative trends can be established.

This year CBC News is establishing an election newswire of its own in which each election newsroom across the country will be linked to Election Central in Toronto by teletype for the transmission of results and other information.
