C. F. GREENE, for 14 years the friendly voice on *Neighbourly News from the Prairies*, has returned to the program after a lengthy absence that started as a winter holiday, but continued when he was stricken with an illness that required surgery.

Mr. Greene, known widely as "Slim," is himself a former weekly editor, having operated the *Winnipeg Mirror* for nine years during the 1920's. During his stint in the weekly business, he discovered some of the harsh "facts of life" that are part and parcel of this calling—that a good newspaper attracts readers, but not necessarily advertisers; and that a newspaper editor's rewards are mostly of the non-material world.

But he also discovered the intimacy with his readers that every weekly newspaperman knows, and learned a respect for the men with printers' ink in their blood that has stayed with him through his later careers as editor of the *Grain Trade Press*, and then as public relations consultant.

Although C. E. L'Ami (founder of the *CBC Times*) has capably filled his place on *Neighbourly News* during his absence, Mr. Greene's faithful listeners will welcome his return. For he has an inimitable way with a "folksy" story that makes it seem even more amusing, and the warmth and friendliness of his voice have added an indefinable sparkle to even the more routine news stories. The "magic" of *Neighbourly News* has lain in the fact that it deals not merely with reporting events, but with recreating on the air the state of mind existing in the prairie's small towns. Mr. Greene's personality has become an indispensable ingredient of this "magic."

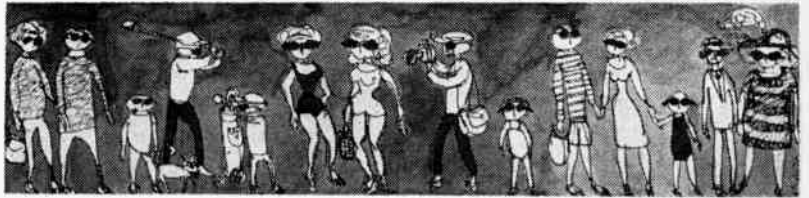


C. F. "Slim" Greene at work clipping weekly papers.

New Summer Programs . . .



This week, CBC's summer schedule begins, with a bevy of new programs, and changes in day and hour for others. Some of the highlights of the network innovations are listed below.

RADIO

Sundays—Bright Darkness, a program about the world of the blind; Speaking of Speech, on which W. H. Brodie talks about the English language and its oddities.

Mondays—Tommy Tweed's Grabbag—the well-known Canadian actor, writer and humourist reads light verse.

Tuesdays—Matinee Quiz—repeats of the question-and-answer segments of Trans-Canada Matinee; Music by Maiste—popular music and jazz by pianist Art Maiste and his trio; Emerson Presents—poetry and stories about great poets, presented by Vancouver actor John Emerson; Now and Then—from Montreal, music old and new; Cue for a Combo—music by small jazz groups from various Canadian cities.

Wednesdays—Men and Mandolins—music by the Van Rome Mandolin Quintet; Duncan's Diary—Chester Duncan of Winnipeg comments on current happenings and oddities in the news; Music on the Menu—popular vocalist Clara Klein, from Vancouver; The Four Gentlemen—old-fashioned harmony by the well-known male quartet; Curiosity Shop—R. S. Lambert talks of historical oddities, famous crimes and supernatural occurrences; Satin and Snuff—popular songs played in the style of the 18th century; Choral Music—choirs from Toronto, Montreal, Winnipeg and Vancouver; Jazz Workshop—groups led

by Dave Robbins and Phil Nimmons, alternating weekly.

Fridays—Stringalong with Ricky—light music by the Ricky Hyslop Orchestra; Tommy Tweed's Grabbag—humorous verse read by the noted actor; Lazy Afternoon—music by the Dave Woods Orchestra; Here's How—reporting on how some Canadian high school students are spending the summer.

DOMINION RADIO NETWORK

Sundays—Blueprint for Music—a program of music appreciation for young listeners, with narrator Charles Winter.

Tuesdays—Transitions—documentary series about some Canadian occupations; first program is entitled Arctic Pilot.

TELEVISION

Sundays—Country Calendar—the program about farming and agricultural developments is seen at a later time; Summer Magazine—series of documentary programs dealing with the history of Canadian rail-roading, the RCMP, pre-historic Canada, man's search for gold and other topics; CBC Newsmagazine—this program, featuring in-depth coverage of recent news stories, is seen on a new day; Hazel—the comedy series starring Shirley Booth, seen half an hour later.

Mondays through Thursdays—Vacation Time—films and live programming for young viewers with hosts Toby Tarnow, Tom Kneebone and Lloyd Robertson.

Mondays—Live and Learn—science for youngsters; A Case for the Court—the popular legal series re-

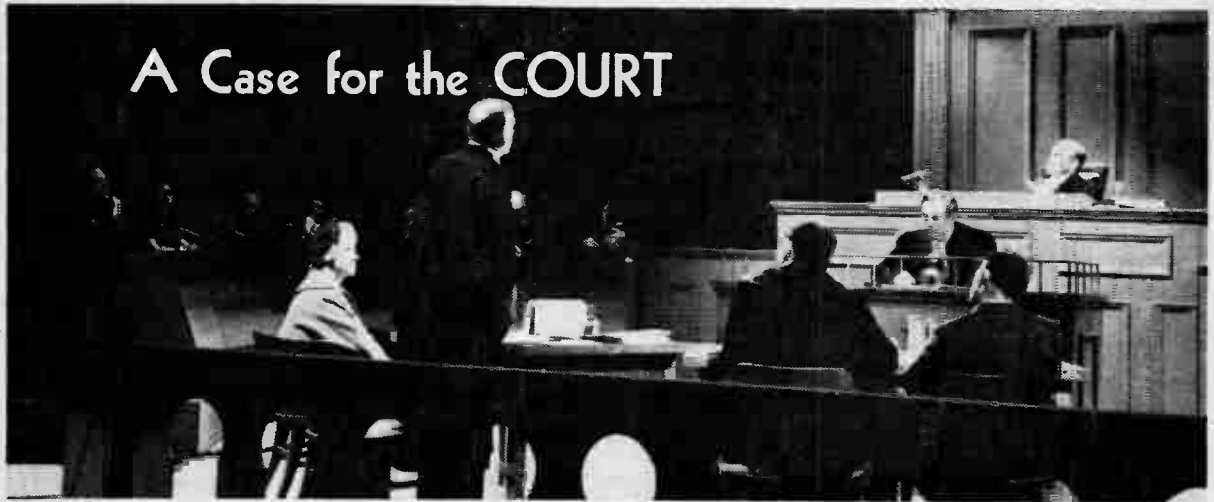

LORD HALIFAX ONCE remarked that "Men seldom understand any laws but those they *feel*." Many Canadians never have occasion to see justice administered in their courts, to learn at first hand what their basic rights and obligations are and to see and hear how Canadian judges and lawyers deal with them in the calm dignity of a Canadian seat of justice. Like Poundmaker, the Indian chief who was tried in 1885 for his part in the North West Rebellion, they often have the idea that "The law is a hard, queer thing. I do not understand it."

The enthusiastic response to the CBC-TV series *A Case for the Court*, from both laymen and the legal fraternity, indicates that many Canadians want to know more about how our courts operate, even if they never have to use them, and lawyers and judges are not only glad that they do, but are delighted with the factual and entertaining way the CBC has set about informing the man-in-the-street in jargon-free language he can understand. Many viewers who had never before seen the law in action have written to the CBC to say that the shows were an enlightening and thrilling experience for them.

Two series of *A Case for the Court* already have been presented by the CBC in collaboration with the Canadian Bar Association, in which practicing lawyers argue fictional cases before a real judge or magistrate, and a third series begins Monday night, July 2. Participating judges and lawyers, selected by the Canadian Bar Association, are from various cities coast to coast. No lawyer appears more than once in a series. Although the cases are fictional, nearly every one is a composite of actual cases tried recently in Canadian courts by the lawyers and judges involved in that particular program.

Production is by George Dick. Scripts for this series, as for the other two, are by Alan King, well-known Canadian writer-actor who used to work for a firm of Supreme Court reporters. He says, "*A Case for the Court* is the most enjoyable job I've undertaken in my 32 years of writing for radio and TV,

not only because the law interests me intensely, but because the lawyers and judges on the show and backstage are so efficient and co-operative. Everything moves like clockwork."

In the first four or five minutes of each program, host Gil Christy introduces the case, talks to some of the men and women involved in it—the plaintiff and defendant (or, in a criminal case, with the accused and the police), and a witness or two, all of whom are played by professional actors. Their discussion, held just outside the courtroom, establishes the facts of the case, after which the action shifts to the courtroom, where the two lawyers argue the case before the judge for about 10 minutes, in abbreviated form. Then a panel of four, representing the public, discuss the legal arguments among themselves, offer opinions, and ask the judge the sort of questions about the case which the public might ask if they were in the studio.

The judge compares this representation of public thinking—an essential element in the law—with the lawyers' submissions, and then hands down his verdict. If he feels that the particular law violates public conscience or sound common sense, he will say so, and perhaps suggest how the law might be changed, or reworded, to serve Canadians better.

The lawyers prepare their own arguments, the panel choose their own questions, and the judges make their own decisions. And after the program is over, the fur begins to fly in a good many Canadian livingrooms, according to letters from viewers. Alan King says he has sometimes seen his own friends pounding a table in their agitation over the judge's decision or the way the case was handled. "Viewers can usually identify themselves easily with someone involved in the case," he says, "because of something in their own past or a situation which they may have to face in the future. So they feel strongly about it. And this is good. The more we can stir up people

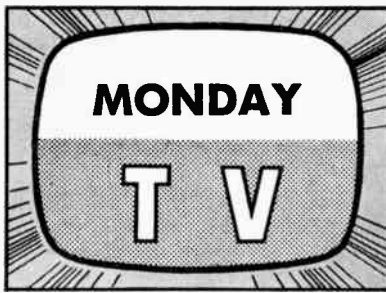

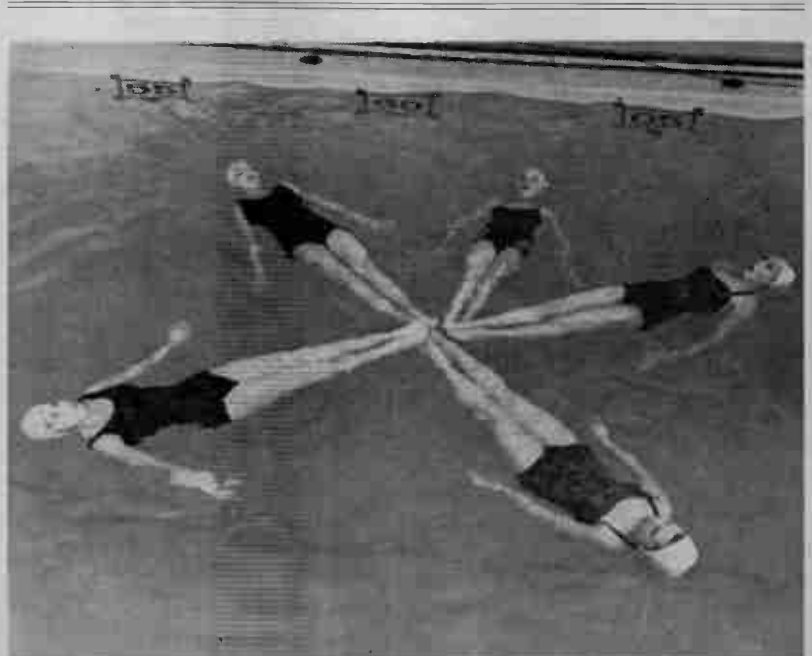

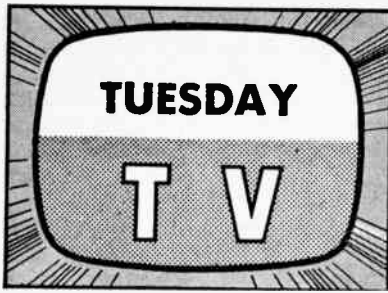

The first program is scheduled for 6:45 p.m. July 4. Could we have a writer assigned to see a screening and interview Reg and Jimmie?

IN THE SCREENING room, a darkened midnight place, lit only by the reflection of several TV monitors, Gibson, Pirie and producer McConnell crouch on stools around the central screen.

Before them, the credits roll through, and then sweater-clad announcer Ed Derbach introduces *Of Bards and Ballads*. The presentation of the program is relaxed and casual in manner, giving the right balance to the music which is always exciting. For in McConnell's own words, "we're playing it straight . . . this is folk music without any of the 'commercial' gimmicks."

Gibson selects the music for the program and Pirie works out his own instrumental arrangements. There is not too much movement in the show—the camera concentrates on the performers and a variety of moods is obtained by lighting techniques. At one

point, with Gibson singing in the foreground, guitarist Pirie is left as a darkened silhouette. Nothing could describe better the almost diametrically opposed personalities of these two performers.

Pirie is a quiet, self-contained man. Only 20, he has already made a name for himself through a variety of shows — *Red River Jamboree*, *The Stu Davis Show*, *Frolic '62*—as one of the most outstanding guitarists in Western Canada. His success in western shows is only one side of the story. For he personally prefers jazz, and is also an equally competent classical guitarist.

Socially he displays the same kind of control and confidence he exhibits when playing the guitar. In conversation he is reluctant to talk about his art or his attitudes toward it. And the most information he would contribute about his personal life was his humorous insistence on the news of his forthcoming marriage—July 7—to Pat Munday, one of the dancers on *Red River Jamboree*.

Ten years older, singer Reg Gibson is a different man. Pre-occupied with people, he talks articulately and at length on the various aspects of human communication. He believes the reason for the current popularity of folk music is that it is perhaps one of the few remaining entertainment media that have a direct contact with an audience. It is a medium that has not been surrounded with the artificiality that would prevent its communication with people.

Something of a phenomenon, Gibson has been

FROM THE BRILLIANT, sunlit waters of tropical coral reefs to the eternal, chilling blackness of the greatest depths where living creatures are found, the sea offers opportunities for a great variety of life. Life is believed to have begun in the sea, and a large part of its evolution has taken place there. It appears that all land-living creatures at one stage or another emerged from the sea and developed their ability to live on land in various ways.

Some sea creatures drift, some swim, some crawl. Many are fixed in position through the greater part of their lives. All must eat, breathe and bear their kind in the salty vastness of the great sea areas. The variety of ways in which these marines lives are lived is the theme of *The Living Sea*, a new CBC-TV series beginning Wednesday afternoon, July 4. Host for the series, which was produced in the CBC's Vancouver studios, is Dr. Ian McTaggart-Cowan, professor of zoology at the University of British Columbia.

Dr. McTaggart-Cowan explains that "the main purpose of the series is to interest viewers in thinking about the sea and the creatures and plants that live in it." The first program, entitled *The Cradle of Civilization*, tells about some of the theories of the origins of the earth, the moon and the oceans, and explains one of the current theories of the first living creatures. "In many cases more than one theory

exists," Dr. McTaggart-Cowan says. "By illustrating the alternative theories we show not only what we do know but also what we don't know."

The series, originally televised in 1957, was produced by Ken Bray. Dr. McTaggart-Cowan is also known for his award-winning *Web of Life* TV series, which was produced by Tom Connachie, who supervised this re-issue of *The Living Sea*.

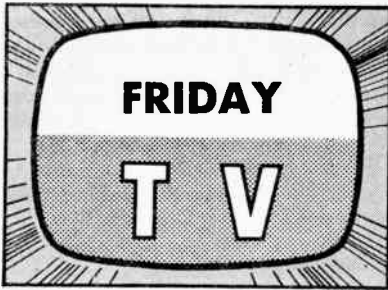
Another scientific series begins on CBC-TV this week. Starting Monday afternoon, July 2, armchair students of the *Live and Learn* series will find out something about geology. Host of the 13-week series is Dr. David Baird, professor of geology and head of the department at the University of Ottawa. The series was shown in Ottawa last winter, where viewers were most enthusiastic about it.

Dr. Baird says the series is designed to acquaint viewers with the history and background of land formations so as to enhance their feeling for their environment and the beauty of their surroundings.

He says: "Many people feel deeply the beauty of the sunset on the mountains; the magnificence of Niagara; or the pounding of surf on a curving beach

—but the natural beauty is greatly enhanced for him who understands what is going on at these places and the processes which made them the way they are. The fire-sparkling diamond or the starred sapphire are beautiful in anyone's gaze but for the man who understands what they are and how nature produced them there is an additional beauty in their symmetrical internal arrangement and in their history as well. For the incurious layman who happens across a fragment of a fossil in a rock it may be but another marking. But for the man who is aware of what it means there is an especial excitement as he looks at the remains of a creature which lived many millions of years ago when the earth was probably much different from what it is now, and when he realizes that what he holds in his hand is a tiny fragment from a record of a billion years of living things which have gradually changed through the long passage of time."

With illustrations, models and experiments, Dr. Baird will give factual information on geological subjects of special interest to the average layman. He will explain scientific techniques used in geological work when the enormous spans of time involved in land formations present special problems in setting up experiments.

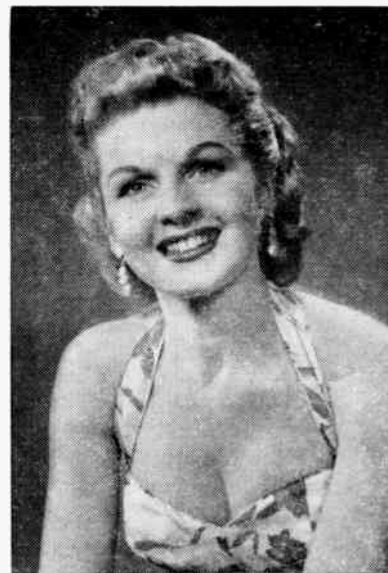

Although it is roughly half the size of Lake Huron, Belgium is similar to Canada in several ways. Among these similarities are its small population: roughly 10,000,000, and its multiple official languages: not one or two but three. German is spoken by some 50,000 inhabitants, grouped close to the German border in the East; in the Northern half of the country, bordering Holland, Dutch is spoken; and in the southern half, French, along with Wallon, a form of dialect which differs somewhat with every region. Brussels, its capital, is quite evidently multi-lingual.

WALLY KOSTER:

WALLY KOSTER, big, brawny baritone from Winnipeg, returns to CBC radio this month with a new, quarter-hour show, to be heard Mondays through the summer. The program, featuring two-piano accompaniments by Lou and Art Snider, replaces that of Tommy Common, who moves to a twice-weekly, Tuesday and Thursday, spot for the next three months.

Thousands of Koster's fans across the country, who got to know him through his CBC radio and TV shows, particularly *'Cross Canada Hit Parade* and *The World of Music*, may have been asking in recent months: "What's happened to Wally?"

The answer is that Wally has been achieving a goal he's been after for years. He's carving out a career for himself as a musical-comedy and nightclub performer, working before live audiences rather than the unblinking eye of the TV camera. He has appeared as a guest on TV a few times during the past year (he was on the *Juliette* show, June 2), but mainly he's been concentrating on in-person appearances, in which his big, booming voice is heard to best advantage. He recently completed an engagement in Sydney, N.S., where his performance in *Oklahoma!* brought standing ovations from the packed house and established a new box-office record for the theatre.

Wally took the first steps toward his new career about five years ago, when he appeared at Toronto's Circle Theatre in a production of Cole Porter's musical *Out of This World*. At the time, he was still deeply involved in television work, and doing double duty in the stage show resulted in a staggering work load, but he enjoyed it nevertheless. Every year since then, he has hit the summer-theatre trail, starring in such musicals as *Guys and Dolls*, *Carousel* and *Gentlemen Prefer Blondes*, the first two productions being in his home city of Winnipeg, with the Rain-bow Stage company.

It was in the spring of 1960 that Wally decided to broaden the horizons of his regular winter work to include more varied experience than merely singing

popular ballads. "For too many years," he said then, "I've just been a puppet that sang. I feel ready now to sing Broadway musical stuff, maybe even a little opera." He managed to get away from pop singing, but he didn't get away from television. CBC signed him as host of *The World of Music*, a series of musical programs which ran on TV through the winter season of 1960-61. Last summer, at the conclusion of that series, he finally found the chance to strike out on his long-awaited new career.

Wally was still in high school when, on a dare from his buddies, he took his first singing job, as vocalist with the dance band at The Cave, a Winnipeg night spot. The band-leader thought Koster's singing was fine, but was annoyed by the fact that his vocalist frequently turned up for work bruised, battered and bandaged, from injuries sustained on hockey rinks or football fields. Wally's rugged, six-foot frame was made to order for heavy sports—he played semi-pro hockey in his 'teens—and if he hadn't wandered into the music business he might have made a career in the sports world.

In the late '30's, he got his start in radio at CBC Winnipeg and soon had a heavy schedule of broadcasts. After moving to Toronto in 1949, he worked as a trombonist and singer with various dance bands around the city, and then got into CBC television in 1953. For the next eight years he starred in one show after another, including *Cue for Music*, *The Big Revue*, *On Stage*, *Mr. Showbusiness* and *Hit Parade*.

When not busy with singing chores, Wally can usually be found with a golf club in his hand, or doing heavy manual labour at his farm north of Toronto. He and his wife, Myra, who doubles as his secretary and Girl Friday, have an 8½-year-old son, Wally II, who is his dad's greatest fan and severest critic. The junior member of the firm is already a veteran of showbusiness. He guest-starred on his father's TV show at age two, and has appeared in a number of commercials.

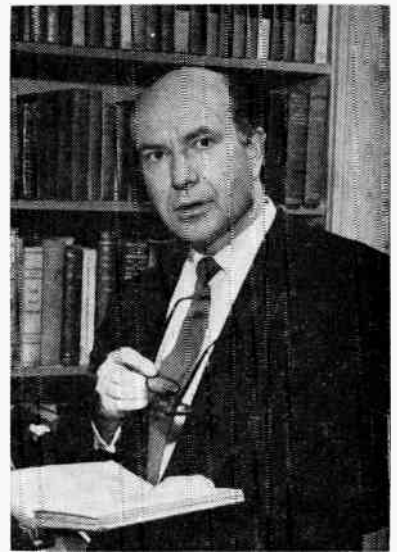

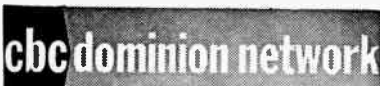

singing since he was four years of age. He first appeared professionally during the depression years, when his father discovered that young Reg could make more money than the rest of the family, by singing on the vaudeville stage. His early acquaintance with hard times most probably accounts for his affinity to Negro blues and folk music, an area in which he excels. His talent for "colored" music has been recognized, and he has been described as

a "white" negro by other negroes. In his own words, "My first and only love has been folk music . . . my ambition has always been to sing it as best I possibly can."

Despite the differences in their background and attitudes as very separate individuals, Reg Gibson and Jimmie Pirie have established a common bond in working together. Like anything else demanding human performance, this rapport works in varying degrees, but when it is at its peak it produces folk music of an intensely communicative kind. For as they both agree in the vernacular—"We dig Folk."

to think about the law and discuss it among themselves, the better the series will succeed."

It isn't only lay viewers who have heated debates about the cases. Lawyers across the country write to say they often argue the cases over luncheon or at meetings.

Highlights of the series include a charge of murder (August 20), a juvenile court case (August 27) and an accident case in which an unused car seat belt figures largely (July 9). The murder case, a 60-minute special, will take place entirely in the courtroom, with witnesses reconstructing the story. This case involves the law in respect to insanity, which the judge will explain, showing how it applies in Canada. Instead of having the case outlined in a preliminary scene with Gil Christy, the accused and the police, the case opens right in court, where witnesses are examined and cross-examined by the lawyers—but their answers are all ad libbed.

Before the TV trial begins, Alan King provides each of the witnesses with a complete account of the crime, what led up to it, the forces at work behind it, and a description of the personality and background of the character the actor is to portray. But once on the stand the actor is on his own, just as he would be in a real court. He must answer the lawyers' questions in his own words. Like any witness at an actual trial, he can't anticipate the exact questions he will be required to answer, or in what direction they may lead. So he must be on the *qui vive* constantly, and if he stammers or contradicts himself, it only adds to the effect.

The performers say they enjoy the challenge of an ad-libbed show. One of them, Cosy Lee, described her session in the witness box as an emotionally exhausting experience but a thrilling one she wouldn't have missed. "I loved every minute of it," she said.

For the murder case Joseph Sedgewick, Q.C., will be appearing for the Crown, and Arthur Martin, Q.C., for the defense, before the Honourable Mr. Justice Stewart, who will preside in three other cases in the series, too. He is also well known in drama circles as an adjudicator, and as a staunch supporter of the Dominion Drama Festival. Many of the legal men in the series have turned out to be very natural and accomplished actors.

"This is not surprising," says Edson L. Haines, Q.C., spokesman for the Canadian Bar Association committee associated with the series, "for advocating a client's cause well is not done objectively. The counsel is living it every minute for maximum efficiency. Because of his devotion to his case, it is very real to him, and for the time being he believes in it completely." So it appears that a good lawyer is also a good actor.

Haines has the highest praise for Alan King's handling of the scripts. "He writes with great precision and never misses a legal point," he says. "He has keen appreciation of the problems confronting a court, and has worked the highest degree of realism into his scripts. The situations they cover are nearly all commonplace, the subject for dispute in any Canadian community. The series is one of the best forms of public relations, one of the most palat-

able ways of informing the public about how our courts work. Our viewing public has increased enormously since the first series. We've had a great many letters asking us to continue, so you might say the third series is by popular demand."

Because juvenile court cases are always heard in camera, only those Canadians directly involved with them have ever had the opportunity of sitting in on one—they could never attend as a visitor. That's why the August 27 case, in which two boys are involved with the law and are tried in juvenile court, should be of special interest. It will show viewers how a juvenile court differs from an adult court. Two of the other cases will be argued as they would be in a Quebec court, to illustrate the difference between French- and English-Canadian law in some civil aspects.

Judges and lawyers coast to coast will be particularly interested in the car seat belt case on July 9, because as far as Alan King knows, this will be the first case of its kind in Canada, and the points it brings up and the way the verdict goes might well influence legal thinking if similar cases come up in actual Canadian courts, as they no doubt will, King points out, because of the growing number of car-drivers who are installing seat belts. He says his research has shown that the use of seat belts lowers

to a remarkable degree the number of injuries in highway accidents.

King always appears in one case in each series. This year it's as a hardware merchant on August 27.

Before King began work on the scripts, he met with producer George Dick, Eric Koch, supervising producer; Milo Chvostek, production assistant, and a committee from the Canadian Bar Association, to select the cases to be included. Then they discussed the most interesting and significant points of law to be brought out in them, the circumstances of the cases, and what kinds of persons the plaintiffs and defendants should be. During these meetings the lawyers present often argued the case among themselves for King's benefit, to see how it *could* go, and then added a few facts here and there to balance it so that it would insure good arguments on the actual show and so that the verdict could go either way.

Originally, says King, the case of *Enticement* (August 13) was to have centred around alienation of affections. But when King was in the middle of his script the Supreme Court ruled that there was no such cause for legal action as alienation of affections unless it were accompanied by something else, such as adultery. So, being an old hand at juggling plots and characterizations, King deftly added a spot of implied adultery to his story, had the husband leave home and the wife sue the other woman for "enticement."

Stuffed Lettuce Salad

- 4 oz. creamed sandwich cheese
- 1 medium carrot—grated
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- dash of garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon grated onion
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped green pepper
- 1 medium tomato chopped and drained
- 1 head lettuce

Groove out centre of lettuce, forming a good-sized well. Mix all other ingredients, making sure tomato has been well drained. Fill lettuce with filling and wrap in foil, and set overnight in refrigerator. Turn on side and slice or cut in wedges as desired. Serve with Sauce a la Russe (Russian Sauce).

SAUCE A LA RUSSE

- ½ cup salad cream (sour cream)
- ½ cup mayonnaise
- ¼ cup chili sauce
- 1 teaspoon horseradish or ¼ teaspoon powdered horseradish
- ½ teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon grated onion
- ¼ teaspoon salt

Mix all ingredients and let stand overnight to season. Mixes well on fresh vegetables, shrimp and lettuce quarters.

On CBC-TV Next Fall . . .

A HISTORY SERIES, a panel show, an afternoon women's program, two serialized drama series, and two programs for children are among the new Canadian-produced shows to be seen on the CBC-TV network during the 1962-63 fall and winter season. The change-over to fall programming takes effect toward the end of September.

Michael Sadlier, program director of the CBC-TV network, said the content of the fall network schedule would be about 65 per cent Canadian. He said the division of evening program time among variety, public affairs and film shows would be similar to that of the 1961-62 schedule.

"In addition to the new Canadian-produced programs, there will be four new U.S. film shows which we believe will give viewers a wide selection of popular entertainment," said Sadlier.

The history programs will be a series of nine, five of them entitled *The Road to Confederation*, and produced by the National Film Board, and four CBC-produced programs marking the 150th anniversary of the war of 1812.

Flashback is the new panel game, devoted to finding out what has happened to once-famous persons, fads and fancies.

One of the serialized drama series, produced for the CBC by Taylor Television Productions, Toronto, will be a Monday-to-Friday afternoon serial adapted by Canadian writers from a library of scripts by the late Robert Howard Lindsay. This series will start in the fall.

The second drama serial, produced by the CBC for showing in evening time starting next April, is tentatively titled *Canada Playhouse*.

Take Thirty is the new women's show which replaces *Open House*, and will be seen each weekday afternoon. The format is designed to provide lively items of interest to women.

The new programs for children include a weekly drama serial for school-age children, produced by CBC Vancouver, and *Misterogers*, a 15-minute puppet show to be seen three afternoons a week, aimed at pre-schoolers.

The new U.S. film shows include *Empire*, a 60-minute series about life on a modern-day Texas ranch, with Richard Egan and Terry Moore; *True*, a 30-minute adventure series based on stories from *True* magazine and starring Jack Webb, and *Beverly Hillbillies*, a half-hour situation-comedy series chronicling the adventures of a hillbilly family which strikes it rich. *The Nurses*, an hour-long series about the work of women in the nursing profession, will be carried on CBC-owned and operated stations.

As well as the regularly-scheduled programs, there will be four one-hour specials with comedians Johnny Wayne and Frank Shuster, and, on a once-a-month basis, hour-long specials starring singer Jo Stafford.

In addition to the serial dramas, *Festival*, *Playdate* and *Quest* will be seen in the fall, along with such public affairs shows as *Close-Up*, *Inquiry*, and *Explorations*; and *CBC Newsmagazine* and *Camera Canada*.

Variety shows returning or continuing include *Don Messer's Jubilee*, *Front Page Challenge*, *Parade*, *Country Hoedown*, *Red River Jamboree*, *Juliette*, the *Ed Sullivan Show* and the *Garry Moore Show*. Film shows returning or continuing are *Hazel*, *Car 54*, *Where Are You?*, *Perry Mason*, *My Three Sons* and *The Defenders*.

Ben Casey, which was seen on a limited network basis during the 1961-62 season, will be carried on the full network starting in the fall.

For the sports fans, National Football League action and other top Canadian sport attractions will return on *World of Sport* in the fall, along with *Hockey Night in Canada*.

As well, many programs seen locally or regionally will return.
