Views on Election Coverage

A map of Canada with the ridings marked out could far better show trends than the I.B.M. machine. It would serve a useful purpose in the interest of national unity if we were informed on what is going on beyond our own little area, by pointing out seats with some unusual or interesting history. Surely the cabinet ministers and Red Kelly aren't the only members of our government, past or present, worthy of mention.

Since the people of Manitoba nearly all have home towns in other parts of the country, why do we have to wait till the next day to find out what happened there, while being subjected to a vote-by-vote count here just to fill in time? . . .

CBC WINNIPEG musicians will perform four special concerts at the University of Manitoba during July, and most of the performances will be available to a larger audience through subsequent broadcasts on CBC Radio.

July 10 and July 31, the CBC Winnipeg Orchestra under Eric Wild will perform. The first concert, featuring violinist Marta Hidy as soloist, will be heard July 16 on the orchestra's regular weekly radio broadcast. The second concert, with mezzo-soprano Rolande Garnier as soloist, will be heard August 6.

The concert July 17 at the university will be performed by Gerald Stanick, viola, Peggie Sampson, 'cello, Leslie Mann, clarinet and Ada Bronstein, piano. *Prairie Chamber Music* July 17 will broadcast Fairy Tale. op. 132 no. 2 by Schumann, performed in the concert by Stanick, Mann and Bronstein, but three additional numbers will not be broadcast.

On July 24, Peggie Sampson, 'cello and Snjolaug Sigurdson, piano, will perform Sammartini's Sonata in G Major. It will be broadcast July 30 on *Recital in Miniature*. Tenor Peter Koslowsky will sing songs by Beethoven, accompanied by Sigurdson during the same concert, and this portion will be heard July 29 on *Distinguished Artists*.

All concerts commence at 12:30 p.m. in the University Residence Auditorium, and the general public is welcome. Producer Tom Taylor is in charge of arrangements.

CLARENCE TILLENIUS is a painter gifted with a genius for capturing the outdoors on canvas. On recent trips, Tillenius has spread his sleeping bag on a mountainside in the Yukon, in the high country of British Columbia, in the forests of New Brunswick, Ontario and Manitoba. Though the person walled up in the city may never watch a white-tailed fawn cavorting through a meadow, or wake to see the sun spilling the yellow light

over a range of mountains or the short-grassed prairie, Tillenius captures these experiences to share with everyone.

Sunday, CBC-TV's 20/20 presents a program in which the cameras follow this rugged artist on his search for nature's beauty. It is a story of the outdoors, of animals, of birds, and of the creative art that makes Tillenius one of the world's foremost painters of nature.

Produced at CBC Winnipeg by Peter Kelly, the program was filmed by Paul Guyot.

Doug Crosley Keeps "Popping Up"

IF DOUG CROSLEY, singing host of Swingalong Tuesday afternoons on CBC-TV, looks like someone you've seen before—chances are it's him you've seen.

If he resembles the handsome youngster who made guest appearances on Country Club and Holiday Ranch in 1958, it's not surprising. If he seems much like the fine young singer who replaced Allan Blye on Saturday Date in the spring of 1959, while Allan took off a week for his wedding, don't be dismayed. Should you find a resemblance between him and the member of the Gino Silvi Singers who did solo parts on the Top Ten medley on Music '60 in 1959-60, or if he appears much like the young man who hosted Welcome Home, CBC Winnipeg's special Christ-

mas show, and CBC Winnipeg's network 25th anniversary show last—well, that's reasonable.

For in each case it was Doug Crosley making these appearances on the CBC Television Network. And he's kept popping up on many other CBC network shows with great frequency in recent months—Red River Jamboree and Music Break, to name a couple more—while hosting the Swingalong show for the past year on CBWT Winnipeg. (The show captured a network spot starting July 3.)

Still in his early 20's, Doug has established himself as a music variety star with a large following. And it all started with a CBC audition after he won an amateur contest in Oshawa, at

AMERICA ABROAD: The Problems of Being Helpful

SINCE 1776, when the 13 colonies fought a war to break unwanted ties with the Old World, the United States has striven to retain its independence, to determine its own destiny uninfluenced by events in other parts of the world. Throughout much of its history, it has managed to preserve that independence, but today, after two world wars and enormous changes in international relations, the country is deeply involved in the fortunes-economic, sociological and political—of a great many other countries.

The U.S. gives aid of various kinds to some 70 nations, and about two million American citizens now live and work abroad, scattered all over the world. An examination of the work being done by some of these people will be presented on America Abroad, a special program produced by Britain's Associated-Rediffusion for Intertel, to be seen on the CBC-TV network on Monday, July 9.

(Intertel, the International Television Federation, is an association of broadcasters in four Englishspeaking countries. Members are the National Educational Television Network and the Westinghouse Broadcasting Company in the U.S., the Australian Broadcasting Commission, Associated - Rediffusion, and the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation. Each member of the federation produces programs for showing through other members' facilities, to an estimated world-wide audience of 42 million.)

America Abroad was filmed in four countries: Cambodia, South Vietnam, Pakistan, and Ghana. All receive American aid in one form or another, but the nature of the aid varies widely, as do the political and economic situations of the four countries.

Cambodia accepts help, not only from the U.S., but from France, the Soviet Union, and Communist

"Parade" repeats .

Brought Back By Popular Request

"Parade" viewers have been naming their favourites over the past couple of years. Now the most-requested programs make up a series of summer repeats

CBC-TV PRODUCER Norman Sedawie has been busy recently, viewing a number of his own productions—the *Parade* variety shows of the past two seasons. He has picked out the best of the crop for showing this summer on the CBC-TV network Wednesday nights. The summer repeat programs have been selected on the basis of program quality and variety, combined with favourable viewer reaction to their initial showings, and they feature some top Canadian and American entertainers.

Sedawie hasn't minded the extra work. "We're very pleased that *Parade* has been singled out for repeat showings," he says. "To the best of my knowledge this is the first time that CBC has repeated a series of TV variety shows."

Parade got its start four years ago, a summer series, returned in 1960 and '61, and was carried on into the fall-winter schedule last year. Producer Sedawie has shared directing duties with Bill Davis, and Saul Ilson has served as writer on all Parade shows. The only regular cast member on the series is host Bill Walker, who has been a part of the show since it began. All other performers—ranging from ballet dancers to Dixieland jazzmen—have appeared on a per-occasion basis, conforming to the show's wide variety of format, from opera to sing-along shows. "I look on each Parade as a 30-minute special," points out Sedawie, "because every show has an entirely different cast and format."

The first summer repeat program was seen last week (July 4), and featured jazz pianist Oscar Peterson and his trio, an orchestra led by Phil Nimmons, and singer Ernestine Anderson. For those who missed past *Parades* or who may wish to savor some shows for a second time, a list of the rest of the summer's shows is given below:

July 11-Sing, Sing, Sing-A sing-along show, with the Gino Silvi Singers and the Alan Lund Dancers.

July 18-Parade Salutes Small Towns-Singers Joan

Fairfax and Denny Vaughan help Montreal Canadiens' hockey star Bernie (Boom Boom) Geoffrion make his TV debut as a popular vocalist.

July 25—Brenda Lee — Show stars the teen-age American singer, backed by a five-man vocal-instrumental group. At 18, Brenda Lee is a veteran of most of the major U.S. television variety shows. She made her first appearance on the Perry Como Show at the ripe age of 10, and has since become a teenage idol, now selling three million records a year.

August 1-Parade Presents Jazz-Trumpeter Maynard Ferguson appears as soloist and as leader of a big jazz band. Montreal-born, Ferguson formed his first band in 1943, at age 15, later was featured trumpeter with Stan Kenton's band, and has headed his own groups at the Newport Jazz Festival, New York's Birdland, and the Stratford (Ont.) Jazz Festival. Sharing the program with him are Jackie Cain and Roy Kral, who specialize in a singing style in which they imitate instrumental sounds, and the Pat Riccio Quartet, a Toronto jazz group.

August 8—The Traffic Problem—Singers Shirley Harmer and Julius La Rosa co-star in a show about driving schools, parking problems and other traffic topics, with the Billy Van Four vocal group and the Don Gillies Dancers.

August 15—Parade Presents Diahann Carroll — Show is built around Miss Carroll, acclaimed as one of the most dynamic and versatile singers to emerge in the U.S. in recent years. She is assisted by the Don Gillies Dancers and the Royden Smith Singers.

August 22—Parade Features Groups—The George Shearing Quintet shares this show with the Billy Van Four, a vocal-instrumental-comedy group known as the Hi-Lads, and a Dixieland band led by trombonist Murray Ginsberg.

August 29-The Jet Age-A musical tribute to modern air travel, starring revue artists Bill Cole and (Please turn to page 9)






Making Ends Meet







China. The program shows projects undertaken in the country by each of these donors, and discusses their relative successes.

In war-torn South Vietnam, some of the major U.S. aid projects are shown, including bridges, highways, civil aviation developments, and the continuing fight against malaria.

The portion of the program devoted to Pakistan, where 70 projects have been completed of 100 undertaken, includes interviews with Americans engaged in these projects and with some Pakistanis who deeply resent the "foreigners" and the projects.

The U.S. citizens who appear on the program are typical of the thousands of engineers, doctors, teachers, missionaries and voluntary Peace Corps workers now representing America in countries throughout the world.

In the opinion of Peter Hunt, writer and producer of America Abroad, these Americans are represent-

ing their country well, on the whole. "Not all are popular," he points out, "but some have proved to be indispensable. Some are popular but useless. Some are brilliant but misplaced. Some mean well but are misunderstood. Where the task involved direct interference in the internal affairs of a country we found acute difficulty, some hard feelings. Where it was being done because it *should* be done, we found co-operation and admiration."

Michael Ingrams, director of America Abroad, shares Hunt's view. "The aid programs to the underdeveloped countries," he writes, "in the initiation, financing and administration of which the United States plays the immensely largest part, are the wonders of the modern world—splendid and hope-filled wonders, however mixed may be their motivation and whatever failures and weaknesses may mar their interpretation. Every American taxpayer can well take pride in the investment he is making in the peace, security and well-being of his poorer fellow humans."

BOXING



"The Pot of Gold Behind a Single PUNCH"

WHAT WOULD THE Marquess of Queensberry think of the sport now? Have the golden gloves become emblems of torture? Is boxing still the gentlemanly art of self-defence or is it mayhem—a pot of gold lying behind a single punch? Should it be abolished?

Recently Montreal freelance broadcaster Lou Craig, an artist and mother of a 14-year-old boy, gathered a variety of outspoken opinions from men associated directly or indirectly with boxing. CBC radio's Soundings presents them Thursday night.

Mrs. Craig talked to a coach, a promoter, boys on their way up as amateur boxers, a doctor, the athletic director of a university, an ex-professional boxer, and Andy O'Brien, sports editor of *Weekend* magazine.

O'Brien pulled no punches in his replies. "Boxing, and this is the fundamental fault of it," he said, "is designed to injure. I abhor the father who sends his boy into golden gloves. The more plain guts a fellow has the more danger he is in."

Ex-professional boxer Armand Savoie of Montreal says he went into the game "for the glory. I wanted to be liked by everybody, and be good to everybody." Savoie, who has since been on unemployment insurance and has worked as a waiter, admits that the friends of his palmy days are no longer around.

Young fighter Marcel Bellefeuille had a patriotic motive for donning gloves, says he "wanted to win something for the country."

Mrs. Craig also interviewed promoter Eddy Quinn, young Olympic fighter, Gaby Masini, coach Roger Larivière of La Palestre Nationale, Montreal, Dr. E. F. Crutchlow, consultant physician to the McGill Athletic Board, and Harry Griffiths, director of athletics for McGill University.

Boxing didn't start out as a refined art. First it was bare knuckles, at a time lost in the mists of Greek mythology, when Apollo was one of the champs. Boxing became a feature at most Greek games, and one of the Olympic heroes, Theagenes, is reported to have killed 1,800 men with his fists, though it is unlikely that this all occurred in the ring.

Greek fighters wore a belt, probably to inhibit foul bashing, and a leather glove known as a cestus. Later, when boxing was introduced to Rome, it fell on evil days, for the Romans, playing to the blood lust of the crowd, added some brutal attractions by attaching bronze buttons to the cestus.

After several centuries of Romans being mashed to pulp for the benefit of the box-office, fist fighting was outlawed. It disappeared for 1,200 years before it popped up again, this time in England, and its popularity quickly spread to North America.

They tell the story that Jess Willard thought he had slipped back into gory Roman times when Jack Dempsey beat the bejabers out of him at Toledo some time ago. The day was a scorcher, and prior to the bout, when Dempsey's hands were sprinkled with powder before they were taped, the trainer accidentally grabbed a can of plaster of paris instead of talcum. When Dempsey started to perspire, the plaster began to set. And when Dempsey threw a punch at his opponent, Willard thought he'd been hit by a brick. After the fight Dempsey's vanity was badly pricked when he unpacked his gloves and discovered the real reason for his success.

Boxing was an even more red-blooded sport than it is today before the Marquess of Queensberry introduced padded gloves to the ring and drew up the standard boxing rules in 1865 (revised in 1890). Andy O'Brien recalls that "wrestling and hugging were allowed. A weakening man could be cross-buttocked into a stage of breathlessness. Gripping a man by the throat was legal. So was tripping him, then jumping upon the prostrate fellow. A round ended when a man went down for any reason, resumed 30 seconds later. There were no wins by decision, only by knockout."

And sometimes bouts went on for hours. The fans were not greedy, but they liked a lot. A world championship heavyweight fight held in Canada in 1857 lasted for 152 rounds—two hours, 58 minutes. But not all bouts, even long ones, have been banging-up sessions for the pugilists. At a fight in Port Dover, Ontario, in 1870, the fighters danced around the ring for an hour and 17 minutes without striking a blow.

Many fights have had their funny side as well as their rough. Several boxers have been wits whose sense of humour took a lot to knock down for a full count. When Max Baer beat Carnera in 11 rounds in 1934, the highlights of the fight was a crazy fandango the two danced before both tumbled to the canvas with Max yelling: "Last one up is a sissy!" When the late Harry Greb was fighting a bout with Gene Tunney in which Tunney was giving him a bad time, Greb's trainers kept shouting encouraging words from

and \$7,000 to spend and save; and Kay and Gordon, whose combined earnings bring in a little over \$10,000 annually. The overall average city income in Canada, according to the latest statistics, is \$5,000. No one is truly "average," but these three pairs of husbands and wives will be among the examples the series will use. In the first program L. C. Rowebottom of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics explains how statistics are assembled, and puts them in proper perspective.

Catherine MacIver says: "Making Ends Meet" does not set out to tell people how they ought to spend their money. But we will see how some families budget, where they save, when they splurge, where the pinch comes. We will also see what the national averages are: how much the illusive "average" family, making two, four or eight thousand a year, spends on housing, food, clothing, appliances, and so forth. And—in the last program—we hope to take a fresh look at the question of personal savings. Is

"money in the bank" as important as it used to be? We hope that by observing the spending patterns of some of their neighbours, viewers may be able to see some choices of which they were unaware. The experience of one family—who looked at 150 development homes before buying one—may, for example, be of assistance to anyone who thinks all subdivision houses in the same price range are pretty much alike."

In each program discussion in the studio will be supplemented by filmed interviews in homes, still photographs with voiced commentary, and cartoons illustrating statistics. An expert in each of the areas discussed (food, clothes, etc.), will also appear on each show to give opinions.

The writer-researcher for the series, Jean Morrison, was assisted by the staff of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics.

The July 9 program will concern food budgeting; July 16: homes; July 23: appliances; July 30: clothes; August 6: cars; August 13: money in the bank.

which CBC variety producer Drew (Country Hoedown) Crossen was judge.

Doug was raised in Oshawa, home of Shirley Harmer (star of A Summer Night, Fridays) and Mary Frances (who made a big hit as female vocalist on Country Hoedown during 1961.) In fact, Doug sang frequently with Mary Frances in an Oshawa bandshell, when both of them were studying semiclassical and operatic singing. "Mary's voice was an octave higher at that time," he recalls—but the demands of a pops singing career caused her to lower it.

Following his graduation from Trinity College of Music, Toronto, Doug worked as a draughtsman in an Oshawa automobile factory until his "big break" —winning the amateur contest and CBC auditions.

Versatility always has been a strong point with Doug. "I used to be soloist at church on Sundays, and sometimes follow up with an appearance at a rock n' roll show the same day," he recalls of his 'teens in his home town. He is good enough on the trumpet and trombone to have played them in an Oshawa danceband, interspersing instrumentals with a few songs. "The fellows in the band didn't like my voice," says Doug modestly, although if this is true, they must be quite alone among a world of Doug Crosley fans.

Among those fans is Manitoba's Lieutenant-Governor Errick Willis. Doug is the only popular performer to have given a command performance at Manitoba's Government House—singing for an I.O.D.E. tea. He gave another performance with the Lieutenant-Governor in attendance at the Golden Boys' banquet held by the Manitoba Travel Association. Mr. Willis enjoyed Doug and the Swingalong chorus so much at that time, that he had them stay the evening, and jokingly proposed that they might make use of him in the bass section.

Doug's career has not skirted the medium of radio. In the summer and early fall of 1960, he did a 15-minute weekly show on CFRB Toronto. He has been guest on CBC Radio's *Variety Showcase*, and one week replaced Georges LaFleche on his CBC Radio Network show.

Night clubs have received him enthusiastically. He went to Buffalo, N.Y., for a one-week stand that stretched to 13 weeks in 1960, and since moving to Winnipeg in 1961, has appeared at a leading night spot.

A privately owned television station in Toronto invited him back for many guest appearances after he first was seen on a late-night variety show.

Perhaps the most important move the young singer has made so far in his career was in the summer of 1961, when he decided to investigate the possibilities of appearing on Winnipeg's outdoor theatre, Rainbow Stage, or on one of the shows produced at CBC Winnipeg.

He was eagerly snapped up by producer Neil Andrews for the series of informal "sing-along" programs planned for the summer, Swingalong. At the end of the scheduled 13 weeks, the viewers were clamouring for more, as they continued to do throughout the winter. The setting had to change from a campfire to a ski-lodge, but the music kept the same relaxing style, under direction of Neil Harris and Mitch Parks. Much of the program's appeal comes from the successfully created atmosphere—that of a group of clean-cut young people having a good time harmonizing together.

Midway in the winter season, says Doug jokingly, "I got tired of taking off my makeup myself after each show, so I decided to arrange for some help." In November, he married Jean Gray of CBC's makeup department.

In his off-camera hours, the husky Doug-6' 1½", 175 lbs.—likes to slip down to the "Y" for some weight-lifting. "I enjoy picking up my trumpet occasionally, too—when the neighbours are out of earshot." And another favourite pastime is cooking, which he does to perfection.

"He turned out 40 magnificent steaks for the Swingalong cast's barbecue the other day," says producer Neil Andrews, smacking his lips. "And I can tell you that his prime rib roast with Yorkshire pudding is a delicacy."

Live audiences add to the fun of performing, Doug agrees—particularly after a recent Swingalong show taped with a studio full of people in attendance. Musical comedy also provides an opportunity for such live-audience appearances, and Doug looks back with pleasure to a show aptly titled "Purely for Pleasure" in which he played the male lead, travelling through southern Ontario in the summer of 1959.

This summer, Doug is anticipating an appearance with Winnipeg's Rainbow Stage, although no announcements could be made at press time. And present plans indicate that Doug and the chorus will continue their local television appearances on CBWT Winnipeg next fall, but—firm schedules have not yet been announced.

the sidelines. "You're doing just fine, Harry," called one of them. "He hasn't laid a glove on you." "Well," mumbled the disheartened Greb through crushed and bloody lips, "you'd better keep your eyes on the referee, because someone in there is punching the hell out of me!"

Today's boxers don't go in for the histrionics of the old ring heroes. John L. Sullivan was probably the champ at giving the crowd a bit of colour and fun. At Madison Square Garden in 1884, when 12,000 braved the heat to see him cut down England's top boxer, Charley Mitchell, Sullivan arrived late to find the crowd considerably browned off with waiting. He staggered into the ring in full dress, took off his top hat, belched loudly, and called:

"Gentlemen, I am sick and not able to fight. The doctor is here, and this is the first time I have disappointed yer."

"He's drunk!" screamed the crowd. Then Mitchell spoke up: "Gentlemen, I am prepared to box, but Sullivan claims he is sick, and it would not be fair as I am feeling pretty good myself." The fight was postponed.

Four years later the two met again, in France, and again got the crowd fighting mad. They battled in a driving rain, and after 35 minutes and 39 rounds the fight was a draw. The crowd was ready for their blood, because during the bout both of the pugilists would stroll nonchalantly around the ring, then retire to their corners to scrape the clay off their boots, "and refresh themselves until one would challenge the other."

World Radio History

No Summer Holiday For CBC - TV Musicians

IT WAS CUSTOMARY, not too long ago, to regard warm weather as incompatable with serious music. A definite hiatus occurred in musical life during the summer, and concerts and recitals were almost non-existant.

Today, however, the enormous popularity of summer music-and-arts festivals has shown that people's tastes don't change completely with the advent of higher temperatures.

Reflecting this idea, CBC-TV will continue to present serious-music programs during the summer months. The hour-long *Concert* series, from Montreal, will be seen most Monday evenings, and the *Recital* series, shown on an intermittent basis in recent months, began a regular weekly schedule, Tuesday nights, starting July 3.

The *Recital* programs will concentrate on the music with a minimum of spoken introductions. Simple settings will be enhanced by imaginative use of lighting and camera angles.

A program of a few weeks ago, in which the Canadian String Quartet played Maurice Ravel's Quartet in F, provides an example of the techniques to be employed. The four players were placed in a setting which suggested the massive stone balcony of a Mediterranean villa; the only set decoration was a

framed portrait of Ravel; the lighting suggested evening; and, as the musicians played, the cameras wandered around the set, moving in from time to time to focus on an individual player when he had a solo passage. The total effect gave the viewer a sense of participation, as if he were a guest at a quiet musical evening.

Some of the Canadian artists to appear in the Recital series: harpist Lise Nadeau, pianist Ronald

Turini, tenor Leopold Simoneau, soprano Pierrette Alarie, and pianist Mark Jablonski.

Other performers to be seen in coming weeks include: 'cellist Zara Nelsova, violinist Devy Erlih, pianist Franz Brouw, flutist Jean-Pierre Rampal, harpsichordist Robert Veyron-Lacroix, violinist Christian

DOUBLE RING DESSERT MOLD

2 pkgs. lemon jelly powder
2 tsp. unflavoured gelatin
1 cup pineapple juice
1 cup hot water
2 pints vanilla ice cream
1 can (20 oz.) crushed drained
pineapple
½ cup toasted chopped almonds
½ cup chopped maraschino

Mix jelly powder, gelatin, pineapple juice and water in saucepan. Put on low heat and stir until gelatin is dissolved. Remove from heat. Spoon in ice cream and stir until melted. Then fold in all other ingredients.

Pour into two four-cup molds and chill until firm. Place on tray, interwinding one ring with the other. Fill centres with fruit in season.

Quilico to Paris

Montreal - born baritone Louis Quilico, who will be seen in CBC-TV's production of the Verdi opera Otello in the fall, recently signed a five-month contract with the Paris Opera for next season. His current contract with the Royal Opera, Covent Garden, expires in July.

Quilico sings the role of Iago in the CBC production, a role he sang in the Canadian Opera Festival in Toronto during 1960. Last winter, in the midst of his Covent Garden season, he made a successful debut at the Paris Opera.

The singer is negotiating for appearances in Russia next season, and this summer will appear on concert stages in Montreal, New York and Philadelphia. In the autumn, he will commute between the Canadian Opera Festival in Toronto (where he will sing the title role in Rigoletto) and the New York City Centre Opera.
