THE CBC will provide part of the first North American Television program to be transmitted directly across the Atlantic later this month.

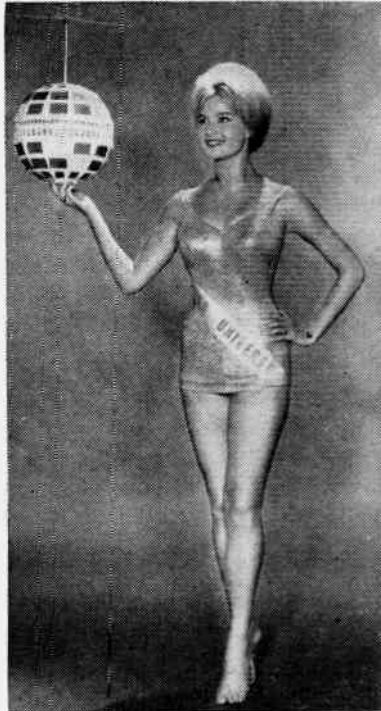
The program will be part of Project Telstar, a continuing series of experiments designed to lead to a full-fledged commercial International Communications System using earth-orbiting satellites. It will be followed by a television transmission direct from Europe.

Both transmissions will be carried live on the CBC's English and French TV networks.

The North American Program, which is being produced by the three United States Television networks is expected to rely on two pick-ups from the CBC—Signal Hill in St. John's, Newfoundland, and the Shakespearean Festival at Stratford, Ontario. Actual length of the transmissions is still uncertain and subject to last-minute changes, as are the actual times and dates of the broadcasts.

The satellite was launched July 10, with complete success. Plans indicate the earliest date for the experimental program as being July 19. However, because the orbit on this date would not permit back-to-back transmissions from both sides of the Atlantic, the most probable date for transmissions would be July 24. The North American program would then begin at 3:20 p.m. EDT, with the European program beginning at 6:14 p.m. EDT. Both programs will be 15 minutes each in length.

The principal transmitting and receiving station in North America will be at Andover, Maine, while the European stations will be in England and France.

A TRAVELLER'S account of Adland, in the Illusion Islands, is presented Tuesday evening on CBC-TV's *Discovery*.

Adland is a country not wholly imaginary and not wholly real. It begins in the imaginations of Admen, but when they have persuaded their readers to adjust their lives to the customs and beliefs of Adland, then this imaginary country becomes a real one.

One of the most striking features of life in Adland is the way it can reconcile absolute contradictions which could not exist together in real life. For example, an Adland car can be very wide inside and very narrow outside. Or again, vodka can be advertised as having no taste or smell whatever (which is why it is drunk by diplomats), but it can also be advertised as having a delicious dryness.

The Adland show, written by Dave Brock, consists of film, still pictures, and some commercials acted by John Anthony, who bewitches Dorothy Davies at her home receiver. Sixty of the special illustrations were drawn in pen and ink by the well-known B.C. artist Don Jarvis, whose television drawings for *A Child's Christmas in Wales* are vividly remembered.

In Adland, believe it or not, the toothpaste contains polka dots, GR-52, and Cluthium. Men with eyepatches are the best judges of shirts, and orchestras play high notes on one side of a concert hall and low notes on the other, to achieve a stereo effect. It may not seem logical. But it does seem familiar somehow.

# The GOLDEN HAWKS

CBC-TV's 20/20 presents the RCAF aerobatic team in action, Sunday, July 22

THE SHIMMERING golden planes swoop up in a graceful arc, holding precise formation, pause a moment at the apogee of their loop, then plummet down almost to the earth, skimming treetops as they zoom away across the horizon. The crowd gasps, breathes a massive sigh of relief, and follows with thunderous applause.

The reaction is always the same across the country, at the air shows and exhibitions where the members of the RCAF's aerobatic team, the Golden Hawks, demonstrate their skill and courage in breath-taking aerial manoeuvres. Some of these, as seen both from the ground and from the cockpit, will be shown Sunday afternoon, July 22, on CBC-TV's 20/20.

The program will introduce viewers to the seven pilots of the team and the ground crews who keep them in the air. It will trace their training procedures

—where the pilots learn to fly mere inches away from each other, in tight formations in which one small error can mean death—and will include films taken during their performance at Rockcliffe RCAF Station, near Ottawa, on Air Force Day.

Viewers will see the team in action from various vantage points—from the ground, from accompanying aircraft, and through the perspex canopy of one of the team's Sabre jets.

The Golden Hawks first performed in public at the annual Air Force Day show at Torbay, Nfld., in May, 1959. Since then, they have travelled across the country many times and have given more than 175 precision-flying performances before an estimated audience of 10 million in Canada and the U.S.

The team was formed to mark the 35th anniversary of the RCAF and the golden anniversary of flight (Please turn to page 9)

# QUEBEC CITY

## Proud, Historic Fortress

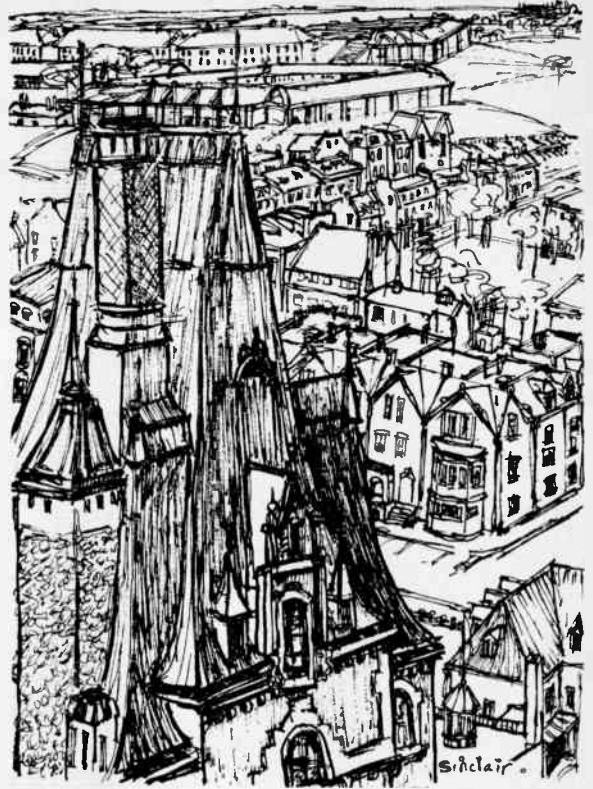
IN AN OLD SUIT and cap smelling strongly of horse, a gallic twinkle in his eye, and a philosophy all his own, the Quebec City *cocher* is garrulous king of the only walled city on the continent.

An incurably romantic monarch who daily surveys the three square miles of his 354-year-old realm from a perch in the driver's seat of a two-wheeled *calèche*, he proudly conducts visitors back into the past with the aplomb of a benevolent ruler who loves every cobble and copper roof in his two-storey kingdom, and is never happier than when showing them off, clattering up and down the old city's steep streets, holding up traffic with regal disdain for modern transportation and tempo.

On CBC-TV's *Playground* this Wednesday afternoon, July 25, he'll invite viewers to hop aboard his *calèche* for a trip through Quebec City, which combines great charm and vitality in a setting as historic as any in North America. He'll drive to some of the popular tourist haunts as well as to out-of-the-ordinary places he knows well but which the regular tripper rarely discovers for himself — places still heavily redolent of the flavour of old France in the New World. Later, viewers will be invited to drop in at one of Quebec's most famous restaurants, La Bastogne, to see a display of French Canadian culinary art in its internationally-renowned kitchens.

The *cocher* will unfold his own version of the city's history, spiced with humour and droll asides as he slouchingly but expertly drives past the city's cherished relics, many of them buildings with four-foot-thick stone walls built to keep out the bitter cold of winter, the heat of summer, and the Indians the year round; past old stone churches with dim, cool interiors that have sheltered the devout for centuries; past the incongruous sight of air-conditioners hanging from ancient windows where Frontenac or maybe Champlain looked out; past *Sous le Cap*, the narrowest street on the continent, where, he says "you get along with your neighbours or maybe get your hair pulled from the window across the street." Six feet across at the widest, the street's balconies on one side almost nudge the ones opposite. There, living in your neighbour's pocket is more than a turn of phrase, but then, as the *cocher* reminds you, French-Canadians are sociable.

The *calèche* clatters past brown, grey, black or white-robed priests and nuns, moving along grace-



fully, skirts fluttering in the breeze off the river, past hordes of darting, bright-eyed children with faces every artist yearns to paint. We see shopping-tired housewives resting their string bags on the countless steps that climb up and down the city, accepted by everyone there as part of the attraction, if a muscle-trying one, of the ancient capital.

How did the city get its name? The *cocher* chuckles. "One of Cartier's men, they say, when he saw the towering cliff for the first time, outlined sharply against the blue sky, cried: 'Quel bec!', which means What a beak! But they also tell another story. They say that when Cartier anchored his vessels in the shelter of the base of the cliff, the Indians on shore called out: 'Kepec, Kepec!' which meant in their language, 'come ashore.' Then Cartier came onto the shore and he and the natives broke bread together. That's nice, hein'?"

The *cocher* is full of tales, some hilarious, some ribald, some very, very sad, such as the one about the time Frontenac died. "He and his countess were separated many years, but he still thought of her, so he ordered his heart sent home to her in a little silver box. But she had a bad temper, that woman, and even with him dead she turned him down flat. 'I do not want a dead heart, which, when beating, did not belong to me,' she said."

On the Plains of Abraham, high above the city, he gets into his stride, reliving the September day in 1759 when the red-headed, large-nosed, 32-year-

old English General Wolfe defeated Marquis Louis-Joseph de Montcalm-Gazon. "Contemplate," he demands, twisting around to see his audience better. "The French, they were not watching here - why should they? Who would be such fools to climb the cliff? They put their army where they saw danger. But . . ." he cuts the air sharply with a stubby fist and pauses dramatically. "No one knows, and that's for sure, how Wolfe found the path up the cliff.

"Some say there was a traitor, but the story I tell is that from his ship he saw women doing their washing in the river and drying it on top of the cliff, so he knew there was a way. Anyway, up they

came, over the edge at 4:00 in the morning, to fight the shortest battle in history.

"In six minutes it was already too late—five minutes more and Quebec was lost, with 649 French killed and 655 British. Both generals, too. Wolfe died in the hour, Montcalm the next day, in that small house with the steep roof we passed back apiece. But first he wrote a letter of respect and admiration to Wolfe, not knowing the English general was already dead, commending to his care the French sick and wounded. Brave men they were, both of them, and the soldiers, too."

The old *cocher's* eyes are misty, and in the following stillness which nobody cares to break, the TV aerials and the zoom of fast cars disappear, and the weatherbeaten old city seems to throw off her years and become again a proud fortress.

in Canada. They hold a respected place among the comparative handful of similar groups—the RAF's Black Knights, the USAF's Thunderbirds, the U.S. Navy's Blue Angels—who indulge in the highly-specialized art of precision formation flying.

Although their aerobatics are spectacular and honed to a fine edge for exhibition purposes, the Golden Hawks usually employ manoeuvres which are taught to all RCAF pilots as part of their training. The Hawks, however, fly at much lower altitudes than do trainees, their formations are tighter, turning distances are shorter, and they do have a few extra specialties, such as the bomb-burst with crossover which they use as a signature.

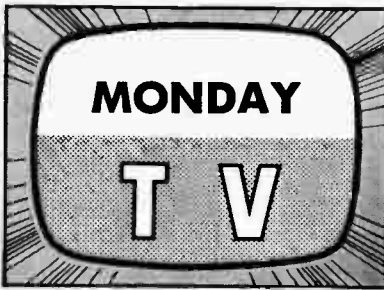
The seven men chosen each year for the team are drawn from the ranks of jet pilots serving with squadrons and training units of the RCAF. The men are chosen for exceptional flying ability and experience, and there is always a waiting list.

Team members have an average of 12 years' service, and all have been with Canada's NATO Air Division in Europe. Five pilots of the 1962 team have served as instructors.

Their aircraft are standard Mark VI F 86 Sabre jets, painted gold with a red and white hawk motif emblazoned on the fuselage. The only extra attention the aircraft receive at the hands of the skilled technical crew which travels with the Hawks is a more frequent inspection of the flying controls.

Of the seven pilots, four work regularly as a formation team, while the other three do solo and duo aerobatics. Leader of the 1962 team is Squadron Leader Lloyd Hubbard, of Delia, Alta., a veteran of 20 years' experience and a member of last year's Golden Hawks.

The team's 1962 itinerary takes them from their home base at Chatham, N.B., as far afield as Victoria, B.C., with stopovers at 56 points between, including four appearances in the U.S., in a tour that runs from May 12 to September 27.

# THE WEAVERS

A GREAT REVIVAL of interest in folk music has taken place in North America in the past decade, and at the heart of the revival is a group called the Weavers, three men and a girl who sing "traditional" songs, accompanying themselves on banjo and guitar.

Formed in 1949, just to sing for fun, they skyrocketed to fame following appearances at the Village Vanguard in New York. Their enormous success in concerts and recordings, with such hits as "Tzena, Tzena," "Good Night, Irene" and "On Top of Old

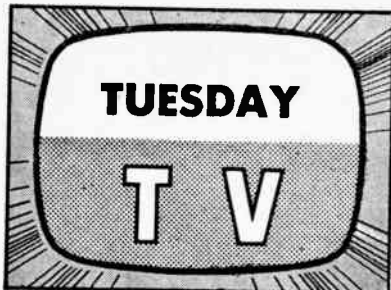
Smokey," has taken them to the top of the heap in the folk music field.

American poet and folklorist Carl Sandburg has said: "When I hear America singing, the Weavers are there."

The group includes new as well as old songs in its repertoire, giving "authenticity" second place to the innate appeal and quality of the music—"A song is a folk song if it *feels* like one," says a spokesman.

On Sunday, July 22, the Weavers will be heard on CBC radio's *Variety Showcase*, in a program recorded during a recent concert appearance in Montreal. 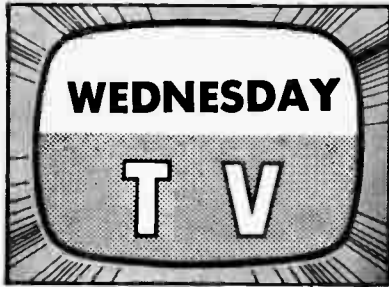

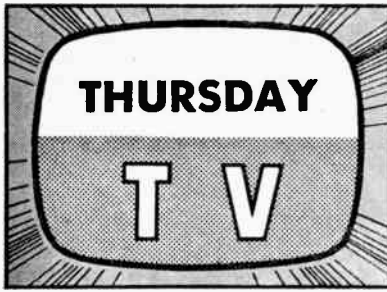

During his unusual life, he has been in the midst of a civil war (in Spain) and two revolutions (in Bolivia), and during World War II he served in the Bolivian Army, attached to the U.S. military mission there.

Winnipeg affords a much quieter existence—he arrived in that city in 1957, just as night clubs were being established, and has stayed on as a favourite of the audiences both in the clubs and on CBC radio and television.

Why the move to Winnipeg? "I liked the idea of getting in on the 'ground floor' in a city that was just establishing night clubs," he explains. "Besides, my wife's father was originally a Winnipegger—although she was born in the States—and she liked the idea of settling here. Of course, the CBC has made it all the more attractive to stay." The Poneiras have purchased a comfortable home, and now have a 2½-year-old son, Rickie.

Like many successful popular musicians, Jose was first trained in the classics. Although he doesn't like to be pictured as a "frustrated concert pianist," his

first public performances were of classical music. "I have followed the career I liked the best," he insists. Now, he refuses to perform the classics in public, but Bach's "Well-Tempered Clavichord" is still his musical Bible, and he plays part of it every day in his warm-up sessions at home.

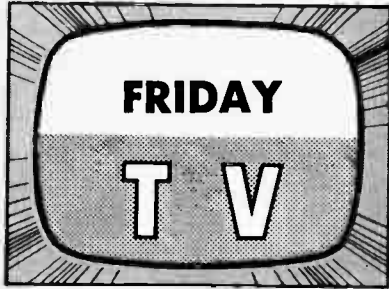

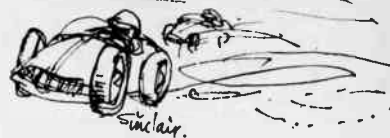

SOME THREE MONTHS back, when the wraps were taken off the 1962 major league baseball schedule, this writer performed his usual crystal gazing chore and predicted that as certain as death and taxes, an American League pennant would be fluttering from the flag-pole in Yankee stadium come September.

And now, after some rather anxious moments for Yankee fans during the first half of the schedule, the American league at long last may finally be separating the wheat from the chaff. The Yankees, plagued with injuries, have been taking their lumps. But on the July 8 week-end, the Bronx Bombers swept a series from Minnesota, and for the first time in several weeks assumed control at the top of the American League ladder. And now with the clubs preparing for that stretch run, the Yankee power and depth should begin to assert itself.

At any rate, television viewers will get an opportunity to watch the best and the worst in the American League on Saturday when the Yankees go against the Washington Senators. It's been a familiar tune for the past few years in Washington, with the lyrics going something like this, "first in war, first in peace and last in the American League."

The 1962 season is no exception. And on July 21, television viewers might see the Yanks begin to put some daylight between themselves and the rest of the league at the expense of the cellar dwellers.

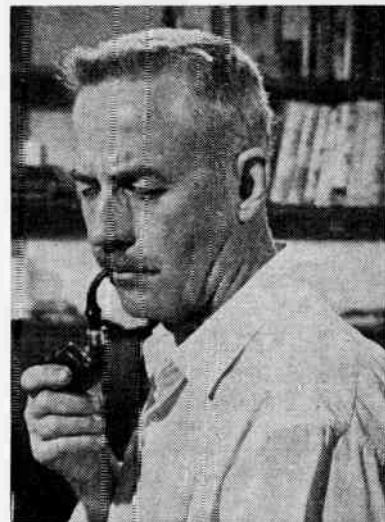

# The Wonderful World of W. O. MITCHELL

*The creator of "Jake and the Kid" recalls his own life — more colourful than that of his fictional characters — on a new CBC Wednesday Night series*



THOSE WHO HAVE grown to know and love the warm, personable characters in the *Jake and the Kid* series through CBC radio and television broadcasts, magazine stories or books, will be interested in the series of programs to be heard on *CBC Wednesday Night* for the next seven weeks beginning July 25. The series will consist of autobiographical essays by W. O. (Bill) Mitchell, creator of *Jake* and the other colourful inhabitants of *Crocus, Sask.*, in which he will talk about his boyhood in Western Canada and about some of the influences that shaped him as a person and as a writer.

He will recall the prairie environment and the central figures in his early life—places and people used later in his novels and in many of the short stories and radio and television plays that have made him one of the leading chroniclers of life in the farming and ranching country of Western Canada.

Even if only a few of Mitchell's adventures are included, the series will make fascinating listening. The author's life has been as colourful as that of any of the characters he writes about.

The unusual and bizarre occurrence seems to be the norm in the Mitchell household, making the most improbable James Thurber story pale by comparison. Old friends are used to the chaos that passes for everyday life with Mitchell, his wife Willa and their sons. Pierre Berton recalls visiting the family once, when they were living in Toronto for a three-year period in the late 1940's. Arriving at the Mitchell ménage about 9:00 p.m., Berton found the place in an uproar. Firemen were scurrying in and out of the house, extinguishing the remaining embers of a fire that had broken out earlier; and Mitchell and his wife were nowhere to be seen (they had lost each other downtown, when Bill, after dropping Willa off at the dentist's, had gone into a deep

reverie, driven into a strange section of town and then been unable to find his way back).

In the midst of all the commotion sat Bob Needham, a friend from the West who had been invited to dinner. Regarding the situation as normal for the Mitchells, he had settled down with drink in hand and was cheerfully observing the proceedings. Eventually Bill and Willa found each other and made their way home, whereupon Bill, ignoring the frantic goings-on around him, sat down and proceeded to regale his guests with a long and fascinating tale in which he played many different roles with great gusto and a fine sense of style.

This kind of thing led his Toronto neighbours to become decidedly unfriendly, a fact which only supported Mitchell's opinion about life in the comparatively crowded confines of a big eastern city. He soon moved back to the uncluttered spaces of the West, to the town of High River, in the Alberta foothills ("just two city blocks from the finest trout stream in the world"), where he combines all-night writing binges with such daytime activities as hunting, fishing, exchanging tall tales with the locals (who used to feel sorry for him because he apparently couldn't keep a steady job) and raising orchids.

"My place is in the Chinook wind district," he says, "where the climate is mild in winter and cool in summer—ideal for writing. We have a magnificent view of the Rockies from our living-room window."

He has an equally magnificent view of his fellow human beings, bringing a compassionate understanding to their foibles and shortcomings. And, while others would call him an irresponsible nut (Toronto composer Morris Curdin, an old friend, says he is merely uninhibited and well-adjusted), he is able to turn the unlikely events of his life into highly entertaining tales. Radio listeners can judge for themselves every Wednesday Night for the next seven weeks.

## "First, Catch Your Hare"

There was an old fellow called Tommy

Who cooked a "Four's Company" consomme;

He based his "receipt" on sheer gall and Ma Beeton,

Stirred well and admired with bonhomie.

... And the tongue-in-cheek result he presents, with the regular Drama Quartet on CBC Radio's *Four's Company*, Saturday, July 21, in a program called *First Catch Your Hare*.

Don't laugh at the injunction in the title. Mrs. Beeton leaves nothing to chance. Her recipes cover every step of the way. And where quantity is concerned, the sky's the limit. With a perfectly straight face she calls for "two pails of spinach" or tells her readers to "take four dozen eggs, two pounds of butter, and half a bottle of port. . . ." How else could you feed a typically large Victorian family, to say nothing of the servants and underlings necessary to a well-run home a century ago?

Catering for an average middle-class family in the age when her famous *Book of Household Management* first appeared may sound to us like running a small hotel, but her directions, if followed to the letter, promise to make every mum a chatelaine with unfurrowed brow. The 1,139 closely-printed pages of her 101-year-old treatise on running a household cover almost any eventuality. With this stout little volume tucked under her arm, the Victorian housewife could meet any cooking, cleaning, social, sanitary, medical, legal, child-rearing and servant-managing problem, and come up smiling. At least in theory.

Mrs. Beeton took four years to compile her book, and no wonder. She is supposed to have tested personally each of her hundreds of recipes for everything from collared calf's head to toad-in-the-hole. And apparently Mr. Beeton survived happily as chief taster.

Mrs. Beeton isn't satisfied with telling her readers how to make various dishes. She instructs them in serving them, combining them with others in countless mouth-watering menus, and she tells them how to act, what to serve, to say and to wear should the Archbishop, the local squire, a titled lady or a plain mum come to call.

If one of the guests should choke on a bone, get a dizzy spell, or pass out entirely, the remedy is there in the back of her book, along with handy instructions for healing a bealing toe, a touch of croup, breaking a contract, or, if it comes to the worst, making a last-minute will. Some of her advice is still sage. But some of her observations are worthy of Punch.

Even five minutes poking through her book is a giddy experience. If you're on a diet it's torture.

Her typical summer breakfast menu reads something like this: fried soles, ragout of duck, veal pie, cold chicken, tongue, poached eggs, boiled eggs, strawberries, tea, coffee, hot and cold milk, marmalade, sardines, prepared sauces, and any fruit. In those days, if anyone had wanted to make do with black coffee they'd have sent for the doctor.

After staggering out from this banquet, the Victorian was shortly summoned to a noon repast consisting of clear soup, mayonnaise of salmon, roast chickens, croquettes of beef, cold lamb, salad, fruit tart, custard, sponge cake, pudding, maraschino jelly, strawberries and cream, bread, butter, cheese biscuits, etc.

A monumental tea heavily reinforced with hot buttered scones probably sustained the Victorian about 4 p.m., when he might begin to feel a little faint. And then at 8 he was royally revived with caviar, clear game soup, John Dory, filleted soles, tartare sauce, salmi of wild duck, chicken cream, prawns in aspic, haunch of mutton, roast ducks,

snipe, masses of potatoes, mashed turnips and other vegetables, olives, benedictine souffle, golden jelly, iced nesselrode pudding, and stilton cheese.

A snack before retiring? Shudder at the thought—but butler and footman were quite likely to glide in with a little something nourishing as the clock struck 11.

Who could resist a Beeton-inspired picnic where the necessary beverages include: three dozen quart bottles of ale, two dozen bottles each of ginger beer, soda-water and lemonade, six bottles of sherry, six bottles of claret, champagne à discretion, any other light wine that may be preferred, and two bottles of brandy. Of course in Victorian times the horses knew their way home.

What did the below-stairs army think of their way of life, those who had to prepare and clean up after all this gorging? Tommy Tweed offers some delightfully sly suggestions in his *Four's Company* script.

And he points out that Mrs. Beeton was no little old lady in black bombazine, as many surmise. She

was attractive and young, one of 21 children, and she died in childbirth at 28. Her great-niece, British author and TV personality Nancy Spain, describes her as "intelligent, well educated, rich and musical. She played the piano divinely, spoke French and German with ease, Italian fluently, took an interest in fashion, and could make her own clothes. She was loved to distraction by her sister, her mother, her husband and her stepfather, so that none of them was really quite sane about her. But most of all, I think, she was loved by the Victorian women of the middle classes to whom her cookery books came as a godsend. She was a boss lady, a brilliant executive. She was about 100 years before her time.

"If she had lived today she would have been one of those fabulous characters—young, beautiful, and full of mad, nervous energy—who dart off to New York by jet air-line, leaving an office filled with memoranda on tape-recordings. She would have been a TV and radio personality. She would also have brought up her children effortlessly, edited a magazine, compiled a dozen books on how to run the home, seen them all through the press, and still looked divine when her husband came home to supper."

## PINEAPPLE DESSERT

- 2 ripe fresh pineapples
- 1 pint fresh strawberries
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 2 to 3 tablespoons orange and lemon juice or 3 tablespoons liqueur (kirsch, apricot brandy or curacao)
- 3 egg whites
- 2/3 cup sugar
- Pinch of salt

Cut ripe pineapple in two, lengthwise. Remove core and meat. Cut up fruit and add strawberries. Marinate with liqueur or orange juice until thoroughly chilled. Fill pineapple shells with this mixture, omitting liquid. Cover with meringue made from egg whites and sugar.

Just before serving, preheat oven to 425 degrees. Bake until meringue is golden—about 10 minutes—but watch carefully. May also be topped with toasted almonds.
