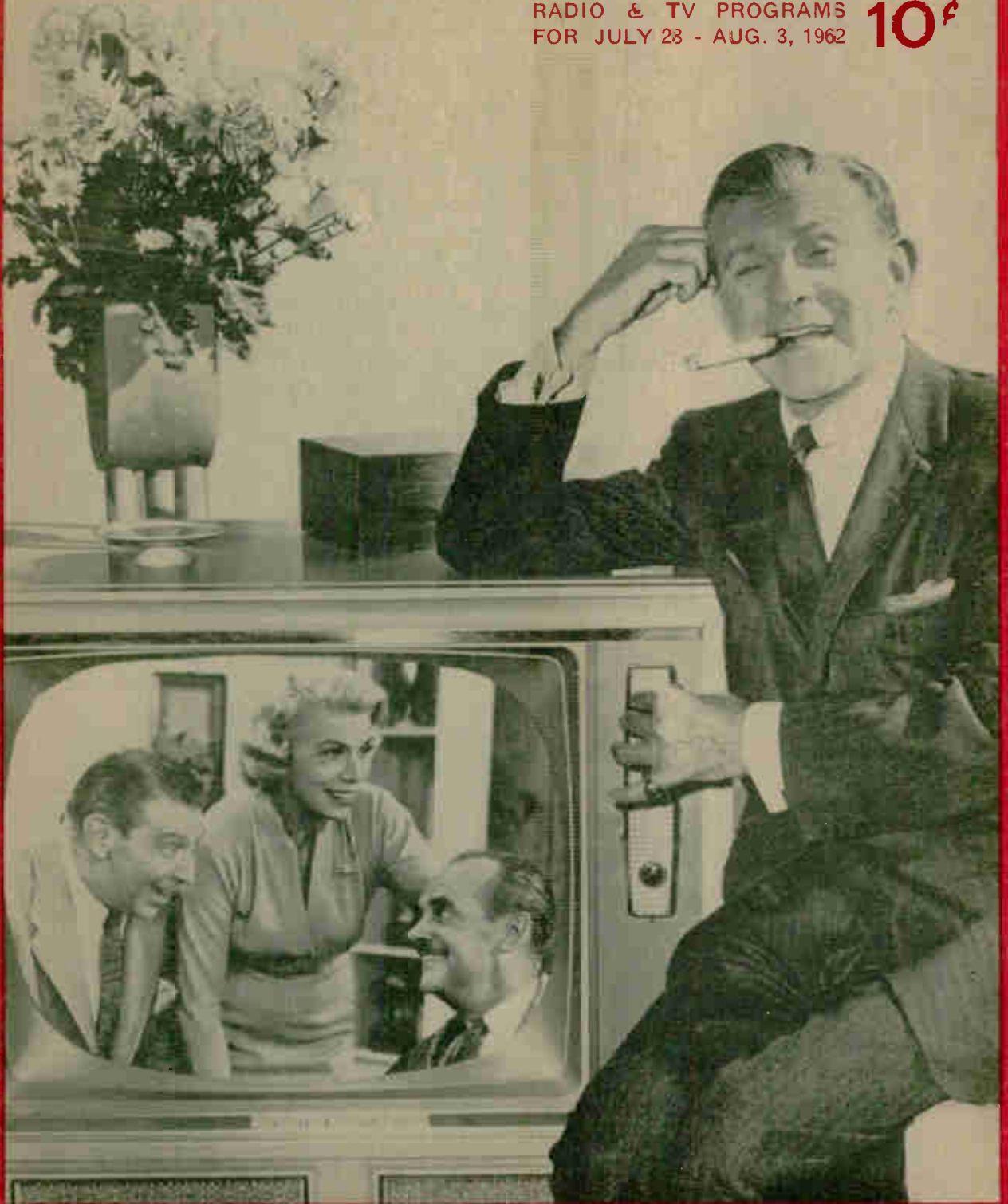

THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES are a fascinating area for the tourist who likes to look around a bit, a CBC Winnipeg film crew of the Farm Broadcasts Department learned on a recent 16-day jaunt across Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba.

Shooting 8,600 feet of film as they travelled, the crew, under producer Gren Bates, picked up dozens of interesting stories that will be featured in coming weeks on *Countrytime* (Saturdays) and *Country Calendar* (Sundays), both on CBC-TV.

Some of the fascinating side-trips taken by the crew: they visited a 20-room mansion at Whitewood, Sask., built by a French count from bricks made right on the property; W. O. Mitchell, author of the *Jake and the Kid* series, was chatted with on the grounds of his beautiful home at High River, Alta.; blind rancher Archie Klaber was watched at work on his 1,700-acre establishment, with 700 head of cattle; they saw the unique Adolph Heyer tree plantation at Swift Current, now operated by Alfred Mirau; and they stopped for a visit at Lac Pelletier, Sask., with former M.P. Irwin Studer, on his beautiful tree farm.

Of course, the more conventional agricultural scene was not ignored on the trip. The Provincial Exhibition at Brandon was visited, and already has been the subject of a program. The Brandon and Indian Head experimental farms were visited on their 75th anniversaries, and some of this film also has been seen, with more in reserve. Another fascinating story put onto film, to be shown August 18 on *Countrytime*, tells of the immense Wascana Centre Area under development in Regina, which calls for hundreds of millions in construction to establish a new university, develop the Legislative Building grounds and erect a museum building, over a period of 50-100 years.

Arriving home, the crew had some kind words for the warm, co-operative manner in which they were received throughout their journey.

## Four's Company:

# Unconscious Humour

"OWNER OF TRACTOR wishes to correspond with widow who owns a Modern Foster Thresher; object matrimony; send photograph of machine."

"C. Ida Desborough, Gerrards Cross, Buckinghamshire, urges people to plant oaks in every available space for the sake of our future Navy."

"Pots, Chamber, fluted, with royal cypher in gold, for flag officers only."

Not schoolboy humour this, but pearls from the United Kingdom daily press, bits of actual but unconscious humour and naiveté which the British delight in collecting and which frequently baffle foreigners. The samples above, some of the most delightful to appear recently, were gathered by readers of the English weekly *The New Statesman and Nation* and sent to the publisher for inclusion in the weekly column of unpremeditated wit titled *This England*.

With many more chuckly examples of the Britisher at his innocent best, Diana Maddox, a member of the Drama Quartet heard Saturday nights in CBC Radio's *Four's Company* series, has prepared a delectable concoction of the naiveté of "pompous and even highly-placed people who have taken up grave poses with, so to speak, their trousers on backwards." It will be presented on July 28, along with several samples of charming childish howlers, including a half-hour adaptation of *The Young Visitors (sic) or Mr. Salteena's Plan*, one of the most appealing—and revealing—novels ever written. Its author—nine-year-old Daisy Ashford.

Miss Maddox points out that sin was taken very seriously in the 19th century, and "in the firm conviction that it was their moral duty, the writers of

children's books larded their stories with homilies of vice and virtue. *Eric, or Little by Little*, first published in 1858, is a prime example. According to its author, the schoolmaster-parson F. W. Farrer, who later became Dean of Canterbury, "It was written with but one single object—the vivid inculcation of inward purity." The program includes a passage concerning "The first time that Eric heard indecent words in Dormitory Number Seven," and "was shocked beyond bound or measure. Dark though it was, he felt himself blushing scarlet to the roots of his hair and then growing pale again, while a hot dew was left upon his forehead." Should he speak out against what he had heard? Life and death, ruin and salvation, corruption and purity hung in the balance as Eric considered. "For half an hour in an agony of struggle with himself, Eric lay silent. The moment passed by forever. Eric had listened without objection to foul words and the irreparable harm was done."

But not all Victorians were prim. We have as our authority Daisy Ashford's description, in *The Young Visitors*, of the goings-on in English high society just before the turns of the century. If you think Victorian ladies were shy and modest, Daisy will set you straight—and she seems very sure of her facts. Her novel, one of the slyest bits of English satire ever written, was published in 1919, after Daisy had grown up, with a preface by J. M. Barrie, who described the book as a masterpiece.

"How cunningly throughout," he wrote, "she keeps us on the hooks of suspense, jumping to Mr. Salteena when we are in a quiver about Ethel (the heroine), and turning to Ethel when we are quite uneasy about Mr. Salteena. This authoress of nine is flirting with her readers all the time. There seldom probably was a novelist with such an uncanny knowledge of his characters as she has of Mr. Salteena. The first line of the tale etches him for all time: 'Mr. Salteena was an elderly man of 42 and fond of asking people to stay with him'."

# The NEW EUROPE:

Subject for  
Discussion at  
this year's  
Couchiching Conference



IN THEIR SWIM SUITS, shorts or other casual attire the men and women lounging around the dock, beach, verandahs and lawns this week at a campsite on Lake Couchiching, 90 miles north of Toronto, will look like any informal resort group. Talking in groups large or small, then breaking off for a quick swim, a game, a hearty meal, a campfire sing-song, and often arguing long into the night, they might be any cross-section of white-collar workers trying to forget time-clocks and responsibilities.

The difference is that some of them are leading international economic and political figures. All of them are thinking people deeply concerned with the problems of our times who go there annually for the express purpose of facing up to their responsibilities, and the topic of most of their conversations and discussions is the many changes which have taken place in Western Europe over the last 10 years—not only the Common Market but other international organizations which have developed over the years—and their applications for the people of Continental Europe, Britain and Canada.

One of the strengths and charms of the annual Couchiching Conference presented by the Canadian Institute for Public Affairs in co-operation with the CBC, is the informal environment in which serious topics of world-wide importance are discussed—an open-air atmosphere which conference organizers have found can be highly conducive to clear thinking, understanding, and the breaking down of antagonism and reserve.

Sessions from the 31st Couchiching Conference (which runs from July 28 to August 4) will be presented nightly on CBC Radio. For the first time, a mobile CBC-TV truck and staff are being sent to the Conference to record special material for a program to be seen on Wednesday night, August 1. The chairman of this year's program committee, former editor of *Saturday Night* Arnold Edinborough, will

interview some of the principal speakers at informal moments while they're leaning against a tree-trunk having a chin-wag, coming in from a swim, sunbathing on the lawn, or having a game of horseshoes in a setting where chipmunks and motorboats add to the colourful background of rustic sounds.

Candid microphones and cameras will eavesdrop on open-air discussions about aspects of European integration which speakers feel are particularly relevant for North America. And in an open-air discussion group conference participants will question the speakers on this topic.

Among those taking part in the TV program will be Raymond Aron, director of studies at the Ecole Pratique des Hautes Etudes in Paris, well known for his political and social commentaries in the Paris newspaper *Le Figaro*, in *Preuves* and many other publications; Max Kohnstamm, from Holland, formerly secretary to the High Authority of the European Coal and Steel Community and now vice-president of the Action Committee for the United States of Europe; Etienne Hirsch, former chairman of the Commission of the European Atomic Energy Community and former head of the French Plan for Reconstruction; and Vladimir Velebit, executive secretary of the Economic Commission for Europe, a distinguished Yugoslavian diplomat.

"In our radio broadcasts from the Conference this year," says program organizer Christina McDougall, "we're trying out the 'open end' technique. Each evening session on the national network will begin at 8 and last until 9, but on Tuesday and Friday nights we'll decide on the spot during each show whether to run the program to the end of the meeting or cut it down at the point where we think the radio audience's interest might be flagging."

The opening broadcast, on Saturday, July 28, titled *The New Europe*, will be an historical analysis

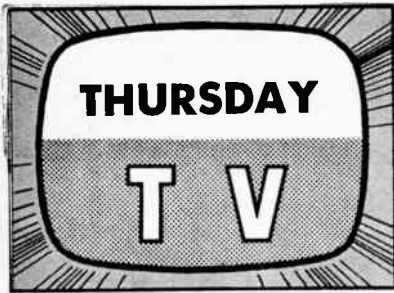
of the emergence, since the First World War, of a new European entity. The speaker will be William D. Clark, director of the Overseas Development Institute in London, England. The chairman is John W. Holmes, president of the Canadian Institute of International Affairs.

Sunday evening's broadcast is to be a talk and commentary on *Isms and Attitudes*, an examination of European attitudes, primarily about the changes taking place there. The speaker will be Raymond Aron, the chairman will be Kurt Swinton, president of the Encyclopaedia Britannica of Canada, Limited, and the commentator will be William Diebold Jr., senior research fellow, Council on Foreign Relations, New York.

The social and cultural pattern in Europe today will be examined in Monday night's broadcast by Etienne B. Hirsch. The chairman will be George P. Grant, associate professor in the department of religion at McMaster University, Hamilton, Ontario, whose series of programs on great philosophers was a highlight of last summer's CBC-TV. States of Europe, Brussels; Vladimir Velebit, executive secretary, Economic Commission for Europe, and Dr. Rudolf Meimberg, chief economic adviser, Deutsche Bank, Frankfurt, and professor of economics at the University of Mainz.

Wednesday's broadcast, August 1, will centre around the implications of the Common Market for Europe, Canada and other countries. Speakers will be William Diebold Jr., Etienne B. Hirsch, Henry H. Mhun, consulting and research economist, Montreal, and Eric W. Kierans, president of the Montreal Stock Exchange.

The social and cultural attitudes of Eastern Europe will be examined in Thursday night's broadcast. The speaker will be Vladimir Velebit, the chairman will be M. A. Crowe, economic adviser to the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce, Toronto, and the commentator will be Raymond Aron, economic adviser to the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce.

The final broadcast, on Friday, August 3, will present an analysis of attitudes and policies of European countries towards other areas of the world. Speakers will be Raymond Aron, and Max Eayrs, associate professor of political science at the University of Toronto.

Anyone may attend individual plenary sessions at the Conference by buying a ticket at the door of Copeland Hall, Geneva Park, Lake Couchiching, during the half-hour preceding a session. Admission is \$2.50 per person at evening sessions and \$2 per person at morning sessions.

In addition to the plenary sessions, the Conference offers numerous small discussion groups which meet in the mornings, full recreational facilities, and, on Thursday night, a cabaret presented by students who work in the dining hall and others on the staff,

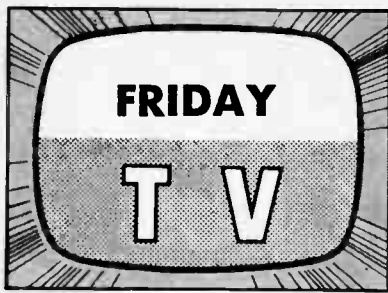
in which they offer skits and musical items satirizing aspects of the Conference and some of its important participants.

Miss McDougall says that nobody at the Conference gets much sleep through the week, for the discussions and arguments started during the plenary sessions are continued every night into the wee small hours, not only by the main speakers, but by the pressmen covering the Conference and by conferees from all over the continent. She says it is interesting, and often amusing, to see how reserve gradually breaks down in the Conference's informal atmosphere as the week progresses. "Some pretty high-powered talent attends, top economic and political figures from various countries, and usually, although they've been warned by letter that dress at Couchiching is informal, they arrive in dark business suits, looking very prim and proper, with a marked degree of reserve.

"After a day or so they usually appear in a bright sports shirt, and by the third day they're dressed like everyone else, in shorts or bathing suit, singing folk songs lustily around the campfire, plunging in and out of the lake four or five times a day between sessions, having hot and heavy discussions while they dry out on the dock, and challenging all and sundry to games of golf or quoits.

"By the end of the week they're speaking freely and inspirationally about all sorts of problems common to countries the world over, they have a much keener understanding of each other, and lasting friendships have developed between the most unlikely people.

"Couchiching offers a unique opportunity for approaching serious problems in an informal, friendly atmosphere, which most men and women attending find both relaxing and stimulating, which comes as a delightful surprise to many visitors from abroad who expect the usual rather stuffy and precise setting for a serious conference."

## Gracie and George Take a "Curtain Call"

"WHEN I WAS BORN," says Gracie Allen, "I was so surprised I couldn't talk for a year and a half." She soon made up for it, and her cheerful *non sequiturs* have confused husband George Burns and delighted audiences for 36 years, in vaudeville, radio, movies and television.

Both veterans of showbusiness—she started at age three, he at seven—Burns and Allen teamed up in 1922, married three years later. Their act changed little over the years. Gracie played the addle-brained wife who had the unerring knack of making logic rearrange itself so that her wildest scheme seemed momentarily sensible, while George—twirling the big

cigar that became his trademark—was the patient, slightly baffled 'straight man,' feeding Gracie the lines that got the laughs (e.g.: "Gracie, were you the oldest in your family?"—"No, my mother and father were older.")

The most consistently popular situation-comedy series on U.S. television, the Burns and Allen show ran eight years, ended only because Gracie wanted to retire from showbusiness to be a full-time housewife and grandmother. Eight of the best episodes from their final season are being shown this summer on CBC-TV, Friday nights.

Sample dialogue goes something like this: TV producer: "I've got two clever writers. They've just finished a story for Marilyn Munroe and Jane Russell. They're two clever boys." Gracie: "If you think Jane and Marilyn are boys, maybe we'd better get another producer."

# Venture Interviews

## Some English WITCHES

IN JOHN VAN DRUTEN'S 1950 Broadway comedy, *Bell, Book and Candle*, the hero had an unusual problem: his fiancée was a witch. Not the old-fashioned, broom-riding, crescent-nosed crone type, but a young, dark-eyed, attractive creature who lived in a luxurious Park Avenue apartment.

To most play-goers, the comedy was a complete fantasy because obviously there aren't such things as witches. But according to some authorities the play could have been entirely factual for, they maintain, there definitely *are* such things as witches in the world today, quite a lot of them, in fact.

One who entertains this possibility is Father Joseph Christie, a Jesuit priest who has for the past two years been studying witchcraft in Britain. He says that the ancient art is enjoying a boom there, both in its benign and malignant forms.

"What is being practised in Britain today," he says, "is witchcraft cleverly adapted for our times. It is designed to appeal to the thrill-seeker or the curious, the confused and uncertain. . . . It is a religion—pagan worship mixed with a belief in magic."

"And," he added with a smile, "I do not underestimate the attraction of the fact that some of their rites are performed in the nude. Witches say that clothes get in the way of the magnetism they try to generate."

A study of witchcraft as it's carried on today will be presented on CBC Radio's *Venture*, Sunday, July 29. Titled *The Witches of England*, it will include interviews with some of those who claim to be practitioners of the mysterious, age-old ceremonies.

Some listeners will be surprised to learn that many witches lead very prosaic lives, and that not all witches are old and ugly. "Often they are attractive young people," points out Father Christie.

One such witch is Thelma Capel, a quiet, unobtrusive stenographer by day and high priestess of a London "coven" by night. A coven is a group of witches and warlocks (male witches), usually numbering 13, who meet regularly to practise their strange rites.

"We worship the life force and the god and goddess (the eternal male and female) who are creators of the life force," says Thelma. "In our worship, we seek to contain and focus this force by group action."

According to some self-confessed witches, there are many covens in the London area, and others in Oxford, Brighton, Newcastle and elsewhere. One of the London warlocks claims proudly that his coven is full of "fine chaps." "We're intellectuals," he boasts, "not working-class types. Our fertility rites and ritual dances take place on Candlemas (Feb. 2), Lammas (Aug. 1), and Hallowe'en (Oct. 31).

There is a certain amount of friendliness between male and female witches. Before dancing, we may have a few tots of rum, and after it some food."

Witches no longer need fear torture or burning at the stake (since the repeal of the Witchcraft Act in 1736, it has been perfectly legal to be a witch in England), but it is still rare for one to admit his or her identity. This, however, poses no problem for Dr. Gerald Gardner, 77-year-old anthropologist who is probably Britain's best-known warlock. Not only does he freely admit his association with the occult, he makes a living from it.

When not helping to perform the rites of the coven to which he belongs, Dr. Gardner serves as curator of a witchcraft museum, on the Isle of Man, where the collection of magical paraphernalia includes ritual swords and knives, bells, amulets and other charms, jars containing the ointment with which witches are said to coat themselves during their ceremonies, and the traditional "flying" broomsticks. Dr. Gardner is a scientist first, a witch second, and any conflict arising from the unlikely combination is resolved in favour of science.

"It is difficult," he says, "to say how much is real and how much is imagination" in what witches claim to have experienced.

One widely-held belief that Dr. Gardner tries to dispel is that all witches are agents of Satan. He maintains that "witchcraft is never evil, although some witches are," and believes that many witches—the "white" as opposed to the "black" variety—are influences for good. They claim, in fact, to have saved England from invasion (by the Spanish Armada, Napoleon, and Hitler), by reciting incantations and raising a great "cone of power."

According to Dr. Gardner, witches are simply practitioners of a pre-Christian religion who worship "the old gods." Their name is derived from the Anglo-Saxon word "wica," meaning "the wise people."

On one point, Father Christie and Dr. Gardner agree: the current resurgence of witchery in England will not last long. "Science is displacing it," sighs the latter. "Good weather reports, health services, games, bathing, nudism, the cinema and television have largely replaced what the witch had to give."

Father Christie sums it up thus: "Those who adhered to the cult (in past ages) could let their hair down in orgies 'in the forests of the night.' But let's face it. Life itself is so *dolce vita* these days that very few have to join a witches' coven to have 'a good time.' But witchcraft has been around for hundreds of years, and it may be a long time before it dies out completely."

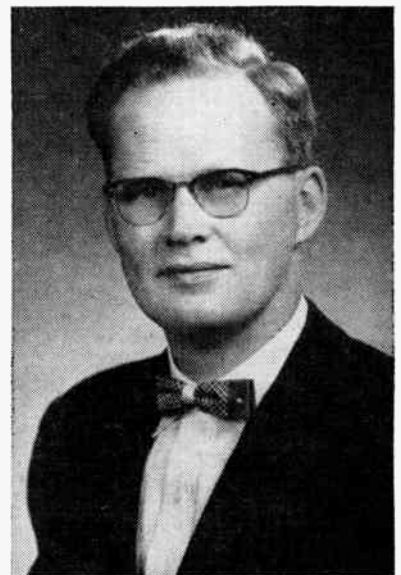

Hilles Pickens, one of the best-informed golf "experts" in the business. This tournament, for that well-known trophy put up by a distiller of "the grape," is the premier event of the year for Canadian golfers.

On hand, to defend his title won last year at Winnipeg's Niakwa Country Club, will be Jackie Cupit, the young Texan who hasn't burned up the circuit since but who has, nevertheless, been making a pretty good living. Others scheduled to take part are Vancouver's ever-youthful Stan Leonard, Al Balding and George Knudson of Toronto. (Knudson, who learned all his golf in Winnipeg, has had a fairly successful season on the pro circuit and should be a good, long-shot bet to win.)

Among the "name" Americans expected for the Canadian Open are Masters champion Gene Littler, U.S. Open champion Jack Nicklaus, plus South Africa's gift to goldfom, Gary Player. Tournament officials are also hopeful of enticing British Open champion and record-breaker, Arnold Palmer, north of the border. Palmer's appearance at the Laval-Sur-Le-Lac golf course, near Montreal, site of this year's Open, would no doubt attract fans by the thousands.

Finally, to complete the weekend sports action, the second of the annual major league all-star games will be televised from Chicago's very picturesque Wrigley Field, home of the National League Cubs. This is the rubber game in the long series of "dream games" dating back to 1933, or it would have been if not for one tie. The American League leads the series with 16 wins, while the National leaguers are hot on their heels with 15.
