CHRISTMAS DINNER RECIPES

STUFFING FOR TURKEY

(15 lbs.)

- 1 loaf day-old bread crumbs
- 1 tbsp. sage
- 1 tsp. salt
- Pepper
- $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp. ginger
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. rosemary
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. thyme
- 1 tsp. parsley— $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. savory
- 1 large chopped onion
- 2 stalks celery, chopped
- 4 tbsp. butter
- 1 apple
- $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. sausage meat

Melt butter, saute onion and celery. Mix with bread crumbs, adding other seasonings as well as chopped apple and sausage meat.

TURKEY GRAVY

- 6 tbsp. fat from pan
- 6 tbsp. flour
- 2 cups stock from giblets and remaining de-greased sauce from pan

Melt fat in pan, add flour, blending until slightly brown. Gradually add stock and cook until thickened. Correct seasoning.

SQUASH & PEAS

- 1 hubbard squash
- 2 tbsp. butter
- 2 tbsp. brown sugar
- 1 pkg. cooked peas

Cut squash in half, remove seeds and into well put butter and sugar. Bake in pan on rack in one inch water until just tender—about 45 minutes. Remove and fill centre with buttered and parsleyed peas. Place on platter.

For Your Enjoyment on Christmas Day

THE FAMILY gathered 'round the livingroom — a fine meal, the exchange of gifts, a brightly-lit tree, laughter and good spirits: this is the traditional picture of Christmas Day in Canada. And in recent years, supplementing the celebration, have been CBC Radio and Television, with widely varied, outstanding programming fitted specially to the occasion.


Mentioned below are the network programs to be seen and heard on Christmas Day. For further details, and information concerning local and regional programming, see the notes and features throughout this issue.

The annual Commonwealth Message from Her Majesty the Queen will be carried on the radio and television networks Christmas morning. (The message will be repeated on television and radio in the evening.) The message will be followed, both on radio and television, by greetings from Prime Minister Diefenbaker, followed in turn by season's greetings from J. Alphonse Ouimet, president of the CBC.

Radio network service begins at 8:35 a.m., when Max Ferguson and his "friends" give their own inimitable introduction to the day, with music by Stu Davis from Edmonton. The next highlight of network programming is the annual *Commonwealth Broadcast* at 9:30 a.m. This year's program has been produced by the New Zealand Broadcasting Corporation, and its theme is "The Challenge of Change." The world's first woman prime minister, Mrs. Bandaranaike of Ceylon, will be a contributor to the broadcast, and from more than a dozen other Commonwealth countries — including Jamaica, Tonga, Canada, India, Pakistan, Hong Kong, Sarawak and Britain—will come accounts of social changes, which are moving at a faster pace than ever before.

At 10:30, *Music for a Christmas Morning*, a 90-minute program of readings from the Scriptures interspersed with music sung by the Festival Singers of Toronto, under the direction of Elmer Iseler, is heard.

The early afternoon will be devoted to a series of programs originating in the CBC's regional centres across the country. At



1:15, from St. John's, Newfoundland, singer Lew Murphy, a vocal octet, and the Ralph Walker Trio will be featured on *Come All Ye 'Round*. Folk-singer Tom Kines and his family will bring musical Christmas greetings from Ottawa on *Kines' Family Christmas* at 1:30, and *The Tamburitians*, from Windsor, Ontario, will present carols from many lands at 1:45. Light music from Halifax, by the Dave Woods orchestra and chorus, will be heard on *A Touch of Tinsel*, at 2:03, and the annual Armed Services Show, *Hits and Mistletoe*, will be presented at 2:30. This year's program will feature recorded excerpts from some of the shows put on by the CBC Concert Party during its recent tour of NATO bases in Europe. Singers Lorraine McAllister, Frances Jordan, Maurice Pearson and Bob Stone, with the Bud Henderson Quintet, will be

heard from CBC Vancouver at 3:00 p.m., on *The Christmas Song Book*, and from Montreal, at 3:30, will come *In a Festive Mood*, another program of light music.

At 5:00 p.m., CBC Radio will present *The Shepherd*, a program prepared by freelance broadcaster Barbara Greene, in which a 75-year-old English shepherd talks about his solitary life and the personal philosophy that he has evolved through the years. At 5:35 p.m., following the news, a service from the historical RCMP chapel in Regina, the annual pre-Christmas parade, will be broadcast, followed at 7:00 by the news, and a repeat of the Queen's and Prime Minister's Messages.

At 7:30, *Assignment* will present a special program entitled *The Spirit of Wisdom*. Prepared by John Scott and Bill McNeil, the program will consist of readings from the writings of leading scholars and philosophers through the ages, and recordings of talks by Sir Winston Churchill, Will Durant, Bertrand Russell, Gandhi, Albert Einstein and others. On *Radio International*, at 8:00 p.m., listeners will hear choral music by three great masters of the late Renaissance—Victoria, Byrd, and Lassus—sung by the Ambrosian Singers conducted by Denis Stevens, with organist Charles Spinks. At 8:30, Eric Wild will conduct his Winnipeg musicians in a *Christmas Pops Concert* which will include the *Carol Symphony* by Victor Hely-Hutchinson. A comedy-drama by David Brock, entitled *An Impromptu Christmas*, produced in Vancouver by Gerald Newman, will be heard at 9:00 p.m., and at 9:30 Canada's top comedy team, Wayne and Shuster, will return to radio to do a half-hour of comedy and music. Concluding the day's special Christmas broadcasts, at

A Child's Christmas in Wales

*Dylan Thomas' classic tale
is put into photographs*

WHEN MARTIN LICHTNER, a 32-year-old New York freelance still photographer, was majoring in English literature at the University of Connecticut, the Welsh writer Dylan Thomas went there to read some of his own shaggy, vividly evocative words for the students. Lichtner was deeply impressed by the startling freshness of Thomas' images, and by the warmth of his unusual voice bringing them to life.

Years later, when Lichtner had become a professional photographer, and was looking around for some project which would use the full range of his photographic talents, he conceived the idea of trying to get the film and TV rights to Dylan Thomas' classic tale, *A Child's Christmas in Wales* (which has become, in many ways, the Dickens' *A Christ-*

mas Carol of our time), and the rights to the recording of the work which Thomas made for Caedmon Records a year or two before his death. Using still photographs of the scenes Thomas described, which Lichtner planned to take himself, as a background for Thomas' own voice reading the story, he hoped to make a half-hour "package" which would appeal to TV viewers of all ages.

Lichtner spent three frustrating months working through an assortment of agents and lawyers in New York and London, England, before rights were cleared. Then he tried to find financial backers, but could interest no one in what seemed to them a hare-brained scheme with little prospect of profit. But by then Lichtner was obsessed with the idea and was determined to see it through. So he gambled. He withdrew all his savings from the bank, and with his wife, child and one still camera, set out for Wales early last December.

Festival Presents

A Cradle of Willow

AN UNUSUAL NATIVITY play set in the English countryside, which was presented on CBC-TV's *Festival* series last year, will be repeated on Christmas Eve (Monday, December 24). Entitled *A Cradle of Willow*, it was written by English playwright Dorothy Wright in 1952, and first performed at Cheltenham, England. Starred in the 90-minute production by Eric Till are Leo Ciceri and Dino Narizzano, with Eric Christmas and Tony Van Bridge.

The drama involves an appealing group of master-basketmakers. As Miss Wright points out in her introduction, "it doesn't matter" where it is set. Although the locale is dateless and nameless, it is obviously somewhere in the West country of England, not only because of the dialect Miss Wright uses for her characters, but also because that part of England is a rich source of the osiers (willows) used in basket-weaving, and also, unfortunately, full of the searing dampness that invites ague, from which some of the basket-weavers suffer. Families of them still plying their trade there today can trace their ancestry back through generations of weavers who have made their headquarters in that part of Western England for centuries.

The author's insistence on timelessness in her drama is emphasized by Robert Lawson's sets and Margaret Laurnet's costumes, which form an effective but unobtrusive background for the moving story. Scenes from the CBC-TV production last Christmas are seen here in photographs by Dale Barnes, Henry Fox and Albert Crookshank.

The village characters with their little peculiarities and weaknesses are headed by master weaver Breague (Geoffrey Alexander), whose wife (Hilary Vernon) is dying from the effects of the damp, unhealthy marshland. Breague's affable but simple-minded cousin and apprentice, Will (Dino Narizzano) is in love with the local innkeeper's daughter, Tansy (Toby Tarnow). Another leading villager is Martin (Leo Ciceri), a draftsman who is embittered because blindness put an end to his promising career as a falconer. Comic relief in the story is provided by a skeptic, Randall (Eric Christmas), and pathos by the foreman weaver, Hoad (Tony Van Bridge), who is married to a mad woman (Moya Fenwick).

As if the community didn't have enough worries, it is constantly plagued by tax collectors, and a census is being threatened, though the weavers don't know why. As the play develops, its author shows that each of her characters is longing for the protection and inspiration of a Messiah, for a variety of personal reasons.

Christmas with Canadian Indian Children

Christmas has all the magic and excitement for Indian children that it has for others, EYES OF CHILDREN on CBC-TV proves

WHEN CBC PRODUCER George Robertson went to the Kamloops Indian Residential School to make a film about the students' preparations for Christmas, he was so charmed by the children's naturalness, and by the appeal of their personalities, ranging from shyly wistful, pig-tailed little girls to impish boys with dancing, black-button eyes, that what he planned originally as a 15-minute film turned into one of half-hour length. Titled *Eyes of Children*, it will be seen on CBC-TV Christmas Day.

The Indian children are shown in their classrooms, on the playground, brushing their teeth en masse, saying their prayers, going to bed, and preparing for the approaching holidays and for Christmas Day itself, with stars in their eyes. Viewers will see them painting Christmas decorations, proudly decking themselves out in costumes to rehearse nativity tableaux, and practicing Christmas carols.

Robertson has the highest praise for the training given the boys and girls by the Sisters who run the school. He says the children have excellent manners—"Yes ma'am, no sir, thank you, please, are all said naturally, in an unforced manner." Their innocence and spontaneity radiate from every foot of the film. Filming was done by John Seale, and Arla Saare edited the program.

Between 400 and 450 children are in residence at the school, the largest of its kind in Canada. Built in 1923, it is run by the Roman Catholic Church under the supervision of the education division of the Indian Affairs Branch of the Canadian government. Its principal is Father G. P. Dunlop (Order of Mary Immaculate). The school has an outdoor swimming pool, basketball and boxing facilities, a large playground and a hockey team from time to time. The Sisters have trained the girls in folk dancing (Irish jigs and others, but not Indian dances) and the dancers have carried off honours at three or four carnival meets. Last July the National Film Board made a film at one of the meets.

Next to Ontario, British Columbia has the largest Indian population in Canada: 38,000, of whom approximately half are under 16 years of age. It is estimated that by 1982 the B.C. Indian population will have reached 75,000, which was the figure before 1835.

The majority of Indian boys and girls spread over the 1,600 reservations in B.C. attend the regular provincial schools. In the last three years the Department of Indian Affairs has arranged for a number of students to board with families in communities adjacent to provincial schools, and the system is reported to be working well. There are also 80 day schools adjacent to the reservations in communities where no other schooling, public or private, is available, and 12 residential schools which average 150 students each, where grades one to nine are taught.

At the Kamloops school 120 students in grades 10, 11, and 12 also sleep there (unique in the system), but take tuition at St. Anne's Academy in Kamloops with 400 white children of the area. The Department of Indian Affairs is aiming at greater integration of Indian students with the community wherever possible.

The relationship between the community and the Indian students is excellent in Kamloops, Department officials report. Eight of the residential schools in British Columbia are run under the auspices of the Roman Catholic Church. There are three residential schools for Anglican children, and one run by the United Church at Port Alberni.

Standards and curricula at the day and residential schools for Indians have been as high as those in regular provincial schools since the Second World War, and the Indian schools are inspected regularly. About half the children at the residential schools come from isolated areas which do not have provincial or day schools, and most of the others are from broken homes. At Christmas time about half the children will be able to go home or will be invited to spend the holidays with families in the community.

Premiere:

A New Work by Godfrey Ridout

THE WORLD PREMIERE of a new work by Canadian composer Godfrey Ridout will be given by soprano Lois Marshall and the CBC Symphony Orchestra in a radio broadcast to be heard Sunday, December 23, at 2:30 p.m. The work, entitled *The Ascension*, was commissioned by Miss Marshall with the aid of a grant from the Canada Council. A second Canadian work—the *Symphony No. 1*, by Harry Somers—will be heard in the program, which will be conducted by Victor Feldbrill, permanent conductor of the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, and the broadcast will also include Honegger's *Symphonic Movement No. 3*.

The Ascension carries a sub-title, *Cantiones Mysticae No. 2*, linking it with an earlier work composed by Ridout for Miss Marshall. In 1953 he was invited to write a set of songs for the Canadian soprano, to be presented at a concert of Canadian music conducted by Leopold Stokowski in New York's Carnegie Hall. Ridout chose the *Holy Sonnets* of John Donne as his text, and the composition—the first set of *Mystical Songs*—was a complete success.

Recently, when Lois Marshall was provided with a grant from the Canada Council to commission a work from a Canadian composer, she went to Ridout once again. What she had in mind was a sacred work suitable for the concert stage, and at first Ridout planned to do a setting of some part of the Ordinary of the Mass. Later, however, he discarded this

idea and chose as his text excerpts from the Propers for the Feast of the Ascension ("God is gone up with a merry noise") and the words of an Ascension Day hymn by Bishop Venantius Fortunatus (530-609 A.D.). Ridout has scored the work for solo voice and strings, with a solo trumpet being used in an obligato role.

Born in Toronto in 1918, Ridout became interested in music early in life, and in his teens became particularly attracted to the music of English composer Gustav Holst. He has never lost his affection for Holst and for the other composers of the English tradition—he cites Elgar, Holst and Walton as chief among his influences—a fact that is reflected in his compositions. His musical education as well, gained mainly at the Royal Conservatory in Toronto was conducted under the guidance of English-trained teachers, notably Ettore Mazzoleni and Dr. Healey Willan.

In 1948, Ridout was invited to join the Faculty of Music, University of Toronto, to teach harmony and history. He is now an assistant professor in the Faculty of Music.

Speaking of his own musical style, Ridout has said: "I keep falling back on the late romantics, but I notice with the last few works I have done there is a trend towards simplicity. I feel that I represent a certain school of thinking . . . the conservative element . . . a rather curious little island of reaction. But it is harder to be a reactionary now than it is to be a revolutionary,

because everybody is a revolutionary."

Lois Marshall made her third tour of Russia this fall, then returned to North America for a tour of Canada and the United States. She will pay a return visit to Europe next spring, and sometime during the winter will be making recordings of German *lieder* in collaboration with pianist Glenn Gould.

The other Canadian composer represented in this week's concert, Harry Somers, is also Toronto-born and studied at the conservatory in that city, but under a completely different influence than that of Godfrey Ridout. Somers' teacher was John Weinzweig, generally acknowledged as Canada's foremost proponent and teacher of 12-tone music. He also studied in Paris with Darius Milhaud, and in San Francisco with Robert Schmitz.

It was during his stay in Paris, in 1950, that Somers began work on his *Symphony No. 1*, and he completed the composition the following year, after his return to Toronto. Although Somers uses the twelve-tone principle as the basis of his work, he doesn't consider himself a 12-tone composer.



The Moon of Wintertime

This Christmas Day carol program takes its name from the first Canadian carol

"TWAS IN THE moon of wintertime, when all the birds had fled, that mighty Gitchi Manitou sent angel choirs instead. Before their light the stars grew dim, and wondering hunters heard the hymn: Jesus your king is born; In excelsis gloria!"


Those are the opening words of the first Canadian Christmas carol, originally written in the Huron Indian tongue by the famous Jesuit missionary and martyr, Jean de Brébeuf, for the members of the Huron tribe in Ontario to whom he brought the message of Christianity in the mid-1600s. A phrase from the verse provides the title for a special Christmas program of folk music *The Moon of Wintertime*, to be shown on the CBC television network on Christmas Day. Taking part in the telecast will be

singers Klaas van Graft, Elan Stuart and David Campbell, and the Toronto folksong group, The Travellers. Frank Stalley will be host and narrator, and musical accompaniments will be provided by Ricky Hyslop and a seven-piece orchestra.

Father Brébeuf used a 16th century French tune as the setting for his little Indian carol, designed to tell the Christmas story to his Huron converts in terms they would understand—the shepherds became forest hunters, God became the Great Spirit, the Wise Men became Indian chiefs, bearing gifts of fox and beaver pelts, and he used the Indian term "moon" in tead of "season."

His little group of peace-loving Hurons apparently loved the carol, for they remembered it and passed it on by word-of-mouth long after Brébeuf was tortured and burned at the stake by invading Iroquois in 1649. The carol was passed on from generation to generation for almost 100 years, in fact, before it was written down by another French missionary, Father Villeneuve. It became very popular in a French-language version, as well as in an



English translation made in 1926 by Canadian poet J. E. Middleton. The Travellers will begin Tuesday's telecast with the carol.



two have been chosen for the program, a Czechoslovakian "rocking" carol and a Negro cradle song called *A-Rocking All Night*. Some of the songs will concern ancient and pagan Yuletide celebrations. One that goes back to Saxon times in Britain is the wassail bowl. "Wassail" is an old English word meaning "be thou hale", or as we might say it today "Here's to your health". In feudal England the peasants used to fill wooden bowls with steaming spiced ale and carry them to the man or house singing "Here we come a-wassailing". The lord and mistress of the manor would drink from the bowls and reward the wassailers with gifts. In Elizabethan and Stuart times the custom was continued by the "waits" who sang in the village streets.

Another hold-over from pre-Christian times was the custom of killing a wren as a ceremonial sacrifice. In Ireland, "wren-boys" used to go around from door to door singing for "money to bury the wren." Their song is one of those to be heard on the program. Others will include such gay little processional carols as *Here come Three Ships*, *Dame Get Up and Bake Your Pies*, and *A Pig Went Out to Dig*.





SUPPOSE YOU'RE a pleasant, soft-spoken housewife in your early thirties. You like to think of yourself—a little ironically, perhaps—as incapable and timid. You prefer to be told what to do, rather than think things out for yourself. In fact, you exploit your incompetency a bit.


But you're really an intelligent person, friendly, happily married, with a small son. On one particular morning, a rainy, dismal sort of day when you'd rather curl up on the couch with a magazine and a second cup of coffee than dig into household chores, you've just kissed your husband off to work, seen your son on his way to school, and are putting off the thought of all the preparations ahead of you—an important business contact of your husband's is coming to dinner—when the door bell rings.

In comes a bedraggled magazine salesman. You don't need any more magazines, but you decide to let him warm up and dry out for a bit. He seems a clever, persuasive and perceptive young man, but

there is something strange about him. You can't pin it down, and it makes you uneasy. He shows no signs of leaving. You hint. He ignores it.

Finally, warned by your sixth sense, you tell him to go, at once. He refuses, and he makes it plain that he is in command of the situation. His threat of what will happen if you don't act as if his being there were perfectly normal, even when a neighbour drops in, frightens you into letting him order you about. Where does he come from? What makes him so strange? As the probable answers dawn on you, the hours gradually develop into a morning of terror. And as your fear mounts, you feel as if you are being swept on in a roaring flood of sinister unreality, from which there is no escape. But in the midst of it, you learn something about yourself which you didn't realize before.

That's the situation in *Rain in the Morning*, an unusual and gripping play by two American writers, Paula Fox and Marjorie Kellogg, which CBC-TV's *Playdate* will present on Thursday night, December 27. Production is by Melwyn Breen. Aileen Seaton and Jonathan White have the leading roles. Others in the cast are Robert Goodier, Barbara Hamilton, James Edmonds and Lloyd Chester.

2:00 p.m.—MET. OPERA

Der Rosenkavaller (The Knight of the Rose). Opera in three acts by Richard Strauss.

Cast: Soprano Regine Crespin as Princess von Werdenberg; bass Otto Edelman as Baron von Lerchenau; mezzo-soprano Hertha Topper as Octavian; and soprano Anneliese Rothenberger as Sophie. Conducted by Lorin Maazel. Place, Vienna. Time, the 18th Century.

Act. I. The bedroom of the Princess von Werdenberg. Her husband is absent and she is entertaining Octavian, a youth of 17. Baron von Lerchenau is announced.

The youth hides behind a screen and dresses himself as a chambermaid. He emerges demurely to the great appreciation of the Baron, who makes open advances to the supposed maid. The Baron wishes to have someone take a silver rose, his betrothal token, to young Sophie von Faninal, the daughter of an army sutler who has recently been made a noble. The Princess thinks of Octavian and assures the baron of its safe delivery.

The Baron leaves the box containing the silver rose and departs. Octavian resumes his proper attire and the Princess tells him how unhappy she is with her marriage. He assures her of his undying affection but she is cynical and the youth leaves in a huff.

Act. II. The House of Herr von Faninal. Faninal and Sophie await the coming of the messenger with the silver rose. Octavian is preceded by a flourish of trumpets and a company of footmen. He sings of the silver rose which he gracefully presents to Sophie. The Baron bustles in and embraces Sophie, to Octavian's dismay, and breaks into a waltz song of boastful, amorous character. The two scandal-mongers, Annina and Valzacchi, suspect there is something between Octavian and Sophie and inform the Baron. A quarrel ensues and the Baron is pricked in the arm by a sword thrust from Octavian. Octavian departs and the Baron soothes his wounded feelings in wine. Annina brings him a letter from the Princess' supposed chambermaid (Octavian) saying she will meet him the following night.

Act. III. A questionable hotel. Supper for two is laid on the table decorated with candles. The scandal-mongers' plan is to station spies everywhere so that everything the Baron says or does can be heard and seen.

The Baron and Octavian, dressed as the maid, enter. When the Baron tries to embrace his companion a head appears from a trap door in the floor. The Baron is mystified by this and also by the fact that the maid seems to resemble someone.

Annina appears protesting that she is a deserted wife and points to four children who crowd around the Baron calling him "papa." The Baron calls the police and is himself detained by the police commissar, who asks him to explain his presence in such a place with a young woman. Faninal enters in time to hear an uncomplimentary remark made by the exasperated Baron.

When the Princess appears, the Baron declares he has done nothing to prevent his marriage with Sophie. Suddenly, he comprehends the affair of the Princess with Octavian and identifies the rose bearer as the maid he has been courting. He hurries away, thoroughly humiliated. The Princess, resigned to the loss of Octavian, induces Faninal to give his blessing to the young pair and all depart, the two lovers last.

The Singing Boys of Mexico

SOME 7,000 FEET UP in the verdant Sierra Tarasca mountains, just over 200 miles west of Mexico City, stands the old Spanish colonial city of Morelia, a living museum of pink stone. Its gracious palaces and monasteries, and gorgeous baroque churches, with their coloured tiles, carved altars, rich vestments and fluttering, polychrome angels, look down on one of the most beautiful provinces in Mexico, Mochoaca, with its small, secret cities hidden in the mountain folds. Its poor but handsome, aristocratic people with their elegant manners retain the spirit of the once-great Tarascan Indian Empire, the only unconquered rival of the Aztecs.

One of the high domes in the pink city of Morelia rises from the oldest conservatory of music in the Americas, the College of Roses (*Colegio de las Rosas*), founded in 1743, the year Handel's *Messiah* was first performed in London, 13 years before Mozart was born, and 122 years before the first conservatory in the United States was established, at Oberlin, Ohio.

At the College 28 boys between the ages of eight and 13, most of them from impoverished homes, gather in the music room of the old cloister

and, looking like urchins in their poor clothes, sing like angels for several hours each day. They are the Singing Boys of Mexico (*Los Ninos Cantores de Morelia*), one of the most famous boys' choirs in the world, and an enthusiastic modern development from an old musical tradition.

They have made four tours of the United States, and this year visited Canada for the first time. While in Toronto late last month they recorded a program especially for CBC radio's *Project '63*. It will be heard Sunday, December 23, at 5:00 p.m. The boys will sing works by Kodaly, Bartok, and Carl Orff, as well as a selection of Mexican carols. Production is by Terence Gibbs.

Charles Flandreau, American travel author whose most famous book is *Viva Mexico!*, believed that "all children should be required to be Mexican until age 15." Certainly Mexican youngsters have a great artistic capacity, often away beyond their years, and a wonderfully responsive musical spirit. Hundreds of boys have studied and sung at Morelia for over 200 years, but their talents were not widely known outside Mexico until about 13 years ago, when Maestro Bernal Jiménez determined to organize a special choir and train it to compete with the best in the world.

He prevailed upon Maestro Romano Picutti, then leader of the Vienna Boys Choir, to go to Morelia to recruit and coach the boys. Rapidly an outstanding ensemble was developed, and it has been praised highly everywhere it has performed.

Historic RCMP Chapel Scene of Xmas Service

ON CHRISTMAS DAY at 5:35 p.m., CBC Radio will present a broadcast of the Christmas church parade and service recorded December 16th at the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Training Division Headquarters in Regina.

The service, for members and wives of the training establishment, is the last church parade before Christmas.

The parade and inspection preceding the church service will be outdoors if weather permits. On parade will be officers, non-commissioned officers and recruits from the training division. The Regina area trumpet and drum band will be present under the command of Corporal W. Perry. The inspection will be taken by Assistant Commissioner E. H. Perlson. Prior to the church service broadcast, will be a short description of this event.

After the parade and inspection, a service will be held in the historic chapel situated off the main parade ground at the barracks. The service will be conducted by the Right Reverend G. F. C. Jackson, Anglican Chaplain to the force and Bishop of the Qu'Appelle Diocese. Lessons will be read by Assistant Commissioner Perlson and by Superintendent H. C. Forbes, Officer Commanding, Depot (Training) Division.

Music by the RCMP choir will be included in the broadcast, under the direction of Sergeant G. L. Skafffeld. Church organist will be Constable D. Simpson.

Regina became headquarters of the RCMP in 1883, when the city was chosen provisional capitol of the Northwest Territories. The tiny RCMP chapel, where the service will take place, is the only original

building left in the training area. It was constructed in 1883 as a canteen, but Mrs. Mary Herchmer, wife of the Commissioner, felt deeply the need for a place of worship for the men and their families who lived in the small community. Consequently, in 1885 members of the force completed the work of changing the building into a chapel, and thus it stands today.

The interior of the chapel is replete with tradition. At the end wall of the chancel are two life-sized figures of uniformed mounties in stained glass windows. One window displays an armed mountie in an attitude of mourning, the other a trumpeter sounding reveille—symbolic of the last awakening.

These stained glass windows were a gift of the Maritime Provinces Association in 1944. They are dedicated to men of Maritime birth who died in service of the force. The windows are exceedingly realistic. Every detail is clear and in life size. The colours—the authentic scarlet, blue and gold of the force—stand out brilliantly.

There are two other memorial windows on each side of the nave. These are dedicated to men of the force who gave their lives in the Second World War. Other memorials to ex-Commissioners, to men who died in Northern service, and a few individual commemoratives are engraved in brass and bronze plaques which attractively line the dark oak walls. One such plaque reads, "To the memory of the men of the Dawson Patrol who lost their lives in the discharge of their duty on patrol from Fort McPherson to Dawson City, Yukon Territories, 1911."

There have been many distinguished visitors to this chapel. Among these, King George and Queen Elizabeth on their 1939 tour, and the present Queen Elizabeth in 1951 with the Duke of Edinburgh. Certainly they must have found, as thousands of visitors to the chapel each year do, a profound impression of quiet dignity and tradition in this little church on the prairie.



A CHILD'S CHRISTMAS IN WALES

They made their headquarters in the little village of Dolwyddelan in the Snowdon mountain district, where they waited for snow to fall and turn the countryside into a Christmas card scene. But no snow fell. Days became weeks, and the villagers, who had become intrigued with the project, joined the Lichtner family in praying for snow. Meanwhile, Lichtner went about with his camera, talking to men, women and children in the streets and in their homes, and they were delighted to co-operate fully as models. He shot hundreds of stills of interiors, and views of local Christmas customs in and around the schools, homes and chapels. And he waited and prayed for snow.

Finally, three days before Christmas, the skies opened and a great fluffy white mantle descended and blanketed the village and surrounding hills, softening the harsh outlines of stone cottage and wall, providing a glistening backdrop for the festive scenes described in Thomas' story, and intoxicating the children with its possibilities for frolicking and snowballing. Lichtner made over 3,000 still photos and finished the project in the fifth week.

He returned to New York to work on the processing. It took several months to shoot the final

film (using the animation, or "moving still" technique), spacing the Caedmon-recorded voice-track with the pictures and arranging to have background music composed and recorded. Approximately 350 of the stills Lichtner took were used in the film. When he started to look around for a composer, he asked his friend, Don Heckman, jazz composer and critic, to help him find the right man for the job. To illustrate exactly what he wanted, he lent Heckman recordings of harp music he had brought back from Wales, and talked expansively about the mood the piece should have, and the type of instrumentation which he felt would best help to interpret it. Later, when Lichtner enquired if Heckman had managed to locate someone who had the qualities they wanted, and who would be interested in the on-spec. project, Heckman said he wanted to write the music himself.

The result of all those months of work is a delightfully moving and nostalgic half-hour program which CBC-TV's *The Lively Arts* will present on Christmas night, December 25. Vincent Tovell, who organizes and produces the series, says the film "has a charming, magic quality which should appeal to the whole family. Although it is about a Welsh village it has a universality which could be applied to families anywhere at Christmas."

'Red River Christmas'

Has Historic Fort as Setting

LOVE TRANSCENDS TIME to overcome the loneliness of a young man at Christmas, in the original musical, *Red River Christmas*, scheduled for the afternoon of December 25 on CBC-TV. Story, words and music for the 30-minute CBC Winnipeg production have been written by Marian Waldman, with additional music by Eric Wild.

Doug Crosley stars as a melancholy youth alone on Christmas Eve, wandering about the grounds of Lower Fort Garry, an authentic early 19th century settlement still standing near Winnipeg. To his surprise, he encounters lovely Mary Nowell, her family and friends, preparing a Christmas Eve party. Doug joins in the celebration and enjoys it, although mysterious circumstances surround it that he does not understand.

Other members of the family are Rolande Garnier, the mother; Florence Faiers, a sister, and Cecil Semchysyn, a cousin. The 17-piece orchestra is under the baton of Eric Wild.

Doug Crosley is rapidly developing into one of Canada's top young TV performers, following chorus work with the Gino Silvi Singers, guest spots on many network series, including the *Hit Parade*, and more recently, *Juliette* and his own *Swingalong* show.

Mary Nowell, whose real name so well suits the lead in a Christmas musical, was a frequent soloist this summer with the *Swingalong* chorus.

Rolande Garnier is a frequent contributor to French and English network musical programs and has played several leading roles at Winnipeg's Summer Theatre.

Petite Florence Faiers has been singing ever since she learned to talk. She studied at the Royal Academy of Music in London, England, from 1954 to 1958, before returning to Winnipeg. Since that time she has appeared in a

wide range of CBC Winnipeg radio and television series, the most recent of which was *Swingalong*.

Cecil Semchysyn is another member of the *Swingalong* chorus, whose musical history includes work with Toronto's Carl Tapscott Singers and the leading role of Emile DuBecque, the planter, in a Winnipeg production of *South Pacific*.

Marian Waldman, who has composed nine varied selections for *Red River Christmas*, is well-known in Winnipeg as a radio actress and playwright. Among a long list of writing credits are the TV series, *Dancing Storybook*, and the radio serial, *Kapitan's Fortune*. This is Miss Waldman's first television venture into the songwriting field.

Eric Wild's musical career has been both long and distinguished. He has arranged and conducted for radio, television, the Navy Show during the war years, and Winnipeg's outdoor Rainbow Stage. He has composed music for many



radio dramas, and his original ballet, *The Shooting of Dan McGrew*, is now in the permanent repertoire of the Royal Winnipeg Ballet and has been filmed by the National Film Board.

Producer Neil Andrews has accepted the challenge of an original Prairie musical with tremendous enthusiasm. "In the entertainment world, there's nothing quite so gratifying as helping to create something absolutely new," says Neil of his Christmas production.
