The Late News

• I wish to protest against the moving of the CBC-TV News to a later hour (on CBWT). There are hundreds of people who will not want to stay up till 11:00 p.m.

• I think it is a great pity you are making such drastic changes in the times of all programs, especially the news at 11:00 p.m. I am speaking on behalf of quite a number of business people. As a rule I sit and listen to the news and go to bed afterwards, as 6:00 a.m. comes early. . . . I hope different arrangements can be made.

With this recent change in the schedule, Manitoba residents now see CBC Television programs at the same hour on the clock as they are seen across the rest of Canada. Although later newscasts may be a disadvantage of this change to many viewers, there will be advantages as well. For instance, children's programs no longer will be telecast while the children are in school, and programs designed for adult viewing no longer will be seen at an hour when children are apt to be watching.

Miss Hervey, who began her professional singing career only three years ago, has been seen frequently on the CBC-TV network, as a guest on *Country Hoedown*, *The Tommy Ambrose Show*, *Front and Centre* and *Parade*.

Background country music is provided by Lloyd Cooper and the *Country Hoedown* orchestra. Fiddlers Al Cherney and Wally Traugott are also featured on the show.

A NEW SERIES of adaptations of European short stories starts Wednesday, October 9, on CBC Radio's *Theatre of the Air*. Produced at CBC Winnipeg by Gus Kristjanson, the plays will be heard each Wednesday at 3:30 p.m. Starting the series is Norman Bortnick's adaptation of *Dermuche*, a story by Marcel Ayme.

TALENTED YOUNG performers are featured each Thursday afternoon, starting October 3, when *Music Hop* makes its debut on the CBC Television network.

The half-hour variety program provides a showcase for established and aspiring folksingers, pop vocalists, rhythm and blues singers, and rock 'n' roll performers.

Host for *Music Hop* is Alex Trebek, a 23-year-old announcer from CBC Ottawa. Trebek, a native of Sudbury, moved to Ottawa seven years ago. After graduating from university in May, he was hired for the summer as a CBC announcer, but has since been taken on permanent staff.

Music for the show is provided by Norm Amadio and his Rhythm Rockers, a group consisting of Amadio on piano and organ, Don Thompson on tenor sax, Alex Lazaroff on drums, Red Shea on guitar, and Johnny Stockfish on bass.

Music Hop is produced by Stan Jacobson.

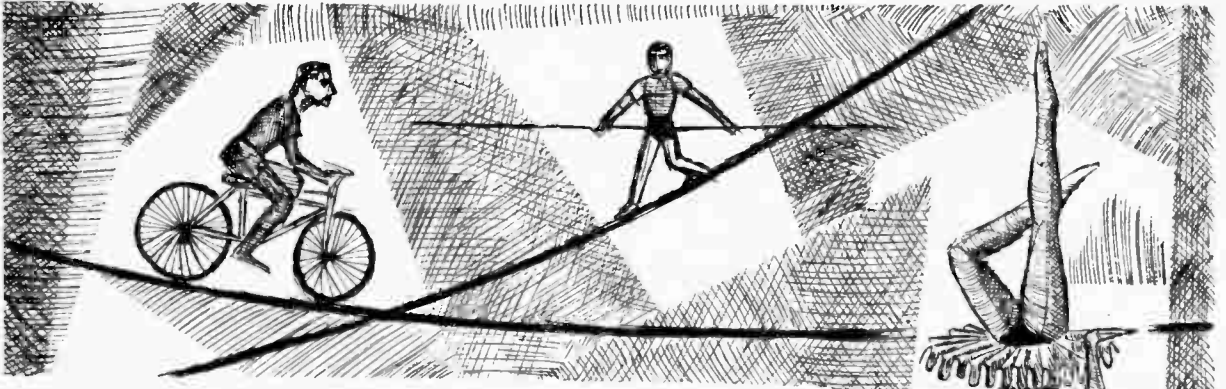

Defying DEATH is Their LIFE

The Flying Wallendas—those who are left—
are observed by TELESCOPE Friday, October 11

TRAGEDY HAS BEEN haunting the feats of the celebrated Flying Wallendas, the proud, clannish, German trapeze artists who have been in the circus business for 90 years. Within 16 months, three members of the troupe were killed in falls from the high wire; a fourth was crippled for life. Fire and earthquake have also threatened them. But the survivors' will to perform is stronger than their will to live. They refuse to give up on the act. And they won't use a net unless state regulations insist.

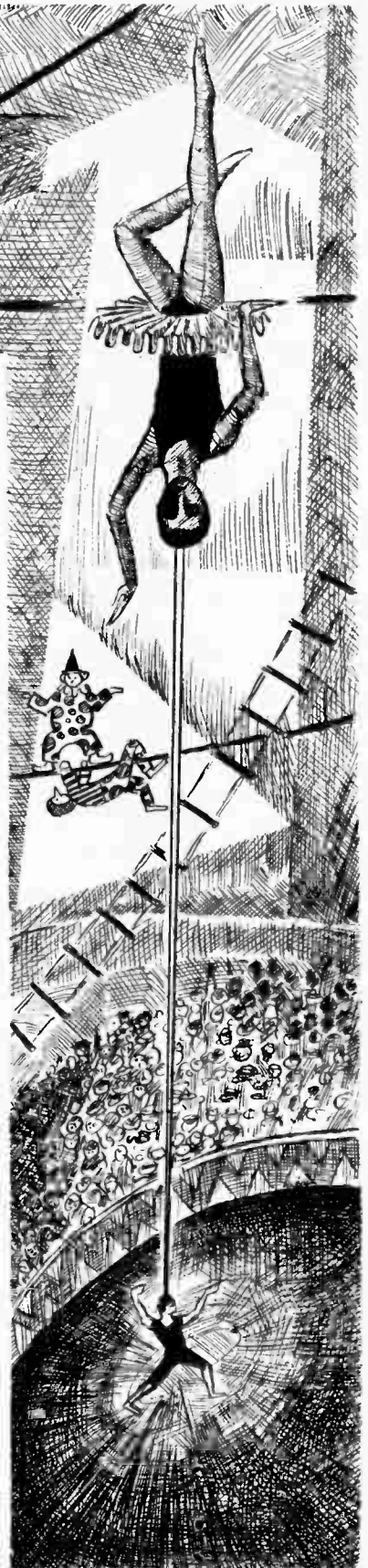
Friday night, October 11, CBC-TV's *Telescope* chronicles the Wallendas' day-to-day flirtation with death in a program filmed while they were making an appearance at *The Enchanted Village* in the Adirondacks. Directed by Jack Zolov, it reveals why this courageous and perhaps foolhardy circus family is so determined to carry on its tradition in the face of personal tragedy grim enough to mean immediate retirement to less dedicated artists.

The cameras observe them in rehearsal and actual performance. Particularly dramatic is the moment when yet another Wallenda takes to the high wire for the first time, the youngest child ever to do so—12-year-old Tino, whose mother, Jenny Wallenda, refuses to have anything to do with his debut in spite of her father's insistence that he go up. During the film viewers will meet Gunther, Jenny, Karl, Herman, Tino, and see the famous three-decker, seven-man pyramid act which brought death and crippling to three members of the troupe when a slip by a novice toppled the works.

Grandfather Wallenda was an animal trainer in Magdeburg, Germany. His daughter, Kunigunde, continued the circus tradition by becoming an acrobat, and her son Karl was attracted to the highwire. He invented a three-man bicycle pyramid, and the act was soon known all over Europe. After the Flying Wallendas visited the U.S. in 1928 they became one of the most celebrated circus families in the world. Many ambitious young aerialists joined them. Some married into the act.

Karl has always been the leader, giving his pyramid of death-defying artists the encouragement they need for nerveless manoeuvring. Four aerialists walk the high wire balancing two men above, while these two balance a girl standing higher still on a chair. Their balancing poles, 23 feet long, made of hollow steel with solid ends, weigh almost 40 pounds, and must be held tightly in the upturned palms at waist-height. Karl's position has been at the front on the second level. He has insisted that the circus bands play softly so his fellow

A Glimpse of London

With the Most Glamorous Tourist Guide:

ELIZABETH TAYLOR



"WHEN A MAN is tired of London," wrote Dr. Johnson to Boswell in 1777, "he is tired of life, for there is in London all that life can afford."

Life does afford a great deal in the English capital, but many North Americans cannot afford the life in London. For them, and for all others who prefer to do their travelling vicariously in a comfortable armchair, CBC Television this week presents a special program. Entitled *Elizabeth Taylor in London*, the program presents an hour-long glimpse—for a glimpse is all that can be gained of this fascinating city in so short a time—of the metropolis, its busy streets, shops, historic and beautiful buildings, parks, pubs, markets and clubs, with one of the world's most glamorous movie stars as a guide. Produced by NBC, the show will be seen on CBC-TV on Sunday, October 6.

Miss Taylor falls into the role of London guide more naturally than one might imagine, for, despite the fact that she has spent most of her life in Hollywood—with some notable extended visits to the North African deserts—she is a native-born Londoner. On the program she tells how she has lately rediscovered and fallen in love with the city of her birth.

There is, indeed, much to fall in love with; but the affair must last a little time to be appreciated. Unlike, for instance, New York, which strikes one immediately with its physical personality, London takes longer to savour. It has perhaps a more subtle but nonetheless individual flavour. It doesn't leap out at you.

Some travellers even have difficulty in *finding* London, or at least the London they expect to find. One American visitor, driving into the city through miles of suburbs from the airport, patiently waited for "the city" (not, however, The City) to appear. Finally, in exasperation, she turned to her companion and asked when they would finish passing through the low-rise suburban buildings and come to the main downtown area. At the moment the question was asked, they were passing through Piccadilly Circus, often thought of as the very heart of London. In point of fact, there is no real "centre" of London, only a number of spots chosen arbitrarily by the individual as the main points of interest. For some, Westminster Abbey may be the centre of the city Commonwealth and others may give that distinction to Trafalgar Square, the Tower, Piccadilly, Buckingham Palace, The City (centre, certainly, of the business world), Covent Garden, or even the Billingsgate fish market. The choice of the city's focal point is up to the individual. London herself doesn't seem to care.

Quest: Another Play by George Ryga — TWO SOLDIERS

WHEN HE WAS commenting on the current season of CBC-TV's *Quest*, which began last week, Daryl Duke, executive producer of that series, pointed out: "We are now moving in the direction of some strong original Canadian dramas. Within the framework of the series, the environment is right for Canadian plays to be seen. Nobody is 'making allowances' for Canadian scripts, and that's the way it should be."

The play to be seen on this week's edition of *Quest* (Tuesday, October 8) is a case in point. It is an original drama by a Canadian author; in fact, it is only the second play by this particular writer, George Ryga. His first TV drama, *Indian*, was presented on *Quest* last season.

Ryga was born north of Athabasca, Alta., 30 years ago, attended grade school and took high school subjects by mail. In 1949 and 1950 he won IODE scholarships to the Banff School of Fine Arts to study the craft of writing plays and short stories. He has written six novels, one of which — *Hungry Hills* — was recently published. In addition he has done many stories and documentaries for CBC Radio series. Married, with three children, Ryga now makes his home in West Summerland, B.C.

Ryga's new play, entitled *Two Soldiers*, is a character and mood piece about two members of Canada's peacetime army on their way homewards on leave. Both are from the same town, and they are chums, but nevertheless they represent vastly different personalities. Playing the roles of the soldiers, the only characters in the half-hour play, are John Vernon and Jonathon White.

The production is unique in CBC-TV dramas, in that it is the first to be videotaped entirely on location. The taping was done in mid-August near Kleinburg, Ont. Production was by George McCowan, who was also responsible for Ryga's first *Quest* play.

DEFYING DEATH

acrobats can hear his quietly-spoken orders. If he hears one of them panting or showing signs of jitters, he warns the rest to slow down until all are at ease again. In the high tension on the high wire the tiniest error or fault could mean death for all seven.

The night of the fatal fall, January, 1962, in Detroit, the pyramid moved along the wire, led by Dieter, who was trained by Karl but was still a novice at the big pyramid. About half way through the act Karl noticed that something was wrong. Dieter wasn't steady, was talking to himself. About five or 10 feet from the safety platform Karl saw that Dieter's pole wasn't right. Then he heard Dieter cry: "I can't hold any longer!" as his fingers uncurled and the pole began to drop. In a frantic effort to renew his hold, a quick movement unbalanced him, he toppled, and the pyramid disintegrated.

Karl remembers worrying about

his 17-year-old niece, Jana, Dieter's sister, and the only female member of the pyramid, who was at the top and had no chance. Then, as he fell, his foot caught and twisted painfully in a guy wire, and at the same moment Jana fell on top of him, grabbing and nearly crushing him. As they clung together the double weight seemed to be tearing his leg off. Screaming with pain he managed to tell Jana that he would not let her go, "even if I leave my leg up here." When it seemed as if he couldn't stand weight or pain any longer, his nephew, Gunther, reached him and helped hold Jana. A net was arranged hastily below by clowns and circus hands, and when it was ready Karl said: "Jana, we are going to drop you to the mat." She screamed "No! No!" and clung frantically to the men, but Karl insisted that she drop, and he and Gunther timed their release together so she would land properly. She wasn't badly injured. Karl and Gunther made their way to the platform hand over hand, while Herman walked the wire.

Karl woke up in hospital to learn that his son-in-law, Richard Faughan, and Dieter were dead, that his son Mario might not live, and that his elder brother, Herman (in his early 60s) and Gunther had gone back on the high wire. Mario survived, but his circus days are over, for he is badly crippled. Jana has abandoned circus life forever.

Death paid the Flying Wallendas another visit during a performance in Omaha last April, when 42-year-old Yetta Wallenda plunged 50 feet to her death after doing a headstand on the top of a swaying fiberglass pole. Her colleagues recalled that she had been growing increasingly nervous during the days before her accident. Her act had been billed as "Skirting the Borderline of Eternity."

The Wallendas continue to skirt the borderline of Eternity without a net in a new act even more dangerous than the one that caused the Detroit accident—a pyramid on bicycles. If anything goes wrong in this stunt, none of the performers has a chance of grabbing the wire.

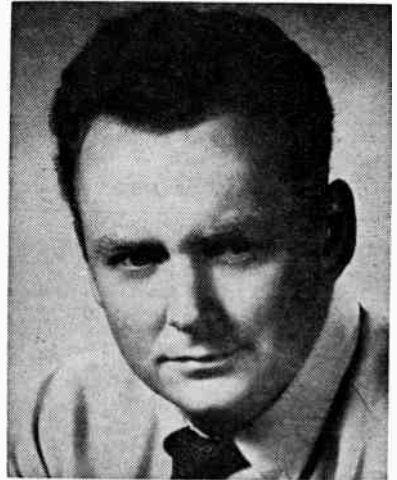

Anouilh's Re-Telling of the Greek Tragedy **ANTIGONE**

WHILE THE GERMANS were occupying Paris during the Second World War, Nazis and loyal Frenchmen rubbed elbows in a bare, cold little theatre for hundreds of performances of a play which cunningly attacked dictatorship and encouraged the French patriots. For some reason the Germans who saw the play did nothing to suppress it, even though some of them must have seen the close parallel between the situation in Paris and the play's witty study of characters forced into tragedy by circumstances.

The play was *Antigone*, Jean Anouilh's brilliant re-telling of the Sophocles legend. Since then the lively, colloquial English translation by Lewis Gallantieri has delighted many audiences who never

knew the grimness of the Occupation, but who see much to identify with in Anouilh's treatment of the conflict between the innocent and the cynic, between morality and expediency.

CBC-TV's *Festival* offers a 90-minute production of *Antigone*, produced by Paul Almond, on Wednesday night, October 9. The production is a blending of old and new. The staging is leanly stark, the cast is in dress of no particular period, performance is in the Greek style.

Montreal actress Suzanne Grossman plays the title role. She has been studying for the past three years at the National Theatre School. Budd Knapp appears as

companies him on a weekend of study and meditation at Elgin House. During the visit, the hot-shot salesman's hypocritical attitude undergoes a vast change, and he emerges with a new outlook on life and a reconstructed sense of values.

The program of October 13 is a documentary, *The Flying Angel*, about the work of Anglican missions to seamen, in which Canon Guy Marshall is shown performing his lonely duties on the Canadian West Coast. Other programs in the series will deal with the work of women in the Church, life in an

enclosed Roman Catholic convent, the challenges presented to a university chaplain, the help given by the Presbyterian Church to unmarried mothers, and the theological attitudes towards man's race into space.

Also included will be programs in which actor Leo Ciceri will give readings from the Old Testament on the life of King David, films about Confirmation in the Lutheran Church, the coming of Christianity to the Canadian West, life and beliefs in a Mennonite community, and a program in which Psalms are sung in settings ranging from Hebrew chants to modern jazz. The repeat series will conclude with a special Christmas program on December 29.

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 5 is one of those days when the television sports fan can stock up on his favourite beverage and foodstuff, park his or her frame in a favourite easy chair in front of the television set and be treated to a full day of top sports entertainment. That early October malady known as "World Series Fever" grips the populace on both sides of the 49th, and television coverage on the CBC network of the fall classic, kicks off the day's bill of fare. Los Angeles and New York hook up in game number three of the best-of-seven affair in Chavez Ravine in Los Angeles. The fourth game will be played Sunday afternoon and unless one team sweeps four straight, game number five takes place on Monday.

By the time this reaches print, two World Series games will have been played and I personally think both games will have been featured by outstanding pitching by both

clubs. Some will argue that the Dodgers with Koufax, Drysdale, Podres and Perranoski are stronger on the mound. But the Yanks have Whitey Ford, the best blue-chip pitcher in baseball, Jim Bouton and Al Downing. And this year Ralph Terry, the pitching hero for the Yanks last term, isn't even included in Ralph Houk's pitching rotation for the series. Terry's only opportunity to repeat his heroics will be as a reliever. So on the mound I think the two clubs are just about even.

Defensively, give the Yanks the edge. And in batting power, the "Broux Bombers" should have a definite advantage. Thus my crystal gazing, which has been wrong before I might add, sees the Yanks winning in five games.

For television viewers in the Winnipeg area, Bob Moir and the general manager of the Winnipeg Goldeyes, Terry Hind, will discuss the upcoming series game on "World Series Warm-up" on CBWT the night prior to each game.

National Hockey League coverage makes its television debut for 1963-64 Saturday night when CBC cameras bring viewers the NHL All-Star game from Toronto. This year the All-Stars, coached by Sid Abel of Detroit, will oppose the

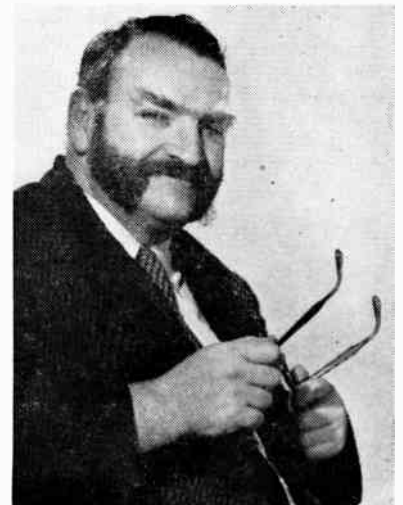

her uncle, King Creon, the disillusioned ruler of Thebes.

Anouilh transformed the Greek device of a Chorus which comments on the action into an actor in casual attire who buttonholes the audience to make sure they won't miss a trick, and sets the mood and character of the production with detachment. Douglas Rain plays this role. Others in the cast are Sharon Acker as *Ismene*, Dino Narizzano as *Haemon*, John Vernon as *First Guard*, Lynne Gorman as *The Nurse*, and George Sperdakos as *The Messenger*.

For more than 30 years Jean Anouilh has lived solely by writing for the theatre, occasionally for films and, like many other modern French dramatists, has turned to themes and scenes of Greek drama for inspiration. In his version of the tragedy which Sophocles wrote around 442 B.C., Anouilh has Antigone, daughter of dead King Oedipus of Thebes, representing the French point of view. The newly-crowned King Creon, who pretends to be a benevolent despot but who has restored order with a reign of terror, represents the Nazis. It is a bare-bones play, demanding concentration from its audience but exhilarating it from the first line.

However, as the Chorus points out immediately, the play has no surprises: "In a tragedy nothing is in doubt, and everyone's destiny is known. That makes for tranquility. . . . Well, here we are. . . . That dark-haired girl sitting by herself, staring straight ahead, seeing nothing, is Antigone. She is thinking she is going to die. Antigone is young. She would much rather live than die. But there is no help for it. When you are on the side of the gods against the tyrant, of Man against the State, of purity against corruption—when, in short, your name is Antigone, there is only one part you can play; and she will have to play hers through to the end. . . . The grey-haired man sitting lost in thought is Creon, the

King. His face is lined. He is tired. He practices the difficult art of a leader of men. . . . The fact is, he loves being King."

The story-line is direct and simple. Antigone's brother, Polynices, has been killed in civil war outside the walls of Thebes. His opponent, whom he fatally wounded, is to be buried with honour, but Creon has ordered that Polynices will be left unburied for dogs and vultures to maul, as an example to other rebels against state authority. The King has declared, also, that anyone who tries to bury the body will be put to death.

Antigone feels that to leave her brother unburied is "a hideous offence against God and Man," for "since time began men have recoiled with horror from the desecration of the dead." Taking her life in her hands, she defies Creon and buries her brother. This gives rise to a conflict in which Creon must decide whether to stick to his edict, or to let his conscience guide him into compromise for the sake of a passionately sincere girl who is willing to sacrifice herself for her faith. Skilled as the King is in diplomacy, he has quite forgotten the ends it should serve.

This play, like all Anouilh's dramatic work, points up man's everlasting struggle between optimism and pessimism. Why, asks Anouilh, are great men in politics often corrupt? Why does love so rarely last? Why does money often take the place of beauty, truth, affection? His reflections are often bitter, but seldom couched in grimaces and melancholy. Often it is the playfulness in his anguish which gives his emotional attack its sting and its theatrical excitement.

She Didn't Break Her Neck?

Beverly Garland at last has gotten through the filming of a TV show without disaster befalling her. She is seen Sunday, October 6 at 11:20 p.m. on CBWT's DESILU PLAYHOUSE

BLONDE Beverly Garland, one of the stars of *In Close Pursuit*, premiere drama of *Desilu Playhouse* seen Sunday, October 6 on CBWT, breathed a sigh of relief when filming was completed. It was one of the few times the accident-prone actress had come through a performance without the assistance of a doctor.

Her first television role was cancelled when the horse she was riding threw its head back and broke her nose. She took some riding lessons before she tried out for her next western, but they didn't do much good.

"I thought I was pretty good after a few lessons," Beverly said. "So when the cameras began to roll I decided to try a running mount. I ran up to the beast, grabbed the saddle horn, and leaped onto its back—but I leaped

too high, and I sailed right over and broke my leg."

In her next television appearance she managed to get the horse past the cameras, but dislocated her ankle when she stepped on a rock while dismounting.

Her next job was in a non-horse drama—but she fell while crossing a lawn and drove a stick from a picket fence through her leg.

While appearing as an alcoholic on an early episode of the *Dr. Kildare* series, she was called on to slash her wrists in a suicide attempt.

"I guess I got carried away," she confessed later. "When the scene was finished, and the make-up men removed the chocolate from my wrists, there was real blood underneath, and we had to call in a real doctor."

In *Close Pursuit*, Beverly finished without so much as a hangnail.

Aldeburgh's Nice But It Can't Beat India

UNDER THE imaginative touch of 30-year-old Julian Bream the guitar has a sweet, underplayed sonority never hinted at by lonesome cowboys, as CBC Radio listeners will hear on CBC Wednesday night, October 9, in a concert featuring Bream and the Carmirelli Quartet, recorded at the 16th Aldeburgh Festival last June.

It will be preceded by an interview with Bream, who is also a lutenist and a jazz musician (he used to play piano in his grandmother's pub in London's Battersea district). He's devoted to Elizabethan music, some of which he and the Julian Bream Consort play in a new RCA Victor album called *An Evening of Elizabethan Music*.

Charming and sophisticated as Aldeburgh is in its treatment of guest artists, it hasn't yet cottoned to

some "niceties" which Bream encountered on his first Far Eastern tour earlier this year. Before a performance in a "dry" town in India in which there had never been a consort of either Eastern or Western music, he was handed a newspaper-wrapped parcel containing a big bottle of Scotch which, apparently, he was expected to consume before playing. (He says he restrained himself admirably.) At the hall he had a job getting them to turn off the rock 'n' roll music piped in to keep the audience happy while waiting, but once he began to play they were spellbound. Afterwards he was handed a huge heap of bills—the *whole* box-office take!

CBC Wednesday Night also includes a concert by the Alarius Ensemble of Brussels, which was featured widely in the 1962-63 season of Les Jeunesses Musicales of Canada. Its members, Charles McGuire, flutist, Janine Rubinlicht, violist, Wieland Kuyken, viola da gamba, and Robert Kohnen, harpsichordist, joined forces in 1958 to study and perform the French chamber music repertoire of the 17th and 18th centuries.

GLYNIS, a new half-hour comedy-mystery series, spiced with the talents of stars Glynis Johns and Keith Andes, was to start over GBWT Winnipeg Tuesday, October 1 at 7:00 p.m., and on CBXT Saturday, October 5, at 8:00 p.m.

Glynis isn't the run-of-the-mill mystery series. There are thrills and chills, but they're combined with bright comedy. There's also a warm yet laugh-filled relationship between Glynis and her spouse, Keith, who is perhaps the most harried husband on record in television.

Probably the most intriguing thing about *Glynis* are its two stars. According to executive producer Jess Oppenheimer, Miss Johns is certain to endear herself

to viewers, and they'll be on the edge of their seats waiting to see what she'll come up with next.

Carrying the role of a mystery writer married to an attorney, Glynis has a rare opportunity to provide tension and suspense combined with many comic situations. 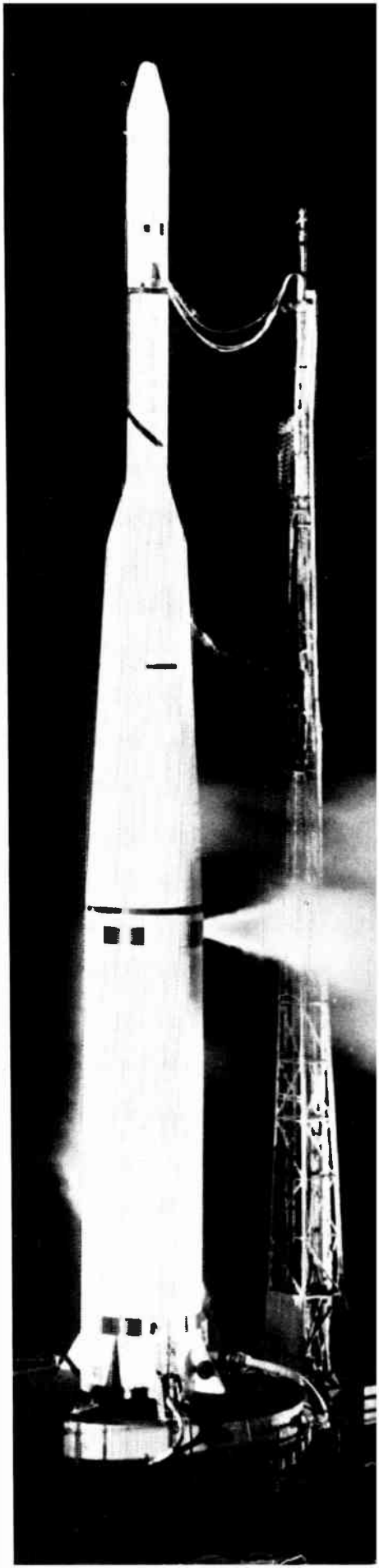
