

In other words a TV license is the grant of a monopoly. • I should be grateful if you would convey to the management of the CBC network my appreciation of their efforts to bring to the public of Canada full reports of the tragic assassination of President Kennedy.

To be invited on such a sad and moving occasion to watch groups of Canadian political observers performing in circus fashion was an insult. Surely such grandstanding could have been left for a later date. The tone

set by the American networks in this regard was beyond reproach. It is unfortunate that in the network's haste to prove its ability to mount rapidly a news program, it did not observe the good taste which the event demanded and which both NBC and CBS recognized.

I was astounded at the lack of maturity revealed (November 24) by both Canadian networks as they performed in the traditions of a Chicago newspaper. I am writing a similar letter to CFRN-TV.


# 1963 As It Might Have Been

CBC-TV's *Take Thirty* spins out the year on a hilarious note Tuesday, December 31, at 3:00 p.m., with four satirical sketches in which Max Ferguson looks back at things that supposedly happened in '63. Production is by Denny Spence, who has drawn out the best of the unique Ferguson talent on numerous occasions in Halifax and Toronto originations.

Max investigates what might have occurred on Queen Elizabeth's return to London from a summer holiday if a couple of Labrador retrievers in the car with her had been mistaken for the Royal children.

He takes a look at the confusion that could have erupted if commands had been grossly misinterpreted as a NATO naval commander and crew landed in Halifax.

Max shows what the reactions on both sides might have been if the Hon. John Diefenbaker had used Ferguson tactics in mediating with the Arabs on the Gaza Strip. The final sketch concerns a lonely little American guarding a panic button that could trigger nuclear war.

ONCE AGAIN, listeners from coast to coast in Canada, from the far reaches of the Northwest Territories and Canadian Arctic, and also those Canadians abroad who have access to the CBC's short wave transmitters around the world will be able to relive the most exciting moments from the past year's top sports events in the half-hour feature presentation, *Year-End Sports Review*, at 8:00 p.m., New Year's Day on CBC Radio.

This will be edition number six of this annual radio highlight, which has become a "must" for sports fans in all parts of Canada. Highlights from such important and dramatic events as the Grey Cup, World Hockey Championships, Canadian Curling Championships, the Stanley Cup, Heavyweight Championship Fights, World Series, and many, many more top-notch sporting features will be highlighted, with well-known CBC sports commentator, Bob Moir providing the linking commentary.

In preparation for this annual radio feature, miles upon miles of tape recordings are checked, edited, dubbed and re-checked, until the final product is ready—a half-hour of fast-moving action and heart-stopping moments that are the distillation of a full year of sports activities from across Canada, and around the world. In all, listeners will hear 37 different climactic excerpts, taken from untold numbers of broadcasts and telecasts, that, at the time, had listeners and viewers sitting on the edges of their chairs. For armchair quarterbacks, and for the ordinary person whose interest in sport may be confined to the knowledge of who won the Grey Cup, it promises to be a highlight of the New Year listening schedule.

The program is produced in Winnipeg, with narration by Bob Moir, production by Ron Hunka and technical operation by Jack Eveleigh.

# The Vogue of the Virtuoso



An amusing yet penetrating account of the emergence of the virtuoso is heard Sunday, December 29 at 8:05 p.m. on CBC Radio

"THEY SAY HE sold his soul to the Devil! And he spent some years in jail. That's where he got all the time to practice his fiddle tricks. I heard that he murdered his girlfriend and used her guts for one of his violin strings. Maybe one of those very strings he'll play tonight! Oooh! How deliciously disgusting! I can hardly wait."

Paris, 1831, and the great Paganini was making his first appearance there in an inflamed aura of superstitious acclaim that sounds almost unbelievable in connection with a serious artist today. But the 19th-century virtuoso was a special breed, a sort of elegant Elvis Presley, a phenomenon that came and went like Hailey's comet and left a trail of wild anecdotes and fan-

tastic legends, but which established the solo artist as a money-making concern — albeit more exotic, more gimmicky, more personality-built than he is now.

How and why the virtuoso emerged, how he held sway, and how he influenced the history of music, is revealed amusingly but with penetration in *The Vogue of the Virtuoso*, a two-hour radio feature to be heard on CBC Sunday Night, December 29, at 8:05 p.m. In preparation for many months, it was devised and organized by John Roberts and is produced by Keith MacMillan.

The script was written by the distinguished American pianist and musicologist Arthur Loesser, a leading authority on this aspect of

musical history, and brother of Frank Loesser, who wrote *Guys and Dolls*. Much of the material in the program is drawn from his best-selling book, *Men, Women, and Pianos*, and it is presented in an informative but essentially entertaining way, with many recorded illustrations, some made by Loesser himself, who, as a boy, met and played for many of the virtuosi of the "old school."

At two points in the program he takes listeners back to audiences of the 19th century with vivid vignettes performed by Toronto actors — Alan King, Ruth Springford, Ian Campbell, Sean Mulcahy, Ed McNamara, and Joseph Shaw. Narration is by Loesser, assisted by Lamont Tilden.

At regular intervals in the program some fascinating extracts are read from letters by such people as Franz Liszt, and from newspaper accounts of performances in Europe and North America, including a highly amusing one of the violinist Vieuxtemps taking Toronto by storm in 1858. And there are many other revealing tid-bits such as one about the legendary American virtuoso Gottschalk playing in St. Catharines, Ontario, around 1864, and an hilarious account of an Anton Rubinstein concert in the United States which is immortalized in a contemporary "poem" called *How Ruby Played*.

# John Howard Griffin's

## *Grim Masquerade*

*His face darkened with dye, this noted novelist learned first-hand what the Negro faces in the U.S. South. He is interviewed Thursday on CBC Radio.*

"IT WAS LIKE climbing a mountain of yesses and grinning, grinning, grinning. It was like the racism in Germany before the Second World War. No one asked my name. They just called me boy or uncle." Texas novelist, historian, musicologist and lecturer John Howard Griffin made a personal experiment in 1959 when he undertook a most unusual assignment for the Negro magazine *Sepia* to find the hard way what it is like to be a Negro in the American South, possibly the only white man ever to do this.

With his head shaved and his skin darkened with drugs and dye, he posed as a Negro to collect statistics and facts about the rising suicide rate among Negroes for a Crime Prevention Bureau study. He began as a detached observer. After seven harrowing weeks of experiencing the worst of hate and bigotry among people hostile to his skin, through Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Louisiana, often walking miles in search of a glass of water, a lavatory, or someone who would cash a traveller's cheque,

taking constant precautions to keep out of trouble, he was so profoundly shocked by what he had seen, heard and experienced, that, after writing his report for *Sepia* and later expanding it into a book, *Black Like Me*, he began to spend his time mediating between Negroes and whites and touring the continent trying to rouse the white man's conscience about the indignities and cruelties suffered by the Negroes.

When he was in Canada recently, addressing students at the University of Windsor, Doris Dickson, CBC Radio's morning commentator in Windsor, recorded a long interview with him about his experiences. *Trans-Canada Matinee* presents it on radio Thursday, January 2, at 2:03 p.m. (2:33 p.m. on CBX).


Griffin is no sensationalist. He's a down-to-earth intellectual, a tall, hefty, happily married man with several children, whose recreations include working with livestock, swimming, reading French literature and cooking French style. And, like Negroes, he has known the heartbreak of isolation, of being "different." But the black world he knew was one of blindness.

The son of a Texas rancher who raised purebred cattle on 40 acres south of Fort Worth, Griffin was born in Dallas in June, 1920. His mother was a concert pianist, and music has been an important part of his life since he was very young. He concentrated on science at high school in Fort Worth, but before matriculating went to France, in 1936, and enrolled at the Lycée Descartes in Tours, graduating in 1938 with the intention of becoming a psychiatrist.

He began to study medicine with private tutors and acquired considerable practical experience in psychiatric techniques as assistant to the physician in charge of the mental asylum in Tours. Griffin found he was able to put his musical knowledge to good use, for musical therapy figured largely in the treatments used there. He studied music theory and composition with Robert Casadesus and Nadia Boulanger, and did some intensive research on Gregorian chant with the help of the organist in the Cathedral of Tours, with whom he collaborated in writing an interpretation of ornaments of music for 17th- and 18th-century keyboard instruments.

Griffin was still working in France when the Second World War broke out. He joined the French Défense Passive, and narrowly missed being captured by the Gestapo while helping evacuate German and Austrian refugees from Tours to the coastal areas. When the U.S. entered the war he joined the U.S. Army as a private, fought in the Pacific and Far East for over three years with the 13th Air

# The Year's News

## IN REVIEW

*CBC's correspondents from abroad come home for their annual assessment of the year's most important events*


THE YEAR'S END is traditionally the time for summing up and attempting to assess the events of the preceding 12 months. It is also the time when all of CBC's correspondents return from their posts around the world for meetings in Toronto. Taken together, these facts underlie three programs on radio and television this week.

The eight correspondents are Norman DePoe, in Ottawa; Tom Gould, in New York, covering the United Nations; James M. Minifie and Knowlton Nash, in Washington; Michael Maclear, in Tokyo, covering the Far East; Morley Safer, in London; Stanley Burke, in Paris; and Phil Calder, in Bonn.

On Sunday, December 29, these men will take part in a special, hour-long edition of *CBC Newsmagazine*, to be seen on CBC-TV at 6:00 p.m. Each correspondent will review briefly some of the major news events of 1963, with particular emphasis on the changes that have taken place among the world's leaders. Members of an invited audience, representing a cross-section of Canadian opinion, will question the correspondents on national and international affairs. Host and moderator of the question period will be Knowlton Nash.

Tuesday, December 31, at 10:00 p.m., the eight will return for the regular edition of *CBC Newsmagazine*. Using films of news events with which they have been associated during the year, they will recall their personal reactions to the stories they covered.

The correspondents will also be heard on radio on Tuesday, New Year's Eve, in a special, hour-long *Year-End News Review*, at 8:20 p.m. (7:20 p.m. on CBX). On this program, recordings of actuality broadcasts and speeches by world leaders will be used to bring the year's news events vividly to mind.

# Would We Sink Without 'Santa'?

MINGLED WITH the happy carolling of Christmas songs and the cheerful chime of cash registers, an off-key note has been struck with increasing frequency around Christmastime in recent years. It's not the "Bah, Humbug!" of a latter-day Scrooge; in fact, it's very much the opposite. The note sounds discordant, perhaps, only because all the "Christmas" tunes — most of them secular — are themselves in the wrong key. The essence of the message that jars the festive air of the season is: Let's make Christmas a sacred festival once again—and take out all the commercialism.

It's a noble idea, and one that would probably win support from a great many people. But just what would happen if we *were* able to remove all the commercialized trappings, not only from Christmas but from the many other occasions throughout the year that are eagerly awaited by retailers?

While our individual pocketbooks may be depressingly flat after one of the many special occasions that come up with startling frequency, the impact on the national economy of any drastic reductions in luxury spending might be even worse. Holiday celebrating and gift-giving on a massive scale have seemingly become indispensable boosters to the economy. And perhaps it is more "Christian" to keep people employed in a commercialized Christmas than to cut out the buying of presents and thus deprive many people of their livelihoods.

The pros and cons of this topic will be discussed on this week's edition of *The Sixties*, to be seen Sunday, December 29, at 5:00 p.m., on the CBC Television network. Prepared by freelance writer Eileen Turcotte, the program will include comments by Canadian merchants, economists, and others who hold strong views on the subject.

## Festival

### A Play About Emptiness

A SENSITIVE STUDY of a romantic tragedy in a modern setting is the *Festival* offering on CBC-TV this week (Wednesday, January 1, 9:30 p.m.) The drama is Jack Pulman's *Still Life*, described as "a play about emptiness" by its producer, Eric Till. It stars U.S. actress Nancy Wickwire as Jane, an embittered night-club *chanteuse* in her late 30s, and British stage and film actor Michael Crawford as Barney, a brash young singer of 19 who is just on the verge of great success in the entertainment business.

Barney is cocky, naive, and proud of his sudden rise to popularity as a singer. His first meeting with Jane, in the night-club where they are both performing, gets the relationship off to a bad start. But Barney uses his rather clumsy charm to make amends. The inexperienced youth and the disillusioned woman fall in love, but it is a far cry from idyllic romance. Jane's devotion to the past, her obsession with memories and refusal to accept the present, result in moods that Barney cannot comprehend.

Despite the problems, the two manage to make a go of things for a time, as Jane responds to Barney's youthful zest for life. But eventually the haunting facts of Jane's past life begin to intrude, climaxing in shattering tragedy.

*Still Life* is almost, but not quite, a two-character drama. A third important role is played by Budd Knapp, as a sinister figure from Jane's past. Others in the cast are Frank Aldous as Charlie, a waiter, and Rex Sevenoaks as Bobby Pierce, a night-club owner.

This is the second drama by British playwright Pulman to be seen on *Festival*. The first, *A Book With Chapters in It*, was presented in October, 1962, and repeated last April in response to enthusiastic response from viewers.

# The Eye Opener Man Returns

TELESCOPE carries a profile of Bob Edwards, colourful newspaperman of the old West, Friday at 9:30 p.m.

"NEVER EXAGGERATE your faults; your friends will attend to that." That was one of the favourite sayings of Bob Edwards, frontier newspaper editor, humourist, humanitarian, drinking man, and a lot of other things.

In the 41 years since his death, Edwards has become almost a legendary figure. And were he alive to see how his fame has spread, he would no doubt have some wry, cynically humorous remark to cover the situation. That was his usual custom when, during the first two decades of this century, he edited The Calgary Eye Opener, one of the oddest newspapers ever published.

One peculiarity about the Eye Opener, for instance, was that it appeared irregularly. Though supposedly a weekly, it came out only when Edwards felt he had enough news to make it interesting, or wanted to get something off his chest. It was very much a personal journal, reflecting its editor's likes and dislikes, his beliefs and his character. So it was only natural that the paper died when Edwards died, in 1922, after a quarter-century of "semi-occasional" issues.

The career of Bob Edwards, one of the most colourful characters of Canada's early West, has been traced on a number of CBC programs in past years. A series of six half-hour plays was presented on radio in 1949, under the title *The Saga of Bob Edwards*. His ad- (Please turn to page 25)

Change of Scene: A public square before the palace of Don Giovanni. Elvira, one of the Don's victims, appears and Leporello attempts to console her by unrolling a list of Don Giovanni's amours. Elvira vows vengeance. When she has departed, a marriage procession with Masetto and Zerlina comes upon the scene. Don Giovanni arranges to be alone with Zerlina and immediately applies his seductive arts. Elvira interrupts them as Ottavio and Anna enter. She recognizes Don Giovanni as the murderer of her father and Ottavio determines to follow him.

Change of scene: All the guests of the peasant wedding have arrived. Don Giovanni leads Zerlina and Masetto to the ball chamber which has been gaily decorated, and Leporello also invites three maskers, not knowing that they are Elvira, Ottavio and Anna.

Change of scene: Ball room. Don Giovanni leads Zerlina away as Leporello engages Masetto's attention. Zerlina cries for help and escapes through the crowd.

**Act II.** Before Elvira's house. Don Giovanni exchanges cloak and hat with Leporello. Leporello is compelled to deliver a message to Elvira. Meanwhile, Don Giovanni, in Leporello's attire, serenades the maid. Surprised by Masetto and his friends, the false Leporello escapes after thrashing Masetto. Zerlina arrives and cheers Masetto.

Change of scene: Elvira's room. It is dark. Ottavio, Anna, Masetto and Zerlina unmask Leporello, whom they believed was the Don.

Change of scene: A graveyard with the statue of the Commendatore. Leporello reads the inscription on the statue's base: "Vengeance here awaits my mur-

ventures provided the meat for many radio talks in succeeding years, and then in 1959 playwright Leslie McFarlane used Edwards as the central character in a *General Motors Presents* comedy on CBC-TV. The success of that first "Eye Opener Man" play led to two sequels, seen in 1961 and '62. In all three shows, Mavor Moore played the role of Edwards, the unpredictable editor with a weakness for whisky and a profound contempt for dishonesty.

Born and educated in Scotland, Edwards came to Canada in 1895 and settled in Calgary, where he was soon embarked on his publishing enterprise with the *Eye Opener*. Though he ruffled a good many important personages with his satirical shafts and forthright opinions, and quarrelled with almost everyone in Calgary and points east at one time or another, he nevertheless won the respect of his fellow citizens, to such good effect that in 1921 he was elected to the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, representing Calgary as an independent. He might have won even greater fame in politics than he had in the newspaper game, but his political career was a short one. He died in November, 1922, after serving only a few months in the Legislature.

## Edgar Snow On Red China

JOURNALIST EDGAR SNOW, a veteran observer of events in the Orient, will be interviewed by broadcaster Harry Rasky on this week's edition of *Project '64*, Sunday, December 29, at 5:00 p.m., on radio.

Snow first went to China in 1928 as a freelance writer, and during the next 13 years he served as Far East correspondent for a number of U.S. and British newspapers and magazines. During the Second World War he reported events in the Far East and Europe, and following the War returned to his roving assignments as a contributing editor to *The Saturday Evening Post*, *Look* magazine and other publications.

In addition to his many articles, Snow has written about a dozen books about China, the most recent being *The Other Side of the River*, distributed in Canada by Random House.

Loesser a lifetime to collect," says John Roberts, "and adds lustre to a brilliant mosaic of a storyline, colourful asides, and a wide variety of musical examples, the last of which is a montage composed of extracts from a variety of antique records. In these, such virtuosos as Paderewski, d'Albert, Joachim, de Pachmann, Lischetizsky, Sarasate, etc., all live for a moment again. In the production, Keith MacMillan with great skill and imagination has welded all the components into a remarkable whole, showing a great flair for the radio medium."

MacMillan describes Loesser as "a short, light, wiry man with grey hair, a typical American voice with lots of personality in it and boundless energy. He's fun to listen to, because he has a tremendous catalogue of information. He finds it almost impossible to talk in a straight line—keeps popping down little side alleys so that he takes five times longer to get to his point, but makes the trip five times more interesting. He was as fascinated as a child with the idea of working with actors who would bring his words to life, and the cast was

very taken with him, too. It was wonderful working with an eminent person who was so co-operative and happy to take suggestions."

Loesser describes a virtuoso as "a musician who uses the music he plays as an opportunity for showing off, not so much the music, as his own brand of special skills. He assumes, often rightfully, that his hearers are more interested in him personally as an athlete than in the deeper content of what he may deliver."

The 19th century was still very young when the first performance of the Beethoven *Violin Concerto* was given by a stunt violinist who played his instrument upside down and behind his back. With that beginning, it's not surprising that the 1800s produced bigger and better musical heroes who could have taught Barnum and Bailey a few tricks about dazzling feats of skill, extraordinary personalities and how to keep the crowd screaming for more.

If blame for the virtuoso's concert shenanigans can be laid at the feet of anyone or anything, it should be placed firmly beside the work-boots of the Industrial Revolution. Before that the offerings of top musical artists were limited to

the staid, exclusive gatherings in baronial mansions. The Industrial Revolution developed a commercial class of merchants, money-lenders, shippers and industrialists with plenty of money, and eventually they decided to have their own musical institution, the concert-for-a-profit. Labourers, servants and peasants couldn't afford the price of admission, the upper classes didn't deign to attend in sufficient numbers to matter, so the middle-class had their fun all to themselves, and it soon developed into a combination of dignified, aristocratic opera and low-class strolling jugglers, freaks and acrobats.

Of course, the more tickets sold, the more profit for the *entrepreneurs*, and because names draw audiences, unusual musical personalities began to thrive, and dress, habits, techniques and *amours* were exploited in the extreme.

The effect of this circus-like atmosphere on the development of the instruments, the artists and public taste is delightfully illustrated by Arthur Loesser. He makes his audience realize that something colourful is missing on the modern stage—but that perhaps it's just as well.

Force, and was discharged with awards from both U.S. and French governments.

On two occasions during the war he had returned to France nearly blind. Doctors attributed his impaired eyesight to a circulatory block around the eyes. It meant that the medical career he wanted was impossible, so he went back to studying music, continuing his work on Gregorian chant at the Monastery of Solèsmes in Sarthe, and in a few months had won the Certificat d'Etudes of the Albaye de Solèsmes. By that time his sight was gone completely, and he says he considers himself very lucky to have "been surrounded by dedicated men" when the tragedy of his situation became complete.

He went back to his father's ranch at Mansfield, Texas, to learn Braille, and studied at a school for the blind in New Orleans. Then he devoted himself to studying philosophy and theology under the direction of the Discalced Carmelite Monks and the Basilian Fathers of Canada.

While drama critic John Mason Brown was visiting him at the ranch one day, he talked to Griffin about his experiences in French monasteries, and urged him to write them down. Soon after that Griffin began an account which he later worked into a novel, *The Devil Rides Outside*, which was published in 1952 and became a best-seller. He took the title from a French proverb, "The devil rides outside monastery walls." "The work is brutal in its intensity, visceral in its images of flesh, but it is triumphant in the contrasting spiritual side," wrote a critic who sounded the tenor of the novel's general reception. It deals with the unending war between good and evil for man's soul. Most readers assumed that it was largely autobiographical, but Griffin says no. He made up many of its characters, but admits that what it reveals about spiritual growth is firmly rooted in his own experience. "In the course of it I wrote my way into the church. I held out tooth and nail (just as the book's hero does), but when I had finished, my conscience wouldn't let me do anything else."

The year after *The Devil Rides Outside* was published, Griffin married Elisabeth Ann Holland. He continued to write, and his second novel, *Nuni*, also a tale of struggle for salvation, appeared in 1956. He worked into it considerable knowledge of primitive peoples which he had acquired during his years of war service in the Pacific. The book's hero, a college professor, is sole survivor of a plane crash on a Pacific island where the only inhabitants are a savage tribe.

In January, 1957, an operation restored Griffin's sight. He says that one of the most wonderful rewards of this was seeing his wife for the first time, after 3½ years of marriage. Being able to see again also gave Griffin the opportunity to go into the South and view the Negro situation for himself, disguised, and accepted, as one of them.

He says he found many southern whites decent and kind, and blames institutions rather than individuals for the fact that Mississippi and Alabama are a terrifying prison for those with dark skin. In Mobile, a foreman to whom he applied for a job told him: "No use trying down here . . . We're gradually getting you people weeded out from the better jobs at this plant. We're taking it slow, but we're doing it. Pretty soon we'll have it so the only jobs you can get here are the ones no white man would have."

He encountered an enormous wall of hostility between Negroes and whites nearly everywhere he went, a wall which he felt was growing higher yearly, but "Atlanta changed my mind. Atlanta has gone far in proving that 'the problem' can be solved, and in showing us the way to do it . . . I pray that the Negro will not miss his chance to rise to greatness, to build from the strength gained through his past suffering, and, above all, to rise beyond vengeance."

After Griffin's first report was made public, his effigy was burned in his home town, a cross was burned on a hill near his home, and his family was threatened. Most of the South reacted quite differently. Only one per cent of the letters he received was abusive. But his parents sold ranch and furniture and moved to Mexico to avoid hostility. And Griffin and his family had to begin a new life elsewhere, too.

## MINCE TARTS

### PASTRY:

1 lb. corn oil margarine  
4½ cups sifted flour  
1 tbsp. salt  
10 tbsp. ice water

### MINCEMEAT:

1 lb. puffed raisins  
1 lb. apples  
¾ lb. mixed peel  
1 lb. currants  
½ lb. cherries  
1 lb. brown sugar  
2 cups apple juice  
1 tsp. mace  
½ tsp. cinnamon  
¼ tsp. cloves  
½ tsp. allspice  
¼ cup brandy  
1 lb. suet  
¼ lb. almonds

Blend lard and flour until size of a pea. Add water. Mix. Refrigerate. When time to bake, fill tarts with mincemeat and bake in 400° oven for 15 to 20 minutes.

### MINCEMEAT:

Place all fruit through coarse blade of food chopper. Add suet, cider and sugar. Simmer for about 1 hour. Then add chopped almonds, spices and brandy.

Place in sterile jars and seal. This mincemeat will keep for 1 year or more if desired.
