The Stag

FOR THE THIRD consecutive season, CBC tv's *Playdate* presents a television drama from the pen of the Welsh-born dramatist, Alun Owen, and for the third time, expatriate Canadian actor Neil McCallum, who lives in England, plays the lead role in an Owen teleplay on this series.

Owen's *After the Funeral* was telecast in 1962, and *You Can't Win 'Em All* was seen in January of last year. The first was about a family gathering for a funeral, and the background was a town in Wales. The setting for the second was a South American country in the throes of a revolution.

In *The Stag*, telecast on *Playdate*, Monday, May 25th, Owen returns to a Welsh setting and a recurring theme in his writing — how people react to one another. John James, who has made his life in the United States, returns to

The winning Elmwood panelists were Noreen Marshall, 251 Harrison Avenue; Ian Thomson, 59 Cobourg Avenue; Thompson Owens, 798 Beach Avenue, and Richard Luddick, 4 Hart Avenue.


Bill Guest, host and moderator of the series, presented each of the winners and their opponents with a Special Award Cup as a memento. The series was produced by Jean Mackay.

THE NATIONAL BROADCASTING Company has purchased 10 CBC tv *Parade* productions for showing on the NBC tv network this summer. The Canadian variety programs will be telecast Friday evenings on the U.S. network, starting in mid-July.

Parade is a series of half-hour variety shows, each having its own individual format and artists. It started as a summer replacement on the CBC tv network in July, 1960. The 10 NBC selections range from a *Parade* featuring vocalist Diahann Carol, seen in July, 1961, to one featuring singer Jane Morgan, seen last February.



FIRST WILDERNESS AWARD

THE FIRST ANNUAL Wilderness Award, for an outstanding film produced for CBC tv in 1963, was won by *One More River*, a study of racial problems in the southern United States. The film, first shown a year ago, is presented again on *Camera Canada* on Wednesday night, May 27th. On the same program the Wilderness Award trophy, a Canadian rock specimen containing gold, is presented by CBC President Alphonse Ouimet, and accepted by producer-director Douglas Leiterman on behalf of those responsible for the winning film, of whom four have been singled out for special medals: Leiterman, co-director Beryl

MOE KOFFMAN, Alan and Blanche Lund, and Rick Campbell, are some of the friends Betty Robertson has invited to join her on this week's *Parade*. The program, called *Betty Robertson and Her Friends*, is seen Thursday, May 28th, on CBC tv.

One of Canada's top television and night-club performers, Betty Robertson has appeared on most CBC variety shows going back to the early days of Canadian television — *The Jackie Rae Show*, *World of Music*, *The Jack Kane Show*. On stage she has played in sev-

eral of the *Spring Thaw* productions, and the revue *After Hours*.

Although Betty Robertson has been singing most of her life it was only after she was already married and the mother of a three-year-old that she turned professional. The most challenging of all performances, she finds, are night-club dates. The only way to beat the competition of clattering dishes, people talking and laughing is to "sing every song as though it's the last one I'm going to sing."

Alan and Blanche Lund have been a dance team since their early teens. Both were born in Toronto within a few blocks of each other and both began professional training when barely out of kindergarten. The Lunds

THE FERGUSON MIND: "That Marvellous Mechanism"



AT 5:30 IN the morning the only honest citizens you're likely to find in the vicinity of Toronto's Jarvis Street are the drivers of the city sanitation trucks hosing down the streets—and Max Ferguson. It's just about this time that Max comes into the CBC studios with a copy of the morning paper he's picked up on the way down. For the next two hours he'll be holed up in the announcers' lounge dissecting the news line by line, assimilating little tidbits that have comic possibilities, rejecting the tragedies, mentally filing this, discarding that. Where the average breakfast reader sees a report on liquor-making at a Benedictine monastery, Max may see the un-froking of a Friar for rendering *Sweet Adeline* instead of Gregorian chants.

The several thousand words of a daily newspaper are all carefully sieved through what his producer calls "that marvellous mechanism" — the Ferguson mind. What nuggets are panned in these lonely hours now have to be cautiously assayed, polished, and refined. Sometimes a find turns out to be fool's-gold. An item that looked good




at first turns out to have a hollow ring, or for various reasons something else just won't work on radio.

Around six, one of the four sound-effects men who rotate their duties on *The Max Ferguson Show*, pops in to see if Max has any ideas on the special sounds required on the show. He could be either John Sliz, Don Burgess, Alec Sheridan, or Bill Roach. If he's lucky something may already be taking

shape in Max's mind. If not, it's a philosophical shrug and "Call me when you're ready," which might turn out to be only a few minutes before air-time. Although the easiest parts of their jobs are fun-like smashing window-panes or loosing bursts of machine-gun fire—the sound-effects men who work on Max's show are among the most taxed in the business. They have to have hair-trigger reactions and be ready to meet frequent demands for unscheduled material. If anyone can possibly anticipate Max Ferguson, when even *he* doesn't know what might be coming next, it's the sound-effects men. In an unscripted, completely spontaneous show with Max at his wildest, the sound-effects man has to be ready with the right sound at the right moment.

D-DAY:

THE CANADIANS

He that outlives this day and comes safe home will stand a tip-toe when this day is named . . . He that shall live this day and see old age, will yearly on the vigil feast his neighbours . . . Then will he strip his sleeve and show his scars . . . Old men forget; yet all shall be forgot, but he'll remember with advantages what feats he did that day.—(*Henry V*, Act IV, Scene III.)



THIS IS A TIME to remember and show old scars, for 20 years ago on June 6th the greatest armada the world has ever seen took thousands of Canadians to the most memorable rendezvous of their lives — and for hundreds, their last.

In commemoration of Canada's supreme effort on that fateful day in 1944, CBC tv's *Horizon* presents *D-Day: The Canadians*, the personal remembrances of some of the survivors of the Normandy landings.

D-Day: The Canadians specifically treats the Canadian operation in the assault on North-west Europe. In their own words, some of the men who were there recall their emotions on that day and the events they experienced.

Written, produced, and directed by George Ronald, *D-Day: The Canadians* combines official Canadian Army films, taken on the beaches and in the landing craft, with films of the Normandy beaches and towns as they are today. Footage from German records seized after the invasion shows the Canadian operation from the defender's strongholds, and includes a sequence showing the capture of some of the paratroopers of the 1st Canadian Parachute Battalion, who landed on French soil some five or six hours before the first wave of infantry disembarked.

D-Day has been recalled in a number of books and films by both the British and the Americans, but Canada's participation suffers from neglect. (Please turn to page 19)

HERITAGE: The Devil You Say

EARLY THIS YEAR the Queen's estate at Sandringham in England was in the news not for its Royal and social connections but for a strange and disturbing discovery made at a ruined church there. A schoolboy, exploring the old Babingly church near one of the farms on the estate, had found certain objects in the church that alarmed some of the older folk. Police identified the objects — a sheep's heart, a black candle, and a clay figure with a hawthorn piercing the region of the heart — as black-magic symbols, which an expert in the lore of witchcraft later verified as crude death charms.

Similar findings, both before and since, have been reported on a number of occasions throughout Britain. In Sussex only a short while before the Sandringham discoveries, a vicar found evidence of a Black Mass having been conducted one night in his churchyard. The desecration moved him to utter a curse from the pulpit against the perpetrators of the outrage.

While these reports provide tasty breakfast-reading to be lightly passed over in favour of more pressing temporal affairs by most, churchmen and the more devout Christians among us may pause for more serious reflection. How do we regard manifestations of Satanism and heresy? Is there, in fact, a personal belief in the Devil today?

This is the question posed on CBC tv's *Heritage* in the program *The Devil You Say*, telecast Sunday, May 24th. The program deals with the subject of the Devil within the context of Christian belief and the history of western civilization over the centuries since Christ. Through paintings and wood-cuts *The Devil You Say* traces the various ideas and atti-


The Nature of Things

Excursion into Hell. Centuries ago people in warmer parts of the world believed that a dread disease was contracted through the foul air generated in swamps. From this belief came the word "malaria" which means "bad air." The word is still used to describe a parasitic disease that remains one of the world's major health problems. Efforts to find and isolate the causes of malaria make one of the greatest scientific detective stories of all time. Mosquitoes of the genus Anopholes were found to be implicated. So far their control is far from accomplished.

MALARIA:

King of Diseases



"IN THIS AGE," says Dr. M. G. Candau, director-general of the World Health Organization, "when man thinks he is about to set foot on the moon, he should be capable of stamping out one of his worst enemies on his own planet." Dr. Candau was referring to the world's most troublesome infectious disease, a dread scourge since at least 4,000 years before Christ: malaria. For many of us in cooler climates, our only knowledge of malaria is what we come across in novels — descriptions, tinged with romance, of a jungle hero tossing in a raging fever while a beautiful heroine nurses him back to health with the quinine all gone and the natives getting restless.

But in reality the pain, fever and chills of malaria are far from romantic. Each year 200 million people succumb to them. Each year two million die from the tiny malarial parasites which overwhelm their red blood cells.

The annual economic loss through malaria is enormous. In India it is estimated at \$500 million, in Mexico \$175 million. And with the ease and cheapness of travel these days, more and more North Americans and Europeans

A Visit to RIDEAU HALL

AN INFORMAL VISIT to the official residence of the Governor-General of Canada, historic Rideau Hall in Ottawa, which was shown on *The Lively Arts* last year, is repeated on CBC tv Wednesday night, May 27th. The program includes a conversation with the Governor-General, His Excellency, Major-General Georges P. Vanier, and Madame Vanier, filmed in His Excellency's study, an oval room panelled in oak, overlooking the gardens; aerial shots of the house; views of public rooms, including a part of the Royal Suite; a portion of a play which was performed at Rideau Hall in the 1870s; and the Governor-General is seen in an official ceremony—receiving Letters of Credence from the Ambassador of the Republic of Niger accrediting him as his country's official representative in Canada.

Nineteen governors-general have lived in sprawling, gracious Government House, and all have left their stamp on the building in ways that combine to make it more of a warm, charming home than a public building.

Host of the visit, which was organized and produced by Vincent Tovell, is Fred Davis. Historical advisor was Dr. Robert H. Hubbard, curator of the National Gallery of Canada. The program was written by Jane Graham and directed by Robert Barclay.

Horizon has assembled from over 62,000 feet of film one of the first accounts that fully documents an important part of Canadian history.

Field Marshal Montgomery has said of the Canadian forces serving with him: "It has been a matter of great satisfaction and pride to have had Canadians with me in the invasion. They have proved themselves to be magnificent fighters, truly magnificent. Their job along the Channel coast and clearing the Scheldt estuary was a great military achievement for which they deserve the fullest credit. It was a job that could have been done only by first-rate troops. Second-rate troops would have failed."

The peppery commander of the Expeditionary Force still has much to say about operation *Overlord* and is seen on *D-Day: The Canadians* in an interview filmed by Norman Allin and conducted by George Ronald especially for this program. Also interviewed on *D-Day: The Canadians* are: General H. D. G. Crerar, then General Officer Commanding in Chief, First Canadian Army; and the Brigade Commanders of the 7th, 8th, and 9th Infantry Brigades—Brigadier Harry Foster, of Chester, N.S. (7th Brigade); Brigadier K. G. Blackader, of Montreal (8th Brigade); and Brigadier Ben Cunningham, of Kingston, Ont. (9th Brigade).

attaching to such an enormous undertaking Churchill reported himself well satisfied with the initial assault. At noon on the 6th of June he rose in the House of Commons to announce: "An immense armada of upwards of 4,000 ships, together with several thousand smaller craft, crossed the Channel. Massed airborne landings have been successfully effected behind the enemy lines. The fire of the shore batteries has been largely quelled. The Allies are sustained by about 11,000 first-line aircraft." The next day he cabled Stalin: "We had expected to lose about 10,000 men, but we got across with small losses. By tonight we hope to have the best part of a quarter of a million men ashore."

Canadian commanders were told to expect on the first day of the landings a very high proportion of casualties. Official records show that actual losses were much lower than expected.

On the 6th of June, 1944, the figures for all Canadian Army Units were 359 killed or died of wounds, and 715 wounded.

Col. C. P. Stacey, Director, Historical Section, General Staff, writes in the official history of the Canadian Army in the Second World War: "It is worth remembering that the men who stormed the Atlantic Wall surmounted not only terrible physical hazards, but a most formidable moral hazard as well. Every man had to face and overcome deep unspoken fears within himself."

The SHAKESPEARE Music of HECTOR BERLIOZ

WASN'T IT Ambrose Bierce who defined an artist's immortality as "a thousand critics shouting that he's unknown?" It was only after Hector Berlioz's death in 1869 at 65 that this extraordinary *Faust* among composers won wide recognition. On his deathbed, debt-ridden and unsaluted, his last sad words were: "At long last! Now it will be possible for them to play my music!" Undisciplined he was, an audacious genius who did everything in an upside-down way, as many were quick to point out, but he was so imaginative and versatile, uncompromising and freedom-loving, that he became much more than a leader of the French Romantic movement. In one bound he brought French music into line

with other contemporary work in poetry, prose and art.

Berlioz faced stiff opposition all his rebellious life. His father, a country doctor, was so indignant when his 19-year-old son decided to drop out of medical school in Paris that he cut off the youth's allowance, and Berlioz had to resort to all sorts of occupations to scrape a living. His great mop of hair and aquiline nose turned up anywhere from theatre choruses to newspaper offices in his quest for jobs. At times he was reduced to living on crusts and raisins and sleeping on the steps of monuments to other great men who had had better luck than he. He composed strenuously, whenever he could buy or scrounge paper and pencil. Once, a work of incredible beauty and power tortured his mind and pleaded to be set down for weeks, but he hadn't the necessary paper, so he had to chase it out of his imagination, and it never returned. His drive and fierce creative ability burned him out completely a year before his death. But he educated Europe's musicians to a new art, and supplied some brilliantly-executed models expressing musical humanism in clear, vigorous terms.

At 25 he fell madly and hopelessly in love with an Irish Shakespearean actress, Henrietta Smith-

son, and pursued her by letter and in person for five years before they finally met and married. And then he found that his misery and determination had not been worth the trouble — they were quite unsuited. After his marriage he recalled the tortured ardor of his early love for her in the dramatic symphony, *Romeo and Juliet*, one of several of his compositions inspired by the plays of Shakespeare, which he much admired.

Selections from three of these works are performed on *CBC Sunday Night*, May 24th, by the CBC Montreal Orchestra conducted by Charles Houdret. The first is the *Overture to Beatrice and Benedict*, a pawky, gay little opera based on *Much Ado About Nothing*. "The eminently classical *Overture*," says French biographer Adolphe Julien, "is based on two salient motives of the opera — a magnificent phrase à la Gluck, taken from the music of *Beatrice*, and a graceful piece of badinage, in triple measure, sung by Beatrice and Benedict as an epilogue." The orchestra also plays the *Funeral Music* from *Hamlet*; and two selections from *Romeo and Juliet*: *Love Scene*, and *Romeo Alone*, and *The Feast of the Capulets*, which vividly describes Romeo's entering his enemy's house at the height of festivities.

HARPSICHORD FEATURED ON DISTINGUISHED ARTISTS

THE HARPSICHORD, the keyboard instrument that was the predecessor of the pianoforte, is supposed to have originated in the late 14th century. From early in the 1600's until the close of the 18th century, it was used in the orchestra, particularly for accompanying the first oratorios and operas. Usually the conductor played it and directed the orchestra at the same time. But the advent

of the piano, with its sustained tones soon cast a shadow over the older instrument, from which it did not emerge until it was revived early in this century by the Polish virtuoso, Wanda Landowska. Its popularity has been sustained since by other noted artists, such as Greta Kraus of Toronto, and Kenneth Gilbert.

Gilbert is the *Distinguished Artist* in recital on CBC radio Monday night, May 25th. The program from Montreal includes *Toccata in D Minor* by Johann Froberger, one of the most prolific composers for the harpsichord. Born in Saxony about 1605, he was a favourite pupil of Frescobaldi, the celebrated 17th-century organist.

At 7:00 a.m., the man who learned-to-stop-worrying-and-love-the-max-ferguson-show comes in—producer Bob Arnott. Most of the time what comes out over the air is as much of a surprise to him as it is to the listener at home. He sees no script (there isn't one, just a shredded newspaper), has only a bare outline of a sketch explained to him by Max (on occasion even Max can't explain his skits until they happen), and is frequently mystified by his involvement in recording weird sounds that begin to make sense only when the show is already on the air. Somehow he must take this amorphous mass and with the other elements—live music, station-breaks, commercials, introductions and sign-offs—give cohesive form to it and keep it on its heading.

Arnott's first step in producing *The Max Ferguson Show* is to

cock a wary ear in the direction of the announcer's room where Max is working on the papers. Silence is bad. A little dry, nervous cough is good. Several little coughs are excellent. All's well. It should be a good show.

"That cough, it's a great tip-off," says Arnott. "It means Max is getting it. When he starts swinging, he's got this nervous little cough. Just habit. His wife says he does it when he steps on the gas pedal to overtake a car."

Happy with this augury, Arnott goes off to his office to check on the music and write the introduction and the breaks that Alan McFee will announce on the air. "Live" music for the show is handled by the regional producers in Vancouver, Winnipeg, Montreal and Halifax, and shipped to Toronto on tape.

In the studio the sound-effects man has his props ready, booth technician Ed Scott is balancing sound levels and running the music inserts through the playback machine as air-time approaches. Alan McFee and Bob Arnott confer on cues for the introduction and commercials, and do a brief run-through. Max is pacing the studio with his head down, listening to voices that only he can hear, smoking his first cigarette of the day. He's too professional to "freeze" on the air, but he's also too professional not to worry about his performance.

The sweep hand of the booth clock comes round to 7:35 and everyone's in place—Arnott in the booth poised to cue McFee standing outside at a pedestal mike, the technician at the controls ready to cut in each of the strategically positioned mikes, the sound-effects man looking like a greyhound in the traps, Max seated at a table, ear-phones on, newspaper spread out before him.

CUE!

ANNCR.: It's the Max Ferguson Show!

THEME: (Up music).

The Max Ferguson Show is like no other show on radio. It's the only show where, as the producer puts it, "you get a dress-rehearsal after the show's already been aired." It goes live at 7:35 direct to the Maritimes and is simultaneously recorded. The rest of the country will hear it at 8:35 in all regions. In the 18 months that it's been on the air surprisingly few goofs have occurred. Once it's on tape minor errors can be corrected, the timing sharpened a little, and a few bumps here and there can be planed down. But never has it been necessary to edit Max Ferguson's sketches, a tribute to his highly developed skill at ad-libbing within a self-imposed censorship. As far out as he often gets, he never oversteps the mark. He possesses the almost uncanny knack of developing, within the tight limits of three or four minutes, a neatly tied-up situation involving numerous characters and sounds arising out of what seems to be the most mundane news report.

It's the kind of show that Max prefers to any other he's done.

"I have to be sharp, fast, incisive, on the ball all the time," he says. "There's no room for padding or sloppiness."

And that says it for the whole crew.

Fox, cameraman Richard Leiterman, and film editor Don Haig.

Originally telecast as part of the *Intertel* series, and filmed by Allan King Associates, *One More River* is not a tract for or against integration. It aims simply at communicating some sense of the real meaning of integration, through the minds and emotions of people di-

rectly involved. It includes interviews with Negroes and whites in South Carolina, Alabama, and Mississippi; and actuality films of situations they encounter daily in the south — the proprietor of a restaurant ordering Negroes off his premises, a couple being turned away from a movie theatre, and student demonstrations against the admission of a Negro to a university.

Among those heard and seen on the program are Calvin Craig, Grand Dragon of the Ku Klux Klan of Georgia, who helps organize Christmas baskets for needy Negro families, but is prepared for violence if the Negroes "get out of hand;" Mrs. Patricia Shelby, a white southern mother who has lived her whole life among Negroes, whom she likes and respects, but who will not allow her children to attend school with Negroes; the Reverend Wyatt Walker, a northern-born, college-educated Negro, who has been jailed six times on charges of lunacy, inciting to riot, and disorderly conduct — the result of walking into a public library in Albany, talking to a public official in a white-only waiting room, riding a Freedom Bus, and refusing to press charges against a white youth who attacked him; Mrs. Charles Jones, a professor of English, whose son spent 30 days in jail — 10 days for each minute he sat at an all-white lunch counter; and Wally Butterworth, a white southern broadcaster dedicated to maintaining white supremacy and "racial purity."

Over a century ago Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation freed Negroes from 250 years of slavery. Since 1954 integration has been law in all the states of the union, but in many southern areas integration is only a token. Although progress is slow, the Negro has in fact made more civil rights gains in the last decade than in the whole century before that, and violent outbursts have not been as many or as passionate as might have occurred in a society with an economic and social basis in prejudice. Integration of the heart must come before the mood of the

American south mellows into brotherhood.

The Wilderness Award was initiated last spring by CBC personnel as a memorial to CBC producer Norman Caton and cameramen Charles Riegler and Len Macdonald, who were killed in a plane crash in the Alberta foothills while filming a CBC *Camera Canada* production entitled *Wilderness*. The Award will be presented annually for an outstanding film produced for CBC tv in the preceding year. The winning film is selected by a panel of bilingual judges from entries submitted from various CBC production centres across Canada.

his home town for his younger brother's wedding.

The main conflict is between John, the nonconformist, and his mother who, along with his old friends in the small Welsh community, resents his independent spirit. For a time, it looks as if Graham, the younger brother, may be influenced by John into seeking something more from life than the prescribed and dullish routine of the home town.

Neil McCallum and John Horton star as John and Graham, respectively, with Ruth Springford as Mrs. James and Anne Collings as Jennifer, a young English tourist who engages Graham's interest in a brief encounter at the pub, where a stag party is being held the night before the wedding.

In supporting roles are Gerard Parkes, Ken James, Gillie Fenwick, Barbara Alleyn, Denise Ferguson, Hilary Vernon and Ivor Barry. Producer is James Gatward.

According to playwright Owen, "The ideal type of television play is the unresolved incident. This annoys the audience, but unfortunately, when you borrow from people's behaviour you can't expect beginnings and endings."



over and they have their own way of communicating (although the council meetings do have a translator in deference to U.N. practice and to speed things up a bit).

The Children's International Summer Villages were founded 13 years ago by a U.S. child psychologist, Dr. Doris Twitchell Allen, of the University of Cincinnati, with the aim of fostering international understanding between the citizens and leaders of tomorrow. Today there are 48 such villages built by the 44 countries participating in the venture. From each of these countries four children are selected to represent their country at the villages. These children are hand-picked for their qualities of leadership, scholarship, and sociability. An adult who speaks the language of the host camp accompanies each group, and the home chapters pay trans-

portation costs while the host chapters pay for their keep.

The 20th Century recently took a camera crew on a tour of some of the Villages in England, Norway, Germany, and the United States to see how the Villages operate and how this experiment in international understanding is working out. This Sunday on CBC tv, May 24th, the program *Too Young to Hate* shows the life of children attending the Villages, how attitudes develop, how friendships grow, and how barriers break down.

Dr. Allen is interviewed on the program, explaining her concept of the Villages, and why only 11-year-olds are chosen; and some of the children themselves voice their reaction to internationalism.

Not all countries send delegations to the camps every year. Some have participated only once or twice. Five Iron Curtain countries have sent children on several occasions—depending on the temperature of the Cold War.

are visiting parts of the world where malaria is prevalent, where elementary hygiene is unknown, where swamps and other mosquito harbors are widespread, and are bringing home the disease in their bodies. So malaria has become an international problem of great immediacy. In 1955, for the first time in history, the nations of the world decided to do something about it—together. At a World Health Organization meeting in Mexico City, a coalition was formed to try to wipe the disease out of the world. And progress,

though slow, is so heartening that the king of diseases may be controlled within the next generation.

As early as the 15th century man suspected that the mosquito was to blame for spreading malaria, but he wasn't sure until half a century ago, when a British scientist, Sir Ronald Ross, discovered that the malarial parasite is passed from animal to animal by the bite of the mosquito—and in 1912 was awarded the Nobel Prize for his efforts. Other scientists carried on from there, and today man knows the answers to many of the questions about malaria which had plagued him from ancient times.

Efforts to find and isolate the cause of malaria, one of the greatest scientific detective stories of all time, is described on CBC tv's *The Nature of Things* on Tuesday, May 26th. The script, titled *Excursion into Hell*, is by Jeremy Brown. The program features Dr. A. Murray Fallis, parasitologist with the Ontario Research Foundation and professor at the University of Toronto. The host is Lister Sinclair.

1 recipe pastry.

FILLING

1 1/4 cups brown sugar

1/4 cup butter

1 tsp. flour

1 tsp. vanilla

2 eggs

3/4 cup currants

Salt

Mix sugar, butter, flour and salt together. Add eggs 1 at a time and beat. Add currants. Fill tart shells 3/4 full. Bake at 425° until top browns.

MAPLE PEANUT TARTS

1/2 cup brown sugar

1/2 cup maple syrup

6 tbsp. soft butter

2 beaten eggs

2 tsp. vanilla

2 tsp. lemon extract

1 cup chopped peanuts

Combine all ingredients and mix smooth. Fill tarts 2/3 full. Bake at 400°.

SHIRLEY BOOTH

SHIRLEY BOOTH'S award-winning portrayal of *Hazel*, Ted Key's famed Saturday Evening Post character, brought the maid of all work to life — and made her a byword in every American home.

Miss Booth is often referred to as "Miss Theatre." The 30 awards that she has won for her outstanding performances on the stage, motion pictures, radio and television include being the only actress to win three Tony's. One was for her starring role in *Time of the Cuckoo*. This was in 1953. She received an Oscar in 1952 for *Come Back Little Sheba*, and the title of "world's best actress" at the 6th Cannes Film Festival in 1953.

In 1962 she was the recipient of an Emmy for her starring role as best actress in the *Hazel* series. TV Guide has nominated her two years in a row for their "Best Actress" Award in the *Hazel* series. In March, 1963, she accepted the Golden Mike Award of the American Legion Auxiliary on behalf of the NBC tv *Hazel* colour series, and in April of the same year the Radio and Television Women of Southern California presented her with their Genii Award for her outstanding contribution to TV for the season.



She has made more than 4,000 appearances in over 40 plays, including *Three Men on a Horse*, *The Philadelphia Story*, *My Sister Eileen*, *Goodbye, My Fancy*, *A Tree Grows in Brooklyn*, *Desk Set*, *Time of the Cuckoo*, and her famous Academy Award role of Lola in *Come Back, Little Sheba*.

She made her television debut in a *Playhouse 90* drama in 1957, but NBC tv *Hazel* is her first continuing television role.

Her hobbies are gardening and collecting antiques. She has furnished her apartment in West Los Angeles with antiques. Historical pieces of Early American furniture also fill her New York apartment and the home she owns at Chatham, Mass., on New England's famous Cape Cod. Here she gives vent to her real desire to keep house. She gardens, cooks, and can be seen with hammer and nails making minor repairs.

Every summer, Shirley Booth spends a few months in her home on Cape Cod, doing all the things she enjoys which her busy life as a top star in the theatrical world doesn't allow. These include sleeping late, leisurely hours in her garden, cooking — and ignoring the telephone.
