



CBC Tuesday Night:

The Music of Mannheim

A series now underway on CBC TUESDAY NIGHT explores the music created under the influence of Elector Duke Carl Theodor of Mannheim, Germany.



When the Duke was visiting in Bohemia in 1743, he attended a concert where he met Johann Stamitz, a brilliant young violinist, son of a village cantor, who had distinguished himself at the coronation festivities of Emperor Karl VII the year before. Carl Theodor was so impressed by the young artist, then in his mid-twenties, that he invited him to Mannheim to form a court orchestra which would provide entertainment for him and his guests. The Duke had no grandiose plans for the orchestra. But over the next 17 years it became the most celebrated of its time, the most influential music group of the 18th century, although it existed for only 35 years.

unusual creativity developed the original little chamber group into an outstanding orchestra of fine precision and brilliant color. After his death in 1757, conductors Ignaz Holzbauer and Christian Cannabich shared conducting responsibilities for a few years, but for the last 20 years of its existence the orchestra was most strongly influenced by Cannabich, who enlarged it to include clarinets as a permanent addition to the woodwinds. When the Electoral Court was moved to Munich in 1778, the orchestra ceased to exist, but its influence on instrumental music, particularly the symphony, continued in a strong current pushing down through the musical decades long after its last mellow notes had drifted out of the windows of the Duke's baroque palace, and were lost in the mists over the Neckar.

At the peak of its development, the orchestra was visited by many famous people, among them Mozart, who first heard it perform when he was 21, just a year before it was disbanded, and English historian Dr. Charles Burney, in 1772, both of whom referred directly to the orchestra in their correspondence with elaborate praise.

We constantly hear oblique references to the proficiency and wide influence of the Mannheim Orchestra and School of Composers, but little direct information about them, let alone much of their music. To remedy this oversight, CBC radio will present a four-part radio series



on the Mannheim School, to be heard on CBC Tuesday Night, beginning November 2nd. It will be performed at the Winnipeg studios by the CBC Winnipeg Chamber Orchestra, conducted by Dirk Keetbaas, who has done extensive research for the programs, and has realized all the scores, which will be performed as nearly as possible in the original Mannheim style. Production is by Bernard Deaville.

The Stamitz name is the only one generally known and connected with the Mannheim period, so Keetbaas intends to bring into focus some of the other talented and significant composers who contributed to the era of the Mannheim School, including Anton Filtz, C. G. Toeschi, Franz Beck, F. X. Richter, I. Holzbauer, and C. Cannabich.

Dr. Charles Burney's reports of the Mannheim Orchestra indicate that its performances were of extremely high calibre, reaching new levels of unanimity, group discipline and expressive vitality. Its composers were exploring new vistas in contrasts and dynamics, and this vitality contributed greatly to their success.

Keetbaas and the players of the CBC Winnipeg Chamber Orchestra will endeavor to re-create this zestful feeling when they offer a hearing, perhaps for the first time in Canada, of these refreshing musical experiments of the Mannheim School of Composers.

Viennese Pianist On Radio Tuesday

CBC TUESDAY NIGHT presents a performance by Paul Badura-Skoda at the University of Manitoba.

FOR FOUR summers the CBC, in association with the University of Manitoba Summer School, has sponsored a series of highly successful Music on Campus concerts featuring outstanding artists of international stature. One

highlight of last summer's series was a recital by the noted Viennese pianist, Paul Badura-Skoda, which was recorded, and will be heard on CBC Tuesday Night, November 9th, at 8:30. This is one of a series of Celebrity Recitals which the CBC has presented in conjunction with various universities around the country and recorded for later broadcast on the radio network.

Born in 1927, Badura-Skoda showed early talent for mathematics, physics and drawing, and his remarkable musical ability didn't really come to light until, at 16, he began serious piano study with the noted Viennese teacher, Professor Viola Thern. The war delayed the start of his career,

Lightning-quick computers combine with expert reporters and analysts to bring CBC tv and radio audiences the most prompt and meaningful coverage possible of the November 8th Federal Election.

ELECTION NIGHT

THE CBC NEWS SERVICE is marshalling its full resources to bring Canadians the fastest and most thorough returns possible on election night, Monday, November 8th. Reporting of results will start on both radio and television when the polls close, at 7:00 p.m. in the various time zones, and will continue until the overall result is known.

CBC tv News has organized election-reporting teams at six regional centres to collect results from all 265 constituencies across the country. There will also be reports from the five party leaders and from the respective headquarters of major political parties in Ottawa.

For campaign and election-night coverage on tv, James M. Minifie is up from Washington to cover the Quebec scene; Peter Reilly has returned from UN headquarters in New York to report on Ontario; Kingsley Brown is in the Maritime provinces, with assistance from Doug Brophy in Newfoundland; Ken Mason is reporting from the Prairies; and Harry Nuttall is covering the Pacific region.

Anchoring election-night coverage at Election Central in tv Studio 7 in Toronto, will be Norman DePoe, Knowlton Nash, and Bruce Marsh, assisted by the noted political analyst, Peter Regenstreif, who will analyze and assess the voting trends revealed by the IBM 1440 computer — the most ambitious data communications system yet designed by IBM for CBC election coverage.

Television reporting of results will consist of 20-minute national segments each half-hour, followed by 10-minute detailed local and regional coverage by individual stations on the network.

CBC radio has had its own team of reporters covering the election campaign: Tom Leach criss-crossed the country reporting the national (Please turn to page 11)

Why Did 118 People Die?

Insight into the exhaustive investigation following Canada's worst air disaster is given by a special program in the DOCUMENT series, Sunday, November 7th at 10:00 p.m.

FOR ITS first program in the 1965-66 season, the television series *Document* will present this week a report on the investigation into Canada's worst air disaster — the tragedy of Flight 831 in November, 1963.

A bare five minutes elapsed between the time the DC-8F aircraft started its take-off run at Dorval International Airport, Montreal, and the moment when the seismograph at College Brebeuf recorded its impact in a field about four miles north of Ste. Therese de Blainville. What happened in those five minutes was the subject of an exhaustive, painstaking enquiry by teams of investigators that culminated in the release in June of this year of the Challies Report. Hon. George S. Challies was appointed by Order-in-Council to head the Commission of Inquiry to "inquire into and to report upon the circumstances surrounding the crash . . . on the 29th November, 1963, when on a flight from Montreal to Toronto, with loss of life of all the occupants, i.e., the crew of seven and 111 passengers."


Reporting to the Commission were: the Records and Documents Group, concerned with the history of the flight personnel and the aircraft itself; the Operations Group, charged with determining whether the aircraft was properly certified, properly loaded, properly despatched, and its crew properly qualified; the Power Plant Group, who examined the engine fragments as possible cause of the crash; the Human Factors Group, reporting on the medical evidence; the Structures Group, fuselage and control surfaces investigators; and the Systems Group, who studied the electrical, hydraulic, and pneumatic systems for inflight fire, explosion, or induction of toxic substances in the air-conditioning system.

Writer-director Jim Carney, who has prepared this edition of *Document*, says of the making of the film, "We made a great effort to avoid the morbid aspects of the subject, without losing sight of the fact that 118 people *did* die, suddenly and appallingly. The course of the investigation itself had more than enough fascination, more than enough emotional power and drama as a film subject in itself. For my part, I found it absolutely fascinating, and must admit to almost forgetting at times the tragic aspects of the crash as the investigation developed.

"To my knowledge, this is the first film to be made of such an investigation."

Executive producer for the series *Document* is Patrick Watson. Narration on this week's program is by John Drainie.

AN ORIGINAL drama by Charles Israel, produced and directed by Paul Almond, which was extremely well received by viewers and critics when it was first presented on tv's Festival last spring, will be telecast again on Wednesday night, November 10th. American actor James Daly appears as Chris Huber, a science professor who returns to his laboratory after the death of his wife, Margaret (played by Teresa Wright) and, in bitter confusion, re-lives the past in a frantic search for understanding of his relationship with her. Others in the cast are Paul Massie, Powys Thomas, Sharon Acker, Julie Biggs, and Donald Hewlett.

It's a challenging role for Miss Wright, the well-known American film and stage actress, but she handles it with delicacy and insight. "When I'm kneedeep in a part," she told us last spring in an interview, "I tear myself to pieces, get a nervous tummy, lose

weight, think, eat and breathe what I'm doing." But she does it with dignity and no histrionics. She's an unpretentious, gentle, approachable person who dresses with quiet chic, and looks much younger than her age.

Let Me Count the Ways

A moving drama about husband-wife relationships is repeated Wednesday, November 10th on CBC tv's FESTIVAL.

She was born in Harlem in 1918, the daughter of an insurance agent. Her parents separated and she lived with relatives for a while, then was sent to a private school in New Jersey. There was a theatrical tradition in the family — her maternal grandmother, Martha Wood, and her Uncle Harry acted in stock, and as a youth her father worked as usher and ticket-taker in New York theatres. that a theatrical career would be suitable for Teresa, too. "I resented it because I thought it meant I wasn't bright enough to be anything but an actress," she recalls, "but my life was shaped when I went to a matinee performance of Victoria Regina, starring Helen Hayes. After that nothing could stop me going on the stage." She was accepted as an apprentice at the famous Wharf Theatre in Provincetown on Cape Cod, and was cast in more roles than the usual novice. After two years there she understudied Martha Scott in the stage version of Our Town (1936), and later toured the U.S. with it. Her delightful performance in *Life with Father* caught the eye of Sam Goldwyn, who quickly signed her up with a Hollywood contract that was probably one of the most protective ever seen in the movie city, for it strictly relieved Miss Wright of leg art poses, publicity romances, and the usual ultra-Hollywood glamor routine.

Goldwyn described her as "one of the most highly sensitive acting instruments it has ever been my responsibility to engage—easily understands her director, learns lines quickly, is sure about picking up inflections and tempo from other actors. She's not headstrong, but she knows what she wants."

A year after she started her movie career she had three Oscar nominations for film roles, and won the award for her performance in Mrs. Miniver in 1942. That year she married writer Niven Busch. They had two children, Niven Teresa and Mary Kelly. Later they were divorced and she married Robert Anderson, author of Tea and Sympathy. Her films have included Shadow of a Doubt (her favorite film role), The Best Years of Our Lives, Enchantment, and The Men, and her notable Broadway performances have been in Mary, Mary, Chin Chin, and The Dark at the Top of the Stairs.

Away from acting she likes to read, "but always optimistic stories; heavy stuff gives me the willies." She collects old theatre magazines and dolls, and refinishes auction sale antique bargains for the 150-year-old Connecticut farmhouse she and her husband bought a couple of years ago.

The first of this season's series is a documentary study of the two-year investigation of the tragic crash of TCA Flight 831 on November 29th. 1963. The Montreal-to-Toronto flight crashed shortly after take-off from Montreal, killing all of the 118 people on board. It triggered the most complex investigation of an air crash in Canadian aeronautical history. By intensive sleuthing the investigators were able to determine the manner in which the plane was functioning and its attitude on impact. The technical investigation took one year and was followed by a public inquiry by George Challies, associate chief justice of the Quebec superior court. Directed and written by Jim Carney.

scene; Stan Rankin was in the Atlantic provinces; Alan Yates in Ouebec; Tim Ralfe in Ontario; Ron Chester in the Prairie provinces; and Tom Earle in British Columbia. These men will be in Radio Election Central, Toronto, on election night and will use the background knowledge gained on their regional campaign beats as results start to flow in from the polls.

The radio reporting staff will be assisted by two political analysts-John Wilson, assistant professor of political science, University of Waterloo, and Val Sears of the Toronto Daily Star-and by CBC television's elaborate IBM computer, to instantaneously translate returns into terms of party standings and show voting trends.

CBC radio expects to be able to provide direct reports from about 35 remote locations on election night, including national headquarters of the major parties, home constituencies of party leaders, cabinet ministers, and other candidates of special interest, and key ridings across Canada, Radio election coverage will follow the pattern of two 10-minute national periods and two 5-minute local periods each half-hour.

As in the past the country-wide results-gathering system of CBC News will be supplemented by news wire services.

as did a skiing accident when he broke his hand. But in 1947 he won first prize in the Austrian Music Competition. The following year he graduated from the Vienna College of Music in piano and choir conducting, with special mention. and won the Bartok Competition in Budapest.

He won the Paris Competition in 1949, toured Europe with the Vienna Chamber Orchestra during the next two years, then made his North American début in Toronto's Massey Hall in 1952, and took South America by storm a year later. He has returned to this continent nearly every year since then, and continues to tour Europe and other parts of the world, averaging around 150 concerts per year. He has also made close to 100 long playing recordings.

His deep interest in the workt of Schubert, three of which he plays on Tuesday night, are largely responsible for a recent rise in the composer's popularity. Last spring Badura-Skoda was invited to become artist-in-residence at the University of Wisconsin, where he hopes to concentrate on special musical projects he has had planned for sometime.



Unlocking Athabasca's Millions

OVER THE PAST decade, world consumption of oil has doubled. By 1980 it is expected to be doubled again, and by 2000 perhaps trebled. Oil and natural gas continue to be the chief source of more than half the world's energy needs. Canada, the largest oilproducer in the Commonwealth, has over 17,000 wells in production, delivering about 40,000,000 tons a year. With low-cost nuclear power far distant in the future the oil industry looks forward to continued expansion.

An important part of this ex-

pansion will be the development of the world's oil reserves, which are divided into two categoriesproven and possible. Proven reserves are those in which the oil is commercially recoverable in terms of existing production techniques and the latest available technical data. Possible reserves are tentative estimates based on incomplete information. The world's proven reserves in 1963 amounted to about 45,000,000,000 tons, a figure that is misleading because proven reserves estimates do not

We learn that she was just three vears old when the bomb was dropped that killed her parents and brother, and that following the blast she grew up with relations in Omura, a village near Kyoto. Finally, she left the village - not only to get away from its old-fashioned ways, but because she had become aware that she bore a stigma - in their eyes she was contaminated by the bomb, not just for a few days or weeks but all her life, and they actually believed that her children would be born as monsters, or dead.

Now she is working as a hostess in a Tokyo bar. After years of putting off her decision, she has made up her mind to revisit the village and Hiroshima, the scene of the holocaust.

The camera follows her to Kyoto, where she witnesses a traditional torch ceremony (the camera work is dazzling here), on to the village, where her grandfather is seen as the embodiment of the old Japanese ways, then to Hiroshima and its grim gallery of pictures and mementos of the blast, and finally her return to Tokyo, carrying with her a gift of fruit which her grandfather had picked and carefully wrapped as an expression of his blessing and continuing love.

As the film draws to a quiet close, it leaves one with the impression of having witnessed a moving human document and an eloquent plea against the horrors of nuclear war.

The Lady's Not for Burning

CHRISTOPHER FRY is one of those refreshing novelties in an age of misanthropes - a man unbrowned-off with life. At almost 58 he still regards the universe with a mixture of strangeness and wonder at the mystery of reality. and this comes over strongly in his plays. He compares this attitude to that of the old lady who saw a giraffe for the first time and refused to believe a word of it. "Reality is incredible, reality is a whirlwind," he keeps reminding us. "What we call reality is a false god, the dull eve of custom. Nothing could be so wildly, perilously, incomprehensibly fantastic as reality itself, and we may as well dare to look at it and like it.'

He feels that poetry offers the best language for exploring this amazement, for saying heaven and earth in one word. And his poetry, with its cartwheeling leaps of language as racy and witty as any since Shakespeare have helped restore the tottering, simpering theatre to the strength of Elizabethan times. Fry has made us more aware of the beauty and fire in our language. He has pointed out its limpid loveliness, its stark simplicity, its sensuousness, its rough, sandpaper qualities, its incredibly varied nuances, its rich, emollient feeling as it slips across our tongues, exciting a whole world of flavors half-forgotten.

One of Fry's most charming examples of verbal fireworks is The Lady's Not For Burning, a heady brew laced with wit that won him the Shaw Prize for the best play of the year in 1948. It will be presented on CBC Stage on Sunday, November 7th at 1:00 p.m., with production by Esse W. Ljungh in the Toronto studios. The radio adaptation is by Alice Frick. Fry balances sheerest nonsense and tender passages with delicacy. His words are softly radiant one moment, caustic the next. Whether he's gusty, brittle, quizzical or elegant, he aims his message at the heart, rather than the head, which is one reason why it appeals to both the intellectual and his charwoman. And he dares, in this age of cynicism, to rate love above every other human emotion. But he alternates romanticism with wit and comedy relief in The Lady's Not for Burning, to produce an invigorating combination of medieval richness and contemporary directness. The play was written for the stage, but it makes ideal radio fare, because its words can be savored better without the distractions of stage business and accessories.

The plot is simple. Thomas Mendip, a swashbuckling misanthrope recently discharged from the army, strolls into the market town where a witch hunt is in progress. He hasn't the foggiest idea who the witch is, but, partly through vanity, partly through generosity, he tries to divert attention from her to himself, bellowing out that he has murdered two of the locals and demanding to be hanged. When the witch, Jennet Jourdemavne, turns out to be not only beautiful but seductive, he falls in love with her, and she with him. Their declaration of love makes a joke of pyres and hangmen in language as moving as it is outside the usual run of contemporary love scenes. Thomas says disparagingly of himself: "Is there a slut would hold this in her arms and put her lips against it?" And Jennet replies: "Sluts are only human . . . You may be decay and a platitude of flesh, but I have no other such memory of life. You may be corrupt as ancient apples; well, then. corruption is what I most willingly harvest. You are Evil, Hell, the Father of Lies; if so, hell is my home and my days of good were a holiday; hell is my hill and the world slopes away from it into insignificance. I have come suddenly upon my heart, and where it is I see no help for."

CBC Radio's New Farm Program

WHEN THE CBC Farms and Fisheries Broadcasts Department introduced its newest program, Country Magazine, on the evening of November 1st, it was carrying on a 25-year-old tradition of regarding Monday night as rural night on CBC radio.

Country Magazine represents a new approach to rural radio programming in Canada, and to appreciate its implications it is necessary to see it in the light of its immediate predecessor, National Farm Radio Forum, which began in 1940. The Forum's familiar theme, "Men of the Soil," has brought thousands of discussion groups together and has resulted in local action, not only in Canada but around the world.

Farm Forum has been copied in at least a dozen countries. In India. for example, it has become the basis of a major community development program. In a recent Unesco publication, "Radio Broadcasting Serves Rural Development." B. P. Bhatt and P. V. Krishnamoorthy of All India Radio state, in part, "As early as 1948, it was realized that the mere distribution of receivers to rural communities would not achieve much unless the rural people were taught how to listen to programs and to discuss them among themselves and thus benefit from community listening. A small beginning had been made by the formation of some 200 listening clubs, when Unesco de-

cided to find out whether the techniques of the Canadian Farm Radio Forum, developed in the rigid winters of the north, might not prove equally effective in the villages of other parts of the world.

"The Government of India collaborated in 1956 in the implementation of a pilot project in some 150 villages of the region of Poona. This project, which was carefully evaluated by a team of sociologists, proved so convincing that it became the starting point for a major effort throughout the sub-continent of India. The experiment carried out in a few villages of what was then Bombay State, has now become a living reality for almost 10,000 villages and is spreading to thousands more every vear."

The scene in India is reminiscent of the early and middle years of National Farm Radio Forum in Canada when the program's vitality was at its peak among Canadian farmers. Since those days, however, the farming situation in Canada has undergone many changes and developments. The increasing urbanization of farm lands, the advent of television, the steady trend towards specialization, the introduction of technological advances and new marketing techniques, are just a few of the factors that have dramatically transformed farming in Canada.

In the light of such changes, new approaches were sought to broaden National Farm Radio Forum to meet the complex needs of rural Canada. True, the program continued to have a core of loyal listeners, but their number was small in relation to the potential farming audience. Special-interest groups remained keen, but the Forum had never been intended to be the partisan voice of such groups. Finally it became obvious that a new program approach was needed in terms of rural broadcasting.

The result has been the intro-

duction of Country Magazine—an hour-long program for rural and urban people about life outside the cities of Canada—heard Monday nights at 9:00 p.m.

The host of Country Magazine is Lamont Tilden, assisted by Ruth Fremes. Featured in various parts of the program are Dr. A. C. Forrest, editor of the United Church Observer; Ralph Hedlin, partner in Hedlin-Menzies, an economic consulting firm in Winnipeg, and Jack McPherson, long-time CBC rural specialist. In addition, special guests will appear from time to time including Miller Stewart, Ken Homer, Jean Morrison and, for a look at the lighter side of rural life, Canadian radio's top satirist. Max Ferguson.

The program begins with a short news capsule, presenting the major news stories of the day as they affect farmers. After a short musical break A. C. Forrest and Ralph Hedlin engage one or two guests in a rough-and-tumble discussion about a current rural issue. Another musical interlude is followed by the Ottawa Letter, featuring Jack McPherson in Ottawa who frequently will introduce a guest. Following a light featurette, the program closes with an irreverent item about rural life, as satirized by writer Bob Arnott or by such guests as Max Ferguson; listeners are invited to contribute items to this segment.

FORMED AS A secret society in Sicily in the thirteenth century, the Mafia (or Honored Society) originally dedicated itself to protecting the oppressed peasants against their foreign overlords. Over the years, however, it developed into a despotic state within a state, terrorizing the peasants it had originally set out to champion and adhering strictly to a chilling code: "Death to anyone who talks about the Mafia."

The sinister activities of the Mafia continue to make explosive headlines. Two months ago, Italian authorities claimed to have smashed the leadership of an international gang linking the Sicilian Mafia and the Cosa Nostra (Our Thing) in the United States. Later this fall. a massive trial is scheduled involving more than 100 Mafia bandits charged with murder, dynamitings, etc. - and over 60 volumes of evidence. The trial will be in the nature of a showpiece and will represent the biggest effort made so far to curb the Mafia.

A documentary about the Mafia will be presented as part of CBC Tuesday Night, November 9th at 11:05 p.m., on CBC radio. Entitled Power Is Sweeter Than Love, the program was prepared by New Zealand author James McNeish who spent four years off and on in Sicily living in a Mafia village and whose recent book, *Fire Under the Ashes*, is the first biography of Danilo Dolci, a social reformer whom the Mafia regards as its number one enemy.

The program includes an interview with Dolci and explores the links between the Mafia and the Christian Democratic Party as well as eminent politicians in Rome. Others interviewed, in English or in translation, include the exiled head of the Mafia, Genco Russo: anti-Mafia lawyers in Sicily; and the public prosecutor who conducted a famous case against the Mafia. The program will also present the story of a young peasant hero who was assassinated by the Mafia ten years ago and a translated interview with the youth's mother, the first person to denounce the Mafia publicly.

Mr. McNeish's thesis is that the Mafia is not only a phenomenon of brigands and violence, but is deeply rooted in the political environment of Sicily. It has not been uprooted, he contends, but has become more sophisticated.

Christian Frontiers:

How Do Churchmen Feel About Union?

AT THE 22nd Session of the General Synod of the Anglican Church of Canada, held in Vancouver last August, the voting on the proposed union with the United Church of Canada was almost unanimously in favor. Special committees of both churches had already recommended union in their document, The Principles of Union, issued in June. The decision of the United Church will probably be made in September, 1966, when its General Council meets in Waterloo, Ontario.

If, as it now seems likely, the merger is brought about, the new church would be the country's second largest, with a total following of more than 6,000,000. There are still many obstacles to be overcome, and even if the United Church agrees to union it would take at least four years to form the new church.

Beginning this week, radio's Christian Frontiers (Tuesdays, 7:30 p.m.) explores the reaction of both clergy and laity to the committees' report, and other aspects of union, in a series of programs sub-titled

Principles of Union, Among the many prominent clergy and lay people heard on the programs will be: the Rev. E. R. Fairweather, professor of Dogmatic Theology at Trinity College, University of Toronto, who was a member of the Anglican special committee: the Right Rev. R. S. Dean, Bishop of Cariboo and Executive Officer of the Anglican Communion; President A. B. Moore of Victoria University, who was Chairman of the United Church committee; and the Very Rev. J. R. Mutchmor, former Moderator of the United Church.

In the preparation of this series, Jim St. Marie, who conducted most of the interviews, also sought the views of members of other denominations, since a number of Anglicans expressed interest in union with the Roman Catholic Church while some United Church members spoke of union with the Presbyterian Church.

Learning How to Learn

"OUR HAND is made to grasp, and it develops through grasping things. So the mind which is conditioned to grasp will grasp more things." These words of Dr. Tadeusz Grygier, psychologist, lawyer, criminologist, professor at the University of Toronto, and research director of the Ontario Department of Reform Institutions, pinpoint the philosophy behind two programs about Learning How to Learn, in radio's Soundings series, Thursdays, November 11th and 18th at 7:30 p.m. They were arranged by freelance writer and broadcaster Constance Mungall. The first is about The Gifted Ones. The second, about slow learners, is called Making Useless People Useful. On both programs Dr. Grygier emphasizes his belief that intelligence can be stretched, that both gifted and slow learners can learn how to learn

Then the children themselves take over the program to prove his point. On November 11th a panel of gifted children from Toronto, Etobicoke and North York discuss and evaluate the education they are getting and the problems they face as exceptional children. Professor John McInnes, director of education at the University of To-

ronto Institute for Child Study, agrees with their demand for more challenge. He says that progressive schools of the 1930s were farther ahead in their search for better techniques than any present education system.

On November 18th a boy who had such trouble learning that he would rather go to the moon than to school, tells his story. It has a happy ending. David was transferred from the classroom he hated to a vocational training school where he, too, could learn how to learn. Now graduated, he has a job in a supermarket. He could have been a drag on society. Today he is a useful citizen. In the program his school principal, J. C.

Carscallen of South Peel Vocational School, his parents and Dr. W. R. Keller, psychiatrist and consultant to the Child Adjustment Services of the Toronto Board of Education, talk about the change in David. Seeing these children, at opposite ends of the I.Q. scale, reach more of their potential, reminds us that we are all more capable of learning and joy than we ever realize.

ATHABASCA'S MILLIONS (Continued from page 17)

include the vast reserves of oil known to exist in the tar-saturated sands near Lake Athabasca in northern Alberta. Deposits there, according to an estimate by the Alberta Oil and Gas Conservation Board, may amount to 100,000,000,000 tons.

Ever since the days of the early explorers, when Mackenzie described how Indians caulked canoes with pitch from the banks of the Athabasca River, this area has been known to be rich in heavy oil deposits, but only since the beginning of the present century have attempts been made to exploit it. Nearly all have failed. How to separate oil from sand and clay on a commercial basis is a problem that has defied oilmen and speculators for more than 60 years. At one time or another they've tried burning it out, washing it out, floating it out, steaming it out. Even an underground atomic explosion was proposed.

The high cost of operations is still holding back the vast riches of the Athabasca tar sands but it is believed that the time is not too far distant when oil will flow from there at competitive prices. Some experts predict large-scale production by the mid-70s. A special report on the tar sands project will be presented Saturday at 4:30 p.m. on radio in a program entitled Athabasca's Millions. Producer-commentator David Cruikshank discusses the operation at the McMurray formation with scientists and engineers working there. The McMurray formation covers more than 11,000 square miles and has over 300 townships.

JIM COLEMAN, widely read newspaper columnist and veteran broadcaster, has been named host of CBC tv's Sports Unlimited.

This year *Sports Unlimited* again will be seen following the *Juliette* show on the Saturday nights that Maple Leaf home games are telecast.

Coleman was born in Winnipeg and educated at University School, Victoria, B.C., and at McGill University in Montreal. His lifelong interest in sports was fostered by his father, the late D'Alton Corry Coleman, chairman and president of CPR. Mr. Coleman Sr. owned a stable of thoroughbred horses and was vice-president of the Montreal Canadiens for a number of years.

Coleman began his newspaper career with his hometown paper, the Winnipeg *Tribune*, and subsequently worked for other Western Canadian papers as well as Canadian Press.

The East beckoned and Coleman worked for the Toronto Globe and Mail as a sports columnist. After 10 years, in 1950, he left the Globe to enter race track management. For 10 of his 12 years in racing he was director of public relations for The Jockey Club.

In February, 1955, he appeared as host of the *Jim Coleman Show* which followed *Friday Night Fights* on CBC tv each week. On the program, seen on the network until 1960, Coleman interviewed outstanding sports celebrities.

In July, 1962, he returned to the newspaper business when he joined Southam Press. His roving assignment takes him to major sporting events in North America, Europe, the Far East and South America.
