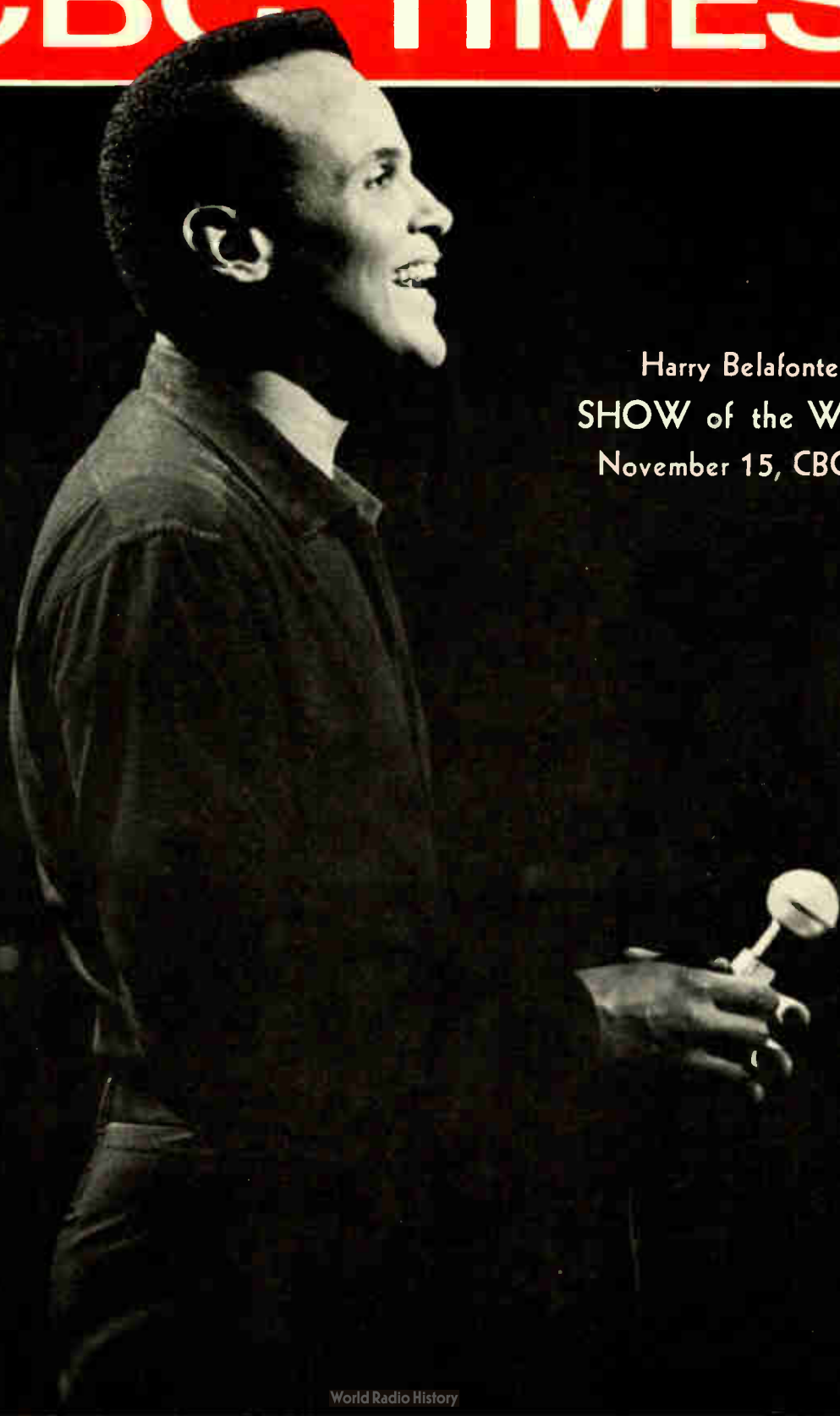

THE DECISION of which cattle breeders, hog raisers and grain growers will attain world-wide recognition rests with the judges at the Royal Winter Fair in Toronto, held November 12th-20th. A winning exhibit can bring prestige, satisfaction, and indirectly, considerable hard cash to the exhibitor.

To bring the important results of judging to Prairie farmers quickly and accurately, Bill Owen, one of the CBC's farm commentators in Edmonton, will attend the fair and broadcast directly twice daily on radio: on *Farm Bulletin Board* at approximately 7:20 each morning, and on the daily Farm Broadcasts at 12:30 p.m. Special broadcasts will be heard in each province, concerning only that province's winners.

Owen also will appear on *Country Calendar* November 21st to report on the Fair for television viewers, showing film taken of the important events.

THERE ARE parts of Winnipeg that even many long-term residents have never seen. There are aspects of life here experienced by only a small minority.

A new program on CBWT Mondays through Thursdays, at 7:00 p.m., *The View from Here*, will "show Winnipeegers their city and themselves in all their diversity," says the program's supervisor, Jack Hutchinson.

"We want to look at whatever is happening here and affecting people, whatever their walk of life: such things as how far the tentacles of the Mafia extend into this city; the expensive fiasco of civil defence; the so-called death strip at Eli; the reasons behind the upsurge in student protest and direct action movements; the thoughts, hopes and fears of a young candi-

date fighting his first election campaign; the scandal of child beating; discrimination as it affects Indians and colored students; the poisoning and pollution of our rivers; licensing of liquor outlets; some of the city's unsolved crime.

"We intend to cover these and other stories wherever and whenever they happen," says Hutchinson, "with every technique at our disposal: film, videotape and live production; with interviews, press conferences, direct reports, editorials, full-length film stories, skits and satires—in whatever way will be most informative and entertaining."

Hosts of the new program are popular CBWT announcer Bill Guest, who needs no introduction; and Michael Magee, formerly of Toronto and Vancouver, a talented writer, actor, director and commentator. Last summer Magee was a regular on *The Observer*, a segment of *Across Canada*; he was commentator for all major Canadian horse races from the Toronto area on CBC television; he has appeared several times on the *Wayne and Shuster Show*, worked on the series *Vacation Time* as a researcher-interviewer, and last year co-directed the racing film *Woody's Wish* for CBC television. In 1963 and 1964 he wrote and narrated the pre-season programs on the Canadian Football League teams. For the radio network, Magee has written a number of documentaries heard on the *Soundings* and *Index* series, on subjects ranging from the Canadian theatre to needed reforms in our penal system. For two summers, he was a frequent contributor to *Saturday Date*, winning a wide following.

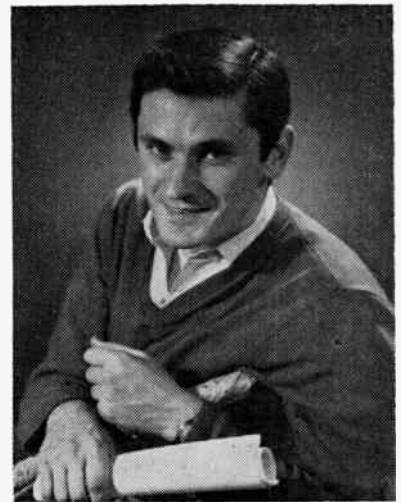
In Vancouver, Magee appeared regularly on local television, and starred in a stage production of Beckett's *Krapp's Last Tape*, winning rave reviews from local critics.

Bill Guest will be co-host of each day's program, and on Wednesdays will moderate the segment

called *The View of a Few*, on which a panel of personalities comment on the news stories of the week.

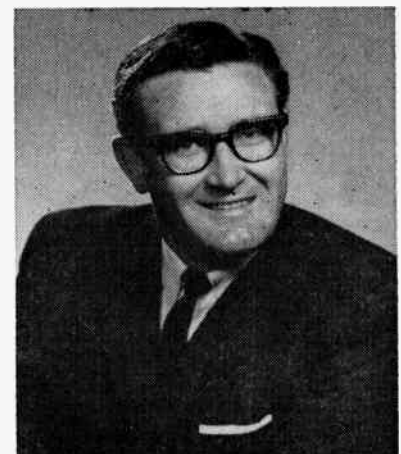
On Mondays, the program will incorporate the Prairie production of *Across Canada*.

Contributors to the program will include most of Winnipeg's experienced television writers: Mort Forer, Marion Waldman, Lyl Brown, Per Holting, and Richard Laferty. Producers are Don Robertson and Frank Resler, both veterans of CBWT's *Eye to Eye*, as are the program's story editors, Lorne Wallace and Jeffrey Anderson.

Charles Lynch New Host of Public Affairs Program



A noted newsman moves into the spotlight of CBC tv's Ottawa-based THE SIXTIES, returning Monday, November 15th at 10:00 p.m.

AN EXCLUSIVE interview with French film star Jeanne Moreau; a look behind the Iron Curtain at Czechoslovakia's cultural and political life today; and a study of poverty in Canada, are some of the highlights of CBC tv's *The Sixties*, which begins its 1965-66 season this week.

Charles Lynch, chief of Southam News Service, who has been a contributor to *The Sixties* since its inception, will be the host. Lynch's association with CBC television began exactly nine years ago when he was appointed CBC correspondent at United Nations headquarters. Since then he has appeared frequently on many programs, either as commentator, interviewer, or panelist. Earlier this year he chaired the 11th Annual Winter Conference, held in Toronto, and has recently returned from a two-month tour of the People's Republic of China.

A post-election survey of the Canadian political scene opens the new season this Monday and will be followed on November 22nd by the first of a two-part program on Czechoslovakia, entitled *The Rusty Curtain*. Part one examines the political and economic situation in present-day Czechoslovakia, and includes an interview with Professor Paul Eisler of the School of Economics, Prague. The second part (November 29th) takes a look at life in Czechoslovakia for the ordinary people, their culture and the degree of their personal freedom in a Communist society. Commenting on this will be one of the country's leading intellectuals, Professor Eduard Goldstucker.

ONE OF the dramatic successes of the 1955-56 Broadway season, *Inherit the Wind*, will be presented this week on the television network. A piece of fiction, based on the 1925 trial of John T. Scopes for teaching Darwin's theory of evolution, the play stars Melvyn Douglas and Ed Begley, re-creating the roles they played on Broadway — Henry Drummond, defence attorney (Douglas), and Matthew Harrison Brady, prosecuting attorney (Begley). Bert Cates, the young schoolteacher on trial, is portrayed by Burt Brinckerhoff; his girl friend, Rachel Brown, by Diane Baker. Murray Hamilton appears as a cynical Baltimore newspaperman named Hornbeck, sent to cover the trial.

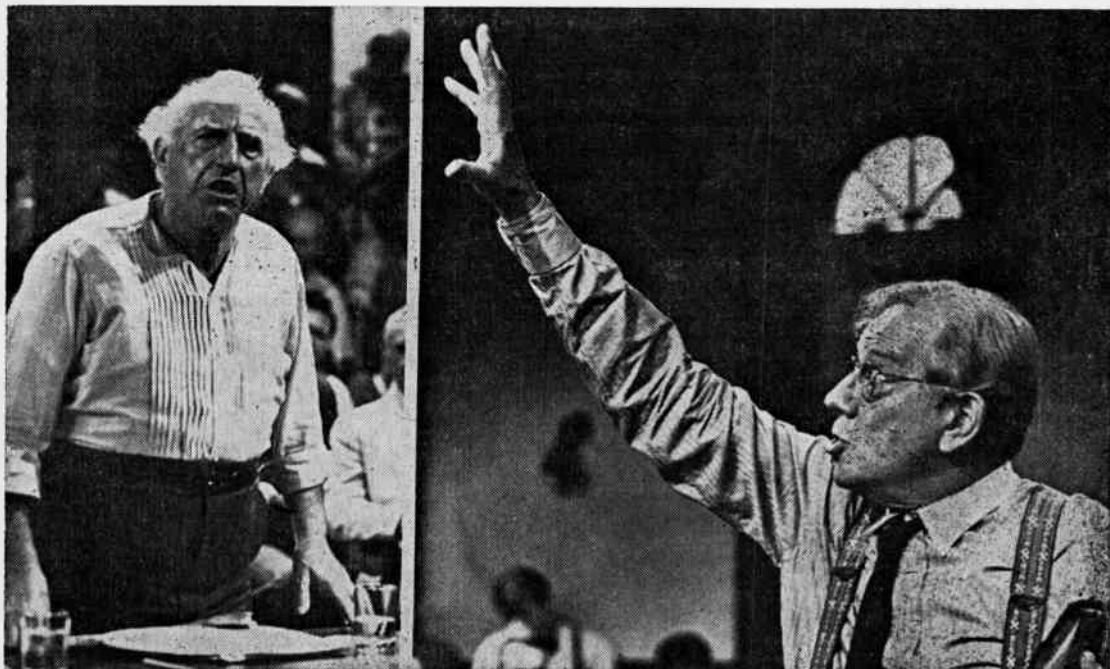
The real-life counterparts to the above were of course, Clarence Darrow and William Jennings Bryan, defence and prosecution respectively; John T. Scopes, the teacher (who was a guest on CBC tv's *Flashback* last season); and H. L. Mencken, the celebrated writer who covered the trial for a Baltimore paper.

In teaching the Darwin theory of evolution in the high school at Dayton, Tennessee, Scopes was acting in defiance of a state law that held "it shall be unlawful for any teacher in any of the universities, normals, and all other public schools in the State, which are supported in whole or in part by the public school funds of the State, to teach the theory that denies the story of the Divine creation of Man as taught in the Bible, and to teach instead that Man has descended from a lower order of animals."

Scopes, despite the aid of the country's most brilliant trial lawyer of the day, was found guilty and fined \$100 and costs. About a year later Darrow put his argument before the Supreme Court of Tennessee, which upheld the constitutionality of the statute under which Scopes had been tried, but which reversed the decision of the Dayton proceedings — not because of Darrow's eloquence but because at Dayton the judge had set the amount of the fine. Under Tennessee law this should have been determined by the jury, not the judge.

Inherit the Wind, written by Jerome Lawrence and Robert E. Lee, is produced and directed for television by George Schaefer.

GORDIE TAPP

Genial, Relaxed Country Gentleman

The host of CBC radio's GORDIE TAPP SHOW has been a professional performer for 18 years. Off the air, his image doesn't change: he's a gentleman farmer and family man.

CANADIAN broadcasting knows no smoother blend of genial emcee and lively performer than Gordie Tapp, host of his own show on the CBC radio network.

Viewers of CBC tv's *Country Hoedown* the last few seasons were given a weekly demonstration of his two-fold talent as he switched from the role of program host to that of Cousin Clem, a hat-crushing extrovert with rustic speech and extravagant gestures.

This season, Gordie has slipped effortlessly into the role of host of *The Gordie Tapp Show*—Monday through Friday at 1:15 p.m. on CBC radio — and welcomes the assignment as the perfect opportunity to present the best in Canadian variety talent

while at the same time giving a boost to new Canadian performers.

The new show is one of the major series undertaken to date by CBC radio's light entertainment department. To begin with, the half-hour show is heard five times a week, offers opportunities to both established and new performers (the program has already introduced 22-year-old Marci Lynn of Toronto and 18-year-old Judy Singh of Edmonton), and features a different musical group each week. Featured this week, for example, are Charles Camilleri and his accordion group who recently made a CBC radio LP transcription described as "terrific" by John Cantelon, producer of *The Gordie Tapp Show*. In addition, however, the program is a travelling showcase. From its home base of Toronto, the show has so far this season visited Edmonton for a week's programs, including an October 25th origination from the R.C.A.F. station at Cold Lake, Alta., where Gordie Tapp also emceed a *Canadian Forces Showcase* program (portions of the program were broadcast on CBC radio on October 31st). Next week *The Gordie Tapp Show* will originate from Vancouver, and it is scheduled to visit Winnipeg, Montreal, and Halifax during the balance of the season.

Also, when Gordie is over-

seas as emcee of further editions of *Canadian Forces Showcase*, one or more editions of *The Gordie Tapp Show* will originate from the sector he happens to be visiting with the Canadian forces program.

Off mike and camera there is the real-life Gordie Tapp—a relaxed country gentleman who lives with his wife and four children on a 35-acre farm in Burlington, Ont. He is the owner and appreciator of fine horses (his stable includes a prize-winning thoroughbred hunter and two Arabians). To exercise the horses, he rides regularly, clad in immaculate riding attire. All his children are good riders, and his eldest daughter, Barbara, has become an avid jumper, winning several ribbons in southern Ontario horse shows. His wife, Helen, is the only non-rider in the family.

Gordie's career in show-business can be said to have begun at the age of five when he played in a school harmonica band. During his high school days he also sang and played at school dances and concerts. Starting in 1947 he was featured on various Ontario radio stations. Then, when the CBC held auditions for *Country Hoedown*, they asked Tapp to act as master of ceremonies. He was an instant success and has never looked back.



A Stroll Down Allen's Alley

Edgar Bergen and Charlie McCarthy introduce a program recalling
the easy humor of Fred Allen, Sunday, November 14th,
at 4:00 p.m. (3:00 p.m. in Alberta) on CBC radio.

REMEMBER Senator Claghorn, Mrs. Nussbaum, Titus Moody, Falstaff Openshaw? If your memory goes back to what is known nowadays as "the golden age of radio," mention of those names will probably transport you instantly through two or three decades to the imaginary place where these imaginary characters lived — Allen's Alley. In the '30s and '40s millions of people visited Allen's Alley every week on radio in the company of one of the greatest American humorists and satirists of modern times, the late Fred Allen.

Some of the best moments of Fred Allen's radio shows have been selected for a special program to be broadcast on CBC radio this Sunday. *The Fred Allen Special*, with host Edgar Bergen and friend Charlie McCarthy, features a number of guest stars who will be heard clowning with Allen. Among them: Jack Benny, Tallulah Bankhead, Milton Berle, Bing Crosby, Shirley Booth, Maurice Evans, Leo Durocher, George Jessel, Major Bowes, Portland Hoffa (Mrs. Allen), Oscar Levant, Bert Lahr, and Beatrice Lillie.

Fred Allen, who started out in vaudeville as a boy juggler ("Freddy James, the World's Worst Juggler") and went on to become a ventriloquist and then a comedian, had his best years from 1932 to 1949, when he used the medium of radio as few others have. The two seemed made for each other. About the time ill health and troubles with sponsors forced him to give up his regular radio broadcasts, and his struggle against television, he had something to say about the change that was taking place in humor and the way it reflected the times: "It's speeded up. It's short, brittle, and sharp. It's mechanized. The pace is too fast and too demanding. And the result is that humor and comedians wear out too quickly. Real humor, as in our historical brand, is conceived in leisure, and with spontaneity. All humor should be created and spread in leisure. You should be relaxed to think of humor, pass it on and enjoy it."

Television and Fred Allen proved to be incompatible when they got together for the first time in 1950, and thereafter he was caustic about the rapidly growing medium. "It's a triumph of equipment over people," he said.

The kindest description by critics of Allen's long-awaited television debut was that it was "a major disappointment." Allen's Alley, for instance used puppets for the characters that radio audiences had come to love. Puppets, said Allen, because people were on the way out. One thing that will never go out, it seems, is humor and the men like Allen who nurture it.

Distinguished Artists:

Violinist Oscar Shumsky

ONE OF North America's leading violinists, Oscar Shumsky, will be the *Distinguished Artist* in recital on radio Wednesday night, November 17th, at 10:30. He will play the *Adagio* from the Mozart *Concerto in A Major* which he performed when he made his debut at the age of eight with Leopold Stokowski and the Philadelphia Orchestra. He will also play the Hindemith *Sonata for Violin and Piano*, No. 2, Opus 11. His accompanist will be Mario Bernardi.

Shumsky has been closely associated with the Stratford (Ontario) Festival for several years, and this past season was its director of music.

He has been playing the violin since he was 3½ years, was the youngest pupil of 80-year-old Leopold Auer, and completed his training with Efrem Zimbalist at the Curtis Institute. He was touring by the time he was 13, but the next year he told his concert manager he was through. "They wanted to turn me into some kind of Frankenstein," he says. "I would rather be Shumsky." At 19 he joined the NBC Symphony, under Toscanini. He recalls his two years with the orchestra as a wonderful experience. But he has never gone back to symphony work. He held a professorship at Baltimore's Peabody Conservatory of Music, was appointed to the faculty of the Juilliard School in New York in 1953, and in addition teaches at the Curtis Institute. He appears frequently in recitals and concerts all over this continent and in Europe.

In 1945 he acquired the Stradivarius violin known as the Ex-Pierre Rode, named after the famous 19th-century violinist who once owned it. Made in 1715 and noted for its exceptional beauty of tone and exquisite workmanship, it belonged at one time to the famous collection of the Duke of Cambridge. It is considered one of the finest examples of the great Cremonese master's Golden Period of violin making.

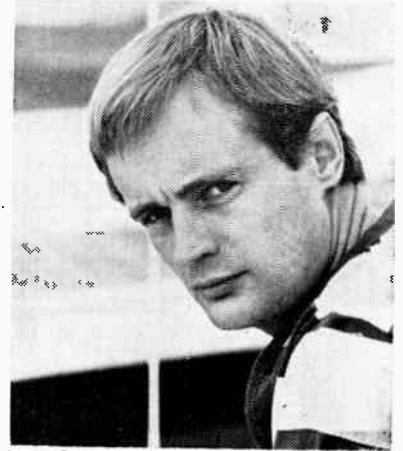

ing room for his hotel. But he finds he is wound up after the evening's performance, so he wanders out into the great foyer of the theatre and into the empty, darkened auditorium. Then, in his mind's eye, he relives the concert he and his fellow artists have just performed.

The program opens with the Bob Dylan favorite, *Blowin' in the Wind*, and includes such Belafonte perennials as *Shenandoah* and *Jamaica Farewell*.

Glamorous Nana Mouskouri, who sings the French-Canadian folksong *Un Canadien errant* and joins Belafonte in a Greek song, was born in Athens. She originally hoped for an operatic career, and was enrolled at the Conservatoire Hellenique. But the spell of jazz and folk music fell upon her when she heard American radio broadcasts.

Her first important appearance was a concert for the United States Sixth Fleet at the Athens port of Piraeus. Then she began to broadcast for Athens radio and the noted composer Manos Hadjidakis (who wrote the score for the film *Never on Sunday*) created songs especially for her. Since then, her recordings have made her known all over Europe.

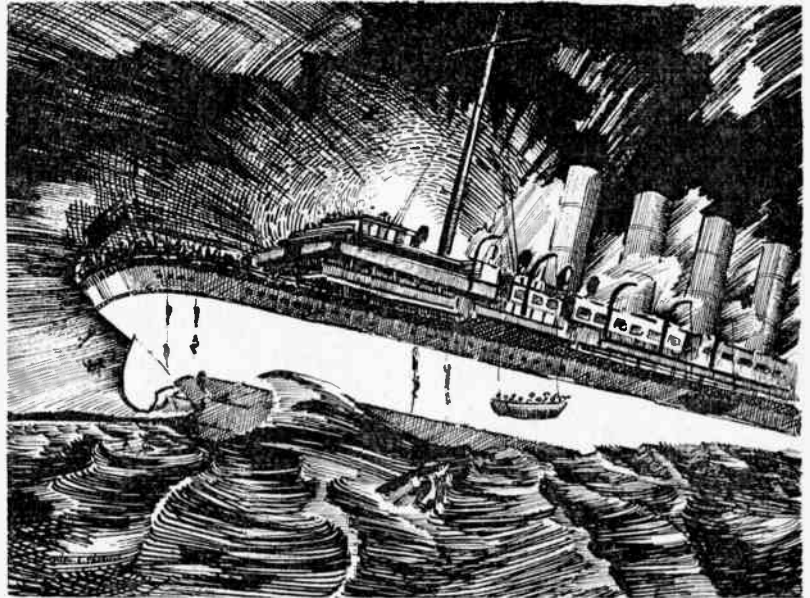

Project '66:

Rendezvous With Death



A REPEAT BROADCAST of the prize-winning documentary *Rendezvous with Death*, about the sinking of the Lusitania in 1915, will be heard on radio's *Project '66* this Sunday. Produced and narrated by Len Chapple of CBC Vancouver, this program was awarded the 1965 Italia Prize in international competition for the best radio documentary of the year.

Of the 800 persons who survived the disaster, several are still living, some of them in Canada. Among the survivors Chapple tracked down for their personal stories are: Charlotte Kelly and Mabel Henshaw of Vancouver; Soren Sorenson of Wainwright, Alta.; George Smith, of Nelson, B.C., at 83 the oldest of the survivors; Doris Lawlor of Toronto, the youngest; Harold Daly, of Ottawa; Mrs. Lucy Taylor, Niagara Falls, N.Y.; and Sir Harold Boulton, London, England.

The German U-Boat that sank the Cunard liner was the U-20, out of Wilhelmshaven. Her wireless operator, Otto Rikowski, is the last remaining crew-member and now lives quietly in retirement in Hamburg, where Chapple recorded his recollections of the affair.

With 1,959 souls aboard, the *Lusitania* left New York for Britain on May 1st, 1915, in defiance of warnings published in the American press by German authorities that shipping in "war zone" waters would be attacked by the German Navy. The luxury liner was the largest and fastest ship in the world, with a double bottom and an air space of five feet between her steel plates (with this in mind experts later queried why she sank in just 18 minutes). Seven days later, off Old Head of Kinsale, Ireland, the U-20 scored a direct hit on the liner. Among those passengers who went down with the ship were 114 Americans, a tragedy which did much to sway public opinion in the United States in favor of the Allies' cause. The incident set off a series of protests by the United States to Germany, one result of which was the resignation of Secretary of State William Jennings Bryan, who felt President Wilson's *Lusitania* note was too severe.

First heard in May this year, *Rendezvous with Death* will be broadcast Sunday, November 14th at 10:30 p.m. on *Project '66*.

The Best of IDEAS

A spoken-word program from the FM network comes to the
nation-wide AM network, Monday at 10:30 p.m.

CURRENTLY, Mondays through Fridays, at 6:30 p.m., the CBC-FM Radio Network is presenting *The Best Ideas You'll Hear Tonight*—a program described by its creators as “an experience in living-room education, designed to appeal to all persons who enjoy thinking.”

Commencing November 15th, 10:30 to 11:00 p.m., and each Monday thereafter at the same time, listeners to CBC-AM radio will be able to hear *The Best of Ideas*, offering a selection of material from *The Best Ideas You'll Hear Tonight*. The new programs replace two former CBC radio series, *University of the Air* and *The Learning Stage*, and are organized by Phyllis Webb and Bill Young. The producer is Janet Somerville.

The first offering on *The Best of Ideas* will be *The Creative Writer*, a series of seven lectures by the well-known Canadian poet, Dr. Earle Birney—starting November 15th and concluding on December 27th. In the course of his seven-week series, Dr. Birney will explore the idea of poetry as play and freedom, pathological syndromes in creation, subconscious inspiration and conscious control, the novel as a “mixed form,” Pop Art and Op Art parallels in literature, and current trends, theories and attitudes in modern poetry. In discussing the reasons and “unreasons” for literary creativity, he gives the talks a very personal slant and authenticity by revealing some of the processes by which he himself has arrived at a poem or a novel: reasons that are mad, mysterious, joyful, or compulsive—in fact, one of his lectures is entitled “Unreason, Madness and Exorcism of Poetry.”

Earle Birney is well known to
November 13th - 19th

CBC audiences both for his broadcasts and his writing. He uses radio as a very personal means of communication and brings his audience close to the subject through his own enthusiasm and something one might call a technique of verbal surprise. “Poetry,” Confucius said, “exhilarates; it lifts the spirit”—and Birney agrees: “Exhilaration. Yes, surely it is that breath-catching something that finally convinces us we are in the presence of a poem, that we have reached ‘that weird, wild clime that lieth sublime / Out of SPACE — out of TIME,’ the perilous Keatsian seas, perhaps, or merely the *Ya-honk* of Whitman’s wild gander in cool night, or only W. C. Williams’ red wheel-barrow in the rain. It works, for us. It swings.”

Dr. Birney’s reputation as a poet was established with his first book, *David and Other Poems* (1942). Both it and *Now Is Time* (1945) received the Governor-General’s Award for Poetry. Since then he has published a number of books, both poetry and fiction: *Strait of Anian* (1948), *Trial of a City*

(1952), *Ice Cod Bell or Stone* (1962), and his most recent collection of poems, *Near False Creek Mouth* (1964). His comic novel, *Turvey*, brought him the Leacock Medal for Humor in 1950; his second novel, *Down the Long Table*, appeared in 1955.

Michael Tippett Visits Canada

IN RESPONSE to an invitation from the CBC, the noted British composer, Michael Tippett, will visit Canada.

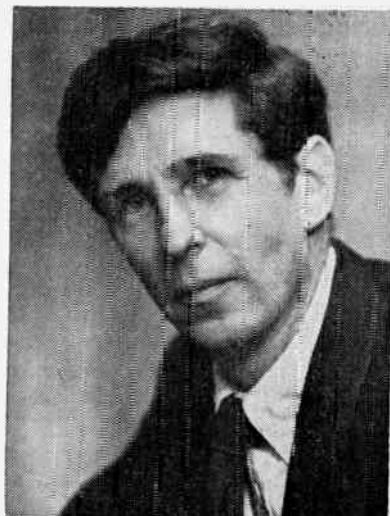
On CBC radio's *Concerts from Two Worlds*, Sunday, November 14th at 3:00 p.m. (9:00 p.m. in Alberta), the 60-year-old composer will conduct the Toronto

Symphony in a concert of three of his own works: *Concerto for Orchestra*; the second movement from *Divertimento on "Sellinger's Round" for Chamber Orchestra*; and *Suite in D*. The composer will introduce the concert, which will be repeated later on the CBC-FM radio network.

While in Toronto, Mr. Tippett will also record introductions and commentaries for a series of programs of recordings of his works, to be broadcast on CBC-FM under the title of *The Music of Michael Tippett*. In addition, he will give a lecture at the University of Toronto and this will be broadcast on the CBC-FM *Encores* program.

The first work on *Concerts from Two Worlds* program, *Concerts for Orchestra* (1962-63), is dedicated "To Benjamin Britten with affection and admiration in the year of his 50th birthday." The work was commissioned for the Edinburgh Festival, 1963, and was first performed by the London Symphony Orchestra conducted by Colin Davis, at the Usher Hall, Edinburgh, in August, 1963. The composer has described it as a "concerto for various instrumental ensembles." An English reviewer stated that what Tippett has done in the work is to strip down the symphonic orchestra into its component parts, and put them together again in a different and unusual order according to the thematic ideas they have to express. "The result is a constantly varied sound-spectrum reflecting changing contrasts and combinations of instrumental colors, and its immediate appeal to the ear is not the least of its attractive features." The performance will be the North American broadcast premiere of the work.

The second selection, *Lament from Divertimento on "Sellinger's Round" for Chamber Orchestra* (1953-54) was commissioned by Paul Sacher and is dedicated to him. It was first performed by the

Collegium Musicum Zurich conducted by Sacher in November, 1954. A variation of the traditional tune "Sellinger's Round" appears in all five movements. The second movement (the one we are to hear) was written for the Aldeburgh Festival, 1953, as a part of a composite work, *Variations on an Elizabethan Theme*, of which the other five movements were written by Lennox Berkley, Benjamin Britten, Arthur Oldham, Humphrey Searle, and William Walton. The solo violinist will be John Dembeck.

The concluding composition bears the title, *Suite in D (A Birthday Suite for Prince Charles)*. It was commissioned by the BBC in celebration of the birth of Prince Charles and was first performed by the BBC Symphony Orchestra conducted by Sir Adrian Boult, in November, 1948. The first movement is a chorale prelude on the hymn tune "Crimond"; the second uses a traditional French melody; the third, the march from Act I of Tippett's opera, *The Midsummer Marriage* and an Irish version of "All round my hat"; the fourth, the English medieval hymn "Angelus ad Virginem"; and the last, "Early one morning," the Helston Furry Dance, a "folk" tune of the composer's own invention, and material re-worked from the overture to his unpublished ballad opera, *Robin Hood*.

Radio Drama This Week

RADIO DRAMA this week is particularly rich and varied. It includes Farley Mowat's warmly hilarious reminiscences about his eccentric father, his dog, Mutt (a striking individualist), and himself as a boy, dramatized by Len Peterson for *CBC Stage* (Sunday, November 14th, at 1:00 p.m.); Molière's masterpiece, *Tartuffe*, the most successful of all his plays, in which he attacks religious hypocrisy with the precision of a master surgeon, adapted by George Woodcock for *Midweek Theatre* (Wednesday, November 17th, 9:00 p.m.); and *The Bold Ones*, a stirring account of Don Hernan Cortes (known in our Anglicized history books as Hernando Cortez) and 400 gold-greedy, hard-bitten Spanish adventurers who, with only 14 cannon, 16 horses and one beautiful, intelligent Indian girl, subdued the mighty Aztec empire of proud Montezuma nearly 450

years ago, in an atmosphere of greed, trickery, astonishing good fortune, queer coincidence and almost unexampled boldness.

William Strange, who wrote *The Bold Ones* for *CBC Tuesday Night* (November 16th), will introduce it with a talk at 8:05, followed by the drama at 8:30. Production will be by J. Frank Willis in the Toronto studios, with Mavor Moore, John Drainie and Jack Scott as narrators; Henry Comor as Pedro de Guzman, the Crossbowman; Sean Mulcahy as Juan de Catalan, a young man who has had his fill of fighting; Gillie Fenwick as Bernal Diaz del Castillo, a brave and splendid soldier who later became Governor of Santiago de Guatemala; Ruth Springford as Malinche, the Indian girl; Tony Van Bridge as Don Hernan Cortes; and with Alan King, Paul Harding, Gerry Parkes, Leslie Yeo, Frank Perry, Chris Wiggins, Henry Ramer, Wil-

liam Osler, and Alexander Webster. The musical score by Phil Nimmons, conducted by Samuel Hersenhoren, is based entirely on Aztec and other ancient Indian themes.

William Strange is a well-known Canadian freelance writer who was formerly director of information for the Royal Canadian Navy. Since 1961 he has spent a great deal of time in Mexico, studying the ancient civilizations. He says that *The Bold Ones* is the result of a year's research into the great story of Cortes and his conquest of Mexico, research which included much reading, and retracing of the fabulous 250-mile march of the Spaniards in 1519-20, from Vera Cruz to what is now Mexico City. Much of the music for the program is based on archaic Indian themes which he recorded in Mexico. In the national archives there he found preserved a large number of musical instruments used by the Aztecs, including clay flutes and drums of hollow logs over which sounding boards are suspended which produce a low-frequency rumble like that of a drum. He persuaded the conductor of the Mexican National Symphony Orchestra to interest

some of his woodwind section in playing the flutes. Some ancient musical scholar had been farsighted enough to write down many melody lines of Aztec folk music. So what the *CBC Tuesday Night* audience will hear is an exact facsimile of what Cortes listened to through the long and troubled night on the eve of his first militant encounter with the Aztec hordes.

Producer J. Frank Willis says this is as difficult and complicated a production as he has ever had to undertake. He will have to simulate the sounds of a vast company of men fighting in the mountains, on the plains, and talking by the seashore—each instance calling for a completely different sound perspective, to give the feeling of space in the out-of-doors. And the rhythms and pronunciations of the old languages, in place and people's names, present a real challenge to the cast. He is faced with a production of the *De Mille* scope, but

his long and varied experience in the world of sound promises some imaginative and original fare. He understands the limitations and the magical possibilities of radio as well as anyone in the medium.

Strange says: "The story of Cortes and his 400 adventurers is one of history's greatest. I never had more fun researching anything than this. How it has come out in radio form is, like any program, the listener's problem. Anyway, the events depicted all happened, unbelievable though it may seem; and the descriptions are all true, for I have seen the country and know it fairly well. I have sought to make the story as authentic as radio drama can be."

Farley Mowat, author of *The Dog That Wouldn't Be*, recalls that when he and his family were living in Saskatoon, his mother bought Mutt as a pup from a little boy for four cents, and in no time at all the Mowats discovered that they had a rare personality on their hands, a lopsided, honest, original and stubborn creature. "He was not really handsome," Mowat says, "yet he possessed the same sort of dignified grotesquerie which so distinguished Abraham Lincoln and the Duke of Wellington. He also possessed a peculiar *savoir-faire* that had a disconcerting effect upon strangers. So strong was Mutt's belief that he was not simply 'dog' that he was somehow able to convey this conviction to human onlookers. When he was asked to do something which did not please him, he would begin to mutter. If he were pressed, the muttering would grow in volume, rising and falling in pitch. It was not a growl, nor was it in the least threatening. It was a stubborn, bumbling sound, quite indescribable." Mutt rarely went motoring without goggles, which he adjusted nonchalantly with his paw. He taught himself to skip along the top of fences, and was the envy and bane of every cat in the neighborhood. He climbed trees and ladders with ease. He was addicted to sailing, and he adored fighting skunks. Mowat makes him almost, but not quite, bigger than life, but also richly funny and unconditionally loveable.

Len Peterson, who adapted the stories for radio, describes *The Dog That Wouldn't Be* as "a delightful book, and I had great fun working on the dramatization. The actor who'll play Mutt is going to have to do a great acting job. He has no words, but a lot to do, a great range of sounds and comments. It's a book that's going to be around for a long time, because it appeals to both adults and children. One of the things I like about Farley is that when he writes about or for kids, he doesn't write down to them."

Most of Peterson's time these days is devoted to polishing a novel he has been working on for a long time—*Joe Katona*—set on the prairies, where he grew up. He is also dramatizing a portion of *The Atonement of Ashley Morden*, by Fred Bosworth, for tv's *Show of the Week*.

Molière's *Tartuffe* will be directed in the Vancouver studios by Gerald Newman. It's a devastatingly funny exposé of religious hypocrisy and raw confidence trickery, built around a piously oily, destitute man who wheedles his way into a rich and honorable merchant's home and cleverly alienates the affections of nearly everyone, spoils the cosy atmosphere of home and hearth, and takes cruel advantage of his host's outrageous gullibility.

Michael Zenon has to study hard and practice dozens of new skills to keep his actions and words authentic on **THE FOREST RANGERS**, Saturday afternoons on CBC television.

FOR FIVE DAYS a week, Michael Zenon paddles a canoe, rides a horse, tracks down bears and other wild animals, helps find lost hunters and criminals in the dense bush and is hero and friend to the junior forest rangers of Indian River.

Michael plays Joe Two Rivers in

Playing Indian Can Be Hard Work

CBC tv's *The Forest Rangers*, seen each Saturday afternoon at 5:00 p.m., and what he does as Joe Two Rivers in the series is done exactly as by Indians and woodsmen.

Even Michael's clothes are authentic. His doeskin jacket was made especially for him by Chief Floating Cloud of the Brantford, Ont., Reserve.

From time to time, Michael has been taught the tricks of woodsmanship by real Indians or members of the Ontario department of lands and forests. For instance, an

Ojibway named Isaac Beaulieu often came out to the film studio to teach Michael and the junior rangers such things as setting a bear trap, how to send and read smoke signals, how to track down someone in the bush and to mark a trail so that others can follow.

During filming of one of the episodes, some lands and forests department men set a carefully controlled bush fire so that Michael and the junior rangers could act out a rescue scene.

The forestry men have also kindly supplied beavers, wolves, deer, and even rattlesnakes to give the series a more authentic touch.

For Michael Zenon who was born in the Ukraine 30 years ago, playing Indian Joe sometimes seems a bit strange. As a youngster, he heard and read a little about North American Indians but then the war came and Michael had little time to think about anything except staying alive in Nazi Germany. He was separated from his family and wasn't reunited with them until after the war.

In 1948, he came to Canada with his mother, father and sister and settled in St. Catharines, Ont. A few years later, they moved to Toronto where Michael attended high school. He left high school to wander all over the United States and Canada, working as an oil driller, miner, truck driver, bulldozer operator and finally as a dynamiter and depth sounder on the St. Lawrence Seaway.

He was always interested in acting and in 1961, received the best actor award in the Dominion Drama Festival. He played the lead in *Rashomon*. He has appeared in all major CBC television dramas, plus many films and stage productions.

He is married and has two children, a boy and a girl. His hobby is racing motor cars. He owns a Porsche and belongs to a number of automobile racing clubs.
