Rich is back February 6th with guests comedienne Barbara Hamilton and vibraphonist Peter Appleyard.

BRIEFLY NOTED . . .

Medical science has not only lowered the infant mortality rate but has also lengthened the lives of Canadians. However, there are thousands of older people who have nowhere to go but nursing homes, and the question arises whether these homes are being adequately administered. At present, the responsibility for such administration is a municipal one, and there are no federal standards to maintain. Should there be? On Sunday night, February 6th, *This Hour Has Seven Days* will present an in-depth study of Canadian nursing homes. Producer Jim Carney has visited several homes and examined their administration and facilities.

The Carl Tapscott Singers will be heard this week in a special program to mark the start of White Cane Week. Recorded before an audience at the Canadian National Institute for the Blind in Toronto, the program will be broadcast Sunday night, following the hockey game on radio. The guest soloist will be soprano Lisa Ference, who is herself blind. Miss Ference will also appear on *CBC Metronome* on February 5th.

Two Quebec farm families whose ways of life provide strong contrast with each other will be the subject of two programs in CBC-TV's *This Land of Ours* series. The first program, to be seen Saturday, February 5th, will visit the small farm of Joseph Ferland, one of the farmers who still hold with the old ways of doing things and to whom tradition is more important than progress. The subsequent program will deal with the farm of Ernest Montandon, who combines progressive farming theories with North American technology.

CBC radio's *Music Scene* program, which has originated every Friday at 10:30 p.m. from Mont-

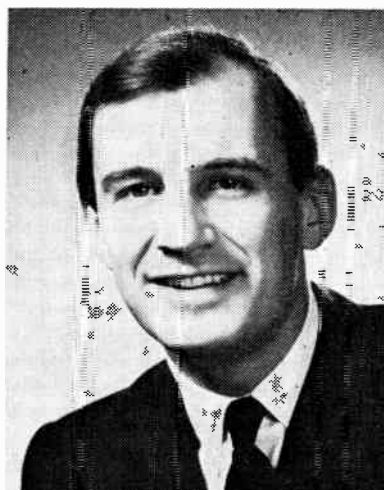

real through the fall and winter, undergoes a change of venue this week. Starting February 11th the title changes to *Music Scene: Prairies*, and the programs will be coming from Winnipeg and Edmonton. The first show, *Portrait of a Prairie City*, will feature the Neil Harris Singers and Orchestra, and singer Reg Gibson.

The opener of the series, says producer Jack Bingham, "will present a picture in words and music of the city of Winnipeg as it is today. It will describe the features for which the city has a right to be famous — the unusually wide downtown streets, the largest freight yards in the world, the railroad stations and the people who come and go there, the ultra-modern airport, the Royal Winnipeg Ballet, the quaint older part of the city where the streets bear girls' names, the unmistakably 'foreign' flavor of North Winnipeg, St. Boniface, Assiniboine Park and its zoo, Rainbow Stage, and the nightclubs."

Since the early 1950s, migration to the United Kingdom has brought the West Indian population of Britain to about a half-million, a little under half the total colored population of the country. In recent months, broadcaster Nancy Bacal has interviewed hundreds of West Indians in areas where they have settled: the London districts of Notting Hill and Brixton, and the cities of Nottingham, Birmingham, Wolverhampton, and Cardiff. In homes, clubs, and places of work, she discussed immigrants' problems with people from Barbados, Jamaica, Trinidad, and British Guiana. She found the central theme of the conversations was their isolation and alienation from the mainstream of British society. The results of her work will be heard in a program entitled *The Strange Presence*, on *CBC Tuesday Night*, February 8th, at 11:05.



David Halton

DAVID C. HALTON has been appointed the new CBC correspondent in Paris, and will take up his duties this month. He succeeds Stanley Burke, who has been appointed to the post of roving European correspondent for the CBC, with headquarters in London.

At 26, David Halton is one of the youngest foreign correspondents in the CBC's history. Born in England, he is the son of Matthew Halton, famous Canadian war correspondent and chief European correspondent for the CBC during the post-war years. Like his father, David was the winner of an IODE scholarship, and attended the University of Toronto, being graduated with an honors B.A. in modern history. During summer vacations he worked as a reporter for the *Calgary Herald* and the *Ottawa Citizen*.

In 1962 he won a French government scholarship for post-graduate work in French politics at the Institute of Political Studies in Paris. Later he remained in Europe as a freelance broadcaster, contributing to CBC news and public affairs programs. He returned to Canada in August, 1964, to work in the Montreal bureau of *Time* magazine, and in July, 1965, joined CBC television news as a writer and editor.

A Quiet Campaign for Dignity

TELESCOPE interviews an Indian
princess, Thursday, February 10th.



A PORTRAIT of a beautiful, articulate Canadian Indian who is helping her people to help themselves, and explaining to the white man the ancient and rich traditions of their close-to-nature life, will be presented on TV's *Telescope* on Thursday night, February 10th. The film was shot in September, mostly on the Odanak Reserve, which rubs shoulders with the village of Pierreville, on the broad and graceful St. Francis River about 70 miles northeast of Montreal.

This 33-year-old with the melodious name of Alanis (Ah-la-*nees*) Obomsawin, was born on the Reserve, the only survivor in a family of five children. Her mother was an Abenaki

Indian, a medicine-maker, and her father was a guide.

The name Obomsawin means pathfinder, and that is what Alanis is for her people, with the result that the tribal elders have rechristened her Princess Ko-Li-La-Wato (You Have Pleased Us). Until she was eight she spoke only her tribal language, but when she left the Reserve to attend school, she had to learn French. Her father had TB for seven years, and when he was dying and no longer able to support his family, Alanis had to leave school in grade seven to go to work for \$5.00 a week.

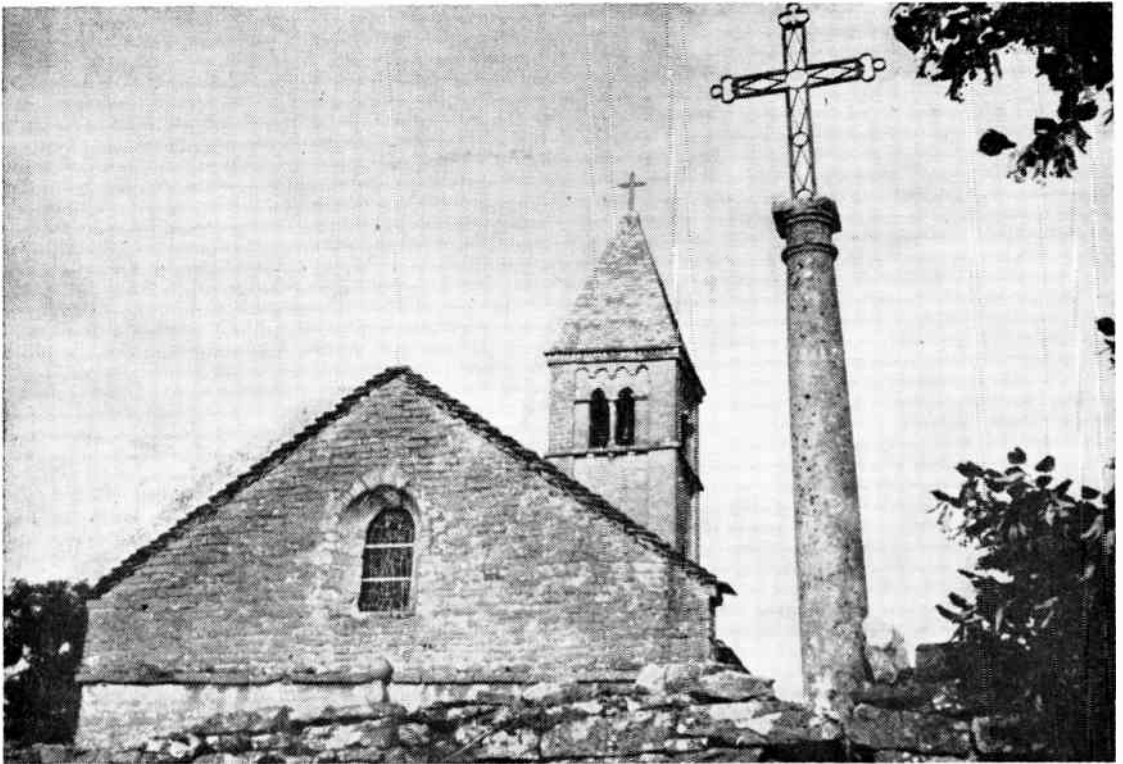
The St. John has its source in the state of Maine, then flows through the province of New Brunswick to its mouth in the Bay of Fundy. The history of this river is typical of

Protestant Monastery

HERITAGE visits an experiment in ecumenism, in France.

"IN ESTABLISHING at Taizé a communal life in the art of Protestantism, my sole wish," says Prior Roger Schutz, "was to gather some men together who might be an existential sign of unity." With this simple statement, Schutz explains on *Heritage Sunday* why he founded, 25 years ago, the monastery which has made the name of Taizé synonymous with ecumenism, and to which pilgrims of various denominations from many countries come to learn the way of Christian unity.

Taizé is a small village in France, just north of Cluny in the province of Burgundy. In medieval times Cluny was a great centre of the Christian church in western Europe. A Benedictine abbey was founded there in 910 which spread its influence all over Europe. A basilica, now almost gone, that was built a

century later was the greatest church in western Christendom until the building of St. Peter's in Rome. It was mostly because of this historical background that Schutz chose nearby Taizé as the site for his experiment. One of the brothers explains: "This proximity to Cluny was for the Prior one of the most important reasons for coming to this neighborhood. He said, 'If we, as Christians of the Reformation, want to start something new, what is new for us, we should know that for centuries and centuries other Christians lived this life. There is always a link between the tradition and the event. Starting something new, you should know what happened before.'"

Schutz, the son of a Swiss Calvinist pastor, was an agnostic in his youth. He later entered the ministry, *(Please turn to page 33)*

FOUR DRAMAS on radio and TV this week take a look—sometimes with tongue well in cheek, sometimes in lyrically serious mood—at the big and little events that separate and unite us, and at the extraordinary things that can motivate our thinking—extraordinary in the fact that to the outside observer they often seem so unimportant. These plays represent the work of four internationally known authors.

On Wednesday evening, February 9th, at 8:30 p.m., *Bob Hope Theatre* presents a CBC production: *The Others*, by American novelist-dramatist Richard Lortz, who writes with a lively charm that has been attracting favorable attention ever since his first novel, *A*

DRAMA: The Big and Little Events of Life

Crowd of Voices, appeared in 1958. This play, produced and directed by David Gardner, concerns a man and wife who are stranded in their seldom-used country home when a blizzard blows up suddenly. As the landscape disappears under a thick white blanket that muffles outdoor sounds, the highly strung wife begins to hear children's voices, and is convinced that there are others in the house besides themselves.

Michael Kane and Anna Cameron play the stranded couple, with Paisley Maxwell as the mother; Kirstin Campbell as Jessica; and Danny MacIlravey as John.

Last year Miss Cameron returned to acting after eight years as hostess of the CBC-TV afternoon series, *Take 30*. A few weeks ago in Toronto she starred in a Crest Theatre production of Edward Albee's *Tiny Alice*. Michael Kane was seen on TV's *Festival* in November, in one of the title roles of *Héloïse and Abélard*.

Another Wednesday night drama, in radio's *Midweek Theatre* series at 9:00, will be *Tin*, by Gunther Eich, one of Germany's leading poet-playwrights. It has been translated and adapted by Otto Lowy, who prepared several Eich works for CBC radio on other occasions. This one, directed by Gerald Newman in the Vancouver studios, is set against a background of governmental tea parties, bistros and streets of romantic Paris, the haunts of a group of young people exiled from a South American country because of their opposition to the regime. Their political and personal integrity is influenced in varying degrees by the economic and political pressures of representatives of the country from which they have fled. Practical circumstances play their part, of course, in how these young people react to their situations, and there are hidden motives involved, too. Like all of Eich's plays, *Tin* is liberally steeped in lyricism and mystery. Almost all his work has been for radio—he uses the sound medium as if it were an enormous canvas, with words the brush and emotion the paint.

A 1964 Italia prize-winning radio play, *Charged to Your Account*, by Ludvik Askenazy, a Czech whose writing reminds one of Samuel Beckett and Eugene Ionesco, will be presented in the *CBC Stage* series on Sunday, February 6th, at 1:00 p.m. It's a tragedy of the Second World War years, as seen by a man of our day. The characters in the play are divided by the chasm of Nazi war folly, and united by their anxieties and joys, tragic situations and happy ones.

Askenazy says: "It is a piece in which it is very important to understand the character of the situations which there isn't time to develop. It is also necessary to understand special implications in intonations, pauses and undulations in the dialogue." Very often in this play a brief silence, adroitly placed, tells the listener more than a spate of words.

The principal character is Mr. Postlethwaite, who works in the department of statistics in Prague, and who has just celebrated his 40th birthday. The author has abandoned the traditional scheme of chronological time and logical discourse in favor (Please turn to page 15)

When she was 22, Pierreville prejudice against her people—villagers called her “the savages”—forced her to leave home and learn English so she could make a new life for herself. In Montreal she became a beautician and a folk singer, and started her campaign to improve conditions for the Abenakis. With her dignity, intelligence and beauty to help her, she tried to persuade the white man that the Indian is not a savage but just a fellow Canadian who doesn't value material things as the white man does, and considers his treasures to be the land he loves and the beauties of nature which he has learned to cherish and enjoy with all his senses. Each can learn from the other, she points out, and she hopes

to bring them closer together by her work and example.

Indians have lived in Odanak for three centuries, and there are about 300 of them left there today, in an area a mile long and three miles wide. For centuries they enjoyed the clear, shallow water of the old St. Francis. Now the picturesque river is polluted. So the town fathers of Pierreville built a swimming pool, and although its green surface reflects the cross of Christian tolerance on a nearby church, the Indians were not allowed to use it. Miss Obomsawin decided that the Abenaki children should have a pool, too, and set out to raise the necessary \$12,000—arranged countless concerts of tribal songs and dances, sales of Indian crafts, gave lectures, appeared on TV, and asked for donations from friends and strangers.

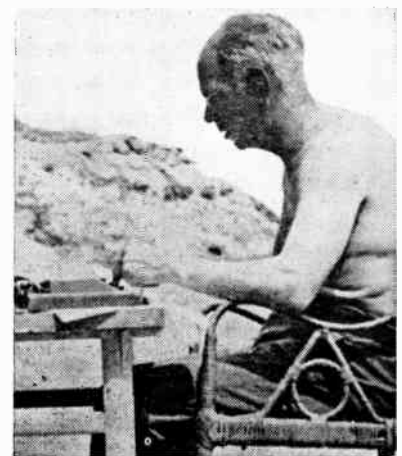

Madeleine coquettishly asks Chenier to improvise upon the theme of love, which he willingly does. He speaks of the pride of the rich and its effect upon the poor. All are indignant at his lack of taste and the countess orders the musicians to strike up a dance. A clamor is heard without and Gerard appears, followed by a crowd of ragged men and women.

Act II. Paris 1794. The Cafe Hottot. Chenier sits by himself at one table, Bersi and the spy at another. Bersi asks whether it is true that spies are being sent through the city and the spy notes the query in a book with the opinion that both Bersi and Chenier will bear watching. Roucher brings Chenier's passport and begs him to leave Paris. He refuses, saying that he loves an unknown lady who he is to meet that day. When darkness falls, Madeleine comes to meet Chenier. The spy is watching and hurries away to report to Gerard. They avow their love and are about to fly when Gerard intercepts them. Roucher interferes and escorts the girl to her home. Chenier and Gerard fight and Gerard is wounded. He warns Chenier that he is condemned and begs him to save Madeleine.

Act III. The Revolutionary Tribunal. The spy tells Gerard that Chenier has been arrested and that Madeleine is not far away. He is urged to sign papers denouncing Chenier, as Madeleine appears on the threshold. He tells her Chenier is in prison and passionately declares his love for her. Madeleine's grief moves Gerard and he promises to do what he can. The mob comes into the Tribunal. The prisoners are brought in and Chenier is denounced as a traitor. Gerard rushes forward crying that the indictment is false and inspired by jealous hate. But Chenier is led away by the angry mob.

Act IV. The prison of St. Lazare. Midnight. Chenier is seated, writing. Roucher stands near. The poet reads the verses he has just composed and the two friends say farewell. Madeleine enters with Gerard. She offers the gaoler money to substitute her for an-

Works By Canadian Composers

Compositions by Jean Papineau-Couture, Alexander Brott, John Beckwith and Norman Symonds are performed on CBC radio.

WORKS BY FOUR leading Canadian composers will be featured on radio this week. On Sunday, February 6th, listeners can hear the world première of a piano concerto commissioned by the CBC from Jean Papineau-Couture, who is also a violinist, conductor and professor of music at the University of Montreal. The performance, by Gilles Manny and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra conducted by Alexander Brott, will be heard in the *Concerts from Two Worlds* series at 3:00 p.m. (9:00 p.m. in Alberta). The program will also include Brott's *Concordia*, and *Flower Variations* and *Wheels* by John Beckwith. And the *Monday Concert* on February 7th at 11:00 p.m. will include *Elegy for String Orchestra* by Toronto composer Norman Symonds, played by the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Victor Feldbrill. (The program will also include Samuel Barber's *Concerto for Piano and Orchestra*, with Michael Rogers as soloist.)

Jean Papineau-Couture tells us: "I began working on my piano concerto last summer, and finished it on November 22nd, which is the day of St. Cecilia, patron saint of musicians — whether there's any symbolic significance in that, I don't know! The concerto requires an orchestra of only moderate size. The piano is playing most of the time—there are no long passages for the orchestra alone, as there are in the standard concerto. The style is chromatic, not serial. It's not tonal, without being frankly atonal. It has only one movement, and two main motifs, both given by the piano. The first is at the beginning when the piano is alone, the second is scherzo-like, about two measures long, repeated often

by the the piano accompanied by the snare drum."

On the same day as the première of the piano concerto, the Montreal Symphony Orchestra will give the first performance of another Papineau-Couture work, *Concerto for Orchestra*, at a concert for children. The composer says he is currently looking for a text for a work he plans to write for the Festival Singers of Toronto.

Concordia, one of Alexander Brott's early works (1947), is a symphonic poem, the title of which is derived from the coat-of-arms of the City of Montreal—"Concordia Salus."

John Beckwith's *Flower Variations* and *Wheels* were written in 1962 for the Victoria Symphony Orchestra, and dedicated to the memory of his father, Harold A. Beckwith. "*Flower Variations*," says the composer, "uses a theme which is a kind of memento of a past era, a nostalgic and homely melody announced first of all by a solo flute. This piece should be taken to embody my sentimental memories of Victoria. In the same fashion, *Wheels* perhaps recalls the vigor of cycling days there—cycling having been just about my only athletic accomplishment as a teenager. (I found pleasure re-creating it, in rural Ontario surroundings, during the summer when I was working on the piece.)"

Norman Symonds's *Elegy for String Orchestra*, first performed in 1963, is his first full-scale venture into the field of traditional concert music, after having distinguished himself as a jazz composer, although he had combined jazz and classical styles in earlier works. His *Elegy* effectively exploits string sonorities in a rather melancholy mood.

POETS in a cellar

PROJECT '66 tunes in on a discussion between several young poets and two successful literary figures, Sunday at 10:30 p.m.

A GROUP of young and virtually unknown poets met in a Toronto jazz cellar recently to read and talk about their work with poet Earle Birney and Austin C. Clarke, the novelist. Some of the young poets have been published in small magazines, some have not. But together they represent a cross-section of Canada's young verse-writers struggling to express their views of life.

Project '66 recorded the session for broadcast this week. As Howard Engel and Dita Vadron, producer and production assistant respectively, explain: "The resulting program is virtually the raw tape of that evening's talk. It is informal, relaxed, and at times incomprehensible, but that's the way it was. As an experimental Project, the program, it is hoped, will bring the listener in touch with what poets of the moment are writing and thinking about."

Those heard on the program, besides Birney and Clarke, are: Marita Enzo, Stephanie Nynych, Victor Coleman, Paul Bâby, Mervyn Procope, and Joe Rosenblatt. Marita Enzo reads *Pastel Shadings*, a

poem by a writer who prefers to remain anonymous; Paul Bâby reads two of his own works, *Reaching Another Barrier* and *Inferno*; Victor Coleman reads his *An Object*, *The Complete Room*, and *The Apple Orchard*; and Joe Rosenblatt reads his comic verse, *Waiter There's An Alligator in My Coffee*.

Birney and Clarke discuss these poems with the writers, analyzing their structure and the techniques employed. The two established writers also read from their own recent works, Birney from *Near False Creek Mouth* and Clarke from his novel *Amongst Thistles and Thorns*. Birney's readings include *For George Lemming*, written as a tribute to the author of *In the Castle of My Skin*; *Hot Springs*, a satiric poem written after a holiday in Mexico at a plush resort; and *Billboards Build Freedom of Choice*, the fruit of a holiday in Oregon where on some highways a multitude of billboards assault the eye.

Amongst Thistles and Thorns is Clarke's second novel. His first, published in 1964, was *The Survivors of the Crossing*. Last year he was awarded the Belmont Award, a \$1,000 prize offered annually by the sponsors, a tobacco company and the magazine *Saturday Night*, for the best short story submitted.

Earle Birney moved from Vancouver last year to take up his position as writer-in-residence at the University of Toronto. He had previously been head of the English faculty at the University of British Columbia, where he had been a professor since 1946. He was chosen to head the Canadian contingent invited to participate in the poetry festival of the Commonwealth Arts Festival held in Britain last year.

the history of all the Maritime provinces, where the land was fought over successively by Indian, French and English. Memories of these struggles are fading now, but along the St. John River, perhaps more than elsewhere in Canada, history is dying hard.

The changes are symbolized by the ambitious Mactaquac Hydro Electric project, which will change the peaceful river from Fredericton to Woodstock into a huge lake

59 miles long and 2½ miles wide. It will provide the province with relatively cheap electrical energy for its mining, chemical and pulp and paper industries. But with it comes a price, and, as the program shows, for some this price is too high. The lake will wipe out some of the richest agricultural lands in Canada, force about 3,000 people to leave their homes and flood many historic sites.

Threats like this disturb New Brunswickers, for they're rightly proud of their history. Many of their settlements date back to the time of the American Revolution and were founded by men and women who left all their possessions behind in New England to remain faithful to King and Country.

Americans of course had heard of the St. John long before the revolution. The river had been established on the map as early as 1604, when Champlain entered it while still a member of De Monts' expedition. La Tour had built a fort at its mouth in 1631, d'Aulnay Charnisay had destroyed the fort 10 years later and built another across the harbor, and, nine years after that, Charnisay had been displaced by an English expedition operating in the name of Oliver Cromwell.

After the fall of Louisbourg a force of 2,000 men under Colonel Robert Monckton had arrived, rebuilt the old French fort and renamed it Fort Frederick. Four years later New England merchants had built a post at the river mouth for fishing and burning limestone and through their efforts a small trade had begun in fish, lime, lumber and fur. But no real development of the St. John was attempted before the British forces were defeated in America. When the agents of the Loyalists arrived,

the population at the river mouth numbered only 145. A little over a year later the city of Saint John had been established.

But it's the capital city, Fredericton, smaller and more secluded, that preserves the image of early New Brunswick intact. It's a mirror of the Loyalist mind—Fredericton's bells still chime with an English sound across this Canadian river. They kept it alive here, the British fact in America; they kept it alive from the end of the 18th century until today. But now they are threatened, and they know it.

By contrast, the people of the Margaree valley in Nova Scotia aren't threatened by immediate change. Their river winds through quietly beautiful meadows and farmlands, with no industry to speak of, and none planned for the immediate future. For this program, the Margaree's serene beauty seemed to demand a legend which is enacted by two Maritime performers — Antonia McGrath and David Fraser.

The third river, the Humber of Newfoundland, manages to combine the demands of industry with the claims of the provincial tourist bureau. Cornerbrook, at its mouth on the west coast, boasts the largest pulp and paper mill in the world, while a little over 50 miles away, at Big Falls, tourists can see the spectacle of Atlantic salmon leaping along to their birthplace, to spawn and die.

Rivers to the Sea was filmed in the three Atlantic provinces last summer by David Carr of CBC Halifax. The program was produced and directed by Michael Rothery and written by Clement Perron. Its three segments are narrated by: John Scott (the St. John), Budd Knapp (the Margaree) and J. Frank Willis (the Humber). — *Eric Baillie.*

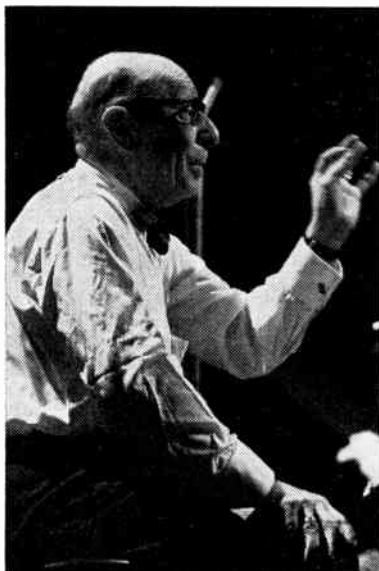

On Wednesday night, February 9th, at 10:30, the *Distinguished Artist* in recital, violinist Hyman Goodman, concertmaster of the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, will play Stravinsky's *Suite Italienne* (1934). This work is from the composer's 1919 ballet, *Pulcinella*, after Pergolesi. Goodman's accompanist will be George Brough.

after studying at Lausanne and Strasbourg, and went to France in 1940, where for two years he sheltered refugees from the occupied parts of the country at his house in Taizé. When Taizé itself finally came under German occupation he returned to Switzerland in order to keep alive the community he had begun to develop. After the war he went back to Taizé and was given a small church that had been built by Cluny monks in the 12th century. It was in this small Roman Catholic church (restored by them) that the Protestant brothers really began their life together as a proper community.

The community drew only criticism at first, largely because monasticism in Christianity is not a characteristic of the Protestant church. Protestants were inclined to think that of the three monastic principles — poverty, celibacy, and obedience (to the Brother-Prior) — the second would alienate the community from the world around them. In his book *The Rule of Taizé*, a guide to the discipline of the community, the Prior says: "If celibacy brings greater availability to concern oneself with the things of God, it is acceptable only in order to give oneself more fully to one's neighbor with the very love of Christ."

The 65 brothers of Taizé are very much a part of the world today. Among them are physicians, psychologists, artists, and others like Brother Michel, who lectures on social and economic conditions in the world, or Brother Pascal, a young American who translates the written works of Taizé into English. The brothers have their own printing presses, a work-shop for making stained glass windows, and a pottery. Brother Frank describes on the *Heritage* program some of the varied activities at Taizé. "From the beginning," he says, "the brothers were convinced that the contemplative lives his life in the service of his fellow man. It was clear for them that they should commit themselves as much as possible in the society of man. In our rule, there is a sentence that says: 'Open yourself to all that which is human.' That means for us that in Taizé itself we try to work as other people do, living from the work of our hands. In the pottery, several brothers work out some artistic works we sell, there is a workshop where we make stained glass windows for churches all over the world, and there are some brothers who make paintings, and one brother who is a sculptor."

The community survived critical attacks and over the years began

to attract world-wide attention from both Protestants and Roman Catholics. A group of young people from Germany (the German Action of Reconciliation) came to Taizé to construct a church of reconciliation, as they have gone to other countries that suffered at German hands in the last war. And for over a year now there has been a small group of Franciscans living in Taizé separate from the priory but united in the spirit of brotherhood. Brother Frank describes how Taizé also sends its members out to work in other communities: "Brothers are sent out to live among the miserable, among the poor, among the de-Christianized masses. Some of the brothers live in Lyons, where one is a truck-driver. This work is the action into which we are pushed by the contemplation, as the action pushes us back into the contemplation. Four brothers conduct a retreat in New Hampshire, three brothers are at university in the state of Wisconsin. There are brothers in Africa, brothers among the dockers in Marseilles, brothers working in factories in England, brothers who work in prison." Some of the brothers also attended Vatican II as observers.

For the many pilgrims who visit Taizé the brothers have accommodation for study sessions, at which they discuss ecumenism, the many problems existing in the world today and how Christian unity can tackle these problems. Usually, during the summer months, sessions last about two weeks at a time, with about 60 participants, many of them young people, from different countries and different churches.

The *Heritage* program, produced and directed by Leo Rampen, is in two parts, sub-titled *Sign of Unity* (this week's edition) and *Dynamic for Tomorrow* (telecast date February 13th). It was filmed at Taizé by Roger Moride. Program organizer for *Heritage* is Helen O'Brien. —Dill Hatton.

'The Doctor' Gives a 'Check-Up'

*Percy Saltzman is the new host of CBC radio's
national telephone forum, heard Sundays.*

PERCY SALTZMAN, who for more than 12 years has been appearing on CBC-TV and radio as interviewer, host and weatherman, took on a new role recently. As the new host of CBC radio's *Cross-Country Check-Up* (heard "live," Sunday nights at 5:30 p.m. CST/4:30 MST), he is on the receiving end of a nation-wide telephone hook-up on which Canadians from coast to coast tell him what's on their minds. (Like father, like son: Percy's son Paul recently made his debut as host of CBC-TV's *Through the Eyes of Tomorrow*.)

"I think the *Check-Up* series shows great promise," says Saltzman. "It's the only one in Canada that opens the line to the whole country. I believe it's healthy for every Canadian to be able to tell other Canadians what he thinks about topics that concern us all—and what he thinks about opinions of other Canadians."

Saltzman first stepped in as a temporary replacement (for former host Brad Crandall) on a program earlier in the series—one of the most controversial so far. The topic was: Should Canada Become a Republic? "I went through a real baptism of fire on that one," he recalls. Calls were received from points all across Canada, and one came from as far away as Aberdeen, Scotland—from a gentleman who wanted to express his opinion about the monarchy.

Not all of the opinions received have been about the topics under discussion; many have been about the show itself. "Imagine the CBC wasting money on programs like this . . ." wrote an irate lady from Winnipeg. "Congratulations. A real comeback for radio . . ." said a Belleville university student. "Don't allow yourselves to be intimidated, and for goodness' sake don't apologize . . ." pleaded a Montreal man.

The program's producers, Andrew Simon in Montreal and Moses Znaimer in Toronto, think of it as "an instant public-opinion poll." They claim that if the professional pollsters had heard the program on the eve of the last federal election they would not have been surprised at the

result. "It was obvious from our calls that evening," says Znaimer, "that Canadians were in no mood for a drastic change."

One feature of the series that differentiates it from other "open-line" programs is that *Check-Up* has in-studio guests who are well acquainted with topics under discussion; also, telephone hook-ups are arranged with people who are specifically qualified to express opinions on subjects. Another special feature is the "ombudsman" segment, in which cases of alleged injustice are aired and solutions sought.

Anyone, anywhere in the country, can take part in the discussions, simply by calling, collect, to CBC's Montreal studios.
