






On Our Cover . . .

CBC Winnipeg drama producer Tony Ross reminisces about his homeland, Ireland, on BETWEEN OURSELVES, 8:00 p.m., March 16th – the eve of St. Patrick's Day. The shots on our cover were taken by Tony's wife while the Ross' were in Ireland recently. Top left, a round tower, dating from the eighth or ninth centuries, in which monks concealed themselves and sacred objects of the monastery during raids by the Vikings. AN INTRIGUING mystery of the North will be disclosed Monday, March 14th at 7:30 p.m. on *Points West* (CBC radio). Gerald Malaher, director of the Manitoba Wildlife Branch, will talk for the first time in public about the mystery of the inland seals of the Northwest Territories.

Seals that are ordinarily found in Hudson Bay have somehow turned up far inland. How they got there, no one knows, nor is there any indication of how long they have been there.

The discovery of these seals presents a baffling puzzle. Far from civilization, they exist in a few colonies on inland water. It is believed they may be a new and unique sub-species.

Ottawa authorities are now faced with a need to protect the seals from native fishermen, who may destroy them because they damage fishing nets.

A PRESSING PROBLEM of our time is the mounting death toll from accidents of all kinds. Accidents have become the leading cause of death in some age groups, particularly among children.

Parents intent on protecting their children from the menace of accidental death or injury should watch a series of programs currently in progress on Western School Telecasts, each Wednesday at 10:00 a.m. on CBC-TV. Beginning March 9th and continuing weekly until April 6th, the programs start with 15 minutes of safety rules for school children. The final 15 minutes is directed to parents of voung children, telling them how they can help ensure a safer life for the young. The children's programs deal with safety in the street, while walking, at play, in the water and at home. The adults' segments are entitled Stop, Look and Listen, A Seat Belt for Susie, Behind Closed Doors, Be Water Wise and Doorway to Death.

CBC-TV will carry about 30 hours weekly of color programming in its 1966 fall schedule, according to

plans now completed. The CBC itself will produce about one-third of these programs on its own electronic facilities and on film. The rest will be imported network and film color series.

English-language regional CBC stations carrying the network color programming in the fall will be Vancouver, Edmonton, Winnipeg, Toronto, Montreal, Ottawa, Halifax, and St. John's, Newfoundland. Technical difficulties may delay for a few weeks the color transmission in some of these areas.

Virtually all CBC affiliates will carry the network color programs in the fall.

The network will concentrate its studio production on the bigger television shows such as *Show of the Week*, and *Festival*. A mobile unit available to the network will telecast sports such as hockey and outdoor spectaculars and will also be used in conjunction with a studio to produce other variety programs out of Toronto.

Already the CBC is starting color filmed programs for Centennial Year, including *Camera Canada* and *Canada* 99, with its series on the rivers of Canada. The color facilities at Expo '67 will be available for use occasionally during

1967 until the fall when the CBC takes them over completely.

The CBC French-language network will carry about 15 hours of weekly color programming in the fall. CBC will produce most of this, since there is no pool of foreign-language French color production to call on.

Total cost for the first stage of the conversion of CBC facilities was set last June by government policy at a maximum of \$15,000,000. This will enable the conversion of the CBC's main regional transmitters to carry color programs from the English- and Frenchlanguage networks. It will also enable the installation of telecine chains in these regions for telecasting some color film programs. The regions will not yet be able to produce studio shows in color.

The CBC rebroadcasting stations and off-network relay transmitters serving smaller communities cannot be converted at this stage to carry color. CBC has made plans for this conversion, and for the addition of regional facilities for live color production. However, at this time, government authorization is limited to the \$15,000,000 as just outlined, and the rate of future development is not yet known.

What's Behind 'Beatlemania'?

Through the Eyes of Tomorrow asks a psychiatrist to explain teen-age exuberance.

FOR THOSE who have heard about, but never actually witnessed, what is called "Beatle-mania," the following description by the head of BBC-TV Light Entertainment, Tom Sloane, may shed some light. "The whole arena is in an uproar-the fans are screaming themselves hoarse and the Beatles themselves are clearly showing the strain of this extraordinary occasion. This is the climax of Beatlemania . . . What happens is fairly easy to describe. As soon as the Beatles appear on any stage, their fans start screaming—and continue to scream until they leave. The noise is absolutely deafening and hardly a note of the music or a word of the lyrics can be heard. Just why it happens this way is a

Designer Margit Bennet presents the fifth of her series of six talks about Design Without Accident. The program also includes a commentary and book reading. Despite nine successful seasons, this year's JULIETTE Show has incorporated many new ideas.

Juliette's Tenth Season

THIS IS JULIETTE's tenth year as star of her own show, and viewers might have been forgiven for assuming that the successful artist would stick to the tried-and-true formulas of the past.

However, this year's show has more new features than any past season. An outstanding example, popular with many viewers, is "This Week"—the part of the show that presents new performers, as well as established artists, in brief appearances usually timed to coincide with their openings at night clubs or coffeehouses, releases of new recordings and concert appearances. "This Week" thus provides a capsule glimpse of the Canadian entertainment scene, not only in Toronto, but in other major Canadian centres.

Juliette's musical director, the distinguished composer-arranger-conductor Lucio Agostini, has added his talents to the show for the first time this season, along with the Art Hallman Singers. Stan Sellen and other designers have been experimenting with more structurally simple settings.

Mark Warren, who gained valuable experience as floor director and close associate of Paddy Sampson in such productions as the Festival Duke Ellington special and Show of the Week's Harry Belafonte hour, took over direction and production of the Juliette show last fall. Warren, a former U.S. Air Force accountant, fell in love with Canada during an assignment in Ottawa several years ago and stayed on to make a career in televison. So far as is known, Warren is the first Negro to be appointed a producer by a North American television network.

This year as usual, of course, Juliette welcomes many distinguished Canadian and foreign guest stars. On her March 12th show Jackie Vernon is the special guest.

Vernon's style of comedy is sometimes labelled "deadpan." However, as a national magazine critic put it, Vernon's pan isn't dead; it's dying, painfully, by degrees.

Vernon's "shtick," as they say, is that of the classic loser. His act, always in the same utterly deadpan minor key, begins with an apology: "I'm only doing this because I couldn't get a job in my regular line of work. I'm a Viking." He always does and says the wrong thing, offending everybody. On breadlines, he asks for toast. When President Johnson declares war on poverty, he nips out and throws a hand grenade at a beggar.

During the next few weeks, Juliette's guests will include harmonica virtuosi, The Three Reeds, singers Elan Stuart and Dave Higgins, and the vocal trio, The Willows.

Takes to

Boots-and-Saddle Music

DANNY THOMAS, self-styled "Toothless Lion" of comedy, who starred for 11 years in his own family series on U.S. television, gets back to grass roots in an hour-long variety special to be seen on CBC-TV this Sunday night, March 13th, at 9:00, pre-empting Bonanza for this occasion. The funnyman's guests on the show, which is subtitled Danny Thomas Goes Country and Western, will be Kay Starr, husky-voiced night club and recording artist who likes to think of herself as a "hillbilly who made good"; Eddy Arnold, a leading countrystyle recording artist who calls himself the "Tennessee Ploughboy"; Pat Buttram, a comic hayseed who has made a successful career out

of playing second bananas; Bobby Vinton, young recording singer; and the Doodle-

town Pipers.

Danny Thomas will sing Give Me Back My Boots and Saddle; Kay Starr sings Wabash Cannonball and joins Thomas for Nobody's Business but My Own; Eddy Arnold sings I Want to Go With You; Bobby Vinton sings Ghost Riders in the Sky; Pat Buttram calls a square dance; and the Doodletown Pipers play a barn medley.

Thomas, who says he chews tobacco because it keeps his mouth clean, and sleeps with the lights on because he spent so many years working in dimly lit night clubs, first hit the big time in the old radio program, Baby Snooks. He started out as a candy-seller in a burlesque theatre, broke into showbusiness as an Al Jolson imitator, became a radio entertainer in 1932, and has been broadcasting regularly ever since.

Shamrock Time Again

Special programs during this week mark St. Patrick's Day.


OFFICIALLY there are nearly 2,000,000 Canadians of Irish extraction, roughly 10 per cent of the total population. This week, however, the number claiming affinity with the Emerald Isle will be at least double or treble the Dominion Bureau of Statistics figures, in anticipation of March 17th, the festival of Magonus Succetus Patricius—better known as St. Patrick, the apostle of Ireland.

According to entries in the Irish Annals, this year will be the 1,505th anniversary of his death, and in commemoration pilgrims from around the world will journey to Mount Patrick near the village of Saul in northern Ireland (where he is said to have landed from France in 432). Those who can't make it that far will be celebrating anyway, Irish or not.

As usual, most of the variety programs on radio and television will have an Irish flavor to them this week (such as *The Gordie Tapp Show* on radio, week-days at 1:15 p.m., and *The Peggy Neville Show* on television, Wednesdays at 7:45 p.m.).

From Winnipeg, where the latter show originates, comes this week's edition of the radio series Between Ourselves (Wednesday, March 16th at 8:00 p.m.), which is wholly Irish in content. Sub-titled The Land Whose Love Gives Thee No Rest, it is a personal account written and narrated by Anthony Ross, who emigrated to Canada from Ireland and after eight years here yielded to nostalgic desire for his homeland and returned. But he found that in the years away from home Ireland had changed a good deal. The most apparent change was in the social structure of the country, with the island being transformed from a cottage society to an industrial onefor better or worse he cannot be sure. Mr. Ross now is back in Canada, as CBC radio drama producer in Winnipeg.

On this program there is a selection of some of the music of modern Ireland not previously heard over here. The Land Whose Love Gives Thee No Rest also includes interviews with the people of Ireland who voice their feelings about their country as it prepares to celebrate the 50th anniversary of its independence.

VIOLENCE: An Accepted Part of Life?

HERITAGE, Sunday, March 13th, deals with the types of violence encountered today.

IN THIS AGE of speed, when young people feel they must grab at life with a kind of fury, and violence and bloodshed are creeping closer to the norm, psychologists and social workers are disturbed by the apathy with which even our enlightened citizens greet each new report of murder, rape, wounding and property damage. "I'll worry when I get stabbed," is the way one executive shrugs it off. "Something's got to be done, but the situation looks kind of hopeless," says a suburbanite. All most

of them want to know about violence is what they read in the papers.

Canadians were shocked in 1964 when New Yorkers who heard a woman's shrieks while being murdered did nothing. But more recently Torontonians stood indifferently by in a shopping plaza during a savage clash that could have ended in murder. "People won't talk," a detective explains, "because they figure they'll get their names in the papers. They're frightened because if someone

finds out they've talked, then some hood's going to get them through their kids."

A nightclub bouncer who is involved with violence almost daily, blames parents for the current law-lessness. "They're not disciplining kids at home like we were," he says. "I was one of seven, and I remember as a kid that if I spoke back to a teacher or a cop, I'd get my head kicked in. Today 10-year-old kids are talking back to teachers and the teachers are scared to do

Memorandum

July 21, 1941, Hermann Goering sent a memorandum to Reinhardt Heydrich of the SS, instructing him to begin preparations for the "final solution to the Jewish question." This meant the systematic extermination of all Jews in Europe, and before the Third Reich collapsed, six million Jews had been annihilated. It has been said that "Auschwitz is the central fact experience of our generation." Two decades after the fact, the National Film Board sent a crew back to the scene of the crime with one of the survivors, Bernard Laufer, who now lives in Toronto.

ON JULY 21st, 1941, Herman Goering sent a memorandum to Reinhardt Heydrich of the S.S., instructing him to begin preparations for the "final solution to the Jewish question" - the systematic extermination of all Jews in Europe. Before the Third Reich collapsed, six million Jews had been "exterminated." This act of meaningless annihilation, performed in the name of a cultivated and highly civilized people, has been described as "the most perfect manifestation of evil since the beginning of time. Auschwitz is the central fact experience of our generation.'

fact, the National Film Board sent a crew back to the scene of the crime with one of the death camp survivors, Bernard Laufer, a Toronto glass-cutter, and his 18-vearold son, Joev. Twenty-four years earlier, Laufer had been classified as sub-human. He survived 11 death camps. Memorandum, the hour-long NFB film about Laufer's return to Germany with 30 American Jews, will be presented on CBC-TV on Wednesday night, March 16th, at 9:30 p.m. It was written by Donald Brittain and directed by him and John Spotton.

The film stresses not the monstrosity but the very ordinariness and banality of this extraordinary crime. The cameraman moves with Laufer through Germany on a pilgrimage to the site of the Bergen Belsen Concentration Camp, occasionally cutting away to cover events in other places which were taking place simultaneously in Germany, Poland and Austria. The cameras move to Dachau, where German doctors performed what they called "terminal experiments" on their captives, and on to Auschwitz, the largest death factory of them all, where an average of 2,700 a day met death, 21/2 million in 2½ years. German soldiers forced Laufer to help build that camp. His parents were exterminated there. On the day Laufer was touring these death sites, some of those responsible for them were on trial in Frankfurt. Six were sentenced to life at hard labor; some got lighter sentences; some were acquitted. "Who," the film asks, "will ever know who murdered by memorandum, who did the filing, and the typing, and the sorting from nine to five? . . . And if it could happen in the fairyland of Hansel and Gretel and the Pied Piper of Hamelin, could it not happen anywhere?"

Manon snatches up her jewels and they go to the door. It is locked by Geronte's order. A squad of soldiers appear to arrest Manon who in trying to escape drops the jewels at Geronte's feet. She is dragged off and Des Grieux is not permitted to follow her.

BILLY ROSE

Larger-than-Life Impresario

Flamboyant showman Billy Rose is heard Sunday at 10:30 p.m. in a conversation recorded shortly before his death.

WHEN BILLY ROSE died a few weeks ago he was a little short of the goal he had set for himself—to make \$100,000,000. A few years ago the target was \$50,000,000, but as in everything that Billy planned, he had to go on to something bigger. One of the greatest impresarios of the American theatre, Billy Rose's own life was something like the extravaganzas he staged.

He came out of the lower East Side of New York, where he was born, and made his name at the age of 17 as the national shorthand speed champion, reputedly able to take 200 words a minute writing backwards or forwards with either hand. When the United States declared war in 1917 he served as a stenographer for the War Industries Board, a job that brought him into contact with the biggest industrialists in the nation. After the war he became chief stenographer to the financier Bernard Baruch, from whom he picked up a lot of tips that later led to shrewd investments.

What started Billy Rose on the way to becoming a multi-millionaire was song-writing. Having heard that song-writers, even the second-rate ones, could make a great deal of money, he spent five months at the New York Public Library studying the popular songs of the previous 50 years to discover what made a hit. Tin Pan Alley wasn't impressed by Billy Rose at first, but his persistence finally paid off. His first published song, in collaboration with Irving Bibo, sold 100,000 copies and earned him \$5,000. That was Ain't Nature Grand. His next, You Tell Her - I Stutter, sold 700,000 copies, and in 1922 he hit the big time with Barney Google - sheet music copies and records numbered in the millions. That Old Gang of Mine repeated the success a year later and Billy never looked back.

During the Prohibition era he combined song-writing with managing a new style of entertainment, the night-club. The Back Stage Club was his first, followed by several others, the most famous of which was the Diamond Horseshoe. Today Billy Rose's name is best remembered in connection with the great spectacles he staged. There was the Fort Worth Frontier Days Celebration of 1936-37, the Great Lakes Exposition at Cleveland in '38, the New York World's Fair Aquacade of 1939. And on Broadway, where he became another Ziegfeld, there was the Rodgers and Hart circus-musical Jumbo, Bizet's opera Carmen transformed into Carmen Jones, and Cole Porter's Seven Lively

In addition to all this he published the book Wine, Women and Words and wrote a column, Pitching Horseshoes, that was published in 400 daily and 2,000 weekly newspapers. Married five time (twice to the same woman) he lived in a five-storey town house in New York that was described as a palace. A year before he died he gave the National Museum of Israel a collection of sculpture estimated to be worth \$1,000,000 or more. When his press agent put out a story that Billy Rose had made \$10,000 an hour on the stock exchange since 1963, Rose had to admit ruefully that it wasn't strictly true. Actually, when the figures were carefully scrutinized, his earnings worked out to an average of \$8,733 an hour.

On radio's *Project '66* this week the showman will be heard in a program recorded last year in New York, when he was interviewed by John Nebel. Howard Engel is the producer.

ILLUMINATION I by Otto Joachim, a CBC-commissioned work which is probably the most extraordinary chamber composition ever written by a Canadian, will have its world première on CBC Tuesday Night, March 15th, at 8:30 p.m.

Although Mr. Joachim describes his work as "not really revolutionary," it employs no conductor and no score. Large charts containing music graphs and notes of varying size are in front of the musicians. Light beams are aimed

In his own words, Mr. Joachim describes the unique musiciancomposer relationship as follows: "Each musician has a big sheet of music before him with 20 or 25 musical sentences on it. The musicians himself can choose what he plays, but through the light beams, the composer has control of each musician, meaning he is receiving as much or as little light as the composer desires. The light determines the speed and dynamics of the section which the musician has chosen to play. If I don't like what the musician has picked for any particular combination, I can fade him out."

At the tape-recording for the première broadcast, when Montreal producer Lawrence Taylor signalled for the broadcast to begin, the studio was in total darkness. Dramatically, light began to play on the musicians singly and in groups, and the performance

was underway. Five musicians participated: Wolfgang Kander, flute; Michael Romandini, guitar; Gilles Tremblay, piano; Guy Lachappelle and Louis Charbonneau, percussion; with actress Marilyn Lightstone reading poems by the awardwinning Canadian poet, Arthur Purdy. Miss Lightstone, well known in Montreal and Toronto as an actress, was also controlled by light beams; therefore, the entire production was subject to chance glimpses of their charts by the musicians and recitalist.

"However, the music is not exactly random," Mr. Joachim explains. "It is aleatoric or, one might say, controlled random. I have composed this work according to the 12-tone row and with a mathematically derived scheme. Therefore, it definitely has unity, and its unity is maintained by giving the musicians the right amount of light during the performance."

During the initial studio production, the musicians used their creative imaginations to contribute

anything because the parents are calling the shot on how their kids are to be treated. This is where the trouble starts."

This Sunday, March 13th, at 3:30 p.m., CBC-TV's Heritage presents a many-sided view of Violence: The Barbaric Heritage. It was written by George Salverson and directed and produced by Dick Knowles, the same team responsible for the March 6th Heritage program about a gentler emotion: love.

A variety of people who have encountered violence at close range will offer their opinions about its cause. They include Michael Waage, a Toronto social worker and former leader of a New York street gang called the Stone Killers: Brigadier J. A. Dextraze, CBE. DSO, CD, who served in the Canadian Army during the First World War and in the Korean War; Jerome Laulicht, project director of the Canadian Peace Research Institute; Dr. George Scott, a Kingston psychiatrist who also works with inmates at the penitentiary there: and the Reverend W. E. Boothroyd, a psychiatrist and theologian attached to Sunnybrook Hospital, Toronto.

CBC TUESDAY NIGHT—9:00 and 10:35

Composer Anton Bruckner

OVER THE NEXT few weeks several CBC radio programs will focus on composer Anton Bruckner, a timid 19th-century man of simple piety who wrote with extraordinary magnificence, but who has been neglected in Canada until recently. On March 15th at 9:00, CBC Tuesday Night presents an hour-long documentary study of Bruckner the Man. Written by Jack Diether, an American authority on Bruckner and Mahler, it illuminates the unusual life and personality of one of the great Austrian musicians. Bruckner rose from the Roman Catholic peasantry to become the unwitting standardbearer for the ardent followers of the revolutionary musical philosophy of Wagner, and the composer of massive symphonies of rock-like majesty and power. Production will be by Robert Chesterman in the Vancouver studios.

At 10:35 CBC Tuesday Night will present a performance of the Bruckner String Quintet, by Mildred Goodman and Eugene Husaruk, violins; Leslie Malowaney,

viola; Otto Joachim, viola (whose Illumination I will receive its first performance the same evening); and Walter Joachim, 'cello. The following Tuesday night, March 22nd. The Festival Singers of Toronto and a woodwind ensemble will present a performance of Bruckner's Mass in E Minor, with Nicholas Goldschmidt conducting.

Music scholar Deryck Cooke de-

scribes Bruckner as "one of the great refashioners" of music, and points out that there is not the slightest ground for the widespread view that his unorthodox structures are merely a spectacular mishandling of orthodox symphony form. He knew what he was doing and it was something quite unprecedented. To express his own personal vision he had to create a new type of symphony - vast, stark, rough-hewn and monumental. And in undertaking one of the most difficult tasks in the whole of music there are moments when even his warmest admirers feel that he's lost his way. Bruckner was born in 1824 to a poor village schoolmaster at Ansfelden in Upper Austria. With peasant - like tenacity he acquired a formidable knowledge of the most obsolete "strict" methods of composition. When his appointment as organist in the cathedral of Linz meant that for the first time he was able to hear. in a local opera house, the music of Wagner-Tannhauser-this tremendous experience acted as the catalyst that crystalized his latent genius. He grafted elements of Wagner's romanticism to the solid technique he had already acquired, trying to do for the symphony what Wagner was doing for opera, and by the 1860s he had found his individual voice as a composer. At first his bitter reward was vituperative newspaper criticism by Brahms enthusiasts, but the tide eventually swung to his favor, and he enjoyed triumph after triumph in his last 10 years.

to the work. Pianist Gilles Tremblay added to the unusual sound effects by throwing a large chain inside the piano and banging on the piano with a mallet at appropriate moments. Inevitably each rendition of *Illumination I* will vary greatly. "There is not a chance in a million that any two playings would be exactly the same," the composer says.

Can banging on a piano be classified as music? "There is good noise and bad noise," Mr. Joachim declares. "Anything which makes noise... which can be organized... which is agreeable — that is music. What is the difference between banging on a piano and banging on a drum, except that the drum is more sonorous and recognized by the public as a musical instrument?"

What is acceptable to the public all depends on the century in

Concerto for piano in E flat major Symphony in D major (K. 385) question and on the type of music played, the composer points out. "Using the tritone as an interval was punishable during the Middle Ages. During the 12th century everything was taboo which was not the school of Notre-Dame. After the Organum, parallel fifths and fourths were forbidden. So you see, musical ideas and opinions have varied enormously over the centuries."

Mr. Joachim agrees that, if performed on stage or television, light would enhance the enjoyment of *Illumination I*. An element of suspense would be added. As light flashed on a particular musician,

audience interest would heighten, knowing that individual was about to perform. However, Mr. Joachim is pleased that the première performance is being given on radio. "If the work can't stand on its own feet without light, then it isn't a success," he says firmly.

A native of Düsseldorf, Otto Joachim composed his first major work at the age of 18, a symphonic poem entitled Asia, written for large orchestra. His musical development has passed through several stylistic phases, such as melodism, the influence of Bartock, and duotonality until, in 1953, he began writing in the 12-tone technique.

Talent Festival Final Competition

Valuable scholarships will be awarded to young instrumentalists and singers competing in the CBC Talent Festival finals Thursday at 8:00 p.m.

THE CBC's seventh national radio competition for young Canadian musicians and singers will conclude on Thursday, March 17th, with a gala two-hour concert. It will be broadcast at 8.00 p.m. from the McMillan Theatre of the Edward Johnson Building, University of Toronto. Eight artists will be competing for top honors in each of four categories: voice, keyboard instruments, string instruments, and woodwind and brass instruments.

Two distinguished Canadian musicians, Sir Ernest MacMillan and Wilfrid Pelletier, will alternate as conductors. During the broadcast the winners will be chosen, and prizes awarded.

The judges will be John Avison in Vancouver, Dr. Boyd Neel in Toronto, John Newmark in Montreal, and Raoul Jobin in Quebec City.

Two prizes will be given in each of the four categories. The first

prize in each is \$1,000, plus an amount up to \$500 towards tuition fees for further studies in the academic year following the competition. First-prize winners will also be offered a CBC recital engagement, and may be invited to appear with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra in its annual student concert series. The second prize in each category is \$500.

This year's Talent Festival began in the last week of November after almost a year of preparation, during which brochures were mailed out to centres across the country, outlining the contest rules, conditions and awards; applicants were auditioned at various centres by a travelling group of representatives from the English- and French-language networks (the Festival is a co-operative venture between the two networks) and 40 auditionees were chosen to appear as contestants in the series.

Charlie's Been Singing All His Life

Don Messer's veteran Irish tenor has never been able to resist the impulse to break into song.

CHARLIE CHAMBERLAIN, featured vocalist on CBC-TV's Don Messer's Jubilee, was brought up on music. His mother, Mrs. Elizabeth Chamberlain, was well known in their home town of Bathurst, N.B., as vocalist, organist and pianist.

A Bathurst resident recalls that even as a child Charlie had an urge to sing. "He didn't let the lack of musical accompaniment deter him — two sticks and a tin pan and he was ready to go. When he burst into song at play, passersby stopped to listen and comment at the richness of his childish voice."

As a young lad, Charlie went to work in New Brunswick lumber camps. In the evenings, he'd keep the other men entertained with his singing and guitar playing. One day in the early '30s Charlie was entertaining on a train when a Saint John businessman heard him and he was so impressed with his Irish songs and lumber camp tunes that he arranged a meeting between Charlie and Don Messer. And that's how his professional singing career started.

Don put Charlie on his New Brunswick Breakdown show, which originated from Saint John and was heard on the eastern network of the Canadian Radio Commission, a forerunner of the CBC. Charlie soon became known as the Singing Lumberjack.

Among the many humorous incidents that Charlie remembers from his early days as a radio entertainer was his first and only singing lesson. He was persuaded to take singing lessons and, as Charlie recalls: "I was a lanky young lumberjack just out of the woods and in the city for the first time. The teacher asked me to sing for her, but she kept stopping me to tell me how to hold my mouth, when to

breathe, and all that kind of thing. When she told me I had to do all these things just to sing, I never went back."

Charlie always adds a touch of humor whenever he appears, and this, coupled with his good-natured personality and wide repertoire of songs, has made him a popular favorite. Although the years have somewhat roughened his tenor voice, his knack for touching the public heart has never failed. Charlie and his wife Lydia, (whom he calls Ti Belle, French for "little beauty") celebrated their 33rd wedding anniversary in November of 1965.
