AROUND CBC

A CBC-TV production seen last December has been named the world's outstanding television documentary of 1965. Long Island University selected The Mills of the Gods, about the war in Viet Nam, for the George Polk Memorial Award.

The program, produced and directed by Beryl Fox, was praised by the judges as being "a sensitively expressed, grim record of a people struggling to exist in a context of total war." It was in competition with television documentaries from throughout the world and all networks in the U.S.A. This is the first time in its 18 years that the award has been won by a Canadian producer.

Miss Fox went to Viet Nam last September to put together a short report on the war for CBC-TV's This Hour Has Seven Days. Instead of staying a few days as she originally intended, she stayed a month-trudging the jungle patrols with U.S. marines, riding gun boats as they traded fire with shoreline snipers, and flying with bomber crews over guerrilla strongholds.

The resulting hour-long documentary was seen on CBC-TV's Document series; and last month was telecast in Britain by the BBC. It is also being considered for telecast by U.S., Australian and West German networks.

Last year Miss Fox won five international awards for her halfhour documentary, Summer in Mississippi, about the disappearance and murder of three young civil rights workers.

The George Polk award will be presented to Miss Fox at a luncheon in New York on March 29th.



A WORK described as the first opera in musical history will be performed Thursday at 3:30 p.m. on radio's Prairie Concert. Le jeu de Robin et de Marion was composed by Adam de La Halle (c. 1240-1286) a French trouvère, for the French court at Naples, and first performed about 1275. Although ten personages appear in the work, this performance, by the University of Manitoba Consort of Ancient Instruments, uses only two singers-soprano Phyllis Thomson and tenor Victor Martens-and a narrator - Christine Mather. Miss Mather also plays the recorder, lute and crumhorn. Other instrumentalists are: Peggie Sampson, treble viol; Harold Vogt, rebec and viol; Paul Palmer, recorders and crumhorn, and Joyce Redekop Penner, portative organ. Tom Taylor is the producer.

distinction in the Vienna International Competition; highest marks in the entrance examinations to the Paris Conservatoire when just 13 years of age; violin prize and chamber music medal of the Paris Conservatoire; first performances of works by Jacques Ibert, Francis Poulenc and Vittorio Rietti; recital tours in the Middle East and Brazil: these are just some of the remarkable accomplishments of André Guetta, recitalist on Prairie Concert, Tuesday, March 22nd at 3:30 p.m. on radio.

Mr. Guetta, now first violinist in the National Radio Orchestra. Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, was one of the principal founders of the Alexandria Conservatory of Music during the post-war years. He was also leader of the symphony orchestra of that conservatory, and played in many musical ensembles. He left Egypt in 1956 because of political upheavals, and joined the Colonne Orchestra in Paris. He also became leader of the Schola Cantorum orchestra and a member of the examining board.

While on a recital tour in Brazil. he became attracted to the country and later moved there, taking out his citizenship last year. His performance for CBC radio was recorded by producer Wm. Liska while Mr. Guetta was in Saskatoon for an appearance as guest artist with the Saskatoon Symphony Orchestra.

Duke of Edinburgh Visits in Ontario

An address by Prince Philip to the Variety Clubs International is carried Monday night, March 21st, by CBC radio and television.

FOLLOWING THE recent Royal Tour of Commonwealth territories in the Caribbean, the Duke of Edinburgh embarked on yet another tour this time to North America. His Royal Highness is currently visiting this continent at the invitation of Variety Clubs International, of which he is an honorary life member.

Sunday, March 20th, Prince Philip arrives at RCAF Trenton and will spend the day privately with former Governor-General Massey. On Monday he will visit Toronto to meet civic dignitaries and tour the city hall, after which he drives to Scarborough to meet staff members and students at Variety Village, a vocational school for handicapped boys.

In the evening of March 21st His Royal Highness will be guest of honor at a dinner sponsored by the Toronto chapter of Variety Clubs International, to be held at the Royal York Hotel. His address at this dinner will be carried on CBC radio at 10:30

p.m. and on television at 11:35 p.m.

Prince Philip flies to Ottawa the next day to meet Governor-General Vanier and members of the council of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award in Canada. His Royal Highness will present gold medals -the first to be given by the three - year - old Canadian branch of the Award - to 18 young Canadians.

Portrait of a Clergyman:

HERITAGE looks at the busy life of a senior member of the Lutheran clergy, Sunday, March 20th at 3:30 p.m. on CBC-TV

Rev. G. A. Heimann of Winnipeg

On CBC-TV's *Heritage* this week viewers will meet a man who, at the age of 72, continues to lead a very active life in the service of the Lutheran Church in Winnipeg. Although officially retired, the Rev. G. A. Heimann often substitutes in the pulpit at various congregations and serves as chaplain for a number of Winnipeg hospitals. Recently, in one year alone, he made 2,294 visits in the course of 360 trips to various institutions.

Mr. Heimann came to Canada from Warsaw over half a century ago and was ordained in Edmonton. In the '20s he took charge of four congregations in the Emerson, Man., area and was also Secretary of the Synod. At the same time, working closely with the railway companies as a representative of the Lutheran Immigration Board, he assisted hundreds of Lutheran immigrants from Europe to find jobs and homes. He later became manager of the Canadian Lutheran Immigration Aid Society and in 1946 was co-founder of the Canadian Lutheran World Relief organization. All told, about 15,000 immigrants have been helped by Mr. Heimann to settle in this country.

When a cyclone completely destroyed the place of worship of one of his congregations, the Church of Friedenstahl in Emerson, he helped build a new church with his own hands.

He moved to Winnipeg after the war and carried on the social ministry as City Missionary. Mr. Heimann was Pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Winnipeg for 14 years.

FESTIVAL:

THE Magic Flute

An international cast appear in Mozart's last opera, Wednesday at 8:30 p.m. on CBC-TV.

NOTHING DEMONSTRATES the tremendous scope of Mozart's genius more dramatically than his opera, The Magic Flute, written shortly before his death. It moves lavishly from the sublime to the ridiculous, from amorous moments to despicable villainy, from burlesque to gentle playfulness. And each musical moment is flawlessly, uncannily right in its place. One of the most interesting things about the opera is that Mozart set out to write a comic play with songs for performance in a Viennese theatre catering to audiences who liked lots of gaudy scenic effects, plenty of gags, amusing stage animals, and low-brow dialogue that wouldn't interfere with middleclass digestion but would be a pleasant antidote to post-prandial drowsiness. With remarkable artistry the composer used that framework to write a morality play with the deepest ethical significance. So successful was he in making something inspirational out of a slapstick plot, that George Bernard Shaw was moved to say that some of the songs in The Magic Flute are the only ones he could decently conceive of coming out of the mouth of God.

Special effects challenge the technical skill of the production crew.

Presenting The Magic Flute is a tremendous undertaking, not only artistically – it's one of the most demanding operas to sing and to stage-but also from the point of view of sheer organization, and because of this it sometimes falls flat on its face on the stage. But television offers it greater scope, in fact, it might have been written expressly for the medium, which allows for greater realism and make-believe than are possible in the theatre. It gives the costume and special effects departments a splendid chance to let their imagination run riot.

Franz Kraemer's production (in English) for *Festival* on Wednesday night, March 23rd, is a tour de force that does credit to the mastermind of the brilliant little Austrian who wrote the opera to pay off some pressing bills near the end of an extraordinary life. The *Festival* presentation will run for two hours and 35 minutes; Walter Susskind conducts the 60-piece orchestra, and the cast of 123 (both on and off camera) is headed by a number of internationally known performers.

They include George Shirley, a young Negro tenor from the Metropolitan Opera, as Prince Tamino; soprano Beverly Sills of the New York City Opera in the extremely difficult role of the Queen of the Night, for which she is famous; Mary Ellen Pracht, a young soprano with the Metropolitan Opera, as Princess Pamina: David Ward, a Scottish bass-baritone who sings at Covent Garden, the Bayreuth Festival and the Metropolitan Opera, as the High Priest, Sarastro; baritone John Reardon of the New York City Opera and the Metropolitan Opera, as Papageno, the bird - catcher; Eleanor Calbes, a young soprano from the Philippines who has sung with the Canadian Opera Company, as Papagena; and Garnet Brooks, a young tenor who has sung with the same company, as Monostatos, the lecherous Moor. The offcamera choruses are sung by the Festival Singers of Toronto, directed by Elmer Iseler.

Supporting roles are sung by Gaelyne Gabora, Joan Patenaude and Patricia Rideout as Three Ladies who attend the Queen of the Night; Geoffrey Clarfield, Michael Hamilton and Douglas Gahm as Three Spirits; Howell Glynne as First Priest; Andrew Mac-Millan and Mel Scott as Second and Third Priests; John Arab and Maurice Brown as Two Men in Armor; Phil Stark, Arthur Apy and Walter Williamson as Three Slaves; and Gillie Fenwick as the Speaker. The voices of the Three Spirits are those of Mary Lou Fallis, Joanne Morrow and Lynda Sinclair. coached by Lloyd Bradshaw. The production is based on

The Magic Flute is the largest production Franz Kraemer has undertaken to date, and probably the most challenging. He describes it as "an opera glorifying 18thcentury enlightenment, a fairytale for grownups or a true story for children, a great apotheosis of man and wife."

Its message has a curiously modern flavor. First, it tells us, you must know yourself, know where the balance is between your nobler and your simpler selves, and then you can overcome anything.

By studying Papageno, we can learn about ourselves. He's not just a silly fellow prancing around in a bird-suit, as he seems at first glance. There's much more to him, but he must grow to maturity before this is evident, and as the lighthearted boy begins to understand what is important and serious in the large scheme of things, and what is not, our own strengths and frailties become more obvious to us.

Like the modern Western, the story of *The Magic Flute* is built around the triumph of good over evil and a test of strength against the elements. While Prince Tamino is being pursued by a ferocious dragon of enormous size, three ladies (attendants on the Queen of the Night) appear and kill the beast. They show him a picture of Pamina, the Queen's lovely daughter, who is being held prisoner by the sorcerer, Sarastro. Tamino falls

instantly in love with Pamina's portrait, and when the Queen appears in a clap of thunder and beseeches him to rescue the girl, he agrees. The Ladies give him a magic flute to protect him, and to Papageno, a lovesick, clowning bird-catcher who decides to accompany him, they present some magic bells. Three Spirits guide them on their journey.

Papageno, whose real purpose in joining Tamino is to search for an ideal wife to assuage his loneliness, finds Pamina in the lecherous clutches of her jailor, Monostatos, a servant of Sarastro. Meanwhile, a priest of Sarastro's order tells Tamino that he may win Pamina when he swears allegiance to the Holy Brotherhood and learns the truth about life.

As Papageno and Pamina escape from Monostatos, they meet Tamino at the gates of the temple, where Sarastro urges them to experience the secret and sacred rites of the Brotherhood. In the second act Tamino and Papageno go through the initiation trials of darkness and silence, and Tamino is shown to be the more worthy, thus warranting the final tests of fire and water. The lovers are still being kept apart, as a further test, but the wicked Monostatos is banished, and joins the Queen of the Night, who is revealed to be the true force of evil.

Although Papageno failed his initiation, he is rewarded for his bravery with a female counterpart, Papagena, with whom he falls headlong in love. Tamino and Pamina manage to pass unscathed through the fire and water trials, joyfully join the Brotherhood of enlightenment with Sarastro's blessing, and greet the triumph of light in the temple of the sun.

Kraemer emphasizes Mozart's theme of brotherhood in the international flavor of his cast, in the animation of the titles, and in visual effects in the finale, in which all the races of the world are represented.

For *The Magic Flute* the CBC special effects department was called on to devise its largest prop to date: a snarling, fire-breathing, 75 - foot dragon complete with darting tongue and evil, electric eyes. The result, fierce enough to satisfy even Grimm, is entirely mobile, covered with overlapping polyfoam scales, and required 12 men inside to operate it.

World Fairs Past and Present

EVER SINCE the Crystal Palace Exhibition of 1851, the call of the great fair has sent millions to gape with footweary determination at the latest wonders of the world-Bell's telephone, Edison's phonograph, the wireless, the sewing machine, the saxophone, computers, the astonishing shapes and textures of the latest experiments in shelter. Almost anything could happen at the fair. President Mc-Kinley was shot at one in Buffalo; the son of a gardener was presented to Queen Victoria at one in London; a couple were married in parachutes over one in New York. excitement and curiosity And blended to make them memorable occasions, particularly for photographers, who have preserved some striking glimpses of the variety of moods and features at these colossal gatherings.

Some of them will be recalled in A World of Fairs, a lighthearted hour - long "special" to be seen Thursday night, March 24th. It was produced by Michael Rothery from historic still photos and early films, augmented by the latest shots of preparations for Expo. The script is by Lester Machan, editing by David Knight, and the original musical score by Ricky Hyslop.

Jeremy Geidt, of *The Establishment* fame appears in some amusing miming as a little man who has been to all the fairs, and who is also a projection of some of the people he has seen at fairs—workmen, board chairmen, gondoliers, draftsmen, etc.

The program begins with a look at the Crystal Palace Exhibition in 1851, where the Duke of Wellington enjoyed his last great victory. Sir Joseph Paxton, who designed the Palace, decided to leave some of the large Hyde Park trees on the ground it enclosed, but before all the glass was in place, sparrows had moved into the trees and refused to leave when the building was complete. After innumerable upturned faces and fancy hats had been unpleasantly splashed, the Duke came to the rescue of frantic officials by having some sparrow hawks brought into the place.

The film shows scenes at the Chicago Fair of 1893, when Little Egypt, the belly dancer, was the *pièce de resistance.* ("Even the uncensored films of this attraction would hardly interest a sixth-grader today," Rothery tells us.) Viewers will see films of the Paris Exhibition of 1889, for which Eiffel designed his 984-foot tower; the 1939 New York World's Fair on the eve of war; the Brussels Fair of 1958; the problem-ridden New York Fair of 1964; and many others.

Act II. Almaviva again appears at the house of the doctor, this time disguised house of the doctor, this time disguised as a tutor, acting as substitute for the supposedly ailing Basilio, who gives lessons to Rosina. Interview with Alexander Kerensky

IN MARCH, 1917, Russia had its first successful revolution against the Tsarist regime. It began in Petrograd (formerly St. Petersburg and now Leningrad), where Alexander Fvodorovich Kerensky, a lawyer and politician, was the head of the Social Revolutionary party. When the first provisional government of the revolution was formed (out of Octobrists, Cadets, and Social Revolutionaries), Kerensky represented his party as minister of justice. Two months after the revolution the government was reorganized and Kerensky became head of the ministries of war and marine.

In July, 1917, the government was again reorganized, this time with a socialist majority, with Kerensky appointed prime minister. At this time the Bolsheviks, under the leadership of founder Vladimir Ilyich Lenin, were attempting to seize power in Petrograd by gain-

The provisional government recalled a cavalry division from war service and put down the Bolshevik revolt, but Lenin escaped to Finland and continued to build up Bolshevik strength for a later attempt against the provisional government.

By September the Bolsheviks had command of the soviet, while the army, under General Kornilov, was trying to impose a military dictatorship. Faced with the threats of these extreme elements. Kerensky sought to weld the more moderate groups in the country into a unified front. Both Kornilov and Kerensky failed in their aims, while the Bolsheviks gained ascendancy. October saw the Bolshevik leader, Trotsky, elected president of the Petrograd soviet with full control of the military committee of the soviet. Kerensky, without sufficient numbers of reliable troops, was unable to suppress the Bolshevik rising of November 7th, 1917, and was forced to leave Petrograd. He returned soon after with a force of Cossacks which broke up against the Red Guards, and he was again compelled to leave.

Kerensky settled first in Paris, where he was the leader of the emigré Social Revolutionaries and editor of their publication, **Dni**. He went to Australia in 1940 and after the Second World War took up residence in the United States.

Now 85 years of ages, he lives in California, still writing-his most recent work is *Russia and History's Turning Point* (1965)-and is still active in teaching. At Stanford University, where he conducts a symposium on the political history of modern Russia, he was visited recently by Mark Gayn of the Toronto *Star* and Dita Vadron of CBC radio's *Project '66* series. The interview is heard Sunday, March 20th at 10:30 p.m.

Among his first assignments was Sir Wilfrid Laurier's funeral in Ottawa, and in 1934 he was the first movie cameraman to arrive at the Dionne farmhouse at Corbeil, Ont., when news of the birth of the quintuplets broke. To shoot that story he had to round up every car battery he could find in North Bay to supply the current for his lights.

The incident with King George VI happened during the 1939 Royal Tour when Tash found himself being filmed by the King, who was a knowledgeable home-movie buff. Having turned the tables on the cameraman, the King winked at him, which so amazed Tash that he neglected to capture it for posterity. He has a lot of memories like that, one of his favorites being the time he covered Churchill's 1941 Ottawa visit. After the filming session was over Churchill caught Tash emptying an ash-tray into his hand and demanded to know what he was doing. Tash told him he planned to put them in an envelope and save "the ashes of a great man." The old warrior walked over to him. grinned mischievously and said, 'Have some more," flicking fresh and very hot ashes into his palm.

Although he has the reputation of being one of the greats of the Canadian motion picture business, Tash admits there have been occasions when he didn't always get what he went after. One embarrassing incident concerned the collapse in 1938 of the Rainbow Bridge at Niagara Falls, Assured by engineers that the bridge would fall under the pressure of a heavy ice-jam, Tash and several other cameramen from across the country set up their equipment and waited for the bridge to break up. They waited patiently for nearly a week, but nothing happened. Finally they all decided the bridge was going to hold on long enough for them to have a coffee break at a nearby hotel so they took off, leaving a boy to watch over a score of cameras for a couple of dollars. The roar of the collapsing bridge could be heard very clearly in the hotel but nobody got back fast enough to see it happen. The newsmen discovered later that an amateur with a 16-mm camera scooped them all.

When Tash got word one day in the '20s that the camerashy celebrity Irving Berlin was expected to slip into Montreal without fanfare, he grabbed his camera and headed for the station. On the way over he picked up Berlin's latest hit song-sheet, with a photograph of the composer on the

cover, to be sure he'd be able to pick him out of the crowd. He found his man, asked him to pose and got a "Don't-bother-mister-Iam-not-Irving-Berlin" brush-off. A momentary doubt was dispelled by another glance at the picture on the song-sheet. It was Irving Berlin all right. Tash followed him through the crowd and got a couple of hundred feet of film before calling it quits. Pleased with himself, he reported to his chief: "He was as tough as they say he is, boss, but there he is - Irving Berlin in the can." Later in the projection room his chief studied the face on the screen and said wearily, "That guy was telling the truth - he isn't Berlin."

That is one of the moments Roy Tash recalls on the *Telescope* program, which includes some of the thousands of feet of film he has shot over half a century. Who is *Roy Tash*² was prepared for *Telescope* by Spaulding Taylor Hall Ltd. It was directed and edited by Rene Bonniere, filmed by Roy Tash and Herb Taylor, with commentary written by Tod Greenaway. Fletcher Markle introduces and narrates the program, which is produced by Peter Kelly. Thom Benson is the executive producer.

Sean O'Casey said that if Behan had lived another 10 years he would have written more and perhaps better.

To most of his friends and colleagues in the theatre he seemed to be squandering his talent in drink and foolishness. The success of his first produced work, The Quare Fellow, catapulted him to international fame in 1956 at the age of 33. Borstal Boy, his autobiography, followed two years later, and his second play, The Hostage, in 1959. With these three works his reputation as a creative artist was solidly established, but he was never again to produce anything of substance to match them. Brendan Behan's Island. autobiographical short stories about life in his native Dublin, Brendan Behan's New York, impressions of that city, and Hold Your Hour and Have Another, a series of essays written for the Irish Press, were minor exercises.

The popular image of Brendan Behan is that of the drunken clown, the garrulous Paddy, the roaring bhoy-o. Certainly he fostered this idea, especially on his visits to Montreal and Toronto, where he was arrested for causing

disturbance, assault causing อ bodily harm, and assaulting police. But Joan Littlewood, director of the Theatre Workshop which first staged The Ouare Fellow in London, remembers him as a much more worthwhile person: "Brendan was caught between love for, and mockery of, obsolete myths. His personal suffering and loneliness gave the world some of the finest laughter medicine of the century. Already in his last notices the greatness of the man was undervalued.

"He was a fine scholar as well as a glorious clown, a man who translated Marlowe's verse into Irish and improvised his finest ballads for the street-sweepers and lonely vagrants of every city in the world. He squandered his life and his genius, but he took the world out on a spree with him."

At the time of his death, Behan was working fitfully on a new play for Miss Littlewood, Richard's Cork Leg, and collaborating with Mrs. Rae Jeffs, head of his publisher's publicity department, on a sequel to Borstal Boy tentatively called Confessions of an Irish Rebel. Since Brendan, like most Dubliners, was said to have been a better talker than writer, this book was to have been virtually a direct transcript of tape-recordings Mrs. Jeffs made of conversations with Behan. Mrs. Jeffs recalls those conversations and the Brendan Behan she knew on a program on this week's CBC Tuesday Night at 8:05 p.m. entitled Inquest on a Quare Fellow. Written, narrated, and produced by Dubliner Val Clery, it is the personal recollections of some of the people who knew Behan well, among them Tony Aspler, Ernie Anderson, Terry Chapman, Michael O'Haodha, Roger McHugh, John Beckett, Robbird MacGabhrain, Seamus Kelly, Desmond and Skilla Mac-Namara, Seamus Parcair, Peter and Beverley Walsh, and Garry Raffles.

THIS WEEK'S RADIO DRAMA

RADIO DRAMA this week represents the three types of playwrights who are helping to make today's Canadian plays so refreshing and thought-provoking. On Sunday, March 20th, at 1:00 p.m., CBC Stage presents a double bill about the folly of man. The Land of Ephranor is by Joseph Schull, one of a handful of outstanding writers who have been contributing to Canadian radio and TV for more than 20 years and whose finesse is much envied by newcomers to the field. This play represents the young Schull. It was first presented in 1945 in the thennew Stage series. The original producer's note about the cast (in Andrew Allan's handwriting) is still attached to the yellowing script, and we see that the première starred Barbara Kelly, who later went on to distinguish herself in Britain, Fletcher Markle, who had a successful career in the U.S., then returned to become host of CBC-TV's Telescope, and John Drainie, who is still a well-known name in Canadian broadcasting.

The Land of Ephranor is a tale told by Halgor the Hermit, whom men call wise because he has pointed out that they are fools. It concerns a wise young man, Othran, "to whom learning was better than laughter and a syllogism more shapely than a fair maid." He thought he was smart enough to remedy the ills of man through reason, and one day he consulted the Hermit to see how he should set about it. The wise old man told him he was a fool, but sent him on a mission to the Land of Ephranor, where there was as fine a crop of ills as any in the world. On his journey Othran learned a great many things about his fellow man which did not answer to reason, and returned disillusioned but considerably wiser.

The other half of the double bill presents the first appearance in a major CBC drama series of a promising new Canadian author,

Marjorie Morris, who lives near Montreal. The Swap Shop is the title of her charming, two-character play, an amusing series of ripostes which she has imbued with a subtle message about the values we are so ready to exchange shoddy replacements. Miss for Morris handles dialogue extremely well for a newcomer and can moralize occasionally in a delightfully palatable manner. She has written successfully for the Little Theatre, and last December two Quebec schools presented an original play she wrote for the Montreal Protestant School Board.

On Wednesday night, March 23rd, Midweek Theatre presents Men of the Mountain by George Ryga, a British Columbia writer who is not as new to broadcasting as Miss Morris nor as old a hand at writing as Schull, but who has established himself as a most original, outstandingly talented author. (Next week Festival presents Ryga's latest TV drama, Man Alive, which producer George Bloomfield describes as the most exciting Canadian script he has ever come across, the story of "a man who refuses to compromise. . . . He is, consequently, a tremendously lonely person." An article about this production will appear in next week's edition of CBC TIMES.) The Buffalo: Victim of Civilization

THERE WERE vast herds of them and they made North America their own. The common guess is that there were 60,000,000 buffalo roaming the continent when the herds were at their peak. Some zoologists argue that's an exaggeration-the figure should be 12,000,-000 or 15,000,000. Whatever the number, men could ride through the herds for days on end and in every direction, to the horizons, there would be buffalo.

The vanished herds of yesterday and the herds of today that exist in remote areas under the protection of man are the subject of two Soundings programs on CBC radio (Thursdays, March 17th and 24th, 7:30 p.m.).

Indians could detect the presence of the huge herds 30 miles away by listening at gopher holes. To the Indian, the buffalo meant a complete subsistence-food, clothing, hides for shelter, implements and even religious symbols. When the buffalo went, the Indian was no longer an independent being.

Buffalo did indeed range the continent. Buffalo bones have been found in the Don Valley near Toronto and in the Kootenav Valley of British Columbia - an animal that probably came north from what is now American territory. They roamed as far north as Great Slave Lake and south to Texas.

Frank Gilbert Roe of Victoria, featured on the two programs, spent years studying books and references about the buffalo. Finally he wrote a monumental volume, The North American Buffalo. In it, he says that most of the folk beliefs about the buffalo just aren't so. The buffalo obeyed no laws whatsoever. It was the most irregular and unpredictable of all creatures. Its migrations weren't regular and it didn't follow the same trails. It might go east or west as well as north and south. What are thought to be buffalo wallows. often aren't.

The Metis hunted the buffalo in organized campaigns. As the herds decreased, the hunts went further and further west until they reached the Cypress Hills in southern Saskatchewan. The white man mounted a furious attack on the buffalo-for sport and adventure, for food (and often only the choice parts, such as the tongue, were taken) and particularly for hides. The stench of rotting buffalo permeated the plains. The herds simply disappeared. In 1884, near the Red Deer River in Alberta, the geologist J. B. Tyrrell saw a small herd of some 20 buffalo. It was probably the last sighting of wild plains buffalo in Canada.

The buffalo all but vanished. An American Indian captured a few animals, raised them and sold them to two American ranchers. They eventually had a fair-sized herd. which was sold to the Canadian government. These animals ended up in Wood Buffalo Park, north of Alberta. There they mixed with the wood bison, a slightly different animal. Many zoologists were outraged because the plains buffalo had various diseases and these they transmitted to the wood bison. The hybrid animals multiplied, however, and now there are about 10,000 of them. Canada is faced with various problems of buffalo management-should the herds be split up for safety's sake, should they be fenced in, what maximum number should be retained?

A most encouraging discovery was made a few years ago in the far northwest corner of Wood Buffalo Park. There, a purebred herd of wood bison was found, healthy and untouched. Urgent efforts are being made now to protect them from contact with the hybrid animals elsewhere in the park.

The two programs about the buffalo were prepared and are narrated by Allan Anderson, and produced by Allan Campbell.

THIS WEEK'S PERSONALITY: Paul Soles

"THE FIRST play I ever acted in was at Sunday school when I was four years old. My one and only line was: Snakes! Save us!"

Since that day, 31 years ago, Paul Soles, co-host of CBC-TV's popular daytime public affairs show, *Take 30*, has packed a lot of theatre and television time into his career. A lot of travelling too.

Since high school, Paul has acted in or directed about 35 plays and a half dozen revues. While attending university in London, Ont., he worked at radio station CFPL as a disc jockey, and still found time to work with the London Little Theatre group and direct the university's annual revue.

In 1960, Paul won the best actor award in the Dominion Drama Festival. "It was in Hamilton, and after we finished the play, I rushed back to my job in London. A couple of days later, I had the evening off and decided to drive back to Hamilton to see the presentation of awards.

"Imagine my surprise when I was grabbed just as I walked in the back door, and marched onto the stage to receive the best actor

award. I was still outside when they called my name and actually didn't know I had won until the award was in my hand."

Paul has been with *Take 30* for three seasons. He started as cohost with Anna Cameron, who left the show last summer to take up fulltime professional acting.

His new partner is Adrienne Clarkson, a scholarly charmer who taught modern poetry at the University of Toronto before coming to *Take 30*,

Last year, Paul played the part of Joseph K in Kafka's *The Trial*, at the Colonnade Theatre in Toronto. While rehearsing for *The Trial*, he did a show for *Take 30* on Canada's famous communications thinker, Marshall McLuhan. He offered English literature professor McLuhan tickets to the play and McLuhan accepted. "He saw it and later said it was the best portrayal of Joseph K he had ever seen," Paul says with a pleased grin.

Paul's wife, Jean, comes from a farm near Paris, Ont. She studied interior design and likes to sing. They have a son, Jonathan David, and Paul will talk about him if asked.

At this time, Paul is playing in a revue at the Theatre in the Dell in Toronto. It is called *Ligging About* and also features Diane Stapley, Brian Crabb and Judy Armstrong. It was written by Paul McDowell, who once wrote for BBC-TV's *That Was the Week That Was*.

But that's at night. During weekday afternoons, Paul continues on *Take* 30.
