THE HUMAN CONDITION

FM and AM radio carry a varied series exploring the common human experience, starting April 3rd on FM.

GERMAN novelist-essayist Franz Kafka, who had a subtle understanding of man's futile search for salvation under a burden of guilt. isolation and anxiety, once observed that "Whoever has faith cannot define it, and whoever has none can only give a definition which lies under the shadow of grace withheld." The human condition has never been as contradictory as it is today. In an age of great technological triumphs in communications, man is more and more isolated as an individual, so that moments of understanding and revelation are all the more precious for their rarity. He has become more generalized, more typical of the mass, yet he doesn't have a real sense of belonging and security.

The human condition in this time of unrest and conformity will be considered in a remarkably evocative new radio series to be heard on both AM and FM. Without trying to preach in any way. or to be too explicit, the series will consider the common experience through drama, music, conversation, and documentary. On CBW-FM, Winnipeg, the program will be heard nightly from Sunday, April 3rd, to April 10th, at 9:30; and on AM it will be heard on Friday evenings for eight weeks, beginning April 29th at 8:00.

Describing the ideas behind it, Peter Garvie, program director, radio network (English), says: "The human condition does not preoccupy us much of the time. We have our jobs and habits, ourselves and our families, and our relations with the world at large are stylized and anonymous. Many of the promptings towards a wider human concern, a sense of community, religious faith, social commitment, are no longer valid for the majority. The force of the usual is such that Pascal's description of man's condition as "inconstancy, weariness, unrest," may well seem narrow and extreme.

"The broadcaster is aware that easy communication across the world has not widened our area of concern. He realizes how much of what he broadcasts reflects the usual-even when he makes the slight. appropriate gestures at Christmas or Easter. His relations with his listeners may seem stylized and anonymous, too. Yet we know. as broadcasters or listeners, or as human beings, that this is not all. that public acts emerge from private motives, that we all experience moments in which the usual seems unreal. Then we are concerned about the human condition in terms of a feeling for others or a new insight into ourselves. If most people no longer discover such moments through the rituals of their faith and society, they often continue to experience them through drama and music and conversation. It is through these forms that radio best conveys ideas-not addressing itself to the audience, but speaking to the individual ear."

The first broadcast, on April 3rd, will examine some of the conditions of man and his environment which have inspired great literary and poetic imaginations. The pro-

gram will intersperse words with interludes of instrumental music, including *The Unanswered Question* by Charles Ives, and *De Profundis* by Arnold Schoenberg.

The April 4th program will be a study on the theme of heroism. Into An Unknown Land is an intimate portrait of the late Secretary-General of the United Nations. Dag Hammarskjold, as revealed in Markings, his posthumous book of poetic meditations, selected from a journal which he began keeping when he was 20. In this he recorded his state of mind, proverbs, maxims, brief biographical miniatures, and prayers, revealing much about a lonely, inhibited, highly intelligent man trying to serve mankind and still be true to his own personal needs and ideals. The program is prepared by Gilles Couture and George Whalley. The second part of the program will be a recorded performance of Gustav Mahler's tragically inspiring Sumphony No. 6, performed by the Toronto Symphony Orchestra conducted in part by Dr. Heinz Unger. and completed after his sudden death by Hans Bauer.

On Tuesday, April 5th, Gerald Newman will direct a Vancouver production of *Benito Cereno*, one of two verse plays about the emergence of America by American Pulitzer Prizewinner Robert Lowell, under the collective title of *The Old Glory*. This one, he says, "is based on Herman Melville's story of a meeting between two Yankee seamen and people on

Will Canada Ever Be Thirsty?

THE SIXTIES looks at our water resources in two programs.


TWO PROGRAMS on The Sixties, this week and next. will examine Canada's water resources and the national water policy. Earlier this year in his first Commons speech since his return to federal politics, E. Davie Fulton termed this one of the most pressing questions facing the nation and warned that Canada will find itself in serious difficulties if it does not develop long-range plans for water supplies and distribu-

Appearing on the two programs, the first of which (April 4th) compares the great amount of water available in Canada with the shortage in the United States. will be several officials of both the Canadian and U.S. governments, among them Mines and Technical Surveys Minister Jean-Luc Pepin and Stewart L. Udall, Secretary of the Interior. The second

program (April 11th) deals with the political implications of sharing Canada's waters with the United States.

Others interviewed on the programs include: Senator Frank E. Moss (Dem., Utah); Arnold D. P. Heeney, Canadian co-chairman of the International Ioint Commission: Governor Welsh, former Governor of Indiana and now American co-chairman of the Commission; and Christian de Late, secretary of the Council of Resource Minis-

These two programs are produced in Ottawa by Cameron Graham.

TIMMY'S EASTER PARADE of Stars, one of the biggest annual events in Canadian show-business, is headlined this year by Bing Crosby. Not to be outdone by his old "Road" partner, Bob Hope, who performed at last year's show, Crosby visited Toronto recently to record the show to be broadcast Sunday, April 3rd at 4:00 p.m. (3:00 p.m. on CBX and CBR) on CBC radio.

This is the 20th occasion of *Timmy's Easter Parade of Stars*, and among the performers contributing to it are: Phil Nimmons and His Band; accordionist Ted Komar; the New Christy Minstrels; the Brian Brown Trio; impressionist Rich Little; Tommy Hunter, with fiddler Al Cherny and the Rhythm Pals; singer Catherine McKinnon; Lance Harrison and His Dixieland Band; the singing group the Four Lads; Neil Chotem and his Orchestra with singer Lucille Dumont; and the Trio Los Zorros.

Also heard on the program will be goodwill messages from the Prime Minister, the Rt. Hon. Lester B. Pearson; Miss Canada, Diane Landry; and

He has not allowed his disability to affect his outlook on life and has many hobbies and an excellent academic standing at school. His ambition is to become a lawyer.

Timmy's Easter Parade of Stars is written by Alan Miller and produced by Jack Budgell. Executive producer is Ken Dalziel. This special broadcast pre-empts Sunday Showcase for this occasion only.

PROGRAMS FOR HOLY WEEK

Easter and the week leading up to it are marked by numerous programs of music and the spoken word on CBC-TV and radio.


TELEVISION and radio will observe Holy Week and Good Friday with many special programs. Here are details of some of them. On CBC-TV the Good Friday features begin at 12:30 with *The Noble Tree*, a choral program, marking Newfoundland's first contribution to a Good Friday network schedule. Produced by Kevin O'Connell, the program weaves favorite hymns with contemplative narration based on the Seven Last Words From the Cross.

At 1:30 p.m. Question 7, a feature film produced under Lutheran Church auspices, tells of the conflict in the mind of the young son of a pastor in East Germany. The claims of the Young Pioneers Movement and of confirmation in his church produces a crisis which is resolved when he goes to Berlin for the finals in a piano competition: he escapes to the West.

Friday's edition of *Take 30* at 3:00 has been extended to an hour in order to present a repeat telecast of two programs on the Protestant monastery at Taizé, France, which were

first shown in the *Heritage* series in February. Founded 25 years ago, the monastery has made the name of Taizé synonymous with ecumenism. Pilgrims of various denominations from many countries go there to learn the ways of Christian unity. *Take 30* hostess Adrienne Clarkson, and her husband, Stephen Clarkson, who has visited Taizé, will provide linking commentary between the two films. Mrs. Clarkson has spent some time at a retreat at the Grandchamps Community, the women's division of the Taizé community.

Holy Week: Seville, at 4:00 p.m., produced by Peter Simcox, in Montreal, is a commentary, in poetry, music and dance, on the annual Easter festivities in the southern Spanish city. The climax of the celebrations is at noon on Saturday, when magnificently dressed religious statues, liberally bedecked in gold leaf and lace, are carried through the streets in a procession that is stopped many times by the songs of Flamenco singers perched on nearby balconies and terraces. Part of the procession, including two songs, will be shown

in the program. It will also present additional songs by Flamenco singer Fernande Chiocchio, Spanish dances by Julio Piedra and Maria Alba, and a ballet sequence about a blind man who regains his sight, featuring Piedra and choreographed by him. Guitar background music will be provided by Alberto Megales, and poetry by Garcia Lorca will be read by actor Griffith Brewer.

At 5:30 p.m. the Halifax studios will present a Good Friday Chorale, featuring the choir of the University of Moncton, New Brunswick. It will be followed at 6:00 by a special edition of Hymn Sing from Knox United Church, Winnipeg, produced by Don Williams. Don Brown will read a story poem, A Little Dog Cried; and Sharon-Ann Ewens will read from the

works of James Weldon Johnson. The audience will he invited to join in some of the singing, which will include Stand Up, Stand Up For Jesus. When I Survey the Wondrous Cross, Hallelujah to the Lamb, Take My Mother Home, When the Saints Come Marching In, I Heard a Forest Praying, Old Rugged Cross, and Let Us Break Bread Together.

The glory of Palm Sunday, the expectation of new life in the spring, the tragedy of Good Friday and the triumph of the Resurrection will be observed in music in a special program at 8:00 p.m. on Good Friday, produced by Vincent Tovell under the title of The Plaited Crown. Performers include the Festival Singers of Toronto, an orchestra directed by (Please turn to page 15)

Featured with Stu in each show is his son, Duane, a 20vear-old singer-guitarist, and an instrumental group known as The Pathfinders. In the April 2nd show Stu sings Streets of Laredo, then teams with Duane to sing Homesteaders' Lament, and I'm Going to Change Everything. Duane sings a French folk song, Sleep My Love.

Stu Davis has been broadcasting ever since he won a talent contest in Regina in 1938, and was given a series of quarter-hour programs on station CKCK. His career was interrupted by war service in the RCAF, but he returned to broadcasting after demobilization, and signed his first recording contract in 1946. He has written over 200 songs, many of which have

been recorded by other artists. He has appeared frequently at the larger Western shows on both sides of the border, and has been a favorite with CBC-TV audiences since 1955.

'The Umbrella' Covers the Arts

WILLIAM RONALD, the Canadian painter whose works hang in 36 major galleries in Canada and the United States, will be the host of a new series beginning this week on CBC-TV entitled The Umbrella. This half-hour program, telecast on Sundays at 5:00 p.m., will be "a non-conformist show, just as Bill is a non-conforming person," says producer John Kennedy. "His personality," continues Kennedy, "which is very forthright and challenging, will be unleashed on a TV world unused to this style of host in a series concerned with the arts."

Over the next few weeks The Umbrella will follow trends and current developments in all the arts, and will include interviews with and features on some of the leading figures in painting, sculpture, theatre, the dance, literature, and music. Besides Ronald, other contributors to the series are Rita Greer Allen and Barry Callaghan.

The title, explains Kennedy, is easy enough to understand: "An umbrella 'covers' anything, but you can't take it into an art gallery. Bill Ronald does." Introducing himself on this week's program, William Ronald talks about his work and painting a career to an audience of art students. Next week he will be seen in conversation with one of the greatest living painters, Marcel Duchamp, whom he interviewed for the program in New York. Viewers will also see Boite en valise, a miniature display of Du-

champ's major works which is in the collection of the Art Gallery of Toronto. Ronald outlines Duchamp's contribution to modern art and the part he played in the celebrated Dada movement of the '20s.

Freelance broadcaster Rita Greer Allen interviews the brilliant Canadian choreographer Brian Macdonald on the April 17th edition of the show. Macdonald, whose work with the Royal Winnipeg Ballet and the Royal Norwegian and Royal Swedish Ballet companies has made him internationally famous, is now planning the musical version of I Am a Camera.

On April 24th The Umbrella will present interviews by Barry Callaghan with two of Britain's most prominent young writers, novelist Alan Sillitoe (The Loneliness of the Long-Distance Runner) and playwright Arnold Wesker (Roots and Chips With Everything). Callaghan, who appeared frequently on Kennedy's previous television series on the arts, Show on Shows, is a professor of English at St. Michael's College, University of Toronto.

At 9:00 p.m. a documentary from Vancouver, entitled In an Ancient City, will map out and explain the events from Palm Sunday to Good Friday, to give viewers a better understanding of the sequence of events, the personalities involved, and the places where the events took place. At 9:30 another Vancouver origination, The Journey, first shown last Easter, will be repeated. Part 1. Bernard Shaw: Who the Devil Was He? A film portrait of the great Irish playwright, critic and wit, first telecast on Festival in May 1965. Produced and directed by Vincent Tovell; script and narration by Lister Sinclair; Shaw's own words spoken off camera by Barry Morse; film sequences shot in Ireland and England by cameramen Rolph Blakstad under the direction of James Murray. Supplementing and complementing the film sequences are old still photos and newsreel footage. After introducing the GBS that most people remember-the witty and bearded sage -the program follows the lesser-known Shaw through his boyhood in Dublin and his 25 years of struggle in London, where he thought, debated and wrote his way to eventual fame. Recalls his passionate interest in the human race and his activities in the Fabian society. Shaw once said that GBS was his most outstanding creation and this is the story of how GBS came into being.

Quebec's Monique Leyrac

LAST AUGUST French-Canadian singer Monique Leyrac won the Grand Prix at the International Song Festival in Sopot, Poland, It was the first time in her career she had ever entered a competition of this sort. If it seemed like luck, she dispelled this notion by winning yet another competition only a week later at Ostend, Belgium.

In Ouebec, of course, they were not surprised. Monique Leyrac has long been recognized as one of the greatest interpreters of the French-Canadian chansonniers. At both Sopot and Ostend she sang Mon Pays by Quebec's Gilles Vigneault and Hiver by Vigneault and Claude Léveillée.

Wherever she sings, her program always includes Mon Pays, even before English-speaking audiences. "I don't know why the English are so moved by it," she says, "there is not much melody and they don't understand the words. It's not like an ordinary chanson. I have to give something extra of myself,

and that's not easy to do every day. I sometimes wonder if I will have to sing it for the rest of my life."

Act I. In the forest near the castle of Montsalvat. Kundry, a wild hag, stumbles in, exhausted, bringing a healing potion for Gurnemanz. He gives the balm to Amfortas who is carried in by attendants and taken on to his bath. Gurnemanz relates to the squires how Klingsor, refused by Titurel as one of the Knights of the Holy Grail, had created a magic garden, and peopled it with beautiful maidens, destined to seduce the Knights of the Grail. The witling Parsifal, entering the precincts of the castle of the Grail, kills a sacred swan with an arrow and is brought before Gurnemanz. Parsifal confesses his fault as one of ignorance. He knows nothing of his own family and Gurnemanz regards him as a fool. Kundry informs Gurnemanz of Parsifal's descent and Parsifal attempts to attack her when she tells him his mother is dead. Amfortas is carried back to the castle and Parsifal walks with Gurnemanz through the wood.

The scene changes to a great hall within the temple. The Knights of the

The scene changes to a great hall within the temple. The Knights of the Grail enter. The wounded Amfortas is carried in, and is compelled, against his will, to display the miracle of the grail, which makes his suffering almost unbearable. But it is only through this ceremony that Titurel, who is represented by an off-stage voice, is kept alive. Parsifal stands motionless through the long ceremony. When he admits to Gurnemanz that he comprehends nothing of what he has seen, he is roughly ejected from the castle. "Thou art nothing but a fool," cries Gurnemanz. A voice intones the legend of the fool that through pity will end the days of suffering and trial.

Act II. An open turret in which are

Act II. An open turret in which are displayed Klingsor's instruments of magic. Knowing that Parsifal is approaching, Klingsor summons Kundry and commands her to seduce him. Klingsor and the turret suddenly vanish and in their place appears a wonderful garden peopled with flower girls. They surround Parsifal who turns them aside. Kundry, now very beautiful, appears before him and touches his heart by telling him of his mother. When she kisses him, the guileless fool understands why Amfortas suffers and how he can be relieved. When Kundry tells him of her sin against the Christ he turns away from her in horror. Klingsor hurls the holy lance at Parsifal but it remains suspended above his head. Parsifal selzes the lance and makes the sign of the cross. At once Klingsor and his magic gardens disappear. As he departs Parsifal tells Kundry she knows where to seek him. to seek him.

Act III. A wood in spring. A well and the hut of a hermit. Gurnemanz hears a faint moan and finds Kundry under a bush, unconscious. He revives her and she asks to return to service. He finds she asks to return to service. He finds her silent and much changed. Since Parsifal's departure, Amfortas has not exhibited the youth-giving grail and Titurel has died. 

Calgary: The Talking-est City

OVER THE PAST year and a half freelance broadcaster Allan Anderson has been gathering material throughout Western Canada and the North for various programs on CBC radio. Recently he was heard on Soundings in a two-part program about the history of the buffalo in Canada. Sunday at 10:30 p.m. on Project '66 he narrates The Western Image, a look at the Western mind in the prairie region.

The men and women he talked with, ordinary people for the most part, were literate, vocal, and stimulating conversationalists, very conscious that they are distinct and different from most people elsewhere in Canada. Calgary, Anderson discovered, is probably the talking capital of Canada — the people there keep their visitors up most of the night in a gabfest. Edmonton, he found, is a very reactionary city, while Winnipeg is static, seemingly just drifting. In general, the cities in the West view each other with rivalry, and no two are alike except for this.

The Law and You

Trans-Canada Matinee
begins a series to help
you to understand better your
legal rights and pitfalls to avoid.

MANY LAW-ABIDING citizens go through life with little or no contact with the actual processes of the law and too often have only a sketchy idea of their rights under the law. To advise people of these rights and to help them avoid some of the pitfalls in certain common situations, CBC radio's Trans-Canada Matinee series begins on Monday, April 4th, 13 talks by Winnipeg lawyer Maurice Arpin, Q.C., on The Law and You.

Last fall Trans-Canada Matinee broadcast a series entitled Your Money and You, which enjoyed such wide popularity that it seemed evident there was a very real need for such information. The present series, it is hoped, will prepare people for situations that may arise in their dealings with door-to-door salesmen or with real estate agents or automobile insurance companies.

The old maxim "Ignorance of the law is no excuse," is so familiar to most people that it scarcely needs reiterating. Yet people continue to get into difficulties in seemingly simple business transactions or the like. This is especially true in the case of buying a house, the subject of Mr. Arpin's first talk. He reminds us of the old principle caveat emptor - "let the buyer see to it," the disclaiming of responsibility for a buyer's disappointment. Someone may buy a house with the idea of extending the building or remodelling it or carrying out other property improvements, only to discover, too late, that zoning by-laws restrict this. Then, too, the question of second or third mortgages may be made to sound attractive by some agents, but without the

specialized knowledge of the professional lawyer to guide them, buyers often end up paying an excessive price. To experienced people such examples may seem elementary, yet many people encountering these situations for the first time are ill-prepared to deal with them.

Some Pitfalls in Buying a House will be broadcast on Monday, April 4th. Subsequent talks in the series up to the second week of May are sub-titled: The Man Who Came to Dinner — or Liabilities of Occupants of Dangerous Premises (April 11th); Automobile Insurance (April 18th); Time Sale Contracts with Door-to-Door Salesmen (April 25th); How to Process an Accident Claim and How to Defend One (May 2nd); Marriage, Children, and the Use of Name (May 9th).

Maurice Arpin is a French-Canadian lawyer whose practice in Winnipeg is general, civil and criminal, with the emphasis on litigation. He graduated from the University of Manitoba (St. Boniface College) in 1944 with a B.A. (Latin, philosophy) with Honors, and in 1950 graduated from the Manitoba Law School LL.B. Honors. He was made a Queen's Counsel in 1960. During the latter part of the war and for two years after the war he served in the Fleet Air Arm of the Royal Canadian Navy as an Observer with the rank of Lieutenant Executive Branch, He is married, with two children, and his wife Helen (also a graduate LL.B. of the Manitoba Law School) is a partner in the firm of Arpin, Rich and Houston.



Britten's Spring Symphony

ONE OF THE musical masterpieces of our time, Benjamin Britten's Spring Symphony, which has been likened to a garland of spring flowers, will be a feature of CBC Tuesday Night, April 5th, at 8:05. It will be performed by the Toronto Mendelssohn Choir and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Elmer Iseler. The program will also include Passacaglia and Air from King Arthur, by Purcell, and Zadok the Priest, by Handel.

The Symphony had its first performance in Amsterdam at the Holland Festival of 1949. Britten says that the idea for it came to him in a lush, tree-bordered meadow somewhere between Snape and Ufford in England's East Anglia. The text is an anthology of 14 English poems evoking spring, and ranging from the 13th-century greeting to the sun, "Sumer is icumen in," through 16th and 17th century lyrics of Milton, Spenser,

Henry Vaughan, Nashe, Fletcher, and other poets, to W. H. Auden's "Out on the lawn I lie in bed."

After its first performance, the music critic of The Times in London wrote that ". . . it was this gaiety, this intoxicated faith and the bubbling happiness that accompanies them which constituted the chief impression of the work," and went on to commend the spiritual radiance of the Symphony.

Britten sub-divided the four main parts of the work into smaller, related sections, each mirroring some contrasting aspect of the season. The first movement depicts the earth's anguish in "black winter" and the longing of all created things for warmth and light. The final movement celebrates the jubilation of early summer, when London's citizens march cheerfully out in their new spring outfits to holiday under the fruit blossoms.

a Spanish slave ship. I wrote it to show my horror of slavery and violence." The plays had their off-Broadway première two years ago. The second half of Tuesday's program will be a performance from Vancouver of Bela Bartok's Quartet No. 6 by violinists Arthur Polson and Campbell Trowsdale, violist Smyth Humphreys, and 'cellist Ernst Friedlander. Like Hammarskjold's Markings, Bartok's Quartets were a continuing expression of his innermost feelings, from the First, written in 1908 when he was in his late 20's, to the Sixth, written in 1939, six years before he died in poverty.

On Wednesday, April 6th, M. W. Steinberg, professor of English at the University of British Columbia, presents a study of political, economic and moral equality as a practical force in contemporary society, in the light of man's struggle from the 19th century until today.

Man's attempt to find salvation, either through involvement in the affairs of the world, or through withdrawal from them, will be discussed on Thursday night in The Voice and the Crowd, a conversation between Northrop Frye, distinguished literary critic and principal of Victoria College, University of Toronto and Father Gregory Baum, a Jewish convert to Roman Catholicism who is head of the Centre of Ecumenical Studies and a professor of theology at St. Michael's College, University of Toronto. In the second half of the program, The Seven Last Words From the Cross by Haydn will be performed by the Vancouver Chamber Orchestra, conducted by Harry Newstone.

Primo Levi's If This Is a Man, a moving account of the degradation of his experiences in Auschwitz concentration camp, where he refused to die, will be presented on Friday night, in a version for

broadcasting by George Whalley of Queen's University, with production by John Reeves. Douglas Rain appears as Levi. When this dramatization was first presented last year, many listeners wrote the CBC to say it was the most remarkable production they had ever heard.

The Common Ear, a documentary about popular music in contemporary society - what it expresses for people and how it fills their emotional needs - will be presented on Saturday night, April 9th. Both those who perform pop music and those who listen to it will express their views. The program was compiled by Jack Batten and produced in Toronto by Doug MacDonald. There will also be two other programs on Saturday night. One features choral music on the theme of innocence, performed by the Festival Singers of Toronto, and produced by James Kent. The other, the Dispossessed, is a documentary study of the mind of a foster child in situations which, to the adult mind, seem tragic. It includes recordings of foster children at play, and interviews with them. Production is by Bill Terry in Vancouver.

The final program, on Sunday night, April 10th, considers two kinds of death, meaningful and meaningless. Death in the Barren Ground tells the grim story of a small party of men who perished of starvation in the winter of 1926-27. in a cabin on Thelon River on the canoe route from Great Slave Lake to Chesterfield Inlet on Hudson's Bay, just before the opening up of the north by air travel. The script by George Whalley is based on a diary kept by the last of the men to die. The second half of the program will present The Third Day: A Play of the Resurrection, compiled by Peter Haworth from a 16th-century text and other sources. with music composed by Robert Turner.

from 11:00 p.m. to midnight on Thursday, April 7th, part two on Good Friday at 2:03 p.m. (2:33 p.m. on CBX and CBR), and part three on Saturday at 11:00 p.m. The cast includes Carleton Hobbs, Cyril Shaps, June Tobin, John Pullen, Deryck Guyler, James Mc-Kechnie and Glyn Dearman, with a section of the New Symphony Orchestra conducted by Christopher Whelen.

The Lincoln Cycle illustrates the advance that was taking place in the drama of the 15th century and the widening of its range. The plays differ from those of other cycles in being acted not on a mobile procession of stage carts but in a standing group of pageants ranged round a central arena, called The Place, the reverse of the modern theatre-in-the-round. The stage directions spoken during the broadcast are unusually vivid. From them we can reconstruct a graphic picture of the performance of mystery plays in the late 15th century.

And at 11:44 Music in the Heather will be replaced by At the Foot of the Cross, a program telling the Passion story through readings from the New English Bible. At 7:30 p.m. the St. George's Cathedral Choir of Kingston, Ontario, directed by Dr. George Maybee, will present a program of Good Friday music, followed at 8:00 by a twohour Concert for Good Friday from Budapest and Prague.

Other radio programs observing Holy Week include The Passion According to St. Luke (Tuesday at 7:30 p.m.), a BBC transcription featuring the Purcell Consort of Voices, conducted by Imogen Holst, with Ian Partridge as the Evangelist, and Christopher Kevte as the Christus. This is the earliestknown Passion music for voices in parts. In the Middle Ages the Passion story was always sung in plainsong. Here the parts of the Evangelist and Christus are still sung in the traditional Gregorian chant, but the other roles are sung by a three-part chorus. The manuscript of the work was discovered just over 20 years ago, and so far there have been few opportunities to hear it sung. In this particular

THIS WEEK'S PERSONALITY: Laurier LaPierre

Professor in the Picture Tube

The jovial co-host of This Hour Has Seven Days jumps from classroom to TV studio several times a week
—and enjoys doing so.

LAURIER LaPIERRE, who divides his time between television appearances and lecturing at McGill University, believes there is little contrast between his two roles.

"I think it's natural for academics to go into public-affairs broadcasting," he says. "We are supposed to have a wide range of interests, and teachers are performers. From the scholarly point of view, a good interview demands research—it must be a confrontation of knowledge with knowledge.

"I think a show like Seven Days, which is trying to get a lot of people committed to their own thoughts, has a great function. The letters we receive are from people who are very much caught up in and concerned with all the complexities of living."

LaPierre is an assistant professor of history at McGill, in Montreal. There he teaches courses in the history of Canadian political parties and French-Canadian intellectual history as well as chairing the French-Canada studies program.

At present LaPierre commutes between Montreal and Toronto or Ottawa about 10 times a month—every Sunday for the production of *Seven Days*, and during the week for interviews. He teaches and sees his students three days a week, has three days free for his family and his own research.

He was born in Lac Megantic, Quebec, on November 21st, 1929. He received his primary and secondary education in Sherbrooke, Quebec, and Baltimore, Maryland.

In the early 50s, LaPierre enrolled at the University of Toronto, where he earned his B.A., M.A. and Ph.D. degrees, graduating in 1962. It was here too that he met his future wife, Paula Armstrong, a student working on her M.A. in history.

LaPierre's television "discovery" was made by Pat Watson, host of *This Hour Has Seven Days*. In 1963 LaPierre had been asked to audition as host for *The Sixties*, a job which ultimately went to Frank McGee. Watson, then producing the Ottawa-based *Inquiry* series, had to replace Davidson Dunton, who was leaving to head the Bilingualism and Biculturalism Commission. He saw the LaPierre audition, liked it, and hired him. When Watson took over his *Seven Days* duties, he brought LaPierre with him.


LaPierre lives in Montreal with his wife and two sons, Dominic, 3, and Thomas, 1.
