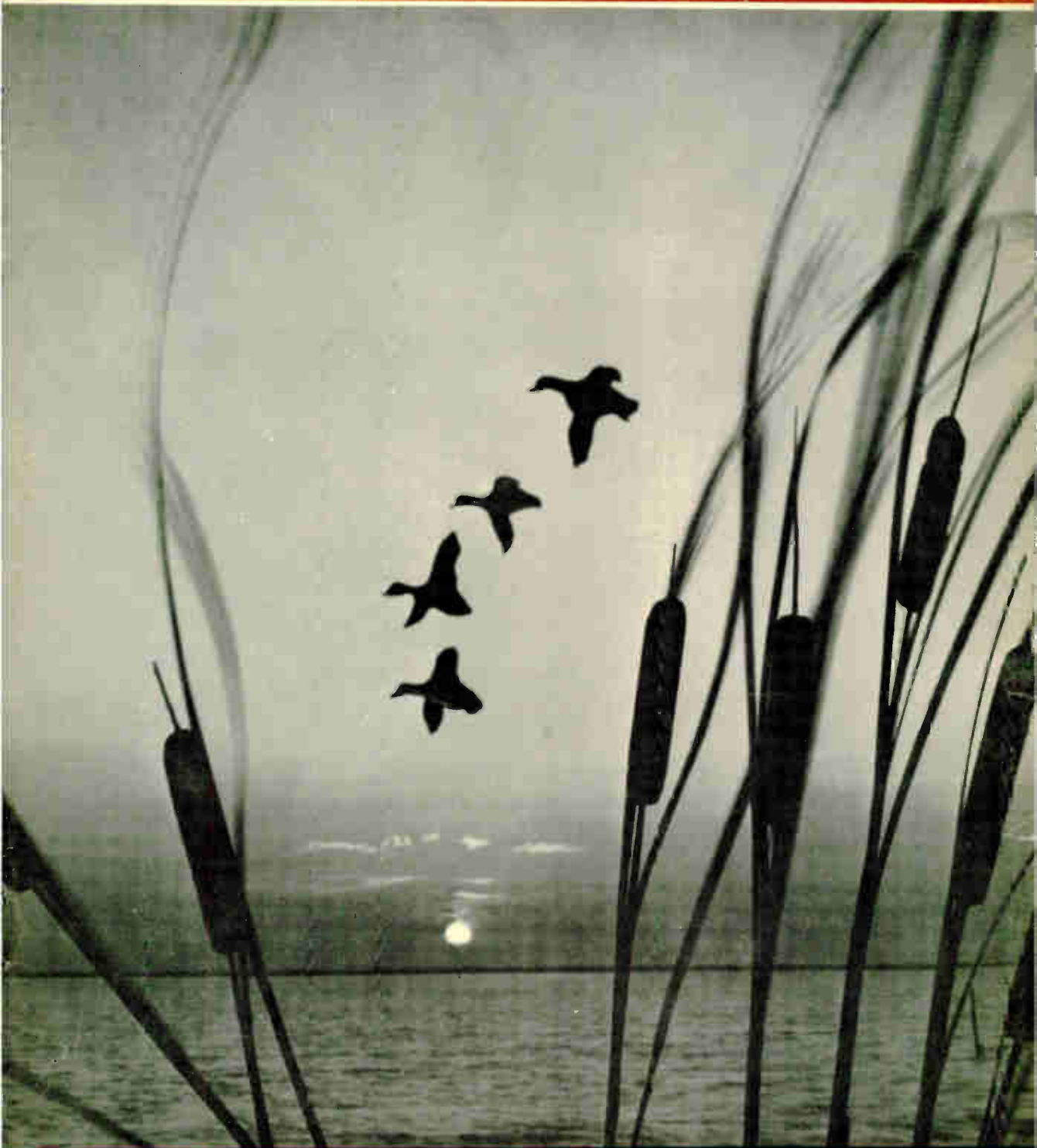

A Strong Protest

• I wish to register strong protest against the cartoon program shown from 8:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 24th on CBC-TV being advertised and broadcast under the title *Alice in Wonderland*. It bore no resemblance to the old classic unless one counts a few familiar character names being bandied about. Furthermore, the dialogue used in the cartoon shown seemed to be aimed more at mentally under-developed adults than at small children.

I have no doubt that many parents, like myself, allowed their small children to stay up late to watch the delightful old story, only to regret it bitterly after the first five minutes. If such things as copyright difficulties made it impossible to produce the original story the advertising matter should have said so and a different title should have been used.

We have come to expect this kind of confidence trick from certain producers of animated cartoons and certain television networks but that the CBC should be a party to such things disappoints me.

ANIMALS AND MAN, a 13-part scientific series presented last fall on CBC television's *The Nature of Things*, has received a special award from the Thomas Alva Edison Foundation in New York.

The award is a special citation given only when the Foundation's directors feel a program has made unusually effective contribution to the public understanding of science.

The *Animals and Man* series was a study of the animal kingdom and man's place in it, through comparisons of anatomy, function and behavior, with emphasis on the relationships of creatures in the evolutionary scheme.

The citation reads: "The trustees of the Thomas Alva Edison Foundation present a special citation for outstanding achievement in a science television series to the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation for *Animals and Man*."

Formal presentation of the award was made in New York to John Livingstone, executive producer of the series, producer James Murray and script consultant Lister Sinclair.

Livingston conceived the series, developing it in consultation with Dr. John Napier of the Royal Free Hospital School of Medicine, London, England—a leading authority on the evolution of higher mammals. Writers were William Whitehead, Livingstone and Napier.

Just west of Winnipeg lies the great Delta Marsh, one of the finest waterfowl breeding areas in North America. She is guest soloist Friday at 7:30 p.m. with the CBC Winnipeg Orchestra on the *CBC Winnipeg Pops Concert*, performing Rachmaninoff's third piano concerto.

Other winners in the Talent Festival were: voice, soprano Jeanette Zarou of Toronto, first; soprano Judith Lebane of Toronto, second; strings, 'cellist Helene Gagne of Montreal, first; violinist Kathryn Wunder of Toronto, second; wood-

winds and brass, clarinetist Alban Gallant of Halifax, first; flutist Robert Cram of Montreal, second; keyboard instruments, pianist Henri Brassard of St. Simeon, Que., second.

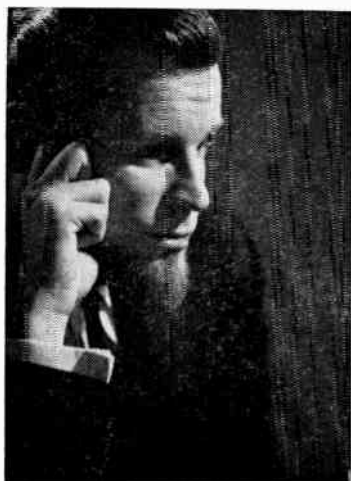
First prize in each category was \$1,000, plus up to \$500 towards tuition fees. First-prize winners also were offered a CBC recital engagement and may be invited to appear with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra in its annual student concert series. Second prize in each category was \$500.

BRIAN MACDONALD:



He Calls the Steps in Three Countries

Three ballet companies benefit from the creativity of this Canadian choreographer. He is interviewed Sunday on THE UMBRELLA.

THIS BEING the week of the annual Academy Awards presentation in Hollywood (see back cover) CBC-TV's show on the arts, *The Umbrella*, will include the topic in this Sunday's edition. Host William Ronald chairs a panel discussing the Oscar awards past and present.

The major part of this week's show, however, will be an interview with choreographer Brian Macdonald of the Royal Winnipeg Ballet, the Royal Swedish Ballet, and the Norwegian Ballet Company. Rita Greer Allen interviewed Macdonald in London last year during the Commonwealth Arts Festival, at which the Royal Winnipeg Ballet performed several works choreographed by Macdonald.

A former music critic for a Montreal paper and a dancer with the National Ballet, Macdonald began to develop as a choreographer after he broke an arm that never really healed properly. That was back in the early '50s. He laid the groundwork for a career as a choreographer by working out routines for ice shows, aquacades, the Montreal *Alouette* cheer-leaders, a weekly variety show on CBC television, and even an act for the celebrated strip-teaser Lili St. Cyr (who told him: "Just give me the steps, honey, I'll sex 'em up.").

In 1957 he directed the McGill student production *My Fur Lady*, which had a successful run in Montreal, (Please turn to page 15)

FESTIVAL:

Exquisite Twenties / Poetry of Dylan Thomas

Poetry and music of this century are presented on
FESTIVAL, Wednesday, April 20th.

THIS WEEK *Festival* offers a most interesting variety of entertainment, beginning at 9:30 p.m. Wednesday with *The Exquisite Twenties*, an hour of music from that era by Maurice Ravel, Igor Stravinsky, and George Gershwin. The Toronto Symphony Orchestra is directed by its dynamic young conductor, Seiji Ozawa, and the soloist will be 20-year-old American violinist James Oliver Buswell IV, who has been winning rave reviews across the continent. Production and direction are by Franz Kraemer.

The second half of the *Festival* program, at 10:30 will be *Dylan Revisited*, a glance through the life of famed Welsh poet Dylan Thomas, as revealed in his writing, adapted for TV and directed by Paul Almond. Douglas Rain appears as Dylan, with Gillie Fenwick, Neil Culleton and Paul Koslo. Sets are by Trevor Williams.

Dylan Revisited begins with the poet "young

and easy under the apple boughs," when "Time let me hail and climb golden in the heydays of his eyes." We see him a few years later as "two-typewriter Thomas, the ace news-dick right out of grammar school." We meet him again on his 30th birthday, when he "rose in raining autumn and walked abroad in a shower of all my days." He explains how he fell in love with the shape and color and sound of words and was at their mercy forever after. "There they were, seemingly lifeless, made only out of black and white, but out of them, out of their own being, came love and terror and pity and pain and wonder, and all the other vague abstractions that made our ephemeral lives dangerous, great, bearable." And last, we see him at 35, toiling "towards the ambush of his wounds," only four years but thousands of springing, shining, capering, loving words away.

MACBETH:

CANADIAN SCHOOL TELECASTS SPECIAL



AN OUTSTANDING performance of Shakespeare's great tragedy about greed and ambition, *Macbeth*, which was presented on CBC-TV last fall, will be repeated on *Canadian School Telecasts* on Thursday, April 21st, at 10:00 a.m.

This was the largest CBC production in the history of school telecasts. Adapted and produced by Herb Roland, it stars Colin Fox as Macbeth, and 23-year-old Ann Anglin as Lady Macbeth, with more than 30 talented young actors from the National Theatre School of Canada in featured roles.

Macbeth is as powerful and timely a drama as it was 3½ centuries ago, because human nature hasn't changed since Shakespeare wrote of the circumstances which can drive a noble and essentially good person to become the lowest of villains in the grip of ambition.

On Tuesday, April 19th, at 10:00 a.m., *Canadian School Telecasts* repeats another production starring members of the National Theatre School. Entitled *Elizabethan Theatre*, the half-hour program shows how Shakespeare's plays were performed in his time in London's famous Globe Theatre.

Upon a Marsh

CANADA 99 looks at our dwindling waterfowl population Wednesday, April 20th at 8:30 p.m.

"AS FAR as I'm concerned, I couldn't care less whether we have ducks around or not. I like to see them all right, but I would just as soon they were on someone else's land."

"Well, I'm not in favor of man upsetting the balance of nature, I think we'd be sorry and future generations sorry if we upset the balance of nature too drastically."

These are the views of two Western farmers in the prairie region, commenting on Canada's diminishing numbers of waterfowl and their breeding areas. Yet another farmer says: "Prairie agriculture has progressed at the expense of the buffalo and the coyote. Why should we let the ducks stand in our way?"

Already in the United States fully one third of the original waterfowl breeding areas have vanished, and in Canada the drainage of marshland for agricultural purposes results in the loss of such areas at the rate of nearly three per cent each year. Not much now, perhaps, but a generation hence the decline of Canada's waterfowl may be severe. Besides the loss of their nesting habitat, the waterfowl are facing other threats to their existence — water pollution, indiscriminate insecticide and herbicide spraying, and, in some cases, hunting. Several members of the waterfowl family are now extinct, others are rapidly diminishing in numbers. Perhaps the best-known example is the whooping crane—there are now only 44 left in North America.

For its final program this season, the television series *Canada 99* ex-

The music of *The Exquisite Twenties* to be heard in the first part of the concert, includes *La Valse* by Ravel, played by the orchestra; *Waltz* and *Ragtime* from *L'Histoire du Soldat* by Stravinsky, performed by James Oliver Buswell IV and six instrumentalists from the orchestra, conducted by Ozawa; the third and fourth movements from the *Violin Concerto* by Stravinsky, played by Buswell and the orchestra; and *An American in Paris* by Gershwin, played by the orchestra.

Ravel's *La Valse*, a choreographic poem for orchestra, and one of his best works, was written in 1919. It's a brilliant exposition on the overshadowing of the romantic waltzes of the 19th century by the advent of jazz, and on the destruction of the gay, carefree life of Old Vienna by the First World War. At the top of the score the composer wrote: "Through an

occasional break in the swirling mist one may dimly distinguish couples waltzing. The vapors are dissipated little by little, revealing an immense ballroom filled by a dancing crowd. The illumination from the chandeliers, blazes forth *fortissimo*. An Imperial Court about 1885."

Stravinsky's *L'Histoire du Soldat* is based on an old Russian legend about a deserting soldier and the devil who comes to carry off his soul, set to modern dance rhythms. The soldier agrees to exchange his violin, the symbol of his soul, for a magic book containing the secret of acquiring wealth.

Gershwin's *An American in Paris*, written in 1928, is one of his most ambitious efforts to use jazz in a symphonic structure. "My purpose," he said, "is to portray the impression of an American visitor in Paris, as he strolls about the city, listens to the various street noises, and absorbs the French atmosphere." It opens with an amusing cacophony of Parisian taxi horns, followed by a lighthearted tour of Paris up and down the boulevards and into a café where a band is setting toes tapping with a popular march. The American visitor's occasional home-sickness is suggested by a haunting blues theme.—June Graham.

and then went on the road, draw-ing good reviews wherever it played. A Canada Council grant in 1958 enabled him to study modern dance and jazz in New York, where he met George Balan-chine of the New York City Ballet.

His first big break in Europe came in the 1961-62 season when the Robert Joffrey company, for which he had created a ballet called *Time Out of Mind*, went to Russia on a cultural exchange pro-gram. *Time Out of Mind* was so well received that Macdonald was literally mobbed in the streets. An-other ballet which he had created for the Banff School of Fine Arts, entitled *Aimez-Vous Bach?*, at-tracted the attention of a Norwe-gian choreographer and he was in- vited to Norway. *Aimez-Vous Bach?* won a top prize at the Sec- ond International Dance Festival in Paris, in 1964, and was among the Macdonald works seen at the Commonwealth Arts Festival.

On *The Umbrella* he discusses with Mrs. Allen the repertory of the Royal Winnipeg Ballet, pre-sented at the festival, and his plans for the future. *The Umbrella* is produced by John Kennedy.

amines Canada's waterfowl resource, what it was in the past, what it is now in relation to present society, and what its future may be. *Once Upon a Marsh*, as the program is sub-titled, visits the principal breeding areas in Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and the state of Minnesota.

to disappear. I was surprised and saddened to learn that many valuable marshlands have already vanished in the name of progress. During the filming we visited Minnesota and North Dakota, where whole counties of marshes had been drained, filled, and converted to farmlands. In Canada, drainage continues at a rate of two or three per cent each year. The biggest problem seems to be that most marshy areas are on farmlands and the farmers receive no income for the production of a public resource on private land. So the marshlands dwindle and the waterfowl population decreases."

Ron Bashford, who produced and directed this edition of *Canada 99*, writes: "I wondered at first just how the marshlands and waterfowl affected the lives of Canadians. The products of most resources, like rivers, seas, forests, and oil-fields, are tangible and obviously vital to the future of the country, but it's a little more difficult to evaluate a flock of geese or ducks. Commercially, there is hunting and tourism, rapidly becoming major industries in a country with wilderness areas. But I really feel the value of the marshlands is felt in more than economic terms, for they provide places for men to periodically return to nature.

Once Upon a Marsh was filmed on the great Delta Marsh in Manitoba and on the sloughs and "pot-hole" marshes throughout western Canada. For Thom Benson, executive producer of the *Canada 99* series, this program has a certain poignancy. He is from Manitoba and grew up there in a time when the waterfowl were plentiful.

"As our country grows, these pristine areas become more important — but it's somewhat of a paradox that these areas also begin

Once Upon a Marsh is introduced by *Canada 99* host J. Frank Willis, who also narrates the program. It was filmed by Ken Gregg of CBC Winnipeg and edited by M. C. Manne. On the sound-track Reg Gibson sings an original ballad which he wrote for this program.

La Boheme. By Giacomo Puccini. Stars Richard Tucker as Rodolfo, Gabriella Tucci as Mimi, Heidi Krall as Musetta, Jerome Hines as Colline and Mario Sereni as Marcello. Conducted by George Schick.

Place, Paris. Time about 1830.

Act I. A garret. Marcello is painting while Rodolfo is gazing out of the window. As they have no fire they use the manuscript of Rodolfo's drama for fuel. Colline enters shivering; he is followed by three young men with food, wood and cigars. Schounard, who follows, explains the source of his riches. While they drink, the landlord arrives to collect the rent from Marcello. They flatter him and give him wine. The rent money is divided for a carousal in the Quartier Latin. The other Bohemians go out, but Rodolfo remains in order to light her candle. She departs, but returns in a few minutes to say she has forgotten her key. Both candles are snuffed out and they fumble in the dark for the key. Rodolfo finds it and pockets it. He takes her hand and in two arias they relate the story of their varied experiences. The waiting friends call Rodolfo, but he wishes to remain at home with Mimi. She decides to accompany him when they persuade him to go.

Act II. Quarter Latin. A large crowd is on the street. Colline buys a great coat. The friends go to a cafe and while they eat, Marcello's former lover, Musetta, arrives with her rich admirer Alcindoro. Wishing to be alone with Marcello, Musetta feigns to be suffering from a tight shoe and sends Alcindoro to a shoemaker. Musetta and Marcello fall into each other's arms. It is discovered that Schounard's riches are gone and the friends cannot pay the bill. Musetta has the entire bill charged to Alcindoro. Joining in a procession, Marcello and Colline carry Musetta out on their arms amid the applause of the spectators. When all have gone, Alcindoro arrives with the shoe. The waiter hands him the bill, and horror-stricken at the amount he sinks into a chair.

Act III. At the toll gate. Clothing peddlers come to the city. Mimi, coughing violently, wishes to speak to Marcello who resides in a little tavern near the barrier where he paints signs for the innkeeper. She tells him of her hard life with Rodolfo who has abandoned her that night. Rodolfo, who is staying at the inn, enters seeking Marcello. Mimi conceals herself. Rodolfo speaks of her deadly illness. Marcello attempts to silence him, but Mimi hears all. She is discovered by her coughing. Marcello joins Musetta in the tavern and Rodolfo and Mimi are finally reconciled. Musetta approaches with Marcello and they have a violent quarrel.

Act IV. Garret room. Marcello and Rodolfo are vainly trying to forget their love affairs and to work. Schounard and Colline arrive with dinner. They parody a plentiful banquet, dance and sing. Musetta and the suffering Mimi appear and all assist the dying girl. Colline goes out to pawn his beloved coat. Mimi and Rodolfo, left alone, recall their past happiness. The others return and while they prepare medicine for her, Mimi dies.

THIS WEEK *CBC Stage* presents *Tyson's Log*, a feature by John Reeves, based on the 1872-73 Arctic diary of Captain George E. Tyson. The production, directed by the author, stars Alexander Webster as Tyson, with incidental music composed and conducted by Morris Surdin. Reeves introduces the feature as follows:

"Captain Tyson was an American sailor who spent most of his working life in the Arctic, both as a whaler and as an explorer. It was in the latter capacity that he joined the *Polaris* expedition in 1871, which set out under the command of C. F. Hall to discover a route to the North Pole. The *Polaris* was powered by sail and steam and was provisioned for three years. The plan was to navigate as far north as possible and then pursue the final stage of the journey by dog-sled. Hall was to undertake this personally with the help of Eskimos, and he was well qualified, having wintered before among the Eskimos, learned their language, and become used to the long treks of the Arctic winter and its scant rations of raw food.

"The original plan, however, came to nothing: the *Polaris* reached well above the 80th latitude before the winter ice set in, and Hall made a short preparatory sled-journey north to survey what

lay ahead of him; but almost immediately after returning to the ship he was taken seriously ill and died a few days later, probably of a stroke. The command now devolved upon a Captain Buddington, a whaler who had no taste for exploration and no talent for leadership. After long vacillation (and drunkenness) he abandoned the aim of the expedition altogether and concerned himself only with a safe return home. This he accomplished late in 1873 with the loss of his ship and 19 of his company.

"These 19, among them Tyson, were separated from the *Polaris* in October, 1872. During an early winter storm the ship was threatened by heaving ice, and the crew was ordered to unload a good stock of provisions onto the ice in case the ship went down. The ship did not in fact go down, but the ice did partially break up and the floe with the provisions on it drifted away in the darkness, carrying with it Captain Tyson, a German scientist called Meyers, the cook and the steward, several German and Swedish seamen, and two Eskimos with their wives and children. The ocean currents carried them relentlessly southward and they were never able to regain the vessel. During their drift Captain Tyson kept an almost daily log. This by a miracle survived. And on it the present feature is based."

The Vision of St. Augustine

A BBC RECORDING of the world première in December of British composer Michael Tippett's new cantata, *The Vision of St. Augustine*, commissioned by the BBC, will be presented on radio this week in the series *Concerts From Two Worlds*. It will be heard Sunday, April 17th, at 3:00 p.m. (9:00 p.m. on CBX and CBR).

The BBC Chorus and Symphony Orchestra are conducted by the composer, and the soloists are baritone Dietrich Fischer-Dieskau and Sheila Amit.

The work is a setting of passages from Augustine's *Confessions*, with amplifications from the Latin Bible. Tippett also uses alleluias

WHEN Prince Edward Island entered Confederation in 1873, Sir John A. Macdonald promised to provide "continuous communication" with the mainland. Since then various political parties and governments have promised some sort of physical link with the mainland. At long last work has begun on a crossing that will cost \$148,000,000, but delays due to overtaxing of the construction industry's facilities might delay completion beyond the 1970-71 date projected.

The crossing, which will span the Northumberland Strait between Prince Edward Island's Port Borden and Jourimain Island on the New Brunswick side, will be a combination of causeway, bridge, and tunnel for both cars and trains. The distance is approximately nine miles, and presents engineers with formidable problems since no crossing has been attempted before over a comparable distance where tidal conditions, weather, and ice are as severe as the strait. The only other similar project is the 14-mile Chesapeake Bay crossing in Virginia.

After waiting nearly a century for their crossing the Islanders now have mixed feelings about it. Some of them feel that the distinctive flavor of the Island, which now is reached only by ferry, will be destroyed.

Agriculture and tourism are the Island's two principal industries. The farmers are naturally happy

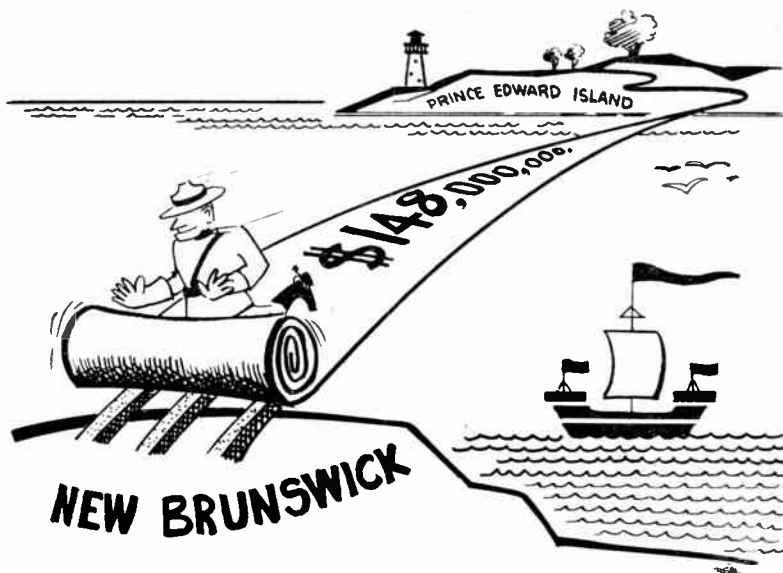
about the crossing since it will get their produce to market faster than at present, but Walter Gaudet, a former mayor of Charlottetown and the secretary-treasurer of the P.E.I. tourist association, feels that the causeway may actually hurt their tourist trade. "Ours is the only island province and it makes for a holiday nobody else can match," he was quoted as saying. "Visitors tell me that the ferry trip is the highlight; they talk about it most. With the causeway we'll be just

another tourist centre at the end of a ribbon of highway . . . I hope I'm wrong because nothing in this province has the potential that the tourist trade has."

Broadcaster Jack McAndrew was in Prince Edward Island recently to record for CBC radio some of the views of the local people about their new causeway. Monday night, April 18th at 9:00 p.m. on *Country Magazine* he will be heard talking to the Islanders on the program *A Road to the Isle*.

JUST BEFORE the mighty *Titanic* slipped beneath the icy black water of the Atlantic on a calm, clear night in April, 1912, taking some 1,500 souls with her, those on board saw another ship steam to within a few miles of them, then veer off. Both the official inquiries into the disaster claimed that the mystery ship was the liner *Californian*, despite the protests of her captain, Stanley Lord, who insisted that his ship was trapped in ice at least 19 miles from the scene. Until his death 50 years later, Lord had to endure the scorn of the world, branded as a man who could have saved hundreds but did nothing. Then, three months after he died, evidence appeared which tended to vindicate him. The first feature on *CBC Tuesday Night* this week, at 8:05, will be *Trial by Inquiry*, a BBC program based on both old and new evidence in the case.

At 9:00 there will be a concert by the Park Lane Ensemble, formed in Britain in 1956 as the result of an idea of three students from the Guildhall School of Music, who wanted a London platform where young artists could perform contemporary and little-known music. This BBC studio program is part of the group's 100th public performance. It includes *Twelve Letters* by Wilfrid Josephs, who was born in 1927. Another of his works was awarded first prize in the 1963 International Composers' Competition of the City of Milan, a success which placed him among the leading composers of his generation. Although he is essentially a serious composer, his *Twelve Letters* is intended as a light-hearted entertainment. The verses are taken from *A Moral Alphabet* by Hilaire Belloc, and the narrator on this occa-

sion is the well-known British entertainer, Michael Flanders.

Actress Dorothy Tutin, a distinguished member of the Royal Shakespeare Company, will narrate Poulenc's *Story of Babar, the Little Elephant*, with Courtney Kenny at the piano. The program also includes Poulenc's *Movement D'Impetuels*; Stravinsky's *Eight Instrumental Miniatures*; and the piano version of *Miniatures*.

At 10:35 Barry Callaghan, of the English department at York University, Toronto, interviews the noted Canadian novelist and short story writer, Margaret Laurence. Miss Laurence is married to a civil engineer whose work takes him to foreign countries from time to time, such as Ghana and Somaliland. She usually accompanies him, and this has given her some authentic background color for her writing. A highlight of *CBC Tuesday Night* on February 8th was a Len Peterson dramatization of one of her short stories, *A Bird in the House*.

Violinist Albert Pratz, noted for his suave, mellow, elderstatesmanship art, arising from his complete mastery of all the violin's ways, will be heard at 11:00 in a recital recorded at Brandon College, Manitoba, with pianist Lorne Watson, director of music at the college. They play sonatas by Walter Piston, Murray Adaskin and Paul Hindemith. Pratz began violin lessons at six, was a professional musician at 14, and hasn't stopped studying since, in spite of a schedule that has included concert tours of Europe and North America, eight years as a member of the NBC Symphony under Toscanini, and many years as concert master of the CBC Symphony and as a teacher of senior students at the Royal Conservatory in Toronto.

DISTINGUISHED ARTISTS:

Pianist Peter Katin

PETER KATIN, considered by British critics as the most brilliant pianist England has produced since the Second World War, will be the *Distinguished Artist* in recital on CBC radio on Wednesday night, April 20th, at 10:30. He will play the Chopin Sonata in B minor, Opus 58.

A former head choirboy at Westminster Cathedral, he was a well-known concert and broadcast performer at 25, when he was appointed professor of pianoforte at the Royal Academy of Music, where he had studied as a boy.

Katin had concentrated on the classics until VJ night when, in a Torquay seaside hotel he volunteered to deputize for a band pianist who had not turned up, and found he could play dance music exceptionally well. Since then he has composed and recorded some light music of his own.

He drives to all his concert engagements within a couple of hundred miles from London—says he finds it a pleasant way to relax before a performance.

Also of special interest this week is a *Symphony Hall* concert by the Philharmonia Orchestra of London, conducted by Sir Adrian Boult, on Thursday, April 21st, at 9:00 p.m. The program includes *Symphony No. 8* by Schubert; *Jeux D'Enfants* by Bizet; and *Symphonic Fragments* from *Daphnis and Chloe*, by Ravel.

and Greek vowels, in keeping with an ancient belief that "ecstasy forces from us a jubilation beyond words." Augustine, whom Tippett considers a religious genius and a modern, was born in North Africa in 354 A.D. When he was 33 he had a vision of a child singing, which led to his final conversion to Christianity. Some months later he had another vision of Eternity, which he shared with his mother, Monica, who died five days later. It is this second vision which is the theme of the cantata.

The first part is rather austere, to show the heartsearching that is necessary if man is to reach the state of ecstasy where it is possible for him to experience a religious vision. The second part is the vision itself. The third is an ecstatic contemplation of the experience the saint and his mother have undergone.

Tippett says: "The music of the angels is the expression of Eternity as against Time. In Christian doctrine it is not possible to know Eternity till after death and resurrection. All that God in his Grace

grants us is occasionally a preleptic vision, a minute foretaste of what this might be. Augustine and his mother were granted such a vision. Five days before she died they stood together in a window embrasure of an inn at Ostia on the Tiber, looking into an inner garden. They asked each other that central question: What might the life of the Saints be like in God's Eternity? Augustine describes how they lost the sense of outside things to the degree that they sensed only their souls. But this was not enough. In Augustine's own words: 'we went *beyond* our souls, so that we might touch that region of unending richness, where you feed Israel forever with the food of truth. . . . And while we were thus talking of eternal life and panting for it, we touched it for a moment with the whole effort of our heart.' But this moment was wordless, for, he continues, 'we sighed, and left the first fruits of our spirit bound to it, and returned to the sounds of our mouth, where words begin and end'."

The program includes a performance of *Symphony No. 3* by Humphrey Searle, with Sandor Salgo conducting the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra.

When the Messiah Comes

THE PROGRAM this week on the radio series *Soundings* opens with the following dialogue between an interviewer and an elderly Jew: "Question: Do you think that things will ever be good between the Gentiles and the Jews? Answer: Yeh, yeh, yeh. Question: When? Answer: When? . . . Ven der Meschiach vet Kimen—When the Messiah comes."

Probably only Jews will appreciate the irony of the old man's reply. It's another way of saying "when pigs fly." The Messiah is coming, but don't count on it being tomorrow. Meanwhile, until He does come, relations between Jews and Gentiles are likely to remain somewhat strained—even in Canada, one of the most tolerant and welcoming of Diaspora lands, where the Jews have settled among the Gentiles.

Moses Znaimer, who has produced this edition of *Soundings*, writes: "There have been many studies of Canadian Jewry, quite a few of them on the CBC. But they have generally been *external* to the community, focusing *in* on it. In contrast, this documentary, *When the Messiah Comes*, reverses optics, and has the community looking *out*. Out at the world of the Gentile and at itself as part of the world. Again, where previous "probes" always put their questions to Canada's "Official Jews" — professors, professionals, and rabbis — this one consists wholly and *only* of the views of laymen, the businessmen, students, and housewives.

"What do they have to say? Well, the kinds of things which aren't heard at mixed teas and Brotherhood conventions. A spade is a spade and a goy is a goy and a wasp is a wasp: someone to dislike and be suspicious of and envy. The talk is blunt — on hate and hope, on "passing," on returning, on being different and better and why, on how it hurts. Message?

None other than the old truth. Jewish life in Canada is ambivalent. Though it flourishes materially, still it's uncomfortable. For every Jew, however remotely, is a wary survivor of the unpleasant centuries. Though young Jews sometimes attempt to escape spiritually, still they retain a certain allegiance to the people and a pride in its achievement. Understand this and you're well on the way to understanding those other mysterious Jewish phenomena: the togetherness within; the exclusivity without."

Znaimer and freelance writer/broadcaster Earl Berger interviewed dozens of Jews representing three generations in the large Jewish communities in Montreal and Toronto. They spoke to the elderly, Orthodox Jews from Europe now living in old peoples' homes here, to the middle generation and the young people of today. While the observance of ritual may be growing lax among the young people, they found, the bonds that unite all Jews are still as strong as ever.

THIS WEEK'S PERSONALITY: *Don Tremaine*

'Trigger' is Down-East Cowboy

EVERY MONDAY evening a genial man with the intriguing nickname of "Trigger" steps into the CBC television spotlight—a piece of paper in hand, a smile on his face and ready for action.

Viewers may not know him as Trigger but they do know him as Don Tremaine, host of *Don Messer's Jubilee*, seen Mondays at 7:30 p.m. on the CBC-TV network.

Don enjoys his role as host of this down-east music show as each week he introduces, with great enthusiasm, the music of fiddler Don Messer and his Islanders, songs by Charlie Chamberlain, Marg Osburne and Catherine McKinnon, special numbers by the Buchta Dancers and special guests.

Don's nickname has been with him for many years and is one of many background facts that may not be commonly known about this CBC staff announcer in Halifax.

Born in Summerville, Mass., of Maritime parents who returned to Nova Scotia when he was three, Don has the distinction of having worked at one time as a "cemetery maintenance engineer," sometimes referred to as a "grave digger."

"During the summer months when school was over, I worked for two years in a local cemetery," says Don. "Forty cents an hour was good money in those days," he added with a chuckle, "and besides, the exercise did me good."

Don, or Trigger as he is more often called by people who know him, also worked as a radio actor while attending Queen Elizabeth High School, Halifax, and later joined the Marine Division of the R.C.M.P.

Married to the former Jean Katherine Cameron of Pictou County, Nova Scotia, Trigger began his career in broadcasting as an announcer with CHNS radio in Halifax.

A country and western music buff, he is familiar to east coast listeners as host of the daily program *Jamboree Junction*, which is heard on the CBC Maritime radio network.

He is also well known to viewers in the Nova Scotia-Prince Edward Island area as a member of the popular TV *Gazette* show, seen week nights over CBHT in Halifax.

Trigger, who counts as his hobbies playing the guitar, swimming, reading and gradually re-

modelling his house, got his nickname as the result of hosting a country and western show.

"Prior to my joining the CBC in Sydney," he says, "I was referred to by the public as that cowboy with the local radio station."

Don recalls the most embarrassing moment of his career occurred during a trip to Toronto. "I flew in for an overnight taping session," he remembers, "and when I got up out of bed in the morning, I had lost my voice."

"It was actually quite hilarious," he recalls with a laugh. "They tried everything from hot milk to honey and a mixture of both, but nothing would work."

"When I arrived back in Halifax, I went directly to the studio for the Don Messer show and was able to limp through the evening on a greatly reduced-in-volume voice, but nevertheless a voice."

Don is a homebody and devotes much of his time off to enjoying his three small children. He and his wife try to keep the children away from the limelight he receives as one of the busiest and most popular CBC personalities in the Maritimes.
