World Radio History

ANOTHER AWARD has come to The Mills of the Gods: Viet Nam. The dramatic actuality report on the war in Viet Nam, seen on CBC-TV last December, received the third annual Wilderness Award April 29th, in recognition as the best film produced for CBC Television in 1965.

The winning film, selected from 24 outstanding entries, was produced and directed by Beryl Fox. Receiving medals for their contribution to the production, in addition to Miss Fox, were executive producer Douglas Leiterman, cameraman Erik Durschmeid and editor Don Haig. Miss Fox, Mr. Leiterman and Mr. Haig were recipients of the 1963 Wilderness Award as well, for One More River.

The much-acclaimed Mills of the Gods only last month won for Miss Fox the coveted George Polk Award from Long Island University.

The Wilderness Trophy was presented in a ceremony April 29th, by A. Davidson Dunton, president and vice-chancellor of Carleton University, Ottawa, Special awards at the same ceremony went to Vancouver producer Philip Keatley for Antoine's Wooden Overcoat, shown on CBC-TV in the Cariboo Country series May 13th of last vear; to director-writer Larry Zolf. producer Douglas Leiterman and editor-co-director Vincent Vaitiekunas for Strike: Men Against Computers, seen on Document; to cameraman Grahame Woods for The Gift, the compelling story of a survivor of the Hiroshima bombing; to George Robertson as producer-writer of The Journey, examining aspects of Canada's religious heritage; and to Barry Morse, for his contribution as narrator of George Bernard Shaw: Who the Devil Was He?, presented on Festival.

SOON ALL of America will be chuckling and reminiscing with Wayne and Shuster. A series of nine CBC-TV programs in which they take "affectionate looks" at comedians, actors and movies of the past and present have been sold to the Columbia Broadcasting System for telecast this summer



as Friday night specials for U.S. viewers.

The series, co-produced by CBC-TV and M.C.A. (Canada), is created and narrated by Johnny Wayne and Frank Shuster. First programs were seen in 1964-65 on Show of the Week, and they have continued this year, with two still to be seen in Canada: An Affectionate Look at the Western, May 16th (see this week's cover) and Mae West, scheduled for June 20th.

Other shows in the series have dealt with George Burns, Abbott and Costello, Jack Benny, The Marx Brothers, Bob Hope and Bing Crosby, W. C. Fields, and the Film Monsters.

Executive producer of the series is Gil Rodin, and directors are Norman Campbell and Bob Jarvis. CBS will telecast the series each Friday at 10:00 p.m. beginning June 17th.

A MAJOR expansion of CBC radio's news service has taken place with the implementation of the new summer radio schedule now in effect. Newscasts now are heard virtually every hour on the hour on weekdays, with supplementary newscasts on the half-hour as well at breakfast, lunch and suppertime.

Explaining the reason for this increase in news programming, Charles Gunning, director of CBC radio news, says it is in "recognition of the public appetite for frequent access to news which only the immediacy of radio is able to satisfy."

One hour of the day does not feature a newscast -9:00 p.m. This allows for longer programming to be scheduled at that time without interruption.

Weekend newscasts, while not quite as frequent as in the Monday-to-Friday schedule, reflect the increased emphasis on news, with only three or four periods missing from the news-on-the-hour schedule. WOJECK, CBC - TV's 10 - week series of one-hour dramas starring John Vernon as a big city coroner has begun filming in Toronto.

To be shot almost entirely on location, the series will be filmed on a continuing basis until mid-October. With scripts by Toronto's Phillip Hersch, *Wojeck* will make its debut on the CBC-TV network in mid-September, at the start of the new season.

Ronald Weyman, executive producer, announced that the first episode to be filmed is entitled All Aboard for Candyland, and its theme is dope addiction. Kate Reid is the guest star of this episode, which will not necessarily be the initial one to be telecast.

In addition to John Vernon, who plays the coroner, Dr. Steve Wojeck, series regulars will include Patricia Collins as Marty Wojeck, the coroner's wife; Ted Follows as Arnie Bateman, of the crown attorney's office; and Carl Banas as Byron James, a detective sergeant attached to the coroner's office. Playing the two Wojeck children will be young James Weyman and Kirstin Campbell.

The episode entitled All Aboard for Candyland is directed by Paul Almond. George McCowan, recently associated with ASP Productions' Seaway series, will direct the next Wojeck episode to be filmed between May 5th and 19th. Titled, Listen! An Old Man Is Speaking, it concerns the problems of senior citizens.

Other directors to be involved in the Wojeck series include Ron Kelly, noted for his CBC-TV dramatic documentaries, The Open Grave, The Gift, and others, who will make his debut as a drama director. Ronald Weyman, the series' executive producer, will also direct several episodes.

Wojeck, will be shot in a similar fashion to the pilot, *Tell Them* the Streets Are Dancing, telecast on CBC-TV on the Bob Hope Theatre series in early March. Distinguished radio producer Rupert Caplan brings a compelling Strindberg drama to life for MIDWEEK THEATRE, Wednesday at 9:00 p.m. on radio.

"THE FATHER, by August Strindberg, is not unknown to me," Montreal producer Rupert Caplan says with a smile. "Many years ago, I produced it and played the male lead for the Montreal Theatre Guild. Later, I produced the same drama for the Ottawa Little Theatre."

And now, for the third time, Mr. Caplan is producing Strindberg's powerful drama about a tormented married couple, poles apart in their sympathies, yet intensely preoccupied with

the perverse relationship that binds them together. The Father will be presented on radio's *Midweek Theatre* on Wednesday, May 18th, at 9:00 p.m. Budd Knapp stars as The Captain, with Eileen Clifford as the paranoiac wife, and with Henry Ramer, Eleanor Stuart, and Alan Mills in leading roles.

One of Canada's most distinguished men of the theatre, Rupert Caplan has produced more than 1,000 dramas on radio, stage and television. He is now best known for his radio work and, in this field, he has won an impressive collection of citations, awards and prizes.

Since 1931, Caplan has been in the top echelon of Canadian theatrical producers, but in the decade prior to that occurred the two most important interludes in his early career. In the 20s, for 2½ years, he worked with the Provincetown Players under the direction of Eugene O'Neill, whose literary executor he was named; and he also worked in close association with Tyrone Guthrie, then a member of the BBC.

One of Caplan's most outstanding productions was a threehour memorial program following the death of Eugene O'Neill, in 1953. As a consequence of this (Please turn to page 15)

in York-Scarborough

CBC radio recalls the political battles of the last election, using Canada's largest constituency as a case-in-point, in a five-part series beginning Sunday, May 15th at 11:03 p.m.

CANADA'S LARGEST Federal riding is the York-Scarborough constituency near Toronto. It has a population of about 350,000, with about 200,000 eligible voters. Yet in spite of its size – three times that of Prince Edward Island and more than half that of New Brunswick or Newfoundland – it has only one member of parliament.

Because of its many distinctive features as a political battleground, York-Scarborough was chosen when last fall's election campaign got under way for one of the most detailed, objective studies ever attempted by CBC radio. Harry J. Boyle, Radio Network Features Supervisor, sent a team of reporters under program organizer John David Hamilton to York-Scarborough at the time the political parties were mobilizing their forces for the campaign. They were to set up their headquarters alongside the various party headquarters in the east end of the riding and gather the whole story of how Canadians go about the business of electing their representatives in Parliament, from the date the election is called until the final post-mortem on the results. They were to find out what kind of people lived in a particular riding, how they voted, what they wanted, and what ideas appealed to them.

From the political parties they were to find out how each was organized, how they worked, and what kind of approach was used not only to their own candidates but to opposition candidates, the national parties and the national issues. All of the parties cooperated, and the back-room planners were delighted that somebody was going to tell their story. Hamilton's reporters were allowed to sit in on strategy meetings, interview the (Please turn to page 27)



FESTIVAL: Glenn Gould and Yehudi Menuhin

Two of this era's greatest musicians combine talents for a television performance Wednesday, May 18th at 9:30 p.m.

TWO-AND-A-HALF years ago, when two of the world's greatest musicians, violinist Yehudi Menuhin and pianist Glenn Gould, happened to be in New York at the same time, Gould invited Menuhin to the CBC's Manhattan office to see a screening of the TV program The Anatomy of Fugue, which Gould had recently videotaped for the Festival series. "This one is a special pet," Gould told Menuhin, and added "I like making these films. I've always felt this terrible frustration in concerts. You do it and it's gone. Why not put it on film and have it? So it will be there." Menuhin murmured agreement. "I don't know if my film is for the mass public," Gould went on. "Sometimes I think they don't know what the hell I've said, but they feel elevated." They exchanged knowing grins, and then Gould called "Roll film!"

Menuhin was spellbound. As he watched, he kept murmuring "Lovely. Wonderful! Beautifully done. Most enjoyable," and sighed with envy as the program ended. So Gould made a suggestion: "Next year, if you're going to have some time, we might do one together. You ever done the Schoenberg Fantasia?" Menuhin's eyes lit up. "What a splendid ideal I must look at the music."

"It's a dry work — one of his last things," Gould told him. "Oh, I have the music," Menuhin went on. "You're coming to England next summer? We might do it there. On the screen it does gain dimension."

Gould nodded. "Some people say that every performance is an experience," the pianist said, "but it's not that for me in concerts. It's animal. It's all a circus. It's immoral."

"I know what you mean," said Menuhin. Then, looking ahead to the prospect of appearing together in a TV concert of works they both admired, h e added: "The Schoenberg. It will be lovely."

But it wasn't until last fall that they finally got together for the CBC-TV show -aprogram of music and stimulating but informal musical conversation displaying their musicianship and delightful personalities to full advantage. It will be presented on Festival this Wednesday, May 18th, as the first in a series of eight hour-long concerts and music programs. Besides Schoenberg's Fantasia the program includes Sonata No. 4 in C Minor by Bach and Sonata, in G Major, Opus 96, by Beethoven. Production is by Eric Till, with Franz Kraemer as executive producer, and sets designed by Robert Lawson.

Board Presents . . .

A series of documentaries is presented on CBC-TV Wednesdays at 10:30 p.m., beginning May 18th.

NFB PRESENTS, a series of documentary films illustrating aspects of life in Canada, returns to the television network this week for its third season. In the weeks ahead, viewers will see what goes on behind the scenes when Max Ferguson does his morning radio show; will visit the headquarters of a motorcycle gang; take a trip aboard the schooner Bluenose II; and see how the war of 1812 affected the settlers in the western part of Upper Canada.

The first program in the series, No Reason to Stay, introduces two young Montreal students, Raymond Wray and Cathy Wiele, in their first screen roles. Wray plays the part of Christopher Wood, an 18-year-old high school dropout, with Cathy as his girl friend. Based on a script by a boy of Christopher's age with first-hand knowledge of the problem, No Reason to Stay explores the situation of a teen-ager who feels that the present educational system has nothing to offer him and that no one listens to his side of the story.

"It's blackmail," he says, "if you don't stay in school, you won't get a job." His girl (*Please turn to page* 9) Raymond Wray, right, portrays Christopher, a high school dropout, who in his world of fantasy sits in judgment on a teacher accused of boring students to death. Snooker Played by Champions

WHEN PRODUCER Claude Baikie tells host Bill Walker to take his cue, he means that literally. On the new series, *Championship Snooker*, seen Saturday afternoons, Bill introduces two competitors each week, for play at Championship House in Toronto.

It's the most familiar billiards game to the layman, being played with 15 red balls, and one each of black, pink, blue, brown, green, yellow, and white balls.

much-praised broadcast, the playwright's widow gave Caplan exclusive Canadian rights to everything written by her late husband, including the stage production of *Long Day's Journey into Night*. Caplan produced the latter play for CBC Wednesday Night in 1959 and, because of its emphasis on suffering, abuse, guilt and hatred, it aroused controversy. But the production was a critical success, and won a coveted Ohio State University award.

"I am frequently asked why I did not go to the U.S.," he remarks. "The O'Neill play might serve as an example of one of the reasons I have not done so. I believe that the CBC is one of the few broadcasting systems in the world that allows its producers the intellectual freedom necessary to stage such a production."

"But apart from that, I am a Canadian. I like Canada and I've been happy to make my life here. I would make more money in the U.S., that's true. But here, I have had creative satisfaction, and a constant stimulation that is worth more than money to me. Privately

owned broadcasting companies are sponsor-conscious — they have to be. Therefore, I don't believe that I would be allowed to produce Long Day or many other works I've directed, in the U.S. Here, at the CBC, the intellectual climate is more liberal and more conducive to artistic achievement. This is true of Canada as a whole, I believe."

Caplan's contributions to Canadian drama have involved the development of many writers and actors, now well known on the international s c e n e, including Christopher Plummer, R e u b e nShip, Hume Cronyn, William Shatner, Ted Allen and John Colicos.

Asked how he felt about Canada's talent drain, Caplan shrugged philosophically. "When they leave, they take a bit of Canada with them, and they make fine ambassadors abroad for this country. Because of them, Canada is becoming known as a rich source of talent.

"There was a time not so long ago," he continued, "that Canada was thought of as a land of tall timbers, mines and wheat fields. Now, the image is changing. When people think of Canada, they think of writers, singers and actors. And best of all, Canadians themselves have learned to take great pride in their own people."





ARE YOU A SAFE DRIVER?

three hours someone becomes a paraplegic or a quadraplegic **as** a result of a car injury.

Currently there is a good deal of agitation to get more safety features built into automobiles to help cut down the heavy toll. Seat belts. head-rests. collapsible steering wheels, recessed instrument panels and door handles have all been recommended as measures that could reduce injury. But what about the human element, the man behind the wheel? Most people who do a lot of driving probably think of themselves as responsible, careful, alert to possible danger and ready to meet sudden emergencies.

To find out just how skilful you are as a driver, to see if you can match or better the national average, you can participate in a special television program this Thursday night and test yourself on your responses to certain traffic conditions, your knowledge of highway safety rules, and basic good driving habits.

The Canadian Drivers' Test is being produced by the CBC in cooperation with the Canadian Highway Safety Council as a public service. Over the past few weeks the Council has been distributing, all across the country, test forms (similar to the one on the back cover of this issue) to be used by viewers for answering questions to be posed during the program. Each question, as the program hosts will explain, will be given a certain number of points for a correct answer and the total score will give you your standing in relation to the national average.

The national average is a standard based on a nation-wide survey which the CBC Research Department recently commissioned for this program. Survey teams in all provinces quizzed over a thousand Canadian motorists on what they knew about cars, what they knew about cars, what they thought they should do in a given situation, and what they knew about the rules of the road. Out of this study emerged a fairly clear picture of what the average Canadian driver is like.

candidates, and spend a good deal of time in committee rooms.

The principal candidates were: Frank M c G e e. Conservative: Robert Stanbury, Liberal; and Ed Phillips, New Democratic Party. McGee had been the Conservative member from 1957 to 1963. He was defeated in 1963 by Maurice Moreau, Liberal, who retired in 1965, at which time Stanbury won the nomination over two other candidates. Ed Phillips was fighting his third campaign against McGee and although he had a manager, was largely running his own show.

As to the riding itself, Douglas Fisher, the former NDP member of Parliament, recently wrote in the Toronto Telegram "It symbolizes both the future characteristics of the electoral framework and a denial of the past in the sense that fast growth and a mobile people have stacked a countryside, wiping out traditions and history." And John David Hamilton writes: "York-Scarborough is where the New New Newest Canadians live . . . there are no traditional guidelines, political or social. It is a purely suburban area with no central core and it consists of most of the gigantic municipality of Scarborough and parts of the municipalities of North York, Leaside, and Markham. Downtown Toronto is only a few miles away and York-Scarborough residents commute to work there. Yet it has


little connection with Toronto traditions. Newcomers from all over the country have swamped the old communities which grew up in the early days of rural Ontario.

"Bungalows and high-rise apartments cover the old Ontario farms now, the village squares have become shopping plazas. There are hundreds of factories and scores of one-family houses. Don Mills is our national symbol of the wealthy suburb. There are new schools everywhere. There are few old people and no slums. The mass of the people who live in York-Scarborough have security and affluence on a scale never before experienced in Canada except by the wealthy.

"The people are generally young and optimistic. They're impatient with the fixed patterns of small towns and the limited income of the worn-out farms of the Maritimes and rural Ontario and Quebec. They've seen what the rich life is on television and they want a part of it. The ones from the big cities—Toronto, for instance—want more room and fresher air and better schools for their children. They're tired of living in ghettoes and ethnic enclaves.

"Most of the people I talked to weren't much worked up about the flag, or scandal, or the French-English crisis, or 'repatriation of the constitution', or American investment. They talked mainly about jobs, prosperity, schools, better homes, the price of milk, the new car, medical expenses, and whether Suzy was behaving herself at the drive-in movie."

Hamilton's team was made up of Starr Cote, ex-reporter from the Ottawa *Citizen*, who was assigned to the Progressive Conservatives; Ann Phelps, a former newspaper reporter who has written many radio documentary programs (including the award-winning *The Southern Moderate*), who covered the Liberal camp; Howard Engel, producer of CBC radio's *Project* '66 series and program organizer for the television series *The Ob*-

server, who worked with the New Democrats. Other team-members who interviewed both political and non-political people in the riding included: Lyal Brown, a frequent contributor of the *Project* series and many other CBC radio and television programs; Bill McNeil, a broadcaster who is perhaps best known as the host of Assignment; and Hector McFadyen, a veteran radio producer who was in charge of technical operations.

The many hundreds of hours of interviews and reports which the team recorded have been edited down to comprise five one-hour programs, entitled *Donnybrook in York-Scarborough*, beginning this week on radio (Sunday at 11:03 p.m.). The same series begins on CBW-FM May 25th.

Douglas Fisher, who read the background story to Donnybrook in York-Scarborough, written by John David Hamilton, wrote in the Telegram: "The CBC has given us the best study of a constituency election that I have ever read. . . . Even a lot of politicians would like to forget that election. Why then should case study be of any interest? Because it captures the problems of the modern candidate and politics in the new form of society and living and demonstrates the hazy inconsequence of so much party behavior."

The Madras House, by Granville-Barker

THESE DAYS everyone is so busy rediscovering Ibsen and patting George Bernard Shaw on the back that they're overlooking, and perhaps underrating, another turn-ofthe-century dramatist who wrote just as witty and intellectually provocative plays commenting on social problems of his time - Harley Granville-Barker. When he was manager of London's Court Theatre in the early years of this century, and was one of the apostles of the "new drama," he gave a hearing to Ibsen and Shaw when conventional theatres shunned them, frequently playing the principal male roles in Shaw's early plays, thus ironically establishing the glow

Soprano Joan Patenaude, baritone John Boyden, tenor Robert Peters, soprano Belva Boroditsky and contralto Ann Golden with Otto Werner-Mueller conducting the orchestra in: Maria Egiziaca Respighi around these playwrights which later overshadowed his own fine work. He didn't write a lot — he's remembered particularly for his excellent prefaces to Shakespeare and for his stage theory, which emphasizes the importance of correct tempo in everything from Shakespeare to slapstick.

But Granville-Barker's few plays include some of the richest of modern times. He had a sharply clear mind and a knack for detached, mocking dialogue equalled by very few. Critic Thomas H. Dickinson once said that Granville - Barker's plays are "like reminiscences of passionate things after emotion has cooled, for they are aloof, cynical. . . . He is like Shaw in liking discussion, in feeling that ideas are among the most important things in the world." Another critic, A. C. Ward, feels that Granville-Barker's great appeal is that his people are "creatively well nourished; beside them, Galsworthy's later characters seem like dyspeptic ghosts around a board of funeral baked beans.'

Frequently he dealt with themes considered most daring in his time, but he had the ability to make intellectual arguments dispassionate enough to get past the censors but still keep the box office happy, except in the case of

Waste, banned because of its savage brutality. One of his most successful was The Voisey Inheritance, a cynical but vital drama full of soul-searchings and frustrations with which audiences find it very easy to identify. One of his greatest achievements was The Madras House, a most agreeable play in which he deals wittily and knowingly with the problem of the "new woman," viewing it with cuttingly ironic brilliance that Shaw never matched, in the opinion of many, even in Man and Superman. "You have got your freedom," says Philip Madras. "Do you mean to pay the price of it? . . . I try to treat you now as I treat another man. . . ." It's not a new idea, but it's still a problem.

The Madras House, in an adaptation by Andrew Allan, will be heard on May 17th in Cohen's Choice, a CBC Tuesday Night series of plays chosen by Toronto critic and broadcaster Nathan Cohen as outstanding but neglected examples of fine 20th-century drama. Production and direction will be by Gerald Newman in the Vancouver studios. Cohen is currently writing a book on What's Wrong With the American Theatre, to be published in a few months by Hawthorne Books in New York. -June Graham.

The 36-piece orchestra will be conducted by Otto Werner-Mueller.

Written as a triptych in one act, the opera opens with Maria, grown weary of her life as a tavern girl in the Port of Alexandria, begging a sailor to take her aboard his ship and carry her far away to a new and better life, offering her body as payment for her passage. A pilgrim tries to warn the sailor that having such an evil woman aboard will spell disaster, but despite him, Maria crosses the seas and arrives at the Temple of Jerusalem where the voice of an angel counsels her to seek redemption through Zosimo, a hermit priest. Old and feeble after years of wandering and seeking, Maria eventually reaches Zosimo in the desert. She confesses to "sins that make the sun hide" and, on receiving absolution, Maria falls dead and is accepted into Heaven.

"It is a highly romantic and melodic work," says producer Lawrence Taylor. "Although it is comparatively little known to the general public, I feel that CBC listeners will discover it with a sense of great delight and enjoyment."

Joan Patenaude, formerly of Montreal, now lives in New Jersey and studies with the Metropolitan Opera Studio. CBC radio was among the first to recognize the talent of the young singer, in awarding her first prize in the voice category of CBC Talent Festival in 1963. She will make her début in September with the New York City Opera Company as Micaela in Bizet's *Carmen*, a role she sang two years ago with the Canadian Opera Company.

Except for a quirk of fate, she would now be studying in Vienna. "After winning a scholarship, I had bought my ticket to Europe. But since the time I had won a Met audition in 1964, the Met had asked me to keep in touch. When I phoned John Gutman to tell him I was going abroad, he said, 'Don't be silly. Come with us.' He advised me that I would do better in New York. 'The love affair between Europe and North American singers is over,' he said." Miss Patenaude is one of 14 young singers studying full time with the Metropolitan Opera Studio where, without charge, they have the benefit of the Met's vocal and dramatic coaches, as well as special training in musical interpretation and languages. They also learn the full repertoire of the Metropolitan Opera Company. Miss Patenaude, who says she has had "an unbelievable amount of help," also has her living expenses paid under a grant from the Province of Quebec.

She is happy to be close to Canada. "My contacts here mean so very much to me. When I come back to Montreal or Toronto to do recitals or an opera on CBC radio or TV, as I often do, my friends in the U.S. are amazed at the opportunities that come my way. There is nothing comparable to the CBC for them."

Stratford-born John Boyden, now a Montreal resident, agrees with that. "In New York, my Canadianism gives me a definite advantage. Maybe it's because this country has produced such an astounding number of fine musicians."

The third star of *Maria Egiziaca*, Robert Peters, is another young artist who has won fame on both sides of the border. Born in Somerville, Mass., he has adopted Montreal as home base and commutes back and forth. As well as major

Canadian engagements, he has sung the lead in Mozart's Magic Flute at Lincoln Centre and in the New York première of Berlioz' Benvenuto Cellini. He is engaged to return to Lincoln Centre next December to sing the lead in Berlioz' L'Enfance du Christ.

Junior Forest Rangers Canada's Ambassadors Abroad

CBC - TV's The Forest Rangers series, seen Saturdays at 5:00 p.m., can be seen these days in almost every part of the world -38 countries in all besides Canada.

Canadians looking for a spot of warm sunshine in Mexico or Barbados are sometimes mildly surprised when so far away from home, they turn on television and see the familiar RCMP uniform and lands and forests department rangers of Indian River, a mythical town somewhere in the Canadian north.

The Forest Rangers is watched in the following countries: Saudi Arabia, Luxembourg, Finland, Sierra Leone, Britain, the U.S., Australia, New Zealand, East Germany, Hungary, Yugoslavia, Norway, Malaysia, Belgium, Gibraltar, Malta, Portugal, Switzerland, Costa Rica, Guatemala, Honduras, Puerto Rico, Argentina, Peru, Uruguay, Venezuela, Kenya, West Nigeria, Rhodesia, Sudan, Uganda, Zambia, Ghana, Egypt, Jamaica and Trinidad, and Hong Kong.

Fan mail, addressed to the Junior Forest Rangers, played by Ralph Endersby, Peter Tully, George Allen, Susan Conway – and to Graydon Gould (chief ranger George Keeley) and Michael Zenon (Indian Joe Two Rivers) – comes in from all over the world to ASP Productions, which makes the *Forest Rangers* series.

Most letter writers want to become pen-pals with the Junior Forest Rangers and ask for information on Canada. Others ask to meet the rangers if they come to Canada and some even ask if the show's producers can arrange passage to Canada for them.

Many British children offer their services as actors in the series during their summer vacations. Others wonder if there really are such things as Junior Forest Rangers in Canada and if so, where can they join up.

A recent letter to Michael Zenon told him he was far better looking than any of the Beatles or Rolling Stones and asked him not to go over the rapids too often in his canoe because he might not make it one of these days.

Another fan letter to Ralph Endersby asked Ralph if he would like to form a Canadian counterpart to an English group called "Junior Detectives." The English boys said they were working on a case where a lady died from poisoning but don't know if "the cops would go for a couple of good theories we have."

Of all the translated titles for Forest Rangers, the Norwegian title is perhaps the most tonguetwisting – "Skogwokterklubben."
