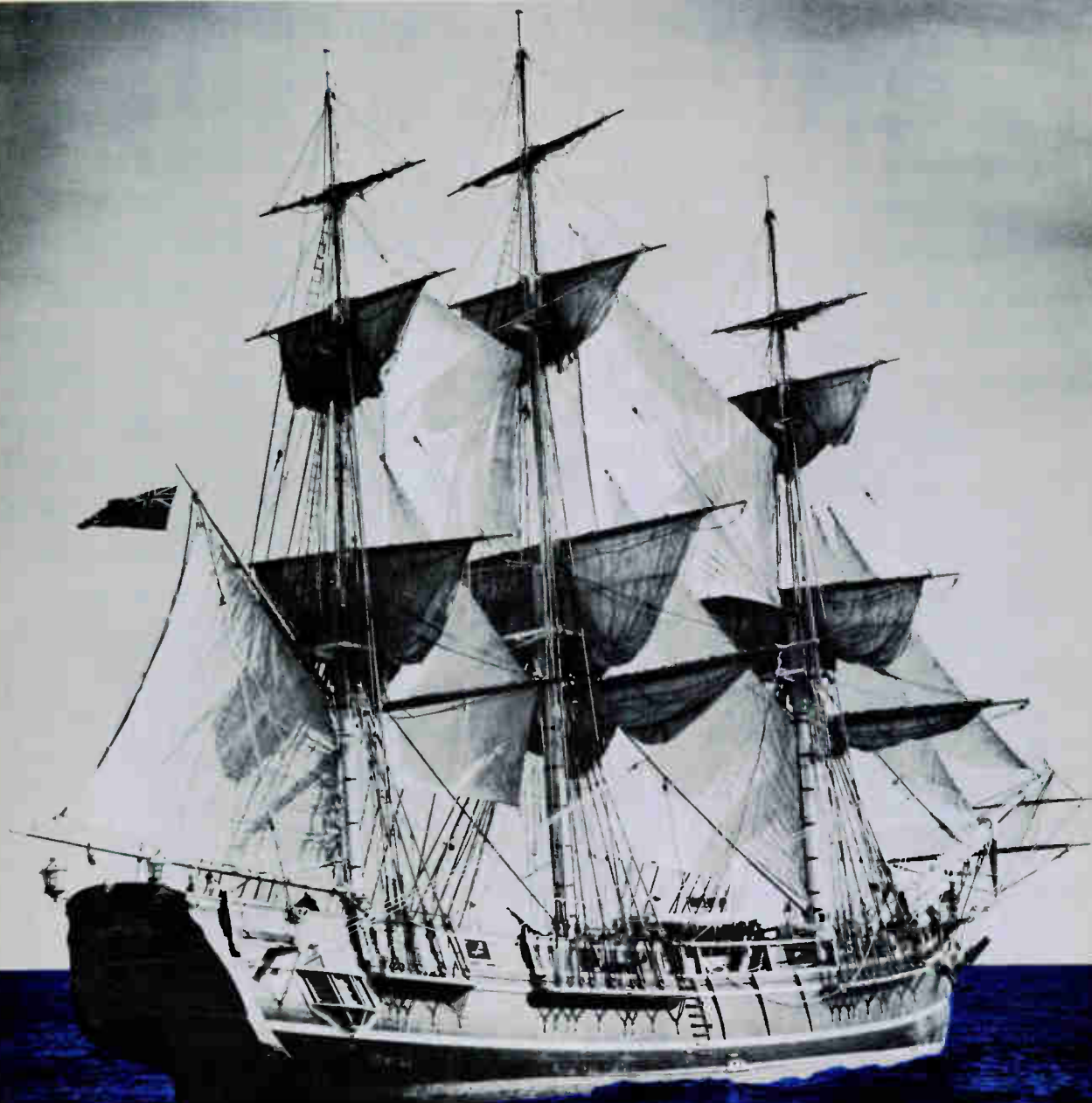

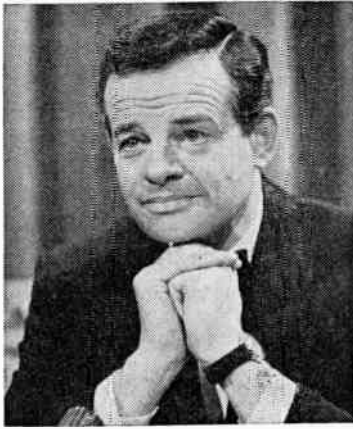

TO THE UNIMAGINATIVE and sit-at-homes, a sailing ship is just a collection of wood, canvas and hemp that induces blisters, danger, queasy stomachs and sudden bumps on the head. But the rest of us know that a yacht, whether it's a sloop or a dinghy, is very much alive, a creature of romance and excitement, a cross between a mule and a gazelle, often temperamental, but elegant and proud, and the best travelling companion in the world.

For thousands of years mariners have enjoyed the exultation of racing wildly through frothing surf beneath scudding clouds, with wind and spray in their faces and land-sprung worries forgotten.

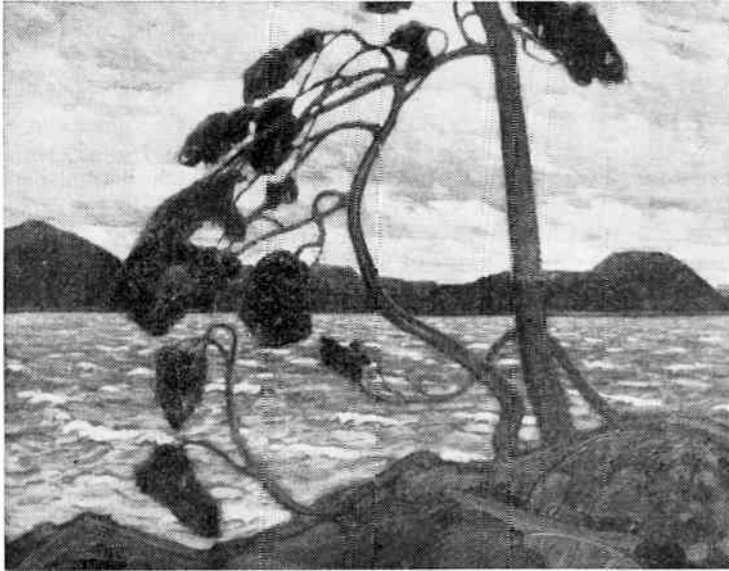

GROUP OF SEVEN

FOUR OF THE ORIGINAL Group of Seven are still with us, all now in their 80s, all still occasionally painting, all honored and respected. Nearly half a century ago no one outside their immediate circle would have bet on their ever being honored or ever achieving respectability, except by virtue of old age. It was May, 1920, when they first exhibited together as the Group of

Seven — Frederick Varley, Lawren Harris, A. Y. Jackson, Franklin Carmichael, Franz Johnston, Arthur Lismer, and J. E. H. MacDonald—although their number often changed over the next few years. Their first showing together drew only abuse and they soon found themselves howled

down for their style, in much the same way as the Impressionists and Fauvists in France before them had been. No one in Toronto in 1920 was quite prepared for the kind of paintings that these men, and Tom Thomson, brought back from their sketching trips into the

The Story of a:

RENDEZVOUS

Nearly 1,200 people went down with the Lusitania when she was torpedoed in 1915.

A few of the survivors tell their story on Camera West, Sunday on CBC-TV.

WHEN THE Cunard Line's 40,000-ton passenger ship, *Lusitania*, was struck by a German torpedo on May 7th, 1915, and sank within 20 minutes 10 miles off the south coast of Ireland, 1,198 of the 1,950 people on board lost their lives. Last fall, producer Len Chapple's radio documentary based on that tragic

event, *Rendezvous with Death*, won an Italia Award. Now Chapple has adapted it for TV, and it will be shown on *Camera West* this Sunday, July 24th.

To locate survivors of the sinking, Chapple advertised on radio and TV, and in magazines and newspapers. "And what a story they had to tell,"

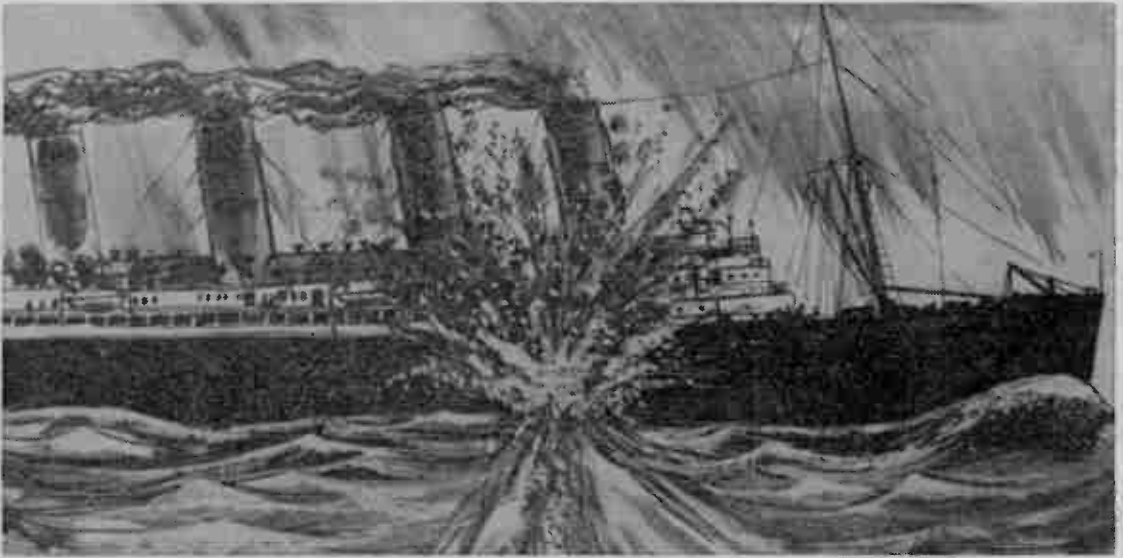

he says. "It may sound a little cold to put it this way, but in most cases it was the most significant thing that had ever happened to them, and was burned indelibly in their memories. Mabel Henshaw and Charlotte Kelly of Vancouver both had their babies torn from their arms as the ship went down, and they tore

me apart telling of that terrible day. George Smith of Nelson, B.C., sailed with a chum who lost all his money in New York before the ship sailed. Mr. Smith ponied up for his passage and his friend lost his life when the ship went down. Margaret Cox of Winnipeg, Soren Sorenson of Wainwright, Alberta, Harold

Daly of Ottawa, and Doris Lawlor of Toronto were able to remember the most fantastic detail — what was served for lunch that day, and the last hand in a poker game, etc. For Lucy Taylor of Niagara Falls the trip on the *Lusitania* was a wedding present from her aunt. From

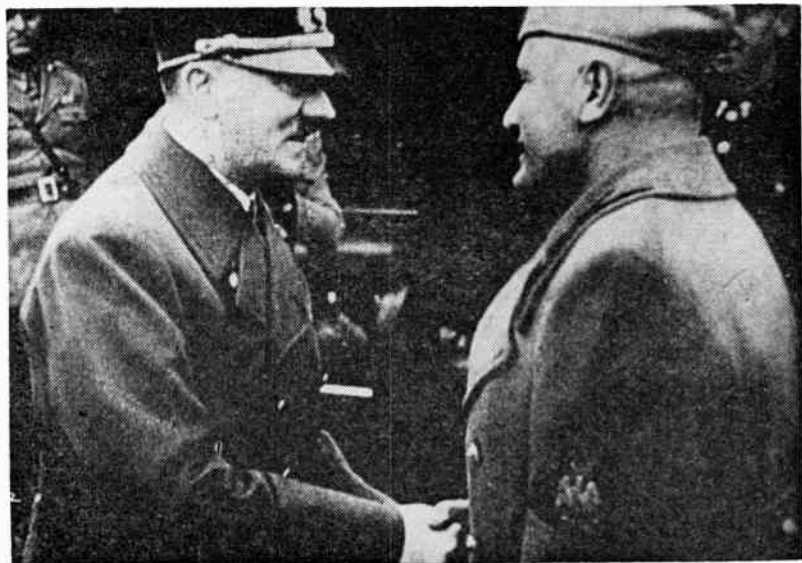
Camera West

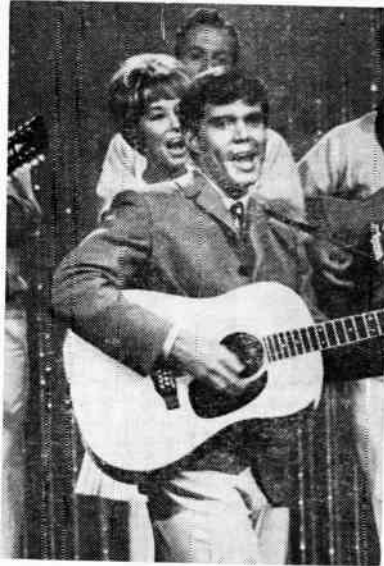

The program includes footage showing the rescue of some of the passengers, and graphic designer Lawrence Kristmanson has prepared more than 60 individual graphics which are used, with the voices of those interviewed, to recreate the time between 2:18 p.m., when the *Lusitania* was torpedoed, and the early hours of the next morning, when the last survivor was picked up. 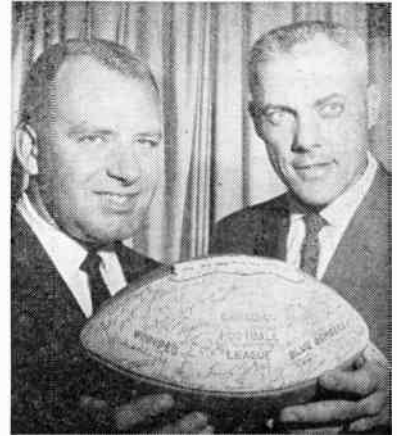

INTERTEL: The House on the Beach

ONE OF THE most unusual centres in the United States for helping drug addicts overcome their problem is Synanon, the house on the beach in Santa Monica, California. It was founded eight years ago by an ex-alcoholic named Chuck Dederich, who cured himself by involving himself deeply in other people's troubles. Today, there are six Synanon communities operating in other parts of the United States, with a total of about 500 residents. The headquarters in the house on the beach, which used to be an armory, has about 190 residents, almost all of whom have histories of drug addiction or crime or both.

Although Synanon (which got its name when someone scrambled the words symposium

and anonymous) doesn't claim to be able to cure everyone who goes there for help, it does nevertheless have a good record of success. Over a seven-year period more than 1,000 addicts passed through Synanon, of whom an estimated 40 per cent went back on drugs after leaving the community. All those who go there do so voluntarily and they must be prepared to help themselves and others. Synanon has no doctors, no psychiatrists or psychologists, no staff for cooking and cleaning. Everything is done by the residents and there are only two basic rules which must be observed - no chemicals of any kind, including alcohol, and no physical violence.

Last year, Rediffusion Television, the British member of the international television organization *Intertel*, sent a film crew to Santa Monica to interview Dederich and some of the people he is trying to help to help themselves. "Emotionally, a dope fiend is an inadequate stupid child," he told director Denis

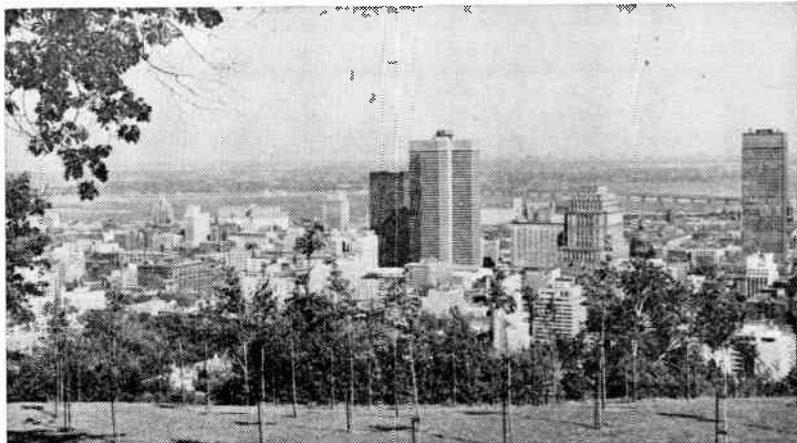

A Study of . . .

"This Blooming Business of Bilingualism"

MONTREAL, with its predominantly French-speaking population of well over 1,000,000 in the city proper, has been called "the second largest French city in the world." Most English-speaking Canadians outside Quebec may think of Montreal as being French, but a good many French-speaking Canadians do not. Guy Cormier, of the daily *La Presse*, says: "Montreal is not a French city. It may be a 'Roman' city because of the number of churches, but it is mainly an English city or an American city. This Anglo-American city is inhabited by close to 80 per cent French-speaking population. That is the heart of the affair."

This week on the television series *Eight Stories Inside Quebec* (Wednesday at 10:30, CBC-TV), director Peter Pearson examines Montreal as the main place of confrontation of Canada's two main language groups, to find out how a great city and its people carry on day-to-day business in English and French. Pearson sees Montreal as a series of paradoxes. It is a paradox that hundreds of thousands of people from each language group come together daily in crowded buses, elevators, and lunch counters, yet often cannot properly communicate with each other. This paradox is institutionalized by a school system which divides the population on nominally religious lines—The Catholic system teaches in French to the French-speaking and in English to others

Entitled *This Blooming Business of Bilingualism*, the program shows how language schools are flourishing in the city and how advertising agencies cope with the problem of delivering two kinds of messages for the same product. "A straight translation would be meaningless," says copywriter Michel Labrosse. "Often you have to create an entirely different image for the same product and even using the same layout material."

The social revolution in French Canada has been directly responsible for at least one aspect of the current bilingualism boom — the growth in private language schools. One school in particular, which specializes in both English and French courses for business executives, started three years ago with only 12 pupils. Now it has over 400. "We have a lot of people who join the

course and quickly become frustrated because they discover it's more difficult than they assumed it would be," says one of the teachers. "Some of them drop out and we never see them again. But most pupils these days are learning a second language because their employers would like them to, and these are the students who remain until they've learned something."

For most people it could cost between \$2,000 and \$3,000 to learn a second language perfectly, and for adults it is likely to be an uphill climb. Dr. Wilder Penfield, the Montreal neurosurgeon, has suggested that the best time in a person's life for learning a second language is between the ages of four and 12, and that the best method at this stage is by the direct method — that is, being in a classroom where only the second language is used. Studies by Dr. Lionel Desjarlais of the University of Ottawa, co-ordinator of research for the Ottawa Separate School Board, have borne out Dr. Penfield's theories about the age-factor in learning a second language.

THE BEST OF IDEAS is casting aside its sober academic gown for a cool summer series of free-wheeling programs by freelance broadcasters Kildare Dobbs and Robert Fulford. Kildare Dobbs, who created five of the six programs, entitled *The Sounds of Criticism*, is an author, critic, and managing editor of *Saturday Night*, and Robert Fulford, a columnist for the *Toronto Daily Star*, is also well known as a broadcaster and TV interviewer. Fulford contributes the final program in the series, *These Boots Are Made for Walkin'*, in which he analyzes the course popular music has taken in America since the late 1940s.

Kildare Dobbs returns to the forties, too, for his first talk,

Frustrations of a Dying Empire (July 28th)—though perhaps an irreverent reverie with sound effects is a better description for the Dobbsian approach to radio than “talk.” The sounds of criticism that issued forth as the empire withered away could be heard in plays, novels, poems, in satire, on records, radio, and television. On the program, the beginning of the end is announced as we hear the voice of Winston Churchill intoning, “Singapore has fallen.” With the casualness of a disc jockey, Dobbs picks out a quotation here, a record there, brings back memories of Stephen Potter’s *Gamesmanship* and *Lifemanship*, Kingsley Amis’ *Lucky Jim*, John Osborne’s *Look Back in Anger*, leads us closer to the present with excerpts from a Peter Sellers record, another by the ‘Beyond the Fringe’ group—and the Beatles. He comes up with an original approach to social history, one that’s wry, witty, sardonic.

The following week (August 5th) Dobbs drops down on post-war America with a program called *Ceremonies of Innocence*. “Americans,” he says, “have always dreamed of innocence, of childhood, of a simple uncomplicated life, the golden world of the Noble Savage and his modern descendant, the Child. They have dreamed also of violence, of that mythical West where brute force conquers all.” As he eyes these polarities of innocence and violence in the American ethos, Dobbs reverts to the McCarthy era (and post-isolationist America), and—by a leap of the imagination—moves on to the cult of the child, the work of J. D. Salinger, whose *Catcher in the Rye*, like Dr. Spock’s child-care manuals, became a best seller, and to *Lolita*.

Joining the March from Conformity (August 11th) shows a growing uneasiness with big corporate life, the plight of the liberal, the insistent power of salesmanship, the techniques of which were being increasingly transferred to the realm of politics . . . the death of the old-time

salesman and the birth of the new all-powerful Madison Avenue Man. The protest came from many directions, but the satire of Walt Kelly’s “Pogo” comic strip, Mort Sahl, Tom Lehrer, Shelly Berman, and Nichols and May present examples of a mordant humor that carried the slings and arrows of outrageous good fortune. Affluence was here, perhaps, to stay, but some were opting out of the values that attached to that affluent, good, square life.

Opting Out/The Beat Movement is the title of the fourth Dobbs program (August 18th). The Beat Generation turned its back on the conforming bourgeois world and took up poverty, drugs, sex, jazz, the Negro, and the passivity of Buddhism. The high priests of the Beat Movement were, for the most part, literary figures—Allen Ginsburg, Norman Mailer (not a complete Beat), Jack Kerouac, William Burroughs and their resident psychiatrist was Wilhelm Reich, whose influence was pervasive. The Beat protest, though it was mocked by many at the time, has had an impact on American life, and the values it espoused have carried over to the youth of the present generation and been put to different uses. The Beats’ identification with what Dobbs calls “the dark absence at the heart of America” was their greatest contribution to the renewal of conscience in the United States.

In his final program, *Man and Machine* (August 25th), Kildare Dobbs reviews two traditions in Western thought—the liberal-mechanical and the conservative-organicist, two views of society which clash in a quiet domesticity, so much a part of our inheritance we hardly notice them. Marshall McLuhan, Canada’s greatest exporter of ideas, oddly enough belongs to the conservative-organicist school. And so from the visible environments of post-war England and America we arrive at the invisible environment of McLuhan’s electronic global village.

One of his characterizations best-known to Canadians is Charlie Farquharson, a salty, middle-aged farmer from Parry Sound, who will appear on *Conversation Piece* to offer his views on some burning issues of the times.

Miss Patterson's guest on Monday will be Ralph Allen, managing editor of the *Toronto Star*, former editor of *Maclean's* magazine, well-known war correspondent, and author of six books. Jean Gascon and Jean-Louis Roux, towering

Entitled *Prelude to War*, it shows the events that led up to the outbreak of war in Europe in 1939, from the occupation of the Rhineland in 1935 to the lightning attack on Poland, September 1st, 1939.

By 1935 Hitler had been in complete command of the National Socialist party for a decade, and had succeeded in eliminating all opposition and transforming Germany into a one-party state. Two years earlier the senile *Reich* president, Field Marshal von Hindenburg, had been persuaded to appoint Hitler chancellor, and when Hindenburg died in 1934 the *Fuehrer* became supreme by combining in his person the three offices of head of state, head of government, and party leader. That same year he concluded a non-aggression pact with Poland that was supposed to last for 10 years. In defiance of the treaty of Versailles he announced in March 1935 the formation of a German air force (contrary to article 198) and the re-introduction of military conscription (contrary to article

173). In March, 1936, his armies occupied the de-militarized Rhineland (contrary to articles 42 and 43). Next he declared the pact of Locarno (1925) null and void. After concluding an agreement with Austria in July, 1937, he then annexed that country barely eight months later. Czechoslovakia was next on the list. British and French appeasement of Nazi Germany forced the Czechs to withdraw their forces from the Sudetenland in 1938, which permitted Hitler an easy take-over of Bohemia and Moravia in 1939.

Although Hitler had already achieved more, with less effort, than had either Bismarck or Frederick the Great before him, his appetite for power and territory increased. His success over Czechoslovakia led to a demand for the Memel territory of Lithuania, he tore up the non-aggression pact of 1934 with Poland, scrapped the Anglo-German naval agreement of 1935, occupied the Free State of Danzig, and, on a transparent pretext invaded Poland. There was now no other course open to Britain and France, and a declaration of war was announced September 3rd, 1939.

From Stratford

MUSIC LOVERS who are chagrined because they can't attend all the concerts at the Stratford (Ontario) Festival this season will be glad to hear that at least eight of them will be broadcast on CBC radio.

CBC Tuesday Night on July 26th at 10:35 will present a Stratford concert featuring Phyllis Curtin, who is reported to have sung in more opera premières than any other U.S. soprano, and has had close to five dozen works written expressly for her. After obtaining her Bachelor degree in political science from Wellesley, she was thinking of a career in international law when her music career began opening up, and now she is busy in the top opera houses and concert halls around the world. Mario Barnardi conducts the National Festival Orchestra on this occasion in a program including the cantata *La Lucretia* by Handel; two concert arias by Mozart; a cantata, *Die Serenaden*, for soprano, violin, cello and oboe, by Hindemith; and *Les Illuminations*, a song cycle by Benjamin Britten

to a series of dreamworld poems by Arthur Rimbaud.

Later this season CBC Tuesday Night will present a choral program of works by Bach and Stravinsky, sung by the Festival Singers of Toronto, conducted by Elmer Iseler (August 2nd); a jazz concert by Duke Ellington and his orchestra (August 9th); another jazz concert featuring the George Shearing Quintet (August 16th); and a performance of the Mozart opera, *Don Giovanni* (August 23rd), with Jan Rubes, Sylvia Saurette, Cornelius Opthof, Howell Glynne, Jerold Siena, Irene Salemka, Gwenlyn Little, and Maurice Brown in leading roles, and Mario Bernardi conducting.

The Chamber Music series on Thursday nights at 8:03 will broadcast three of the six chamber music concerts presented by members of the National Festival Orchestra under the direction of Oscar Shumsky. The one broadcast of August 4th features Mozart's *String Quintet in E flat*, with Powys Thomas as commentator; on August 11th, Anne Eggleston's *Quartet for Piano and Strings*, with Martha Henry as commentator; and on August 18th, Georges Enesco's *Dictuor for Double Wind Quintet*, with Leo Ciceri as commentator.

They've relied on experience, intuition and courage to guide their fragile, sensitive vessels safely through the hazards of wind and wave, rock and current, and even in the space age these are still the three important characteristics for a first-class sailor. But modern mariners have come a little closer than their forefathers to understanding why sailing ships are so capricious. The physics or aerodynamics of sailing is a fairly new field, and a fascinating one.

The Monday, July 25th, edition of *The Nature of Things*, prepared by Lister Sinclair, takes a look at some scientific efforts to

understand why sailing ships do what they do.

At Britain's University of Southampton, two wind tunnels are used to study both sail and hull action. The sail is something like an airplane wing, but of course it moves a lot more. Yachts sail heeling over, and they don't go where they're pointing, which has fooled many a landlubber testing himself at the helm for the first time. The hull of a racing yacht offers designers so many subtle curves in different combinations, each of which makes the boat steer quite differently, that they haven't nearly been exhausted by naval architects. Factors like this make the study of sailing dynamics amazingly complex.

The program includes some exciting film footage of ships in action, as well as wind tunnel and radio-controlled model experiments. Production is by James Murray. John Livingston is the executive producer.

And on Sunday, July 31st at 11:03 a.m., Aitken will be the soloist with the CBC Vancouver Chamber Orchestra, conducted by John Avison. The program includes Le Magnifique Overture by Grétry; Poem by Griffes; Concerto (1950) by Blacher; Ballade

Holgate in 1931, and Lemoine Fitzgerald in 1932. The following year the Group was disbanded and its members formed the nucleus of the Canadian Group of Painters. Recognition was long in coming and some of the members did not begin selling their work for a decent figure until fairly late in life. Varley, it is said, was 75 when he finally earned enough to file an income tax return.

The four surviving members of the original Seven are Varley, A. Y. Jackson, Arthur Lismer, and Lawren Harris, all of whom will be heard on CBC radio this week and next in a two-part program in the *Venture '66* series. This program, prepared by freelance broadcaster Laurence Nowry, includes recordings (from the CBC archives) of Lemoine Fitzgerald, and interviews with Edwin Holgate, A. J. Casson, the Rt. Hon. Vincent Massey, Barker Fairley, Frances Loring, Marius Barbeau, and some

for flute, piano and strings by Martin; and Vision from High Rock, Opus 123, by Hovhanes.

This summer Aitken is teaching as an associate of the Communications Centre at Simon Fraser University, Burnaby, B.C., which is offering a new approach to teaching the Arts. His particular subject is music and its relationship to contemporary thinking.

Aitken is one of the two principal flutists in the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, teaches flute and conducts chamber music classes at the University of Toronto, and gives recitals in the Toronto area.

Born in Nova Scotia, he began studying the flute at the age of nine. Since moving to Toronto 12 years ago he has made many solo appearances in concerts and on radio. In 1960 he won the Mary Osler Boyd Award offered annually by the Women's Musical Club of Toronto. He was the youngest musician ever to hold a first chair in the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra.

other friends and relatives of the Group's members.

Few, if any, Canadian artists since the Group of Seven have had to face such violent hostility to their work as the Group suffered in the '20s and '30s. But they were sustained by their belief, as Lawren Harris expressed it, that "an Art must grow and flower in the land before the country will be a real home for its people . . . this Art will differ from the Art of the past, and from the present-day Art, of any people; superseding nothing, only adding to what has been done.

"The (Group of Seven) artists make no pretence of being the only ones in Canada doing significant work. But they do most emphatically hold that their work is significant and of real value to the country . . ."

Canadian Composers Featured on . . .

CBC WINNIPEG POPS CONCERT

WHEN THE early missionaries in Canada tried to befriend and convert the Indians, they found that music was an excellent means to this end, and some tribes still sing chants taught them by the first new Canadians over 300 years ago. Back in those days most music was of necessity imported, and the local efforts at originality were pretty crude. But today Canadians rank with the best contemporary composers anywhere in the world. A look at the *Catalogue of Canadian Composers* reveals that this fairly young country has contributed an astonishing quantity of major musical works to world literature, and its variety and quality constantly amaze visiting musicians.

The CBC has long been a champion of Canadian music, and hardly a week goes by without some of our composers having a hearing across the country

on radio or TV, and in many other countries through International Service recordings. This week CBC radio offers a rich assortment.

On Friday nights at 7:30 the *CBC Winnipeg Pops Concert* is presenting a series of four programs featuring light music by Canadian composers of the last 100 years. The last of the four, on July 29th, conducted by Eric Wild, includes *Opening Night Overture* by Robert Turner, a festive, rhythmic work meant to convey the general mood of excitement, expectancy and glamour surrounding an opening night in the theatre, whether it's a play, ballet or opera. It was commissioned by the Vancouver Symphony Society, and was first performed in 1955. Also on the program is *Summer Idyll*, a nostalgic work by Leo Smith, the Birmingham-born cellist, lecturer and composer who began his career in the Hallé Orchestra and the Royal Opera Orchestra, Covent Garden, and who was a distinguished figure in Toronto music circles from 1908 until his death in 1952. The third work on the program is *Esquisses* by François Morel, his first serious piece (1947), an impressionistic work "much like a soft sketch of Degas."

A quarter-hour of light music styled for a summer evening's relaxation is offered Thursday evening on "Here's Don." The trio below features Don Meadows on drums with pianist Ken Jefferson and bass Jim Roberts.

figures in French-Canadian Theatre, are interviewed on Wednesday. This conversation is their first together on the subject of theatre in almost three years. They both started out to be doctors, and both are presently appearing in the Stratford Festival, where Gascon is also directing.

Harold Town, the controversial, outspoken Canadian artist, lives up to his reputation as a person who says what he thinks when he appears on Thursday's show. He offers a long commentary on the Canadian theatre, which he calls "the courtesan of the Arts," describes the Stratford Festival stage as "a rabbit hutch with Stygian tunnels at the rear," and says he's fed up with the Stratford, National Ballet, and other companies which, when they have money to spend on production design, immediately hire non-Canadians. He also talks about his early career as a comic illustrator. Friday's guest will be Anne Francis, well-known Ottawa journalist and a former Philadelphia debutante who became a fervent Canadian.

"Come Out Swingin'!"

(Roaring 20's Style)

Whether it be business, show-business, or both Fred Finn says "you gotta come out swingin'." That's how he started *Mickie Finn's*, a unique San Diego nightclub, featuring Finn on piano and his wife, Mickie, on banjo.

And that's what he has done with *Mickie Finn's*, a musical program modelled after the nightclub and seen on CBC television, Wednesdays at 8:00 p.m.

It all began with a business administration course at San Jose State College in California, where Finn wrote a 25-page paper, based on a survey and study he conducted, titled: "Roaring 20s Nightclub Type Operations on the West Coast and How They Would Apply to Other Markets."

He included 40 clubs in this 1959 survey.

"I broke the study down into such headings as location, operational methods, entertainment psychology, physical layout, promotion and advertising, importance of uniqueness, and perpetuation of activities," said Finn.

Finn was 21 and his wife 20 when they took their \$1,000 savings, headed for San Diego, leased a 10,000-square-foot-warehouse, worked night and day to fix it up, and ran up \$70,000 in debts by opening-night five months later. The first year, the club grossed a quarter of a million dollars.

Finn is glad he took the academic approach.

"My research conclusions held up," he said. "Without the study,

I would have made more mistakes, which I couldn't afford. But no matter how much research you do and how much you think you know, you just scratch the surface. If I had known all the pitfalls, I would have been scared to death. A little ignorance is helpful. If I had waited until I had been truly ready, I probably would never have opened the club. You just got to get in there and swing."

The Finns have been in business for over five years now and an estimated two million people have visited the club.

It's more than just the scientific planning that brings the people in.

"We make the people feel comfortable," he said. "They relax and have a good time. Mickie is great at putting everyone at ease."

On the television series, as in their own club, Fred and Mickie Finn and their band play everything from Gay Nineties favorites to the latest American sounds before an audience seated at long checkered tablecloth-covered tables.
