

World Radio History

Profile of Thom Benson



MAYBE it's the contradictions in their personalities that make people really interesting. For instance, Thom Benson, CBC's acting director of entertainment programming who is one of the most cosmopolitan of men, is an indefatigable gardener with a great love of birds and animals, who gets unashamedly mistyeyed over things sentimental. Although he says he enjoys the amenities of the atomic age, he misses the gentleness and kindliness of the 19th century, in fact, there's something of the Victorian dandy about him--the elegant way he carries himself, and his haberdashery (when we talked to him he was wearing a pale yellow waiscoat, against which his tie was a cerise and sapphire exclamation point). Although he's courteous and charming with feminine women, he can be extremely caustic with dolts of either sex, with fellow workers who are disloyal to their jobs, with what he calls What'sin-it-for-me Charlies.

He delights in practical jokes, which are often oblique expressions of affection, and yet many co-workers find him aloof. Benson has a Ciceronian facility with words, in conversation or in the occasional drama or short story he writes and sells, yet he has a habit of abruptly dropping some of the Anglo-Saxon expressions beloved by small boys into otherwise polite conversation to ruffle people's surfaces and see what shows through, a disconcerting habit to those who resent having anyone see behind their

masks. He's receptive to ideas, understands film better than most, and we've seen him spot an elusive flaw in a 'rough-cut' faster than anyone, but he can get pretty heated when his ideals are challenged. He works his team hard, but he'll drive himself harder to be first with a CBC story over fantastic odds --though with no hard feelings for the rival he may have worked tooth and nail to outwit.

For instance, he always gets a great bang out of competing with the U.S. networks in covering big events, such as Sir Winston Churchill's state funeral. "After a great deal of very delicate negotiations," he recalls, "I got the RAF to agree to rent us two fast Vulcans to fly our



Nineteen Seventy will be Manitoba's Centennial Year and to help launch it CBC Winnipeg has joined with the Manitoba Centennial Corporation to present a special one-hour television program called *The Spirit of '70*. Hosted by Bill Walker, a native Winnipegger, *The Spirit* of '70 stars the members of the Royal Winnipeg Ballet, the Guess Who, Joan Karasevich, Ray St. Germain, Reg Gibson, the Sing-Out Winnipeg teen group, Ed Evanko, Geoff Scott, Don Slade and Cliff Gardner, and Bob McMullin and his Orchestra.

Both Bill Walker and Joan Karasevich have starred at Winnipeg's open-air theatre Rainbow Stage. Bill in such productions as *My Fair Lady* and *Music Man*, and Joan Karasevich in last summer's production of *The King and I*.

The Guess Who have been frequent performers on CBC-TV in such series as Let's Go and Where It's At. The group is led by Randy Bachman, lead guitar; Burton Cummings is lead singer and doubles on piano, organ and rhythm guitar; Jim Kale is their bassist; and Gary Peterson is the drummer. Ray St. Germain recently starred in the series *Time for Livin*' and also stars on CBC-TV this week in the special 2 *for the Road*. Reg Gibson is the host-singer on a current TV series in Winnipeg called *The Group*. Ed Evanko has appeared on m a n y CBC-TV network shows and on Broadway in *The Canterbury Tales*.

Cliff Gardner and Don Slade, who supply the comedy on *The Spirit of '70* are well-known personalities in Winnipeg. Cliff has appeared in Rainbow Stage productions and on CBC programs, Don is a morning-radio personality for a private station. Geoff Scott is a satirist and on the show will be doing some sketches of Canadian politicians and statesmen.

The winning entry in a contest for Manitoba's official Centennial song-entitled Manitoba -with music by Gordon P. Watson and lyrics by Mrs. N. Collier, both of Portage la Prairiewill be performed on the show by the Sing-Out Winnipeg.

Looking Back — the sixties

BY whatever nick-name the decade now ending will eventually come to be known, it will certainly be remembered as a time of world-wide revolution on all fronts, of spectacular achievements in the sciences, of high drama and high hopes that were often brought low. It was the decade of the Beatles, the Pill, Medicare, Civil Rights, Ban the Bomb, and Man on the Moon.

The decade might almost be said to have begun with a bang, when the French exploded their first nuclear device in February, 1960; a U.S. pilot named Gary Powers in a plane called the U.2 wrecked a U.S./Soviet summit conference; and Adolf Eichmann, key man in Hitler's "final solution" program, was captured. The following year the Soviet Union put the first man into orbit, Major Yuri Gagarin, and this success was soon followed by U.S. orbital flights; Dag Hammarskjold, Secretary General of the UN, died in a plane crash; and the Soviet Union set off the greatest manmade explosion in history. We came close to a Third World War the next year when President Kennedy challenged the Soviet Union over the build-up of missiles in Cuba. The world was shaken, a little more than a year later, when President Kennedy was felled by an assassin's bullet.

As the '60s moved on the United States became more deeply involved in the war in Vietnam and there was an acceleration of the Civil Rights movement. Pope Paul VI toured the Holy Land in 1964, the first Pope to do so since the beginning of the Christian Era; and China exploded its first atomic bomb. In 1965 men walked in space for the first time; Dr. Martin Luther King led a march from Selma to Montgomery, Ala., the Pope visited America, the first time a Pope had visited the continent; and there was the Big Blackout that plunged a large part of the eastern United States and Canada into darkness; Rhodesia proclaimed its independence.

The latter part of the '60s saw increasing unrest in the United States over the war and racial discrimination; Vatican II; the tragedy of Biafra; the assassinations of Dr. Martin Luther King and Robert F. Kennedy; the world's first heart transplant operations; our first close-up look at the planet Mars; and two landings on the moon that, besides being staggering achievements in themselves, yielded valuable scientific data.

The crowded decade and the year now ending will be reviewed on several radio and television programs this week. Following is a selection of some of the special programs and last editions in 1969 of regular series:

RADIO

THE '60s IN RETROSPECT

Bruce Rogers and Lyal Brown co-host a two-hour "psychedelic" view of the decade which focuses on general trends and themes rather than a chronological sequence of events. Backing up the two hosts will be a number of experts to assess and analyze such areas as space, politics, leadership, war, dissent, music, and science. Among the confirmed participants is Glenn Gould.

Research for this special production of the News and Features departments of CBC radio is by William Hogg, with science contributions prepared by Raoul Engel. Produced by Howard Engel of Features and Angus McLellan, executive producer, of Radio News. (Sunday, December 28 at 9:03 a.m.)

ANTHOLOGY

This literary magazine of the air, which usually concentrates on Canadian short stories and poetry, will be talking about the books people read in 1969. Larry Zolf will be phoning several prominent Canadians to

ask them what were their favorite books in the past year. Among those who have agreed to be on the program are Pauline Jewitt, John Bassett, Gordon Sinclair, Judy La Marsh, Mavor Moore, Jack Webster, and film-maker Allan King. Produced by Alex Smith. (Saturday, December 27 at 10:03 p.m.)

THE SIXTIES IN SPORTS

A one-hour program hosted by Bob Picken and Gren Marsh in which the decade and the year are reviewed. The first halfhour summarizes the major events of the first nine years and will include recorded highlights of those events which CBC radio has covered. The highlights of 1969 include World Championship and Stanley Cup hockey; the Grey Cup; World Series; the Queen's Plate; the Kentucky Derby; the Preakness and Belmont; the Canadian Open Golf Championship; and the Scotch Cup Curling match. Written by Bob Picken and produced in Winnipeg by Doug McIlraith. (Thursday, January 1 at 11:03 a.m.)

TELEVISION

MAN ALIVE

The '60s was a time of ferment in the Church, with old ideas being challenged and authority being assailed. "God Is Dead" was a popular slogan that appeared almost everywhere, rock music began to be heard in the liturgy of some churches, and even the Pope himself was challenged within the Roman Catholic Church.

As a production of the Religious Broadcasts department, *Man Alive* has been concerned with all this since its inception in 1967. But it is also a series about the world at large and the human condition in general, so in its look back it will touch on many significant events of concern to all Canadians. Roy Bonisteel is the host, Leo Rampen the executive producer. (*Monday*, *December 29 at 10:30* p.m.)

THE NATURE OF THINGS

Science past and future is the subject of this retrospective program. The participants will not only review the main achievements in science over the past decade but also hazard some predictions for the '70s. The first voice you hear on this program is that of a computer that speaks, one indication of the advances in this area of technology. Taking part in the program are several distinguished Canadian scientists and the U.S. science writer Dr. Isaac Asimov, associate professor of Biochemistry at Boston University School of Medicine.

Speaking about progress in the earth sciences will be Dr. J. Tuzo Wilson, principal of Erindale College at the University of Toronto and professor of Geophysics at Erindale. Dr. James D. Prentice, associate professor of physics at U of T, will comment on the discovery of gravitational waves in the '60s and the significant contribution to physics by lasers. Dr. Donald Chant, chairman of the department of zoology at U of T, will discuss advances in ecology and the destruction of natural resources on our planet; Dr. Lou Siminovitch, chairman of the department of Medical Cell Biology at U of T, talks about the DNA molecule; Dr. John M. Carroll, associate professor of Computer Science at the University of Western Ontario, discusses the increasing sophistication of machines and what we can expect in this field in the future; Dr. Arthur Porter, professor of Industrial Engineering at U of T, also has some comments on computer technology; Dr. Donald A. MacRae, director of the David Dunlap Observatory at U of T and chairman of the astronomy department at U of T, looks at the progress of astronomy, astrophysics, and space flight; Dr. Pierre Grondin, chairman of the department of Cardiac Surgerv at the Montreal Heart Institute, will discuss Medicine in

the '60s, particularly the field of organ transplant.

Dr. Isaac Asimov appears throughout the program to bridge the comments of each of these specialists. Produced by Roman Bittman: executive producer James Murray. (Wednesday, December 31 at 7:30 p.m.)

Trans-World Top Team

A special 13-week color TV series, Trans-World Top Team, featuring bright high school students from Canada and Hawaii in a quiz competition, will begin January 3. It's a co-production by the CBC and ABC (Honolulu). The three teams (in panels of four) representing Canada, from Neil McNeil High School, Toronto; Sydney Academy, Sydney, N.S., and St. Pius X, Toronto, were winners of CBC-TV's national championship series of Reach For the Top. The three teams of outstanding Hawaiian students, named Lunalilo, Kalakaua, and Kamehameha after Hawaiian kings, took part in a similar quiz program called Hawaii-High. Producers of the series are Sandy Stewart, Canada, and Pat Pantonini, Hawaii. Co-hosts and quizmasters are Alex Trebek, Canada, and Dick Graham, Hawaii. Directors are Robert Gibbons, Canada, and Marvin Pienta, Hawaii. (Saturdays, TV, $1.00 \, p.m.$)

Landmark

A special series of eight halfhour TV programs designed to inform Canadians about what is at stake in the complicated job of developing our country's non-renewable natural resources - minerals, oil and gas - and selling them in world markets, begins on Sunday, January 4, under the title of Landmark. Produced by the CBC's agriculture and resources department, the series is being filmed on location in CBC studios in Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto, British Columbia, and in Washington, New York and Chicago. Series host is Toronto writerconsultant John Kettle. Consultants are Robert Fowler. president of the Canadian Pulp and Paper Association, Larry Dack of the Financial Post, Jim Hilborn of Corpus-Communications, and Charles Law, Research and Publishing Services. Doug Wilkinson is executive producer; the writer is George Salverson; producers are Llovd Bryden, Doug Lower, Eric Mc-Cleary, Jack Zolov, and Mike Poole. (Sundays, TV, 1:00 p.m.)

This Land of Ours

The highly entertaining TV series, *This Land of Ours*, which focuses on people involved with our natural resources from coast to coast, returns for 13 weeks on a new day: Sunday, January 4. Eight of the programs will be in color. A product of the CBC's agriculture and resources department, the series features John Foster as host and writer. John Lackie is executive producer. Direction is by Foster, Lackie, Gerry Richardson and Mike Poole.

The first program, No Man's Land, illustrates in color the forces that can attack and spoil our finest parks, using Algonquin as an example of a park now

showing wear and tear. It is 3,000 square miles of rock, pine and lake country, a beautiful example of land from the Canadian shield, and is managed under the "multiple use" concept-that is, the needs of almost every type of recreationist can be satisfied there to some degree. But basically it is wilderness park. About 65 million people live within one day's drive of it. It's estimated that in 30 years Ontario's population will reach 16 million, and in addition this province will have to provide recreation for 150 million Americans. Logging has been permitted in the park since 1893, but as the public's awareness and use of the park increases, some difficult and controversial questions have arisen. The whole concept of logging, or mining, in public parks is under continuing scrutiny. In addition, many of the wilderness qualities of Algonquin are being eroded by the very people who use and love its canoe routes and campgrounds. Direction: John Lackie.

The January 11 program, The Yukon Way, was filmed at Frances Lake, a horseshoeshaped body of water surrounded by the hills and mountains of the Yukon Territory, where a young couple, 32-yearold Kurt Hansen, a well-educated Dane, and his beautiful Japanese-Canadian wife, Yoshi, live in a log cabin and make their living by guiding and outfitting small groups of fishermen who try their luck in the swift, sparkling river teeming with lake trout, grayling and Dolly Varden trout, which flows out of the lake. Direction: Gerry Richardson.

Rupert House is an Indian village at the foot of James Bay in Quebec, and the site of the first Hudson's Bay Company post in Canada. There is still no road in, but several hundred Cree Indians make a peaceful living there as trappers, hunters and fishermen. They turn out excellent canoes in the old HBC factory. Rupert House is also the home of a remarkable woman, Maud Watt, who went there as a young bride in 1920. Included are some rare photographs from Maud's own adventures in 1920. Direction: John Foster.

Later programs are: Stake in a Winner, a day at the thoroughbred farm near Toronto owned by E. P. Taylor, and the home of a winner of the Kentucky Derby, Northern Dancer; Call of the Wildfowl, a visit with Fred Sharpe, an Alberta wildlife specialist who works for Ducks Unlimited; Widkiitiwin. in which the cameras accompany attractive Indian folk-singer Alanis Obomsawin as she travels to Vermilion Bay in the Kenora district of Northern Ontario, to visit an Ojibway co-operative and perform at a village concert; a cattle drive for 120 miles through the interior of British Columbia to Nazeo with 59-year-old rancher Pan Phillips, who lives so back of bevond that he gets his mail quarterly; Guide to a River, a 40-mile canoe trip down the largest spawning ground for Atlantic salmon in North America, the Miramichi River in New Brunswick: a Newfoundland love story about an elderly outport couple and the affection they have for each other and for their home: and other programs to be announced later. (Sundays, TV, 5:00 p.m.)

Celebrations

A musical gala celebrating the 100th birthday of Manitoba, in the province's glittering Centennial Concert Hall in Winnipeg, will be presented on TV in color on Wednesday night, January 7. It features the internationally acclaimed Royal Winnipeg Ballet, the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra directed

by George Cleve, and 22-yearold American concert pianist Susan Starr, who placed second in the recent Tchaikovsky Piano Competition in Moscow.

Also featured are two new works: A Song and A Dance. the first movement of Celebrations for Orchestra, the first major symphonic work by Winnipeg composer Victor Davies, which was commissioned by the orchestra through the auspices of the Canada Council for the Centennial; and choreographer Paddy Stone's amusing Variations on Strike Up the Band, commissioned by the Royal Winnipeg Ballet. Set to George Gershwin's music, it had its début in Saskatoon last September.

The second part of the program features pianist Susan Starr, who plays the third movement of Schumann's *Piano Concerto in A Minor* with the orchestra. The orchestra concludes the program with the finale from *Symphony No. 5* by Shostakovich. Production is by Hugh Edmunds. (*Wedncsday. January 7, TV, 8:30 p.m.*)

One Revolution Around the Sun

Peru is undergoing a total social upheaval, and the outcome will influence the direction of the whole South American continent. An hour-long color documentary looking at the political, social and historical dilemmas of Peru will be presented on Thursday Night on January 8. It was produced and directed by Martyn Burke. Among the scenes in the film are the mammoth anniversary ceremony, celebrating the takeover of the giant International Petroleum Corporation refinery a year ago in the desert town of Talara; the capture at gunpoint of an unsuspecting trawler by Peruvian gunboats; the takeover of a large hacienda in the Inca capital of Cusco; and scenes from the Peruvian jungle near the Amazon headquarters, where American fundamentalist missionaries are bent on converting even the fiercest, mankilling tribes; and many other fascinating scenes and events. (Thursday, January 8, TV, $10:00 \ p.m.$)

POP DECADE

Some of the biggest names of the pop music scene will be heard on this radio special for New Year's Eve, both in interviews and performance, John Lennon among them. This twohour production hosted by Alex Trebek and Jack Batten is an in-depth survey of pop music of the '60s, its development since the early days of Rock and Roll and the experimental work now being done that will carry through to the '70s.

Also included are reports on rock poetry, rock heroes, Speed, Groupies, Soul, Blues, the big festivals like Woodstock and Mariposa, and a look at the business side of the music industry with interviews with many of the "names behind the names," and a forecast of what's next in pop music. As much as possible, says producer John Coutanche, it's "a definitive look at the '60s."

Among those taking part are Judy Collins, Frank Zappa of the Mothers of Invention; John

CROSS-CANADA NEW YEAR

A five-hour New Year's Eve special on radio with a "rollercoaster" format that moves the show across the country as each of the time-zones approaches midnight. A music show with different hosts in each region and newscasts on the half-way mark in each hour, *Cross-Canada New Year* opens in St. John's, Newfoundland, at 10:10 p.m. Produced by Bob Helm. (Wednesday, December 31.)

365 + 1

A survey of the year in pop music, but unlike *Pop Decade* this will *not*, says Alan Millar who prepared it, be an in-depth study—"God knows what condition people will be in on the first morning of the New Year, so it's going to be a pure music show hosted by Harry Brown. As a radio review of some of the better pop music recorded in 1969 by Canadian artists, we'll have the original London cast of the musical Anne of Green Gables, the Neil Harris Singers, Gilles Vigneault, Bonnie Dobson, Gordon Lightfoot, Ian and Sylvia. Neil Chotem, and Peter Schofield and the Canadians, a teenage band of students whose average age is 17. Harry Brown introduces the recordings and will have something to say in between the music selections about the performers." (Thursday, January 1 at 10:03 a.m.)

TOURNAMENT OF ROSES PARADE

The annual telecast from California of this dazzling spectacle will have June Lockhart and Bob Barker as commentators and astronauts Alan L. Bean. Richard F. Gordon, Jr., and Charles Conrad, Jr. as Grand Marshals of the parade. (*Thursday, January 1 at 10:30 a.m. CST*)

BOSS BRASS

A Shoe Full of Stones

SIX distinguished Canadian TV artists combine their considerable talents in a film drama in color, *A Shoe Full of Stones*, to be seen on New Year's Eve. Wednesday, December 31, at 9:30 p.m. The six are Phillip Hersch, creator of the prize-winning *Wojeck* series, who wrote the script; Lee Patterson, Sharon Acker and Gerard Parkes, who star in it; Grahame Woods, who photographed it; and Ronald Weyman, who produced and directed it.

Patterson plays the Reverend Mr. Noah Bunker, who has left the organized church to serve the people of a downtown ghetto from his small street mission, and is trying to help an emotionally disturbed immigrant boy, Ramon Alverez, who, with his family, is being bled by Sanchez, a man who got them into the country illegally. Ramon enlists the help of his friends Chico to rob Sanchez, but the incident ends in murder when Ramon pulls a gun. Chico comes to Noah for help, and so does Police Officer Donovan. Sharon Acker plays Anne Bunker, Noah's wife, and Gerard Parkes appears as Donovan. Others featured are David Britton as Ramon; Nick Fylan as Chico; Louis Zorich as Sanchez; Nicola Lipman as Veronica; Elaine Ives-Cameron as Mrs. Alverez; Alf Gallagher as Jaime Alverez; and Patrick Sinclair as P.O. Martin.

After graduating from the Ontario College of Art, Lee Patterson went to Britain, where he became an assistant stage manager for the BBC. He says it was mostly a go-for job, and one day when he was asked to pick up an actor's cheque at an agency, the agent was so impressed by the young Canadian that he phoned next day to offer him a role in Death of a Salesman in Windsor. Then he was in Johnny Belinda, and in West End productions of South Pacific and Stalag 17, in which he played the lead. After that came about three dozen films, plus stage and TV roles in Canada and the U.S., including two seasons in the U.S. TV series Surfside Six. Now he guest stars on both sides of the Atlantic. A month ago he and Miss Acker played leads in the CBC-TV production Power Trip.

Miss Acker stars oppoite Arthur Hill in the recently released feature film, Don't Let the Angels Fall. Her first Hollywood film was Point Blank, with Lee Marvin.

Dublin-born Gerard Parkes was named Best Actor in the 1968 Canadian Film Awards, for his performance in the Paul Almond production of *Isobel*. A year ago he gave a highly regarded performance as the lead in a *Festical* production of *The Write-Off*.

It did, with melodically comic results which you can enjoy on radio's CBC Showcase on January 11. The book is by Coneybeare, music and lyrics by Randle, and production by John Cantelon in Toronto. It stars Donald Harron, Paul Kligman and Jim Barron in speaking roles, and Tommy Ambrose and Lawrie Bower in singing parts.

The First Ten Months of Life -Part 2. "Will we have a normal baby?" That is a question which worries many prospective parents, especially in cases where they have already had a baby with a genetic defect or where the mother has taken certain drugs or contracted certain diseases during pregnancy.

It used to be a question which could not be answered until the moment of birth. These days, however, there is a test which can tell a mother four months after conception whether the baby she is carrying is normal and, incidentally, whether it is a boy or a girl.

By taking a sample of the mother's amniotic fluid, in which the fetus floats in the womb, doctors can now get fetal cells, incubate them and look at their chromosomes. This test to determine whether or not the fetus is normal is performed primarily when the chance of fetal abnormality is great.

They camped out, and survived several exciting experiences, including an earthquake and being charged by rhinos and elephants. They were the first to film the Egyptian vulture, and hyenas feeding at night and doing their own killing. They photographed gigantic flowers in the foothills life of the mountains far above the tree-line; daily activities of the lion family; the hunting technique of the cheetah; the Uganda kob antelope staking out his territory; and how the life cvcle ensures each animal of survival. material back to Canada, Fred Friendly, then head of news and public affairs at CBS, is a dear friend and competitor, but we've always been abrasive towards each other in our work. He was out to beat us that time. I had my crew standing by in London for several days, and when Churchill's death was announced, we began a game of spying and one-up-manship with CBS. At one time Friendly suggested we be partners on the job, but I said no, and had 'creeping supers' made up saying 'This is coming to you from the CBC'. I was trying to anticipate Friendly's moves, and had a spy in the airport at London. Wherever I went, I left my telephone number for him to call. At 2:00 a.m. one day I got an urgent message to say that CBS had rented a DC8 jet, ripped the insides out and put in a videotape recording machine, and it was already in the air. I couldn't figure out what the hell Friendly was trying to do. I thought it would probably land in Scotland or Ireland, and take the feed from there -Ireland was closer to North America by an hour, almost enough to let the DC8 beat our Vulcans.

"I called the control tower in Prestwick. Scotland, to ask if there was a DC8 around anywhere. They hadn't seen one, but when I rang my old friend Gunnar Rugheimer at the Dublin airport, he said yes, there's one just going to land. So then I knew Friendly planned to tape the whole funeral in Ireland, edit it on the way back to North America, and put it on the air immediately. Then I got a call from Canada to say that CBS had somehow gained access to our back-up micro-wave out of Halifax, which meant that when we landed in Halifax, and

had to play right onto the network, we'd have no back-up to rely on if our micro-wave failed. I did everything I could in London to get the Vulcans a free runway for fast take-off. And I had an open line to the naval airport at Shearwater, Nova Scotia, where both they and the DC8 planned to land. Then it suddenly struck me that we were using a services aircraft, while Friendly had a chartered one, and I remembered a little regulation saying that commercial aircraft can't land at a services airfield without a Cabinet Minister's approval. So I called my old friend, Bill Lee, then head of public relations for the RCAF, and asked him to get in touch with a Minister and not let the DC8 land, so it would have to go to an internal airport about 40 miles away and send the tapes by truck or motorbike. Bill called back to say they aren't going to land.

"Then Shearwater reported that Friendly had a warmed-up helicopter standing by to make the 40-mile dash and they'd still beat our Vulcans by three or four minutes, but that Shearwater would refuse it a landing runway because of the traffic. Undaunted, the copter pilot landed on the grass. By the time they got their tape out and on pictures are no good. We had to take your feed! . . . and there was our CBC creeper coming in regularly across the screen in all those U.S. sets!"

That sort of spirit is partly Benson's Irish heritage, and partly the result of the resourcefullness he acquired in his extraordinary childhood. He was born in 1915 about half-way between Selkirk and Winnipeg, in a tiny village called Old England, where the only English-horn resident was his mother. His father was from Bally James Duff, near Belfast. When Benson was seven his separated. parents and his mother, a courageous woman who died last year at 97, resumed her nursing career to support Thom and his nine-yearold brother.

A couple of years later she went up to nurse at Norway House, leaving the older boy to attend St. John's College in Winnipeg, and taking Thom along to attend school with Indian children. Benson recalls that he picked up three things: a smattering of Cree, some Indian friends of whom he was very fond, and diphtheria, "but the forestry people flew in antitoxin in time to save my life."

Then Mrs. Benson and Thom returned to Winnipeg. "It was the depths of the Depression," he recalls, "and we didn't have a lot of money, but tried to stay together somehow. I went to night school and worked days

its way to the machine, our Vulcan was coming in to land. Then the Shearwater commander cried: "They're on the air! Your plane has stopped at the end of the runway'. I knew it would take four or five minutes more for us to get on the air. So I phoned Friendly in New York to compliment him, and said it must have cost him a quarter of a million dollars to win. He said yes, but our as a store messenger and handy man, but that didn't pan outit was too tiring. Then, through friends, I got into St. John's College and worked nights." Later Mrs. Benson returned to Norway House at the request of the Anglican Church, and Thom went with her. He stayed with a doctor who had a good short wave battery radio with a big horn, and Thom became interested in the fascinating world which the receiver drew into the white winter expanse of northern Manitoba. Back in Winnipeg there were no jobs.

"I began perfecting my sodaierking technique-it seemed the only road to a job. But I had my sights on something beyond that, because I applied at Harmon's Drug Store, about halfa-block from CKY, where the people from the station came in for lunch. I got taken on part time. About six months later Reg Harmon made it a steady job. at \$12 a week. Among the customers I got to know were program director Herb Roberts and manager Bill Backhouse, a dear man. I made sure they knew about my interest in radio, and finally the great day came. They said they were auditioning for an announcer, and would have me over to try out. It was a great audition, and I gathered there was no doubt I'd get the iob. But there was to be a final audition the following Sunday, I blew it sky high, and went down to Harmon's basement and cried. Later, practically the same thing happened. Then I got my guts back, and began pestering CJRC, and sold them on the idea that if I announced the dance band at night they wouldn't have to send an announcer over to the hotel. They agreed. But they couldn't pay me, so I talked the hotel into giving me \$7 a week if I gave them plenty of on-mike plugs. I kept on my drug store job,

and some cronies going by the hotel and he'd called out 'I want to see you!' He offered me a summer job. It was difficult making up my mind which job to take, but I chose CKY's, and I made sure I was seen around the station at night, answering the switchboard, sweeping the floor, etc. In the fall I was told they'd keep me on. That was about 1938.

"When the Second World War broke out, I joined the navy. They wanted me to do recruiting but stay with the station. I stayed till 1942, then went on active service. I was demobbed as a Lieutenant-Commander in 1945 after a completely unspectacular naval career, and was installed at CKY as chief announcer.

In 1947 the late Ira Dilworth. then of the International Service. whom Benson calls "one of the great men in broadcasting, and one of the greatest influences on my life," phoned him from Montreal to ask him to become IS representative on the prairies, interpreting prairie people and developments for listeners abroad. "The money he offered was less than half what I'd been making," Benson says, "but of course I took the job. Then, in the summer of 1949 Ira said 'I want to second you to the information division of the Department of External Affairs in Ottawa for a year.' This meant another sacrifice, but it was a year I'll never forget. At the

hockey championships, royal tours, etc.

Between his CBC travels to distant places, Benson got married, and he and Nancy have three children between six and 12. As the special events department expanded, Benson moved into the field of documentaries, turning out about one a month for radio.

When CBC-TV began, Benson's responsibilities included those of the new medium, and he recalls that "It was very exciting, but we were all at sea. I prefer TV now, but was afraid of it then. Radio is much more personal, because one can be everything in a production . . . conceive the idea, write, produce, voice. It's as if it's made from one's own hands. But in TV it's in the hands of other people as well."

Benson's department excells at the sort of TV features represented by two highly regarded specials shown this season: And We Were Young, and Who Killed Tom Thomson, and he hopes to shoot The Megantic Outlaw soon. He says "I have great love for this country and always want to be in a position to reflect that to the people of Canada." And, of course, to be first with reports on colorful events of state and international interest. He's fascinated by the question of whether there's life on other planets, but savs he's sure that on the day it's ordered that he die, somebody will step

starting work there at 8:00 a.m. and continuing till late at night on the air. It was exhausting, and finally Reg Harmon, who'd kindly gone along with me on this double deal, said you can't do two jobs, Thom. Which career do you want more? I chose radio, but still at only \$7 a week. After seven months of announcing I was offered a fulltime summer job. But a few days before that I'd passed Backhouse

end of the year I was transferred to Toronto as IS representative."

The CBC domestic service asked that Benson be one of the chief reporters under A. E. Powley's direction for the 1951 Royal Tour. The year after the tour a CBC special events department was formed, and Benson became provincial supervisor in Toronto, organizing coverage of Olympic Games, British Empire Games, world out of a rocket on Jupiter, and he'll never know the answer. But if that happens we suspect that no matter who sends the first telecast back to earth, even if it's Fred Friendly, a ghostly 'creeper' will insinuate itself across the screen saying 'This is coming to you through the CBC', and somewhere among the background crackles there'll be a Bensonian chuckle.—June Graham.
