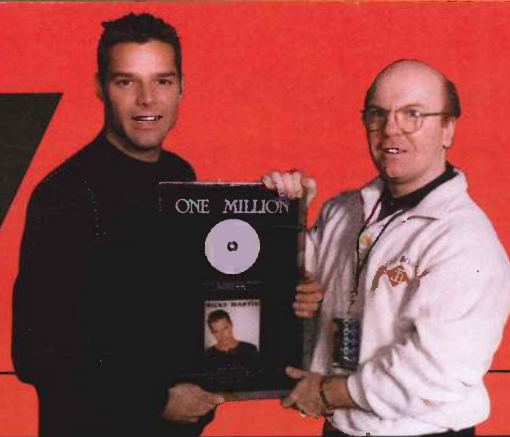

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Majors to begin shipping source-tagged CDs

Now that the industry as a whole has apparently agreed on an anti-theft system, at least two major record companies have announced that they will start shipping CDs with the Sensormatic anti-theft tags immediately.

Warner Music Canada will commence shipping CDs with the Sensormatic tags beginning April 1. Initially, Warner will tag every third disc manufactured in Canada in the 'Full Price' and 'Superstar' categories. The tags will not, however, apply to any third-party product distributed by Warner.

Warner plans to expand the use of the tags to all of their distributed product in the year 2001.

And Sony Music Canada is also planning to start source-tagging product, probably as early as May 1. Sony were previously at the forefront of the source-tagging plans, according to VP of sales Don

Oates. But the failure of Sensormatic to adequately supply the labels resulted in source-tagging being put off again.

"We made it very clear that we would be happy to source-tag," says Oates, "once the industry

decided on which one company they were going to use for source-tagging. Last year, almost to this day, the RMAC people came into our offices and told us that they had taken Sensormatic as their dedicated tag supplier. So I took that opportunity to tell our customers across the country that Sony was going into source-tagging with Sensormatic, at RMAC's request."

Sony had started source-tagging product beginning in May of last year, right through to September. But Sensormatic's failure to provide adequate inventory resulted in Sony being a stand-alone label.

Oates says that Sony, at the time, had no choice but to pull out of the program, until RMAC and/or Sensormatic could solve the problem of maintaining an adequate supply of tags. Oates adds that Sony's stance since then has been a wait-and-see one.

"The moment we know Sensormatic can supply adequate inventory, and we're being advised that they can now, then as soon as we see one or two of the other distributors utilize source tags, we will jump back into the situation of tagging our product."

The process finally becomes reality after retailers first began pushing for some type of anti-theft device early in the '90s. The retailers were hoping to curtail millions of dollars in losses due to shoplifting.

The tags are estimated to cost between four and five cents per CD, but neither Warner or Sony expected to see any price increase passed on to the consumer.

CAB accepts PM's e-business challenge with FuturePlan

FuturePlan is the Canadian Association of Broadcasters (CAB) new plan to boost radio, television and specialty broadcasters' presence on the internet, setting out a research blueprint and positioning Canadian private broadcasters so they can meet the emerging challenges of the new digital economy.

The plan features five objectives: the development and ownership of distinctive content; the establishment of internet business; brand

The Sensormatic tags are installed during the manufacture of the jewel boxes, which are then sent to the music manufacturers. Retailers also found the cost of installing anti-theft devices prohibitive.

Universal Music Canada president Randy Lennox noted that Universal "will be source-tagging in the month of April," with an announcement expected shortly.

extension across many platforms; securing maximum structural flexibility; and the expansion of revenues and revenue sources.

FuturePlan was launched via an internet web cast hosted by CAB board chair Daniel Lamarre, who accepted a business challenge set down by Prime Minister Jean Chretien. Chretien, speaking to the Mississauga Board of Trade last month, urged Canadian industry to gain a 5% worldwide share of e-commerce by 2003, and to do \$200-billion worth of on-line business.

Part and parcel of FuturePlan is a proposed immediate change to the Copyright Act to ensure that internet-based broadcasting is clearly established as a different medium, and that the copyrights of creators are recognized.

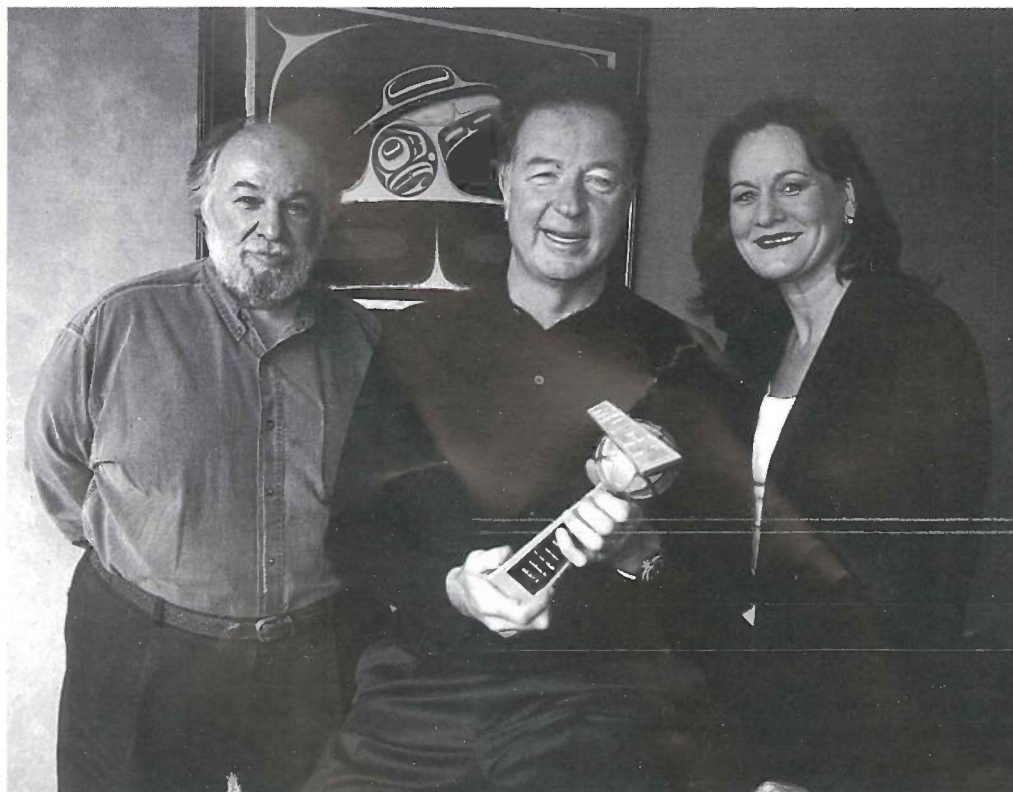
In addition, FuturePlan is setting out a strategy to increase the supply of Canadian music, both French and English. The CAB, working with the Canadian music industry, has enacted a number of programs to raise the profile and marketability of emerging domestic artists.

In terms of television and specialty channels, FuturePlan calls for the removal of "artificial structural barriers", with the hope of increasing investment by broadcasters in programming. The new model would result in more Canadian programming, more promotion dollars and an increase in export potential for Canadian programming.

"Canada's private broadcasters are proud to do their part," notes Lamarre. "On behalf of our members, Mr. Prime Minister, we accept your challenge."

CAB president and CEO Michael McCabe added, "Canada's private broadcasters can play a vital role in 'dot-com' development. Our members are already on the 'net, but we're poised to take a giant leap into e-business."

FuturePlan was developed via CAB's Strategic Planning Group, a cross-section of industry executives.

Vengaboys leading DEP's foray into Canadian market

If you haven't heard of The Vengaboys, then obviously you're not a dance fan. The Vengaboys first release, *The Party Album*, debuted at #14 on the RPM 100 CDs chart (April 26/99), and eventually went on to sell more than 300,000 units in Canada. Those numbers made *The Party Album* the top-selling album from an indie label and distributor all of last year.

The Vengaboys story is unique, to say the least. A pair of Spanish DJs named Danski and DJ Delmundo toured across Spain in their schoolbus between 1992 and '97, organizing illegal beach parties on several Spanish beaches. The parties ended when the police showed up.

The duo were already gaining notoriety in the club and underground circuits, releasing several dance tracks in limited quantities. During one of those infamous beach parties in 1996, the DJs met up with beach partiers Kim, Roy, Denice and Robin, who quickly became the up-front presence of The Vengaboys.

Danski and Delmundo took care of the producing and DJ-ing, while Kim, Roy, Denice and Robin took care of the on-stage performing. With Kim being the on-stage leader, the group initiated a European tour in the winter of '96.

The many stories surrounding the Vengaboys are almost movie-like. During a performance dubbed *Music For The People, Money For The People*, in Barcelona in January of '97, the group performed their so-called *Cash Chaos Concert*, tossing close to \$10,000 in cash into the crowd. The result was a bunch of happy fans, complete madness, and a trip to Spanish jail.

Rather than wait for trial, the group jumped bail and fled to Brazil, where they were housed at the private estate of legendary bank robber Ronnie Biggs, an old friend of Danski and Delmundo. The two DJs eventually found themselves in a studio in Europe, while the foursome of Kim, Robin, Roy and Denice continued their European tour under the Vengaboys banner. Robin left in late '99, replaced by Yorick.

The story of the first Vengaboys album is decidedly less frenetic. When their first single, *Up And Down*, was released in March of '97 (by Benelux), the response was immediate, and the major label bidding war began. But rather than signing with a major, the group chose instead to opt for licensing deals with smaller independents. *The Party Album* was picked up by Strictly Rhythm in the US, and Isba Music in Canada.

The Party Album produced four singles that wound up at or near the top of the charts - *Up And Down*, *We Like To Party*, *Boom Boom Boom Boom* and *We're Going To Ibiza*. And the recently-released *Platinum Album* promises similar results. Lead single *Kiss* is already racing up the dance charts, and the album should follow on the retail charts.

Helping to guide the Canadian success story of the Vengaboys is Quebec-based dep distribution. Overseeing the fast-rising audio sales division of dep is Georges Tremblay.

The company is now in its fourth year of operation, and has grown from three employees to 27 in their central

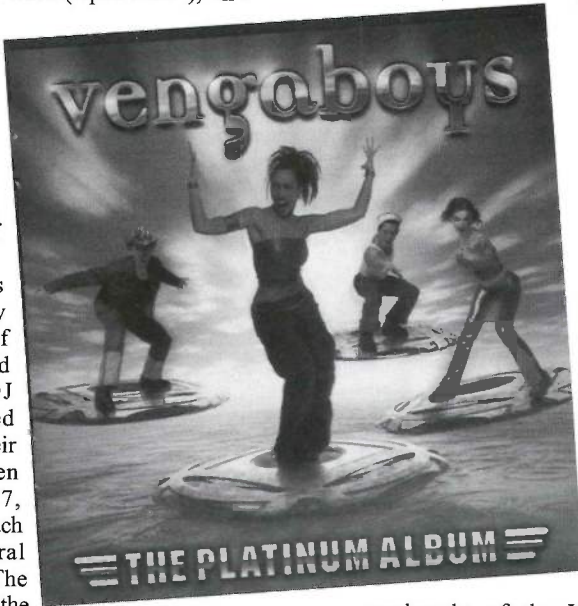
Quebec office alone (not counting warehouse staff).

Tremblay says that dep is distributing an extensive list of indie labels, over 90% of which are Canadian, as well as the Cleopatra group from California, Orbison Productions from Nashville, French label TF1 (distributed by Sony in the rest of the world), YFB and Isba.

"We go from jazz, to worldbeat, to a lot of French pop/rock, dance, classical - we do the whole spectrum."

Tremblay credits DJ/producer Daniel Desnoyers with the

onslaught of the Vengaboys in Canada. Desnoyers, who produces dance compilations for Isba, secured the Canadian licensing for the song *Up And Down*, and eventually discovered that the entire Vengaboys album was available for licensing. Isba picked it up, with dep distributing, and the rest was automatic.

"We kept getting request after request, so we eventually rush-released the album. Our first ship-out was around 20,000 units, and we had 6,000 units scanned in the first week. By mid-September of last year, we were shipping something like 15-20,000 units a week."

In fact, Canada alone represented more than 7% of the worldwide sales of the Vengaboys *Party Album*, indicative of the huge interest in dance music in this country.

Tremblay says that the dep has already shipped platinum on the new Vengaboys *Platinum Album*, and he's also excited about an upcoming release from Alice DJ.

"And it's coming from the same gang, Violent Music in Holland, who were responsible for the Vengaboys."

As noted, the three-plus years of dep's existence has seen some rapid growth. From a start-up staff of three, the Quebec office staff has grown to nearly 30 (not including warehouse staff).

And Tremblay says the company continues to grow day-by-day, in the hopes of becoming a more prominent nationwide distributor.

"We have a full-time office in Toronto, we have agents around the country. We also have a video department, we handled some of the French *Pokemon* videos, and we sold 500,000 units. So there's lots of different faces of dep. We want to solidify our position here in Quebec in the French market, but our goal is really to become truly national distributors."

Despite being 'only' a distributor, dep's offices receive numerous demo tapes from aspiring artists daily. Tremblay says that the company has no interest in designing their own record label, preferring instead to source the demos out to the labels they distribute.

As far as he's concerned, labels should stick to making records, and distributors should stick to distributing them.

"I don't think it's our role as a distributor to do that (start their own label). I think the healthier our labels are, then the healthier we'll be."

He adds that dep has no plans to begin distributing online, as one might expect. Again, as far as he's concerned, each company should stick to what it does best.

And he recognizes that the brand name recognition of retailers like HMV is what attracts the consumer.

"We are thinking about it, but we have to look at how it would affect our retailers. I think it has to be 'to each his own' - they're a retailer, we're a distributor, there's labels - I think if everybody does their job well, then it's great."

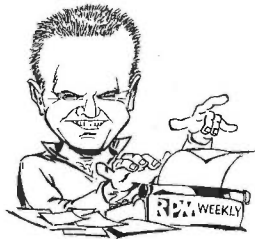
Notre Dame's Quasimodo signed to CDA Productions

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Rubber: It's probably not what you think

If you were one of the many who saw a big yellow duck wandering through the hotel lobby during Canadian Music Week, and you were wondering what the heck it was all about - well, now the answer is here.

The name of the band is Rubber, as in ducky, the kind Ernie used to sing about. And that ubiquitous yellow duck at CMW was doing his thing



to promote the release of Rubber's self-titled debut via Warner Music Canada.

Now there's no sense disguising it, so why not just come out and say it - the members of Rubber (Harry Hess and Pete Lesperance and, to a lesser extent Barry Donaghy) used to make up another Canadian band known as Harem Scarem. There, now that that's out of the way, we can talk about Rubber.

Lesperance, who was still slowly recovering from that devastating Warner post-Juno party, doesn't want to completely forget his past. But at the same time, he and his fellow band mates would prefer to be judged on the merits of their new project. Harem Scarem did provide a nice life for them, but it's now history.

"We've had a good and lucrative career overseas, which was the whole Harem Scarem thing. We were over in Japan for the last few years, and meanwhile back here, everybody kept asking, 'well

what happened to that big-hair band?'"

"The Harem Scarem thing progressively changed over the years, but obviously, because of our initial outing, we never really got a crack at changing. We thought we were writing songs as relevant as anything else out there, so we thought, fuck it, let's just change the name and begin again.

And Warner's totally behind it, we've got some great action at radio, we just did an awesome video with Warren Sinoda, which is actually being serviced to Much today. So we're hopeful - we're realistic but we're definitely hopeful."

Lesperance and Hess have been writing songs together for nearly a decade, and in the years since that previous band took off overseas, they've veered off into other work, including producing and mixing albums for other artists (Hess handled mixing duties on the latest Julian Austin album).

And over the last couple of years, their songs started becoming something decidedly un-Harem Scarem like, thus leading to the idea of beginning anew.

Lesperance says that the duo didn't want to be squeezed into a category with the new record, as they had been in their previous lives.

"We just let the songs develop as naturally as we could in whatever vein they seemed to want to go in. We never said 'this has to be an alternative rock record', or 'this has to be a pop record', which is why you'll find a quasi-country song like Coming Down alongside a straightforward rock track like It's Gotta Be."

A cursory listen to the album reveals a whole host of primal sources, everything from the Cheap Trick to Split Enz to Squeeze. And with Hess and Lesperance producing the record themselves, they were able to create the type of sound they wanted, rather than the type of sound that was expected from them in the past.

"When (insert band name here) started, it was ten years ago, we were young, we were like 18 or 19 when it started. We didn't know really what we were doing. We were kind of into the rock thing at the time, and that was before the whole grunge thing kicked the shit out of rock. Unfortunately, we got branded as that, and as we changed, nobody really cared.

"But this is absolutely where we want to be. And when we made this record, Harry and I were thinking 'Canada's never gonna let us have another chance, and this is gonna sink us in Japan, totally'. But we finally thought, 'we're 30 years old, let's

make the kind of record we wanna make'. And so far, things have worked out, and even in Japan, they're saying 'wow, sounds like Cheap Trick!'"

The pleasing thing about Rubber is that, unlike so many new guitar-oriented bands that pop up today, there's no resident angst attached. Songs like Sunshine (the lead single), It's Gotta Be and Pool Party are generally upbeat, almost pop-oriented tunes.

Lesperance himself could never understand the need for so many bands to vent their supposed anger on the world. If you're a successful band, selling lots of records, what's to be angry about?

"Hey, you've got a lot of money, you've got a good life - what are you so mad about? But no, this is a pretty happy little record."

Having said that, it goes without saying that the Rubber band men are happier than they've been in years with a new record. And they certainly must have been in the right frame of mind to write the

songs for the album.

"You know what, I guess we must have been, because I'm happier with it than anything we've done in years. Of course, what else am I gonna say, we're promoting a new record. But I love it, and going out and playing it is so liberating."

When it came time to sort out a lead single from the record, Warner went with the decidedly positive Sunshine. But before it was released to radio, the band brought the track to friend Arnold Lanni (best known currently for his work with Our Lady Peace) for a quick remix.

Lesperance and Hess have known Lanni since they were labelmates years before during Lanni's tenure with Frozen Ghost. And considering that Hess recently purchased Lanni's Arnyard Studios, the choice of Lanni to remix the single was a natural.

"When we were talking to Warner about the first single, they said Sunshine was gonna be it, but they wanted a couple different remixes. And we thought, hmmm, we know a really great guy for this, and he was happy to do it. He really likes the band, but more than that, he's really great people."

The next logical branch on the Rubber tree is touring, and Lesperance hopes to get the band out on the road ASAP.

"There's a couple of things in the works, but nothing's really confirmed yet. We're trying to do the Third Eye Blind tour, but that's still up in the air. Right now, we're just fine-tuning it, and trying to figure out what the hell we are going to do. But with summer coming up, and all the different festivals, we will definitely be doing our share of playing."

And about that name? No, it doesn't refer to condoms, and no, it isn't a play on The Spinners' classic Rubber Band Man. In fact, Lesperance says he never even thought of the condom connotation.

"It's funny you mentioned that, because I never even thought of that. Actually, Blue Balls, Barry's old band, were gonna call themselves Rubber at one point, and I just thought 'wow, that's a great name'. So when we needed a new name, we just thought, 'let's steal that'. But I think it's a cool name, and it's very nondescript. When you hear the name, A it's memorable, but B, you have no idea what they sound like. It's sort of its own thing."

And as a footnote, the video for Sunshine was added into heavy rotation at MuchMusic this past week. So prepare yourself, for the Rubber..band..men.

Baby Blue Crew signs with Universal Canada

Universal Music Canada has announced the signing of renowned DJ squad The Baby Blue Sound Crew. The crew, comprised of Kid Kut, KLC, Singlefoot, and C Boogie, is an urban DJ outfit that has attained strong indie success.

Baby Blue's success was certified when they became the first Canadians to appear on the Black Entertainment Television (BET) program Planet Groove. They have since become Canada's unofficial 'urban ambassadors'.

Randy Lennox, president of Universal Music Canada, commented, "We're thrilled to be working with Baby Blue. They have established themselves

as Canada's premiere urban entertainers and we can't wait to build on their already tremendous success. Signing this group is further confirmation of Universal's commitment to urban music in this country."

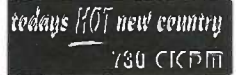

The trio have been nominated in two categories for this year's TNN Music Awards: Group or Duo of the Year and The Discovery Award. The awards will be broadcast live on June 15. John Stoneham is beginning to pick up impressive spins for his latest single, Who Said, one of his originals to be included on his upcoming CD which he produced with Brent Budrug. The single has already caught the ear of a number of important

country programmers and enters the chart this week at #87. Stoneham is well known in the film business where he has gained notoriety as a stunt man (RPM - March 13, 2000). Bodrug, a former protege of Oscar Peterson, is also a

He has also produced and arranged for Aceface, Plastic Soul and Paul Manchin. The Dixie Chicks have another hit, this time with Goodbye Earl, which bullets up to #5 this week on the RPM Country 100. The song message however, got the following response from Edmonton's R.M. (Bob) Poley, who writes: "I have never been an activist, a writer of letters to the editor, rebel, fuddy-duddy, nor a grumpy old man -- until now! For forty-plus years I have been an avid, supportive, country music fan. But I am now disappointed and embarrassed that the industry has lowered itself to promoting music that frivolously condones and supports the murder of men! Goodbye Earl by the Dixie Chicks is a so-called country song in which the artists flippantly shout 'Earl had to die -- Goodbye Earl.' The lyrics then describe two women committing murder and destroying the evidence. The video version shows the women giggling and humorously burying a body rolled up in carpets/blankets, and the police can't find Earl who is now a missing person. I believe that this music does not

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What's Happening

The words **KISS Farewell Tour** are sad ones indeed to the millions of member of the KISS Army around the world. But after 27 years, and more than 75 million albums sold worldwide, the band has finally decided to call it a day. The Farewell Tour will stop off at Toronto's Air Canada Centre on June 23, with guests Ted Nugent and Skid Row. To coincide with the tour, the band's fourth live album, *Alive IV*, will be released later this year. The album will feature songs recorded during their Reunion Tour, the Psycho Circus tour, and their New Year's Eve show in Vancouver.

The **Enrique Iglesias in-store** appearance has been moved from Sherway Gardens to the more spacious Bramalea City Centre. The performance and autograph signing, set for April 4 at 5:30 pm, is in conjunction with HMV Canada. Following his Toronto appearance, Iglesias will make an appearance at the HMV Megastore in Montreal on April 6 at noon.

Blues giant John Lee Hooker will perform at Massey Hall on April 29th, with guest John Hammond. Canadian blues artists Ray Bonneville and Colin Linden will open the show. Hooker has been performing for over half a century, and has been accorded a closet-full of honours, including induction into the Rock 'N Roll Hall of Fame, and a star on the Hollywood Walk Of Fame. This past month, Hooker received a lifetime achievement award at the Grammys.

The **Headstones** are coming off a much-talked-about performance at Lee's Palace during Canadian Music Week, a show some are calling the best club gig they've seen in years. The group's newest album, *Nickels For Your Nightmares*, is slated for an April 4th release, led by the lead single, *Settle*, which went to rock radio last week. The Headstones embark on a tour beginning April Fool's Day, with a show at the U. Of NBC Courtyard in Prince George. Other confirmed dates include Barrymore's in Ottawa (April 5), Coyote's in Thunder Bay (10), Winnipeg's The Zoo (11), Louis Pub in Saskatoon (15), The Palace in Calgary (18), the Shaw Conference Centre in Edmonton (20), and Vancouver's Commodore Ballroom (26).

Koch International has acquired the exclusive Canadian distribution rights for Street Salter Films home video and DVD product, including all 41 hours of the sci-fi series *Lexx*, all 19 half-hour episodes of the comedy series *Made In Canada*, all 46 hours of the family series *Emily Of New Moon*, and the one-hour music special *Celtic Electric*. Salter Street Films, based in Halifax, develops, produces and distributes original film and television programming, including the highly-rated comedy *This Hour Has 22 Minutes*. Koch International also distributes home video product for the Discovery Channel and TLC, among others.

The **Violent Femmes** have returned to the airwaves with their latest EMI release, *Freak Magnet*, a "selection of recordings we've made in the studio over the last four years," according to vocalist/guitarist Gordon Gano. Hailing from Milwaukee, the Femmes first burst on the scene back in 1982 with their self-titled debut, which offered the modern rock anthems *Blister In The Sun*, *Kiss Off* and *Add It Up*. Fifteen years and nine albums later, the band continues to roll along. The Femmes are firmed for an April 20th date at The Warehouse, with guest Hawksley Workman.

BMG R&B artist Angie Stone is firmed for April 17th at The Government. Stone has received rave reviews for her Arista debut, *Black Diamond*, with plaudits coming from the likes of D'Angelo and Lenny Kravitz.

Elektra/Warner's Third Eye Blind are at The Warehouse on April 27th with guest Tonic. Third Eye Blind burst on the scene back in the summer of '98 with their self-titled debut album, which spawned the hits *Semi-Charmed Life*, *How's It Gonna Be*, *Losing A Whole Year* and *Jumper*. The album went on to sell more than four million units worldwide. The group recently released their sophomore effort, *Blue*, which is being propelled by the hit lead single, *Never Let You Go*.

Guitar great Joe Satriani is at Massey Hall on April 25th, in town to promote his latest Epic release, *Engines Of Creation*. Satriani is considered one of the most gifted guitarists of his time, and has taught some of the hottest players around, including Metallica's Kirk Hammett, Steve Vai and Primus' Larry Lalonde. His debut album, *Surfing With The Alien*, released in 1987, went on to sell more than two million copies worldwide.

Toronto's MIX 99.9 morning crew entered a colourful float in the St. Patrick's Day parade, which took place March 12. Daryng Daryl's 1981 Chevette was painted green, and sent off to be decal for the parade. Only problem was, the car came back with the words *Merry Christmas* scrawled on the side. The problem was quickly remedied with a can of spray paint. On March 17th, the car journeyed down Yonge Street as part of the St. Matty's Day Parade, which featured the entire O Motley MIX Crew: Michael Fatley and his dance troupe, lifesize dancing Guinness pints, T-MIX (the station mascot), and Jimmy, the MIX morning crew leprechaun.

CFOX in Vancouver put together the winning team in last week's AC/DC NTN Topix trivia contest, arranged by Warner Music Canada in conjunction with the release of the newest AC/DC album, *Stiff Upper Lip*. The record company challenged radio stations across the country to put together a team of 'experts' to compete in the AC/DC trivia contest, with autographed memorabilia from the band up for grabs. The winning team consisted of FOX midday host Steve Dunbar, and local contest winners Barry Tomlison, Todd Fewer, John Caelles and Darren Moys. The second place team was from The Bear in Ottawa. Each CFOX team member will receive autographed AC/DC lithographs

Victoria Lord, who had been handling press and promotion for Universal Music Canada's classical division, will now also oversee Universal's corporate communications. As corporate communications manager, Lord will report directly to president Randy Lennox, and will be the primary contact for Universal's trade and public relations activities.

Beginning this Friday (March 31), Mitchell will perform at the club every Friday in the month of April (7, 14, 21, 28). As part of his cross-country residency tour, Mitchell will also be appearing in Calgary, Edmonton, Winnipeg and Montreal.

Virgin artist Kelis is at The Opera House on April 20th, with guest Jully Black. Kelis' Virgin debut, *Kaleidoscope*, was produced by The Neptunes, best known for their work with Blackstreet, Mase and Ol' Dirty Bastard.

V2's Stereophonics are at The Opera House on April 21, with guests Jet Set Satellite. Stereophonics latest album, *Performance & Cocktails*, was given a great boost when the band opened up for Our Lady Peace on the latter's cross-Canada tour. Their last Toronto appearance, at Lee's Palace last October, was a sell-out. Stereophonics are also featured on Tom Jones' latest album, *ReLoad*, joining Jones for a rousing rendition of the Three Dog Night classic, *Mama Told Me Not To Come*. Netzwerk artists Jet Set Satellite have just recently their debut offering, *Blueprint*.

Catherine Wheel's newest album, *Wishville*, should be released sometime this spring by Sony, adding to a list of albums that has collectively sold more than a million copies worldwide. To celebrate the release of this new album, the band will make a special concert appearance on April 12 in Toronto, at a still-secret location. BMG prepping Guess Who retrospective for Canadian tour

A CD retrospective is currently being put together for BMG by Valerie Lapp to coincide with the much rumoured, and now factual, reunion of the Guess Who and a tour of Canada that will include 22 performances in 20 cities across Canada.

Randy Bachman, Burton Cummings, Jim Kale and Gary Peterson, who reunited last fall for a 20-minute set that closed the Pan Am Games, were so taken by the audience response, they huddled shortly after to talk about a reunion with a possible tour.

The Winnipeg band first hit in 1965. They appeared on the front cover of RPM dated March 8, 1965, when they had changed their name from Chad Allen and the Expressions to The Guess Who. Interesting enough, the story was headlined "The Guess Whos", a promotion ploy by their label Quality, to bring attention to the band, and which resulted in The Guess Who. In fact, Allen was

still with the group at that time as was keyboardist Bob Ashley. Their first single release under the new name, Shakin' All Over, was a monster hit, topping the RPM chart on March 22, 1965, which also opened the door into the US.

The foursome (Chad Allen, Jim Kale, Randy Bachman and Gary Peterson) won the Annual RPM Award (now the Junos) as Top Vocal Instrumental Group in 1966 (Jan. 17, 1966). Burton Cummings joined the Guess Who a few months later (RPM - June 20, 1966). Flying On The Ground Is Wrong was their last single for Quality.

Through an agreement arranged by Stan Klees with George Struth, president of Quality Records, the Guess Who's contract was sold to Jack Richardson. Their first single under the new agreement, When Friends Fall Out, was released on the Nimbus 9 label, a partnership between Richardson, Ben McPeck, Alan MacMillan and Peter Clayton. The single peaked at #75 (RPM - July 20/68). These Eyes, released in Canada and the US on the RCA label, peaked at #7 in Canada and #6 in the US (March 3/69). However, Laughing, the follow-up was a #1 hit in Canada (Sept. 6/69). Their next #1 single was No Time (Feb. 28/70), followed by their anthem, American Woman, which also topped the chart (May 9/70). That was their last #1 single, although they did maintain chart presence in both Canada and the US throughout the early seventies. Share The Dance did make it to #2 (Dec. 5/70), Rain Dance peaked at #3 (Oct. 16/71), Running Back To Saskatoon got up to #9 (Dec. 2/72), Clap For The Wolfman managed a #4 slot (Oct. 5/74), and their last charted single was Silver Bird, which peaked at #63 (Aug. 14/76). Their last US charted single was Dancin' Fool which peaked at #28 (Jan. 11/75).

Lorne Saifer Entertainment in association with House of Blues Concerts have firmed the tour dates with the opener at the Memorial Stadium in St. John's on May 31, followed by Halifax's Metro Centre (June 2), Saint John's Harbour Station (3), Ottawa's Wordperfect Theatre (7), the Molson Centre Theatre in Montreal (9), Kitchener's Memorial Centre (10), Peterborough's Memorial Centre (12), Memorial Gardens in North Bay (13), the Molson Amphitheatre in Toronto (15), the Fort William Gardens in Thunder Bay (17), Saskatchewan Place in Saskatoon (19), Prince George's Multiplex (21), Skyreach Place in Kelowna (22), Vancouver's GM Place (24), the Riverside Coliseum in Kamloops (25), Calgary's Canadian Airlines Saddledome (27), Skyreach Centre in Edmonton (28), Canwest Global Park in their hometown of Winnipeg (30), the Canada Games Arena in Grande Prairie (July 8), Red Deer's Centrium (9), the Sportsplex in Lethbridge (11), and Brandon's Keystone Arena (14). It's expected that further dates will be announced over the next few weeks.

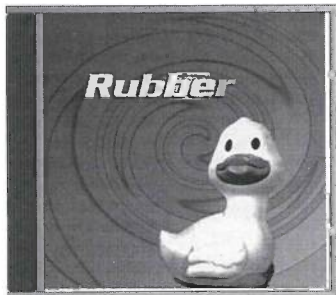

RUBBER - Pop/Rock

Shifting musical gears midway through your career is one sure-fire way for a band to alienate most of their fans, thus enacting the possibility that the career might not last much longer. Harry Hess and Pete Lesperance, the former members of a certain big-haired hard rock band that had great success in the far east, were smart enough to recognize that releasing this kind of record under their previous appellation was akin to musical suicide, so they did the next best thing - they started over. Anyone in this business who knows the names Hess and Lesperance probably knows the band we're talking about, but the less said about that former incarnation, the better. Hess and Lesperance have obviously turned a sonic corner in their creativity, with a fresh-sounding collection of tunes that evoke warm, high-school memories of Squeeze or Cheap Trick. The harmonized chorus of the opening track, It's Gotta Be, provides a resonating response to critics who slagged the duo's previous work, indicating that the pair have been holding back for far too long. Lead single Sunshine is catchy guitar-oriented pop/rock that's a natural for rock radio, or even CHR, and the video's already been slotted into heavy rotation at Much. Admittedly, the remainder of the tracks don't match the radio-friendly first pair, but there's still plenty to crow about, including the equally poppish Who-Buddy, the '80s sounding Stuck With You, the semi-countryfied Coming Down, the Squeeze-like bridge in Pool Party, and the acoustic voracity of Everybody Else. There's nothing to change the world with here, just good simple rock songs, which is what Hess and Lesperance have been aiming for all along. -RR

THE JEFF HEALEY BAND - Rock
Get Me Some

Given the industry's current penchant for boy bands and teen queens, it's somewhat surprising that Universal has chosen to embellish their domestic roster with beer-drinking favourite Healey. There's never been any doubting of Healey's talents on guitar, but one has to seriously ask whether there's still an ample fan base for this type of repertoire. Since the reasonable success of tracks like



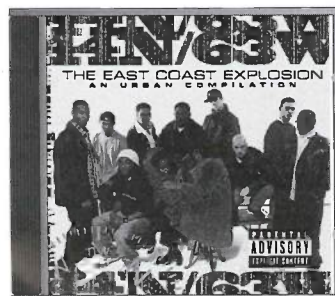
See The Light and the cover of While My Guitar Gently Weeps, Healey's career has essentially gone into hibernation, with he and his fellow bandmates more concerned with managing other artists (Amanda Marshall most notably). It would be unfair to dub this one a comeback, but that description isn't too far off the mark. The material here is typical Healey - entirely routine blues/rock stuff punctuated by ubiquitous guitar ventures and hearty vocals. Universal's actually released a couple of first singles - the standard rock radio tune Which One, and the Dianne Warren-penned ballad (!) I Tried - both of which are scoring decent radio adds, thanks largely to Healey's measurable track record. But tunes like Love Is The Answer, My Life Story, Holding On, I Should Have Told You or House Is Burning Down have a sameness and unflattering familiarity that's unlikely to impress those who have wavered on the sidelines over Healey's work. When he does delve into a more blues-oriented song, like Feel Better or Macon Georgia Blue, the results are definitely worth listening to. But on the whole, one wonders if this album might be five years too late. -RR

THE CROW: SALVATION O.S.T. - Rock

After the surprising success of the original movie, with the late Brandon Lee, The Crow has developed into something of a mini-industry, with a successful sequel, a television show, and two strong selling soundtracks featuring some high powered rock names. The newest film sounds like a rehash of the first



two, but the soundtrack sounds like a winner, featuring a slew of some of rock's nastiest players. Leading off is a remixed version of Filter's The Best Things, which will also be featured in an upcoming video. Rob Zombie contributes the Naked Exorcism Mix of the wonderfully titled Living Dead Girl, typical thrash-and-slash Zombie material. Kid Rock offers his usual trailer-park warmth in Warm Winter. The Infidels offer Bad Brother, featuring some meaningless wailing from off-pained actress Juliette Lewis. Courtney Love and Hole are also featured with a raunchy cover of Bob Dylan's It's All Over Now Baby Blue. Stabbing Westward have one of the finer cuts with Waking Up Beside You (Forgotten By The World Mix). Monster Magnet (Big God), Days Of The New (Independent Slaves) and Danzig (Underbelly Of The Beast) are three more considerable names lending their talents to this soundtrack. The kind of music to curl up in front of the fire and roast marshmallows with. -RR

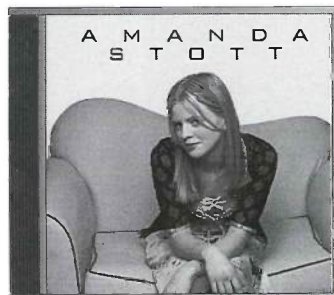
While 44N/66W may indicate Halifax's geographical coordinates, the twelve groups/artists showcased here are sure to place Nova Scotia's rap and R&B scene on Canada's musical map. The album is a testament to the breadth of talent that exists in this country. And it features twelve tracks: all recorded in Halifax;

ten co-produced by SoulFingaz and 2 Rude (JUNO Awards 2000 Winner - R&B/Soul). Almost all the artist are newcomers with the exception of R&B crooner Jamie Sparks, who released an album two years ago. On the mid-tempo Unforgettable, Jamie displays his confident, smooth R&B vocals. Another R&B 'must listen to' is I'm Feeling You by Zander featuring rap by Shy Luv, two very vocally dexterous MCs. Shy Love also display their versatility on Playa For Life and Kaspas's Bounce To This. Switching to rap, the opening cut East Coast Buttaz with Classified/Joran/Flexman is Naughty By Nature-ish, sports witty lyrics and has crossover potential. M.I.C.S. by Bonsah is ready to rock the clubs this spring. Although producer 2 Rude admits that it took only six days to complete ten songs, the production and the skill displayed highlights the vast potential of untapped talent. And after the amount of noise the ECMA's made, it is no surprise that this type of album comes out of Halifax. -TS



GROOVE ESSENTIALS 2000 - R&B/Soul

Welcome to the rebirth of Groove Essentials. This new and improved compilation rises from the ashes of the former wholly-Canadian package, now showcasing local up-and-comers alongside established, international heavyweights. It is a solid mix of Quiet Storm styled soul. Speaking of heavyweights: No! Barry White is not present. However, Deborah Cox (September), Usher (Nice & Slow), Tyrese (Sweet Lady), R. Kelly (If I Could Turn Back The Hands Of Time), and Faith Evans (Lately), should soothe the fans and excite retailers. Also exciting are the established, domestic offerings: Glen Lewis (Too Much), Wade O. Brown (I Want It All Back), Carlos Morgan (Watcha Got), and Divine Earth Essence (Without You) - with its Millie Jackson-ish rap. They speak volumes of the maturity of the individuals and of the genre in this market. Newcomers include Bliss, Ora (Juno 2000 nominee in the R&B/Soul category), and Meesah. The Groove Essential recipe shows the possibilities, both for commercial success and for widespread exposure of domestic R&B/Soul artists. Fans of the genre will surely have an opportunity to sample future stars. -TS



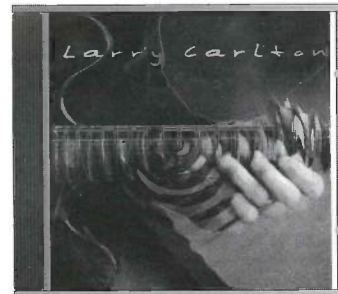
AMANDA STOTT - Country

Get this: "Wide-open fields of golden canola and periwinkle flax, an endless blue sky uninterrupted by any of those silly mountains, and magnificent prairie sunsets ... and then there's that voice. The clear unmistakable voice that rises amidst the grain elevators, gravel roads and unyielding rolls of land. The voice of Amanda Stott." And if that ain't singing the praises of Cancon country, my name ain't Johnny Canuck. It would be unfair to pigeon-hole Stott's vocal talent to that "prairie sound." Surprisingly, she does have a very persuasive,

free spirit, non-conformist vocal identity. Surprising, in that Stott is a 17-year old daughter of a Brandon, Manitoba farmer ... a little bit of fluff ... the age being the only important factor. There's no MAPL logo displayed, which makes it a little difficult when it comes to determining Cancon, which is still a major factor for radio programmers. All tracks however, are at least two-parts Cancon: (A) for Artist and (P) for production. The album was produced by Tom McKillip, using the facilities of the Tragically Hip's Bathhouse Studio in Bath, Ontario, with mixing and overdubs done at MR&D studios in Burnaby, BC. Black Is Black, the first single taken from the album, hit hard on release and continues to bullet up the RPM Country 100 (#23). The song was written by Even Stevens, Scott Miller and Nikki Hassman. Also key is You're Not Alone, written by Canadian west coasters, Ron Irving and David Pickell and don't overlook I Just Believe That I Can, penned by Irving and McKillip. Jason McCoy's name pops up as one of the writers of Magic as does Steve Wilkinson who co-wrote All Along and Lisa Brokop contributed to the team of writers on To Keep From Missing You and He Loves Me Like That, which are also key. Songwriter material aside, it's Stott's tonal quality and projection that lights the fire. -WG

LARRY CARLTON - Gentle Jazz
Finger Prints

When Jimmy Webb wrote Gentle On My Mind he might well have been thinking about music as heard here. guitarist Larry Carlton plays his own songs -- some of them to his own arrangements -- in a gentle persuasion of rhythm and melody. Is it great jazz? Are the compositions great? Only time will tell. What's definite at present and on the evidence here,



is that he's an excellent guitarist whose artistry shines through in understatement. Some of the younger crop of guitarists coming up now could do well to learn from a master that understatement is better than showy displays of technical dexterity. Till I Hurt You features a Michael McDonald vocal and Gracias is a guitar duet with Vince Gill. Good album to be enjoyed late at night with a final brandy and a superb cigar for obligatory smoke rings. -BW

THE WILKINSONS - Country
Here And Now

Originally from the Belleville/Trenton area of Ontario and now living in Nashville, this family unit, papa Steve and children Amanda and Tyler, have experienced a phenomenal trip up the charts on both sides of the border and into country music history in a short two years since they released their debut album, Nothing But Love. The album has sold more than 50,000 copies in Canada. Interesting too is that they have sold more than half a million singles at a time when the singles market is not considered a factor, but it should be. In any event, this, their follow-up album continues with that "sweet harmony and fresh-scrubbed image," perhaps a bit more "grewed up," which is probably why



country programmers latched quickly onto Jimmy's Got A Girlfriend, the first single taken from the album. The song was co-written by Lonestar's Richie McDonald with Anthony Smith and Ron Harbin and features Amanda and Tyler on lead vocals. Another hot track is It Was Only A Kiss with Amanda on lead vocals. The song was written by Amanda and Tyler with pop writer Robin Wiley who has written for 'N Sync. There are no MAPL logos to identify what is and what's not. The album however, should be taken on its own merit and should be programmed for what's in the grooves which should parlay out as a big winner at both radio and retail. Also key is the Charlie Craig/Rob Crosby penning of Don't Look At Me Like That with Tyler on lead vocals and the barnburning The Only Rose, which Steve Wilkinson wrote with Steve Wariner and that's the elder Wilkinson doing the lead vocals with Wariner on harmony vocal, a must for a single release. Produced by Doug Johnson, Russ Zavitson and Tony Haselden. As an added bonus this release is an enhanced CD with high definition videos, four-colour photographs and Fan Club information. **-WG**

AUDRA McDONALD - Pop

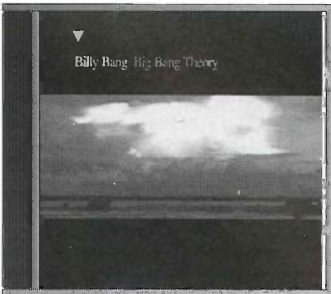
Most singers would sell their souls for Audra McDonald's problem; that of a voice so rich and phrasing so precise that a listener hears



the singer not the song. On 14 tracks, the three-time Tony winner performs pieces mostly from Broadway musicals -- some well known, others not -- and triumphs over them all. In other words and fewer words, she could sing the Altoona, P.A. Yellow Pages directory and one would enjoy hearing her do so. She's an incredible talent and this is an album of lasting contentment. **-BW**

BILLY BANG - Jazz

Jazz violinist Billy Bang's chief influence and inspiration is Stuff Smith and it shows. The latter dismissed the playing of his contemporary, Joe Venuti, as "very pretty" but not pushed to the limit. Bang plays jazz violin with a clear affection for what he's doing but what it is, lacks melodic line and requisite swing as it pushes musical parameters. What's heard here is more or less standard progressive mod and the violin as lead instrument seems incidental. It could just as easily have been sax

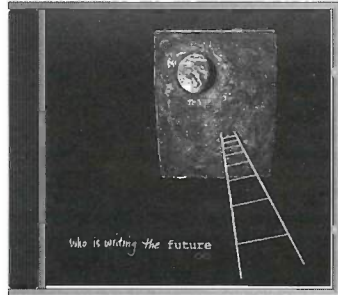


or even trumpet. The true star of the sessions is pianist Curtis Lundy who delivers marvellous line without distracting from a supposed nominal role as part of the rhythm support. Good enough album one supposes but we still prefer Venuti. **-BW**

JACK LENZ - World Music

Pretty heavy stuff from "philosopher" Jack Lenz, formerly from Eston, Saskatchewan and now based in Toronto. We use the "philosopher"

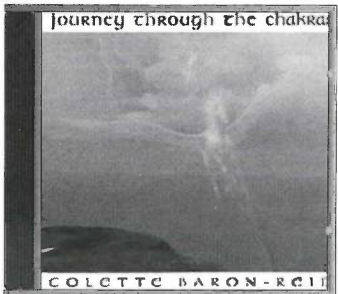
tag with much respect, as you will witness yourself as you begin this trip with Lenz who has gathered an impressive support group: Michael White (trumpet), Ron Allen (flutes, saxophones), Kevan McKenzie (percussion, drums), David Pilch (bass), Guido Basso (flugelhorn) and Dutch Robinson and Sheree Jeacocke (back-up vocals). Also of note is guest vocalist Christopher Rouse in his first solo performance and what a beautiful job he does on Father and Daughter. Lenz, who is heard on lead vocals on all the other tracks, was the keyboardist on the session which was recorded at Toronto's Slamm Recording Studio.



He also wrote all the material with the exception of Promises Kept and Seventh Heaven Instrumental, which were written by McKenzie and Jeacocke and Past Roads Travelled, a solo write by McKenzie. There's a haunting, almost spiritual effect that Lenz projects with his soft and almost petulant vocal reverence that goes straight for the jugular with his song message. Those messages are the basis of which Lenz translates as "It is not enough to consider questions of metaphysical importance but also how we will progress towards a truly inspired and harmonious world civilization based on good principles of justice, unity and peace." The message aside, the renderings are flawlessly programmed to impact immediately. Lenz and McKenzie produced. **-WG**

COLETTE BARON-REID - Esoterica
Journey Through The Chakras

As a self help to meditate upon one's Chakras the album might or might not be effective. As a



musical offering, it's quite soothing and even seductive. Miss Baron-Reid's voice is firmly feminine like that of the original Lonesome Gal on long ago late night radio and the orchestral music borders on the lushly exotic. The truth is however, and we don't mean it unkindly, that it's like the suspense music on TV's Who Wants To Be A Millionaire? Like many of the show's contestants, we're bowing out on this one. Final ansuh. **-BW**

GREG OSBY - Jazz

Blue Note-7243 20134-F

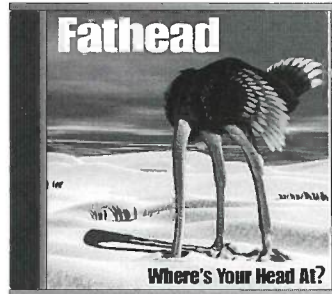
The promo copy confirms what we've long felt to be the case, that "Greg Osby is incapable



of hewing to the status quo." Fair enough except that his music should be enjoyed by listeners, not just himself. Yes, we know the argument about an artist vis-a-vis a performer but have never accepted it. If a musical offering doesn't please an audience then all the appreciation in the world can't make it palatable. On this, his ninth Blue Note recording, the alto saxophonist/clarinetist fronts for elder statesmen Andrew Hill (piano) and Jim Hall (guitar) with Gary Thomas on flute and tenor sax and a rhythm section playing a mix of originals and standards. Had he stuck to originals he might have pulled it all off. When however, he essays standards his musicianship is displayed for all to recognize as mere showboating. As one case in point we offer his treatment of Fats Waller's Jitterbug Waltz which is "deconstructed" beyond all recognition. Mind you, Hill once commented, "I can't see limiting myself to one harmonic or rhythmic conception." Why the deuce not ... if one is playing for an audience that wishes to be entertained, not held captive to an artist proclaiming a possible genius recognizable only to himself? He and Mr. Osby are well paired. Dammittaltohell, what ever happened to the concept of melody? That's the same question that was asked of Sauter-Finnegan half a century ago. Isn't anyone out there listening? **-BW**

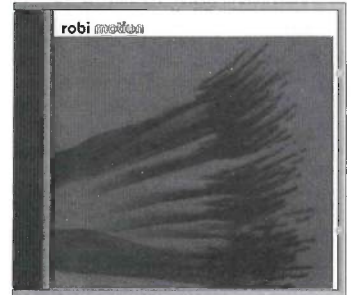

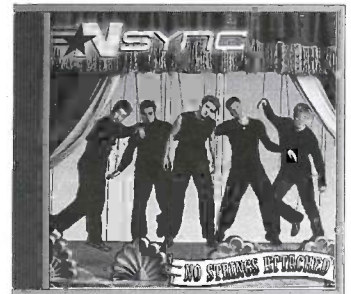


unique approach. The trio's intros are sheer genius which, on the first track, Uneasy, raises a little trepidation as to what's coming. But then, the impact is immediate and from there on in, becomes a very pleasant introduction to their own brand of rock. Bar band comes to mind, but not in any way negative. Their type of music would sit well with an appreciative concert-type audience. The vocals border on surrealism and, when planted on top of their sometimes seering rock forays, become very interesting, not to mention entertaining. Levy wrote all the material, and it's difficult to pick a favourite, they're all that good with clever layering of vocals onto the instrumental tracks. There's no intrusion, a real marriage of opposites that create positives. Patch into Weaker Animal first and the trip becomes a journey. The same with Who Are You Now, Something For Nothing and Hide. Ride It Out, taken as the first single is also a gem. Recorded at the Rehearsal Factory in Toronto and Ben's (Huxley) apartment. A cross-Canada tour is being planned for the sun months. **-WG**

ALBUM PICK

***N SYNC** -Pop
No Strings Attached

The real deep thinkers out there might look at the lyrics to "N Sync's huge lead single, Bye, Bye, Bye, and read something altogether different into it. Although the song is ostensibly about a guy parting ways with his girl, it's easy to see how some might interpret it differently. Case in point is the chorus: "Don't wanna be a fool for you/Just another player in your game for two/You may hate but it ain't no lie/Baby bye bye/Bye bye/Don't really wanna make it tough/I just wanna tell you that I had enough/It might sound crazy but it ain't no lie/Baby bye bye bye." Now those who followed those lengthy legal wranglings might construe that as a parting shot at their former manager, but that's probably a little too extreme. You might say that the accompanying video, showing the five guys acting like puppets on strings, until those strings are finally cut, is another outgoing shot. And finally, you could also look at the title track ("Take it from me/It's a lesson to be learned/Even the good guys get burned"), and deem that it, too, is a slag at their former management. But hey, that would be over-reaching just a tad, wouldn't it? As for the album, it's clear that "N Sync are aiming for a slightly more uptempo, street-oriented sound than their new labelmates, the Backstreet Boys, eschewing the more mainstream pop sound of their contemporaries. The aforementioned Bye Bye Bye is obviously tailor-made for CHR, as is It's Gonna Be Me (both were co-written by hot hitmaker Andreas Carlsson), but after that, the songs are more in tune with dance, rather than CHR, radio. Space Cowboy is a perfect example, with its borderline silly chorus ("Why-yi-yi-yippie-yi-yay-yippie-yi-yo-yippie-yi-yay!") and a rapping appearance from TLC's Lisa 'Left Eye' Lopes. The beat goes on with a revved up cover of Johnny Kemp's R&B '80s hit Just Got Paid, the She'kspere-produced It Makes Me Ill, the dance-worthy title track, the computerized Digital Get Down, and Bringin' Da Noise. The group does slow down a couple of times: the Richard Marx penning of This I Promise You is an obvious AC choice, as is the Diane Warren ballad That's When I'll Stop Loving You. And the album concludes with an acapella track, I Thought She Knew, written by Robin Wiley. Given the huge numbers this album's already putting up, that "N Sync/Backstreet Boys rivalry should be in full bloom. **-RR**

deserve any recognition under any circumstances, and especially it should not be aired publicly on any airwaves. I believe that the staff of all radio and television outlets, if they are responsible and caring community citizens, should ignore this disturbing piece of music and remove it from playlists. I urge every person aware of this insulting song which trivializes killing to assist in achieving this goal. Please speak out, advise others and contact the offending stations and request that they refrain from playing such disturbing music." (signed) R.M. (Bob) Poley.

Brent Brooks, Program Director at CKGY Red Deer, Alberta, answers the above letter: "Bob, I commend you on taking a stand on your beliefs, but it seems to me you're trying to shoot the messenger. Why do you think Earl is being heard on the radio and being seen on CMT? It's a hit, according to radio industry charts, which reflect radio airplay which is determined by listener requests and CD sales. Not to mention it has been one of our five most requested songs for the past three weeks. To say any station that plays the song or that the Chicks themselves 'condones and supports the murder of men' is ludicrous. In your description of the song's content, you forget to mention that Earl regularly abused his wife, ignored a restraining order and put her in intensive care. In the liner notes of the CD the Chicks in fact say they do not advocate premeditated murder. You might also be interested to know the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence fully supports the song and video. The fact that the song and video are presented in a light hearted manner is supposed to ensure people such as yourself don't take it too seriously. I think you put it best in your opening line: 'I have never been ... a fuddy-duddy, nor a grumpy old man -- until now!' The song simply says what most people, including myself, think when they learn a man is abusing a woman. If this song makes

one man think twice about raising his hand towards his wife, girlfriend or daughter, it's worth a few complaints. The Dixie Chicks and the song's writer, Denis Linde, have accomplished what they set out

to do ... pro or con, we're talking about a very serious issue that people like yourself seem to want to turn a blind eye to." (signed) Brent Brooks

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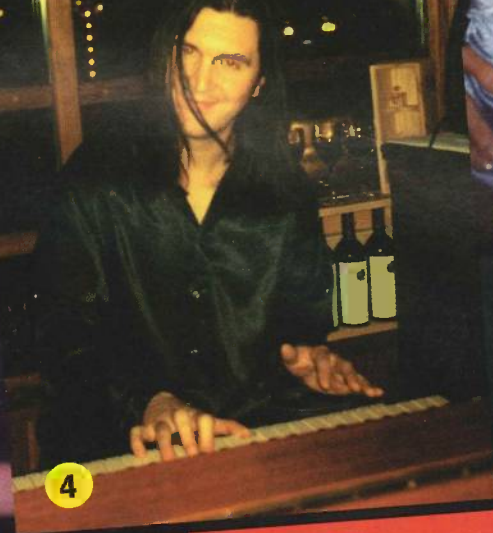
