GROUP NEWS

The Dickens haven't broken up. They're still playing New York, and from reports received here, have been happening in a large way in and around the Village.

The Magic Cycle now have an organist. His name, Pete Young, formerly with Who In The Blazes. You can catch this well put together little group at the Aurora Arena Oct. 27, and over in Monctowne, Ont. Oct. 28. The group have just put the finishing touches on their next record release.

Winnipeg's Guess Who are really flying with their just released Quality single "Flying On The Ground". This will also be released in the U.S. on the Fontana label. If you want a good look at this top unit, look in on the Thursday television show "Let's Go" (CBC-TV) at 5:30 PM. They recorded several Coke commercials last September and these should be coming your way soon. November 10 has them on the same bill with The Jefferson Airplane in Fargo, North Dakota and with the JA in Winnipeg at a later date. The Guess Who are booked exclusively by Trans Continental Promotions Ltd., out of Winnipeg.

Joe Vargo's favourite groups, The Checkerlads and Tomorrow's Keepsake (formerly The White Nights) are chartbound again. The Lads have just released their RCA Victor single "My Time Is Comin'" and "Behind Every Man". The Keepsake also look good with "High And Mighty" and "Eat Your Hot Dog, Boy". Another of Vargo's hot groups, the 49th Parallel will be heading into Upper Canada soon to make an appearance on the "It's Happening" show and to cut a couple of Coke commercials. Their RCA Victor outing "Labourer" is just now beginning to move down the charts after a long run.

Too bad the CTV and CBC-TV folks won't take advantage of the Toronto presence of some of Canada's top western groups. Vancouver's greatest, The Nocturnals will be in the Toronto area for several weeks.

Their booking agents, Dram, out of Kitchener have set up a whole squad of dates for this great recording team. Their Trans World single "Uptown" is out and I've already heard a couple of stations giving it a spin.

Another great western Canadian group that was in Toronto recently and completely ignored by the television crowd was The Midnight Angels, from The Pas, which is about a million miles north of Winnipeg. They were in town with their manager Melvin Metzner and from what I hear they cut one of the best sessions ever recorded at Sound Canada. The CBC was Johnny-on-the-spot though. "Action Set" found time to give these visitors a big welcome and an interview which will be heard from coast to coast in the next few weeks. That "Action Set" is a real powerhouse in this country. From the few mentions they've made about RPM, the enquiries from all across Canada have been astounding.

There's a new group on the horizon, and they're from Hamilton. They're called The Deep End. Not too much information available on them as yet, but I did manage to get a photo of them. They'll be cutting as session soon.

Not many of Toronto's Village groups are lasting, but one that is not only lasting but getting stronger is The Private Collection. They'll be releasing a single soon, and these guys are the original originals, and one of the first Toronto groups to lay on the vocal bit. That's the new trend.

Hamilton's great underground group The Soul Society didn't happen at Toronto's Coliseum as reported in RPM last week. Otis Redding cancelled out because of a throat ailment, and the show is reported to have been put over to another date. Meanwhile, if you hear of The Soul Society and Bobby Washington playing in your area, catch their act.

Ottawa is a town that's really happening with the "sound" scene. There's so much happening down there that Ian Connerty will be filling us in on the Ottawa happening, beginning next week.

The Stampeders are one Canadian group to keep your eye on. They've been around so long, almost everyone who is anyone in the business knows them, and likes them, mainly because they never put another group or artist down and they're always such a happy looking group. Their long awaited record is out on their own label, Music World Creations, and it could happen for them. Watch "Morning Magic".

THIS WEEK WE ANALYZE "THE 100"

It is interesting to analyse the top 100 records from time to time to find out what kind of music is selling. As of Oct. 15th. (and using the RPM 100 as a guide) I came up with the following figures that might interest you.

25% of the chart items are R&B or heavily R&B oriented. This figure has been approximately in that area for the past 6 months and only fluctuates slightly. Of this 25%, 8% of the singles are by groups, 7% by male vocalists, 6% by female vocalists and 4% by male female duos.

Rock groups (or rock oriented groups - the "pop" sound) hold down a very large 47% of the chart. So practically every other current hit is by a "rock group".

Solo vocalists only command 18% of the action and the distribution is 15% boys, 3% girls. Girls just aren't making it alone. Duos hold 3% with male duos 2% and female duos 1%.

Stars who are equally known for TV or movie work hold down 4% of the chart and it's 50-50 guys and gals.

Don't release an instrument, the odds are 98% against it getting on the top 100.

Only one country oriented single shows up to give country music 1% of the 100 single market.

In the final analysis, it looks like groups have it and boy singers. The odds are highest if you fit into one or the other of these categories.

If you are a gal, join a group. You will have an easier time of it. If you are a group, play rock. It sells. Vocals are all important.

I thought you might like to study these figures more closely, so below is a chart of the current trends. It might help you to choose your bag today (but who knows about tomorrow?)



CKFH "NOW" SOUND - 24 HOUR OPERATION

Toronto: CKFH has received another boost in its bid to take over the reins of Toronto's teenage listening market. Ethnic, religion and all the solid pay every week shows, have been thrown out the window, and 'FH has thrown its big gun, Big "G" Walters into the prime time from 7 to 10 PM (Oct. 16). Kenny Wells, a very Dave Mickie sounding cat will take Walter's old spot 10 PM to 1 AM and hand the what's hoped for large audience over to John Donabie, who grooves to 6 AM. Don Daynard moves the morning crowd to work. (6-10 AM); Dan O'Neil has the housewives and noon hour crowd well in hand (10 AM-3 PM) and Tom Fulton has a good share of the after school crowd and the homeward bound listeners (3-7 PM).

BOB KAPP - NEW PERSONALITY AT CJKL-CJTT

Kirkland Lake, Ont: Bob (Bob Bell) Kapp moves in from London, Ontario to take over the morning show at CJKL and CJTT

EIGHT POINT FIVE WAX FOR JET

Bathurst, N.B: The Eight Point Five (formerly The Generation) have just completed their first recording session for Jet Records. Denis Menard, well known CKBC radio personality sat in on the session and predicts a big one for the group, at least in their own area. "Mr. Casey's Mail Order Bride" and "Were We Wrong", both originals by the group, will be released in approximately 3 weeks.

"GERUSSI" - A TALE OF TWO CITIES (Ottawa-Toronto)

Toronto: Bruno Gerussi, well known Canadian actor bows his own CBC Monday-to-Friday radio show Oct. 30 at 10:30 AM EST. The program to be carried by CBL in Toronto and CBO in Ottawa will deal with people and events in the two cities. He'll guest important political and social figures from the both cities and also move into the Canadian drama and entertainment field, by reading poetry by Sarah Sissons, the poet of Toronto's "Cabbagetown" slum area, among other contributors and will also spotlight Canadian music. Regular contributors to his show include: Andrew Allan, distinguished director-actor-writer, who will review films and books; Mike Magee, a rather caustic quick-witted type who will comment on the world scene; Ma Murray, a Gordon Sinclair in skirts type journalist. Ma is tabbed the "legendary journalist of the Cariboo" and apparently she has been a bit of a shocker to readers of The Bridge River-Lillooet News for many years. B.C. expatriates will find her interesting.

BRIAN BAKER - ROCKS AT CHOW

Welland, Ont: New teen type personality at CHOW is Brian Baker, who takes over the 7 to Midnite spot. His show, "The Bakers Dozen" features C-HOW's SoundSurvey and Top 13 tunes.

BRUCE BERRIE'S "KISS THE WIND" FEATURED ON RCA VICTOR'S "1967 CBC SONG MARKET" ALBUM

Toronto: Bruce Berrie, the 22 year old Prince George, B.C. contractor, who picked up first prize (\$2000) in the CBC's "1967 Songfest" has had

his entry featured on the RCA Victor Canada International album release, "1967 CBC Song Market" (PCS-1175). Billy Van supplies the necessities to the Berrie tune. Other contestants have had their entries given the professional touch by well known Canadian artists including Tommy Ambrose, Jim Pirie, Cleone Duncan, Vanda King, Ian Smith, Norma Locke, Rhonda Silver, The Laurie Bower Singers and Ken Steele.

BOB BACON TAKES UP DUTIES AS ASSISTANT MANAGER CKNB

Campbellton, N.B: Bob Bacon, after a leave of absence from the radio scene returns as assistant manager, production manager, program director, and chief announcer ("they have a small budget", he notes) at CKNB. Their new format is more MOT with much emphasis on Canadian talent, (15% to 20%) thanks to the Canadian Talent Library and those Canadian record companies supplying releases to the station. Other additions to the station are Graham Wylie, formerly of CJCH Halifax and Rod Butcher who will take up duties as music director. Paul Ahier is the managing director of the operation.

TOM FULTON

SPEAKS OUT

In the latter part of September, I was relaxing in a central Ontario resort area. Radio reception was excellent. I was able to pick up a good many radio stations, major and minor, in Southern Ontario. It gave me a chance to listen to the small towns and compare them to the larger stations that I'm more familiar with. I'm sorry that I bothered. Without exception the announcers were immature inept kids, devoid of professionalism in any form.

I could go on for pages about how rotten their delivery was, and how marked their speech defects were, and how inane their chatter was, and how they should all try some other line of work. I could go on for pages, but I won't, because these kids in Southern Ontario, and for that matter in rural areas all across Canada, are not to blame. THEY ARE NOT TO BLAME. The fact is, the entire Canadian radio industry is to blame. Radio is one of the only industries to demand no formal nor on the job training from its workers. ANY KID can walk into a radio station and get a job. Sure he can, if he's willing to work for the lowest wages in Canada, work some of the longest hours, and have the least job security. And, as you know, there are five of these kids waiting to fill each available job. Radio stations can set up a revolving door policy without any fear of running out of applicants. Unless the novice has the innate talent to develop and improve himself, he's doomed to low wages; and all the other things that I've described earlier. You don't have to have been in the business very long to realize that for every announcer making over \$300 a week there are one hundred announcers making \$70.00 a week or less.

A lot of the kids who are now slugging it out for low wages in small towns, sustaining themselves with visions of someday becoming a big city "star", would do far better if they learned another trade. Like welding or plumbing. The average welder and plumber makes far more

"THE O'KEEFE CENTRE PRESENTS" OPENS NEW DOOR FOR CANADIAN TELEVISION

Toronto: Not since Breweries replaced corks with caps has their been such a happening in the froth business with the venturing into the big showbiz of the O'Keefe Brewing Company. The first of their "Presents" series is off and apparently well received. "The Rock Scene, Like It Is", with Dionne Warwick, Sergio Mendez and Brazil '66, The Jefferson Airplane, The Doors and Eric Andersen was exceedingly well hosted by Noel Harrison, and probably just got under the door of teenage interest. That rock scene has moved into "what it was". Nevertheless, it was a well put together and exciting 60 minutes, particularly the second half. With a price tag of around \$150,000.00 per show, it puts our producers, namely Bob Jarvis, of this show, up with the top producers of the world, insofar as freedom of expense is concerned and could attract the foreign dollars and even bring back some of the Canadian expatriates. In any event it will keep the cream of the Canadian producers in Canada, if the trend continues.


The CBC however, still suffers from the inferiority press complex. At a pre-screening of segments of what was to come in the "O'Keefe Centre Presents", they shied away from showing the real explosion of the rock scene (The Jefferson Airplane and Doors), and preferred to appease the rather dowdy press lineup with Sergio Mendez '66 and Dionne Warwick, and then concentrated on Harry Belafonte, George Burns and Shirley Bassey all of whom are generally accepted by the adult viewer. The latter three are to follow with shows of their own.

There will be six of these hour long shows through the fall and winter months (one per month). The next showing will be that of Harry Belafonte, and from what has been seen already, Belafonte has never looked better. If they're selling the series individually, this one will probably attract more buyers. The Belafonte show is set for Nov 23 at 8:00 PM EST. A colour set adds about \$125,000.00 to the viewing enjoyment.

Toronto: CFTO-TV arranged for an exclusive television interview with U.S. Senator Robert F. Kennedy, which was skedded for CTV's Public Affairs programme "W-5", Sunday, Oct. 22 at 10:00 PM EDT. Kennedy, who recently topped the Gallup Presidential Polls in the U.S. was interviewed by Telegram Publisher Mr. John Bassett, who centred Kennedy on many of the controversial points of U.S. political and social issues including the Vietnam conflict. The Senator was in Toronto with the New York Rangers, as part of their cheering section for their game with Toronto (21) and was also expected to attend the Argo's, Ottawa game (22).


A 13 million dollar purchase of a name U.S. record company is rumoured. The dough is Canadian. They must have money. Their latest promotion piece was the end.

than the average announcer will ever earn. And that's a fact of life Bunky. All the glory and ego-satisfaction in the world isn't going to put bread on your table when your responsibilities widen.

If you are working as an announcer in a city with a population under 100,000, (and don't bother counting the "market area",) you'd better do some tall thinking. Examine the opportunities in the announce field. Especially in the D.J. field. You'll find out that the odds against your success are staggering. But don't give up hope.

There are many areas of broadcasting that the average young announcer just isn't interested in. News, sports, writing, sales, promotion, music, programming and production are only a few. In fact if you're just starting, or thinking of starting, a career in radio, consider all the possibilities. You may find the way easier, more rewarding, and faster if you don't limit yourself to being "the greatest D.J. the world has ever seen".

Perhaps, if you're interested, we'll explore ways to "break" into radio, and methods of advancing your career, in future issues of RPM.

CBC'S "GOOD 'N' COUNTRY - NOW ALL CANADIAN


