It's pop music quiz time . . . put up your hand if you remember Chad Allan. If your hand isn't up, shame on you. Chad Allan was one of the pioneers of pop music in Canada. Here's a little background to jog your lagging memory.

There was once a High School band in Winnipeg called Al and The Silvertones and they made a record entitled "A Tribute to Buddy Holly" on the Canadian American label around 1960. Then came a group known as Chad Allan and the Reflections, later changed to Chad Allan and the Expressions, who made quite a stir internationally with "Shakin' All Over". Is it beginning to come back?

As a promo idea the group took the name Guess Who? and by this time you're putting two and two together and saying "oh, that Chad Allan!" Yes, and that Chad Allan eventually left the Guess Who in 1966 and their story is known to most people. Chad's story is not.

Chad Allan went back to University and through the years from '66 to '73 he earned his BSc and BA degrees and was well on his way to his MA. Along with his studies he did a lot CBC-TV work and live performing around the Winnipeg pub scene. He worked in the chorus of Music Hop and became host of the show in 1968. The Guess Who became the

CRIA ISSUES STATEMENT ON CAN CONTENT REGULATIONS

An October 16/73 meeting of the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) centred around recent press reports indicating that the CRIA "were preparing to seek a reduction or an end to the content regulations". This report was flatly denied by the CRIA (RPM 13/10/73). Out of this meeting came the following press report which is reprinted herewith in its entirety.

"The Canadian Recording Industry Association believes that the CRTC Canadian content regulations for radio broadcasters has been a positive step in attaining regular broadcast exposure for Canadian recording talent.

"The recording industry in Canada has historically worked closely with the broadcast industry - each growing with the aid of the other and each equally aware of the need to encourage the development and growth of the creation and performance of Canadian music.

"The CRIA feels that a regular channel of communication should be established among the recording industry, the broadcast industry and the CRTC, so that all three parties may communicate more effectively on an issue that calls for a creative need to be balanced with the economic reality.

"The reality is that most original Canadian recordings do not recover their costs based on sales in Canada. It is with this thought that, while the CRIA fully supports the premise of Canadian content regulations, it believes that consideration must be given to the qualitative aspects of the content regulations before any quantitative changes are contemplated.

The Association looks forward to establishing a mutually rewarding line of communication between themselves, the radio broadcast industry and the CRTC."

CONSUMERS SPENDING MORE, DOUBLE LPs UP

Consumers are spending more per album in the record store these days and sales of double albums are at an all-time high. Recent operating cost increases in retail stores have trimmed discount margins on Toronto's Yonge Street Strip to about \$1.50 on a \$6.29 list price. The average price now paid by consumers for new product in Canada's main retail record street is \$4.79 for a \$6.29 album. In smaller centres, there are even some reports of retailers leaving all discounting behind and selling product for the recommended list.

"Price doesn't matter to the rock consumer anymore," was one retailer's comment. "If a kid comes in with \$20 he doesn't know whether he'll get four or three albums, he just knows he has \$20 and can spend it all."

Much of the time, he may buy a double album with a list price from \$12 to \$14 (which might be sold on Yonge Street for \$9.98). Resistance to high price tags doesn't stop Leon Live, Deep Purple Made in Japan, Beatles Gold or Elton John's new album from selling their way into the top ten.

RITCHIE YORKE DEPARTS CANADA

Ritchie Yorke, one of the most controversial writers in the history of the Canadian music industry and the one who gave the industry a conscience, has announced his retirement from the Canadian music scene. He will shortly move his base of operation to London, England.

After a tenure of six years, Yorke has resigned his position as Canadian editor of *Billboard Magazine*, the longest of any locally-based representatives of that international publication. It was because of Yorke that *Billboard* became aware of the Canadian record industry and instigated their now annual *Spotlight on Canada*.

Although not representing the Canadian music industry, it was Yorke who appeared before the Canadian Radio-Television Commission and voiced his opinion for the creation of a Canadian content ruling. It was because of this that he was tagged "the enemy" and became the object of a very smooth plot well calculated to discredit and finally destroy his credibility. It was also Yorke who influenced the powerful Canadian Record Manufacturers Association (now known as The Canadian Recording Industry Association) to back his proposal of a *Maple Music Junket*, which resulted in thousands of Europeans becoming familiar with Canadian recording artists. Yorke's endeavour in this regard was never fully recognized.

Continuing to tell it like he saw it, Yorke blew the minds of many in the industry with his book, "Axes, Chops and Hot Licks" (Hurtig, 1971), the only book of its kind ever published in Canada. Again - more enemies and more ammunition for the propaganda machine.

Yorke had always been of the opinion that to integrate Canadian music, artists etc., with their foreign counterparts, would bring

LIGHTHOUSE/FLYING CIRCUS PLAY MAJOR AMERICAN TOUR

Since September 21, Lighthouse and Flying Circus have been involved in an extensive tour south of the border covering 18 concert dates so far in Maine, Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Kentucky and Wisconsin.

The tour continues until November with dates in Manhattan, Kansas (October 16 & 17); Des Moines, Iowa (18-20); Bettendorf, Iowa (22 & 23); Pittfield, Massachusetts (24); Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (25); Washington, D.C. (26); Emmitsburg, Maryland (27); Ruston, Louisiana (November 2); Baton Rouge, Louisiana (3); Lafayette, Louisiana (4); Monroe, Louisiana (8) and Arkadelphia, Arkansas (9).

This tour comes about as a result of the success generated by a previous tour of Western Canada by the two bands last year.

Capitol Records is now rush-releasing the third Flying Circus album to coincide with as much of the tour as possible. The album, entitled "Last Laugh" will be the first of the band's three albums to be released in the U.S.

much more attention to the Canadian domestic scene. His opportunity came with Procol Harum. Yorke arranged for this popular British group to record a "live" album with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra, released on A&M and one which qualified as Canadian content.

Ritchie Yorke was an established reading habit for Canadians, Americans, Britishers, and many others to whom he was bringing home the message of the Canadian record industry. It was because of those endeavours that he was awarded a Juno Award as Canadian Music Journalist of the Year '71 in March of 1972. He has also performed services as a special consultant to various federal government agencies regarding the Canadian music industry since 1970.

Yorke carried his Canadian banner into the consumer field as well. He was a highly regarded staff writer for the *Toronto Globe and Mail*, Canada's national newspaper; and the now defunct *Toronto Telegram*. He also contributed to *Miss Chatelaine*, *RPM Weekly*, *The Montreal Star*, *The Music Scene*, *Canadian Composer*, *The Canadian*, *Grapevine*, *Rainbow* and many others, many through syndication.

With several wide-ranging projects in the works, Yorke will concentrate on a novel set in the international rock music scene - for which he has received a Canada Council grant. He will also be concentrating on a number of American and British markets, to be announced at a later date. He has apparently considered several firm writing offers in New York and Los Angeles before deciding to relocate in London.

Yorke will continue his ties with Canada, to a lesser degree, through syndicated columns on the world rock scene to be carried by the *Ottawa Journal*, *Winnipeg Free Press*, *Saskatoon Star-Phoenix* and others. He will also contribute to a network of newspapers and magazines on four continents. These will include the *New Music Express* (UK), *Music Life* (Japan), *Zoo World*, *Phonograph Record*, *Fusion*, the *Los Angeles Free Press*, *Boston Globe*, *Houston Pose*, *Sono Control*, *Mundo Joven* (Spain), *Muziek Express* (Holland), *Suosikki* (Finland), *Go-Set* (Australia) and others.

Born in Australia, Yorke arrived in Canada with his wife in July 1967. He will be accompanied to Europe by his wife Annette and two year old daughter Samantha.

FIRST U.A. ALBUM FOR DAVID WIFFEN DUE SOON

The long awaited David Wiffen album, his first for United Artists, is scheduled for release, both in Canada and the U.S. next week. The album, "Coast to Coast Fever" was produced by Bruce Cockburn and recorded at Thunder and Eastern Sounds in Toronto, and contains ten tunes, seven of which are Wiffen compositions.

Wiffen is much respected as a songwriter with such people as Anne Murray, Tom Rush, Eric Anderson, Ian & Sylvia and Jerry Jeff Walker recording his material. The new Roger McGuinn Album for Columbia features Wiffen's "Drivin' Wheel" while the most recent Harry Belafonte set includes a song called "Mr. Wiffen".

During the past 12 years David Wiffen the performer has amassed a large following of devoted fans throughout North America as well as gaining the respect of many of his peers in the music industry.

Heavy promotional plans are now being formulated at U.A. for the album and a tour of Eastern Canada has been set starting in mid-October.

MCA PREVIEWS NEW ELTON JOHN ALBUM — OCTOBER 9

MCA Records hosted their first in a proposed series of festive evenings being cleverly billed as "Progressive Music Lovers Symposiums" and centering attention around a new MCA album release, this time it being the already gold, soon to be platinum, standard "Good-bye Yellow Brick Road" by Reg Dwight. Dwight is the young chap who runs around in platform boots and spaced-out sunglasses under the stage name of one Elton John.

The October 9th event was attended by a jovial crowd of people from various record companies, radio stations and music publications who ate sandwiches, drank some wine and listened to the fine two record set in the comfortable screening room at the MCA Building. There's no need in speculating on the success of this album, other than to say that it will invariably turn out to be one of the biggest hits of this year. The material on the albums could have been edited down to make one sensational record, and though the package as a whole is good, some of the selections tend to lag. The jacket artwork is terrific.

Also included in MCA's "Progressive Music Lovers Symposium One" was a screening of the Universal motion picture, "American Graffiti", a film that takes you back to 1962 and lets you spend an evening with a bunch of typical teenagers as they cruise around in beautiful, souped-up cars, and most of all listen to music. The film was put together by a heavyweight crew led by producer Francis Ford Coppola, who recently made

HORN BACKUP GROUP TO RELEASE ON COLUMBIA

Parmitar (rare bird), the backup group to Paul Horn, have been set for a single release on the Columbia label. The single, "Vancouver" was produced by Horn for VIP Ltd.

An album, also produced by Horn will follow the single release.

Horn, an internationally-known jazz flautist, now makes his home in Vancouver and helped popularize jazz through his BCTV series. He has released album product on Rada and lately on the Columbia label. Production took place at Can-Base Studios in Vancouver.

"The Godfather"; director George Lucas, who made "THX-1138" and director of photography Haskell Wexler, whose credits list "Medium Cool".

"American Graffiti" is a lot of things . . . it's fun, it's very accurate in details concerning dress and automobiles, but most of all it's music. All of the music is predominantly contained in the background only rising in level periodically for special impact. The radio is always being played by the kids as they go about their night of adventures listening to the Wolfman Jack show. The double album soundtrack of the film, though distributed by MCA in the States, is being handled by GRT Records here in Canada.

The evening was the baby of MCA's National Promotion Manager Scott Richards, aided by Jeff Burns, Gabriella Moltovanye, Debbie Graham, Glenda Richards, Randy Sharrard, Dave Holman, Leo DeRocher and Alex Downey who all pitched in acting as hosts and hostesses making the evening a very enjoyable success.

The next "Progressive Music Lovers Symposium" will be held to preview the forthcoming double album set by the Who.

TRUE NORTH RELEASES COCKBURN/MILLS-COCKELL

Just released about a week ago were two new albums on the True North label. Bruce Cockburn has done his fourth for the label entitled "Night Vision", which features some beautiful cover artwork. The jacket folds out and forms one complete picture that is a reproduction of an Alex Colville painting done in 1954.

This True North release continues with John Mills-Cockell's "Heartbeat" and again this album has an interesting sleeve designed and photographed by Bart Schoales. Mills-Cockell was one of the members of Syrinx and happens to be one of the foremost virtuosos of the synthesizer and one of the pioneers of contemporary electronic music.

The third True North album from Murray McLauchlan is expected out the first week in November, while his follow up single to "Farmer's Song", "Hurricane of Change" is beginning to take off in many markets.

Negotiations are underway for a new Luke Gibson album, though everything is still in the planning and discussion stages at this time.

McLAUCHLAN SINGLE BREAKS NATIONALLY

With "Farmer's Song" his necessary catapult into the contemporary rock market, True North's Murray McLauchlan has been afforded almost instant "hitdom" for his newest release "Hurricane Of Change". The day of release, Columbia's Ontario promo rep, Mike Watson took to the road and within a couple of days covered most of the major and breakout markets in Ontario. The plum of the market, Toronto, first heard McLauchlan through CFTR. Their music director Paul Godfrey programmed the single on receipt. CKOC's Nevin Grant gave the record instant airing and established McLauchlan in that market.

Charlie Camilleri, national promo for Columbia, mustered his network of promotion reps and at time of writing, most major and breakout contemporary rock stations are now airing and charting the single. Gil Audy, who looks after Columbia promotion in Quebec, received a warm reception at the powerful French language CKAC in Montreal as well as at CJFM and CFCF. The record was charted at CKWS and CKL in Kingston and is expected to receive a number at CHUM/Toronto, CJCH/Halifax, CHLO/St. Thomas, CKCK/Regina, CHED/Edmonton, CKXL/Calgary as well as at CKLG and CFUN in Vancouver.

Camilleri used his trip to Nashville to hype the McLauchlan single to Epic and Columbia people as well as to visiting jocks. No news, at time to writing as to a U.S. release, although on the basis of the initial success of "Farmer's Song", it's expected that a release is imminent.

COUNTRY MUSIC ASSOC. TO NEW HEADQUARTERS

Because of the growth of the Country Music Association in the past several years, plans for a move into a new building in 1974 are underway.

CMA has been headquartered in the lower level of the Country Music Hall of Fame building, which they have shared with the Country Music Foundation staff since 1966.

Since that time the CMA membership and staff have doubled in size. The Country Music Foundation has also increased their staff and is in need of space for the many donations of records, books, tapes and display items made to the Museum and Library.

CMA will occupy the entire first floor of the new, two-story structure, with the second floor to be leased to other tenants yet to be announced. The building, which contains 14,000 square feet, will be of mirrored glass exterior and a projected completion date for the complex is set for mid-March of next year.

The new building is one of several under construction in the Music Row area, including the City Executive Building, the Hall of Fame Motor Inn and Spence Manor. Broadcast Music Inc. is presently tripling its existing floor space. With other buildings in the planning, stages, the growth of Country Music is evident along Music Row.

GAVIN PICK FOR A&M'S DICKENS

A&M's most recent Canadian single release, "America's Super Hero" by Dickens (AMX 354) received the following comment in Bill Gavin's Canadian Special (12/10/73) "Driving and colorful instrumental track. Record probably should be serviced to stations with a lyric sheet — it's hard to understand at first hearing."

The single, now shipped across Canada, was produced by David Kastle for Big Eye Productions, with both sides Kastle originals published through Almo Music of Canada Ltd., and Ashbury House (CAPAC). The flip, "You're The President" was produced at Ben McPeck's Captain Audio studios with the plug side taped at Eastern Sound.

Kastle, an employee of Concept 376, has been a part of the domestic music scene for the past few years having released product, as a group member, on RCA and Warner Bros.

MARATHON'S MAPLE STREET HEAD FOR MUSIC CITY USA

Marathon recording artists, Maple Street are heading south of the border to Nashville for a week long stint at Boots Randolph's Carousel Club, October 29 to November 3.

Ronnie Prophet, who has a lifetime contract at the club, gave the nod to Maple Street when that week became available, after seeing the band and being impressed by them when they guested on his CBC summer series "Country Roads".

While in Music City, Maple Street will also be appearing on the syndicated Porter Wagoner and Dolly Parton television series, as well as WSM's Ernest Tubbs Show.

Earlier on the October agenda of the band was a recording session at Eastern Sound in Toronto.

GOOD NOISE SHIPS FIRST ALBUM RELEASE

The initial album release from the newly formed Good Noise label, held up for some time by certain paper stock shortages, has now been shipped coinciding with a big consumer level promotion campaign. The album is the debut set for Montreal-based progressive rock band Man Made and features a very distinctive cover illustration by Italian artist Fornisetti. A reproduction of the jacket artwork has been printed on a special stock paper suitable for framing and included in every album.

Posters, T-shirts and stickers bearing the artwork have been prepared for special distribution to high schools and discotheques as well as to the usual record centres. This, coupled with in-store promotion, radio spots and print ads are aiming the advertising at the consumer directly, on a street level.

A schedule of radio-television interviews and album reviews is presently being coordinated in Toronto, Montreal and Quebec City to coincide with the release.

EDWARD, HARDING & McLEAN TOP RATING FROM N.E.C.

The National Entertainment Conference, in its recent Newsletter, has given top marks in their evaluation to Canada's Edward, Harding & McLean. The Artists and Agency Evaluation chart gives the highest possible evaluation (15) to the trio for Cooperation and Attitude, Showmanship and Professionalism, Audience Reaction, Drawing Power, Musical Accomplishment, Arrival, etc.

The N.E.C. based in Columbia, South California, is the largest U.S. campus entertainment catalogue, listing Canadian and American groups and their availability. Also listed in the current issue are The Stampeders, Gordon Lightfoot, Jason, and Abraham's Children.

Several Canadian colleges and universities are members of the N.E.C. with yearly membership listed at \$75.00. The N.E. C. will be holding their 1974 National Convention in Houston, Texas from February 2nd through the 6th. It's expected that representatives from more than five hundred universities and colleges will be on hand for the Convention during which upwards of thirty-three groups will be showcased for the buyers. Edward, Harding and McLean are apparently high on the list for selection.

"BETWEEN FRIENDS" A NEW CANADIAN FILM

Director Don Shebib's latest feature effort, "Between Friends" will premiere in Toronto, October 12th, at the Imperial One. This is Shebib's third outing, it follows the heady success of "Goin' Down The Road" and the youth-oriented "Rip-off".

Product for Canada was shipped Oct. 16 which should give the A&M promo network a good head start in bringing the record home in Canada.

Hampshire is also receiving heavy radio play in Australia where his "First Cut" deck has now reached the No. 5 spot in Brisbane after 5 weeks on the chart. It is also in the top 15 on 2SM Sydney, regarded as the most powerful contemporary rock station in Australia.



FOOTPRINT RECEIVES GOOD CANADIAN/U.S. HEARING

Footprint Productions, a Toronto-based firm, have been encouraged by the response to their production of "The Elton John Story". Prior to modification by Footprint for syndication throughout North America, the Elton John Story was brought about through the efforts of Roger Scott, an English broadcaster formerly with CFOX in Montreal. It is through Scott that Footprint hope to have a European release for their Rolling Stones docu. This has been held up temporarily through the issuance of writs against two producers of documentaries on the Stones. Footprint are also negotiating with Scott for a feature documentary on The Who.

The Elton John Story has now been contracted to CJOM/Windsor, CJBK/London, CKLC/Kingston, CKOC/Hamilton, CKRC/Winnipeg, CJON/St. John's; CHED/Edmonton, and CKLG-FM/Vancouver. Several U.S. stations and Australian stations have also picked up on the story including KOL, KOOL-FM, WZZQ, WNCR, 3XY, 2SM, 4PR and The BBC.

It was during RPM's recent Big Country Music Meet that Footprint were able to establish strong contacts with executives from the broadcast and record industries, for their own production, "The Country Side". The package is twenty-six one-hour documentaries on an equal number of the biggest names in country music and is an entirely Canadian venture. Artist interviews

SINGLES SLOWED DOWN TO A TRICKLE

The sales of single records in Canada are running at their lowest levels in quite some time because of a two-month disruption in retail marketing caused by numerous factors. Orders being placed with many rackers are turning up only half-filled at the retail store and in turn, rackers report back ordering on many new titles at the manufacturer level.

The rail strike of September is credited with part of the problem, along with continuing paper and vinyl shortages in some areas that are now beginning to hurt. With advance American radio station mailings continuing as before, the gap between first airplay and first 45rpm stock into stores is now running at approximately one month for all labels. There are some exceptions as manufacturers attempt to adjust production schedules to fit. This involves deciding which album and single product in the forthcoming release should be pressed in depth or pressed first in the run and which should have a trial pressing only.

The shortages now seem to be easing somewhat but record companies are still being

forced to do some allocating and forecasting instead of the former policy of "press big on everything and we'll see what sticks to the wall." Similarly, retailers have to watch closely those back ordered singles which may well have died by the time stock becomes available. But there seems no solution to recovering the profits lost when a retailer has to say "sorry, but we don't have those records in stock yet." The inevitable result of continuing slowdowns and material shortages would appear to be an upward push on both wholesale and retail record prices, though no announcements linking increases directly with shortages has yet been made.

The tour continues on to Ottawa, Ontario (October 28 - 30); The University of Sherbrooke, Quebec (31); Hamilton, Ontario (November 2); London (3); Windsor (4); Winnipeg, Manitoba (6-7); Calgary, Alberta, (9-10); Edmonton (12-13) and Vancouver, B.C. (15-17).

Coinciding with the tour is a major promo campaign being carried out by Polydor Ltd. in support of Miss Mathieu's new album "Disque D'Or".





regular band for the show, which evolved through many phases as "Let's Go" and then "Where It's At".

About this time Chad was working on his MA and for one year he was teaching assistant in psychology at the University of Manitoba. He packed in his formal studies halfway through his masters and was contacted by Randy Bachman, another ex-Guess Who member. Together they formed Brave Belt and recorded two albums over the next two years. Chad left Brave Belt and decided to start his solo career. His present GRT album was begun in June 1972 and took one year to finish. He wrote produced and paid for the album himself and just recently closed the deal with GRT Records. Both Chad Allan and GRT are happy with the arrangement and are optimistic about the first solo venture.

Now you've been brought up to date on Chad Allan and you're probably wondering why he left two bands which are now either extremely successful (like the Guess Who) or are on their way to success (like Bachman-Turner Overdrive, formerly Brave Belt). Chad Allan is a very laid back, easy-going kind of a guy, but at the same time an extreme individualist who has his own ideas, goals and directions. He'd just rather be his own man and produce his own music. His experiences as being part of a number of groups only helped to reinforce his singularity.

This singularity is exemplified on his solo album, entitled "Sequel". To be extremely general, it is a collection of ten very easy ballads that could easily fit into many radio formats. To be specific, the album is an expression of Chad Allan, the solo artist as opposed to Chad Allan the member of a group.

ACTION CONTINUES IN RCA'S STUDIOS



Gordon Sinclair makes news in U.S.

A June 5th comment by CFRB's Gordon Sinclair, entitled "America's Generosity" has become reading and listening fare for thousands of Americans. Sinclair's secretary (Miss) Pat Morse is in the habit of answering requests for reprints of Sinclair comments and hadn't attached too much significance to this one in particular until just recently when she found her file bulging with requests from almost every state in the Union. She attributes the snowballing effect to the many listeners Sinclair has in Buffalo, plus Americans living in the Toronto area and to Toronto listeners who had passed the comment on to their American friends.

Bill Gavin, the prophet of the U.S. record/broadcast industry, received a copy of the comment from Tess Russell of KNPC Los Angeles. Apparently the morning man, Dick

Whittinghill read the comment to his listeners advising that if they would like a copy to mail their request to the station. Tess has, to date, mailed more than a thousand copies to the Los Angeles area.

RPM received permission to reprint Sinclair's comment from Miss Morse, which follows:

"The United States dollar took another pounding on German, French and British exchanges this morning, hitting the lowest point ever known in West Germany.

"It has declined there by 41 percent since 1971 and this Canadian thinks it is time to speak up for the Americans as the most generous and possibly the least appreciated people in all the earth.

"As long as sixty years ago, when I first started to read newspapers, I read of floods on the Yellow River and the Yangtze. Who rushed in with men and money to help? The Americans did.

"They have helped control floods on the Nile, the Amazon, the Ganges and Niger.

"Today the rich bottomland of the Mississippi is underwater and no foreign land has sent a dollar to help.

"Germany, Japan and to a lesser extent Britain and Italy, were lifted out of the debris of war by the Americans who poured in billions of dollars and forgave other billions in debts.

"None of these countries is today paying even the interest on its remaining debts to the United States.

.... "When distant cities are hit by earthquake it is the United States that hurries in

to help . . . Managua, Nicaragua, is one of the most recent examples. So far this spring, 59 American communities have been flattened by tornadoes. Nobody has helped.

"The Marshall Plan, the Truman Policy, all pumped billions upon billions of dollars into discouraged countries. Now newspapers in those countries are writing about the decadent war mongering Americans.

.... "Why does no other land on earth even consider putting a man or woman on the moon?

"You talk about Japanese technocracy and you get radios. You talk about German technocracy and you get automobiles.

"You talk about American technocracy and you find men on the moon, not once but several times . . . and safely home again.

"You talk about scandals and the Americans put theirs right in the store window for everybody to look at.

.... "When the Americans get out of this bind . . . as they will . . . who could blame them if they said the Hell with the rest of the world. Let someone else buy the Israel bonds. Let someone else build or repair foreign dams or design foreign buildings that won't shake apart in earthquakes.

"When the railways of France, Germany and India were breaking down through age, it was the Americans who rebuilt them. When the Pennsylvania Railroad and the New York Central went broke, nobody loaned them an old caboose. Both are still broke.

"I can name to you 5,000 times when the Americans raced to the help of other people in trouble.

"Can you name me even one time when someone else raced to the Americans in trouble?

.... "Our neighbors have faced it alone and I'm one Canadian who is damned tired of hearing them kicked around. They will come out of this thing with their flag high. And when they do, they are entitled to thumb their nose at the lands that are gloating over their present troubles.

"I hope Canada is not one of these.

.... "And finally the American Red Cross was told at its 48th annual meeting in New Orleans this morning that it was broke.

"This year's disasters . . . with the year less than half over . . . has taken it all and nobody has helped."

CKFH TORONTO ADDS WOLFMAN ON WEEKENDS

The newest air personality at Toronto "solid gold" station CKFH is Wolfman Jack. Jack, who is one of the United States' biggest syndicated radio personalities, began his CKFH scheduling on the October 12 weekend. He is to run from 10PM to midnight Friday through Sundays, or immediately following NHL Hockey if there is a game on the Saturday or Sunday.

Wolfman Jack's show is contemporary, with about 60% gold content, but it is WJ's personality and voice that make the program such an audience grabber. The program is quite artist-oriented, as WJ explains aspects of music or plays artist sets (new and old record back-to-back). On his initial CKFH weekend, the show aired a half-hour of the Rolling Stones.

Music director Mike Byford also confirmed a format adjustment at CKFH designed to get more 1955-62 era music on the air. Two records per hour must be pulled from this category, or more at the jock's discretion. The extra "fifties rock" has pulled extensive phone appreciation from listeners.

The personality lineup at CKFH is Mal Faris 6-11AM; Steve Harringer 11AM-3PM; Dick Joseph 3-7PM and Tom Kelly 7-midnight. Midnight to six is "uninterrupted music radio" with an operator.

Byford mentions three hot Canadian singles that he feels are equal in quality of production to any American releases. He says the Ian Thomas, Lighthouse and Gary & Dave singles fit nicely in his current programming.

CHUM LTD. TO BUY CFRW AM/FM WINNIPEG

Toronto-based broadcast chain CHUM Ltd. has announced the purchase of two Winnipeg radio stations, CFRW AM and FM from present owner Jim Pattison Broadcasting. The transfer must be approved by the Canadian Radio-Television Commission before completion.

The sale would leave Jim Pattison Broadcasting with only CJOR Vancouver while expanding CHUM Ltd. holding to eight radio stations and 50% of a ninth (CKPT Peterborough). CHUM Ltd. controls at present CHUM AM/FM Toronto, CJCH Halifax, CFRA/CFMO-FM Ottawa, and CFUN Vancouver. The company also has extensive television holdings.

CRTC's FM hearings start next week

The Canadian Radio-Television Commission has an enormously complex task ahead of it . . . deciding on regulations for FM radio. And advocates of a "loose" policy have been getting more vocal lately in an attempt to fight off rules that might be too restrictive. One scene that they hope to make the CRTC aware of is the rise of American Top 40 FM in Canada.

The situation has developed only within the last year, but is very significant. Top 40 FM formats from the U.S.A. are growing at an unprecedented rate in their ability to attract Canadian listeners. The stations are all that the CRTC dislikes in radio: concentrated repetition of the same "hits", screaming deejays who say next to nothing, and so on. The only difference is that the singles are all stereo and that the stations have ratings punch.

In Toronto, WGRQ-FM Buffalo is now a force to be reckoned with. American AM rock stations have little audience in the city, since Canadian AMers are clearer. But any good component stereo brings you a clear WGRQ signal, and they have all the hits (and in stereo), with far fewer commercials than Canadian Top 40 stations. No Canadian FM station is playing 24-hour-per-day hits the way the Buffalo station is, and listener-ship, though now quite small, is definitely

on the increase. Similarly, WDRQ-FM Detroit blankets the southwestern tip of Ontario and WCKF-FM Erie is listened to in London and Lake Erie areas. Not every Canadian has access to these stations but up to 50% live close enough to the border to receive one.

Is it good to restrict Canadian FM radio with many rules when American FM, unrestricted by the same rules, can flood the same area? Technical agreements on FM between Canada and the U.S. are largely dormant, and American stations are free to increase wattages and take prime frequencies, with little or no recourse available to Canadians to prevent it.

The above argument certainly adds credibility to those who urge swifter licencing of FM channels. "We've got to occupy those FM frequencies before the Americans do," they say, and it isn't all alarmism. The FCC has been granting about thirty FM applications PER WEEK of late, giving new licences, approving frequency changes and awarding increased power. On the other hand, the CRTC deals with barely one or two FM matters per MONTH.

Top 40 on FM is just beginning in the States, but already many broadcasters there say it is the big news for radio in the seventies. The CRTC should be aware of the success pattern and realize that most Canadians (especially in the three biggest markets) now have, or will have, a U.S. Top 40 FM station on their dials, next to all the Canadian ones. So far, the Americans have been attracting growing

audiences, and the drain on Canadian stations is likely to become much more apparent in the next few years. (Actually, everything here applies equally to "wall-to-wall beautiful music" stations too - Canadians turn to U.S. FMers for this type of programming if it isn't available in Canada.)

I'm not defending the Top 40 format as it is usually practised by most broadcasters on the lowest common denominator level. But it is something for the CRTC to ponder, this fact that many Canadians feel that contemporary music has more to say to them than any other type. Maybe the CRTC should be looking at ways to upgrade this type of radio instead of attacking it so violently. Because the simple fact is that many, many Canadians prefer contemporary radio to other forms. And they like it just as well on FM as on AM, Canadian or American, where it is available. Because, to the listener, it is "just radio".

Taking "what the listeners want" into account is supposed to be part of the CRTC's duty in developing new FM rules. The only problem is, very few listeners of the average variety ever communicate with the CRTC; most are unaware that new FM regulations are even under discussion. The CRTC also refused to accept BBM balloting as an adequate reflection of what the public desires on radio.

But the public must be heard from sooner or later. Hopefully, the CRTC will find ways of dealing with American FM competition and the public desire for contemporary music on radio. The Commission has a big task ahead in coming to terms with these problems. Next week's FM public hearing in Ottawa is just the start of that task.

FALL HIGHLIGHTS ON CJRT-FM

While the political game for the licence of CJRT-FM Toronto continues, the Ryerson radio station is into the start of another season. Although the credit course "Open College" is missing this year, the station boasts of three informal (non-credit) educational offerings.

"The History of Opera" is presented by well-known educator and conductor Dr. Boyd Neel and receives three repeats weekly. "Canadian Government and Politics" is presented by Professor Ronald Blair and also airs thrice weekly. And "German Lessons" has begun in a continuation of last year's "Familie Baumann" series.

Other new programs on CJRT-FM include "Festival 1973", which brings major European music festivals to Toronto airwaves. And the speeches from the Canadian Club and Empire Club are back on Tuesday and Friday afternoons.

Matrix 4-channel listeners can enjoy their new equipment when CJRT presents the Boston Symphony Orchestra each Sunday evening using this quadrophonic format.

"Morrow: The London Years" is a CJRT highlight for four Sundays in October. The fading, crackling shortwave sound of Ed Murrow's CBS voice intoning "This . . . is London" was familiar to thousands of North Americans as the bearer of news from war-torn Europe. The series was written and produced by John Twomey and includes a selection of Murrow's broadcasts from London to America up to 1946.

CHAM ADDS ARTIST SHOWCASE TO SUNDAY

CHAM, the Rogers radio station in Hamilton, has announced the addition of a new program designed to feature interviews and music with some of the biggest names in Canadian and international pop music. Called the "Wayne Dion Show", the program is to run Sunday evenings beginning in mid-November.

The hour-long show features singles and album cuts from the artist, who is interviewed by CHAM's Wayne Dion. With Dion's background as a newspaper pop columnist and radio entertainment broadcaster, CHAM feels the series will bring an "insider" viewpoint to the pop music world. Confirmed already for the initial two tapings are Ronnie Hawkins and Crowbar, with subsequent weeks tentatively including Murray McLachlan, Bruce Cockburn and Yoko Ono.

Before moving Dion to the prime-time evening hours of Sunday, CHAM has featured him in a half-hour length Sundays at 8AM, more or less as a shakedown run. Guests so far on this segment have included Ken Tobias, Tony Kosinec, The Bells and The Downchild Blues Band.

Interviews for the Ken Dion Show will be conducted in Hamilton, Toronto and New York City. Rogers Radio is exploring the possibilities of syndicating the program to interested Canadian broadcasters.

Q BROADCASTING SUMMONED BY CRTC

Vancouver-based company Q Broadcasting has been summoned by the Canadian Radio-Television Commission to appear before it at the November 26 Toronto public hearing. The CRTC indicated it wished to review with the company the ownership and control of the company following the upheaval at the May 25, 1973 board meeting. At that meeting it was reported that Bill Bellman, founder of and largest shareholder in Q, had been voted off the board by the other directors. Bellman subsequently negotiated with Allan Slaight of Toronto for the sale of the Bellman shares in the company.

The November hearing will allow the CRTC to see who is now controlling Q Broadcasting, licensee of CHQM AM/FM Vancouver and CKPG AM/TV Prince George.



CAPAC: Canada's first Performing Right Society

CAPAC's most important job is the collection of licence fees for the public performance of music, and the distribution of that money to the composers, lyricists and publishers whose works have been played. CAPAC's been doing this since 1925.

The test of a performing right society is its performance on behalf of its members, and the members of affiliated societies it also serves. Here's how CAPAC's been doing over the past five years:

CAPAC, of course, collects and distributes performing right royalties for foreign composers whose works are played in Canada – and that's where a share of the money we receive goes. On the other hand, CAPAC is receiving a growing income each year from foreign societies, in payment for our members' works being played abroad.

The figures above demonstrate two important things: 1) The benefits that result from the fact that CAPAC is the only performing right organization owned and run in Canada, by its own members, and 2) that CAPAC is always prepared to back up its claims with complete information.
