
Motown Records of Canada, Ltd. has now established offices in Toronto under the direction of Mr. Ron Newman who will carry the title of managing director. The new office/warehouse complex is located at 1960 Ellesmere Road in Scarborough.

The above announcement was made by Mr. E.G. Abner, president of Motown Records.

Newman is no stranger to Motown product (they've dropped the Tamla) having been associated with Phonodisc Ltd., Canadian licensee of Motown product, in the early sixties. He was later appointed to management at Motown's Detroit headquarters, a position he held until taking over as president of Stereodyne (Canada) in 1971.

In making the above announcement Abner stated: "This is a very exciting move for Motown and we are extremely proud to open our own company in what we consider to be one of the most promising markets in the world. Ron Newman joins us with a strong Motown background and with an excitement and energy that matches ours in this new venture. We look forward to our making great strides immediately in Canada with our product from the United States as well as Canadian product, an area we plan to develop."

MUSIMART READIES RELEASE OF CANADIAN DISC PRODUCT

Musimart Ltd., a Montreal-based independent record importer and distributor since 1947, have launched a new label — Sting Records. Jack Inhaber, director of marketing and sales for Musimart, expects first product by the latter part of March. Sting will concentrate on Canadian content and will work closely with independent producers "with track records", according to Inhaber.

The label's national promotion director, Mike Kordupel, will shortly launch a national campaign for the initial release — comprised of three singles.

Musimart have had much success in Canada with the Fantasy label, picking up Canadian Gold with such artists as Creedence Clearwater Revival. Fantasy are apparently screening Sting's new masters for possible U.S. distribution.

GREENWOOD APPOINTED TO SMILE PROMOTION

Calvin Greenwood has been appointed promotion representative for the Toronto-based Smile Records.

A founding member and bass player for the City Muffin Boys as well as supplying bass



and conga for Canadian recording sessions, Greenwood has also chalked up an impressive list of credits on the Canadian film and television scene. One of his most recent television film accomplishments was a two hour feature "Bringing Back The Future", a documentary on the Rastafarian Society in Jamaica. Also featured was a special on Peruvian Indian Music. Both films were televised by the CBC-TV Network.

Prior to his appointment to Smile, Greenwood was associated with Sunrise Films.

LYNN JONES BACK ON RECORD SCENE

Lynn Jones, one of the most popular of Canadian country singers, has returned to the disc fold with her Arpeggio single, "I Love Your Kind Of Lovin'", a Tony Hatch composition which brings the Jones talent into the realm of the pop programmer. The Arpeggio single was produced by Gary Buck at RCA's Toronto studios with John Arpin looking after arrangements. The single is expected to be followed by an album shortly.



A very popular club performer Ms. Jones has kept up a hectic schedule of dates and has even managed several television appearances, including Global's "Cliff Edwards Show". She was also a regular on George Hamilton IV's CHCH-TV (Hamilton) show this past season as well as appearances on The Family Brown's "Country Way" (Ottawa), Ray Griff's "Good Time Country", another Global production and "Country-time", the CBC summer replacement for "The Tommy Hunter Show".

Ms. Jones is managed by David Peever who has offices in Mississauga, Ontario.

MIDDLETON & GALLANT HUSTLE FOR COLUMBIA

Terry McGee, Columbia's Ontario promo rep, has been kept busy with television, press and general promotion for the label's Patsy Gallant and Tom Middleton.

Middleton, fresh from his successful concert tour through Western Canada, lent himself to a couple of days of promotion in Toronto (4-5) that included taping CFTR's "Sunday & Friends", a collage of interviews with music, and reintroducing himself to music directors in the area. He moved on to Montreal where he taped a segment for Cliff Edwards' new Global TVer. Middleton's current single, "One More Chance" has been receiving a fair hearing across the country, influencing sales on his album release, "It Wouldn't Have Made Any Difference".

Patsy Gallant, currently on release with her single, "Save The Last Dance For Me" culled from her "Power" album, flew into Toronto (5) for two tapings of Global's "Everything Goes" as well as a taping of CFTR's "Friends". The first Global show was televised Mar. 8 with the second set for the 25th.

SHAW SCORES A FIRST WITH STREAKER SINGLE

With the "streaker" fever fast catching on, Mel Shaw has scored a first on the record front with the release of a hard rocking streaker single.

Shaw took a group of trans-planted Jamaicans into RCA's Toronto Studios the morning of March 10 — Quality's George Struth heard the rough cut at noon and signed the group immediately. A new label, Orion, was designed that afternoon and a new group, Shine, emerged this week with what could be a "streaker" hit.

Entitled, "Streaking Left, Streaking Right", the song was written by group member Lloyd Lovindeer through MJS-BMI. Several "streaker" singles are now being rush released in the U.S. including a couple by radio stations but Shaw would appear to be the first with a Canadian "streaker".

HASEK TAKES A SOLO TRIP

Michal Hasek, a Toronto folk cum rock singer of sorts, has sidestepped the many disappointments of "not interested" from record company A&R people and produced, packaged and released a single and an album on his own NAJA label. His album has been given a favourable review by Toronto critics and he is presently pitching his follow-up single, "Strange Man".



This recording bit with Hasek has been almost an obsession, and two years in the making. His accompanying press release notes: "Michal Hasek spent two years of his life recording, designing, publishing, mastering, pressing, quality controlling, promoting, releasing his album"

Getting an album or single off the ground in Toronto without the support of a major or very important independent record company hasn't met with too much success in the past but Hasek has experienced several surprisingly wide-open doors and he is selling product — in Toronto. The album is competitive with anything on the market and if promoted on a national scale could pave the way for this very talented young Canadian. 

Born in England, Hann makes his home in Vancouver where he has made a study of Canadian folklore — one of the reasons for his confident approach to recording. Both he and his co-writing partner Pete White have an extraordinary feel for the



music they write and Hann's interpretation on six and twelve string acoustic guitars and dobro supplies an air of elegance so necessary in catching the ear of first, the programmer and then the consumer.

Hann is presently touring Western Canada. He has played dates in Nelson, Castlegar, Calgary and Lethbridge. Coming up are Medicine Hat (13), Regina (14-15), Saskatoon (16-19) and Winnipeg (20-23).

Hann's previous touring netted him excellent notices. Edmonton Journal critics found him "a master of emotions, giving each song just what it needs to emphasize the subject, whether it is the predicament of a trapped coal-miner, a trapped lover, or whatever." Jeani Read in Vancouver's Province referred to Peter White's lyrics as having "a deadly accuracy of statement and a clean, economical expression of emotion, all beautifully sustained by the rough-gentle of Hann's voice". Alex MacGillivray, editor of Lively Arts (The Vancouver Sun) tagged Hann as being one

LONDON LAUNCHES HEAVY PROMOTION ON BURNS' DECK

Donny Burns, a very talented on-air personality at CKGM Montreal, could emerge over the next few weeks as a nationally-known recording artist. London's promotion and sales team, under Ken Verdoni, are now zeroing in on a national promotion that should bring the Burns' ditty home.

Verdoni is confident of breaking "Downtown Swampwater Swinger" (London M17466), a Burns original through Halben-CAPAC. Chart berths have already been secured at Montreal giants CJMS (28) and CKLM (31) with playlist action at CHOM-FM, CFCF, both in Montreal; CKCK/Regina, CFQC/Saskatoon and Edmonton's CFRN and CJCA.

The flip, "You Ain't Gettin Older You're Gettin' Better" was co-written by Burns and Richard Lightman.

London's product exploitation manager, Kenneth Verdoni, is also a believer in the Hann sound and is putting together a rather extensive national promotion campaign to back the album release. To bring more attention to the album, London will shortly release a single, "Perhaps In A Shadow", culled from the album. The plug side was co-written by Hann and White through Land: End Music-BMI.

ROYALTY RECORDS BUSY IN THE WEST

R. Harlan Smith's Royalty Records is one of the busiest places in the west this month. A new Wayne Vold single, "Loving You Losing You", a Smith composition, is now on release. In an effort to push the single, Vold is currently touring with the Ian Tyson Show. Prince George, B.C. native, Garry Fjellgaard, will make his album debut in the near future on Royalty with a set consisting entirely of self-compositions.

Edmonton jazz singer, "Big" Miller, will come forth with a change of pace, a "country/pop ballad", to be followed by a single and an album from Brian Sklar entitled "Alberta Land" and "Proudly Canadian, Proudly Country" respectively. Composers include Dick Damron, Gene McLellan, R. Harlan Smith and Sklar.

Meanwhile, Smith himself is on the road, touring Alberta before moving into the Ottawa Valley area and southern Ontario. A new single, "Momma Brown", from Smith's "I Remember Love" album, will be released by GRT immediately. A new album for GRT, scheduled for a fall 1974 release is now in the can.



tion. McFarland was former Ontario sales (branch) manager for London Records and prior to that was regional promotion manager for Phonodisc, supplying him a wide and varied knowledge of the recording business.

Taking on duties as operations manager is Don White. He was, until just recently, associated with Ampex Music of Canada. Ampex was Motown's licensee in Canada for the past three years.

Independent distributors for Motown (Canada) are now being firming by Newman and will be announced shortly, as well as the label's initial release. This will include singles, albums and tapes (cassette and 8-track).

There have been many changes in the structure of Motown since Newman's last association with the former Detroit-based label. Now headquartered in Los Angeles, Abner and Motown would appear to be placing much emphasis on the development of established and new artists, a healthy attitude now being broadened to include the Canadian market.

In taking over the directorship of the Canadian operation, Newman stated: "I am extremely proud to again be associated with Motown which has met with nothing but success since the company was founded. At the same time, I thank Mr. Abner and Motown for their confidence in me and welcome what has to be the most exciting and challenging event in my entire career. I have great confidence that Motown Records Canada Limited will become an integral part of the Canadian record scene in a meaningful way and in a very short period of time."

MCA Records has been experiencing considerable success with promotions run in conjunction with western radio stations. CKY, Winnipeg and MCA recently embarked on a tee shirt giveaway program which has proved so successful that plans are now afoot to extend the idea to all Moffat stations. The concept was engineered by MCA's Winnipeg-based promo rep, Jack Skelly.

In Edmonton, CHED has been meeting phenomenal success with its "Take a Chance and Win". Listeners phone to compete for complete sets of albums by Elton John, Cher, Buddy Holly and Rick Nelson. The promotion met with such response that CHED's Wayne Bryant recently approached MCA to double the number of sets available for give-away.

In Vancouver, CKWX and MCA combined forces to print up a series of posters featuring MCA artists Rick Nelson, Elton John and Cher, emblazoned with the MCA logo and the station's call letters. MCA supplied substantial numbers of albums for give-aways and co-operated in the establishment of a "Spin and Win" booth at both the Vancouver Home Show and the Boat Show.

According to the company's Barry Ryman, the promos have resulted in substantially increased action on MCA product.

Billy Fury, had a big hit of their own with "Telstar".

Al Hooper and his boys recently celebrated their tenth anniversary in the business with a well-turned out press party at the Cloverleaf Hotel in Toronto. McLean-Hunter Cable was on hand to tape an hour of the show to be televised at a later date.

Having gone through many changes - country, pop, folk, commercial rock, the Diamonds have their roots in country and this is where they have picked up most of their large following. They have released thirty-five albums over the years. They have recorded for Allied, Paragon, Marathon, Vintage, Dominion and are currently with Columbia, although Hooper is still under contract as a solo with Dominion. H.P. & Bell Management have been quietly concentrating on the promotion of their publishing arms Mediatrix, Hopo & Boco and H.P. & Bell Music. Latest signing has Skip Prokop's "I'd Be So Happy" (Mediatrix-BMI) as being picked up by Three Dog Night as their next single release. "Happy" was included on the "Sunny Days" album by Lighthouse. Also from Prokop through Mediatrix are internationally known hits such as "Pretty Lady", "One Fine Morning", "Sunny Days", and "You Girl".

Muzak, currently on a Canadian content trip, have selected several Mediatrix compositions including "Sunny Days", "I Just Wanna Be Your Friend", "1849", "One Fine Morning", "Hats Off", "Step Out On The Sea", "Take It Slow", and "You And Me". Bringing much attention to Mediatrix is the current success of the Lighthouse album and single entries of "Can You Feel It".

H.P. & Bell Music-CAPAC has registered good action with Bill King's "Wheel of Good Fortune" and they have also been advised that King's "Anthem" is to be recorded by the Chambers Brothers with release on the Columbia label.

Hopo & Boco-BMI looks good with action on the Bob McBride single, "Do It Right" and the Larry Smith single, "I'm Gonna Love You".

On tap is a single release by Em, a country artist with publishing through H.P. & Bell. His single, "Lay Me Down" on Capitol is to be followed by an album.

MCA TO DISTRIBUTE SHELTER IN CANADA

Shelter Records will now be distributed in Canada by MCA Records (Canada).

Initial release under the new deal will be a Leon Russell single, "If I Were A Carpenter", a Tim Hardin composition with new lyrics.

Album releases are now being scheduled for Russell, J.J. Cale, Phoebe Snow and Mary McCreary.

HOUKA OFF WITH TIM WILLIAMS COUNTRY SINGLE

Vancouver-based Houka Records have released a country single, "Careful Mountain Pony" by Tim Williams. The plug side was penned by Marc Strange, well-known Canadian television personality, through Ross Group Music-BMI.

The flip, "Leavin' You" is a Williams' original through Ross Group and Studebaker Music-BMI and is described as "Tim's own statement born of his own long experience of the country singers' lonely life on the unending road."

Williams is no stranger to the recording field. He was a studio sideman for country productions in Los Angeles for many years and released a solo album on the Epic label before moving to Canada a few years ago.

Houka are now planning a tour of Williams through Western Canada sometime this spring.

JOHNNY WINTER CONCERT

If Johnny Winter doesn't like Toronto, he should learn to because they love him. Gutsy, blarey, and hoarse, the lean Winter jogs out — and you feel it, through the floor and in the air. Winter and his group jolt through a few fast numbers including, from "Saints and Sinners", "Stone County", "Boney Maroni", and "Blinded by Love" which were hard and driving but showed little style in comparison to the work on the album. One of the most appreciated numbers and one that showed what Winter can do, was a lengthy blues tune. It seemed that Winters, with his group suffered, but alone he was radiant. So consequently he soloed once more on "Silver Train" but then that song tended to get repetitious. "Jumpin' Jack Flash", the most over-done concert number, brought back the life and had to be the show-stopper. Winter received three encores — "Johnny Be Good", "Stray Cat Blues" — also from "Saints and Sinners", and the third, indiscernible amidst the noise and confusion. I think a positive to the performance but to the disappointment of many, "Rock and Roll Hoochie Koo" was not played.

As for Brownsville Station, they should have stayed in the boys' room, generally unappreciated for their loudness and comments to the audience, although they did finish well with "Smokin' in the Boy's Room".

McDONALD & GLOVER APPOINTED TO AXIS

Brian McDonald and Patrick Glover have been appointed entertainment consultants to the Vancouver-based Axis Entertainment.

Glover has acquired much knowledge of the business through two years of managerial experience with Vancouver's Mr. Natural. McDonald is a former member of the popular west coast rock group, Sweeney Todd.

Axis Entertainment was formed in January of 1970 and has become one of Western Canada's largest booking agencies. The firm was founded by Barry Samuels, now in partnership with Bella Greenfield.

Acts represented by Axis include Teen Angel and The Rockin' Rebels of Hellroaring Records, currently touring Canada; Heart, being readied for a national tour; Sweeney Todd; and Mr. Natural plus sixteen other groups known throughout the B.C. province through club and one nighter dates.

Axis has also been booking dates for Susan Jacks, Paul Horn, Jayson Hoover and Tom Middleton. The firm is the west coast member of the newly formed Canadian National Booking Association.

TOURING AND RECORDING KEEPING CHILDREN BUSY

Using the theme "Children should be seen and heard", United Artists have launched a national campaign to bring attention to Abraham's Children, setting the pace for their new single and album. The single, "Rockin' In The City", is a group penning and was produced by Paul Gross at Toronto Sound.

The United Artists sales and promotion crews are now thoroughly Children oriented through the success of the group's first effort for the label, "Goddess Of Nature".

The single, released in November of last year has just completed ten very successful weeks on the RPM Singles Chart. During this release the Children tied-in a tour of the Atlantic Provinces that proved a solid record sales getter.

Currently touring Western Canada, the group are reportedly experiencing good houses which should improve when their new single is shipped. They have already filled dates at the Marigold Inn (Regina) after which they embarked on a healthy run of one nighters. These will include: the University of Saskatchewan/Saskatoon (17), North Battleford (18), St. Albert/Alberta (19), Mount Royal College/Calgary (21), Lethbridge (22), Edmonton (23), Kimberly/B.C. (25), Rocky Mountain House (26), Medicine Hat College/Alberta (27), Red Deer (28), Edmonton (29), University of Alberta/Edmonton (30).

The month of April sees the group for a week at Oil Can Harry's in Vancouver (1-6) followed by a concert in Edmonton (7) with Three Dog Night, Red Lion Inn/Saskatoon (8-13), Brandon University (15), Playhouse Theatre/Winnipeg (16), Thunder Bay (18), Sault Ste. Marie (19) and the capper of the tour in Sudbury (20).

SAWCHYN'S N.A.A. TO REPRESENT LIGHTHOUSE

H.P. and Bell Management Ltd., who represent Lighthouse among others, have signed an agreement with J. Sergei Sawchyn of National Artists and Attractions Limited (Toronto). The agreement calls for Sawchyn to represent Lighthouse in all the countries of Eastern Europe, including the Soviet Union, as well as for the Peoples Republic of China. Sawchyn has also coordinated the forthcoming Lighthouse seventy-five day trans-continental tour of Canada. The tour will open in Victoria May 28 followed by Vancouver (29), Penticton (30) and Kamloops (31).

June 1st sees the group in Nelson followed by Calgary (3-4), Edmonton (6-7), Lethbridge (8), and Medicine Hat (9) to complete their stay in Alberta.

Saskatchewan dates include: Swift Current (11), Estevan (12), Yorkton (14), Melfort

(15), Prince Albert (16), North Battleford (18), Saskatoon (19) and Regina (20).

Moving across to Manitoba they play Winnipeg June 21 and 22.

Thunder Bay is the first Ontario date (23) followed by Sault Ste. Marie (26), Sudbury (27), Timmins (28), North Bay (29), and skirting the rest of Ontario they head for the Atlantic Provinces.

Campbellton, is the kick-off date for New Brunswick (July 3) which coincides with the Salmon Festival. This is followed by Bathurst (4), Newcastle (5) during Old Home Week and over to Prince Edward Island for a Summerside date (6). Back to the Mainland for a Halifax date (7) and across to Newfoundland's Stephenville (9), Cornerbrook (10), Grand Falls (11), Gander (12) and St. John's (13-14). Back into Nova Scotia they have dates in Sydney (17), Antigonish (18) and Truro (19), Moncton, N.B. (20), Charlottetown, P.E.I.

(21), Bridgewater (24), during Old Home Week, Yarmouth, N.S. (25), Fredericton, N.B. (26), Saint John, N.B. (27) and Edmundston, N.B. (28).

Quebec dates include Quebec City (July 31) and Montreal (August 1) to be followed by Ottawa, Cornwall, Brockville, Belleville and Kingston. Tour capper will be Aug 10.

The entire tour, one of the most extensive of any Canadian group, was coordinated by Sawchyn's Cantour division of his Toronto-based National Artists and Attractions Limited.

Sawchyn became involved with Lighthouse when, as General Manager of the Royal Winnipeg a post he held for nine years, he was instrumental in the co-production of the successful rock-ballet evening with the Royal Winnipeg Ballet and Lighthouse. Tagged, Ballet-High, the package received its world premiere at the National Arts Centre in Ottawa and picked up good notices on the Canadian tour of several cities.

Since taking on the H.P. and Bell account, Sawchyn has presented Lighthouse at the new Hamilton Place — a completely "sold out" evening and at the Peterborough Memorial Centre before the largest rock audience ever assembled in that city.

H.P. and Bell and Cantour are now busily engaged in finalizing technical arrangements for the Canadian tour which will include the first souvenir booklet ever presented on Lighthouse as well as a selection of special T-shirts.

VANCOUVER FLOODED WITH WEA ARTISTS

WEA Music's Vancouver promotion team continues to be fully occupied with artists in town for personal appearances.

In the next two weeks alone, seven major WEA artists make Vancouver appearances: Frank Zappa, March 14th, Agrodome; Beach Boys, 17th Coliseum; Eagles, 21st, Gardens; Maria Muldaur, 22nd, Queen Elizabeth Theatre; T. Rex, 30th, Gardens; Donny Hathaway, April 1-4, Oil Can Harry's; and Black Oak Arkansas, 3, Coliseum. A second show has already been added for the Maria Muldaur concert. The Beach Boys go on from Vancouver to play a March 18th date in Victoria.

ORVAL PROPHET READIES ALBUM

Orval Prophet — fitter 'n' a fiddle, has been busy putting together his next single release to be followed by an album.

The popular Columbia country artist has been back on the road after a short illness. He recently played the Grand Central in St. Thomas and completed a taping of The Family Brown Show, "Country Way" (CJOH-TV Ottawa).

Prophet's last chart effort, "Champlain & St. Lawrence Line" brought much attention to his "Judgment Day Express" album which became a strong album seller for Columbia.

INDIANA READY TO DO BATTLE WITH PIRATES

The fight against tape pirates in the U.S. is now showing results on the State Legislature level. Indiana's Governor Otis Bowen has signed an anti-piracy measure into law.

Several factions were involved in bringing attention to the tape problem. These included CMA board member Bill Anderson; Henry Brief, Executive Director of RIAA (New York); Kenneth Lemry, Columbia Records (Terre Haute); and Don Nelson, manager of WIRE Radio in Indianapolis. The latter was state chairman of the anti-piracy committee in Indiana for the Country Music Association and led the campaign to obtain the law.

The statute against bootleg tapes allows the first offence as a misdemeanor (a non-indictable offence in Canada) carries maximum penalties of \$2000 and one year in prison for the illegal duplication and distribution. The second offence, a felony (an indictable offence in Canada) carries a maximum penalty of ten years and a \$5000 fine.

Retailers selling the tapes can be fined a maximum of \$5000.

The Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) has been pressuring governments (federally and provincially) to bring about a tougher law to deal with a problem that has been sapping a good portion of the profits for several years and allowing for the distribution of inferior product.

What price freedom in the "free" world?

London, Eng.

The "free" world's press is doing a lot of tut-tut-tutting, as well it might, over the plight of the Soviet writer, Alexander Solzhenitsyn.

But such abominable attitudes notwithstanding, are the Russians really any worse than

we are? Are we living in glass houses without the right to throw stones? I wonder.

Consider, if you will, the situation of Timothy Leary, the American behavioral psychologist now serving up to 15 years in a Californian prison for possession of a minute amount of marijuana.

Solzhenitsyn, at this writing, has been summoned to report to the state prosecutor's office in Moscow, which many observers feel will ultimately lead to the legal silencing of his anti labor-camp literary endeavor.

But the fact remains that Solzhenitsyn is still a free man — Leary is not. It's hard to avoid asking yourself which then is the more democratic state?

Now what sort of crap is this he's spouting, some readers may be saying . . . after all, everyone knows that Solzhenitsyn is a hero while Leary is just another of those crackpot, anarchistic fanatics of the acid era. That's the picture that the "free" world media puts out, anyway. Leary was poisoning the minds and thoughts of the kids.

We first came into contact with Tim Leary in the Fall of '69 during John and Yoko's Montreal bed-in for peace, and Leary seemed neither Jekyll nor Hyde. He had an aura about him of a philosopher, a thinker, a man of gentle disposition and obvious peace-of-mind. It just happened that his thinking did not coincide with that of the current American political administration, which — despite its horrendous and criminal activities — remains in power. One would like to believe that nobody's thinking coincided with the corruption within the Nixon administration.

PALASCHUK PRODUCES LINDA BROWN ALBUM

Joe Palaschuk, Palais House producer, has just completed an album session for A&M with country artist Linda Brown. The session was produced at RCA's Toronto studios.

Material on the album will be primarily Canadian with six of the ten selections being Brown originals. A single will probably be taken off the album.

Linda picked up a large following of country programmers with her first single release, "Empty Closets", which had a fair run up the RPM Country Playlist.

Some of Leary's scientific investigations involved the use of drugs such as marijuana and LSD, which despite staggering evidence to the contrary, are still considered dangerous to the aspirations of the "free" world.

Drugs, Leary said recently, were only about one tenth of his work, but the media invariably question him about them, as they asked Einstein about the atomic bomb. He readily admits he has always advocated the legislation of marijuana. Who doesn't? And he thinks that LSD — which he describes as one of the most powerful substances known to man — should be under public control like fissionable nuclear material.

He predicts that there will always be heroin addicts, and he feels that the best way to deal with them is by registering their names and supplying the poor unfortunates with the substance on prescription. "If insulin was illegal," he perceptively notes, "don't you think diabetics would be robbing to get their fix?" Amen.

Leary claims he "knows more about the nervous system than any man alive". He does not find it strange to be locked up behind bars because "most of the great thinkers I model myself on have ended up here."

Along with his lady, Joanna, Leary was kidnapped in Kabul a year ago by American narcotics agents after their passports had been confiscated by the U.S. consulate. After four months of solitary confinement, Leary was charged with a 29-count indictment, and offered bail on the security of a world-record five million dollars. Said the

judge: "Your ideas are too dangerous".

Eventually charges of drug manufacture and smuggling were dropped because of lack of evidence. Earlier charges going back to 1966 were also dumped when their originator, G. Gordon Liddy, attained infamy as one of the Watergate conspirators.

Leary was sentenced to six months to ten years for possession of one one-hundredth of a gram of marijuana, plus a consecutive sentence of six months to five years for walking out of an open prison. One hopes that the injustice of these sentences will haunt the judge until his dying day. You might also compare them with some of the Watergate convictions.

Solzhenitsyn, not to play down his obvious dilemma, has still to be charged for his "crimes".

Leary said not long ago that he regards drugs as tools, extensions of man's mind as machines are of his body. I cannot recall a more realistic description. Leary is no prisoner of drugs — he is a prisoner of conscience. A conscience that too many of us have chosen to ignore as we hypocritically tut-tut about the Commies.

Leary's ambition is to change the world — "why settle for anything less?" As we have all seen in recent times, that change does not come through exercising your franchise. Yet it of all things is the goal to which we all must strive — if, dare I say it, we want to remain alive.

New Albums

THE CREAMCHEEZE GOOD-TIME BAND — Home Cookin' — MCA 398-J

Creamcheeze is a group you try so hard to like that you just might overlook some of their faults. What you have here is a folk country variety type of mood music, if there is such a category. There's a lack of balls, perhaps their choice of material, or instrumentation - or maybe even mix. Whatever it is, it takes away from a very talented group that's capable of much more. Strongest cut is what we are already familiar with, "Uncle Jed", a past single release.

BUFFY SAINTE-MARIE — Buffy — MCA 405-J

Buffy's first for MCA and it's just packed with hard sell single material from the opening cut "Can't Believe The Feeling When You're Gone" through to "That's The Way You Fall In Love". There are "uppers" and "downers" and all manufactured by Buffy (compositions) with an incredible production assist by Norbert Putnam. Probably one of the strongest cuts and dynamite single material is "Sweet, Fast Hooker Blues" which would definitely have to be followed up with "Hey! Baby Howdja Do Me This Way?". In any event — Buffy is finally front and centre with a new dimension in sound.

PAUL HANN — A Fine, White Thread — London NAS 13500-K

An Englishman now making his home in Vancouver, Hann, has been taught the good sounds of Canadian folk by his co-writing partner, Pete White. But it's Hann's clean and simple interpretation that brings the album home. There's also a lush classic yet earthy backing to the session. This is supplied by an excellent array of musicians including Robbie McDougall, piano and piano arrangements, Graeme Card, mandolin, Humphrey Dumptruck, banjo, Gary Koliger, pedal steel and a rich string section with arrangements by Bob Buckley. An outstanding album, and a credit to Edmonton's Century II Studios. This is a complete programming package for the pop and country programmer and for those contemporary rock programmers looking for a musical interruption.

CLIMAX BLUES BAND — FM/Live — Sire SAS 2-17411-Q


This is blues at its finest and recorded live at the Academy of Music and broadcast live on New York's FM giant WNEW. A bitch of a set showcasing the unmistakable blues guitar, sax and vocals of Pete Haycock and Colin Cooper. There's a lot of blues here and the cuts are lengthy with solo features throughout. Highly recommended for listening is "Going To New York" and a frenetic blues version of "Let's Walk Together".

ROY BUCHANAN — That's What I Am Here For — Polydor PD 6020-Q

Everybody's doing the blues but no one does it quite as well as Buchanan, particularly his stage offering. This, his third album, is somewhat disappointing. A blues master, Buchanan just doesn't come through on this production as well as he should. Perhaps the choice of material that takes away from what could be dynamite cuts. We like "Hey Joe", "Don't Turn Away" and the title number but that's not enough to make for a great album.

VILLE EMARD BLUES BAND — Live in Montreal — Funkebec FK2-700-K

A very energetic and entertaining package of talent from a new Quebec group. The session was produced by group member Bill Gagnon (bass player) at Studio Six in Montreal. Musicianship is excellent and some of the solo vocalists, exceptional and their choice of material, all original. They say that music has no language barrier but there is a point of acceptance,



and what we have here could take away, unfortunately, from the talents of this group. Firstly the information on the album is in French — the introduction is also in French and one might get the idea that this usage of French is overdone and could be construed as being flouted at English Canada where it is hoped to solicit radio plays and sales. A two-record set of a very expensive session loses its punch with too much and perhaps contrived audience reaction. The album without these distractions, could stand on its own. Perhaps this type of "canned" excitement is good for Quebec but could be a turn off factor for English Canada. By the way we do like the album and in particular "Indian Giver God" with a superb vocal and guitar execution by Rawn Bankley.

JOHN MAYALL — The Best Of — Polydor PD 2-3006-Q

A very special album by Mayall and a host of name musicians including: Eric Clapton, Mick Taylor, Jon Mark, Mick Fleetwood etc. etc. The two-record set comes complete with "a photographic portfolio" of the musicians who contributed their talent to this set. There's nothing really new here — a problem of all "best of" albums, but it is convenient for the Mayall fan and could garner more of a following.

Bella Coast Bounty is comprised of Bob Chipman, lead guitar; Ken Slauenwhite, piano; Wayne Bowser, lead singer; Royal Hobbs, drummer.

HIBBS SHOWS GOOD FORM WITH "ALL KINDS" SINGLE

Harry Hibbs, Marathon recording artist, is picking up strength on his initial single for the label, "All Kinds Of Everything". A good cross section of pop and country stations are now leaning on the single resulting in encouraging retail sales. Early stations playlisting the single include: CKBB/Barrie, Ont., CFSX/Marystown, Nfld., and CJDC/Dawson Creek, B.C.

Despite the budget price, the album contains an attractive brochure containing the opera text in Italian and English as well as sketches by Nicola Benois for Scala production stage sets of La Forza. We understand that this release is to be followed immediately by a re-issue of the Callas recording of Verdi's Masked Ball.

Not another Le Sacre du bloody Printemps!! This pre-historic hooch dance seems to turn up each month as a new release. I am sure that by now every conductor in the world has had at least two or three tries at it. (who says there is a vinyl shortage?). The great London Philharmonic Orchestra who by now could probably play the work beautifully without a conductor, turn in a predicably polished performance and Philips engineers have captured their sound in their predicably polished way. But the A and R man who planned the release should be sent a copy of Grove's Dictionary of Music and Musicians so that he might be inspired to record some of the thousands of works by thousands of composers who have yet to appear on any disc. Let's give this old war horse a rest.

ITALIAN OPERATIC ARIAS
 Regine Crespin - soprano
ACE OF DIAMONDS SDD 2208



Vintage Regine Crespin originating from a 1963 release from London Records and once again available on this company's Ace of Diamonds budget line. The orchestra is the Royal Opera House conducted by Edward Downes. Side one is devoted to arias by Verdi and includes "Tacea la notte" from Il Trovatore, "Morro" from Un Ballo in Maschera, and the Willow Song and Ave Maria from Otello. Side two features a fine "Suicidio" from Ponchielli's La Gioconda, "Voi lo sapete" from Mascagni's Cavalleria Rusticana, "Un bel di" from Puccini's Madama Butterfly, and "L'antra notte in fondo al mare" from Boito's Mefistofele. The jacket contains the text of each aria in Italian and English but does not identify any of the composers of the operas. No timings are provided, and Regine Crespin's vocal range is nowhere identified. (she could be a stranglely attired tenor!). Perhaps we expect too much from a budget product, but by now, such information should be standard on all albums.

BRUCKNER Symphony No. 8 in C minor
 Otto Klemperer conducting the New Philharmonia Orchestra
ANGEL SB-3799

A beautiful, expansive reading by the late Otto Klemperer of Bruckner's massive Symphony No. 8 in C minor. Each of the work's four movements occupies one entire side in this two record set. The Leopold Nowak edition was chosen by Klemperer for this recording. An analysis of the work by Hans Keller is included as well as an essay Otto Klemperer — a personal remembrance by Peter Andry, General Manager of E.M.I.'s international Classical Division. The language of Otto Klemperer's conducting style is the language of Anton Bruckner and the Symphony "speaks" through this fine recording with profound nobility.

HENRY LITOLFF Concerto Symphonique No. 4 in D minor
 Op. 102
 Gerald Robbins - pianist; Monte-Carlo Opera Orchestra conducted
 by Edouard Van Remoortel
GENESIS GS 1035

Anyone who has attended the London Henry Wood Promenade Concerts regularly cannot have avoided hearing the Henry Litolff "Scherzo" whacked out with sparkle and enthusiasm by Irene Scharer (in the 1920's) and Moura Lympany and Eileen Joyce in the war and post war years. It is the second movement



of a massive four movement Concerto by English composer Henry Litolff who was born in London in 1818 and became known as the "English Liszt". Pianist Gerald Robbins who was a major prize winner in the 1969 Van Cliburn Competition turns in a truly brilliant performance of this taxing work and is well supported by the Monte-Carlo Opera Orchestra conducted by Edouard Van Remoortel. The first movement is a stormy Allegro Con fuoco of considerable musical interest, followed by the brilliant Scherzo, which improves in stature when played in its proper context after the serious opening movement. The weak point in the work is the third movement, a brief Adagio Religioso, sentimental in the extreme. The Finale, Allegro Impetuoso returns to the brilliance and bustle of the opening two movements and is strongly reminiscent of Mendelssohn and Saint-Saens. Available through Almada Corporation and strongly recommended to 19th century buffs.

MUSIC IN SALISBURY CATHEDRAL
 Salisbury Cathedral Choir
 Michael Deason Barrow- Treble Soloist
ORYX 1806

An interesting and varied programme of church music by the choir of Salisbury Cathedral in England. Boy soprano Michael Deason Barrow turns in a charming performance of Pie Jesu from the Faure Requiem. Charles Stanford is represented by his Evening Service in G and the Nunc Dimittis in G. Other anthems include the Laudate Dominum by Mozart, Ye now are sorrowful by Brahms, O give thanks by Wesley and William Byrd's O Lord rebuke me not. This recording, made at Salisbury Cathedral is available in Canada through Almada Corporation.

Better red than dead

Let us return to yester-year — to 1965 and my formative radio days. Whilst going out of my mind doing math homework, the flutter of my favourite radio station fades in once more. Oh praise the benevolent ionosphere for bringing WCFL and Ron Britton back for another fifteen minute skip spectacular! Ron's really happening tonight. He faded out last time just when the 10,000 screaming elephants jammed into the elevator to come up to the studio. I must have missed the elevator ride 'cause now they're all screaming in the middle of a pimple commercial he's doing . . .

There I was, listening to personality radio at its personality-est. And what amazes me now in retrospect, was the great pains I took in trying to listen to that station. I'd

have the dial poised at 1000 waiting for pattern change and WCFL to come drifting through. And then I'd sit through incredible degrees and durations of interference waiting for the station to fade back again. To top it all, I had forty local stations, all clear as a bell, to tune to if I wanted. But none entertained, communicated, reached out to me as WCFL did at the time. Then Drake came along and regrettably I dialed back home for the clearer version of the same thing — the local time-temp rocker.

I really did like that type of radio, then. And so did many others, although obviously not enough. Drake and friends cleaned the whole thing up and gave contemporary radio a smooth, consistent, broad-based presentation. It worked. The numbers

proved it and those still hanging on to their now out-dated "personalities" were getting beaten badly by the clean machine.

That's all history. What is happening now is that a number of us have realized that those clean machines are, in fact, machines and more personalized presentations are gaining a lot of appeal these days. But is this new appeal, once more, enough? Progressive low-key-delivery rock on FM has made its mark but is certainly not taking over as the new mass appeal radio. Wolfman Jack, Don Imus and the like have certainly had much publicity but that is all. Imus' numbers in New York are far from the best. Personality radio is interesting to read about and talk about, but how about listening to it on a mass-scale?

Regardless, in case you haven't heard, personality radio is rumoured to be coming back. Really, in one form, it never left. A station like CFRB can hardly be accused of not having personalities in the traditional sense. John Spragge, PD at CFRB, is very conscious of the role of personality at his station, ranking it first in importance followed by news and thirdly music as an entertainment bridge. Spragge does recognize the danger of having personalities bigger than the station though, and strives for a good balance of the station's strong over-all personality enhancing the strong personalities of the on-air staff and vice-



**SIX TV COMMERCIALS
REJECTED BY CAAB**

The Canadian Advertising Advisory Board, a self-regulatory body for the advertising industry, judged six television commercials in violation of the children's advertising code. The code, adopted in 1971, prohibits exaggeration of children's products, messages asking children to urge their parents to buy a product, under-playing of cost of children's products with words like "just" and "only", and endorsement of products by personalities.

One commercial, for the McDonald Doll, used the phrase "only \$1.25". Another, "Super Slides", violated the code by breaking frequency scheduling rules and two others were run in error by some stations. Irwin's "Kerplunk" and "Don't Break the Ice" commercials had been approved a year earlier, but the interpretation of code wording had changed since, rejecting the use of the word "get" in reference to urging parents to buy the toys.

EXIT THE GENTLEMAN STAGE RIGHT

On February 28, 1974, Winnipeg's "Doc" Steen took down the music director's shingle which he hung on the CKRC library door 13 years ago, when that station acquired its rock license.

Steen's exit from CKRC — and probably radio itself — has called the curtain down on an era. It was his creative, maverick, almost prophetic ear which had called the musical shots in Winnipeg for more than a decade, and now one of the Canadian Music Industry's rarest gentlemen has willingly abdicated.

Steen, who acquired the nickname "Doc" because he was a pharmacy student who drifted into radio via CBC drama, has worked CJOB, CKEY, CKGM, CKY and CKRC.

As the music director of CKRC, Steen became known for airing records on his own judgment, rather than placing a lopsided emphasis on the "numbers game". Among others, Doc started the ball rolling

for hits such as "Love Is Blue" (Paul Mauriat), "Unicorn" (Irish Rovers), "The Good, Bad & Ugly" (Hugo Montenegro), "Lean On Me" (Bill Withers), "Farmer's Song" (Murray McLauchlan), "Happiest Girl In The Whole U.S.A." (Donna Fargo), "Never Been This Far Before" (Conway Twitty) and Alan Schick's "Lucy, Lucy, Lucy".

In many cases, Steen had been playing the tunes as album cuts for many weeks when the record company decided to release the songs as singles. A recent example is Ringo Starr's "You're Sixteen".

This was indeed a maverick music director: a man who refused to let the Bill Drakes of the world do his thinking; one who could not be bought and who would not rip anybody off, who asked for so little that everyone who called on his station wanted to give more. In short, a man who walked tall because he walked softly.

The question remains, why did Steen — a veritable institution in his market — lay down the earphones so willingly?

Steen reported that he has become "... increasingly frustrated with the lack of creativity allowed in today's radio. What have we been doing during the past 10 years — and what are we doing now — for the forgotten people, the listeners?

"Given today's radio philosophy, or lack of it, we now have a flood of stations that, basically, are doing the same things and really sound pretty much the same.

"The real listener — not the statistic in the rating books — has a choice in most cases between Tweedeldee and Tweedeldum. Radio as a whole, including so-called 'progressive FM', is a money machine which has in a very real sense forgotten where the money ultimately comes from... so it churns out mechanical and largely irrelevant things aimed at a fictional listener.

"The system has become so inbred that there's little chance of any real feedback filtering through from the street to management, and thus as long as the ratings games are well-played there's little hope of changing it.

"I came to see that what it all really meant was that I'd have to change to fit the system, and I guess I just got tired of selling my soul. Where's the creativity in cranking out 30 songs, give or take a few, lifted from Gavin and company, sandwiched between time, temp, weather, commercials and, in the best of cases, the jock is not really allowed to develop his own personality on air."

And thus, exit the gentleman, stage right.

RON WADDELL MOVES TO TV


After four and a half years at CKDM, Dauphin, Manitoba, doing a rock show as "The Ugly One", Ron Waddell moved in 1970, to radio station CJGX, Yorkton, Saskatchewan, as promotion manager and country disc jockey. Besides many successful promotional efforts at GX Radio; such as "Canada's Biggest Country Music

Yorkton, CHSS Wynyard and CFSS Estevan, all in Saskatchewan, and CKSS Dauphin, Manitoba; with the "Top of the Morning" show telecast on all four channels each morning Monday to Friday. The show is similar to a radio morning show, featuring news, weather, sports, and information, along with the playing of records. Everything, including the dee jay chatter has the added advantage of colour cameras telecasting the entire show.

With the vast areas of both Saskatchewan and Manitoba that are covered, this provides a wide and unique exposure for new releases along with the visual aid for promotional materials. The type of music played is a combination of the best contemporary, "pop" and country material available and Waddell has experience in all three fields, having also been music director at GX radio. Album cuts and old gold are mixed in for balance. Waddell would like to point out that the size of the record library at the moment is not that large, and would like to rectify this by having all record companies take note of his new address: Shamrock Television, 95 East Broadway, Yorkton, Saskatchewan, and be added to all mailing lists for new releases and promotion materials; with a special request for record company promotional people to be on the lookout for video tapes of your artists that he can use to help you with your promotion activities and new releases.

Waddell would like to invite any performers in the area to stop in for an interview, and if you would like, performances of your latest releases can be video taped for showing on the "Top of the Morning" show and on their Friday night live talent show, "Profile", hosted by Roger McLauchlin. Many performers have already appeared in this manner, including Bobby Curtola, and RCA's Lady and the Gentlemen.

As Waddell gets settled in his new job, and as music director for the Shamrock stations, he hopes to very soon start releasing playlists to the industry. These playlists will be available upon request.



Month" promotion every October, he was able to build an exceptional communication with country music people throughout Canada and the U.S. The height of 1973 activities for Waddell was to get the approval from the Prime Minister's office to declare, on behalf of the Canadian country music people, October as "National Country Music Month" in Canada. This year his country music month promotion will have the added advantage of full television visual effects.

March 1, 1974, would have marked four years at GX Radio for Waddell, but on February 1st, he accepted an offer from the Shamrock Television stations of Yorkton, to become their morning man and host the "Top of the Morning" show. Shamrock Television consists of four channels: CKOS

SOFT ROCK FM FOR MONTREAL MARKET

Progressive FM? . . . contemporary rock? . . . soft rock? . . . getting warmer. But organized progressive is what program director Frank Van de Ven (previously MD at CFQR-FM Montreal) likes to call the new format at CJFM in Montreal. The format isn't really that new — it's been going for about eight months, but, according to Van de Ven, the Book has finally started to show the basic audience profile and what he hopes to be a bright trend. The cumes are down but the quarters and total and average hours tuned are up, showing a developing loyal following.

Getting back to the term "organized progressive", Van de Ven believes traditional progressive rock radio (now there's a new phrase) lacked the organization and discipline to attract a wider audience base. With a low key delivery, minimal talk and staying away from the real progressive "fringe" type of music, CJFM hopes to fill the gap for those who feel "they are being ripped-off by the AM contemporaries and find CHOM-FM too heavy". In this way they hope to convert a whole new audience that never really listened to radio before.

Station manager Paul Fockler (previously

with CJIC Sault Ste. Marie for fifteen years) describes the station as being three on a scale from one to ten for heaviness of music and CHOM and CHUM-FM seven and five respectively. The music is picked for its compatibility to the station with very little attention paid to the charts.

As an example of the music, the new Todd Rundgren, Clifford Ward, Joni Mitchell, Grateful Dead, Strawbs, Tom Scott, John Mayall, David Essex and Anne Murray albums, to name a few, were added to the playlist last week. The delivery is typically FM — low key with no jingles, no music pad talk-overs, and up to four songs played in a row. Commercials are produced so as to minimize tune-out, with as much local production as possible — a delicate point with national accounts. Interviews (Moody Blues, Bruce Cockburn amongst others) are integrated in the programming as well as live performances by local artists. Specials highlighting the music of particular artists and the National Lampoon Comedy Hour are also featured.

As far as the bilingual situation is concerned, Fockler sees no problem. Even though the announcing is totally English, a large portion of French music is played, with a great response reported towards local Quebec recordings.

With the continuing success of the softened FM progressives and the FM out-and-out rockers south of the border, the development of CJFM will be looked upon with great interest.

versa. And it's certainly been successful over the years although the clean machines are still chipping away.

Another, newer form of personality radio is the progressive FM. Bob Laine of CHUM-FM sees personality as the station's reason for being. Each man is his own program director within ideal and flow guide-lines. Although strong personalities like David Marsden have developed rather a love-hate relationship with his listeners-non listeners, Laine maintains that good ratings have substantiated the hate end of the relationship. As far as applying his type of radio to AM, Laine admits stereo has much to do with the success of progressive FM and besides, previous attempts on AM have not been very successful. It really isn't drive radio — a major consideration on AM radio.

And now to the clean machines. No program director would ever refer to his station in such terms these days — maybe it's because they were the type who liked a Ron Britton years ago or maybe it's just not cool these days to admit that individual personalities have no place at their station. But some of them do sound like clean machines to a lot of people and often they accuse each other as being such. Maybe they do believe in personality to some extent but just don't know how to pull it off.

Most top forty stations think of personality radio in terms of the station having a strong personality as a whole as opposed to the individual personalities on the station. Martin Kamerman, GM at CHAM Hamilton sees his station as having to distinguish itself from the other contemporaries in the market due to the 85-100% music crossover. He describes his station as busy, active; and all the psa's, news, music, pacing, signal engineering and jocks must jive together to give the station a consistent and distinct personality. As far as on-air personalities are concerned, the jocks should be able to be tuned out if music is what you're after or, at the same time, tuned in if you're after interesting entertainment. And as far as a Don Imus is concerned, if you can pull it off, do it. If not, don't try. They are a very rare breed.

Across the street to CKOC and Nevin Grant. Like Martin, Nevin tries to give his station a strong personality, as a whole. His way is to get involved in the community — have the jocks, news and promotions relate and get into the community. As far as individual personalities are concerned, Nevin feels people want to be entertained more these days and are looking for more meaningful


content. He encourages his people along those lines. The rumoured shift to strong personality radio is a shallow trend, in his mind, and would be a mistake to jump into at this time. Personality, on a moderate level is, and always has been, an important ingredient at CKOC, according to Nevin.

And then there's CFTR's Mike Marshall. He describes the role of the PD as supplying the machine and the jocks supplying the grease. Marshall, a staunch Draker, believes more music, consistency, and good, clean radio will beat personality every time. A member of an old school or a wise, scientific programmer — time will tell.

A question I asked the programmers that reaped some interesting answers was "What colour would you describe your station as being." Red seemed to be predominant.

Amongst others: Nevin described his station as red — connotating warmth. Another described it as blue - cool. Kamerman described his as yellow — full of sunshine and cheer. Another described it as grey — no image. Mike Marshall thought of his station as red also — exciting and flashy. And John Spragge described CFRB as green — but he is self-admittedly colour blind.

Despite accusing each other of the opposite in most cases, all felt their radio station had a strong personality. Personality radio as a coming trend? Only very moderately so. 
