COLUMBIA HOSTS DINNER IN HONOUR OF O'JAYS


Columbia Records of Canada treated Toronto press representatives to a soul food buffet at The Underground Railroad (3) along with complimentary tickets to the O'Jays show at the O'Keefe Centre the same night. Promo reps Terry McGee and Mike Watson were on hand to host the dinner and introduce the O'Jays and Johnny Nash (also on the bill) to the media.

The O'Jays show was a tightly knit demonstration of contemporary rhythm and blues that included their hits "Love Train", "Backstoppers" and "For The Love of Money". Johnny Nash opened the concert and performed cuts taken off his new album "Celebrate Life". He finished the set with his best-known hit "I Can See Clearly."

The latest album for the O'Jays is "Ship Ahoy" which was certified gold in just ninety days.

PETER GRAHAM TO QUALITY PROMO

Peter Graham has been appointed country promotion manager for Quality Records. The appointment came at a time when Quality stepped up its country involvement through a pacting for distribution rights to

the Broadland label, a country production house headed up by Gary Buck.

In making the above announcement George Smith, Vice-President and Managing Director of Quality, stated: "I'd like to express my enthusiasm and state my strong support for Quality's role in country music and its commitment to the success and development of country music in Canada.

Graham will work closely in the formulating of sales plans as well as with distributors in regards to sales of key album and tape product. Prior to this new appointment Graham was Quality's national merchandising manager.

Graham has been involved in the record business for some time, working behind the scenes at Quality and finally emerging with a sound working knowledge of the business generally. Although the role of country promotion man is new to Graham, his background lends itself more to this field than any other. He was brought up on country music in his native India where his mother was a country singer of some note.

Initial feet-getting-wet chore for Graham is the overwhelming single release from Broadland including: Patti MacDonnell ("I'll Be Seeing You Someday"), Bob Murphy ("Don't Put The Blame On Me"), Wayne Rostad ("Burnett Road") and Darlene Madill ("Knock On My Door").

CAPITOL'S KING'S SINGERS TAPE CDN. CHRISTMAS SHOW

Global TV has scheduled the broadcast of a show featuring three of Canada's most popular personalities, Paul Anka, Chief Dan George and Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau. The special will also include a British import called The King's Singers and will be aired on Christmas Eve. The King's Singers will sing a concert of seasonal music selected from their English EMI album, "Deck the Hall". The sextet taped part of their show during a North American tour which included dates in Sackville, New Brunswick

POLYDOR READIES NEW BTO SINGLE

Bachman-Turner Overdrive's charter, "You Ain't Seen Nothing Yet", this week certified for Canadian Gold at the same time Polydor announced plans to ship their new single, "Roll On Down The Highway". Shipping date has been set as Dec 24 - just in time for the Holiday nausea to subside and fire up the new year for the highly successful Mercury group, currently setting records for one-nighters on the U.S. west coast.

Record World, the highly respected U.S. trade magazine, recently honoured BTO with their year-end awards. The Vancouver-based group took top male group in both pop singles and pop album categories. In the top album listings they placed no. 2 with "BTO II" and were rated no. 5 for "Not Fragile".

The year 1974 was extremely good for BTO having walked away with a pair of Junos for Most Promising Group and Contemporary Album of The Year ("Bachman-Turner Overdrive") and a first for a Canadian group - the Platinum and Gold Leaf certification for all three of their album releases.

GRT TAKES LEGAL ACTION TO PROTECT LIGHTHOUSE

GRT received information in the summer of this year that Lighthouse product manufactured in the U.S. was being put up for sale in Canada at prices substantially lower than normal trade costs.

Parties offering the product for sale were notified by both Lighthouse and their legal counsel of the infringement. Following this, most companies who had been involved in the infraction made a financial settlement and/or ceased selling the Lighthouse product.

However, both Record Warehouse Ltd. of Ontario and Caravan Stereo Ltd. of Quebec continued to offer the product in question at a consistently abnormally low discount cost. Action was then taken against both companies asking among other things, damages in the amount of \$250,000.00.

Legal action against Caravan Stereo Ltd. was settled with a financial settlement and Caravan's agreement to publish the following notice in its catalogue which is widely circulated throughout the industry. "In keeping with our policy of supporting the Canadian Music Industry, we will not offer for sale discontinued records of Lighthouse and other Canadian artists distributed by GRT and which are still current in Canada."

Examinations for discovery have now been completed in the action against Record Warehouse Ltd. and trial is expected to begin in the Federal Court of Canada sometime in February of 1975.

The legal actions were taken in keeping with the Canadian Copyright Act, section 17 (4) of that Act.

Even the concert business is holding its own amid the talk of short money and inflation. The industry couldn't be healthier, according to many of the record heads.

The fight for hits continues and with it the establishment of best selling album artists. Promotion and publicity become a major factor in establishing the stars who will climb the charts in 1975.

The excitement that is (or should be) part of musicbiz is the climb to stardom of a recording act. The formula to success has never been perfected, but it's either somewhere in the grooves, or somewhere in the promotion and starbuilding. The merchandising takes care of itself, once you have a

name act that will sell. Just keep filling the browsers.

To an outsider it looks easy, but any record biggie will tell you that many a buck was lost and many a saved dollar created a star just by magic, good promotion and hard work. That's the record business and that's the music business, but of course you know all this. In 1975 you'll be making a bigger and better try to take your share of the market.

Now's the time to start thinking about whether you want to be a store keeper or a creator of moneymaking stars.

The doors to the music world swing both ways. That's what makes it an exciting business.

SHA NA NA DRAWS
3000 TO UBC

Fifties-style rock kings Sha Na Na pulled over three thousand paying customers to their performance at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver last week. The audience was caught up in the spirit of the evening and provided additional entertainment by way of greased hair, riveted jeans, fist fights and moons.

The concert was promoted via KCLG FM and CITR, UBC's campus outlet. Ray Ramsay of Taylor, Pearson, Carson, distributors of Sha Na Na product, arranged for radio spots on 'LG FM promoting the group's current "Hot Sox" album and for giveaways of product over both KCLG FM and CITR. The campus station also put together a programming special to tie in with the appearance.

While in Vancouver, group members were interviewed by the media, including representatives of Zoo World and the Georgia Straight.

DOWNCHILD TOURING
BRITISH COLUMBIA

GRT's Downchild Blues Band is winding up a three city tour of Canada's western-most province. The group opened December 1st in Kelowna's Community Centre, followed by a week-long stint at the Zodiac, Vancouver December 2-7. The province's capital city, Victoria, hosts the group at the McPherson Playhouse, December 8th. Negotiations are currently underway for a stay at another Vancouver nitery later in the month.

The tour was set up by Doug Pigget of Vancouver's Concerts Caravan. KCLG FM and print ads were used to promote the appearances. Monica Netupsky of Emerson Sales, distributors of GRT product throughout British Columbia and Alberta, set up album giveaways of the group's current LP, "Dancin'" over CKIQ and CKOV, Kelowna. Downchild's current single, "Tell Your Mother", drawn from the "Dancin'" album, is now being aired over most major stations in the country, including CFUN, CFTR, CHUM, CHED, CKY and CKXL.

COLUMBIA SIGNS TORONTO BAND TO EXCLUSIVE CONTRACT

Columbia Records of Canada recently announced the signing of a well-known Toronto "rock 'n' blues" band known as Lick 'n' Stick to an exclusive recording contract.

The group has spent the last few years in some of Toronto's raunchier bars where they attracted many admirers to their tight, clean style of music. Lately they have been receiving more exposure in the city's better clubs and are finally beginning to gain the mass acceptance that has been owing to them for so long.

A Columbia spokesman noted: "The acquisition of Lick 'n' Stick to Columbia marks another step forward in the company's on-going search for Canada's most talented musicians".

RENO TEAMS UP WITH CBC FOR VARIETY SHOWCASE

Montreal singer Ginette Reno recently hosted a CBC special titled "Ginette Reno - With Love" (13) complete with a backing of Canadian music makers led by musical director Rick Wilkins. The show was produced by Ray McConnell.

Humourist-singer Gordie Tapp, another Canadian star, was special guest on the show. He has been making his mark in the U.S. as a regular on the syndicated country variety series "Hee Haw".

Reno demonstrated her musical versatility as she ran the gamut from rock to blues to country, including in her repertoire "Kodachrome", "Help Me Make It Through the Night", "Country Girl", "Last Blues Song", "My Man", and "Rock 'n' Roll Lullaby".

MAIR APPOINTED TO BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF MASSEY HALL

Alexander Mair has been appointed to the Board of Governors of Massey Hall. The prestigious 2755 seat concert hall, known throughout the world for its acoustically perfect sound quality, is the home of one of the world's finest symphony orchestras — the Toronto Symphony Orchestra. As well the Hall has been the natural setting for Canadian and international folk artists including Gordon Lightfoot, and Valdy and the driving rock sounds of Steppenwolf and many others.

Mair is one of Canada's busiest young music industry executives. During this past year he formed and heads up Attic Records, is President of Music Consultants Limited, General Manager of Early Morning Productions and is a Director of the Composers', Authors' and Publishers' Association of Canada (CAPAC). It is through these associations that he has become involved in many and varied aspects of the pop music business at home and abroad.

Massey Hall Board of Governors comprise: Arnold Edinborough (writer), Eugene Hallman (CBC-TV), Carole Taylor (CTV-TV), J. Alan Wood (Musicians' Union), and Toronto Mayor David Crombie. Representing the business community are: John E. Brent (Chairman of the Board, IBM Canada Ltd), Murray B. Koffler (Chairman of the Board, Koffler Stores Ltd.), and Frank McEachren (Director, Community Relations, Eaton's). President of the Board is Edward A. Pickering with Ontario's Lieutenant-Governor, Pauline McGibbon, as patron.

MIKE & MACK PRODUCTIONS SIGN WITH WARDAIR

Mike & Mack Productions Limited of Toronto has announced the signing of an agreement with Wardair, Canada Limited of Edmonton. Effective immediately Mike & Mack Productions will be producing the inflight audio entertainment programs for the passenger entertainment system aboard Wardair's Boeing 747 carriers. Seven channel selections will cover musical tastes ranging from classical to country. A major programming feature is the inclusion of a substantial selection of Canadian product. The first cycle provides a Canadian content factor of approximately 35% domestic product and both the country and French language channels are 100% Canadian in their content.

The company invites material from Canadian sources for possible inclusion in future productions. Mike & Mack Productions is currently negotiating its service with other major carriers. For more detailed informa-

"Fire" is currently number fourteen of rocker CKLG's chart.

The Moody Blues, always a strong catalogue seller, are now hitting the stores with their first new album in three years. The double record "greatest hits" package is being promoted by London via header cards, posters and bios in retail outlets. Initial orders for the set were described as "staggering".




ALBUM REVIEWS

VALDY

Family Gathering
A&M SP-9013-W

A&M are getting their rocks off with this powerful outing from Valdy — a long awaited follow-up to his "Landscape" album. Valdy tries his hand at producing this com-



bination "in concert" and "studio" set and comes up with an entertainment package that will carry him through into the new year. The simplicity is still there — even with the embellishment of instruments and the female vocal — all done to a subtle turn and revealing the qualities that earned Valdy a Juno last year. A&M have picked "Renaissance" as Valdy's next single, but it's only one of a package of strong singles potential on this album. The "live" session, recorded at Toronto's Massey Hall, features the Diamond Joe White group which brings out the best in country from Valdy. Don't overlook Valdy's "Ode To Wilf Carter" which was written by Joe White and the traditional "Johnny" with arrangement and interesting lyrical adaptation by Valdy.

CHARLEBOIS Barclay 80200-Q

While Charlebois is generally thought of as a rock singer, he is in fact the possessor of a clear, rangy voice which sounds much like many French language balladeers. What Charlebois does have is incredible self confidence which shows throughout. The most interesting cut on this, Charlebois' tenth album, is "Can Blues" an emphatic musical statement for which no English translation is supplied.

PETE SCHOFIELD & THE CANADIANS Christmas Is Love P.S. Records PS-1002

Just in time for Christmas and hopefully out on the market in sufficient quantities to take advantage of the airplay the album will obviously receive from stations with an easy listening format. A nice departure from the usual trite Christmas music. Selections of "Rudolph The Red Nose Reindeer", "Sleigh Ride", "Jingle Bells" etc. are about as contemporary as you can get. Two selections, "Christmas Is Love" written by Pete Schofield and "Winter-Time", a Schofield/Terry Quinn penning are beautifully put together by vocalist Tammy Rafferty. If you're looking for a contemporary rock and pop Christmas album and you want the Canadian big band influence try Schofield and The Canadians. Average age of the musicians is 18. Album was produced at Sound Canada.

PRELUDE After The Gold Rush Dawn DNLS 3052-L

Hot on the heels of their international hit, "After The Gold Rush", this talented British trio reveal they have more than a capella capabilities, which brought them and Canadian Neil Young's name into prominence. Ian Vardy, Irene and Brian Hume have an unusually soft and communicative vocal talent richly treated with acoustic guitars and harmonica backing. Country, pop and contemporary rock programmers will treasure this genuine package of entertainment, particularly the "Paris Morning" and How Long Is Forever" cuts.

JOHN DIEFENBAKER G100 Gold Records

Diefenbaker is surprisingly clearly spoken in this recording made during a testimonial dinner in honour of Senator Art Laing. Dief's witticisms should find favour with his fans and this set is chock full of them. Although national distribution is not yet set up, radio stations interested in a programming twist could get copies directly from Gold Records.

JOAN BAEZ Contemporary Ballad Book Vanguard VSDB 29

For those of us who lived and died for the likes of Richard Farina, Woody Guthrie and the early Bob Dylan, this is the album to have. They're all here: "Long Black Veil", "North Country Blues", "Children of Darkness", "Lady Came From Baltimore" and sixteen more on a double record set of real interest to those who lived through it all. Fantastic collection.

A FOOT IN COLDWATER All Around Us Daffodil DAF-10048-W

Combining unusually stylistic vocals with solid and powerful instrumentation, Foot in Coldwater remains one of the most underrated bands in the country. "All Around Us" could be the one to get them the exposure they deserve. It's a set highlighted by the sheer force of the titler and the re-make of "Para Dice".



The top-rated programs are first, World of Disney (CBC), followed by M.A.S.H. (CBC), All in the Family (CBC), The Waltons (CBC), NHL Hockey (CBC), Streets of San Francisco (CTV), Irish Rovers (CBC), Rookies (CTV), Mary Tyler Moore (CBC) and The Beachcombers (CBC).

CBC also claimed seven of the top ten Canadian produced programs seen in the common CBC and CTV coverage regions. 




