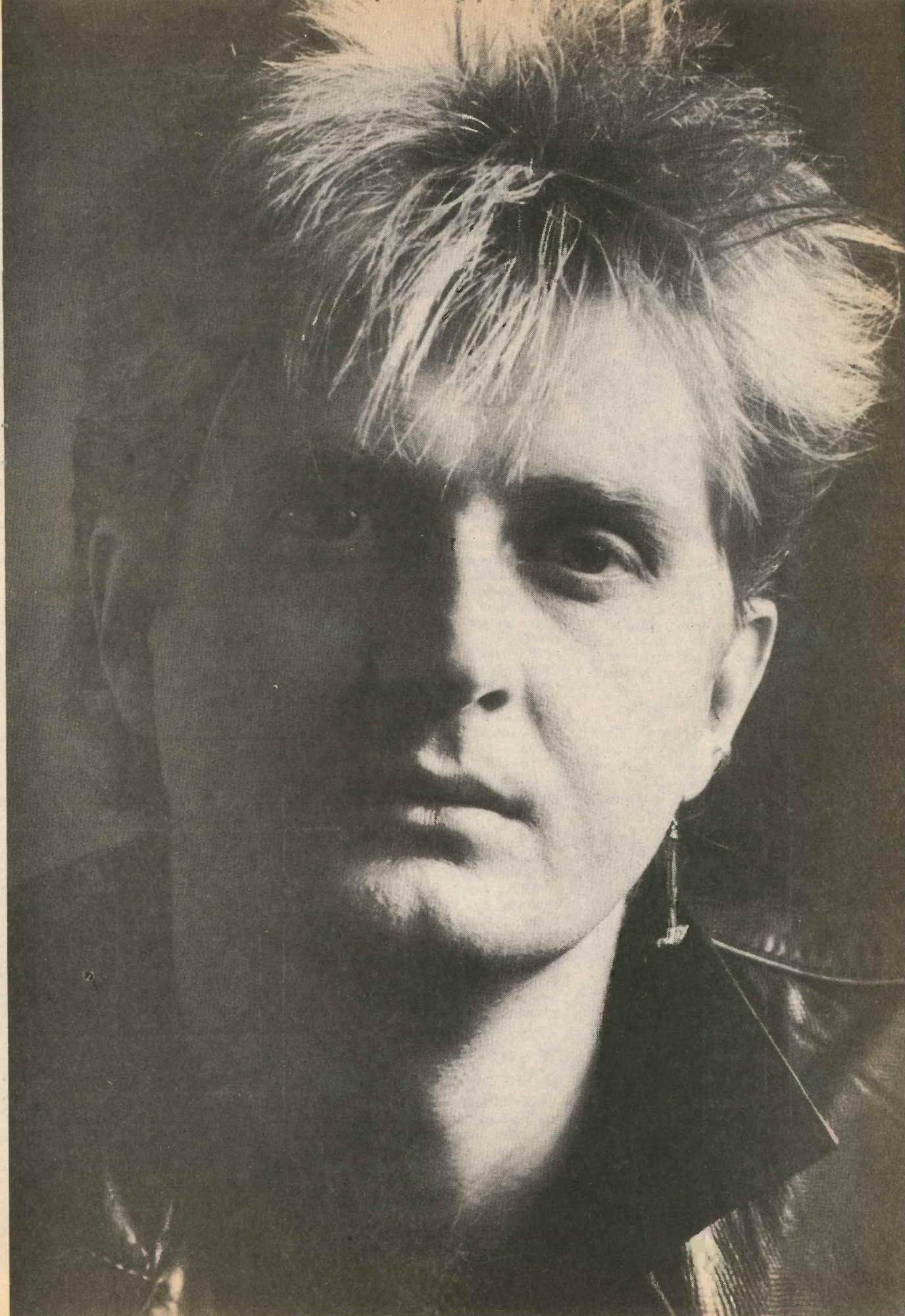

Gordon Sinclair 1900 - 1984

Anne Murray headlines at World Exposition

Toronto: Leonard Rambeau, President, Balmur Ltd., reports that Anne Murray will be headlining two shows at the 1984 World Exposition in New Orleans on June 1 and 2.

The Capitol recording star is currently making strong gains up U.S. country and A/C charts with her latest single, Just Another Woman In Love. The single was taken from her Good News album.

Murray's U.S. popularity continues on a phenomenal roll and she is obviously the sweetheart of U.S. music critics. During her recent appearance at the Universal Amphitheatre in Los Angeles, Paul Grein of the Los Angeles Times wrote: "Murray sings with a conversational ease and naturalness that offsets even the most sentimental lyric. She is also able to vary her vocal approach, singing in a pure, rounded style or with a gritty, guttural edge."

Mike Reynolds, writing in the Hollywood Reporter, also caught Ms. Murray at the Amphitheatre and wrote: "It's easy to understand why Murray is so popular, with her engaging personality readily warming the audience with in-between banter. Her delivery of songs suggest an equal effectiveness on grittier material, as evidenced by her upbeat opening. More of that material could open up a whole new Anne Murray following."

vision been like before Gordon Sinclair?

Mental vigour was obviously the essence of life for Gordon. There he was, just a few short days from his 84th birthday, and on the day he was struck down by a massive stroke, he reported for work as spry and as prankish as usual, and put his CFRB 10 to Noon news to bed and even left a couple of notes in the typewriter for his next edition. When he left the station, seemingly quite healthy and having incredible control of his faculties, not very common among 83 year olds, the parting remarks were his usual, "See ya tomorrow." which, of course, would not come to be.

I had met Gordon Sinclair, thanks to CFRB's George Wilson, several years ago, although I had been an admirer of his for years. I once took him to task in a column about the lack of Cancon on his Showbusiness program. He tore a piece off me on one of his subsequent shows, first giving RPM a very valuable promotional boost: "RPM, a lively little music magazine that keeps watch on the record and radio industries," he told his multitude of listeners, "has taken a swing at me for reporting on more international than Canadian showbusiness news." He bet me a "case of the best champagne available", if I could prove that his five minute Showbusiness segment contained less than 30% . . . "no, make that 50% Canadian news," he challenged. I didn't take him up on it and a couple of months later when we both bellied up to a bar for a couple of shots of "old stepfather", he chided me for not checking out his show. "For your information, young fella," he chuckled, "I purposely did several shows without mentioning one Canadian item, just to see if you were on your toes . . . and you could have had a whole case of Dom Perignon . . . how about that?"

The management and programming staff of CFRB proved once again why they are leaders in the field of broadcasting, with the very tasteful and professionally-produced tribute to Gordon Sinclair they went to air with, a few minutes after the announcement of his death.

Gordon Sinclair's wisdom, much of which he gained through practical experience, his very method of communicating to the masses, his brashness, his choice of four letter words and his mischievous on-air antics are treasures that should be available to his friends and admiring public. I would be the first to reserve a copy of Sinc's recorded contributions to this country . . . and what an excellent method of financing a Gordon Sinclair Heart Fund. - WG

ABBA's Love Songs WEA Custom's first

Toronto: The ABBA compilation album, titled Love Songs, has become the first release for the newly-formed direct marketing division of WEA Music Canada. Product will be released on the WEA Custom label.

Atlantic, Elektra/Asylum Product Manager Kim Cooke, who is heading the project, reports that on May 7 they began test-marketing the ABBA album in Alberta. The campaign, which runs for six weeks, covers Calgary, Edmonton, Medicine Hat and Lethbridge.

TV advertising is the priority but there are also radio promotions throughout the province as well as p.o.p. aids including banners, header cards and in-store video compilations.

"Rather than just a total Greatest Hits rehash which has been done over and over," explains Cooke, "this album has a marketing twist . . . two tracks never before released. The package is also thematic in that the tracks are all love songs instead of just ABBA's best hits. Most songs on the album are ballads."

The two previously-unreleased tracks, Cassandra and Should I Laugh Or Cry, have been released as a radio-only single. If successful, the campaign will be expanded into other markets.

"This is the perfect band for this type of project," continued Cooke. "There's still a fanatical audience for ABBA. I wish we had done it earlier."

CKGL-FM's Wainwright catches Sylvia off guard

Kitchener, Ont.: Paul Wainwright, who hosts Focus, an interview/music show, on CKGL-FM, may have scooped the nation when he discovered Sylvia's new single, Victims Of Goodbye, isn't what it was supposed to be.

During his "live" interview with the popular RCA recording star, Mr. Wainwright asked her about the duet she did with B.J. Thomas on her single. Sylvia was confused and claimed the release was of her as a soloist. Mr. Wainwright played the single for her and that's when it hit the fan.

B.J. Thomas, who had recorded the single with Sylvia, was apparently removed from the track, which is the U.S. release. However, the wrong parts were somehow shipped to Canada, and although there is no label copy mention of B.J. Thomas, he is certainly alive and dueting with Sylvia on the Canadian release.

Mr. Wainwright suggests that those who have a copy of the initial Canadian release should hang onto it, they could have a collector's item. This track is also included on Sylvia's new album.

It's expected a new single will be issued in Canada.



1984 was a dramatic turnaround for Attic

This is the year that Attic returned to the airwaves following a dramatic turnaround that involved shaking up our domestic roster and debuting 1984 with an indisputable string of hits at radio; Perfect Affair, Lee Aaron, The Nylons, etc.

This is Attic's 10th year of operation, and, not coincidentally, a renewal of our mandate to sign and develop exciting domestic artists for the world market. This is not to slight our uncanny knack for breaking hitherto unknown international artists in this market (George Thorogood, Plastic Bertrand, Katrina And The Waves, Kamahl, The Bandleader series, Hazell Dean, etc.)

Now, as we head into summer, new signings include two west coast bands; Body Electric and The Villains, Body Electric's debut single, Don't Take Me For A Fool, is already on CHUM-AM, CFTR, CHED, CFGO, CFRW, CJME, CKOM, CKDA, Z99 etc. This sort of success is no stranger to lead singer Frank Ludwig (of Trooper), keyboardist Bob Buckley and guitarist David Sinclair (both of Straight Lines). The single and LP were recorded at

Little Mountain Sound and re-mixed at Rupert Hine's Farmhouse Studio in England. A June/July showcase tour is in the works.

The villains are a cross-country touring phenomenon. Their debut LP, Go Crazy, was re-mixed at New York's Power Station. Debut single is You Are, while the title track becomes the debut video. A cross-Canada tour is expected to begin in June.

Lee Aaron returns with the instant anthem of We Will Be Rockin, re-mixed by producer Paul Gross at the Power Station, New York. Special edits make this vastly superior to the LP track. Lee Aaron's Metal Queen album is currently released domestically in Japan, Germany, Holland, Belgium, Sweden, Austria, and more. Her 1982 debut LP, known as The Lee Aaron Project, is being re-released this month (titled simply Lee Aaron) with a new cover and previously unreleased track Under The Stars (featuring her current live band).

To coincide with a sell out June tour, the new Nylons' 45 is Take Me To Your Heart, written by Annie Lennox and Dave Stewart. It's a serious shot at CHR radio for this platinum-plus act. MOR and A/C stations should also consider the flip side, Perpetual Emotion.

Also new is Perfect Affair's She's Got It, produced by Mick Ronson (who plays all guitars). Look for this group to tour Western Canada again next month. Action so far includes CFTR, CFGO, CFRA, CKXL, Q-107 and more.

Coming soon; the debut album from Belinda Metz.

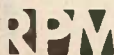

Red Rider continues their rise in rock popularity with the release of *Breaking Curfew*, the Toronto quartet's fourth Capitol album. There has been immediate radio reaction to, *Young Thing*, *Wild Dreams (Rock Me)*, the first single taken from the album. A video shoot of this track is now in the works.

Capitol is lending a hefty promotion

campaign to the new Rider project with a boxed press kit containing the album, and cassette, plus background material on the foursome. The kit highlights the clever jacket artwork, designed by Norman Moore with photography by Beverly Parker, shipped to press and radio and to be utilized by the Capitol sales force. The package can also be used for promotional giveaways. The campaign also provides for posters, mobiles and flats as well as radio time buys and print advertising.

Breaking Curfew represents the band's second collaboration with co-producer David Tickle of Australia, the first being *Neruda*, their previous album. Group leader, guitarist and lead singer Tom Cochrane and lead guitarist/vocalist Ken Greer, co-produced with Tickle. These two members also double on keyboards on the album.

The other two members are drummer Rob Baker and bassist/vocalist Jeff Jones.

Cochrane is the heavy in the songwriting field, penning eight out of the nine tracks, and co-writing the remaining track, *One Way Out*, with Green and Marty Goldenberg. The album was produced at the Metalworks and E.S.P. as well as Startling Studios in England.

Instrumental assist on the session came from keyboardists John Webster and Steve Sexton as well as saxophonist Earle Seymour and the vocal group Rough Maids, the latter heard on *Shake Monster* plus the single.

Prince Charles & City Beat release debut on Virgin

Toronto: The Boston-based funk-rock group, Prince Charles & The City Beat Band, make their debut on the Virgin label with the release of their *Combat Zone* album, the group's third project. The album was produced by Charles P.C. Alexander, who is also credited with the arranging and writing.

More Money has been taken as a single, with an extended version included on a 12" EP along with *Don't Fake The Funk* and *Heavy Duty Booty*. Their album contains a cover of Elvis Presley's classic, *Jailhouse Rock*.

The eight-piece group actually made their name in Britain where their previous releases, *Gang War* and *Stone Killers* gained them a foothold in that market.

The new project has been described as "a haunting collection that illuminates Cochrane's personal obsession with causes of a romantically dangerous nature - the frustrations of youth on *Young Things*, *Wild Dreams*, the pain of human injustice on *Someone's Watching*, and the torment of everyday people relationships on *One Way Out*."

Even prior to the recording of Red Rider's first album, *Don't Fight It*, released in 1980, Cochrane, an established writer, had already perceived that record buyers and concert goers were hungry for music that was both musically and lyrically powerful. Many of his peers regard him as one of the best contemporary songwriters on the North American rock scene, and the growing numbers of fans the group has attracted in three short years, attest to this exceptional songwriting ability.

A journalism student at Toronto's Ryerson, which no doubt contributed to his songwriting ability, Cochrane made his recording debut in 1974, with a solo album titled *Hang On To Your Resistance*. It might be too harsh to describe the album as a flop, although it did draw some critical acclaim - commercially the album was not a success. Undaunted, he played around the edges of the industry for the rest of that year, chalking up one notable achievement, scoring the movie soundtrack for *The Happy Hooker*, which led to a hiatus, of sorts.

In the meantime, Red Rider was mounted in 1975 and three years later (1978) the band and Cochrane found each other - a giant bonus for both.

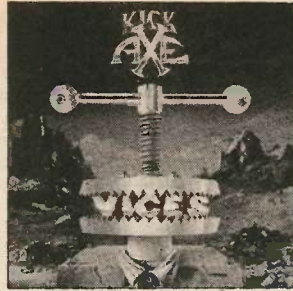

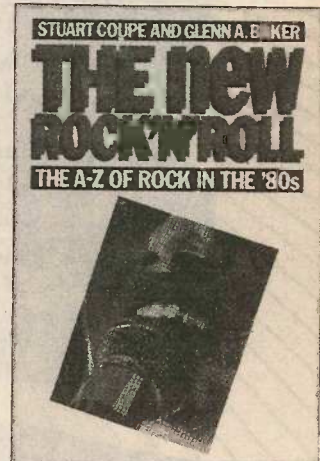

With the Australian Invasion, of sorts, it's only natural that a book of praise, of sorts, detailing new music accomplishments of down-under groups should reach these shores . . . and at a very opportune time. Actually, the book is very cleverly pre-



sented, with a tongue-in-cheek introduction by co-author Baker titled They Shoot Punks Don't They? He sets the pace for what follows with his opening . . . "To be perfectly honest, the title of this book is a misnomer. What we are dealing with here is the realm beyond Andrew Loog Oldham's Industry of Human Happiness - the Land of Lost Visions. With a very few exceptions there is no new rock, only mutton cleverly dressed as lamb slipping by the taste buds of the unaware. The talent of discernment has never been more essential for artistic survival," given there are those interested in new music, who are remotely familiar with Andrew Loog Oldham.

Suggestions of "no Australian bias" might be challenged, however the new music from Australia did play a major role in the music of the '80s, so far. The authors would appear to have scored a monumental list of "nobodies", many from Australia and the U.K. and some American. There are many "stars" as well and the pages are beautifully peppered with great photos, left-fielder quotes, album jackets and more.

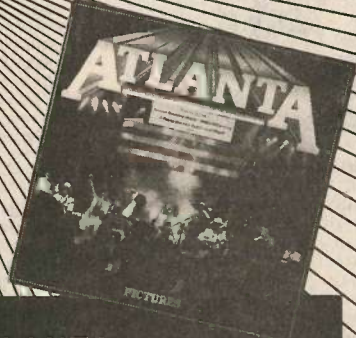
The only Canadians Coupe and Baker could find to fit their "New Music" would were Bryan Adams, The Spoons and Rough Trade . . . and what was written about these established acts, could have been much more in depth, but we mustn't let our Canadian bias show.

For the most part this is a very well put together happening of rock in the early '80s when there was a lot of changes going on . . . and outspoken and, by far, a much more educated collection of recording artists. How's this from Boy George, "I don't want to be a tax exile because I like this country too much. Europe stinks as far as I'm concerned. They all think I'm a girl in Germany." Tom Petty shared his view of rock videos. "If I see one more rock video I'm gonna scream. I can't even tell who the musicians are. Is this guy the bass player? Is he an actor? Is he the French chef?" . . . and a classic from the Jam's Paul Weller, "I'm sick of pop music. Most of it is just crap. It's sick, really sick. Every now and then you get a new face who becomes The New Get of Rock Rebellion. Ah, it just pisses me off." Great stuff and there's lots more, particularly a rare look at Japan's New Music, an even more concise look at that country's rock movement from 1969 through 1980.
