





Labatt's entering U.S. 'quietly and unobtrusively'

This past month, Labatt's entertainment operation, Blue Live, presented singer/songwriter Vangelis in Los Angeles, which marks the company's first involvement into concert promotion stateside. "We're moving in quietly and unobtrusively," says Judy Pal, Labatt's public relations coordinator.

Actually, Blue Live's Jim Skarrett explains the move is "just a follow-up to our philosophy of trying to get involved totally in the music and entertainment industry, as opposed to being just a sponsor of an event.

"We'd like to get involved in (more) U.S. presentations, venue management, like we have with Massey Hall - merchandising and publishing," he continues. "An all encompassing company, with each arm of it helping the other arm."

To that particular end, 6 months ago, Skarrett hired Larry Mason (former PolyGram A&R Director), who is currently in England following his return from L.A. and the sold-out Vangelis shows. Although based in Ontario, Mason "spends most of his time in either London, New York, or L.A.

"A lot of what he'll be doing will be centered on the European scene," Skarrett explains, "just looking at the newer things coming out, trying to get a handle on the direction

Hornsby & The Range No.1 at MuchMusic

Ken Bain's untiring promotion efforts on behalf of Bruce Hornsby & The Range is beginning to pay off with top of the chart numbers and this week a No. 1 berth on the MuchMusic Top 30 (Dec. 12). Other significant movers are Parachute Club's Love Is Fire, up to No. 7 from 10; Bruce Springsteen's War, which moves to 12 from 16; Robbie Nevil's C'est la vie, up to 13 from 20; and Cyndi Lauper's Change Of Heart to 19 from 24.

Chart adds this week are Corey Hart in at No. 20 with Can't Help Falling In Love; Kool & The Gang's Victory at 27; and Land Of Confusion by Genesis, new at 29.

Having dealt with bands such as Dire Straits, Stevie Ray Vaughan and J.J. Cale, Skarrett maintains Mason's expertise is not "in being a promoter or so much a businessman, as being a person who is involved with the management and development of artists."

Therefore, as well as assisting Canadian bands (Kim Mitchell, Haywire, Parachute Club and The Partland Brothers) in their endeavours to conduct a viable national tour, Blue Live will also be presenting foreign acts that are "just starting out," building in the process "loyalty and a relationship" with those acts.

Skarrett agrees, "Yes, we've had a good track record with some of the developing stuff. We took Mr. Mister out when people were saying 'Mr. Who?' and it turned out to be very successful and we took the Platinum Blonde tour, when the album was virtually a

Court gets tough on bootlegger

Patrick Fox, Director of Investigative Services for the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) reports that the most recent prosecution for copyright infringement "has yielded Canada's most severe penalty to date."

David Wolotko, who pleaded guilty to a single count of fraud over \$1,000 under the Criminal Code, was sentenced to 1 day in jail and a \$15,000 fine. He appeared before Judge M.H. Harris in Scarborough (Ontario) Provincial Court (Dec. 1-2, 1986). Judge Harris also made an order pursuant to Section 25 (3) of the Copyright Act (R.S.C. 1970) that all material seized by the police in their raid of Apr. 18, 1986, be delivered to Fox as a representative of "those persons whose copyright interests were infringed." As a result, Fox reports that "some 360 video bootleg masters and 649 audio bootleg masters will be destroyed."

According to Fox, Wolotko, operated "a substantial mail-order bootleg business known as Rockin' Ears/Rockin' Video."

Fox goes on to explain that there was evidence the accused "may well have been responsible for the distribution of bootleg materials valued at up to \$1,000,000 annually but, because these business operate on a cash-only basis, the Crown could not establish the exact amount of business done by Wolotko."

The bootleg recordings were of live performances by major artists in countries around the world dating from 1972 to and including a performance by Rush in Montreal from Mar. 7, 1986. Also included were some 17 video and 17 audio bootlegs of Bruce Springsteen performances. The accused, Wolotko, apparently offered the bootleg items at an average price of \$35.00 per hour of recording time.

Fox concludes with "The heavy penalty imposed by Judge Harris should serve as a deterrent to video and audio pirates, as copyright owners whose works are pirated in the future, use the Wolotko decision as a precedent for even higher penalties.

"Obviously, we can't take on hundreds on those projects, but those are the kinds of projects that I find a lot more satisfying than going out and buying someone who'll sell-out in 4 hours . . . I mean . . . that's a great end of the business . . . that's the business end of showbusiness.

"But the other end of working with an act, watching it develop and seeing it come to a gold album (Haywire) and a national tour, to me that is the satisfying side of it. The other part is very much technical: you buy a rider, you put it on sale, and you build a stage - then you do a show. That's very satisfying financially, but that's not as satisfying to a person who's in the music business."

Springsteen set 'diamond' before New Year - Oates

As far as certification is concerned for Bruce Springsteen's new release, that won't come until January. But with shipments expected to easily surpass the quarter million mark before the new year, Don Oates, Vice President Marketing & Sales for CBS Records Canada, reports the 5-LP box set will actually have reached the diamond plateau before the end of the month.

With the label's fiscal year ending Nov. 28, Oates also explains that CBS finished 1986, "substantially" over budget. "However, even without Bruce Springsteen, we would have been over budget," he adds.

In terms of both dollar and unit figures, the Springsteen live compilation has given CBS Records, "our best month ever," says Oates. On the year, "without Bruce, it wouldn't have been our 3rd best, but with him, it's been our 2nd best ever."

Initially though, the tremendous demand for the boxed set did place their manufacturing division in a bind, and Oates relates they were in a "heavy-duty catch up" situation subsequent to replenishing stock, with respect to other artists' product. "We're over the hump now," stresses Oates, "and back into a full supply cycle of the other product."

Although, as in previous years, CBS in 1986 didn't have the one blockbuster record, Oates attributes their success to releasing "a lot of platinum acts." These include the Top Gun Soundtrack, Billy Ocean, Jennifer Rush, Cyndi Lauper, Billy Joel, Miami Sound Machine, and The Outfield, among others.

"Even without Bruce Springsteen," Oates concludes, "we were having an exceptional year - better than last year."

Back to back videos released on Corey Hart

The Aquarius label has released 2 videos on Corey Hart: one on his current chart item, Can't Help Falling In Love, the other, a popular album track, Angry Young Man. Both tracks are included on his Fields Of Fire album.

The old Presley hit was performed by Hart, via satellite, from Amsterdam during the recent Juno Awards presentation. Keith Brown of Aquarius Records stresses however, that the new video "embodies a different performance which was shot in London under the direction of Rob Quartly.

Interestingly enough, when reviewing Hart's Fields Of Fire album, People's Magazine's Mary Shaughnessy zeroed in on Can't Help Falling In Love, which was released almost 25 years ago by Presley. "Hart infuses that 1962 ballad," writes Shaughnessy, "with a uniquely personal interpretation that stands up to Elvis' already worthy version. Not only can you hear Hart's voice out front where it belongs, but you can actually hear what he's saying."

Can't Help Fallin In Love is the follow-up single to I Am By Your Side, so it's only natural that a video would also be released of this track. However, it is unusual for a second video to be released at the same time, prompted by the success of Angry Young Man in Europe as well as an album track in North America. The video of the latter was shot in Rome and represents what is described as "an upbeat departure for Hart." Both

videos were directed by Quartly.

"I'm anxious for people to see the Angry Young Man video," says Brown, "because I think it shows Corey in a more natural light. The past 4 times now we've released a ballad as a single. As a result, we've had 4 emotional video performances in a row." He continues with "When I look at the Angry Young Man video, I see a lot more of the Corey Hart that I know," concluding with "The only dark clouds that hang over the real Corey are the kind you see raining on the Coliseum."

Hart and Quartly have worked together on 8 videos, the first being the award-winning Sunglasses At Night.

Paul Young - a move to rock . . . and credibility!

Since being plucked from The Q-Tips, a British R&B band, Paul Young has released a trio of solo albums. The latest, *Between Two Fires*, stylistically moves away from R&B towards a rock-tinged feel. No longer are his song's hooks played by a keyboardist, but by a guitarist, thus the "gritty" sound - what he set out to achieve - he is most pleased with.

Unlike his previous albums, *No Parlez*, and *Secret Of Association*, "which," he admits, "were merely a series of exercises." He stresses however, that *Between Two Fires* was "a conceived" project. "The concept being to try and pin myself down to one sound for one album," he adds.

"We knew what sound we wanted," he continues, "so we knew what the songs should be like, and also what producer we wanted." The producer brought on board was Hugh Padgham, known for his work with Genesis, The Police, and Phil Collins, among others.

One of the tasks handed to Padgham was "to get the band to sound live," relates Young, "to sound like we were playing together as a band. Whereas before," he continues, "we would always start a song from

scratch and 'added' one thing at a time."

The bandmembers were assembled before recording began - and it was stressed that the opportunity to practice was essential. "They've all been with me long enough to know their position in the arrangement. We just said 'do what comes naturally to you lads', same as they do live. So, it came out sounding more live, more direct . . . which is what we wanted."

Young is well aware his albums sell proportionately much better in Canada than in the U.S. - so well, in fact, that defining his musical style was a constant concern while recording the album. He believes the U.S. market will be much more receptive if he is viewed as a rock musician.

"What we took into account," suggests Young, "was the fact that Americans are finding it hard to locate us. They don't know which radio stations to service, because they don't know what kind of music to call it. We found on the last one, they called Playhouse a rock track, and Everytime a soul or R&B track. Therefore, I'm getting serviced in different stations all the time and they can't ever see me as one particular type of artist, which is what they have to do.

"In England," he continues, "you don't have that because there's no radio stations to service - there's just one major radio station. On the whole, we don't have to call ourselves anything other than musicians. This is the thing you realize when you come to America, that the whole business works in a different way."

Although, obviously each system has its advantages, Young suggests that over the past few months, he has seen "some pretty disgusting stuff" enter the U.K. charts and these "novelty" records have "some of the bigger bands worried." The blame, he reasons, lies not only with the record com-

panies - who sign the acts - but also with the consumers - who buy the product.

"We've got this soap opera called *Eastenders*," he relates. "It's like General Hospital . . . and it's like all these actors are releasing records that are getting to No. 1. And we're getting models who take their clothes off . . . getting record deals and getting hits.

"But that's what they want to buy. So they (the record companies) just get a pretty face . . . well, not even pretty . . . just a familiar face is as important to them. They're just too safe."

Apparently, the new British rocker has much to contend with. Their credibility is at stake and the essence of what they do best, which is write hit songs, is plagued by those who can't; yet through circumstance, are undermining the very existence of these real musicians.

"I suppose if my album has to come under a banner," Young concludes, "it comes under rock . . . as long as I don't get labelled pop because that gives me a very short life. Pop is Madonna and pop is WHAM . . . and my album doesn't sound like either of those."

Paul James Band covers classics on new single

Toronto guitarist Paul James recently released 2 songs on the independent label Lick 'n' Stick Records. Both sides of the single, which contains 2 rock 'n' roll classics, were produced by James.

Side one carries *Route 66*, a number written by Bob Troup and recorded by the Rolling Stones during the mid-60's. On the flip, realizing the current season, is *Run Run Rudolph* a Chuck Berry composition.

The single, recorded at Comfort Sound, is presently available through Roblan's, Records On Wheels and The Record Peddler.

Dave Evans resigns Capitol position

J. David Evans has resigned as President and Chief Operating Officer of Capitol Canada.

In making the announcement of Evan's exit from Capitol, Edward C. Khoury, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer, Capitol Records - EMI of Canada Limited, noted: "I very much regret to have to announce that David Evans has resigned as President and Chief Operating Officer of Capitol Canada."

Khoury continues with "David (Evans) who had a distinguished career of over 18 years with our Canadian company, made many significant contributions to our Canadian company, made many significant contributions to our success in Canada, and I am sure that his many friends, both within the company and throughout EMI Music worldwide, will wish him every happiness and success in the future."

At the same time Khoury announced the appointment of Richard C. Lyttelton to succeed Evans as President and Chief Operating Officer of Capitol Records - EMI of Canada Limited.

Lyttelton, joined Capitol Canada in June of this year as Managing Director. He first became associated with EMI Records in the U.K. in 1966 and, after a short period in business on his own, rejoined the company with EMI Leisure Enterprises in the U.K. He returned to EMI Music in 1976 becoming Managing Director, Finland, Director International for EMI Records - EMI U.K., and Managing Director, South Africa.

In making the above announcement, Khoury noted "I am sure that all of Richard's colleagues in North America and worldwide will join with me in congratulating him on his new appointment, and wish him great success in his new leadership position."

It is only recently that the idea of working on a cruise ship has been made possible for Canadians. With the cruise industry becoming a very important part of the travel business, it is inevitable that Canadian artists would become much in demand.

It's a great life and allows for travel to all parts of the world or the same 7-day cycle, week after week. Every night is showtime. As well, the entertainers become involved in other events that are part of being cruise staff. It can be fun, stimulating and good experience for a career in entertainment.

The demographics of the passengers range from young swingers on the funships to senior citizens on the more expensive and extensive cruises and the very rich or famous on various luxury cruises.

Entertainment on board can range from Las Vegas-type shows featuring

The super ships have as many as 16 lounges, and most of them feature live music or entertainment.

Regent Holidays of Toronto is currently sailing 2 ships through the Caribbean and they make every attempt to hire as many Canadian musicians and entertainers as possible. They even play up their Cancon policy in publicity brochures.

Currently performing on the T.S.S. Atlas are 2 Canadians, who have been seen extensively on television in Canada. Ron Victors is a young Torontonion, who is working on an album to be released shortly. Jane O'Neil, another Toronto native, has also launched a recording career and has taken a break to sail, and to work on her material. She is quite happy with her job on the Atlas, which she considers an exciting new experience. Both she and Victors feel they are adding to their showbiz experience as they perform before capacity houses night after night.

The sister ship to the Atlas is the 14,000 ton M.V. Oceanos. Canadian recording artist Chris Barbieri, who resides in Hamilton, Ont., is Entertainment Director on the Oceanos and acts as emcee, comedian and singing host in the main lounge of the cruise ship. He feels it is an enormous opportunity

that can't be matched on the mainland. As well, he acts as Social Host and Sports Director to the 500 to 700 new passengers who come aboard every Saturday to cruise the resort ports of the Caribbean each week.

Some entertainers become Cruise Directors and make this their lifetime career. If you love sailing and want to live on a ship, it may be the life for you.

"We do everything we can to hire Canadians whenever we can," says David Buxton, Director of Cruise Operations for Regent Holidays, "but there are times when we can't find the right people in Canada and we have to look to other countries."

Unfortunately, there is no agency specializing in supplying talent for cruise ships. However, as the industry grows, the need for talent will no doubt become a priority.

It should be pointed out that this isn't a career for everyone. The discipline is completely different, and you don't become a big star on a cruise ship. You may find yourself helping to bring new passengers aboard or calling numbers for bingo in the lounge in the afternoon, or supervising the games around the pool. It isn't one big holiday - it's hard work and it's 7 days a week with very few breaks. Most cruise ships require that you sign on for 6 months - so you better not become homesick or seasick.

Whittaker & O'Connor hot with Skye Boat Song

The traditional Scottish ballad, The Skye Boat Song, released as a duet by Roger Whittaker and Des O'Connor is racing up the U.K. pop charts, and after only 5 weeks on release now has a No. 17 berth. The veteran British performers performed this 100 year old classic a few months ago on the Des O'Connor Tonight TV series. Audience reaction in the studio and among the millions of viewers, prompted a release on the Tembo label. Whittaker has performed the song as a



whistling feature in his concert tours throughout the world for the past 12 years.

J. Edward Preston, President, Tembo Music Canada supplies a little history on The Skye Boat Song, which he explains "illustrates an episode in the escape of Prince Charles Edward Stuart (Bonnie Prince Charlie) in the winter of 1746, fleeing from the advancing troops of King George II. The Young Pretender, as he was titled by his followers, had led the Jacobite Rebellion to victory at Prestonpans, before marching on London: to take the English throne, which he believed was rightfully his. The rebellion however, was crushed at Culloden and with his army in total disarray, Charles fled. He was helped in his plight by Flora Macdonald, who disguised him as her Irish maid-servant, and made good his escape from the Scottish mainland to the Isle of Skye. The young Prince was later taken to safety in France."

Preston goes on to explain that "the song itself, was founded on an old Hebridean sea shanty first heard in 1879. Four bars were taken from Hebridean boatmen, and 4 extra bars added by composer Annie Macleod. The words were written by Sir Harold Boulton in 1884."

Apparently, the betting in the U.K. is that the record will be in the Top 10 by Christmas. Tembo is rush-releasing the single in Canada, where it will be distributed by RCA.

Rita McNeil breaking with new LP and single

The stage would appear to be set for a national breakout for Rita McNeil, who has released an album, Flying On Your Own, and the title track as a single. Her product is released on the Halifax-based Lupins label.

McNeil's management was recently taken over by Brookes Diamond, a management firm known throughout the Maritimes (see separate story).

"We have a solid homebase to work Rita's album and single," said Diamond. "We've received unbelievable support from the Maritimes, and the action is beginning to move westward very quickly."

The press, particularly in the West, have been quite responsive to McNeil's release. Says Denny Boyd of the Vancouver Sun, "If your emotions are vulnerable, her (McNeil) songs won't just touch you, they will haunt you."

A native of Big Pond, Nova Scotia, McNeil has become somewhat of a folk figure throughout the Atlantic Provinces, where she draws capacity houses. Her music bridges all music formats, with the single now catching the ears of A/C and CHR programmers. Her album contains 2 country-oriented tracks, Used To You, and Leave Her Memory, both of which have been carted and are being programmed by country programmers.

The 41-yr. old McNeil has successfully broken down the format barriers, as witnessed by the growing numbers of chart adds she is receiving across the board, and just recently appeared in a feature film, Candy Mountain, lensed in both New York and Nova Scotia. In the film she performs Everybody, a track that is included on her album. The Robert Frank (Rolling Stones) directed film also features performances by Dr. John, Leon Redbone, Tom Waites, and Kevin O'Connor.





Canadian singles market 'very strong' - Kennedy

Citing distinct variables and differences between the Canadian and U.S. singles' markets, Leonard Kennedy and Terry Trojek of Saturn Distribution affirm the Canadian 7" situation is far from approaching its "swan song" as reported recently in an American trade.

With singles accounting for, on average,

7 to 8 percent of a retailer's gross, Kennedy believes no retail outlet would forego those sales when there is no viable alternative to the single currently on the market.

"Singles sell albums," he states, "and right now they're the best promotional tool a record company has."

Because of the rackjobber's aggressiveness in the marketplace, Kennedy proudly boasts that Saturn has never experienced a decline in sales over the years and he expects the forthcoming years to be equally as profitable.

Buyer Trojek explains video programs, such as MuchMusic and Video Hits, have been instrumental in influencing singles sales. "Sure," he adds, "as far as impact is concerned. If they (the consumers) like the song - they'll go out and buy it."

However, also attributing significantly has been radio's switch to "gold" formats, which, says Kennedy, have tripled their

shipments of single product this past year alone.

"It's up to the retailer now," says Trojek, "to do what radio isn't doing. Today we don't wait for a radio chart . . . our charts are more important." WEA's Cooke compiles new Redding multi-LP set

Compiled, designed and released to replace the now 15-yr. old "Best Of" package, WEA - through the Atco label - has added to its pre-Christmas list of titles a new Otis Redding 4-LP set.

Contained in the 2 double-album packages, titled The Otis Redding Story, Volume 1: Mr Pitiful and Volume 2: Deep Soul, are tracks previously unreleased and extensive liner notes, written by Rob Bowman.

This "definitive" compilation, which label manager Kim Cooke maintains took 9 months to assemble, is far more attractive to the serious collector. As well as the liner notes, photographs are featured in the 4 page booklet included.

The previously unavailable tracks are found on Volume 2: You Left The Water Running and Stay In School. These tracks are what Cooke refers to as "the gems" of the package. "What we've done is given a fresh coat of paint to a brilliant artist," he concludes.

Jan Matejcek elected to CISAC posts

Jan Matejcek, President and General Manager of the Performing Rights Organization of Canada Limited (PROCAN), has been elected to both the Administrative Council and Executive Bureau of the International Confederation of Societies of Authors and Composers (CISAC). PROCAN represents almost 20,000 composers, lyricists and music publishers in Canada, while CISAC is made up of 94 composer/author societies from around the world.

PROCAN's Nancy Gyokeres points out that "The CISAC thrust is felt in copyright areas worldwide via its discussions and lobbying for modern copyright legislation." She continues with "Through its technical committees, the day-to-day operation of performing rights societies is enhanced by constant contact between member societies."

There are 24 societies holding seats on the Administrative Council, whose representatives in turn elect the 12-person Executive Bureau.

Gyokeres concludes with "Mr. Matejcek's election ensures that the interests of Canadian music creators are heard at the international level."





KICK AXE - Rock
Rock The World - Epic - PEC-80118-H
 The problem in the past with this band, has been their inability to 'hit the nail on the head', even with Spencer (Quiet Riot) Proffer producing their last release, *Welcome To The Club*, which couldn't match the sales of their debut. However, on this, their 3rd LP, *Kick Axe* seem to have found that elusive nail - by using a bigger hammer. Included is a bone-crunching version of Fleetwood Mac's *The Chain*, and excellent tuneage in *Devachan*, *Great Escape* and *Magic Man*. Therefore, despite the jacket and the tribute (*We Still Remember*), this package offers up a good blend of rock, touching on metal, that should do respectable numbers with that particular demograph. Produced by Larry Gillstrom (guitars) at Emil's Studio in B.C. Canada.

DAVE CLARK - Pop/Rock
Time - The Album - Capitol - SWBK-12447-F
 A double album featuring the song of Dave Clark's musical play, also titled *Time*, which stars Cliff Richard. The majority of the material was co-written by Clark, who also takes executive producer credits. Both Richard and Julian Lennon guest, the latter singing a duet with Stevie Wonder as well as covering Clark's '60s hit, *Because*. Also contributing vocal talents are Queen's Freddie Mercury, Dionne Warwick, Ashford & Simpson, and Leo Sayer.

VARIOUS ARTISTS - Christmas
The Nashville Christmas Album
 Epic - WPE-40418-H
 As producer Steve Buckingham puts it, "It isn't often that the public is fortunate enough to hear recording artists in intimate surroundings accompanied by acoustic instruments," and that's what we have in this timely package. Includes performances by Janie Frickie (*What Child Is This*), Merle Haggard (*White Christmas*), Charly McClain and Wayne Massey (*Winter Wonderland*), George Jones and Gene Watson (*Silver Bells*) and Willie Nelson's *Pretty Paper*, with vocals by John Conlough and Charlie Daniels on fiddle. Should be front-racked.

OTIS REDDING - Soul
Vol. 1 & 2 - Atco - SD2-807(8)-P
 A fine collection of material from the late R&B star - presented in chronological fashion from 1963 through 1969. The quality of the pressing is certain to garner attention, as he is heard more noticeably than on previous recording efforts. Contains his most popular songs (*Mr. Pitiful*, *Fa-Fa-Fa-Fa-Fa*, and *Sittin' On The Dock Of The Bay*), and a couple of covers (*Satisfaction*, *Day Tripper*, and *Sam Cooke's Shake*) as well as Irving Berlin's *White Christmas* and the Steve Cropper/Eddie Floyd penning of *Knock On Wood*. Liner notes written by Toronto musicologist/journalist Rob Bowman. WEA's Kim Cooke put these excellent packages together. Also includes a 4-page booklet insert.



BEN E. KING - R&B
Stand By Me, The Best Of...
 Atlantic - 78-17161-P
 All but 3 of the tracks are performed by King, remainder by himself and The Drifters. Title track vying for the No. 1 spot on many radio stations. Also includes *Don't Play That Song*, a track co-written and produced by Ahmet Ertegun. Remainder produced by Jerry Leiber and Mike Stoller, with *Supernatural Thing (Part 1)* being the exception. Front racking will guarantee sales - thanks to movie of the same title.

JOHN ABERCROMBIE - Instrumental & Don Thompson
Witchcraft - Justin Time - JUST-16
 Seven tracks featuring Abercrombie's guitar work and Thompson's bass and piano, produced by the duo at Toronto's Puget Sound. Full Colours was co-written by the 2 producers, and is the only original. Album defies categorization, but could ease into a new age or free-form jazz label.

CREEDENCE CLEARWATER - Rock
REVIVAL - Vol. 2 - Fantasy CCR3-W
 Specially-priced double album (gatefold) set, featuring CCR classics - released appropriately with John Fogerty's resurgence into the charts. Package contains 20 tracks including *Suzie Q*, *Good Golly Miss Molly*, *Night Time Is The Right Time*, *The Midnight Special*, *Hello Mary Lou* and more.

WEIRD AL YANKOVIC - Comedy
Polka Party - Scotti Bros - FZ-40520-H
 Yankovic wasted no time in releasing this recording, merely an attempt at spoofing today's contemporary pop songs by re-writing the lyrics - which he is now known for. Perhaps the cutest is *Addicted To Spuds*. Whether the original artist or Yankovic took more time writing the lyrics is another matter however.



ANDY WILLIAMS - Pop
Close Enough For Love - Atco - 79-05611-P
 Are there any Andy Williams' fans out there? You bet there are and this package of Romantic Music From The Movies is designed for them, and perhaps others. There's a little smaltz, but done up in that cool Andy Williams style that catapulted him into chart prominence way back when. This is a new production and there's an acknowledgement of David Foster on *How Do You Keep The Music Playing* from the *Just Friends* film, but no elaboration. This is a key track, but so are most tracks. Produced, arranged and conducted by Jeremy and John Lubbock. Lots of lush backing.

KING CRIMSON - Rock
The Compact King Crimson - EG - EGLP-88-W
 From their varied and multi-musician past comes an anthology of the band's best - culminating, of course, with *The Court Of The Crimson King*. A 2-LP gatefold package that appears just in time for the holiday season rush and should generate some income for the label over this period. Evidently this set is a personal selection of material compiled by guitarist Robert Fripp. Sounds like a classic and could go down as one.

JOHNNY MATHIS - Christmas
Christmas Eve - Columbia - FC-40447-H
 Christmas or practically any time wouldn't be the same without a little crooning by Johnny Mathis. This package is timely as Mathis is unmatched when it comes to holiday songs like *It's Beginning To Look Like Christmas*, *It's Christmas Time Again*, and *Christmas Is For Everyone/Where Can I Find Christmas* (from *The Bear That Slept Through Christmas*). Produced by Denny Diante with various arrangers and conductors including Henry Mancini, Jeremy Lubbock and Ray Ellis.

WARREN ZEVON - Pop
A Quiet Normal Life - Asylum - 96-05031-P
 Selling on the strength of his only (relative) commercial hit, *Werewolves Of London*, the label selected material that certainly is appropriate and relevant for today's record-buying crowd. The lyrics of Zevon's are, to say the least, explicit, and the assists of David Lindley, Russell Kunkel, Lindsey Buckingham, and Stevie Nicks (on *Mohammed's Radio*) and Jackson Browne, lend a great deal of credibility to this package. Should sell through on the very strengths of those aforementioned lyrics.

TERRY CRAWFORD - Pop
Total Loss Of Control - Attic - LAT-1228-W
 Although now overshadowed by Jennifer Warnes' new release, this album reflects another fine offering from Crawford, and features a host of guest musicians. Although the keyboard work is a little overbearing at times, the vocals are a standout. Good production from Joel Feenay and Tim Thorne, both who also co-wrote 2 tracks. Cancan.



PAUL BRADY - Rock/Pop
Back To The Centre - Mercury - 826-8091-Q
 Eric Clapton is featured on *Deep In Your Heart* however, this set goes far beyond that particular track. Both *Walk The White Line* and *Follow On* are key, and both demonstrate Kenny Craddock's Hammond Organ talents. *The Homes Of Donegal* is a traditional piece, arranged by Brady, who also wrote the majority of the material.

THE ROYAL PHILHARMONIC - Christmas
ORCHESTRA - Vocalist Ann Mortifee - The Chicago Synthesizer-Rhythm Ensemble
 Columbia - FC-40441-H
 Ann Mortifee does the vocals on *Silent Night*, *God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen* and *O Come, O Come Emmanuel* and *Carol Of The Birds* on this excellent package of Christmas material. Also contains an exceptional Christmas Medley of *The First Noel: Deck The Halls: and Troika* (from *Lt. Kije Suite* by S. Prokofiev). Paul Freeman takes Executive Producer credits with Julian Rice as Production Supervisor. Excellent use of synthesizers - very unique.



Gun label to distribute Rita MacNeil product

Terry Kelly, President of the Halifax-based Gun Records, has announced the signing of an exclusive distribution contract with Rita MacNeil. The deal was negotiated with MacNeil's management firm of Brookes Diamond. Initial release will be MacNeil's new album, Flying On Your Own. The title track has been taken as the first single.

In making the announcement, Kelly noted: "Having experience in the successful distribution of my own records through Gun Records, we have decided to utilize this experience for the benefit of our clients," continuing with "One of the most important mandates of Gun Records is to generate interest from retail distribution outlets to feature our product in store front display areas."

The MacNeil album was produced by bandleader Ralph Dillon with the exception of the title track and Fast Train To Tokyo, both of which were produced by Declan O'Doherty. The Tokyo song was written by MacNeil during her appearance at Expo '85 in Japan.

Ann Weatherbie, Distribution Manager for the Gun label will be working with retail outlets in the Maritimes as well as with the major record brokers across the country. Orders for the new album have reportedly reached in excess of 10,000 units.

Tony Kelly, General Manager of Gun Records, points out that "adding a national distribution network to Gun Records will provide a very important service to our clients, which is necessary for success in the recording industry."

Plans are also underway to expand Gun's operations which will include computerized distribution and tracking, as well as the development of a marketing strategy that Kelly sees as a "further promotion for our artists."
